HUNGRY FOR MORE

After a 2004 season that was filled with countless individual accolades, an NCAA Central Regional team title and the program's best finish at the national championships in over 10 years, one might think the LSU gymnastics team would be ready to rest on its laurels. That couldn't be any further from the truth for head coach D-D Breaux and the 17 athletes that comprise her 2005 team.

The Tigers finished less than three tenths of a point shy of the Super Six team finals and nothing short of securing a spot in this year's championship round will quench the team's thirst for success this season.

"Did that seventh-place finish make this team hungry? You bet it did," said Breaux. "I think this team left the championships extremely hungry and I think that has translated into us seeing a greater effort in the process this year. I am seeing the team realize that it is what we do today that is going to make us a championship team later on."

LSU will have plenty of talent to draw from this season as it returns 13 letterwinners from a year ago, a group that includes the reigning NCAA Central Region and SEC Gymnast of the Year, three All-Americans and two All-SEC performers.



THE SENIORS

Leading the pack of decorated athletes is a four-member senior class that includes All-Americans Annie Gagnon and Lauren Companioni.

Gagnon was recognized as an All-American on the vault in 2004 after earning the distinction on the bars as a sophomore. She will train just three events this season—the vault, bars and beam—as she is still hampered by a foot injury that kept her relegated to the uneven bars through the first seven meets last year.

"Annie has been very consistent and done some beautiful gymnastics this fall," said Breaux. "She really understands the process this year and has made a great effort to increase her difficulty on both the beam and bars."

Companioni was an All-America selection on the floor as a freshman and looks to earn that status again as a senior.

"Lauren is exciting, fun to watch and the crowd loves her," said Breaux. "She has made tremendous strides on vault and her beam looks solid. If we can get her performance level to where it needs to be she should be in two or three events this season."

Rounding out the senior class are Jade Jenkins and Katherine Hilton. Jenkins contributed on the vault, beam and floor a year ago and is again expected to add depth in those events.

Hilton has been a bar specialist for the Tigers the last two seasons and should once again contribute on that event.



THE JUNIORS

Headlining the six-member junior class is the current NCAA Central Region and SEC Gymnast of the Year, April Burkholder. The anchor of the 2004 Tiger squad, Burkholder was the NCAA runner-up in the all-around and earned All-America status on the vault, beam, floor and in the all-around.

"April is a phenomenal athlete," said Breaux. "I think the thing last year that was so remarkable about her was her consistency week in and week out."

Burkholder hit an astounding 53 of her 53 competitive routines in 2004 and will again be looked at to anchor the squad in the all-around.

Terin Martinjak and Rikki L'Heureux will also be counted on heavily after solid and consistent efforts a year ago.

Martinjak was been a mainstay in the Tigers' beam and floor lineups each of the last two seasons and should again be a top performer in those two events.

"You can't beat Terin's consistency on beam," said Breaux. "We are trying to increase her difficulty on floor, but I won't sacrifice any of her consistency for her difficulty."

One of the most dependable athletes in the Tigers' vault and bars lineups a year ago, L'Heureux scored 9.750 or better on 18 of her 20 competitive routines in 2004. The Wakulla, Fla., native is coming off post-season shoulder surgery, but will again be looked to as a serious contender on those two events.

Wrapping up the junior class are Lindsey Thompson, Megan Durning and Kelly Lea.

Thompson matured into one of the Tigers' top performers on the vault last season. She is once again training the all-around and should add depth in the other three events this season.

Durning sat out most of last season while recovering from a dislocated hip, but contributed needed consistency on the beam when called upon.

"Megan is always there. You know she'll hit and you know she'll be ready to go," said Breaux. "She's a great team person, a great competitor and you can't deny the contribution that she makes."

Lea trains the all-around and saw limited action on the bars and floor last season.

"I'm beginning to see the stuff out of Kelly that I saw when I recruited her," said Breaux. "She's in there everyday training every event. She is trying to increase her difficulty and she knows her role on this team. If someone lets up she'll be the person that's going to get in there."



THE SOPHOMORES

Contributing over a third of LSU's competitive routines a year ago, the sophomore class should once again make a significant impact on the Tigers' lineup in 2005.

"Last year I think the sophomores made a bigger impact in the lineup than even they thought they would," said Breaux.

Kelly Phelan, Lisa Rennie and Nicki Butler were all consistently in at least three events last season and will look to do the same and more come January.

Phelan saw all-around action five times as a freshman and could be a mainstay in all four events this year.

Rennie was remarkably consistent on the bars, beam and floor during her first season and looks to add vault to her repertoire as a sophomore.

Butler was a standout in the vault lineup, winning five meet titles and earning a national ranking on the event during her inaugural campaign. She should again be a key performer for the Tigers on the event, as well as on the bars and floor.

THE FRESHMEN

LSU will welcome four freshmen to the team this season in Ashleigh Clare-Kearney, Emily Ellis, Kristen Julian and Melissa Wason.

Clare-Kearney comes to Baton Rouge from Manchester, Conn., where she won five Level 10 state all-around titles and three regional crowns.

"Ashleigh is probably physically the strongest athlete I have had on my team since Sandra Smith," said Breaux. "I think she is going to make some major contributions. We just need to clean up her form and prepare her to compete week in and week out."

Ellis hails from Fayette, Ala., and along with Clare-Kearney, is expected to make an immediate contribution on the vault, as well as the other three events.

"Emily has a lot of difficulty in her routines and is a perfectionist. Everything she does, she does extremely well," said Breaux.

