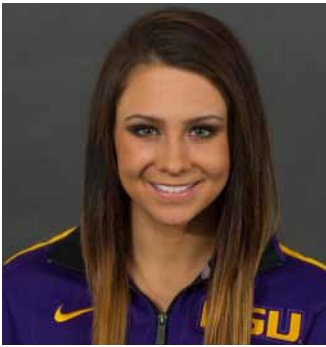

**SOPHOMORE SEASON (2013)**

One of the nation's elite all-arounders ... Earned First-Team Regular Season All-America honors on vault and all-around and was also named Second-Team Regular Season All-America on beam ... Honored as the 2013 NACGC/W Central Region Gymnast of the Year ... Named the 2013 SEC Gymnast of the Year, becoming just the fourth LSU gymnast to earn the league's top honor ... Has posted 26 scores of 9.90 or higher this season ... Has tallied 25 individual titles this season (9 AA, 6 BB, 5 VT, 4 UB, 1 FX), the first LSU gymnast to record at least 20 titles in one season since Susan Jackson in 2010 ... Leads the nation with nine all-around titles this season, and the nine titles are good for third place in school history - trailing Susan Jackson's 11 in 2010 and Sandra Smith's 10 in 1980 ... Ranks No. 7 nationally in the all-around at 39.555 RQS, No. 5 on vault at 9.940, No. 11 on beam at 9.895 and No. 20 on floor at 9.905 ... Captured the NCAA Columbus Regional vault title with a 9.925 and also scored 9.90's on beam and floor ... Won the SEC All-Around, Vault and Beam titles on the way to earning All-SEC honors at the SEC Championship ... Became the first LSU gymnast to win three titles at one SEC Championship and the third LSU gymnast to win the SEC All-Around title, joining Rachelle Fruge' ('91) and Ashleigh Clare-Kearney ('08) ... Earned the first perfect 10.0 of her career to become the SEC Vault Champion, recorded a career-high 39.750 all-around total to tie for the SEC AA crown, and equaled her career best on beam with a 9.95 to tie for the SEC BB title ... She is the first LSU gymnast to win three SEC titles in one year, and she is now tied with Ashleigh Clare-Kearney and Susan Jackson for the second-most league titles in school history, only trailing Sandra Smith's five ... Won four titles, including her eighth all-around crown, at NC State with a 9.95 on vault, 9.875 on bars, 9.85 on beam and 39.550 all-around ... Had a stellar meet at home against Alabama where she won the all-around with a career-high tying 39.600 and tied for the bars title with a 9.925 ... Won the all-around (39.450) and vault (9.925) in LSU's win against Georgia ... Finished with a 39.475 all-around for second place at Auburn ... Won her fourth straight all-around title with a 39.525 against Arkansas, including a career-high tying 9.95 on vault ... Named SEC Gymnast of the Week for the second time this season after she set a career high with a 39.600 all-around, winning vault (9.95), bars (9.85) and beam (9.90) at Missouri ... Won the all-around with a 39.225 and won the beam with a career-high 9.95 at Kentucky ... Captured the all-around title with a 39.450, set a career high on bars with a 9.95 and posted 9.90's on vault and floor at the Metroplex Challenge ... Won the beam title with a season-best 9.90 at Alabama ... Posted a 39.425 in the all-around with 9.90's on vault and floor against Florida ... Scored the highest all-around total in the nation with a 39.500 and won the all-around, beam and floor titles against North Carolina State ... Posted a career-best 9.975 on floor against the Wolfpack ... Earned SEC Gymnast of the Week for her performance against NC State.

**FRESHMAN SEASON (2012)**

Captured First-Team All-America honors on vault (9.925) and the all-around (39.475) at the NCAA Championship Semifinal I (4/20) ... Won the all-around in Semifinal I with the 39.475 and finished tied for seventh at the championships ... Finished seventh on vault with a 9.7313 at the NCAA Individual Event Finals (4/22) ... Became the seventh freshman in LSU history to earn First-Team All-America distinction, joining Jeanie Beadle (1977),

