TIGER SOFTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP LEGACY

1 WCWS MOST OUTSTANDING PLAYER

Kristin Schmidt earned Women's College World Series Most Outstanding Player honors at the 2004 WCWS, making her the only player to not win the national championship and earn the honor outright.

2 WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES APPEARANCES

LSU is one of five schools in SEC history with multiple Women's College World Series appearances. The Tigers along with Florida, Georgia and Tennessee have tallied a winning record in WCWS play.

3 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

The Tigers have had three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans in the 14-year history of the program, while only one program in the SEC has had more than four.

5 SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

LSU claimed an unprecedented four consecutive league championships from 1999-2002. Only three other schools in SEC history, Alabama, Florida and Georgia, have claimed multiple regular season titles.

5 SEC TOURNAMENT TITLES

LSU has won an unrivaled five SEC Tournament titles and has advanced to the championship game in nine of the past 13 seasons.

6 SEC TOURNAMENT MVP'S

Six of the 15 SEC Tournament Most Valuable Player honors have been won by the Tigers, including an unparalleled five straight from 1999-2004.

8 SEC WESTERN DIVISION TITLES

LSU has won more Division titles than any school in the SEC. Only the Tigers and Alabama have claimed the division crown.

9 50-WIN SEASONS

LSU is one of only two programs in the nation, along with Arizona, to have posted nine 50-win seasons over the past 16 years.

13 ALL-AMERICANS

The Tigers have 13 NFCA All-Americans in the 15-year history of the program, second-most of any school in the SEC.

13 NCAA REGIONAL APPEARANCES

LSU has racked up 13 NCAA Tournament appearances, including seven-straight from 1998-2004. The Tigers are tied for the most NCAA trips among SEC schools since 1997.

48 WINS PER SEASON

LSU is averaging 48 wins per season since 2001, the seventh best average in the nation.

63 ALL-SEC SELECTIONS

LSU has garnered 63 All-SEC First-Team or Second-Team selections since 1997, the second-highest of any school in the conference.

128 WEEKS RANKED IN THE ESPN/USA SOFTBALL POLL

The Tigers have been inside the ESPN/USA Softball Poll for 128 of the 139 weeks since the poll's inception during the 2003 season, while spending 44 weeks ranked inside the Top 10.

193 WEEKS RANKED IN THE NFCA/USA TODAY POLL

LSU has ranked among the nation's elite for 193 of the 216 weeks of the NFCA/USA Today Poll since the Tigers began play in 1997. Highlighting the stretch was a span of 103 consecutive weeks in the poll from Feb. 20, 1998 to March 30, 2005. LSU also has been ranked inside the nation's Top 10 for 93 of those weeks.

.754 WINNING PERCENTAGE

LSU has compiled the sixth-best winning percentage in the nation since the 2001 season.

.737 WINNING PERCENTAGE IN SEC GAMES

LSU has posted the second-best winning percentage of any school during conference play.

.706 WINNING PERCENTAGE IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT

LSU has the best winning percentage in SEC Tournament history by 102 percentage points.

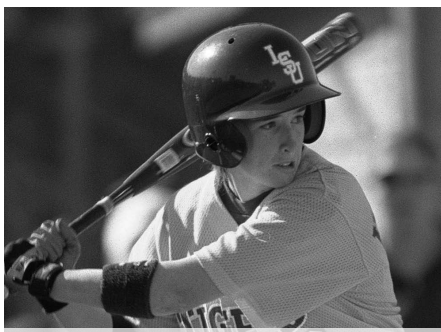

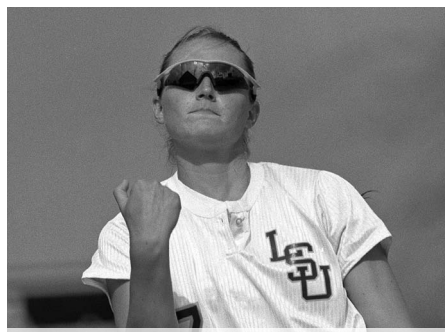

MEDIA TRAINING

LSU is one of the few schools where student-athletes go through media training to enhance their communication skills. Dr. Tommy Karam and Dr. Shirley White are two experts in the field who give training sessions to student-athletes here on campus. The Academic Center features

a mock press conference setting to get student-athletes acclimated to giving interviews in front of both print and electronic media. Karam and White record the mock interviews on camera and then provide feedback, allowing student-athletes to become more comfortable and confident when doing actual interviews.

ESPN, SEC AND LSU

In 2009-10, ESPN and the Southeastern Conference reached a milestone 15-year agreement. ESPN acquired rights to every SEC home football game -- excluding those on the CBS network broadcast package -- and serves as the exclusive national cable home and the syndication rightsholder for the conference. LSU has made 11 appearances on the ESPN family of networks since the 2010 season as part of that package.



Bo Campbell Auditorium

The 1,000-seat auditorium is used through the year as a classroom and lecture hall. Each seat in the auditorium has space for a laptop and a modem hookup, providing each student unlimited learning opportunities. 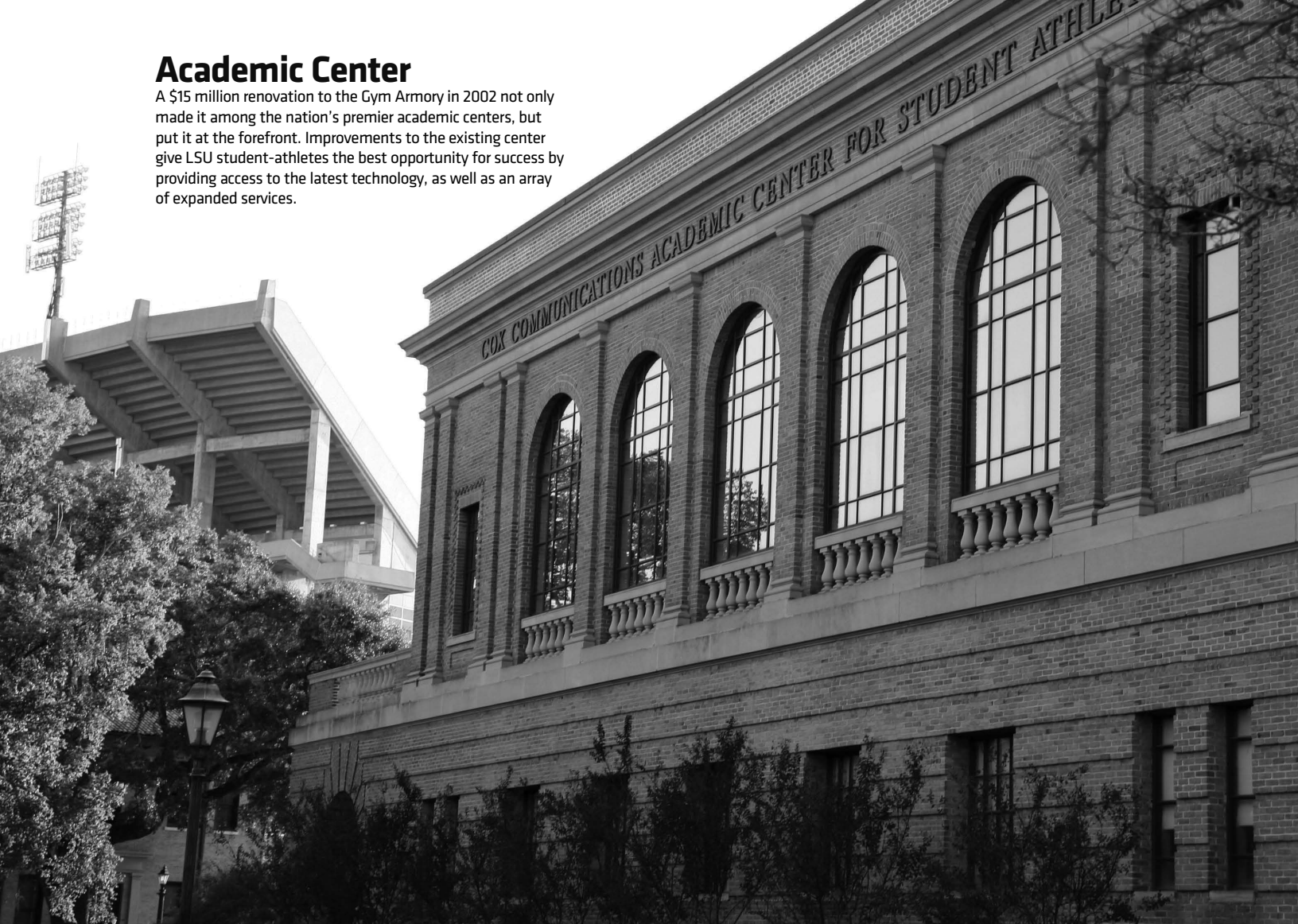

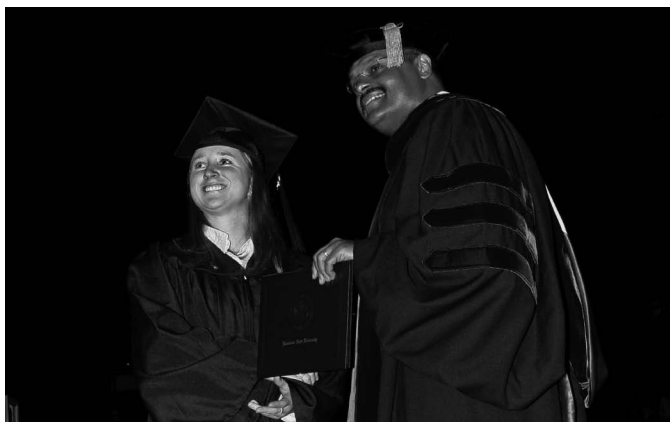

Nutrition First

LSU is one of the few schools nationally who maintain a state-of-the-art nutritional program for today's student-athlete. Senior Associate Athletic Trainer Shelly Mullenix coordinates with LSU dining services to provide a balanced training table diet. LSU trainers also meet one-on-one with student-athletes to give them expert nutritional information.

ATHLETIC TRAINING



LSU boasts the largest and most complete athletic training facilities in all of collegiate athletics with both the Operations Center and the Broussard Center for Athletic Training in Tiger Stadium. Both are furnished with the latest in technology and equipment. The Operations Center training room features a full view of the practice fields, two hot/cold jacuzzis and an underwater treadmill.