Wason, a five-time regional qualifier and national championships competitor as a junior, comes to LSU from Winter Park, Fla. She is expected to add depth on beam and floor.

Hailing from Mandeville, Julian is the lone Louisiana native of the 2005 freshmen class. A strong tumbler and consistent competitor on the beam she should add depth in those events this season.

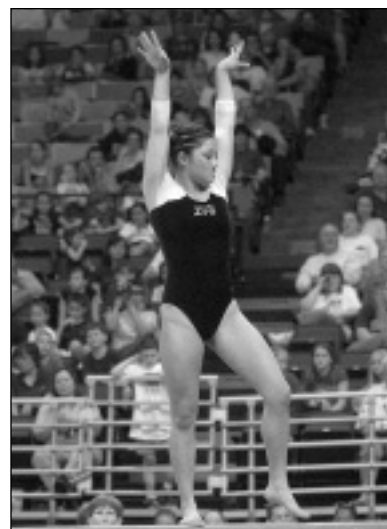

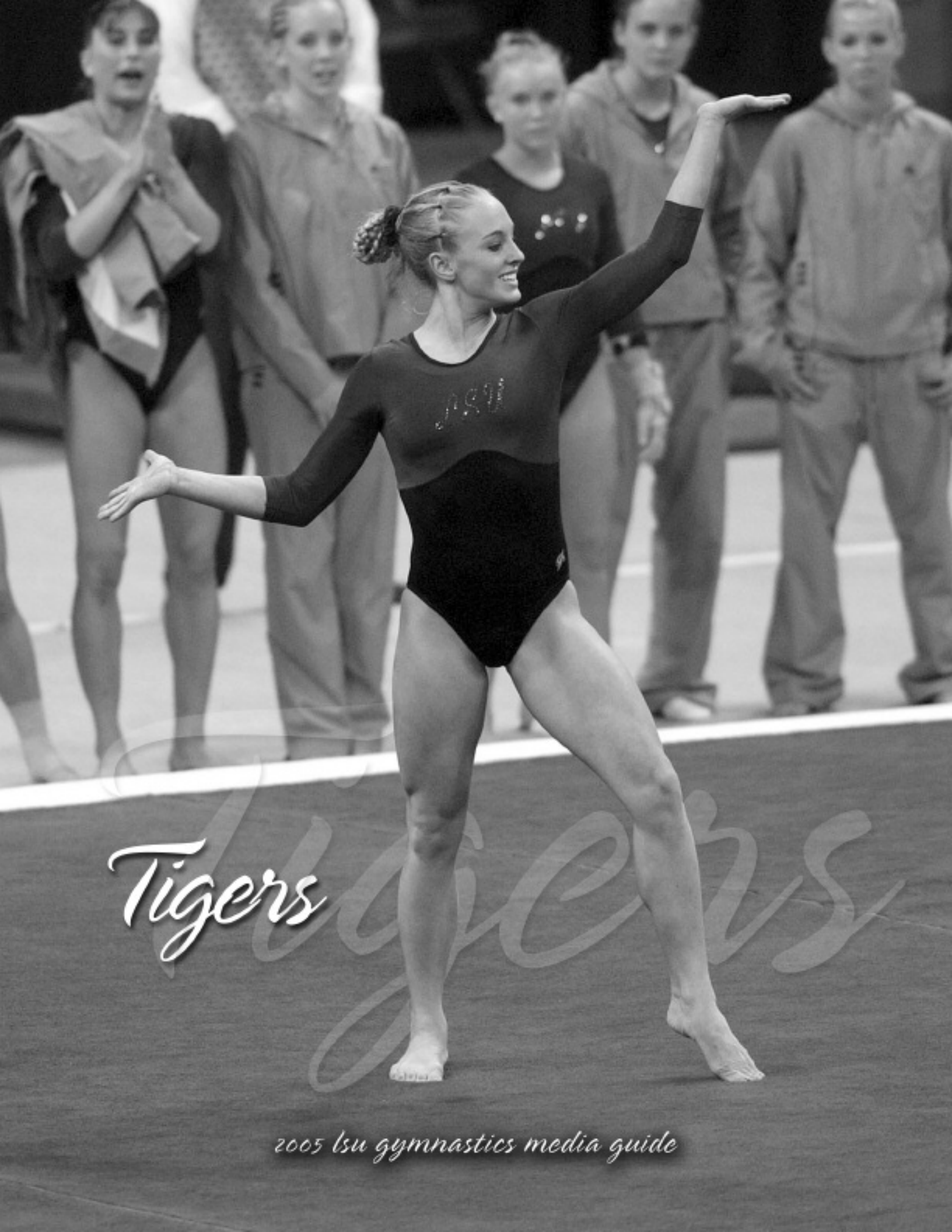

As the "Dean of Coaches" at LSU, head gymnastics coach D-D Breaux has represented the University at the highest level both in the gym and, most importantly, in the classroom for 27 years. Her dedication to the student-athlete on an individual basis has transcended into academic success, community involvement, Coach of the Year honors, SEC Championships and top-10 national rankings throughout her tenure.

Now entering her 28th season as the mastermind of the LSU gymnastics program, the fire in Breaux's eyes burns as bright today as it did on her first day on the job.

