Returning three-time All-American who is an outstanding contributor on vault, beam and floor ... Poised to compete in those three events again as a junior ... A vocal leader for the squad who always gives maximum effort in practice and in competitions.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2015)

Saw action on beam in 12 of 13 meets, competed on floor in nine of 13 meets and vaulted in eight of 13 ... Tallied Second-Team All-America honors on beam and floor at the NCAA Championships Semifinal II (4/17) ... Scored a 9.90 on floor to tie for sixth and a 9.85 on beam to tie for eighth in the NCAA Semifinal ... Established career highs on vault, beam and floor in a fantastic sophomore campaign ... Earned a 9.925 on vault twice – at Auburn (2/13) and at Centenary (3/13) ... Posted a career-high tying 9.90 on beam vs. Missouri (1/23) ... Scored a career-best 9.925 on floor vs. Minnesota (3/6) ... Competed in the leadoff spot on beam half the season ... Achieved nine scores of 9.90 or higher this season (5 vault, 1 beam, 3 floor) ... Finished just outside the Top 25 at No. 26 in the final vault rankings (9.90 regional qualifying score) ... Averaged a 9.878 on vault, 9.833 on floor and 9.769 on beam ... Earned 21 scores of 9.825 or higher (7 vault, 6 beam, 8 floor) ... Recorded Scholastic All-America and SEC Academic Honor Roll achievements for the second straight year.

FRESHMAN SEASON (2014)

Competed all season long on beam and delivered strong performances in the postseason ... Earned First-Team All-America honors on beam after posting a season-high tying 9.90 at the NCAA Championships Semifinal I (4/18) ... Followed up her fantastic beam routine in the semifinal with another solid performance to score a 9.875 in the NCAA Super Six

Finals (4/19) ... Wrapped up her freshman season in stellar fashion by scoring a 9.8875 at the NCAA Individual Event Finals (4/20) to finish in a tie for third place nationally on beam ... Is the first freshman in LSU history to qualify to the NCAA Individual Event Finals and her third-place national finish is the highest finish for an LSU gymnast on beam since Susan Jackson won the beam national title in 2010 ... Became the first LSU freshman to earn All-America honors on beam since Colleen Barger in 1997, and she became only the second LSU gymnast in history to earn First-Team All-America honors on beam as a freshman, joining Jeanie Beadle who accomplished the feat in 1977 ... Tallied the first 9.90 of her career on beam at the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional (4/5) as she helped LSU earn a 49.600 in the event, the second-best beam total in program history ... Competed once in the vault lineup and scored a 9.875 versus Kentucky (3/14) ... Averaged a 9.797 on beam and competed in the event in 12 of 15 team meets ... Posted a 9.825 or higher 10 times in 13 beam routines during the season ... Earned NACCG/W Scholastic All-America honors and SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition.

Coached by her mother, Donna, at Acadiana Gymnastics where she competed as a level 10 gymnast ... Competed at the 2013 J.O. National Championships and placed fifth on vault ... Was outstanding at the 2013 Louisiana State meet where she swept all individual titles, winning vault, bars, beam, floor and the all-around, and she received the Fruge' Award for the highest all-around total out of all level 10 age groups ... Five-time All-American who enters her junior season as one of the team's strongest leaders ... Outstanding all-around performer and ranked as one of the nation's best a year ago ... Energetic and powerful gymnast who has the ability to provide big scores in any event ... Has performed a double-twisting Yurchenko full vault.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2015)

Recorded First-Team All-America honors on floor at the NCAA Championships Semifinal II (4/17) when she posted a 9.925 to finish second in the event ... Finished in a tie for fifth on floor with a 9.9125 at the NCAA Championships Individual Event Finals (4/19) ... Earned Second-Team Regular Season All-America honors on floor and the all-around by ranking No. 10 nationally on floor with a 9.930 regional qualifying score (RQS) and No. 13 in the all-around with a 39.450 RQS ... Finished the regular season ranked No. 10 on floor, No. 13 in the all-around and No. 19 on beam (9.895 RQS) ... Became the first gymnast in LSU history to compete a double-twisting Yurchenko vault, doing it for the first time at the Metroplex Challenge (1/31) ... Shattered career highs on all four events and the all-around: 9.975 on vault vs. Minnesota (3/6), 9.875s on bars vs. Florida (2/20), at Alabama (2/27) and at the SEC Championship (3/21), 9.950s on beam vs. Georgia (2/6) and at Centenary (3/13), 9.975 on floor vs. Minnesota, 39.725 in the all-around vs. Minnesota ... Her 39.725 all-around total vs. Minnesota ranks as the 11th-best in LSU history ... Captured seven individual titles (three on beam, two all-around, one vault and one floor) ... Won all-around titles with a 39.550 at Auburn (2/13) and a 39.725 vs. Minnesota ... Shared the vault title with a 9.85 at Kentucky (1/16) ... Won beam titles with a 9.95 vs. Georgia, 9.925 vs. Minnesota and 9.95 at Centenary ... Earned the floor title with a 9.95 at Auburn ... Competed on almost every event in every meet, seeing action on vault, bars and floor in 12 of 13 meets and 11 of 13 on beam ... Posted 15 scores of 9.90 or higher (10 on floor, 3 on beam, 2 on vault) ... Finished the season with a 9.895 average on floor, 9.869 on vault, 9.809 on beam, 9.704 on bars and 39.333 in the all-around ... Ended the season with a streak of nine consecutive performances with at least a 9.90 on floor ... Posted a 9.85 or higher in 32 of 48 total routines ... Earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the second straight season.