The Broussard Center includes an on-site x-ray room, an in-house pharmacy, as well as the largest hydrotherapy pool in both collegiate and professional sports and is one of the few collegiate training centers with a full-service pharmacy and a full-service vision center.

Hydrotherapy Treatment

An integral part of rehabbing and developing LSU student-athletes is the operations center's hot/cold jacuzzis and an underwater treadmill in a fully equipped Hydrotherapy room. The Broussard training center boasts the largest hydrotherapy pool in both collegiate and professional sports.

Broussard Athletic Training Center



The two story, 22,000 square foot facility contains 20 treatment tables with the newest forms of modalities available, 14 taping stations, a 1,600 square foot rehabilitation area which contains the latest rehabilitation equipment including the Cybex Norm, Woodway treadmills and Body Master select rise equipment. LSU's multi-million dollar athletic training facility is named in honor of Dr. Martin J. Broussard (left), the legendary trainer whose career spanned over 40 years at LSU.

- In the 2009, 2010 and 2011 editions of U.S. News & World Report's America's Best Colleges, LSU is ranked in the first tier for "Best National Universities."
- LSU is the only public university in Louisiana designated as having very high research activity (RU/VH) by the prestigious Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, the highest ranking awarded to doctorate-granting institutions.
- LSU was named to the 2009 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll, the highest federal recognition a college or university can receive for its commitment to volunteering, service-learning and civic engagement, by the Corporation for National and Community Service.
- LSU earned the prestigious Carnegie Community Engagement and Outreach classification in 2008, one of 68 public institutions nationally with this elective classification based on community engagement.

O'Neal announced his retirement from the NBA in June 2010 after a brilliant Hall of Fame career of 19 seasons.

Seimone Augustus

Seimone Augustus received her degree in 2005 after just three years at LSU and while earning NCAA Women's Basketball National Player of the Year honors twice. She was the first pick of the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Minnesota Lynx and teamed with fellow LSU alum Sylvia Fowles to claim an Olympic gold medal for the United States in 2008.

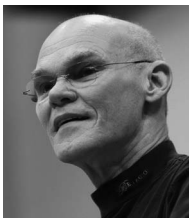
Eduardo Aguirre, Jr.

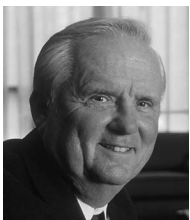
James Carville

Lod Cook

Cook graduated from LSU with a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 1955 and then earned his Master's degree in petro engineering in 1955. Cook served as CEO of ARCO for nine years.



Sylvia Fowles

Sylvia Fowles was a two-time State Farm All-American at LSU before going onto a career in the WNBA with the Chicago Sky. Fowles and Seimone Augustus became the first LSU basketball players to claim Olympic gold when they did so in 2008 for the United States.

Mike Papajohn

The starting centerfielder on LSU's inaugural College World Series team in 1986, Mike Papajohn today is a prominent actor in Hollywood. Papajohn was the only actor to star in four \$150 million movies in the same calendar year doing so in 2009. The LSU alumnus has appeared in blockbuster films: Spiderman, Terminator Salvation, Transformers: Revenge of the Fallen and For the Love of the Game.

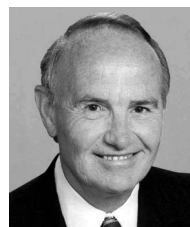

The following nine individuals are the only athletes to have their jerseys retired by LSU. Men's basketball has retired the No. 23 for Pete Maravich, No. 50 for Bob Pettit, Jr., No. 33 for Shaquille O'Neal and No. 40 for Rudy Macklin. Women's basketball retired the No. 33 for Seimone Augustus. Football's only two retired jerseys are the No. 20 worn by Billy Cannon and the No. 37 worn by Tommy Casanova. Baseball retired the No. 15 in honor of longtime coach and former athletics director Skip Bertman and the No. 20 for Ben McDonald. Casanova, Macklin and McDonald joined the prestigious list in May 2009. Augustus became the first woman in LSU Athletics history to have her jersey retired in January 2010.

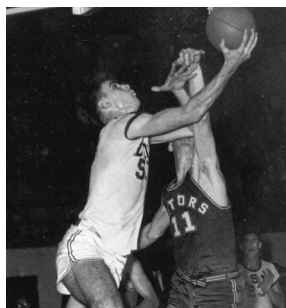

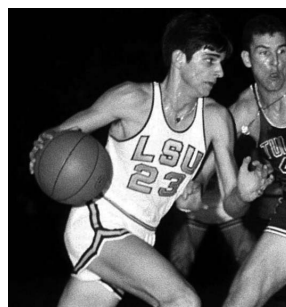

50 Bob Pettit

Pettit led LSU to its first NCAA Final Four in 1953 and he later became the first player in NBA history to exceed the 20,000-plus point barrier. Pettit is a member of the NBA Hall of Fame, and in 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



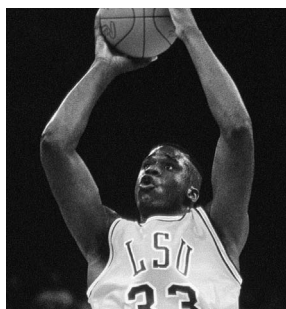
23 Pete Maravich

"Pistol Pete," Maravich still holds the NCAA record for career points with 3,667 and for career scoring average with 44.2 points a game. He was selected the National Player of the Year in 1970 after leading the Tigers to the NIT Final Four. He scored 50-plus points an amazing 28 times. He went on to a 10-year professional career and was selected as one of the NBA's 50 greatest players in 1997.



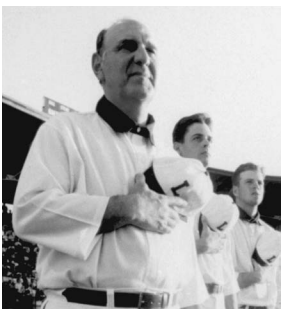
20 Billy Cannon

One of the true legends of college football in the South, Cannon was the 1959 Heisman Trophy winner and helped the Tigers to the 1958 national title. Cannon's most memorable performance came in 1959 against Ole Miss when No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss 3-0 in the fourth quarter. He fielded a punt, broke seven tackles and returned it 89 yards for the 7-3 victory. He went on to a successful 11-year professional career.



33 Shaquille O'Neal

O'Neal was the first pick in the 1992 NBA Draft. He was named MVP of the league in 2000 and was a three-time NBA Finals MVP after leading the Los Angeles Lakers to three World Championships. At LSU, O'Neal averaged 21.6 points and 13.6 rebounds for his career, and in 1991, he was named the World's Amateur Athlete of the Year as well as SEC Athlete of the Year and National Player of the Year. In 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



15 Skip Bertman

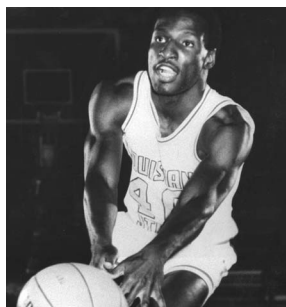
A legend in the college baseball ranks, Bertman created a dynasty at LSU, guiding the Tigers to five national titles in a 10-year stretch from 1991-2000. He also coached the United States to a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and was an assistant on the gold medal-winning U.S. squad in Seoul, Korea, in 1988. Bertman retired from coaching following the 2001 season and served as LSU's athletics director for seven years. Bertman was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006.

About LSU Retired Jerseys

The retirement of the jerseys of Casanova, McDonald, Macklin and Augustus comes under a new provision of the LSU jersey retirement bylaws that says the retirement of an athlete's jersey in a particular sport does not preclude a current student-athlete in that sport from wearing the jersey number in that or any other sport, subject to the discretion of the head coach. This provision applies only to jerseys retired after January 1, 2007, so the numbers worn by Maravich, Pettit, O'Neal, Cannon and Bertman may never again be worn by future student-athletes in their respective sports. To have a jersey retired at LSU, an athlete must have completed intercollegiate competition for LSU a minimum of five years prior to nomination. Athletes must have demonstrated truly unusual and outstanding accomplishments, exceeding and in addition to all criteria used for Hall of Fame selection. Nominees must have a unanimous vote of support from the Hall of Fame committee.

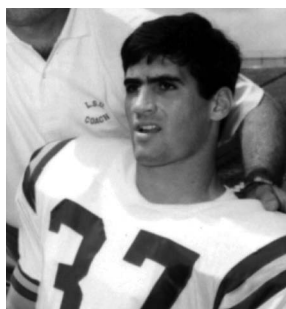
Rudy Macklin 40

Rudy Macklin was a two-time basketball All-American selection during his Tiger career from 1976-81 during which time he became LSU's all-time leading rebounder with 1,276 boards and the second-leading scorer in school history behind only the legendary Pete Maravich with 2,080 points. He led the Tigers to two Elite Eight appearances and the 1981 Final Four in Philadelphia. He still holds the school single game rebound record with 32, a mark like some of the great records in any sport that may never be broken.



Tommy Casanova 37

Tommy Casanova is the only three-time All-American in the history of LSU football and is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame. During his Tiger career from 1969-71, Casanova personified versatility for his myriad of talents as he played offense, defense, returned punts and kickoffs. One of just two three-time All-SEC performers at LSU, he played six seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals of the NFL while earning his medical degree.



Ben McDonald 19

Ben McDonald won the prestigious Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's most outstanding player, in 1989 and is a member of the College Baseball Hall of Fame. He led LSU to two College World Series appearances. In 1989, McDonald was named National Player of the Year by Baseball America, The Sporting News and Collegiate Baseball. He was selected by the Baltimore Orioles as the No. 1 pick in the major league draft in 1989 and went on to enjoy a 10-year major league career with the Orioles and the Milwaukee Brewers.



Seimone Augustus 33

Seimone Augustus is the only women's basketball player in school history to earn State Farm Coaches Association All-America honors three times: 2004, 2005 and 2006. Augustus became LSU's first NCAA National Player of the Year and she claimed the honor twice in 2005 and 2006. A 2006 graduate of LSU, Augustus was the WNBA's No. 1 draft pick in 2006. She went on to lead the United States to a gold medal at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games.

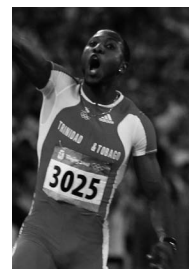

She is ready to build on a championship legacy and tradition of two Women's College World Series trips, five SEC regular season crowns, five SEC Tournament titles and 13 NCAA Regional appearances.