Breaux has been recognized by her peers time and time again, having won SEC Coach of the Year honors four times (1993, 1994,

1995, 2000), NCAA Central Regional Coach of the Year accolades twice (1999 and 2002), and was named a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors in 1988 when she guided the Tigers to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

2004 was a banner year for the LSU program as it won the NCAA Central Regional title for the second time in the three years, before finishing seventh at the NCAA Championships, the Tigers' best finish at the national meet since the 1993 season. Individually, Breaux guided the efforts of SEC Gymnast of the Year April Burkholder and All-American Annie Gagnon. Burkholder became LSU's all-time top performer at the NCAA Championships, finishing second in the all-around to better Jennifer Wood's third-place effort at the 1996 championships.



2003 saw Breaux mold a young and inexperienced Tiger squad into one of the finest teams in the nation, as LSU recorded a second-place finish at the NCAA West Regionals and a top-10 showing at the NCAA Championships.

In 2002, Breaux guided her team to the NCAA Central Regional title. The Tigers continued their success at the NCAA Championships where they finished eighth overall, LSU's best national finish in over five years. In addition, Breaux guided Nicki Arnstad to LSU's first individual NCAA Championship in modern history, as Arnstad won the floor exercise with a stunning 9.950 performance.

Aside from athletic honors, Breaux excels in recruiting quality student-athletes from Louisiana as well as across the continent, having recruited some of the top Canadian athletes of all time. A Louisianan through and through, Breaux concentrates on recruiting right here in her native state, as well as at the national level.

Outside of the gym, Breaux has taken an active role in the academic success her program has achieved in her 27 seasons at LSU. By making academic success her team's No. 1 priority, Breaux's teams have reached the highest scholastic goals she has established over the past decade. Throughout the country, she is acknowledged as having one of the finest academic teams year in and year out. LSU gymnasts have been named Academic All-Americans 73 times and members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll on 87 occasions since 1991. During the 2003 season, a school-record 13 of Breaux's student-athletes were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, an honor reserved for sophomores, juniors and seniors. In 1999, the Tigers posted the third-highest GPA in the nation and the highest of any team in the NCAA Championship field.

Inside the gym, Breaux's Tigers have placed among the nation's top-12 teams 19 times in her 27 seasons, finishes that include a fourth-place showing in 1988, sixth-place finishes in '80, '83, and '90, seventh-place in '87, '91, '93, and '04, eighth in '94 and '02, ninth in '78, '86, '95, '98, '99 and '00, 10th in '03, 11th in '79 and '81, and 12th in 1997.

LSU has placed among the top three in regional competition 19 times, winning regional titles in 1979, 1980, 1986, 2002 and 2004. Her teams have included two national champions, 25 All-Americans and 25 All-SEC selections.

Breaux's Tigers earned the SEC Championship title in 1981, finished second in '90, '95 and 2000, and third in '82, '83, '97, '98 and '04.

It is this delicate balance between exceptional academics and athletic excellence that has allowed Breaux to keep her team at the top of the national scene year in and year out.

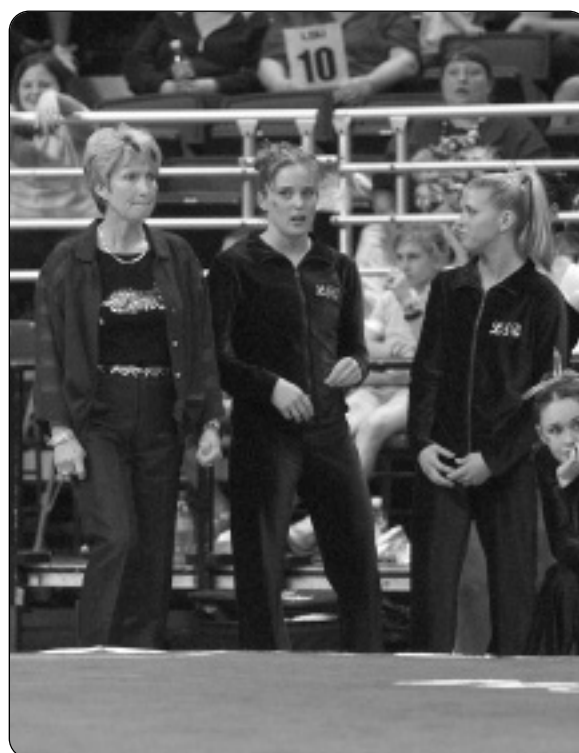

Long-time Southeastern Conference assistant Bob Moore begins his sixth season with the LSU gymnastics program. Moore's presence has been undeniable in his first five years as he has helped the Tigers maintain their status as one of the nation's premier programs.

The Tigers' vaulting team has flourished under Moore's watch, recording nine of the top 10 event scores in school history, including seven of those in 2004 alone. Individually, Moore has also guided the efforts of Annie Gagnon and April Burkholder, who each earned All-America honors on the event a year ago.

Moore joined the LSU coaching staff in 2000 after a six-year stint at the University of Florida where he served as the program's top assistant. To his credit, Moore coached two national champions on the vault while at Florida, in addition to numerous All-Americans and SEC champions.

"Bob provides us with experience at the highest level, not only within the SEC, but the NCAA," said Breaux. "He knows exactly how tough this conference is and what it takes to take a program like ours that is an established top-10 team and bring it to the next level."

LSU is Moore's third stop within the SEC, as the 2005 season will be his 17th within the league. Prior to his tenure at Florida, the Birmingham, Ala., native spent five seasons as an assistant at Auburn.

In addition to strengthening the Tigers on the vault and with their uneven bar routines, Moore plays a significant role with LSU's Bengal Gymnastics program, a highly successful youth age group program that practices in the LadyTigers' gymnastics training facility.