FRESHMAN SEASON (2014)

Saw action on vault, beam and floor all season, competing on vault and beam in all 15 team meets and competing on floor 13 times ... Earned First-Team All-America distinction on vault after she posted a 9.90 at the NCAA Championships Semifinal I (4/18) ... Garnered Second-Team All-America status on floor when she scored a 9.90 in the event in Semifinal I ... Competed on vault in the NCAA Individual Event Finals (4/20) where she recorded a 9.825 ... Tallied season highs of 9.95 on vault (twice), 9.95 on beam (three times) and 9.925 on floor ... Captured five individual titles with three on beam and two on vault ... Won beam titles at Oklahoma (2/9) with a 9.90, versus Missouri (2/28) with a 9.875 and at home against Kentucky (3/14) with a 9.95 ... Won vault titles with a 9.90 at Arkansas (2/7) and a 9.95 in the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional (4/5) ... Earned SEC Freshman of the Week after the double-meet weekend at Arkansas and at Oklahoma when she won two titles, including the beam title that helped secure LSU's upset win at No. 2 Oklahoma ... Named SEC Freshman of the Week again after the Kentucky meet where she won the beam title with a 9.95 ... Scored back-to-back 9.95s on beam against North Carolina State (3/7) and Kentucky, becoming only the second LSU freshman to post back-to-back scores of at least a 9.95 on beam (April Burkholder did it first in 2003)

... Added a third 9.95 on beam at the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional to become the first gymnast in LSU history to score at least three 9.95s on beam as a freshman ... Her 9.85 on beam against Centenary (1/10) marked the highest beam score by a freshman in a season opener in LSU history ... Averaged a 9.873 on vault, 9.757 on beam and a 9.840 on floor ... Posted a 9.85 or higher in 28 of her 44 total routines and achieved a 9.90 or better in 14 routines ... Named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

CLUB/HIGH SCHOOL

Competed as a level 10 gymnast for ACE Gymnastics where she was coached by her parents Ray and Joan Gnat ... Six-time qualifier to J.O. Nationals ... Recorded four Top 10 finishes in the all-around in six appearances at J.O. Nationals ... Shined in the final meet of her club career at the 2013 J.O. Nationals where she captured the vault and floor national titles and placed second in the all-around with a 38.475 that ranked as the second-highest all-around total of the entire event ... Swept all five individual titles at the 2013 Regional Championships and finished with a club career-best 39.000 all-around total ... Captured vault, beam, floor and all-around titles at the 2013 Florida State Championships ... Earned six vault titles in only eight meets during the 2013 season, including a perfect 10.0 in the event at the Lady Luck Invitational ... Finished fifth in the all-around at 2012 nationals with a third-place result on vault and floor ... Took second in the all-around at 2012 regionals with first-place finishes on vault, beam and floor ... Competed at the prestigious Nastia Liukin Cup in 2010, 2012 and 2013 where she placed eighth in the all-around in 2013 ... Attended and graduated from Lake Mary High School where she was an honor roll student.

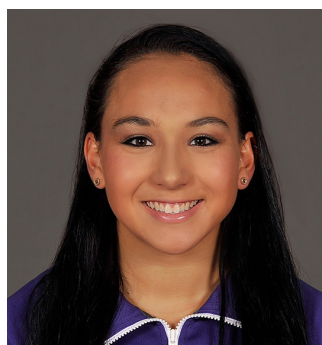

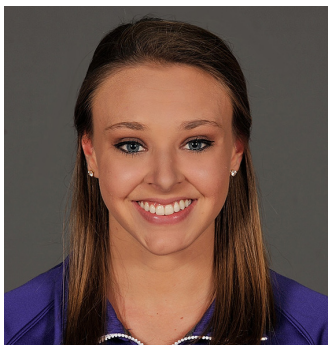

D-D Breaux

HEAD COACH • 39TH SEASON

With each passing season, LSU gymnastics continues to collect more honors and titles to its storied program, and head coach D-D Breaux has been the catalyst behind LSU's sustained success.