"Before talking about the 2012 season, I would like to thank Yvette Girouard and everything that she has done for this program and what she has built," Torina said. "It's through her efforts that we're standing in one of the nation's top facilities and one of the best places to play college softball. It's no question that this is done by all of her effort and the efforts of the staff previous to our current staff. I want to thank her for giving us these 22 young women. This team was selected 100 percent by her, and I love them like they were my own. We thank her every day for everything that she's done for this program."

The Tigers return all the necessary ingredients with a solid nucleus of experience, depth and talented newcomers to return to the pinnacle of the softball world. Torina and the Tigers have their sights high and hope to earn the program's third trip to Oklahoma City.

"Number one is to be in the College World Series, without question," Torina said. "It was very clear to us as a coaching staff where this team wanted to go. These eight

seniors haven't won a regional yet and haven't won a conference championship. They've been in some battles, and they've done some good things. A championship is what they talk about. They want a championship, they want to leave their mark and they want to hang a trophy in the hallway. They want to do all of those things. From the minute we got here, they expressed that that's where they wanted to be, and it fit perfectly with where we were trying to go as well."

To reach those goals, Torina has challenged the 2012 Tigers to have the 'it' factor in every aspect of the program whether it be during the execution of a hitting drill at practice to delivery season tickets to the fans.

"One thing we've talked a lot about during the fall and leading into the season is having the 'it' factor," Torina said. This 'it' factor, we talked about creating it with this team, and it's kind of that intangible factor that you can't necessarily put words on. Coach Miles talked about it a lot in his football postgame interviews and talked all year that this team just had 'it'.

"Our tag line is 'whatever it takes'. We've talked a lot with our players about what it takes to create that, and what is it about those special teams that have that 'it' factor," Torina continued. "It's determination, it's chemistry and it's work ethic. All of those things go into creating that 'it' factor. I feel like this is a very solid unit of 22 players, and all will contribute this season."

LSU also heads into its fourth season of "Softball on the Berm" at Tiger Park. The park has gone through many additions from when it first opened its gates in 2009, including a state-of-the-art ticket booth and training facility.

During the fall season, LSU played host the National Pro Fastpitch All Stars as part of the league's college tour. The Tigers carried a 1-0 lead into the seventh inning, and had the NPF All Stars down to their final out.

"I'm pretty proud of how it went," Torina said after the game. "I'm proud of our team, I'm proud of the city of Baton Rouge and the LSU fans. I think this performance can boost us to play with anybody in the country. If we can play with professional players then obviously we can play with anybody in Division one. This is going to be a really good year for LSU softball. I feel really good about what is in store for us."

THE BATTERY

As is the case for any collegiate softball program, LSU's pitching staff will have the biggest impact on the Tigers.

Reigning All-SEC First-Team, NFCA All-South Region First-Team and NFCA All-American Third-Team performer Brittany Mack headlines a three-arm arsenal and is looking to build on a 20-7 junior campaign.

Mack ranked among the SEC's elite in ERA (1.74), opponent batting average (.187) and strikeouts (209). She won 10 of her last 13 decisions, including a pair of wins during LSU's sweep of No. 1 Alabama last season.

Rachele Fico also finished last season strong and returned to her 2010 SEC Freshman of the Year and NFCA All-South Region First-Team form. Her 183 strikeouts were seventh in the SEC.

During the NCAA Regional opener against Syracuse, Fico notched 18 strikeouts. The 18 Ks were the second-most in program history for a single-game, only behind Britni Sneed's 19 strikeout against Oklahoma at the 2001 Women's College World Series.

Meghan Patterson compiled a 6-1 mark during her freshman campaign and picked up eight or more strikeouts during six of her eight starts. The Destrehan native finished the season with 91 Ks in 53.2 innings of work.

"We're led by our pitching staff," Torina said. "All three of them are very talented, they're very special and they will keep us in every ball game on the schedule this season. Any one of them could be a No. 1 at many universities throughout the country. We're really lucky to have a staff of that caliber all in one place."

Calling the shots for LSU behind the plate will be Morgan Russell and Lauren Houston. The veteran duo has combined to start in 185 games over the last three seasons for the Tigers.

THE INFIELD

LSU's infield was key as the Tigers compiled a sparkling .973 fielding percentage in 2011, a second straight Top 20 national finish.

Tammy Wray, an All-Louisiana Second Team selection, returns to the hot corner. She tallied 126 assists, second-most in the SEC. Offensively, Wray belted eight home runs and 33 RBIs to rank second and third on the squad.

Opposite Wray on the diamond will be Ashleigh Kuhn at first base. The Northwestern State transfer sat out last season due to NCAA rules. She tallied a .289 average with 28 RBIs during the 2009 season with the Demons.

Heidi Pizer and Dylan Supak also are candidates to see time at first base. Pizer chipped in nine RBIs in limited action, while Supak collected TSWA All-State and All-District accolades all four years at LaGrange High School in Texas.

Allison Falcon, Juliana Santos and Cassie Trosclair will all see time in the middle of the infield. Defensively when not on the field, the trio could see time in the lineup at designated player.

Falcon is back to full strength after an injury cut her 2011 season to only five appearances. LSU was 30-3 when she was the starting shortstop in 2010.

Santos was a strong force at the top of the lineup as LSU won 33 of 43 games last season when Santos batted in the No. 2 hole. She cranked a team-leading nine doubles en route to 26 RBIs.

Trosclair made 50 appearances, including 36 starts after transferring from Auburn. Her .270 batting average was upped to a .328 clip when she was in the No. 7 or No. 8 spot in the lineup.

Rikki Alcaraz and Kailey McCasland will provide depth on the infield and also are in the running to see time in the lineup at designated player.

Alcaraz, from Marist High School in Orland Park, Ill., picked up All-Conference and All-Area honors during the 2008, 2009 and 2010 season. McCasland hails from California's San Clemente High School where she secured multiple All-South Coast League First-Team picks.

"We have a lot of depth and some great competition in a variety of positions on the field," Torina said. "Another thing that's contributed is that I'm new, and I haven't seen these guys play in a ton of games yet. As a coach, I don't want to make judgment on people solely based on practice, because I don't think that's fair."

"There are a bunch of girls that want to be great, and they're working hard every day," Torina continued. "They all deserve to play, without question. They've all worked and deserve a chance and deserve a spot."

THE OUTFIELD

LSU's outfield will have a veteran presence with Ashley Applegate and Ashley Langoni on the corners. Simone Heyward also is back to patrol centerfield.

Applegate will start in right field after missing most of last season due to injury. Being used primarily at designated player, she spent the majority of the 2010 season with over a .300 batting average and produced 12 multi-hit efforts. She also scored 35 runs and drew 32 walks in 2010.

Heyward, an 2011 All-SEC All-Freshman honoree, turned in a team-leading .294 batting average, scored a team-high 39 runs, drew a team-best 28 walks and added a team-leading 23 stolen bases from the leadoff spot. The 23 stolen bases ranked sixth in the SEC.

Langoni compiled a .271 batting average to go along with five dingers and 38 RBIs. Her 48 hits and 12 multi-hit performances paced the Tigers, while her 38 RBIs were second. She also produced several ESPN type web gem plays from her left field post.

A.J. Andrews, Jacee Blades, Alex Boulet, Katie Guillory and Tammy Vermeulen will provide depth in the outfield. All five players possess blazing speed and are candidates to serve as pinch runners in critical situations.

Andrews racked up 57 stolen bases on a crisp .557 hitting ratio while at Countryside High School in Florida and was selected to play in the 2011 Under Armour All-America Game.

Blades, a utility option, will be utilized in the infield when not in the outfield. She started 38 games and notched a .252 batting average last season. She also garnered a perfect fielding percentage with 60 putouts and 25 assists.

Boulet scored on 14 of her 28 pinch running attempts. She also registered 19 stolen bases to not only rank second on the team but tied for 10th in the SEC.

Guillory checked in with 17 pinch running appearances after she missed the first two months of the season due to injury.

Vermeulen was named to the Section 11 Team and played travel ball for Florida's Gold Coast Hurricanes squad.

"I can't ask for a lot more than this team, and I can't ask for a lot more than what they've given us as a staff," Torina said. "They have done every single thing we've asked them to. They've bought into every change and everything we've asked them to do."

"I like to have some speed, some power," Torina continued. "We work on defense the same amount of time we work on offense, and we don't go a day without doing one or the other. This team is capable of all of the things I'm asking them to do. We can run, we can hit, we can play defense and definitely pitch. They have all of the tools and all of the things I need them to have."

THE SCHEDULE

The Tigers affirmed their long-standing commitment of facing the nation's elite as they square off with five of the eight participants from the 2011 Women's College World Series. In total, the 2012 slate features 27 games against 13 teams that qualified for the 2011 NCAA Tournament.

"From start to finish, the 2012 schedule will be very challenging for the Tigers," Torina said. "Our team will have to put forth its best effort every time we take the field. We will have many opportunities throughout the season to prove ourselves matching up with softball's best-of-the-best."

LSU will play host to three non-conference tournaments, including the Tiger Classic [Feb. 10-12] on opening weekend. The Tigers square off with Big 10 NCAA Tournament foes Michigan and Penn State before meeting Louisiana Tech.

LSU welcomes Alcorn State, McNeese State and South Alabama for the Tiger Invitational [Feb. 25-26], while Mississippi Valley State and Troy head to the Capitol City for the Purple & Gold Challenge [March 9-10] to conclude the non-conference tournament schedule.

LSU hits the road for the first time at the high profile Louisville Slugger Desert Classic [Feb. 18-19] in Las Vegas, Nev., where the Tigers meet up with 2011 WCWS participant California, 2011 NCAA Tournament Team DePaul, Cal State Northridge and Utah State.

At the prestigious The Preview [March 2-4], LSU has a quartet of games scheduled with 2011 WCWS participants Oklahoma and Oklahoma State. The Tigers will play at a pair of games at the ASA Hall of Fame Stadium, home of the WCWS, in addition to the campus sites.

"We are fortunate to put a team on the field that has a great deal of experience," Torina said. "Our eight seniors have the poise and confidence to tackle these types of marquee games. They truly have the chance to go out on top. There's no question that we will have to show up at our best level each and every day."

LSU welcomes ACC members Florida State [Feb. 15] and Georgia Tech [March 21] along with Southeastern Louisiana [Feb. 21] for midweek action to Tiger Park. The Tigers also take on Nicholls State [March 7 & April 4] and McNeese State [March 28 & April 18] for midweek home-and-home series.

