# PREVIEW



## In the Spotlight



Having always expected the most from her teams, 2004 is no different for LSU head coach D-D Breaux, who enters her 27th season at the helm of the Tiger gymnastics program.

"I expect them to be the best team we have ever had," said Breaux. "I think we've got more depth than we've had in the past and just as much talent."

With expectations for the 2004 campaign at an all-time high, the team has shown an equal commitment to reaching new levels, diving into a challenging preseason program that should put them on the fast track to achieving their season goals, a return trip to the NCAA Championships and a berth into LSU's first ever Super Six Finals.

"We have done more in the preseason than we have ever done before," said Breaux. "We have conditioned harder, lifted weights and been more committed as a team to our conditioning and training program. Assuming everyone stays healthy, strong and focused, these are the things that are going to help make a difference at the end of the season, when it counts."

### THE RETURNING SQUAD

Anchoring the Tigers' charge to the Super Six is a group of five upperclassmen that is headlined by lone senior, Lindsay Beddow.

Beddow was a staple in LSU's bar and beam lineups a year ago and should again be a force on those two events, while also making a case for spot in the floor lineup this season.

Beddow will be supported by fellow upperclassmen Annie Gagnon, Jade Jenkins, Lauren Companioni and Katherine Hilton, who comprise a talented junior class that played a vital role in the Tigers' success a year ago.

Returning off her most successful season to date is Annie Gagnon. Gagnon earned All-America honors on the bars last year and will again be looked to as a leader on that event. Breaux hopes to use Gagnon in the all-around this year, but that will likely come

later in the season as Gagnon is still recovering from a foot injury that required surgery in the fall.

"If we can get Annie 100% healthy and hitting on all four cylinders she will be an impact all-arounder," said Breaux.

Another All-American dotting the LSU lineup is Lauren Companioni. Companioni earned All-America honors on the floor as a freshman and has the possibility of garnering such accolades again after making solid contributions on the vault, beam and floor in 2003.

"We need Lauren on the floor of competition," said Breaux. "Her drive, her determination, her ability to lead and her spirit on the floor speaks volumes about her and that's what helps get teams through rough spots."

Fellow junior Jade Jenkins returns this fall training three events, the vault, beam and floor. Jenkins was a mainstay in the Tigers' beam and floor lineups last season and also saw limited action on the vault and bars throughout the year. With an impressive off-season under her belt Breaux expects her to be a solid contributor on all three events.

Katherine Hilton, a bar and beam specialist for LSU, worked her way into the Tiger's bar lineup last season and proved to be one of LSU's top performers on the event by the end of the year. She should again be a major contributor on the bars and could also crack the beam lineup this season.

"I would never say never for Kat," said Breaux. "Once she puts her mind to something she is strong willed enough to carry through with the task."

LSU returns a strong seven-member sophomore class that returns for the 2004 campaign seasoned and ready to go after producing over half of the Tigers competitive routines a year ago.

The group is headlined by 2003 SEC Freshman of the Year April Burkholder. Burkholder posted one of the most successful freshman campaigns in LSU history, shattering the school record in the all-around (39.875) and tying the school record mark on the floor exercise (10.0). After recording the Tigers' top marks in every event last season, Burkholder is once again expected to pace the Tigers in 2004.

"April continues to set the standard," said Breaux. "She works hard everyday in practice and its shows. I expect her to be ever bigger and better this season."

Breaux also expects great things from fellow sophomore Terin Martinjak. Martinjak was one of the Tigers' top performers on the vault, beam and floor last year. She is expected to add bars to her repertoire this season, which could make her one of the top all-around threats in the conference.

"Terin has been very focused and determined this preseason," said Breaux. "I fully believe that we will be our best team if Terin becomes a strong all-arounder."

Rikki L'Heureux, Kelly Lea and Lindsey Thompson are also training the all-around and are expected to once again be mainstays in the Tiger lineup.

L'Heureux was one of LSU's most consistent performers on the vault and bars last year and will again be counted on in those events, as well as on the balance beam.

Lea was a steady performer on the bars and floor for the Tigers in 2003 and after an impressive off season could also make waves on the vault and beam.

Thompson worked her way into the vault lineup towards the end of last season and should see action on that event again, while also contending for spots on the other three events.

Last, and certainly not least, for the talented sophomore class are Brittany Brown and Megan Durning. Brown produced impressive results on the vault and floor for the Tigers last season and has upgraded her difficulty on both of those events this year.

Durning was one of the Tigers' most dependable athletes a year ago and Breaux believes she will continue that role this season. A rock in the LSU beam lineup, Durning was also a solid contributor on the vault and floor when called into action.

"Megan was a staple, a real 'go to' person for us last year," said Breaux. "In a pressure situation, she's the one I want."

## THE FRESHMEN

The Tigers welcome a trio of freshmen to the team in Nicole Butler, Kelly Phelan and Lisa Rennie. Breaux believes all three come to LSU with potential to help in the all-around.

"These are three freshmen who will definitely make us a better team," said Breaux. "Nicole and Kelly could make us or break us on the vault. If they do what they are capable of doing we are going to be a great vaulting team, while Lisa is a great bar worker. She

has strong, beautiful lines that should make her an impact performer on the event."

Butler is an elite level gymnast from Virginia Beach, Va., who finished second in the all-around and first on the vault at the 2002 U.S. Challenge, while Phelan, a native of Orlando, Fla., was a three-time national qualifier who earned runner-up honors on the floor at the 2003 national championships.

Rennie comes to Baton Rouge from Las Vegas, Nev., where she was a four-time national qualifier that finished second on the bars at the 2003 national championships.

## THE SCHEDULE

Never one to dodge the tough competition Breaux and her Tiger squad will be tested from beginning to end during the 2004 season as the six of the teams on the Tigers' slate rank among last season's top 25.

"This is a get ready quick schedule," said Breaux. "We start with a quad meet at Michigan State and then jump right into the fire with meets against Florida and Alabama."