Sandra Smith ('80), Jennifer Wood ('93), Shanyyn MacEachern ('99), Lauren Companioni (2002) and Susan Jackson ('07), and Courville is one of only three LSU freshmen to earn multiple First-Team All-America honors, joining Smith (VT, FX) and Wood (VT, UB) ... She is the first LSU gymnast to achieve First-Team All-America status in the all-around as a freshman ... Led the team with 17 individual titles with seven on vault, four in the all-around, and two each on bars, beam and floor ... Won all-around titles vs. Kentucky (2/3), at Washington (2/17), vs. Alabama (2/24) and vs. West Virginia (3/16) ... Posted season highs of 9.95 on vault, 9.90 on bars, 9.925 on beam, 9.90 on floor and 39.500 in the all-around ... Finished the season ranked No. 3 nationally on vault with a 9.930 RQS, No. 8 in the all-around with a 39.450 RQS, No. 19 on floor with a 9.890 RQS and No. 24 on bars with a 9.875 RQS ... Earned First-Team All-SEC and Freshman All-SEC honors by placing third in the all-around at the SEC Championship (3/24) with a 39.450 ... Third-place all-around finish at the SEC Championship is the best for an LSU gymnast since Susan Jackson tied for second in 2009 ... Named SEC Freshman of the Week after she won the all-around against Kentucky, Alabama and West Virginia ... Her 9.925 on beam against Kentucky (2/3) is the first time an LSU freshman has scored at least a 9.925 on beam since Lisa Rennie earned a 9.95 at the SEC Championship on March 20, 2004 ... Posted 18 scores of 9.90 or higher and scored at least one 9.90 or better in 12 of 14 meets ... Led the team with a 9.862 vault average, 9.845 bars average and 39.263 all-around average ... One of only six LSU gymnasts to score at least two 9.95's on vault in a career ... Named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

**CLUB/HIGH SCHOOL**

Coached by former LSU national champion Susan Jackson at Louisiana Gymnastics Training Center ... Competed as an elite gymnast throughout her club career, most recently as a senior international elite gymnast ... Was a three-time qualifier for the Visa Championships (U.S. National Championships) ... Only competed once in 2011 to focus on her collegiate career, but she earned second place in the all-around, bars and beam at the Metroplex Challenge ... Finished 10th in the all-around at the 2010 Visa Championships ... Placed second in the all-around at both the 2010 Texas National Elite Qualifier and the 2010 Florida National Elite Qualifier, and she captured the beam titles at both meets and won the vault and floor titles at the Texas meet ... Earned a spot on the Junior U.S. National team in 2007 after placing fifth in the all-around at the Visa Championships ... Member of the National Honor Society in 2008 and 2009 ... Attended University Laboratory School in Baton Rouge where she was awarded for the most community service hours as a junior.

**JUNIOR SEASON (2013)**

Has competed in the all-around in eight meets this year and serves as the leadoff performer on vault ... Recorded 9.85's on beam and floor at the NCAA Columbus Regional ... Tied her career high with a 39.375 all-around at the SEC Championship, including a career-best 9.875 on beam ... Earned a 39.200 in the all-around at NC State led by a 9.85 on floor and 9.80's on bars and beam ... For the second straight week she shattered her career high on vault as she nailed her landing for a 9.925 against Alabama ... Set career highs on vault (9.90) and the all-around (39.375) against Georgia ... Tied her career high on beam with a 9.85 at Auburn and also tied her career high on vault with a 9.875 ... Tallied a 39.250 all-around score, led by a 9.875 on bars, against Arkansas ... Set a career high with a 39.350 in the all-around at Missouri, tying for the bars title with a 9.85 - the first individual title of her career ... Posted a 9.875 on vault and 9.825's on bars and floor at Kentucky ... Set a career high with a 39.275 in her first meet in the all-around this season at the Metroplex Challenge ... Scored a career-best 9.90 on bars at Metroplex and added 9.825's on vault and floor, and the 9.90 on bars is the first 9.9 of her career ... Tied her career high with a 9.875 on vault at Alabama ... Solid against Florida when she scored a 9.775 on vault, 9.775 on beam and 9.825 on floor ... Served as a great leadoff competitor on vault (9.825) and floor (9.825) against North Carolina State and also contributed a 9.75 on beam ... A leader inside and out the gym.

**SOPHOMORE SEASON (2012)**

A consistent competitor who demonstrated leadership inside and out of the gym ... Provided strong performances on vault, beam and floor during the season ... Posted a career-high 9.85 on beam at the NCAA Championships Semifinal I (4/20) ... Earned a new career high with a 9.875 on vault at Arkansas (1/20) ... Served as the leadoff performer all season on floor and tallied eight scores of 9.80 or higher, including six in a row from January to March ... Compiled 23 total scores of 9.80 or higher all season ... Recorded season highs of 9.875 on vault, 9.85 on beam and 9.85 on floor ... Her season-high 9.85 on floor was against Kentucky (2/3) ... Earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the third straight season.