The rugged SEC schedule gets underway with a home mid-week doubleheader against 2011 NCAA Tournament participant Auburn [March 14]. Other league series inside the friendly confines of Tiger Park include three-game sets with Mississippi State [March 16-18], Arkansas [March 30-April 1], Ole Miss [April 20-22] and 2011 NCAA Super Regional qualifier Georgia [April 27-29].

The Tigers have conference road trips to South Carolina [March 23-25] before meeting SEC heavy hitters which include 2011 WCWS participant Alabama [April 6-8], 2011 NCAA Tournament participant Tennessee [April 13-15], 2011 WCWS finalist Florida [April 24] and 2011 NCAA Super Regional qualifier Kentucky [May 4-6].

"The atmosphere for SEC softball is second to none," Torina said. "Each team gives one another their best shot week in and week out. I know our fans are already excited for the season. Our players are ready for the challenges ahead."

Beth Torina, who guided Florida International's program to new heights and a former University of Florida standout, was hired as LSU's fourth softball coach on June 20, 2011.

Torina, a two-time Sun Belt Coach of the Year recipient, led FIU to a 129-111 record in four seasons. She directed the Golden Panthers to their first NCAA Tournament victory in 2010. The 2010 campaign also saw FIU sweep the SBC postseason awards as Kasey Barrett was the league's Pitcher of the Year, Ashley McClain was tabbed Player of the Year and Brie Rojas garnered Freshman of the Year status.

Individually, Torina coached 10 players to 14 All-SBC selections sparked by Jessy Alfonso and McClain, who have picked up All-SBC First-Team honors during each of the last two seasons. McClain also has collected 2010 and 2011 NFCA All-South Region First-Team accolades.

Torina currently serves as an assistant coach under Florida head coach Tim Walton for the USSSA Pride of the National Pro Fastpitch League. The Pride won the 2010 NPF championship and their roster features multiple Olympians, including ESPN softball analyst Jessica Mendoza.

"We are extremely excited to welcome Beth to LSU and for her to take the leadership reigns of our softball program," Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Allewa said. "She brings great passion, energy and character to our program and will wear the purple and gold with pride!"



Prior to FIU, Torina spent six seasons as the top assistant at the University of Houston. She served as the program's recruiting coordinator

where the Cougars won the 2007 Conference USA championship and made two NCAA Regional appearances.

One of her most prized recruits, Angel Shamblin, went on to become a two-time C-USA Pitcher of the Year, an NFCA All-South Region selection and a 2008 NFCA All-American. In addition to Shamblin, Torina saw seven UH hurlers receive All-Conference USA accolades during her tenure.

Torina began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Stetson University from 2000-02, leaving her mark on the Hatters' softball program after helping lead the 2001 squad to a share of the regular season Atlantic Sun Conference championship. Torina's pitchers set a quartet of school records, including wins (45), shutouts (20), strikeouts (385) and strikeouts per seven innings (6.70).

Torina earned her B.S. in health sciences and occupational therapy from Florida in 2000. During her playing career with the Gators, she was a member of the 1998 Southeastern Conference Regular Season Championship team as the squad's top pitcher. She posted 60 career wins, which currently ranks tied for fourth in the UF record book.

Howard Dobson

1st Season at LSU

Howard Dobson enters his first season as an assistant coach at LSU. He will serve as the program's hitting coach, assist with recruiting and recently was one of 24 coaches named to the 2011-12 United States Women's National Team coaching pool.

Dobson spent the previous four seasons as the head coach of Southern Miss. During his tenure with the Golden Eagles, he coached seven All-Conference USA performers highlighted by Megan Hill. The four-time All-Conference USA pick set eight offensive program records, including hits (205), RBIs (151), runs scored (148), home runs (48) and total bases (398). She also garnered NFCA All-Midwest First-Team accolades, the program's first recipient since the 2000 season.

Prior to Southern Miss, Dobson served as an assistant coach at Oklahoma for five seasons. He helped the Sooners continue to develop their reputation as not only a Big 12 offensive powerhouse but a national offensive juggernaut.

OU topped the Big 12 in scoring and also ranked among the league's top two in batting average during all five of his seasons in Norman. The Sooners had seven players secure NFCA All-American honors in addition to 15 NFCA All-Midwest Region selections and 20 All-Big 12 honorees. Norrele Dickson, Heather Scaglione and Kristin Vesely racked up multiple NFCA All-America selections under Dobson.

Dobson played an instrumental role as OU made a pair of trips to the Women's College World Series trips in 2003 and 2004. The Sooners also made four NCAA Super Regional runs (2003, 2004, 2005, 2007) during their five consecutive trips to the postseason sparked by a 55-win campaign in 2007, which is tied for third in the OU record books.

Before Oklahoma, Dobson contributed to the establishment of Houston's softball program in 2000. The Orange, Texas, native had players notch 10 All-Conference USA accolades in two seasons fueled by Kristen Glowacz's 2002 C-USA Freshman of the Year award. The 2002 Cougars paced C-USA in hits (480), runs scored (279), slugging percentage (.448), RBIs (244) and home runs (47).

Dobson began his coaching career in the Pelican State with stops at Southeastern Louisiana, McNeese State and Barbe High School in Lake Charles. He directed his team at Barbe to a 5A state championship and

gained valuable experience working at collegiate skills camps along with coaching on the international level. In the summer of 1999, his international team won the German Open.

A former all-conference performer at Panola College in Carthage, Texas, Dobson went on to finish his collegiate baseball career at McNeese State where he graduated with a degree in health and human performance and English in 1997.

Dobson and his wife Katharine have a five-year old son, Trip.





ASSISTANT COACH

Lindsay Leftwich

1st Season at LSU

Lindsay Leftwich embarks on her first season as an assistant coach at LSU. She is involved with all aspects of the program which include defense, hitting, recruiting and camps.

The former Northwestern State standout was with Beth Torina every step of the way for the previous four seasons at Florida International. The Golden Panthers collected 14 All-Sun Belt selections sparked by a sweep of the league's 2010 postseason awards where Kasey Barrett picked up the SBC's Pitcher of the Year, Ashley McClain notched SBC Player of the Year and Brie Rojas secured SBC Freshman of the Year. McClain also has come away with National Fastpitch Coaches Association [NFCA] All-South Region First-Team honors in 2010 and 2011.

FIU posted a 38-21 record and claimed the program's second-ever NCAA Tournament bid and first-ever NCAA Tournament victory in 2010. The Golden Panthers improved their win total during three of her four seasons, and she aided Torina to a pair of SBC Coach of the Year awards.

Prior to FIU, Leftwich served as a graduate assistant at New Mexico. She was in charge of softball operations and assisted with daily coaching duties during the 2007 season. In 2006, Leftwich worked as the pitching coach at Wichita State where she helped the Shockers compile a 35-23 record.

Leftwich, a native of Houston, Texas, opened her coaching career as a student assistant at Northwestern State. She aided in coaching the offense and catchers in addition to playing an instrumental role in recruiting, fundraising, alumni relations and camps.

Leftwich enjoyed a three-year playing career with the Demons highlighted by NFCA All-Southeast Region, All-Southland Conference and All-Louisiana Second-Team selections in 2002.

NSU racked up a program-record 45 victories en route to a NCAA Tournament berth during the 2002 campaign. Leftwich drove home 44 RBIs, which are currently tied for third-most in program history for a single season, while her 123 assists on the infield paced the Southland Conference.

During her career, Leftwich added five Southland Conference along with a pair of Louisiana Sports Writers Association [LSWA] Hitter of the Week awards. She finished her career ranked fifth in both home runs and

RBIs at NSU after a back injury held her out of her senior season.

An excellent student-athlete, Leftwich garnered numerous academic accolades, including Verizon Academic All-District Team recognition in 2002 and 2004 and NFCA Scholar Athlete recognition from 2001-04. In 2005, she earned a bachelor's degree in psychology and a minor in art and substance abuse prevention.





Quinlan Duhon
Director of Softball Operations

Quinlan Duhon heads into third season as the Director of Operations for the LSU softball program after her exceptional four-year career from 2005-08. She also served as a student marketing assistant during the 2008-09 academic year following her playing career.

Duhon is responsible for handling all the behind-the-scenes aspects of the softball program which includes team travel, supporting camp operations, supervising player academic progress, ordering and distributing of equipment, organizing recruiting functions and campus visits, as well as serving as the program's liaison to the Diamond Backers Booster Club. She also oversees a staff of three student managers.

Duhon has been instrumental in the direction and growth of the team's footprint in the Baton Rouge community by coordinating the season ticket delivery program and being involved in the scheduling of the team's philanthropy projects.

On gameday, Duhon manages the coaching staff's T2 motion video file system from the press box and handles pregame motivational pieces for the Tigers. During her playing career, Duhon was a part of three NCAA Regional teams highlighted by the 2006 and 2007 Super Regional squads. She scored the walk-off, game-winning run in a 5-4 triumph over Louisiana-Lafayette in the 2006 NCAA Regional championship game.

LSU spent the duration of the 2007 season in the nation's Top 10 and compiled an impressive 55-12 record. The Tigers tallied series victories over both No. 1 Tennessee and No. 2 Alabama during the regular season to win its fourth SEC Western Division crown and fourth SEC Tournament title during the Yvette Girourd era.

Duhon had an outstanding postseason being named to both the NCAA Palo Alto Regional and Tempe Super Regional All-Tournament teams. She cranked three home runs in NCAA play, including a two-run shot as part of a 3-2 win against Cal State Northridge in the NCAA Regional opening round.

As one of three captains for the 2008 team, Duhon posted career-bests in batting average (.333), hits (54), home runs (11), RBIs (38), on-base (.424) and slugging percentage (.605) en route to an All-SEC and All-Louisiana Second-Team honors. Duhon finished her LSU career ranked third belting 30 career home runs and is listed among the school's Top 10 in walks (68), RBIs (128), total bases (300) and sacrifice flies (13). She is one of only 11 players in program history to score over 100 runs and post over 150 career hits. The Youngsville native also was a four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection.

Duhon earned her bachelor's degree in general business and currently is pursuing her master's degree in sports management. She lives in Baton Rouge.

Matt Dunaway heads into his fourth year as an associate sports information director at LSU. He serves as the primary media relations contact for the Tiger softball and volleyball teams in addition to promoting LSU athletics community service efforts.

