- Pedro Suarez kicked the 33rd field goal of his career, tying him with Mike Conway for the third most field goal in a career by an LSU player.
- Jamie Howard was sacked today for the first time since the Tennessee game. Howard was not sacked for 115 consecutive passing plays.
- James Gillyard's sack for a safety marked the first safety by LSU since the Ole Miss game last year.
- James Gillyard now leads LSU in quarterback sacks with four on the season.
- In the last four games, Scott Ray has caught 23 passes for 327 yards. He caught 8 for 125 at Florida, 6 for 99 vs. Kentucky, 3 for 40 at Ole Miss and 6 for 63 today vs. Alabama.
- LSU rushed and passed for 239 total offensive yards against the No. 1 defense in the country. Coming into the game, Alabama was allowing 166.8 yards per game.
- LSU scored on the first possession of the game for the first time since the Colorado State game (Game No. 4).
- Harold Bishop's six catches was the most in his career. His previous high was three.
- LSU's four QB sacks was the most by the LSU defense this season.

CURLEY HALLMAN QUOTES FOLLOWING LOSS TO ALABAMA

"This was a tough loss, naturally. It was a big win for Alabama. All of their goals are intact. Our guys were well-prepared and gave a good effort. There were a few miscues and we didn't get things done in key situations.

"Alabama has an excellent football team. Very solid accross the board. The reason we had some opportunities to win tonight is these young men came out and played hard.

"We'll keep working through this together and keep trying to turn this thing around.