The Tigers open the 2004 campaign with a two-meet road swing that includes a quad meet at Michigan State on Jan. 9 and the conference opener at Florida, Jan. 16.

LSU then returns to Baton Rouge to open the home schedule with defending SEC champion and national runner up, Alabama, on Jan. 23. The Tigers continue the home stand, Jan. 30, with a tri-meet featuring Centenary and Texas Woman's.

Feb. 6 takes the Tigers back on the road, traveling to Fayetteville, Ark., for a match up with second-year team Arkansas. LSU then takes on Georgia in Athens the following week.

The Tigers continue the conference slate at home, welcoming Kentucky to the Maravich Center, Feb. 20, before traveling to Denton, Texas for a tri-meet with Texas Woman's and Arizona, Feb. 23.

LSU then closes out the regular season home schedule against Ohio State on March 5, before concluding the regular season all together against Centenary in Shreveport on March 12.

The Tigers then head to Duluth, Ga., for the SEC Championships on March 20, before returning home to host the NCAA Central Regional Championships, April 2, in the PMAC.

The 2003 season will come to a conclusion, April 15-17, at the NCAA Championships, when defending national champion, UCLA, hosts the event at the Pauley Pavilion in Los Angeles, Calif.

In collegiate team competition, six gymnasts perform on each of the four apparatus: vault, uneven bars, balance beam, and floor exercise. The cumulative team total is a combination of the five highest scores per event.

At least two judges are required to evaluate and score the performances of athletes in collegiate competition, the final mark given is an average of the two. A perfect score in team competition is 200, with top collegiate scores being 190 and above.

The number and difficulty of elements required to rate a performance on a 10-point scale has increased in recent years, thus athletes must insert more difficulty in routines to have a opportunity for a perfect score in 2004.

## BARS, BEAM AND FLOOR

Judges use a rating system to evaluate each element on the following scale:

- A - easy
- B - partial difficulty
- C - medium difficulty
- D - high difficulty
- E - highest difficulty

Routines are required to contain the following to start from a 9.50 value

- 3 - A elements
- 3 - B elements
- 2 - C elements

To score a 10.0, a gymnast can earn the remaining .5 points in three ways:

1. one tenth from a D or E element
2. one tenth from a combination
3. remaining three tenths from additional D or E elements or additional combination

## VAULT

Vaults in women's gymnastics are grouped into four categories, with the various body positions and movements performed defining each category. Depending on the type of vault selected by the gymnast, she must meet the requirements specified in the Code of Points, the official text giving the relevant value of each skill performed. A successful vault begins with a strong, accelerated run. The best vaulters explode off the board, raising their feet up over their head with tremendous quickness during the preflight phase of the vault from the springboard to contact with the horse. During the support phase (when the gymnast pushes off the horse) the judges are looking for proper body, shoulder and hand position and an instantaneous repulsion.

The second flight phase and the landing are critical areas. Watch for the height and distance traveled, as well as the number of saltos and twists. In addition, gymnasts must "stick" their landing, by taking no extra steps. Usually the more saltos and twists, the higher the difficulty value of the vault.

## UNEVEN BARS

The most spectacular of the women's events, the uneven bars, demands strength as well as concentration, courage, coordination, precision and split-second timing. Watch for the big swings that begin in handstands on the high bar, incorporating multiple hand changes, pirouettes and release elements.

The routine must move from the low bar to the high bar, incorporating many grip changes, releases and regrasps, flight elements, changes of direction, saltos and circle swings through the handstand position.

The entire routine should flow from one movement to the next without pauses, extra swings or additional supports. Each routine must have two release elements.

The low bar can be adjusted to between 148 plus or minus 3 cm tall while the high bar must be between 228 plus or minus 3 cm tall. The bars can be adjusted to a maximum of 150 cm apart from each other.

## BALANCE BEAM

The beam routine must last between 70 and 90 seconds and cover the entire length of the beam. The gymnast must use acrobatic, gymnastics and dance movements to create high points, or peaks in the exercise, consisting of two or more elements performed in a series. An example of an acrobatic series is a cartwheel into a back handspring into a back salto. A gymnastics series might consist of a turn, followed by a split jump.

There are a few special requirements on the balance beam: one acrobatic series including at least two flight elements; a turn on one leg of at least 360 degrees; a gymnastics leap or jump with great amplitude; one gymnastics/acrobatics series; one gymnastics series; and an element close to the beam.

The overall execution should give the impression that the gymnast is performing on a floor, not on a strip four inches wide. Watch for variations in rhythm, changes in level (from sitting on the beam to sailing high above it), and the harmonious blend of gymnastics and acrobatic elements.

The balance beam stands 120 cm high. It is 10 cm wide and 500 cm long.

## FLOOR EXERCISE

The floor routine must be choreographed to music, lasting between 70 and 90 seconds and covering the entire floor area. The gymnast must use acrobatic and gymnastics elements to create high points in the exercise. These include two acrobatic series, one with at least two or more saltos in different directions; an acrobatic-gymnastics series; and a gymnastics series. Throughout, the gymnast must harmoniously blend these elements while making versatile use of floor space changing both the direction and level of movement.

The quality of grace may be disguised by movements of playful theatrics, but look for a dancer-like command of music, rhythm and space. The gymnastics elements should flow freely into each other while the leaps cover impressive distances and the pirouettes and turns add excitement to the music. The area of the floor exercise is 40 feet by 40 feet.

# Breaux

Head Coach - 27th Season

As the "Dean of Coaches" at LSU, head gymnastics coach D-D Breaux has represented the University at the highest level both in the gym and, most importantly, in the classroom for 26 years. Her dedication to the student-athlete on an individual basis has transcended into academic success, community involvement, Coach of the Year honors, SEC Championships and Top-10 national rankings throughout her tenure.

Now entering her 27th season as the mastermind of the LSU gymnastics program, the fire in Breaux's eyes burns as bright today as it did on her first day on the job.