Fight: 2011 Tigers Memorable in Girouard's Final Season

THE HALL OF FAME COACH RIDES OFF INTO THE SUNSET

The LSU softball team fought to the finish during the 2011 season as the Tigers compiled another 40-win season under the guidance of Hall of Fame coach Yvette Girouard.

Prior to the Purple & Gold Challenge in March, Girouard announced that the 2011 season would be her last with the Purple & Gold.

After a seven-game losing streak which included five setbacks versus No. 2 Florida and No. 1 Georgia put the Tigers at 15-12, LSU found its rhythm for a memorable finishing kick.

The Tigers ripped off a 25-6 record down the stretch highlighted by a sweep of No. 1 Alabama in April to climb up to a fourth-place finish in the SEC race.

During LSU's final regular season home series against South Carolina, current and former players along with opposing coaches spotlighted Girouard's impact on college softball with a video tribute. The Hall of Fame coach also penned a hand-written thank you note as a keepsake poster for the fans.

The Tigers returned to the NCAA Tournament. After losing its opening game to Syracuse, LSU fired back with back-to-back wins before taking host and No. 16 seed Texas A&M to extra innings.

After the loss, Girouard left her visor in the third base coaches box honoring the tradition of players leaving their cleats at their positions following the final game of their careers.

G'S LEGENDARY EFFECT ON LSU

Pick whatever criteria you want to use and you'll get the same result: Yvette Girouard was synonymous with outstanding softball. Her effect on LSU, the SEC and NCAA Softball has been powerful.

A pioneer of the game, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Hall of Famer amassed 1,285 career victories, 526 of them coming at LSU, to rank second in the NCAA history.

Girouard's legacy is steeped in championship tradition as the four-time SEC Coach of the Year guided the Tigers to a pair of Women's College World Series appearances (2001 and 2004) in addition to three SEC Regular Season championships (2001, 2002 and 2004) and four SEC Tournament titles (2001, 2002, 2004 and 2007). She coached nine different players to 14 All-American selections during her 11 seasons at LSU.

The Broussard, La., native played an instrumental role to the opening

of the new Tiger Park, the single largest monetary investment LSU has made exclusively to any women's sport.

Girouard played her own personal touch by giving the architects many of the ideas for the park's unique features, including the arches at the front of the stadium and the 1,000-seat outfield berm.

For her efforts, the deck overlooking Tiger Park was named the "Yvette Girouard Clubhouse Deck". On June 9, the Louisiana State Legislature honored Girouard with a resolution for her "extraordinary coaching career."

LSU MAKES HISTORY ON ESPNU ALL-ACCESS SHOW

LSU softball was the first female sports program to be spotlighted on ESPNU's All-Access show. The 30-minute piece originally aired to a national audience on Wednesday, May 4th.

"We were extremely honored to have ESPN, the worldwide leader in sports, spend a day with our program," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "This is another prime example of how much our game has grown during my career. We're excited for our fans and the nation to get an inside look at the day-to-day operations of Tiger softball."

Girouard opened the show by giving an inclusive tour of the state-of-the-art Tiger Park facility, including a glance inside the team locker room. Girouard along with associate coach James DeFeo and assistant coach Kristen Hobbs Cain had the cameras rolling during their daily morning staff meeting.

Junior pitcher Brittany Mack showed the cameras around campus for stops at Mike the Tiger's cage, a team weights session led by Assistant Strength & Conditioning Coordinator Melissa Moore and a glimpse inside the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes.

The piece continued with a training room visit guided by Associate Athletics Trainer Ana Gross before all three coaches were miked up during the team's afternoon practice session.

"It was a once in a lifetime experience and a privilege to show the ESPN cameras around our gorgeous campus," Mack said. "We're very excited to be not only the first softball team, but the first female sports program to be featured. It speaks volumes about our team."

FICO FANS 18 IN NCAA OPENER VERSUS SYRACUSE

Rachele Fico was masterful in LSU's NCAA Tournament opener versus Syracuse. She allowed five baserunners, only two of them to reach scoring position, during her first 10 innings of work.



MACK ETCHES HER NAME ON LSU'S ALL-AMERICAN LIST

Brittany Mack (pictured above) was picked among the nation's elite and became the 13th player in program history to garner Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-America accolades. As a third-team selection, Mack joined Kristin Schmidt, Britni Sneed and Emily Turner on the prestigious list of Tiger hurlers to accomplish this feat.

"Of all the players I've ever coached, Brittany being named an All-American is one of the greatest achievements I'm most proud of," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "She has worked extremely hard not only for herself but her team to overcome physical injuries as a freshman and a sophomore. I'm extremely happy for this particular woman because she's has become a master of her mental game."

Mack, an All-SEC First-Team selection, claimed a 20-7 mark, a stout 1.74 ERA and amassed 209 strikeouts during her 184.2 innings of work to rank among the SEC's Top Seven in those categories. She picked up two of the three victories during LSU's sweep of No. 1 Alabama during the regular season. In the process, Mack doubled her career win and strikeout totals during the 2011 season.

Mack also racked up a trio of SEC Pitcher of the Week awards in 2011 to join Schmidt and Sneed as the only LSU hurlers to earn the honor three times during the same season. The Round Rock, Texas, native enters her senior season 74 Ks away from Cody Trahan for fifth place on the program's all-time list.

In the process, Fico struck out the side three times en route to a memorable 18 strikeouts.

However, the sophomore right-hander had her gem spoiled when Syracuse's Lacey Kohl connected for a three-run homer to break a scoreless tie during the 11th inning.

The 18 Ks were the second-highest single-game effort in program history only behind former three-time All-American Britni Sneed's 19-strikeout performance against Oklahoma at the 2001 NCAA Women's College World Series.

DEJA VU: YOUNG'S BLASTS LIFT LSU PAST NO. 1 BAMA

LSU's series with No. 1 Alabama was filled with everything: clutch walk-off home runs, gutsy pitching performances and record crowds at Tiger Park.

Friday's opener set the tone and marked both the longest game in terms of innings (14) and time (4 hours, 31 minutes) during program history.

Brittany Mack tossed all 14 innings and stranded 16 Alabama baserunners along the way. She worked her out of multiple bases loaded jams en route to a career-best 14 strikeouts and hurled an amazing 234 pitches.

Anissa Young broke the 1-1 deadlock to lead off the 14th inning and ripped the sixth pitch of the sequence, a 2-2 offering, on a line to clear the right field fence.

"It was a curveball that I just sat on and stayed through it," Young said. "It means a lot to me. I just want to say congratulations to my teammates. We stayed positive and did a great job. It was an awesome feeling seeing both the fans along with my teammates jumping up and down. It will be something I will never forget."

If that wasn't enough, Young provided another majestic blast in the 10th inning for a 3-1 victory during game two of the series. Again, Young went to right field for the memorable longball to send the program-record 2,563 fans into pandemonium.

Rachele Fico went the distance and limited the explosive Alabama offense to one run on four hits. She also picked up 11 strikeouts.

"The little things have really paid off this weekend," Fico said. "We have capitalized on all of our opportunities, and we're staying so mentally focused and locked in. To play two extra inning games, it takes so much mental focus for every pitch. We're all here to help each other out. Brittany Mack gave me some pointers from last night's game that helped me do well in tonight's game."

Mack returned to the circle for the series finale and fired a two-hit shutout to clinch the sweep. She recorded nine strikeouts and at one point sat down 14 straight batters.

"Brittany Mack has finally matured. I have said before that she has all the potential to be an All-American pitcher and now it's starting to

show," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "I just wanted us to play well this weekend. That's all any coach can ask of their team is to play well. I knew if we pitched well, we had a chance."

Young and Mack garnered SEC Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their performances.

Young also picked up USA Softball National Player of the Week. She was the fourth player in program history to earn this prestigious honor and joined the elite company of former All-Americans Kristin Schmidt [March 4, 2004], Emily Turner [April 18, 2006 & May 1, 2007] and Kirsten Shortridge [March 26, 2010].

SANTOS TIES PROGRAM SINGLE-GAME HIT MARK

Juliana Santos matched a program single-game record and notched an impressive 5-for-5 effort with three RBIs during LSU's 10-1 victory over Arkansas on April 2.

Santos joined Lauren Castle as the only players in program history to reach the impressive feat. Castle tallied her 5-for-5 effort during a 15-9 triumph over Mississippi State on March 31, 2005.

"It's awfully good to see Juliana swing the bat with a lot of confidence," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We always talk with the players about being a positive during an inning and doing anything you can to help your team be successful. She was the epitome of that today and got on-base a variety of different ways."



HEYWARD PROVIDES INSTANT SPARK

As a freshman, Simone Heyward started 53 of 58 games at centerfield for the Tigers. She garnered a team-leading .294 batting average on 45 hits primarily as the LSU leadoff hitter.

Heyward crossed the plate to score a team-high 39 runs, drew a team-best 28 walks and added a team-leading 23 stolen bases. She went on to claim All-SEC Freshman and All-Louisiana Second-Team honors.