Led by Breaux, LSU has seen increasing accolades that include nine NCAA Championships appearances in the last 10 seasons, four Super Sixes since 2008 and nine individual national titles since 2002.

In 2015, Breaux guided LSU to a 13-1 overall regular season record, which included a perfect 7-0 record against SEC competition for the first time in school history.

The list of achievements in 2014 includes a program-record third-place national finish in the NCAA Super Six Finals, another individual national title by Rheagan Courville on vault, the 13th regional title in school history, the highest score in program history on three different occasions, 20 total All-America honors including a nation-leading five First-Team All-Americans, and a school-record 13 consecutive meets with at least a 197 score.

Because of her outstanding efforts in leading LSU to a record season, Breaux was not only named the 2014 Central Region Coach of the Year, but she was also honored as 2014 National Coach of the Year.

In 2013, LSU recorded the 12th regional team title in school history, and the Tigers reached the NCAA Super Six for the third time in 2013, recording a fifth-place finish. Three gymnasts won five individual SEC titles in Courville (VT, BB, AA), Lloimincia Hall (FX) and Jessica Savona (FX).

In 2010 LSU reached the NCAA Championships for the ninth straight year while senior Susan Jackson became the first LSU gymnast to capture the NCAA All-Around national

title, and she also won the 2010 balance beam title to become LSU's first three-time NCAA champion.

In 2008 LSU joined elite company by advancing to the NCAA Super Six Finals as Breaux and the Tigers broke through into the six-team field for the first time in program history to compete for college gymnastics' national championship. The Tigers placed fifth.

In 2009, LSU made a repeat trip to the Super Six to compete for the national title, and one day later Breaux and staff coached senior Ashleigh Clare-Kearney to two individual national titles on vault and floor.

As the "Dean of Coaches" at LSU, Breaux has represented the University at the highest level both in the gym and in the classroom for more than 30 years.

Entering her 39th season as the mastermind of the LSU gymnastics program, the fire in Breaux's eyes burns as brightly today as it did on her first day on the job.

During her tenure Breaux has established and maintained LSU's reputation as one of the premier collegiate gymnastics programs in the country. Under her tutelage, the Tigers have placed among the nation's top-10 teams 26 times in 38 seasons, finishing a program-best third in 2014, fourth in 1988 and fifth in 2008 and 2013.

LSU has also placed among the top three in regional competition on 30 separate occasions, winning regional titles 14 times in four different decades, including back-to-back first-place regional finishes in 2008 and 2009 and 2013-2015. Under her leadership, LSU has captured 10 individual national titles, 167 All-America honors and 59 All-SEC selections.

Jay Clark enters his fourth season as associate head coach at LSU in 2016, and his impact has been felt far and wide in his first three seasons with the Tigers.

With the help of Clark's leadership and expertise in collegiate gymnastics coaching, LSU has earned back-to-back NCAA Super Six Finals appearances in 2013 and 2014, produced two NCAA individual national titles, captured three NCAA regional team titles and tallied numerous school records.

His work with the Fighting Tigers of LSU has not gone unnoticed. In fact, Clark was named the Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year, sharing the honor with fellow LSU assistant Bob Moore, in his first three seasons with the team.

Clark also earned the 2014 National Co-Assistant Coach of the Year award, along with Moore, and it marked the second time in his distinguished coaching career he has garnered the nation's top award.

Clark carries a wealth of championship experience and recruiting prowess in collegiate gymnastics, and he has shown the ability to help programs reach the highest level throughout his coaching career.

Highly regarded as one of the nation's best recruiters, Clark serves as recruiting coordinator at LSU, and he assists in coaching every event for the Tigers with an emphasis on uneven bars.

In his three seasons at LSU, Clark has coached the Tigers to 10 All-America honors on bars, six Top 10 bars team scores in school history and the top two bars title winners in LSU history. Sarie Morrison captured a school-record 28 bars titles, and Rheagan Courville won 19 bars title to rank first and second in school history. Both put up record numbers under Clark's guidance.

For the second consecutive season LSU earned a Top 5 national ranking on bars in 2015, and the team posted the second-highest bars total in school history with a 49.600 against Iowa. The Tigers also accumulated the second-best season average on bars in school history with a 49.288 average.