Breaux has been recognized by her peers time and time again, having won SEC Coach of the Year honors

four times (1993, 1994, 1995, 2000), NCAA Central Regional Coach of the Year twice (1999 and 2002) and a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors once (1988) when she guided the Tigers to a fourth-place national finish.

2003 saw Breaux mold a young and inexperienced Tiger squad into one of the finest teams in the nation, as LSU recorded a second-place finish at the NCAA West Regionals and a top-10 showing at the NCAA Championships.

In 2002, Breaux led her team to its first NCAA Regional Championship in 16 years. The Tigers continued their success at the NCAA Championships where they finished eighth overall, LSU's best national finish in over five years. In addition, Breaux guided Nicki Arnstad to LSU's first individual NCAA Championship in modern history, as Arnstad won the floor exercise with a stunning 9.950 performance.





Aside from athletic honors, Breaux excels in recruiting quality student-athletes from Louisiana as well as across the continent, having recruited some of the top Canadian athletes of all time. A Louisianan through and through, Breaux concentrates on recruiting right here in her native state, as well as at the national level.

Outside of the gym, Breaux has taken an active role in the academic success her program has achieved in her 26 seasons at LSU. By making academic success her team's No. 1 priority, Breaux's teams have reached the highest scholastic goals she has established over the past decade. Throughout the country, she is acknowledged as having one of the finest academic teams year in and year out. LSU gymnasts have been named Academic All-Americans 67 times and SEC Academic Honor Roll members on 81 occasions since 1991. During the 2003 season, a school-record 13 of Breaux's student-athletes were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, an honor reserved for sophomores, juniors and seniors. In 1999, the Tigers posted the third-highest GPA in the nation and the highest of any team in the NCAA Championship field.

Inside the gym, Breaux's Tigers have placed among the nation's Top 12 teams 19 times in her 26 seasons, including a fourth-place showing in 1988, sixth-place finishes in '80, '83, and '90, seventh-place in '87, '91, and '93, eighth in '94 and '02, ninth in '78, '86, '95, '98, '99 and '00, 10th in '03, 11th in '79 and '81, and a 12th place finish in 1997.

LSU has placed among the top three in regional competition 19 times, winning regional titles in 1979, 1980, 1986 and 2002. Her teams have included 29 All-Americans and 24 All-SEC selections.

Breaux's Tigers earned the SEC Championship title in 1981, finished second in '90, '95 and 2000, and third in '82, '83, '97 and '98.

It is this delicate balance between exceptional academics and athletic excellence that has allowed Breaux to keep her team at the top of the national scene year in and year out.

Breaux, a native of Donaldsonville, La., earned both her bachelor's and master's degrees from LSU. She is the mother of two daughters, Jewel (21) and Sara (17).

In addition to strengthening the Tigers on the vault and with their uneven bar routines, Moore plays a significant role with LSU's Bengal Gymnastics program, a highly successful youth age group program that practices in the Lady Tigers' gymnastics training facility.





# PHILIP Ogletree

Philip Ogletree begins his fourth year with the LSU gymnastics program after three already highly successful seasons at the collegiate level. In just three years, Ogletree has proved to be a tremendous asset to the LSU gymnastics program, working with the athletes on the uneven bars. Ogletree has guided the Tigers to seven of the top-10 bar scores in school history, including a school-record 49.650 in 2002. In addition, Ogletree helped Sharene Mamby to a rare 10.0 in 2001.

"Philip has done a tremendous job for us," said Breaux. "He has been a great addition to our staff, both as a coach and as an administrator. Our team and staff have blended very well with Philip in the mix."

Ogletree came to LSU after spending the previous season at the Georgia Gymnastics Academy.

Ogletree arrived at LSU with 18 years of coaching experience, including 11 with Level 10 gymnasts in Georgia. While his stop at LSU was his first collegiate stop, he was no stranger to LSU athletics. During his time, he tutored future LSU greats Abbey Burns, Kim and Kerry Descalopoulos, all natives of Georgia, during a stint with the Atlanta School of Gymnastics.

During his time in the state of Georgia, he coached six Level 10 national champions on the floor exercise and helped place five athletes on the national team. Ogletree has also coached at the American Classic and U.S. Classic national meets.

From 1980-82, Ogletree was a gymnast at the University of Georgia. He later graduated from Georgia State with a bachelor's of science degree in education in 1992.

Ogletree is married to the former Jill Hickok, a descendent of "Wild Bill" Hickok. The couple has two children, Bridget, 10, and Jake, 8.

## RAISING THE BAR

With a lineup that included just one senior and 10 underclassmen, a young and inexperienced LSU gymnastics team came together during the 2003 season and produced one of the finest campaigns in recent history. The Tigers concluded the year with a 10th place finish at the NCAA Championships, two of the top-15 team scores in school history and new school records on both the beam and floor exercise.

Individually, 2003 saw the emergence of one of LSU's top all-arounders in April Burkholder. In just her inaugural season with the Tigers, Burkholder posted school record performances in both the all-around and floor exercise, while garnering SEC Freshman of the Year accolades.

Also making great strides was sophomore Annie Gagnon, who earned All-America recognition on the uneven bars.

Even with the numerous postseason accomplishments during the 2003 season, the journey was a long fought battle filled with highs and lows that began in Nassau, Bahamas.

The Tigers opened the season at the Bahama Breeze Invitational taking on the talented competition of 25th-ranked Maryland, Towson and Illinois. Head coach D-D Breux couldn't have asked for a better start to the

year for the young Tiger squad as the team produced the best season-opening score in school history, 194.600, to come away with the team title.

The Tigers nearly swept all the individual honors as well, as Jade Jenkins won the all-around and vaults titles, Lindsay Beddow finished first on the bars and April Burkholder took home top honors on the beam.

The next week proved to be much of the same for LSU as the Tigers opened up SEC schedule with a 195.825-194.125 win over Kentucky and Centenary (189.400) in Lexington. The tri-meet proved to be a coming out party for April Burkholder who won the all-around, beam and floor titles in just her second collegiate meet. Gold medal performances didn't stop with Burkholder as Beddow posted her second straight win on the uneven bars.