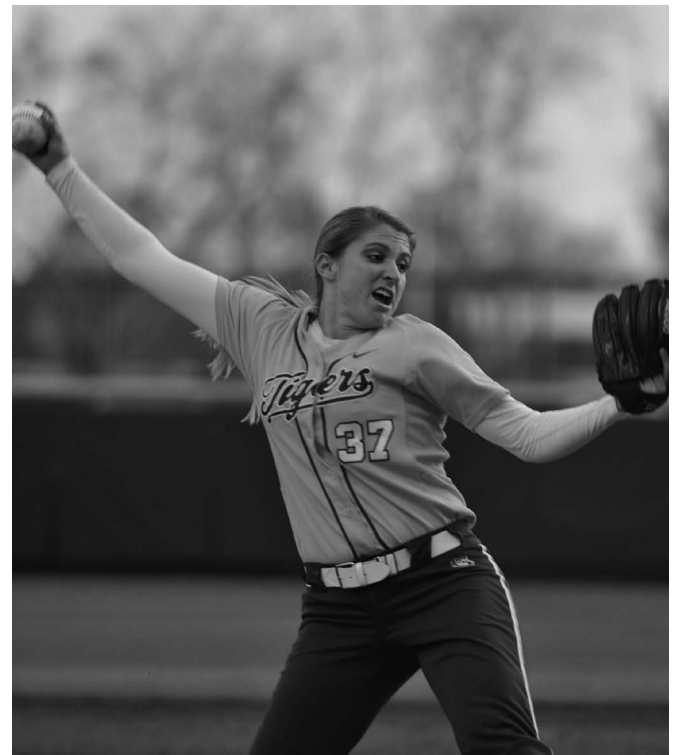

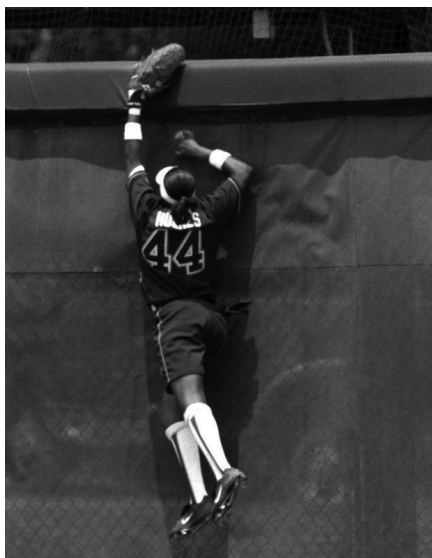

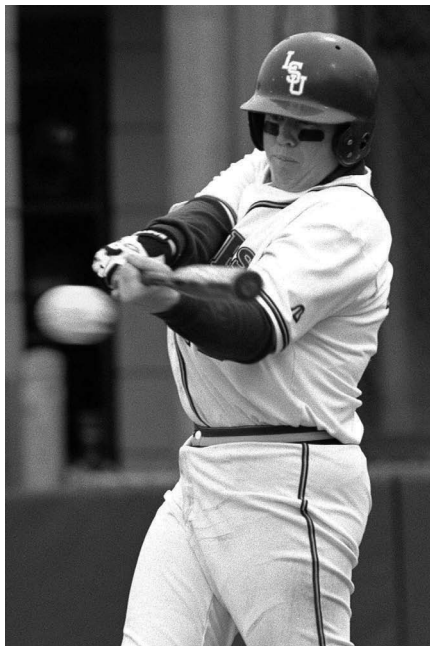

2004 WCWS

For Yvette Girouard and the LSU softball program, the second run to the Women's College World Series was filled with as much joy, drama and excitement as the original.

Like in 2001, the Tigers accomplished the SEC triple crown and claimed the SEC Western Division, Regular Season and Tournament championships.

LSU also won a heart-stopping 13-inning affair and nearly pulled off an impossible feat at the WCWS.

After starting the 2004 campaign with a 5-3 record, the Tigers strung together a 17-game winning streak that stretched into the heart of SEC action.

LSU continued its climb up the polls sparked by a three-game sweep at No. 7 Alabama to end March. The Tigers rocketed up to a program-high and checked in at the No. 2 spot heading into postseason play.

A trio of wins over Alabama, Auburn and Georgia, all ranked among the Top 15 at the time, allowed the Tigers to win their third SEC Tournament in five years.

Unlike 2001, LSU's quest to Oklahoma City didn't start inside the friendly confines of Tiger Park. Instead, the Tigers were shipped to Waco, Texas for the NCAA Regionals.

After wins over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and Seton Hall, LSU found itself down 3-0 to regional host Baylor after two innings.

Camille Harris kickstarted a three-run third inning with a solo home run to left field. Three batters later, future All-American Leslie Klein belted a two-run triple down the right field line to even the score at 3-3.

The Tigers exploded for a quartet of runs in the 10th inning. Stephanie Hill and Lauren Delahoussaye provided RBIs coupled with a Baylor error and wild pitch.

The next day against Illinois, Julie Wiese jumpstarted LSU with a solo shot in the second inning followed by RBI hits from Delahoussaye in the third and fifth innings.

That would be more than enough run support for two-time All-American Kristin Schmidt. She was touched up for only an unearned run on three hits to go along with nine strikeouts as the Tigers raced past the Fighting Illini 4-1 to return to the WCWS.

Another Big 10 team, No. 6 Michigan, would bite the dust in LSU's opening game in Oklahoma City.

After 11 scoreless frames, the Wolverines took a 2-0 advantage to open the 12th inning. In the home half, the Tigers used an RBI-single by Leigh Ann Danos and a passed ball to knot the score at 2-2.

LSU won the game in the 13th on a Harris infield single. After two throwing errors, Sara Fitzgerald crossed home for the game-winning run. In the circle, Schmidt fired all 13 innings and tallied 13 strikeouts.

Following a 2-0 setback to No. 2 UCLA, rain altered the WCWS schedule. The Tigers were faced with the task of winning three games in one day to advance to the championship game.

A Fitzgerald RBI-single in the fourth inning proved to be the game winner as LSU edged No. 4 Florida State 2-1 to start the day. Schmidt provided another 13 strikeouts and surrendered only one run on four hits.

The Tigers fought off elimination for a second time and erased an early 1-0 deficit against No. 5 California. Klein opened the second inning with a solo home run, Harris followed with a two-out, two-run double in the third and Delahoussaye tacked on an insurance run with an RBI-double of her own during the sixth.

Schmidt added eight strikeouts and pitched around trouble to close out the 4-1 victory for her third win of the WCWS.

LSU was poised to finish out the hat trick and carried a 1-0 lead into the fifth inning. Seven outs away, the Golden Bears struck for a quartet of runs to take the win.



After her amazing performance, Kristin Schmidt was named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2004 Women's College World Series.

"What more could you ask for from your team," Girouard said after the game. "I told the team before we got off the bus this morning that we weren't leaving the park until they turned out the lights on us tonight and we are doing just that. Unfortunately, we came up just a little short."

"This team did everything my staff asked of them. They played with total heart. Kristin Schmidt pitched her heart out and this team never died. If I have ever coached a team that deserved to go to the national championship game, then it is certainly this group of girls."

Yvette Girouard's first season at LSU ended in storybook fashion as the Tigers racked up a school record 59 wins and qualified for the program's first Women's College World Series.

LSU also completed the SEC triple crown for the first time en route to the SEC Western Division, Regular Season and Tournament championships.

After splitting a doubleheader at No. 21 Louisiana-Lafayette on April 18, the Tigers reeled off 12 consecutive victories to climb up to No. 3 in the national rankings.

Girouard refocused her team after a 7-3 setback at Auburn in the regular season finale and fired back with a 6-0 win over Auburn to open the SEC Tournament.

Three days later, All-American Stephanie Hastings belted a solo home run that stayed just inside the left field foul pole to open the SEC Championship against No. 22 South Carolina.

The first-inning blast coupled with a stellar effort from SEC Player of the Year Britni Sneed in the circle were more than enough to avenge a 1-0 setback to the Gamecocks from the season before.

Sneed hurled a three-hitter to complete her undefeated SEC season and recorded a tournament-record 11 strikeouts against zero walks to secure the MVP honor and 1-0 triumph.

LSU opened NCAA Regional action with victories over Cornell, Penn State and No. 9 Arizona State before facing No. 19 Louisiana-Lafayette in the finals.

The Tigers broke through for a pair of runs in the third inning as Hastings and future All-American Trena Peel provided RBIs.

An Alana Addison homer brought ULL within 2-1, but Sneed shut the door on the Cajuns retiring 12 of the final 15 batters highlighted by a strikeout of Heather Bertrand to vault LSU to the Women's College World Series.

Following a 2-1 hard-fought, extra inning loss to No. 4 Stanford, the Tigers bounced back behind a Julie Wiese two-run homer to dismiss No. 15 Iowa and set up an elimination tussle with No. 5 Oklahoma, the defending national champion.

The teams battled deep into the night before LSU emerged with a gritty 2-1 triumph in the 13th inning. An errant throw off an Ashley Lewis ground ball allowed Jennifer Schuelke to cross the plate for the game winning run.

Sneed willed her way to an impressive 18 strikeouts, a program single-game record. She escaped multiple jams during extra innings, none more impressive than back-to-back Ks to get out of a bases loaded situation in the 10th.

The game was viewed by 1.57 million fans, a softball record at the time according to NCAA Productions.

The Southeastern Conference

SETTING THE STANDARD FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS IN SOFTBALL

SEC Softball will celebrate its 16th year of existence in 2012 and has established itself as one of the leading conferences in the sport.

The Southeastern Conference qualified seven teams for the 2011 NCAA Tournament - Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU and Tennessee. As the conference, the league also made its 20th overall, ninth consecutive year with at least one team in the Women's College World Series.

For the sixth time in the last seven years dating back to the 2005 season, the SEC advanced multiple teams to Oklahoma City. Both Alabama and Florida met in the semifinal round with the Gators advancing to their second overall championship series.

Alabama won the 2011 conference title as they posted a 19-6 SEC mark. It was their second consecutive year winning the hardware and third title in school history. The Tide posted a 45-7 overall record and Kelsi Dunne earned SEC Pitcher of the Year honors for the second year in a row. Florida's Kelsey Bruder was named SEC Player of the Year while Tennessee's Ellen Renfro earned Freshman of the Year accolades. Kentucky's Meagan Aull was selected as Scholar-Athlete of the Year while Co-Coach of the Year honors went to Yvette Girouard (LSU) and Tim Walton (Florida).

Softball came under the auspices of the Southeastern Conference in the 1996-97 season. Since that time, 10 different conference teams have made appearances in the NCAA Championship, including six teams earning Women's College World Series berths - one by South Carolina in the inaugural season, Alabama in 2000, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2008, 2009, and 2011, Florida in 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011 Georgia in 2009 and 2010, LSU in 2001 and 2004 and Tennessee in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2010.

Eight teams (Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State, South Carolina and Tennessee) have made Top 25 appearances and six teams have climbed into the Top 10 (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee) of the NFCA/USA Today Poll. At least one SEC team has been ranked in the poll each week since the inception of SEC Softball.

South Carolina is the flagship team of the league with a rich history in softball dating back 35 seasons. The Gamecocks have made 15 NCAA Regional and three Women's College World Series appearances.

Mississippi State played softball for five seasons during the 1980's before resuming the sport when it was added to the SEC. Tennessee added softball in 1995-96, one year before its inception in the SEC. Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU and Ole Miss began softball programs in 1996-97 to give the league 11 representatives (Vanderbilt does not sponsor softball).

The 1999 season was the first in which the conference was eligible for an automatic berth to the NCAA Championships. As the sport continues to grow in competitiveness and popularity, the SEC has had six different regular season champions and five different conference tournament champions. LSU leads the way with five regular season crowns, five tournament titles and eight division championships.

