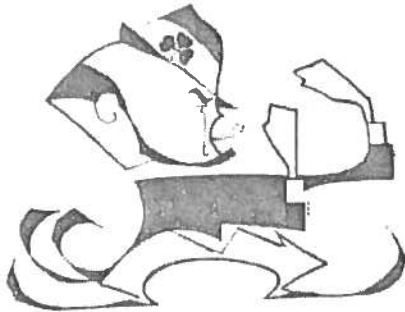

NOTRE DAME vs. LSU
GAME NOTES

September 12, 1981

Notre Dame starting quarterback Blair Kiel's 7-yard scoring toss to fullback Larry Moriarity in the first quarter was Kiel's first touchdown pass at Notre Dame. Kiel, a sophomore from Columbus, Ind., started Notre Dame's final nine games of 1980. Moriarity, a junior from Santa Barbara, Cal., scored the first touchdown of his Notre Dame career on the play.

Senior quarterback Tim Koegel and senior split end Dave Condemi, who were high school teammates at Moeller High School under Coach Gerry Faust, hooked up on a scoring play for the first time in their Notre Dame careers today, a 6-yard pass in the third quarter. It was Condemi's first touchdown catch at Notre Dame. Koegel was 6-for-7 for 101 yards today, his highest single-game yardage total at Notre Dame. His previous best was 81 yards ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ against Purdue in 1979.

LSU freshman tailback Eric Martin, who did not carry the ball in the Tigers' loss to Alabama last week, gained 50 yards on five carries this afternoon, including a 26-yard scoring run for LSU's only touchdown of the day.

Notre Dame's victory today makes Head Coach Gerry Faust the 22nd out of 24 Notre Dame head coaches to win his first game at the school. Notre Dame's record in season openers is now 80-8-5 over all, and 59-7-3 at home.

LSU COACH JERRY STOVALL QUOTES:

Notre Dame beat us to death physically. They battered and bruised us pretty good. Junius Dural has a dislocated elbow, Alex Clark separated his shoulder, Tommy Boudreaux was dinged up, Terry Roussel bruised his knee and James Britt was bruised also. I'm not sure, at this point, how serious any of those injuries are.

They are more physical than Alabama. Their defense is very quick and they have excellent team pursuit. They have good offensive arrangements and they move the ball well.

(About the fumble on the opening series) We can't afford mistakes like that against anybody, especially not against excellent teams.

There was an enormous amount of penalties in today's game. I don't know that I have seen a game with so many major penalties. We didn't capitalize on Notre Dame's penalties and, a number of times, they didn't capitalize on ours.

We've gained an awful lot of playing experience in these first two games. We've played a lot of young kids and they've been forced to grow up in a hurry. They're finding out what college football is all about.

Right now we're going to lick our wounds and find out how badly we are hurt. If the injuries aren't as serious as we fear, then, considering the experience that we've gained, we've come out of these two games in pretty good.

(Are you glad the first two games are over?) Heavens no...we're 0-2.

Notre Dame did an excellent job of blocking. We weren't confused -- they just executed well. We did not cover the tight end delay or the back in the flat very well.