Riding the first 5-0 start since the 1995 season, the Tigers unfortunately could not keep the momentum going as multiple falls on the balance beam at Auburn contributed to LSU's first loss of the season, 194.500-194.275.

Despite the team's setback Burkholder continued to shine. The freshman standout won the bars and vault titles outright and shared the event crowns on both the beam

and floor en route to winning her second straight all-around title.

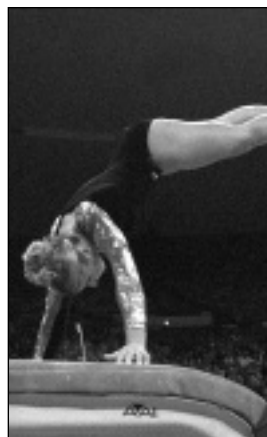
Looking to rebound from its loss to Auburn, LSU returned to Baton Rouge for the home opener against eighth-ranked Denver. The Tigers used season-high marks on each of the four events to upset the Pioneers, 196.625-193.750. LSU once again nearly sweep the individual honors as Burkholder won both the vault and floor titles, Lauren Companioni finished first on the beam and Katherine Hilton captured the bar title in her collegiate debut.

With the upset of No. 8 Denver in their back pockets, the Tigers were looking for more of the same when the seventh-ranked Florida rolled into Baton Rouge the following weekend. However, despite posting an impressive 196.500, the Gators' solid performance on the beam in the final rotation proved to be too much for the Tigers as Florida edged LSU by a margin of .450.

Burkholder continued her winning ways in the contest again taking home individual titles on the vault and floor exercise.

With the defending national champion, Alabama, up next LSU knew it had a difficult challenge ahead in Tuscaloosa. After two weeks at home the Tigers never seemed to get on track in the opposing arena, falling to the Crimson Tide, 197.400-193.800.

Continuing their road schedule, the Tigers traveled to Lincoln, Neb., for the always competitive Masters Classic. Even without the services of Burkholder, who sat out the meet with a sprained ankle, LSU was solid, posting its best road score of the season to that point. However, it wouldn't prove to be enough for the team title as host-Nebraska was nearly unstoppable with its meet-winning 198.025 and Washington was nearly as good with its mark of 196.725. The Tigers posted a respectable 196.025 to outlast Kent State who finished with a 192.900.

Following two straight road meets the Tigers returned to the Pete Maravich Assembly Center for their final home stand of the season, taking on first-year team, Arkansas, and perennial national and SEC powerhouse Georgia in back-to-back weeks.

The arrival of the Ladybacks brought out the best in LSU, as the Tigers used a school record-tying 49.475 performance on the beam to dominate Arkansas, 196.700-193.475. Lauren Companioni turned in one of her best meets on the season, winning both the beam and floor titles en route to earning SEC Gymnast of the Week honors.

L'Heureux along with senior Brooke Cazeaux and sophomore Annie Gagnon recorded phenomenal performances of their own, as L'Heureux won the first individual title of her career on the vault and Cazeaux and Gagnon combined to share top honors on the uneven bars.

With a solid performance to build on the Tigers went into the home finale with fifth-ranked Georgia eyeing another upset on the PMAC floor. However, LSU's upset bid fell just short as the Gym Dogs edged the Tigers, 196.475-196.350.

LSU did turn in outstanding beam rotation, sweeping the top three places on the event. Terin Martinjak claimed gold with a near perfect 9.950, while Burkholder and Beddow followed closely behind with marks of 9.925 and 9.875, respectively.

The Tigers took the loss in stride and traveled to Salt Lake City for a match-up with seventh-ranked Utah. Hoping to repeat the

results from a year ago, when the Tigers upset the perennial national power Utes, LSU posted its best road score to date, but failed to outlast the Utes who claimed victory, 197.475-196.575.

Coming off two difficult road losses the Tigers were hungry for a win heading into their final regular season meet of the year, a tri-meet with in-state rival Centenary and Texas Woman's in Shreveport. LSU came away with more than a win, it recorded one of the finest performances in school history.

Behind a school record 39.875 all-around performance by freshman phenom April Burkholder the Tigers rolled to a season-high 197.225, easily outscoring both Centenary (194.600) and Texas Woman's (194.575). LSU's 197.225 marked the third best performance by an LSU team in school history, while Burkholder's all-around score was the best by a Tiger athlete since the 1995 season.

Burkholder was nearly flawless throughout the night scoring a perfect 10.0 on the floor, a 9.975 on the beam, and a pair of 9.950s on the vault and bars. Her marks were good enough to garner five gold medals.

As a team, LSU was just as sensational, setting a school record on the floor, while notching season highs on both the vault and bars. The Tigers didn't count a score below 9.875 on the floor en route to an LSU-best 49.600, while identical marks of 49.400 on the vault and bars were nearly as impressive.

Riding the waves of one of the best performances in LSU history, the Tigers entered the SEC Championships in Birmingham, Ala., with high expectations. However, tough competition, tight scoring and a fall on the uneven bars led the Tigers to their third straight fourth-place finish at the conference championships, finishing with a 195.650.

Alabama and Georgia battled it out for the conference crown as the Crimson Tide came out on top by just .050, while Florida finished in third, Auburn was fifth and Kentucky and first-year team, Arkansas, tied for sixth.

Individually, Burkholder made her case for SEC Freshman of the Year honors, scoring an impressive 39.450 to place fourth in the all-

around competition.

Next, with a bid to the national championships on the line, the Tigers were headed to Seattle, Wash., for the NCAA West Regionals. Pitted against two top-15 teams, in Nebraska and host-Washington, that had each defeated the Tigers earlier in the season, LSU knew it was facing one of the season's most difficult challenges. The young squad competed with tenacity and the poise of veterans and eventually walked away with a second-place finish and their fourth trip to the NCAA Championships in the last five years.