Philip Ogletree

Assistant Coach - Fifth Season

Philip Ogletree begins his fifth year with the LSU gymnastics program after four already highly successful seasons at the collegiate level. In just four years, Ogletree has proved to be a tremendous asset to the LSU program, working primarily with the athletes on the uneven bars.

Ogletree has guided the Tigers to nine of the top 11 bar scores in school history, including a school-record 49.650 in 2002. In addition, Ogletree helped Sharene Mamby to a rare 10.00 during the 2001 season and Annie Gagnon to All-America honors in 2003.

In 2004, Ogletree was awarded for his efforts when he was named the NCAA's Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

"Philip has done a tremendous job for us," said Breaux. "He has been a great addition to our staff, both as a coach and as an administrator. Our team and staff have blended very well with Philip in the mix."

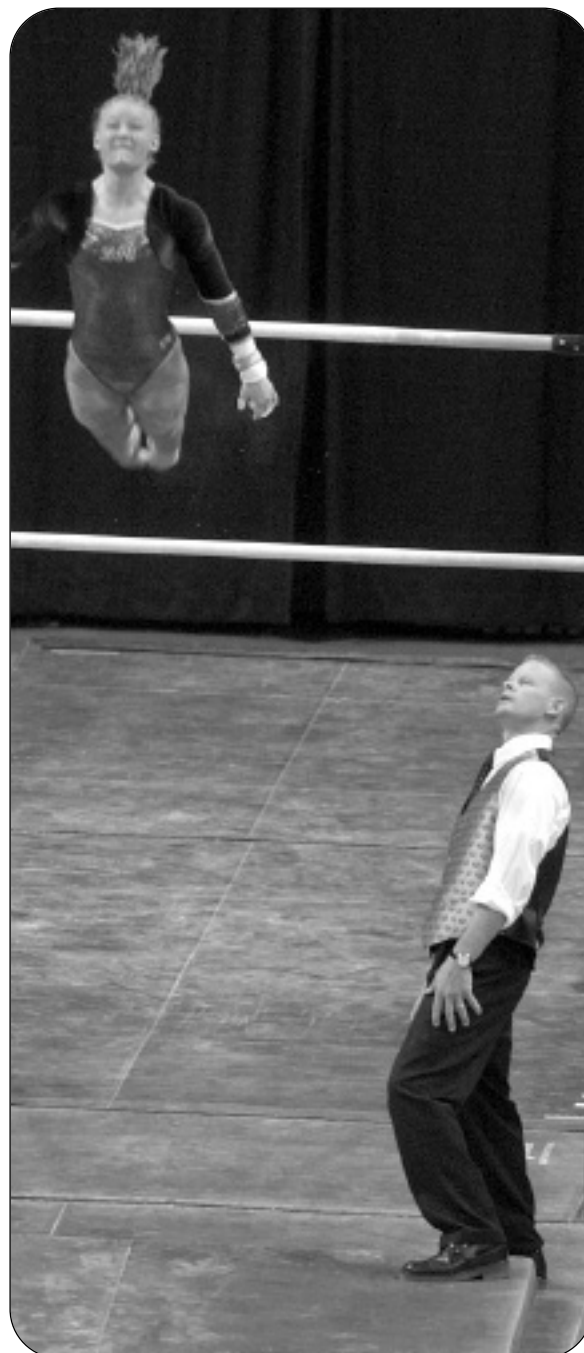
Ogletree came to LSU after spending the previous season at the Georgia Gymnastics Academy.

Ogletree arrived at LSU with 18 years of coaching experience, including 11 with Level 10 gymnasts in Georgia. While his stop at LSU was his first collegiate stop, he was no stranger to LSU athletics. During his time, he tutored future LSU greats Abbey Burns, Kim and Kerry Descalopoulos, all natives of Georgia, during a stint with the Atlanta School of Gymnastics.

During his time in the state of Georgia, he coached six Level 10 national champions on the floor exercise and helped place five athletes on the national team. Ogletree has also coached at the American Classic and U.S. Classic national meets.

From 1980-82, Ogletree was a gymnast at the University of Georgia. He later graduated from Georgia State with a bachelor of science degree in education in 1992.

Ogletree is married to the former Jill Hickok, a descendent of "Wild Bill" Hickok. The couple has two children, Bridget, 11, and Jake, 9.

Sweet Success

TIGERS FINISH SEVENTH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Tigers recorded their best finish at the NCAA Championships in over 10 years, placing seventh overall at UCLA's Pauley Pavilion. LSU's 196.650 marked the program's highest score ever at the national meet, bettering their previous championships record of 196.300 set in 2001.

BURKHOLDER, GAGNON EARN ALL-AMERICA HONORS

April Burkholder and Annie Gagnon ran LSU's streak of consecutive seasons with at least one All-America performer to 12, as each garnered All-America accolades at the NCAA Championships in Los Angeles. Burkholder earned a total of four All-America awards as she was named a first-team selection on the vault, beam and in the all-around and was a second team honoree on the floor. Gagnon was recognized as a second team selection on the vault.

TIGERS WIN NCAA CENTRAL REGIONAL TITLE

Behind the highest regional championships score in school history (197.500) the Tigers knocked off No. 6 BYU, No. 18 Arizona State, No. 23 Auburn, No. 24 Kent State and Michigan State to take home the NCAA Central Regional crown in front of a hometown crowd of 3,012 at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The regional title marked the program's second in three years and eighth in program history. The Tigers were the top scoring team on three of the four events, and were led by individual event wins by April Burkholder in the all-around (39.675) and on the floor (9.950), Burkholder and Nicki Butler on the vault (9.950) and Burkholder and Annie Gagnon on the bars (9.900).