**REDSHIRT FRESHMAN SEASON (2011)**

Bounced back from a season-ending injury prior to the 2010 season to become one of the team's top all-arounders in 2011 ... Displayed consistency throughout the season with only six falls in 51 total routines ... Earned Second Team All-America honors with a seventh-place finish in the all-around in the first semifinal at the NCAA Championships (4/15) ... Pushed LSU's streak to 19 consecutive years with at least one All-American with her performance at nationals ... Set a career high with a 39.175 all-around score at the NCAA Championships and also tied her career best on vault with a 9.85 ... Tallied season highs of 9.85 on vault, 9.80 on bars, 9.825 on beam, 9.875 on floor and 39.175 in the all-around ... Competed in the all-around in 12 of 13 meets, including the NCAA Championships ... Qualified to nationals by finishing as the top all-arounder not on a qualifying team at the NCAA Athens Regional (4/2) with a 39.075 all-around score ... Best events were vault with a 9.760 average and floor with a 9.748 average ... Scored a 9.80 or higher in eight of 13 floor routines ... Tallied a 39.000 all-around score or higher in six of 12 meets ... Named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the second straight year.

# D-D Breaux

HEAD COACH • 36TH SEASON

With each passing season, LSU gymnastics continues to shine as one of the nation's best programs, and head coach D-D Breaux has been the catalyst behind LSU's sustained success.

Led by Breaux, LSU has seen increasing accomplishments that includes nine NCAA Championships appearances in the last 10 seasons, two Super Sixes in the last five seasons and seven individual national titles since 2002.

Under Breaux's leadership and coaching, LSU gymnasts have begun to reach new heights in individual and team success.

In 2012, a school-record four LSU gymnasts captured All-SEC honors, highlighted by three freshmen - Rheagan Courville, Lloimincia Hall and Jessie Jordan.

In 2010, Susan Jackson became the first LSU gymnast to capture NCAA All-Around national title as she became LSU's first three-time NCAA champion.

In 2008 LSU joined elite company by advancing to the NCAA Super Six Finals as Breaux and the Tigers broke through into the six-team field to compete for college gymnastics' national championship in 2008. The Tigers finished fifth, beating out rival Alabama, for the best finish in program history since the current NCAA format was implemented in 1993.

In 2009, LSU made a repeat trip to the Super Six to compete for the national title and one day later Breaux coached senior Ashleigh Clare-Kearney to two individual national titles on vault and floor.

As the "Dean of Coaches" at LSU, Breaux has represented the University at the highest level both in the

gym and, most importantly, in the classroom for more than 30 years. Her dedication to the student-athlete on an individual basis has transcended into academic success, community involvement, Coach of the Year honors, SEC Championships, NCAA Regional Championships and top-10 national rankings throughout her tenure.

Now entering her 36th season as the mastermind of the LSU gymnastics program, the fire in Breaux's eyes burns as brightly today as it did on her first day on the job.

During her tenure Breaux has established and maintained LSU's reputation as one of the premier collegiate gymnastics programs in the country. Under her tutelage, the Tigers have finished among the nation's top-10 teams 23 times in 35 seasons, placing a program-best fourth in 1988, fifth in 2008 and sixth on four separate occasions.

LSU has also placed among the top three in regional competition on 27 separate occasions, winning regional titles nine times in three different decades, including back-to-back first-place regional finishes in 2008 and 2009. Her teams have included eight individual national titles, 111 All-America honors and 46 All-SEC selections.

Additionally, Breaux's Tigers won the inaugural SEC Championship title in 1981 and have gone on to finish second four times and third five other times.

For her dedication to the sport and her teams' numerous accomplishments, Breaux has been recognized by her peers time and time again. In the summer of 2009, Breaux received one of the highest honors as she was voted into the USA Gymnastics Region 8 Hall of Fame.

# Jay Clark

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH • 1ST SEASON

Jay Clark enters his first season as associate head coach at LSU, and he brings with him a wealth of championship experience and recruiting prowess in collegiate gymnastics.

Highly regarded as one of the nation's best recruiters, Clark joins the LSU staff as recruiting coordinator, and he will also assist in coaching every event for the Tigers with an emphasis on uneven bars.

Because of his recruiting success, ESPN and ESPN The Magazine selected Clark as the ninth-best recruiter in all of collegiate athletics in 2011.

Clark spent 20 seasons at the University of Georgia where he helped guide the Gym Dogs to seven NCAA National Titles and 12 Southeastern Conference Championships.

Clark primarily coached bars at Georgia, and he coached the Gym Dogs to 64 All-America honors and seven NCAA Individual National Titles on bars, including two-time champions Courtney Kupets and Kat Ding.