However, getting to the national championships wasn't that easy, for the Tigers fate wasn't decided until the final routine of the final rotation of the evening.

Entering the last event the Tigers knew they needed a 49.225 to clinch a second-place finish and a trip to the NAAs. With marks of 9.700, 9.800 and two 9.900s already secured, the Tigers ace in the hole, April Burkholder, began her routine needing a 9.925 to lift the Tigers to a second-place finish and a .025 victory over Washington. Burkholder delivered exactly what was needed, a 9.925 on a near flawless routine, to win a share of the regional floor title and secure the Tigers' berth at the NCAA Championships.

After the dramatic victory LSU had two weeks to prepare for its return trip to Lincoln, Neb., and the NCAA Championships. The Tigers drew the meet's morning session that put them up against defending national champion Alabama, Pac-10 champion UCLA, Big 10 champion Michigan, Arizona State and Iowa.

LSU's quest for its first ever Super Six appearance was cut short as miscues on the floor ended the Tigers' season in the first round of competition. LSU finished fifth in its session and 10th overall with a final team score of 194.000.

Individually, sophomore Annie Gagnon was exceptional on the bars, earning All-America honors, with her 9.825 effort while extending LSU's streak of consecutive years with an All-American performer to 11.

## LSU Gymnastics Practice Facility

When determining what makes an athletic program successful, many elements factor in. Ask any coach and they will say that quality facilities rank among the most important elements.

The LSU Gymnastics team and head coach D-D Breaux moved into the newly renovated gymnastics training area in the LSU Field House in the Fall of 2000 and immediately reaped the benefits of one of the finest training facilities in the nation.

"It's a dream come true. It's a realization that the commitment by the university, fans and boosters really is all about the student-athlete," said Breaux.

The LSU Field House renovations and expansion created a brand new facility, that includes a locker room, squad room, 18,143 square feet of training

space -- double the previous space -- an equipment room, sauna, sound room and conditioning/aerobic room.

One of the nicest aspects of the facility is the glass wall that allows an onlooker to see the multi-million dollar Bernie Moore Track Stadium, legendary Tiger Stadium, the Pete Maravich Assembly Center -- the competitive home of the LSU gymnastics team -- and the beautiful landscaping of LSU's campus.

D-D Breaux started to fathom ideas of a new facility years ago, never thinking that one-day dreams would turn into realities under her tenure.

"About 10 years ago I started thinking about this idea, and about five years ago I started talking about it. Eventually, (former athletic director) Mr. (Joe) Dean and some board members along with the Tiger Athletic Foundation started listening. They realized that we needed it not only to maintain our top 10 status, but it was also a safety issue. We needed the upgrades to protect the athletes."

As it is with all sports, talent is also a key ingredient for success. A new facility not only enhances training and safety, but is also be a very useful tool in recruiting.

"I think it puts us ahead of some schools if there is a facility race. When girls come to visit our facility they will be impressed. They will be able to look out and see the other athletic facilities, and they will be able to grasp the entire experience they are looking at if they choose to attend LSU.

"Young female athletes are coming to the realization across the spectrum that opportunities are out there for them. They can take scholarships and compete at the collegiate level. So I think this project and other things of this sort are very important."

Paramount to the success of an intercollegiate program is a first-class facility and the Tigers have just that in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

For nearly a quarter-century the "PMAC" has been home to some of the finest gymnastics competitions in the nation. The PMAC has served as host site of the SEC Championships on three occasions, most recently in 1998, and the NCAA Regional Championships six times. The PMAC will once again play host to the regional championships in 2003 when it welcomes six of countries top teams on April 2.

Seating 14,164 spectators, the massive \$11.5 million building has competed with neighboring Tiger Stadium as the most visible structure on the LSU campus since its completion in 1971.



Originally named "The Assembly Center," in 1988 Louisiana Governor Buddy Roemer signed legislation changing the official name of the building to the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in honor of the former LSU basketball legend who had died earlier that same year.

The PMAC is home to the LSU men's and women's basketball teams, as well as the volleyball program.

In addition to the normal seating configuration, a proscenium stage can be lowered into place at

the north end allowing some 4,500 seats for theatrical productions. An additional 1,000 seats can be placed on the floor for graduations, convocations, lectures, concerts or other special events.

Several renovations have recently been completed to keep the PMAC as one of the top facilities in the Southeastern Conference. A new sound system was installed in 1994 and a year later the lower level seats of the PMAC were all replaced. In November 1999 a new multi-million dollar scoreboard/video replay system was installed.

Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College has, throughout its 143-year history, served the people of Louisiana, the region, the nation, and the world through extensive multipurpose programs encompassing instruction, research and public service. The University continuously develops programs of breadth and quality that make it one of the nation's outstanding educational institutions.

The University influences the educational, economic, social and cultural lives of its citizens throughout the state – indeed, in some way, it touches the life of every person in Louisiana.

Because of its designation as a Research I University – the top category of the Carnegie Foundation's ranking of research institutions – LSU ranks in the top 2 percent of the nation's colleges and universities. The Research I designation is shared by only 59 public and 29 private universities across the nation. One of only 25 universities nationwide designated as both a land-grant and sea-grant college, LSU is also actively pursuing space-grant status.

History and tradition began with LSU's founding in 1853 by the General Assembly of Louisiana as the Louisiana State Seminary of Learning and Military Academy near Pineville, Louisiana. The institution opened January 2, 1860. When the Civil War began, the school's first superintendent, William Tecumseh Sherman, resigned to assume a command in the Union Army. Fire demolished the Seminary in 1869 and the school moved to Baton Rouge.

In 1870, the Seminary was renamed Louisiana State University. In 1874, under the United States Morrill Act, the Louisiana State Agricultural & Mechanical College was established in New Orleans. The two institutions were merged by the Legislature in 1877 to become Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College.

Construction on the present campus began in 1922 and the first classes were held in 1926. LSU experienced major growth in the 1930s and 1940s, expanding its student body, curricula and services. During the 1960s, the University began to place increasing emphasis on research.