BURKHOLDER RACKS UP THE ACCOLADES

April Burkholder racked up the individual accolades during the 2004 season as she was named both the NCAA Central Region and SEC Gymnast of the Year. Burkholder won the Central Region all-around title (39.675) and earned All-SEC honors in the all-around, scoring a 39.600 at the conference meet.

OGLETREE NAMED CENTRAL REGION ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR

LSU assistant coach Philip Ogletree was named the NCAA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year in a vote by his peers. Ogletree, who concentrates his efforts primarily on the uneven bars, helped the team post two of LSU's all-time top-10 marks on the event in 2004, and guided the efforts of All-SEC selection Lindsay Beddow.

LSU PLACES THIRD AT SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Tigers recorded their best conference finish in four years, placing third behind meet champion Georgia and runner-up Alabama at the 2004 SEC Championships in Duluth, Ga. LSU notched an all-time SEC Championships-best 197.275, a mark that included a meet high 49.400 on the uneven bars.

BURKHOLDER, BEDDOW RECEIVE ALL-SEC ACCOLADES

April Burkholder and Lindsay Beddow were recognized for their outstanding performances at the SEC Championships as each earned All-SEC accolades for the first time in their careers. Burkholder was named a first-team selection after finishing third in the all-around with a 39.600, while Beddow was named a second-team honoree for her 9.900 effort on the uneven bars.

GAGNON SWINGS INTO THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Annie Gagnon was nothing short of sensational on the bars for the Tigers in 2004. The Montreal, Quebec native inched her way up the national bar rankings throughout the year and concluded the regular season ranked No. 4 in the country with a regional qualifying score (RQS) of 9.940. Gagnon either won outright or shared the bars title at eight different meets, including the NCAA Central Regional Championships. In addition, she posted scores of 9.900 or better on 10 of her last 12 routines of the season.

BUTLER VAULTS TO SUCCESS

A solid three-event competitor for the Tigers, Nicki Butler excelled particularly on the vault during her freshman season. The Virginia Beach, Va., native finished the regular season ranked 11th nationally on the event with an RQS of 9.940. She averaged a 9.896 over the course of the season, and scored a 9.900 or better on eight separate occasions. She either won outright or shared the meet title on the vault in five meets during the season, including the NCAA Regional Championships.

LSU SHATTERS VAULT RECORD

LSU shattered the school record on the vault in the regular season finale at Centenary. The Tigers scored an impressive 49.625 to better the previous record of 49.475 set against Illinois-Chicago in 1997. LSU was led by a pair of near perfect 9.975s from April Burkholder and Nicki Butler. Kelly Phelan and Lindsey Thompson followed with identical 9.900s and Rikki L'Heureux rounded out the Tigers' scoring with a 9.875.

TIGERS POST SCHOOL RECORD FLOOR MARK AGAINST OSU

Behind five scores of 9.900 or better the Tigers established a new school record on the floor against Ohio State, notching a 49.675. April Burkholder led all Tigers with a meet-winning mark of 9.975. She was followed by Brittany Brown, who earned runner-up honors with a career-high 9.950, and Kelly Phelan and Terin Martinjak who each posted scores of 9.925. Lisa Rennie added a career-high 9.900.

RENNIE ON A ROLL

Lisa Rennie proved to be a sensational three-event competitor for the Tigers during her freshman campaign. She concluded the regular season ranked 20th nationally on the beam and finished the year with the Tigers' second-best season average on the bars (9.861). Of her 40 competitive routines during the season, the Las Vegas native scored 9.800 or better on 35 of them, including 14 marks of 9.900 or higher.

TIGERS' 197-PLUS BECOMES A HABIT

Prior to last season, LSU had only scored above a 197.000 four times in school history. In 2004, the Tigers notched eight marks of 197-plus. In addition, LSU scored consecutive 197s for the first-time in program history, posting a school record eight straight marks of 197.100 or better between Feb. 23 and April 2.

PERFECT 10.00S BY THE PAIR

Never before in program history had two LSU athletes ever recorded 10.00s in the same rotation during a single meet. The Tigers accomplished the feat twice in 2004. Terin Martinjak and Nicki Butler became the first duo to notch a pair of perfect marks, doing so on the floor at Texas Woman's. Martinjak and April Burkholder later matched that feat at Centenary, posting identical 10.00s on the balance beam.

BURKHOLDER PERFECT ON THE VAULT...

April Burkholder scored LSU's first 10.00 on the vault since the 1997 season in the Tigers' tri-meet victory over TWU and Arizona. She became just the third athlete in LSU history to ever score a 10.00 on the event.

AND THE FLOOR TOO!

April Burkholder's two perfect 10.00s on the floor exercise in 2004 set her apart in the LSU record books. One of just five athletes in school history to have ever posted a perfect mark on the event, she is the only to have done so on three separate occasions.

BURKHOLDER GARNERS SEC GYMNAST OF THE WEEK HONORS

Twice during the 2004 season April Burkholder was selected as the SEC's Gymnast of the Week. She was first honored during the week of Feb. 9, following wins on the vault (9.925), beam (9.975), floor (9.975) and in the all-around (39.775) at Arkansas. Just two weeks later the Houston native was recognized after again winning the vault (9.950), beam (9.975), floor (10.00) and all-around (39.800) titles against Kentucky.