- 2011 was the second year of the SEC on ESPN agreement, and SEC softball was televised more than any other league. Over the last two seasons on the ESPN family of networks, there have been 23 regular season games and all 14 games of the 2010 & 2011 SEC Tournament televised.
- In 2011, the SEC had a record of nine combined National Player of the Week awards from the NFCA and USA Softball.
- Three SEC teams were ranked in the top 10 in both final polls: 2) Florida, 3) Alabama, 9) Georgia. Six teams overall made the final Top 25 polls. Kentucky finished in the Top 25 for the first time in school history. The Wildcats ranked 13th in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches poll and 12th in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Poll
- In 2011, seven SEC student-athletes were named NFCA First-Team All-Americans. Overall, a record 16 players were named to first, second and third teams combined which included LSU's Brittany Mack.
- The SEC has earned 138 Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-America honors since 1997. 57 First-Team selections, 48 Second-Team selections, 33 Third-Team selections
- The SEC had 27 student-athletes named to the 2011 Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Region teams. 17 were named First-Team, 10 were named Second-Team.
- The SEC had 20 student-athletes named to the 2011 Capitol One Academic All-District teams highlighted by eight players on the All-America First Team: Stephanie Brombacher (Florida), Kayla Braud (Alabama), Kelsey Bruder (Florida) and Raven Chavanne (Tennessee).

Dr. John V. Lombardi

President, Louisiana State University System



Dr. John V. Lombardi is the fifth individual to serve as the President of the Louisiana State University System. As its Chief Executive Officer, Dr. Lombardi oversees 11 institutions, including five academic campuses, as well as 10 public hospitals located throughout the state. He is also a Professor of History at Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College.

Dr. Lombardi was born in Los Angeles, California and attended Pomona College where he earned his bachelor's degree. He received his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in history from Columbia University. He joined the faculty in the Department of History at Indiana University, where he later served as Dean of International Programs and Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. In 1987, he became Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at the Johns Hopkins University. From 1990-1999, Dr. Lombardi was President of the University of Florida. Prior to his appointment as President of the LSU System, he served as Chancellor of the University of Massachusetts Amherst.

He is a Latin American historian, with a special interest in Venezuela. Dr. Lombardi is also one of the country's foremost authorities in higher education, serving as Co-Editor of The Top American Research Universities. He is the author of numerous professional publications, and along with his wife, Cathryn, co-authored a teaching atlas on Latin American History. He has taught courses in history, intercollegiate sports, and university management.

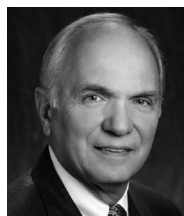

Dr. Michael V. Martin

Chancellor, LSU



Dr. Michael V. Martin assumed the chancellorship of Louisiana State University and A&M College on August 1, 2008. Prior to his appointment as LSU's eighth chancellor, Dr. Martin established a distinguished career in higher education, serving most recently as president of New Mexico State University.

Before arriving at NMSU in 2004, Dr. Martin served for six years as vice president for agriculture and natural resources at the University of Florida, leading the university's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences. He was elevated to senior vice president of the University of Florida shortly before being selected as NMSU's president. Previously, he was vice president for agricultural policy and the dean of the College of Agricultural, Food and Environmental Sciences at the University of Minnesota. He began his academic career at Oregon State University as a faculty member in the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics.

An academic leader dedicated to the land-grant mission, Dr. Martin is recognized as a strong voice for higher education. In 2007, he received the Justin Smith Morrill Memorial Award, named after the author of the bill creating land-grant universities, which honors outstanding service on behalf of the land-grant mission. Only six individuals have been designated to receive this award since it was first given in 1980. For his leadership in improving the quality of life for New Mexico citizens and future generations, he was awarded the 2008 Distinguished Leadership Award by Leadership New Mexico.

Other recent awards include his recognition as a powerbroker by The New Mexico Business Weekly in 2006, being named Outstanding Alumnus of Minnesota State University Mankato in 2006, and receiving the NMSU Social Justice Award in 2005.

Dr. Martin is involved in a wide array of professional and community organizations and activities.

An active scholar, Dr. Martin has authored numerous book chapters and articles for academic journals, trade publications, and the popular press and recently published pieces for The Chronicle of Higher Education and University Business.

Some of his philosophy is summed up in the following quote: "It is the tradition of land-grant universities to be non-traditional," written as part of a 2001 article titled "The Land-Grant University in the 21st Century," published in the Journal of Agricultural and Applied Economics. He traced the history of the



land-grant movement from the mid-1800s and concluded that "the fundamental land-grant principles of accessibility, practical as well as classical education, research and discovery in the public interest, and connectedness to all the people remain powerful and profound."

A native of Crosby, Minn., Dr. Martin earned a bachelor's degree in business and economics and a master's degree in economics at Mankato State College (Minnesota State University) in Minnesota. He received his Ph.D. in applied economics from the University of Minnesota in 1977.

Dr. Martin and his wife, Jan, have two children, both adopted from South Korea. Amanda, a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, is a graphic artist in Saint Paul, Minn. Sam, who holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Minnesota and a master's from Sarah Lawrence College, is a genetics counselor at Beth Israel Hospital in New York City.

Joe Alleva

LSU Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics

LSU

Joe Alleva continues to bring unprecedented national recognition to LSU as Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics. Under Alleva's leadership, LSU enjoys one of the country's premier athletics programs with success on and off the field of competition. Now in his fourth season at LSU, Alleva is dedicated to athletic and academic excellence, and is committed to providing the opportunities and the resources necessary for student-athletes to excel in competition, in the classroom and in the community.

Alleva joined the LSU family on April 4, 2008 after a highly successful tenure as director of athletics at Duke University for 10 years. Alleva's role at LSU was further expanded in August of 2009 when vice chancellor was added to his title by the LSU Board of Supervisors. It is the first time in school history that the director of athletics has also held a vice chancellor position.

Alleva was recently appointed to a five-year term on the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Committee, reinforcing his position as one of the most respected athletic administrators in the country.

Upon his arrival at LSU, Alleva unveiled a strategic master plan for the LSU athletics program -- "LSU: Thru and True" -- to ensure the advancement and future of LSU Athletics as an exemplary program. The central mission of the plan is to create an environment for student-athletes to reach their ultimate potential, prepare them to be champions in life and to set out goals and values for the entire athletics program.

Alleva's vision for LSU athletics facilities includes plans to enhance the appearance of Tiger Stadium and transform the North Stadium Drive corridor into a showplace for the university. Under his direction, LSU's world-renowned track and field program received a state-of-the-art running surface last year when a new track was installed in Bernie Moore Stadium. Extensive renovations to the Tiger soccer facility will be completed this fall, and future plans include a new gymnastics practice facility, a tennis complex, and renovations to the Maravich Center and field house.

Alleva directed a major renovation to the University Club golf course that was completed in September 2010 and allows the LSU men's and women's golf teams to compete on one of the most challenging courses in the country. The renovated course helped prepare Tiger golfers John Peterson and Austin Ernst, respectively, to win 2011 NCAA men's and women's individual championships, marking the first time both titles were claimed by players from the same school. The Lady Tiger golfers were third in the final team standings, marking the highest finish in LSU history.

LSU Athletics completed another highly successful year in 2010-11, highlighted by a Fighting Tiger football squad that posted an 11-2 mark -- including a Cotton Bowl victory -- and finished the season ranked No. 8 in the nation. The 2010-11 athletic year also featured Top 5 national finishes both indoors and outdoors by the men's and women's track and field teams.



In 2008-09, all 20 LSU sports competed in NCAA postseason play for the first time in school history and the Tiger baseball team won the national championship. This past year LSU ranked second among Southeastern Conference teams in the Learfield Director's Cup All-Sports standings and finished in the Top 20 for the sixth year in a row.

Alleva ensures that the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is a first-class facility that provides student-athletes the resources necessary for success in the classroom and personal development. The facility was recently enhanced by the addition of a media training center that gives student-athletes valuable assistance in improving their communications skills. And with a strong emphasis on community service and outreach programs, the implementation under Alleva's direction of the "Geaux Givers" program fosters a relationship between the local community and LSU student-athletes, who regularly participate in philanthropic events.

In addition, Alleva has bolstered the department's L-Club program to reach out and connect with former student-athletes.

Alleva oversees a staff of outstanding coaches and he made two critical additions to LSU's coaching staff in the off-season. He lured the dynamic Nikki Caldwell to LSU to coach the Lady Tiger basketball team and then hired Beth Torina to direct the Tiger softball program, bringing a new wealth of knowledge and passion to the LSU women's sports program.

Alleva is an innovator with bold ideas that benefit not only LSU but all of Greater Baton Rouge. He has been instrumental in the planning of the Bayou Country Superfest,

a two-day country music concert and festival held in Tiger Stadium each spring. The event attracts nearly 100,000 visitors to the LSU campus and makes a tremendous economic impact upon the local community.

Alleva has served on numerous national committees throughout his career including the Football Bowl Certification Committee, the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet and several Southeastern Conference and Atlantic Coast Conference committees.

He became director of athletics at Duke in 1998 and his impressive tenure there propelled the university into the ranks of America's top all-around collegiate programs. Among his outstanding list of accomplishments includes the greatest 10-year period in Duke Athletics, winning more ACC and NCAA championships than in any other decade in school history.

Alleva, whose hometown is Suffern, N.Y., majored in Finance at Lehigh University and received his bachelor's degree in 1975. While at Lehigh, Alleva was the quarterback of the football team and team captain in 1974. Alleva also played on the Lehigh baseball team. He served as a graduate assistant football coach and earned an MBA in 1976.

While at Duke, Alleva played a key role in Durham's community sports scene. He started Little League Baseball in Durham over 20 years ago, and also began the American Legion baseball program.

He is a member of the North Carolina American Legion Hall of Fame, Suffern High School Hall of Fame and the Rockland County Hall of Fame.

Alleva and his wife, Annie, have three children, J.D., Jeff, and Jenny.



Verge Ausberry
Senior Associate AD/Operations

A former LSU football standout, Verge Ausberry joined the athletics administrative staff in August 2001 as the Associate Athletics Director for Operations. He was appointed to the position of Senior Associate Athletics Director in May 2006.

Ausberry supervises and is responsible for football operations, football scheduling and new projects. He also oversees the LSU men's and women's track and field programs, the equipment staff, the strength and conditioning staff, the Dr. Martin Broussard training room, the video department and football game management.