Recognizing the importance and extent of statewide agricultural activities of units in the LSU System, the LSU Board of Supervisors in 1972 established the Center for Agricultural Sciences & Rural Development. This unit was renamed the LSU Agricultural Center in 1982. Components of the LSU Agricultural Center include the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, International Programs and Administrative Services.

The primary mission of the LSU Agricultural Center is to conduct research in agricultural and natural resource development and to provide off-campus extension education that disseminates technological, economic, and management information to Louisiana residents.

In 1977, the Paul M. Hebert Law Center, established as the LSU Law School in 1906, was made an autonomous division of the LSU System. The Law Center provides legal education characterized by an unyielding demand for academic excellence. Its unique curriculum, based on civil law as well as substantial elements of common law, provides law graduates with qualifications and training for not one, but two legal systems.

LSU, located on more than 2,000 acres in the southern part of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, is bordered on the west by the Mississippi River. The University's more than 250 principal buildings are grouped on a 650-acre plateau that constitutes the main part of the campus.

LSU and A&M College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. The Hebert Law Center holds membership in the Association of Law Schools and is on the approved list of the American Bar Association.

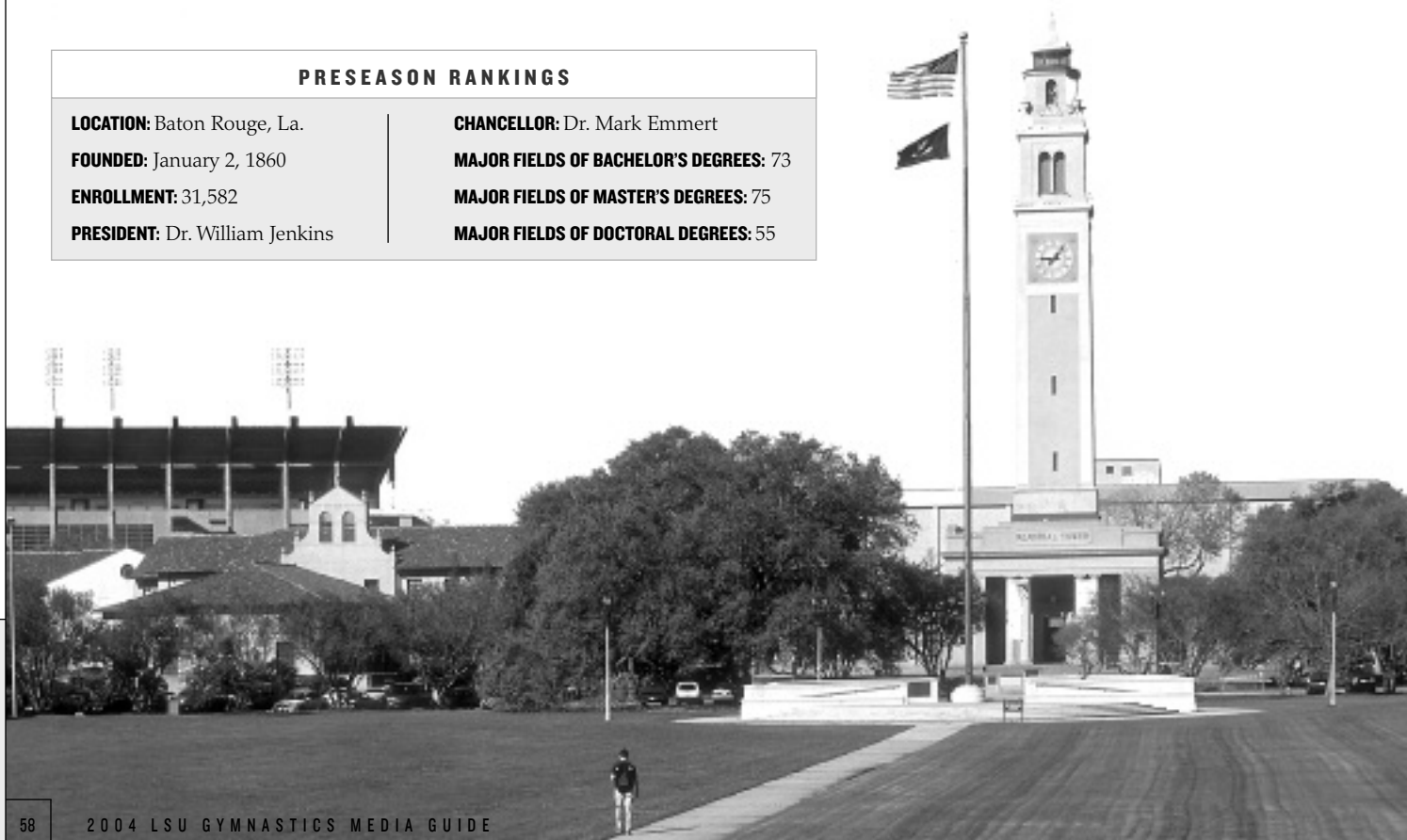

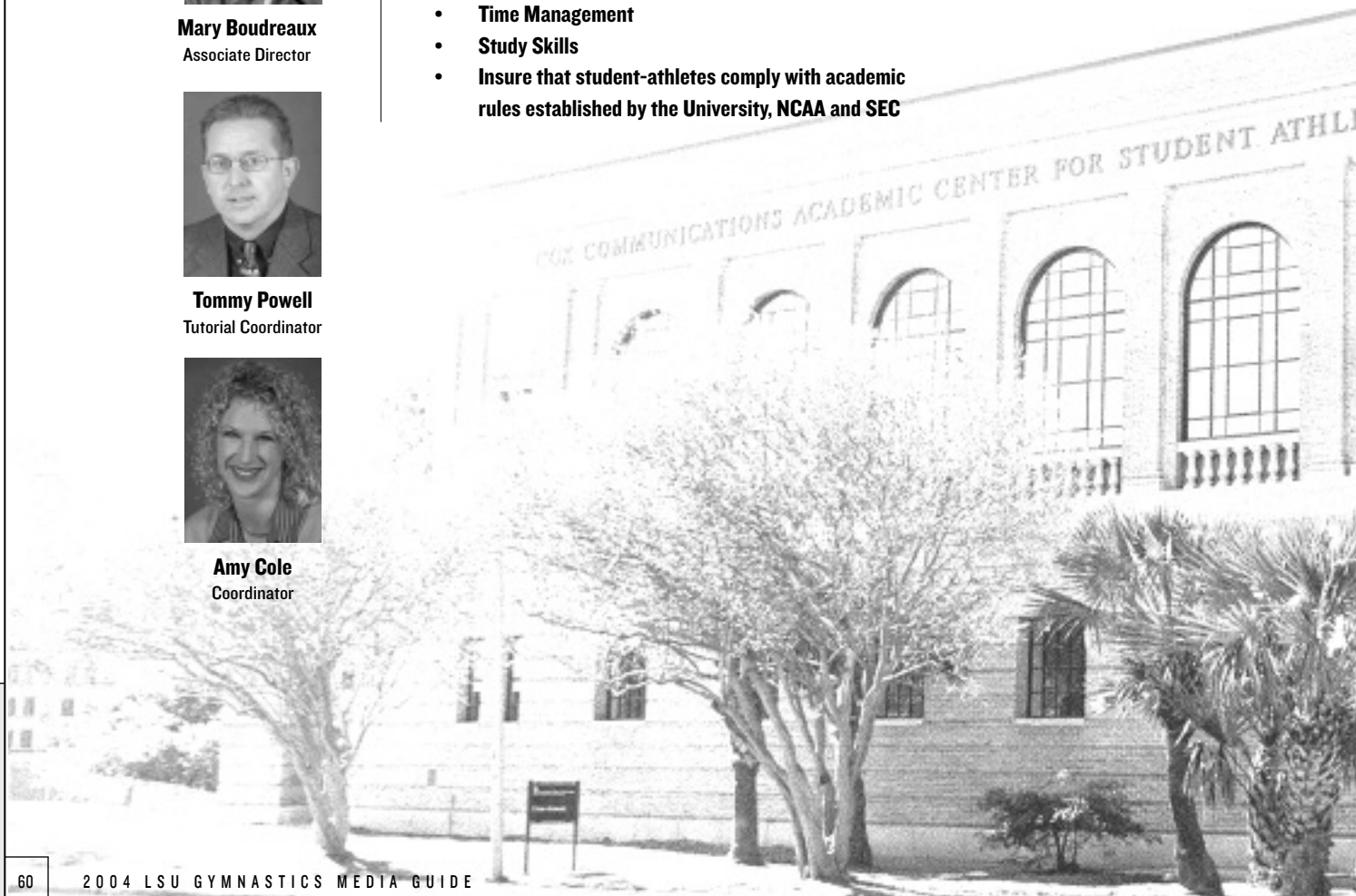

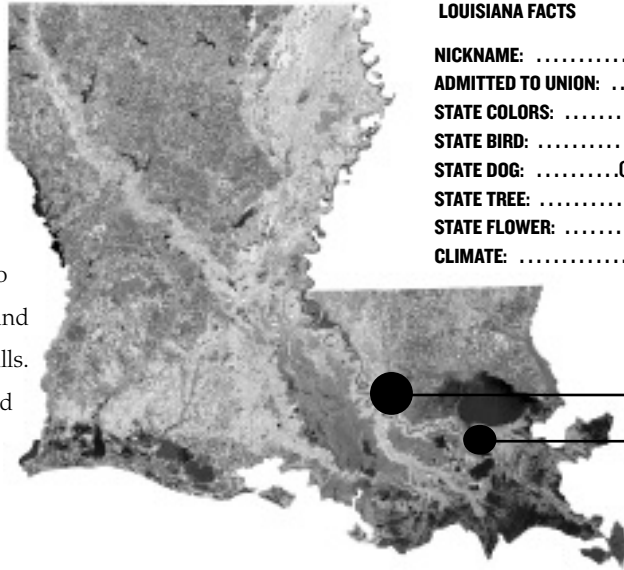