LSU RECORDS BEST SEASON OPENING SCORE IN SCHOOL HISTORY

For the second straight season the Tigers started the year with the best season-opening score in school history. LSU's 194.875 at the Michigan State quad meet bettered the previous season-best opening mark of 194.600 set in 2003 at the Bahama Breeze Invitational.

LSU Gymnastics Practice Facility

When determining what makes an athletic program successful, many elements factor in. Ask any coach and they will say that quality facilities rank among the most important elements.

The LSU Gymnastics team and head coach D-D Breaux moved into the newly renovated gymnastics training area in the LSU Field House in the Fall of 2000 and immediately reaped the benefits of one of the finest training facilities in the nation.

"It's a dream come true. It's a realization that the commitment by the university, fans and boosters really is all about the student-athlete," said Breaux.

The LSU Field House renovations and expansion created a brand new facility, that includes a locker room, squad room, 18,143 square feet of training space -- double the previous space -- an equipment room, sauna, sound room and conditioning/aerobic room.

One of the nicest aspects of the facility is the glass wall that allows an onlooker to see the multi-million dollar Bernie Moore Track Stadium, legendary Tiger Stadium, the Pete Maravich

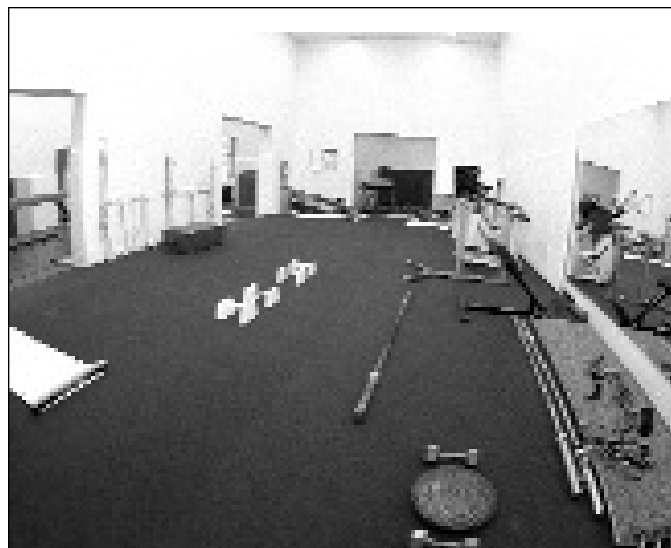
D-D Breaux started to fathom ideas of a new facility years ago, never thinking that one day dreams would turn into realities under her tenure.

"About 10 years ago I started thinking about this idea, and about five years ago I started talking about it. Eventually, (former athletic director) Mr. (Joe) Dean and some board members along with the Tiger Athletic Foundation started listening. They realized that we needed it not only to maintain our top 10 status, but it was also a safety issue. We needed the upgrades to protect the athletes."

As it is with all sports, talent is also a key ingredient for success. A new facility not only enhances training and safety, but is also be a very useful tool in recruiting.

"I think it puts us ahead of some schools if there is a facility race. When girls come to visit our facility they will be impressed. They will be able to look out and see the other athletic facilities, and they will be able to grasp the entire experience they are looking at if they choose to attend LSU.

"Young female athletes are coming to the realization across the spectrum that opportunities are out there for them. They can take scholarships and compete at the collegiate level. So I think this project and other things of this sort are very important."

Paramount to the success of an intercollegiate program is a first-class facility and the Tigers have just that in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

For nearly a quarter-century the "PMAC" has been home to some of the finest gymnastics competitions in the nation. The PMAC has served as host site of the SEC Championships on three occasions and the NCAA Regional Championships seven times, most recently in 2004.

Seating 14,164 spectators, the massive \$11.5 million building has competed with neighboring Tiger Stadium as the most visible structure on the LSU campus since its completion in 1971.

Originally named "The Assembly Center," in 1988 Louisiana Governor Buddy Roemer signed legislation changing the official name of the building to the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in

honor of the former LSU basketball legend who had died earlier that same year.

The PMAC is home to the LSU men's and women's basketball teams, as well as the volleyball program.

In addition to the normal seating configuration, a proscenium stage can be lowered into place at the north end allowing some 4,500 seats for theatrical productions. An additional 1,000 seats can be placed on the floor for graduations, convocations, lectures, concerts or other special events.

Several renovations have recently been completed to keep the PMAC as one of the top facilities in the Southeastern Conference. A new sound system was installed in 1994 and a year later the lower level seats of the PMAC were all replaced. In November 1999 a new multi-million dollar scoreboard/video replay system was installed.