Ausberry, from New Iberia, La., played inside linebacker for the Tigers, lettering in 1986-89. He was part of two SEC championship teams, playing on teams that went to four bowl games.

Before joining the LSU athletic administration, he was very closely involved in the athletic program, first serving for almost seven years as a member of LSU's highly regarded Academic Center for Athletes.

After leaving the Academic Center, he moved in July 1999 to the Tiger Athletic Foundation staff as part of LSU's fundraising arm.

Ausberry received his Bachelor of Science degree in education in May of 1990, his Master of Education degree in administration, supervision and certification in child welfare in May of 1992 and his specialist in higher education administration in 2004. He is presently a doctoral candidate in higher education administration at LSU. He is married to the former Cheri Morial of New Orleans and they have two boys, Austin and Jaiden.



Miriam Segar
Senior Associate AD/Senior Woman Administrator

Former LSU women's basketball player Miriam Segar has been a part of the athletics administration since June of 1995 and was most recently named Senior Associate AD and the department's Senior Woman Administrator after having served as Associate Athletics Director for Student Services since April 2007. She had served as Assistant Athletics Director since 2004.

As LSU's Senior Woman Administrator, Segar's responsibilities include oversight of the highly successful Tiger Olympic Sports program including 17 men's and women's sports. Segar began her administrative career at LSU as the compliance coordinator where she served for three years. Following that, in 1998, Segar was named the director of the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program where she worked until 2001 when she became the Director of Student Services.

While working with CHAMPS/Life Skills, Segar guided the program to the Division I Athletic Directors Program of Excellence Award in 2001.

Senior Associate AD/Business

Mark Ewing, a 27-year employee of Louisiana State University, joined the Athletics Department in January 2001, and serves as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Business.

Associate Vice-Chancellor for University Relations
Senior Associate AD/External Affairs

Herb Vincent serves in the dual position of Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs in the athletic department and Associate Vice Chancellor for University Relations. He was appointed Senior Associate AD in May of 2006 and assumed the additional duties of oversight of University Relations in August of 2009.

Vincent manages communications and serves as the primary public relations officer for the University and all its entities. In his role in athletics, he supervises the sports information office and marketing and promotions office, serves as the primary liaison with LSU Sports Properties, and is the department administrator for the sport of baseball.

Vincent was the LSU sports information director from July 1988 to July 2000. During that time he was named Assistant AD in November of 1989, and then was elevated to Associate AD for Communications in 1992.

In August of 2000 Vincent became Vice President for Communications for the College Sports Southeast regional cable network, headquartered in Birmingham, Ala., before returning to LSU in 2002.

Bo Bahnsen

Senior Associate AD/Compliance and Planning

Returning in 2009 to serve the department in the Compliance Office, Bahnsen is once again proving to be a very versatile member of the athletic department.

Before moving back to Compliance, Bahnsen served the previous five years, in a valuable role as Associate Athletics Director for Internal Relations, overseeing the ticket office and all customer service operations.

Bahnsen oversees the Pete Maravich Assembly Center and game management for all sports except football.

Prior to December of 2003, Bahnsen's primary responsibility for the previous 14 years was to serve as LSU's NCAA compliance officer.

Bahnsen served as manager of the LSU basketball team as an undergraduate at LSU. In 1982, he became the administrative assistant for the men's basketball team, where he worked for five years before moving into athletics administration as director of purchasing and travel for two years.

In July 1987, he became administrative assistant to Athletics Director Joe Dean, overseeing the purchasing office and departmental travel operations until his promotion in 1989. In 1989, he was assigned his primary responsibility as NCAA compliance officer as assistant athletics director, and then was promoted to associate AD in 1996.

Bahnsen has been responsible for overseeing the successful implementation of LSU's Tradition Fund Program, a football-seating plan that requires contributions for the right to purchase approximately 45,000 seats in Tiger Stadium. In 2009, he helped organize the highly successful LSU celebration of the 100th anniversary of the Men's Basketball Program.

A native of Wharton, Texas, Bahnsen attended Wharton County Junior College for two years before transferring to LSU in 1979. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in physical education.

Bahnsen, 51, is married to the former Karen Mayson, a former LSU golfer and current head coach of the Lady Tigers golf program. The couple has two children, Darren and Devin.



Eddie Nuñez

Senior Associate AD/Internal Operations

Eddie Nuñez joined the Athletics Department in October 2003 as the Director of Game and Event Management and was promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Operations and Project Development in June of 2007 and Senior Associate Athletic Director in 2009.

Nuñez's responsibilities include supervision of the men's basketball program, men's tennis program and the women's tennis program. He also supervises the Event Management department as well as directs all capital projects for the athletic department. Under his guidance, the athletic department has experienced over \$200 million dollars in renovations and construction of athletic facility projects. Most recently this included the renovations of Bernie Moore Track, the construction of the new baseball and softball stadiums, the LSU SportShop and the new Basketball Practice Facility. He was responsible for the negotiations of a \$9.0 million dollar contract with Daktronics to replace and enhance all Video boards throughout all LSU Athletic Facilities as well as the implementation of the seat back leasing program in Tiger Stadium.

Nuñez was the Athletic Department's liaison with the Tiger Athletic Foundation and oversees all project development as well as assist in fundraising/development. As the Liaison for TAF, he oversaw the construction of the addition of the Stadium Club in Tiger Stadium and the new football operations center and also represents the athletics department on various University and community committees.

Nuñez came to LSU after two years as the Director of Game and Event Management at Vanderbilt University. At Vanderbilt, along with directing the Game and Event Management department, he also assisted in construction of a New Soccer/ Lacrosse Stadium, a New Basketball Practice Facility and a New Baseball stadium as well as the renovation of several other facilities including renovation of their track facility. Prior to that, Nuñez served as men's basketball administrative assistant at Marquette University for one year and two years as men's basketball graduate assistant and head equipment manager for coach Billy Donovan at the University of Florida. Senior Associate AD/Athletic Facility Management

The 2010-11 athletic year was another successful one for LSU at the conference and national level. Women's track and field claimed the SEC Indoor and Outdoor Championships, while the Tiger football team finished the season ranked eighth after compiling an 11-2 record and a Cotton Bowl victory. The women's golf team earned its highest NCAA Championships finish ever by taking third as freshman Austin Ernst became the first player in school history to win the NCAA individual title. Men's golfer John Peterson followed that up with an individual NCAA title of his own. Swimmer Jane Trepp shattered the SEC record in the 100 breaststroke and won the league title in the event.

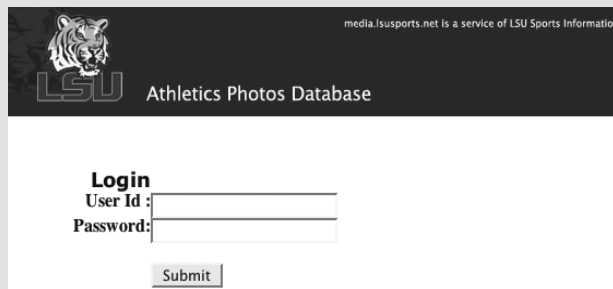

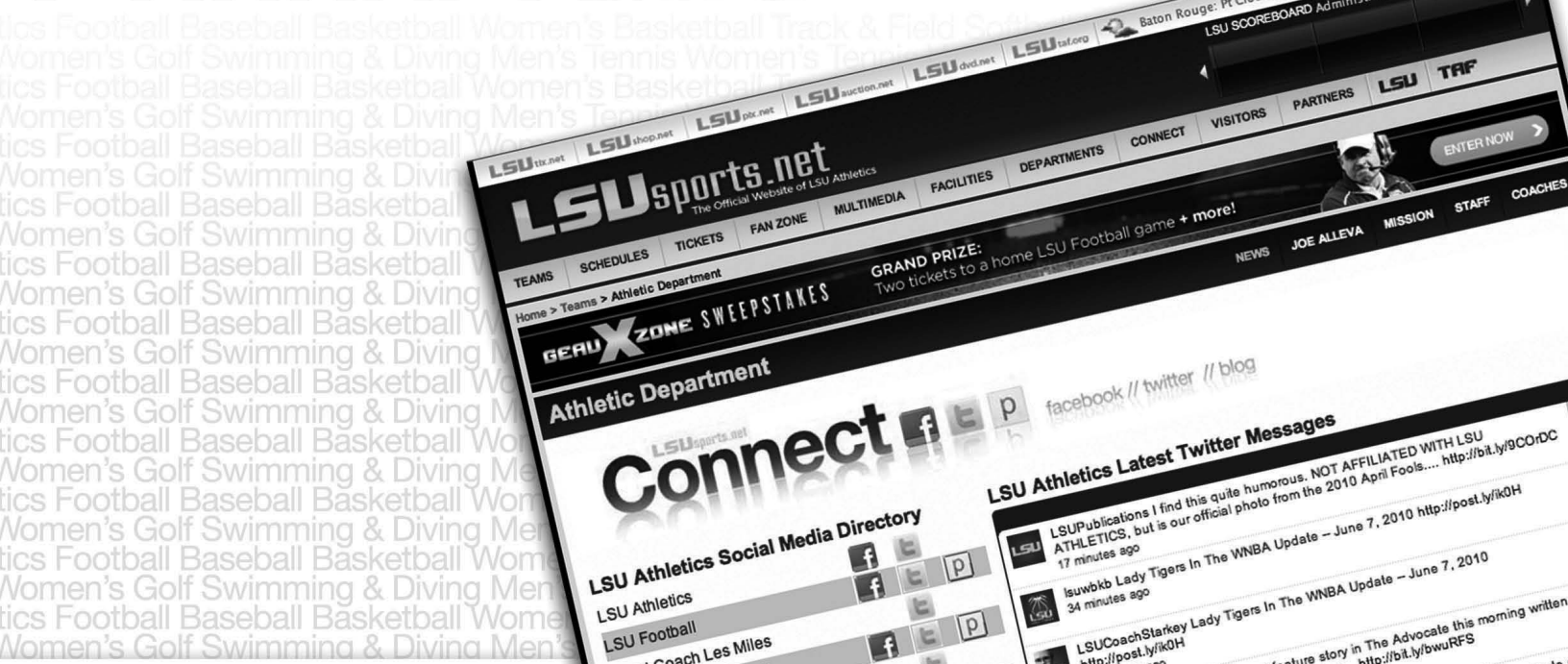