on this page are the only men to have had their jerseys retired by LSU. Basketball has retired the No. 23 for Pete Maravich, No. 50 for Bob Pettit, Jr., and No. 33 for Shaquille O'Neal. Football's only retired jersey is the No. 20 worn by Billy Cannon, while baseball retired the No. 15 in honor of longtime coach and current Athletics Director Skip Bertman.



### Bob Pettit, Jr.

Led LSU to its first NCAA Final Four in 1953 and later became the first player in NBA history to exceed the 20,000-plus point barrier. Pettit is a member of the NBA Hall of Fame and in 1997 was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



### Billy Cannon

One of the true legends of college football in the South, Cannon was the 1959 Heisman Trophy winner and helped the Tigers to the 1958 national title. Cannon's most memorable performance came in 1959 against Ole Miss when the No. 1 Tigers trailed No. 3 Ole Miss 3-0 in the fourth quarter. He fielded a punt, broke seven tackles and returned the ball 89 yards for the 7-3 LSU victory. He went on to a successful 11-year professional career.



### Shaquille O'Neal

The first pick in the 1992 NBA Draft, O'Neal was named MVP of the league in 2000. A three time NBA Finals MVP, he led the Los Angeles Lakers to consecutive World Championships between the 2000-02 seasons. At LSU, O'Neal averaged 21.6 points and 13.6 rebounds during his career, and in 1991, was named the World's Amateur Athlete of the Year, as well as SEC Athlete of the Year and National Player of the Year. In 1997, he was named one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



### Pete Maravich

"Pistol Pete," Maravich still holds the NCAA records for career points, with 3,667, and career scoring average, with 44.2 points a game. In 1970, he was selected as the National Player of the Year after leading the Tigers to the NIT Final Four. He scored 50+ points an amazing 28 times. Maravich went on to a 10-year professional career and was selected as one of the NBA's 50 greatest players in 1997.