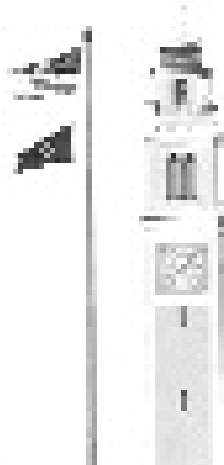

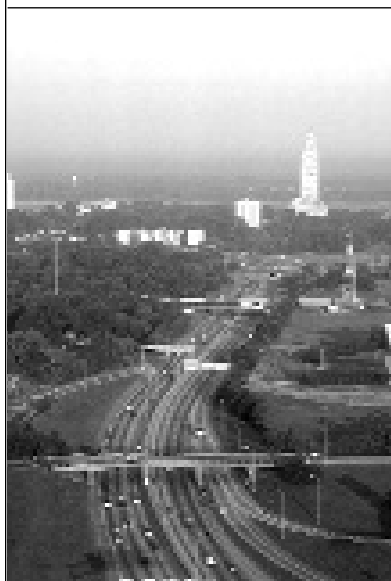

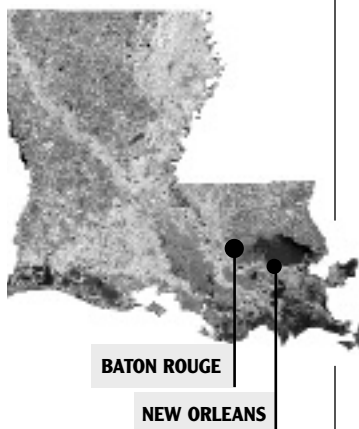

Pettit led LSU to its first NCAA Final Four in 1953 and later became the first player in NBA history to exceed the 20,000-plus point barrier. He is a member of the NBA Hall of Fame and in 1997 was named one of the top 50 players in NBA history.

"Pistol Pete," Maravich still holds the NCAA records for career points with 3,667 and career scoring average with 44.2 points a game. He was selected as the National Player of the Year in 1970 after leading the Tigers to the NIT Final Four. He scored 50+ points an amazing 28 times, before going on to a successful 10-year professional career where he was selected as one of the NBA's 50 greatest players in 1997.



**SHAQUILLE
O'NEAL**

The first pick in the 1992 NBA Draft, O'Neal was named MVP of the league in 2000 and was a three-time NBA Finals MVP after leading the Los Angeles Lakers to three World Championships. At LSU, O'Neal averaged 21.6 points and 13.6 rebounds during his career. In 1991, he was named the World's Amateur Athlete of the Year, the SEC Athlete of the Year and National Player of the Year. In 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.

One of the true legends of college football in the South, Cannon was the 1959 Heisman Trophy winner that helped the Tigers to the 1958 national title. Cannon's most memorable performance came in 1959 against Ole Miss when No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss 3-0 in the fourth quarter. He fielded a punt, broke seven tackles and returned it 89 yards for the 7-3 victory. He went on to a successful 11-year professional career.

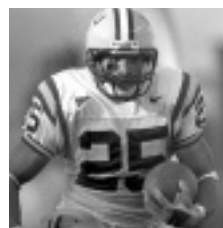


**SKIP

A legend in the college baseball ranks, Bertman created a dynasty at LSU, guiding the Tigers to five national titles in a 10-year stretch from 1991-2000. He also skipped the United States to a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and was an assistant on the gold medal-winning U.S. squad in Seoul, Korea in 1988. Bertman retired from coaching following the 2001 season and currently serves as LSU's athletic director.

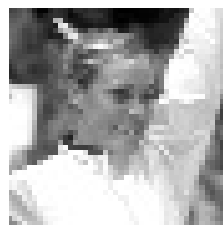
JOSH REED

An All-American, Josh Reed re-wrote both the LSU and SEC record books with a record 94 receptions for 1,740 yards on his way to winning the Biletnikoff Award in 2001. 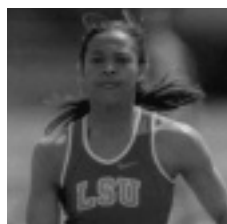
ESTHER JONES

The 2002 NCAA Floor Exercise Co-Champion, Arnstad became the first LSU gymnast to win an NCAA national title. She was a four-time All-American and won the NCAA Central Regional floor and all-around titles.



PETA-GAYE DOWDIE

A 19-time All-American, Dowdie was a member of three NCAA Championship teams during her time at LSU and went on to compete for her native Jamaica at the 2000 Sydney Olympics.



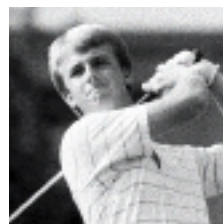
BRITNI SNEED

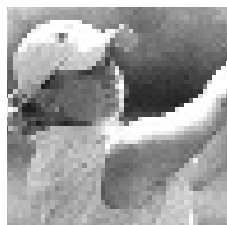
MARIE FERDINAND

Senior Technical Director for PDI/DreamWorks' movies "Antz", "Shrek", and "Shrek 2."

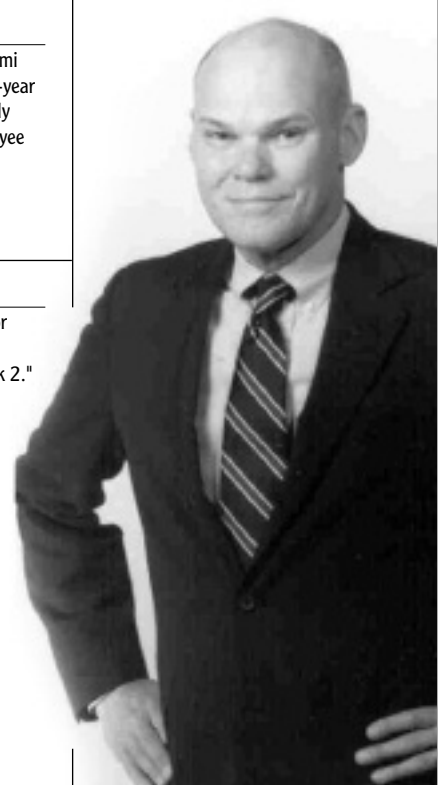


HARRY J. LONGWELL

Graduated from LSU in 1963 with a Bachelor's degree in Petroleum Engineering and currently serves as Executive Vice President of ExxonMobil.