From 2009-12, Clark served as the head coach at Georgia, and during that time the Gym Dogs captured three NCAA Individual National Championships and produced 23 All-America honors. In 2012, his Georgia team won the Bulldog Cup, which recognizes the UGA team that excels academically, supports their peers in athletics and consistently serves the community.

Prior to his stint as head coach, Clark was the recruiting coordinator at Georgia from 1999-2009 while serving as assistant coach from 1999-2004 and associate head coach from 2005-09 when Georgia won an NCAA record five straight national titles.

In 2006, he earned NCAA National Assistant Coach of the Year and NCAA Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors after Georgia won a second-straight national title, and in 2001 Clark was named USA Gymnastics State of Georgia Coach of the Year.

Clark also coached at the club level for 13 years from 1992-2005 as the founder, owner and head coach of Classic City Gymnastics in Athens, Ga. He coached several Classic City gymnasts to state, regional, national championships and to the Junior Olympic National Team, and eight gymnasts went on to compete collegiately at the NCAA Division I level.

A native of Roswell, Ga., Clark earned his undergraduate degree in exercise science from Georgia. During his college career he also worked as a Physical Therapy Technician at Athens Sports Medicine Clinic, and he stayed in that capacity for four years until his coaching career began at Georgia.

Clark is married to the former Julie Ballard, an All-American Georgia gymnast from 1994-98 and a native of Mandeville, La. The couple have two children – a son, Cole, 10, and a daughter, Kinsey, 7.

# Bob Moore

## ASSISTANT COACH • 14TH SEASON

For more than a decade, Bob Moore has consistently coached the Tigers to be one of the top vaulting lineups in the nation, and in the past five seasons he has shown his mastery of coaching the event.

Moore coached Susan Jackson to the 2008 NCAA vault national title, and he followed that up by coaching Ashleigh Clare-Kearney to the 2009 NCAA vault title while Jackson was the runner up – giving LSU back-to-back national titles in the event. On top of that, Moore guided three Tigers to First-Team All-America status on vault in 2009 – Clare-Kearney, Jackson and Staci Schwitkis.

In 2010, Moore guided Jackson to a second place finish on vault again, and he coached former walk-on Ashley Lee to a ninth place finish – giving LSU back-to-back years with two gymnasts in the national top 10.

With more than 30 years of outstanding coaching across the southeast, Moore received one of the highest honors in his profession by being inducted into the USA Gymnastics Region 8 Hall of Fame in 2011.

Regarded as one of the best vaulting coaches in the country, Moore has been recognized several times for his exceptional work. He was named the NCAA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2009, marking the third time he has received the distinguished award. Moore first earned the award in 2005, sharing it with fellow LSU assistant Philip Ogletree, and Moore also received the award in 2007.

A longtime Southeastern Conference assistant, Moore begins his 14th season with the LSU gymnastics program, and his presence has been undeniable. He has helped the Tigers maintain their status as one of the nation's premier programs that includes nine NCAA Championships appearances in the last 10 years, two Super Sixes in the last five seasons and seven individual national titles since 2002.

Moore's primary responsibility with the Tigers is vaulting where the team has flourished under his watch as the team has finished in the top 10 of the national rankings in the event eight of his 13 years at LSU, including four straight seasons from 2007-10.

In his 13 seasons at LSU, Moore has coached his athletes to 15 All-America honors on vault, two national titles, and two national runner up finishes. In fact, LSU's one-two finish on vault in 2009 marked only the fourth time in NCAA history that two gymnasts from the same team finished first and second in the vault national finals.

As well as strengthening the Tigers on the vault, Moore plays a significant role with LSU's Bengal Gymnastics program, a highly successful youth age group program that practices in the Tigers' gymnastics training facility.

Moore is also LSU's academic coordinator as he works closely with the gymnastics academic advisor to ensure each gymnast is on the right track each season. In Moore's 13 years with the team, LSU has produced 67 Scholastic All-Americans and 106 SEC Academic Honor Roll members.

Moore's expertise was fine tuned at two other SEC programs. Before joining the Tigers, Moore spent six years at the University of Florida where he served as the program's top assistant. To his credit, Moore coached two national champions on the vault, in addition to numerous All-Americans and SEC champions. And prior to his stint in Gainesville, Moore coached for five seasons as an assistant at Auburn.

A native of Birmingham, Ala., Moore graduated from Samford University in 1976 with a degree in general studies with an emphasis in music. Bob is married to the former Sandra Ballard, and "Pops" and "Momme" are the proud grandparents of Isabella, Sophia, Trey and Brooklyn.