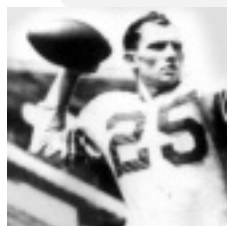


### Skip Bertman

A legend in the college baseball ranks, Bertman created a dynasty at LSU, guiding the Tigers to five national titles in a 10-year stretch from 1991-2000. He also skippered the United States to a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and was an assistant on the gold medal-winning U.S. squad in Seoul, Korea in 1988. Bertman retired from coaching following the 2001 season and currently serves as LSU's Athletics Director.

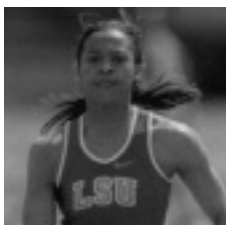

#### **Y.A. Tittle**

A standout quarterback for the Tigers from 1944-47, Tittle went on to a Hall of Fame NFL career that spanned 15 seasons and saw him selected as the league's MVP on two occasions ('57 and '62).



#### **Peta-Gaye Dowdie**

A 19-time All-American, Dowdie was a member of three NCAA Championship teams during her time at LSU. Dowdie later went on to compete for her native Jamaica at the 2000 Sydney Olympics.



#### **Walter Davis**

An Olympian in 2000, Davis helped LSU to national titles in 2001 and 2002. The SEC Male Athlete of the Year in 2002, he won six NCAA titles and earned a school record nine All-America honors.



#### **Marie Ferdinand**

The eighth pick overall in the 2001 WNBA draft by the Utah Starzz, Ferdinand was named a First-Team All-America selection in 2000-01. She helped the Lady Tigers to three NCAA Tournaments, including an Elite Eight appearance in 2000. She is a two-time WNBA all-star selection.



#### **Meredith Duncan**

The nation's top collegiate golfer in 2002, Duncan left LSU as the school's most prolific female golfer. She earned first-team All-America honors as a senior in 2002 and won the United States Women's Amateur Championship in 2001.



#### **Pat Henry**

Has led the LSU track and field program to 25 national championships and 19 SEC titles. The only coach to win both men's and women's national titles in the same season.



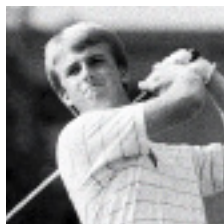
#### **Nicki Arnstad**

The 2002 NCAA Floor Exercise Co-Champion, Arnstad became the first LSU gymnast to win a national title. She was a four-time All-American that won the NCAA Central Regional floor and all-around titles in 2002.



#### **Josh Reed**

The 2001 Biletnikoff award winner, Reed re-wrote the SEC record book with his 94 receptions for 1,740 yards during his senior season. A consensus first-team All-America selection, he also led the nation in yards per game (145.0) that year. Reed ended his career with an SEC record 3,001 receiving yards on 167 catches.



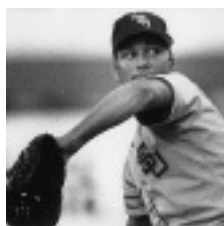
#### **David Toms**

The two-time SEC Player of the Year, Toms has gone on to a successful career on the PGA Tour. Among his PGA Tour victories was a thrilling win at the PGA Championship in August of 2001.



#### **Todd Walker**

Capped his LSU career as the SEC's all-time leader in hits, runs, RBIs, and total bases. Walker, who is a member of the All-Time College World Series Team, led LSU to the national title in 1993.



#### **Ben McDonald**

Named the National Player of the Year in 1989, McDonald was later chosen as the first player in the Major League Baseball Draft by the Baltimore Orioles.

## Mary L. Landrieu

Became the first woman from Louisiana elected to a full term in the United States Senate in 1997.



## Dr. James Andrews

A world-renowned orthopedic surgeon, Andrews is a 1963 graduate of LSU and a 1967 graduate of LSU Medical School. While at LSU, Andrews won the SEC indoor and outdoor titles in the pole vault.



## Reinosuke Hara

A researcher at LSU in the 1950s, he later received an honorary Doctorate of Science degree from LSU in 1992. Hara currently serves as the Vice-Chairman of Seiko Instruments.



## Harry Longwell

Graduated from LSU in 1963 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering and currently serves as the Executive Vice President of ExxonMobil.



## Carlos Roberto Flores

Elected as the president of Honduras in 1997, Flores is married to the former Mary Carol Flake, also an alumnus of LSU.



## Jim Flores

A graduate of LSU, Flores currently serves as the Vice Chairman of Ocean Energy, the World's Leader in Oil Exploration, based out of Houston, Texas.

SHREVEPORT, La. -- Behind a school record 39.875 in the all-around by freshman April Burkholder the 12th-ranked LSU gymnastics team turned in its highest score of the season, 197.225, to defeat in-state foe Centenary (194.600) and Texas Woman's (194.575) Friday night at the Gold Dome.

"We competed lights out tonight," said head coach D-D Breaux. "We had a couple mistakes on the bars but we didn't lose any momentum. April (Burkholder) truly competed at the level she was capable of, she couldn't be denied tonight and was absolutely phenomenal."

Burkholder became just the third gymnast in LSU history to score a perfect 10.000 on the floor exercise, to lead LSU to a school record 49.600 on the event. Not counting a score below 9.875, the Tigers' Jade Jenkins and Brittany Brown finished tied for third with career-high marks of 9.925, while Annie Gagnon and Lauren Companioni each posted marks of 9.875.

LSU also dazzled the crowd with season-high marks of 49.400 on the vault and bars to top the field on both events. Burkholder won the vault with a phenomenal 9.950, while freshman Rikki L'Heureux followed with a career-high 9.900 and Jenkins, Lauren Companioni and Brittany Brown rounded out the Tigers scoring on the event, posting impressive marks of 9.850.