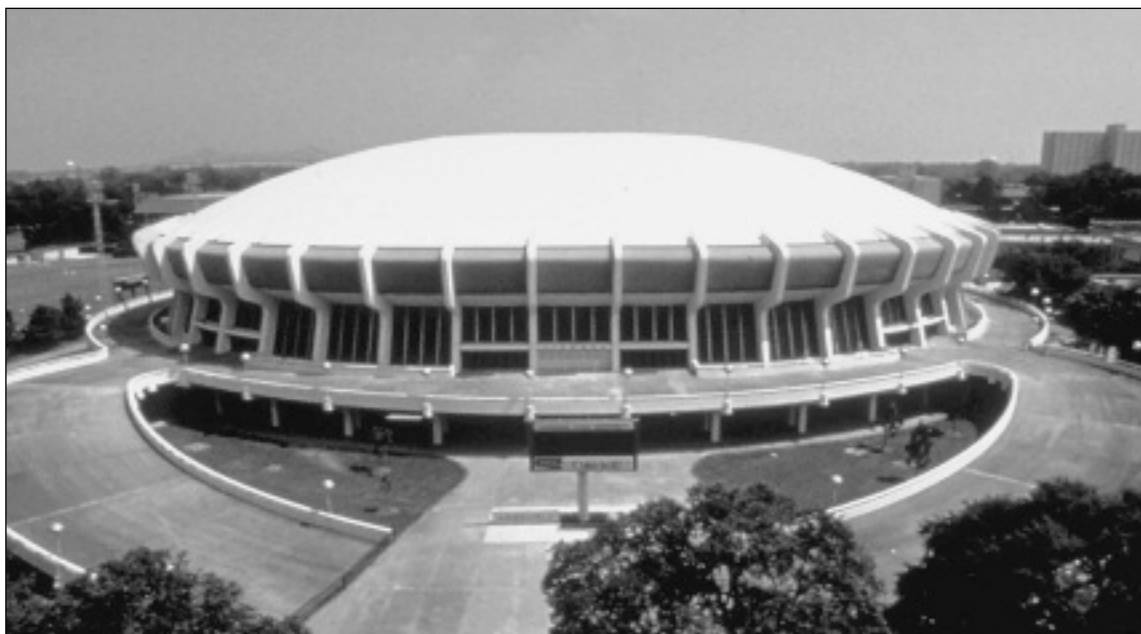
JAMES CARVILLE

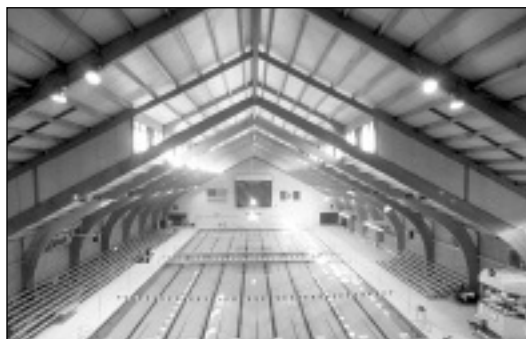

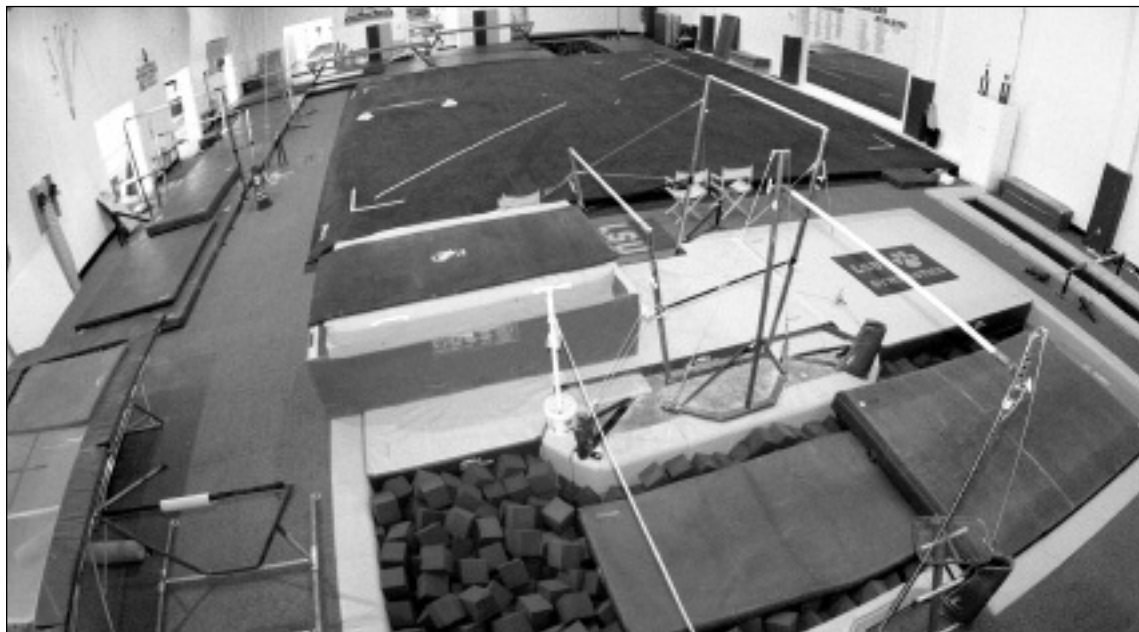