## INDIVIDUAL NATIONAL CHAMPIONS



**Jeanie Beadle**  
1977 AIAW Balance Beam National Champion

A pioneer in LSU gymnastics history, Jeanie Beadle won the Tigers' first individual national championship, claiming the AIAW beam title in 1977. She competed for LSU from 1976-80 and earned All-America status in 1977 and 1978. Her national title marked the first individual title for any female student-athlete in LSU history, and her All-America honors were also a first for a female student-athlete at LSU. As the leader of the team during her career,

Beadle guided the Tigers to three straight first-place finishes at the AIAW Regionals. For all her accomplishments and firsts at LSU, the Baton Rouge native was inducted into the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999.



**Nicki Arnstad**  
2002 NCAA Floor Exercise National Champion

Nicki Arnstad capped an exceptional four-year career by winning the NCAA floor title at the 2002 national championships in Tuscaloosa, Ala. In the final performance of her career, Arnstad tallied a 9.950 to claim LSU's first NCAA individual national title. She earned a total of four All-America honors during her career as she was recognized twice on the floor and twice in the all-around. Also a two-time First Team All-SEC performer, she still shares the school record on the floor exercise (10.00), posting the perfect score twice during her senior season including at the NCAA Central Regional to lead LSU to the NCAA Championships.



**April Burkholder**  
2006 NCAA Balance Beam National Champion

One of the most decorated gymnasts in LSU history, April Burkholder ended a stellar four-year career by winning the national beam title at the 2006 NCAA Championships. In her final meet as a Tiger, Burkholder posted a 9.9125 on the beam in Corvallis, Ore., to become LSU's second beam national champion. She recorded a school record 14 All-America honors during her career and was named to the All-SEC team four times. Burkholder was also selected as both the NCAA Central Region and SEC Gymnast of the Year twice (2004 and 2005) and was named the SEC Freshman of the Year

in 2003. She is also second in school history with eight perfect 10.00's and the only Tiger with at least one on three different events - scoring four on floor, two on vault and two on beam.

Ashleigh Clare-Kearney finished her outstanding career April 18, 2009, by becoming LSU's first two-time national champion as she captured the vault national title with a 9.900 average and the floor national title with a 9.950 score in Lincoln, Neb. The five-time First Team All-American capped her senior season by earning NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year recognition, and she recorded her third straight First Team All-SEC honor after repeating as SEC Floor Exercise Champion. She was also the SEC Gymnast of the Year as a junior as she became

LSU's second SEC All-Around champion in 2008. Clare-Kearney ended her career as LSU's all-time leader in individual titles as she finished with 114, and she was instrumental in leading the Tigers to back-to-back NCAA Super Six appearances in 2008 and 2009.

Susan Jackson became LSU's first gymnast to win a national title before her senior season as she earned the vault national title with a 9.8563 average as a sophomore at the 2008 NCAA Championships in Athens, Ga. After finishing as national runner up on vault in 2009 behind Ashleigh Clare-Kearney, Jackson went out on top as a senior in 2010 by capturing two more national titles to become LSU's first three-time champion. She tallied a 39.625 all-around score at the NCAA Championships in Gainesville, Fla., to earn LSU's first All-Around national title, and

two days later she punctuated her career with a near-flawless performance to earn the beam national title with a 9.9625 score. Displaying consistency all season as a senior, Jackson was named the SEC Gymnast of the Year and NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year, and she became the first LSU gymnast to receive the prestigious AAI Award and Gymnastics Honda Sports Award that both go to the nation's top gymnast. Jackson further cemented her legacy by winning 11 all-around titles in 2010, breaking a 30-year-old school record for the most in a single season.



**Rheagan Courville**  
2013 NCAA Vault National Champion

Rheagan Courville capped one of the best seasons in LSU history by winning the vault national title on April 21, 2013 inside Pauley Pavilion in Los Angeles, Calif. Courville performed a fantastic vault to score a 9.9250 and take home the title. She wrapped up a phenomenal sophomore campaign in which she won SEC Gymnast of the Year, Central Region Gymnast of the Year, earned First-Team All-America honors on vault, floor and the all-around, First-Team Regular Season All-America honors on vault and the all-around and Second-Team Regular Season honors on beam, captured the SEC All-Around, Vault and Beam titles, and finished the season with a

nation-leading nine all-around victories. In addition to the vault title, Courville finished as the national runner-up in the all-around, cementing her name as one of the top gymnasts in LSU history.

#### 2009

One year later LSU repeated as Super Six participants as the Tigers rallied in the prelims at the 2009 NCAA Championships to advance to the finals.

#### 2013

LSU recorded a second-place finish in Semifinal I to earn a spot in the Super Six, and the Tigers went on to tie the 2008 squad for the second-best finish in school history by placing fifth with a 197.050.