As a team LSU produced four All-America honors on bars in 2015 with three gymnasts (Rheagan Courville, Randii Wyrick and Shae Zamardi) earning First-Team All-America honors at the NCAA Championships. It marked the first time in program history that three gymnasts secured First-Team All-America honors on bars in one season.

The 2014 season was arguably the finest in LSU history as the Tigers earned the best finish in program history by taking third place in the NCAA Super Six, and Clark played a prominent role in the Tigers' success throughout the year.

Under Clark's direction, LSU shattered the school record with a 49.330 average on bars and finished the

2014 season ranked No. 5 nationally in the event. In addition, the Tigers tallied three of the top 10 bars scores in school history, including a 49.600 that ranks as the second best, and LSU produced three All-America honors on bars.

Clark coached Rheagan Courville to a First-Team All-America honor at the 2014 NCAA Championships, and Courville went on to finish fifth in the event at the NCAA Individual Finals.

LSU reached the Super Six in the 2013 season, and under Clark's guidance the Tigers finished the season with a 49.260 regional qualifying score on bars, the highest final RQS in that event since the 2009 season.

Clark coached Sarie Morrison and Randii Wyrick to First-Team All-America honors on bars in his first season with the Tigers, and it marked the first season LSU produced at least two All-Americans on bars since 2010.

Under Clark's tutelage, Morrison shattered the single-season school record by winning 12 bars titles in 2013, breaking the previous record of nine bars titles by Susan Jackson in 2010.

Because of his recruiting success, ESPNU and ESPN The Magazine selected Clark as the ninth-best recruiter in all of collegiate athletics in 2011.

Before Clark joined LSU he spent 20 seasons at the University of Georgia where he helped guide the Gym Dogs to seven NCAA National Titles and 14 Southeastern Conference Championships.

Clark primarily coached bars at Georgia, and he coached the Gym Dogs to 64 All-America honors and seven NCAA individual national titles on bars, including two-time champions Courtney Kupets and Kat Ding.

From 2009-12, Clark served as the head coach at Georgia, and during that time the Gym Dogs captured three NCAA individual national championships and produced 23 All-America honors. In 2012, his Georgia team won the Bulldog Cup, which recognizes the UGA team that excels academically, supports their peers in athletics and consistently serves the community.

Prior to his stint as head coach, Clark was the recruiting coordinator at Georgia from 1999-2009 while serving as assistant coach from 1999-2004 and associate head coach from 2005-09 when Georgia won an NCAA record five straight national titles.

In 2006, he earned National Assistant Coach of the Year and Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors after Georgia won a second-straight national title, and in 2001 Clark was named USA Gymnastics State of Georgia Coach of the Year.

Clark also coached at the club level for 13 years from 1992-2005 as the founder, owner and head coach of Classic City Gymnastics in Athens, Ga. He coached several Classic City gymnasts to state, regional, national championships and to the Junior Olympic National Team, and eight gymnasts went on to compete collegiately at the NCAA Division I level.

A native of Roswell, Ga., Clark earned his undergraduate degree in exercise science from Georgia. During his college career he also worked as a Physical Therapy Technician at Athens Sports Medicine Clinic, and he stayed in that capacity for four years until his coaching career began at Georgia.

Clark is married to the former Julie Ballard, an All-American Georgia gymnast from 1994-98 and a native of Mandeville, La. The couple has two children – a son, Cole, 13, and a daughter, Kinsey, 9.

For 16 seasons at LSU, Bob Moore has consistently proven that he is one of the nation's best vault coaches.

During his outstanding career with the Tigers, Moore has been recognized several times for his exceptional work. Besides earning National Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 2014, he has been named Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year on six occasions – 2005, 2007, 2009, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

A longtime Southeastern Conference assistant, Moore begins his 17th season with the LSU gymnastics program in 2015, and his presence has been undeniable. He has helped the Tigers maintain their status as one of the nation's premier programs that includes nine NCAA Championships appearances in the last 10 years, four Super Sixes in the last eight seasons and nine individual national titles since 2002.

For the third straight season Moore guided LSU to elite status on vault as the Tigers ranked No. 2 nationally in the event at the end of the 2015 season. LSU shattered the school record for highest vault score with a 49.825 against Minnesota, and that event score ranked as the highest total of any team on any event in the 2015 season. Once again, Moore shared Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors with fellow LSU assistant Jay Clark.

In 2014, his coaching peers across the nation recognized his efforts by voting him not only the Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year but also the National Co-Assistant Coach of the Year along with fellow LSU assistant Jay Clark.

The 2014 season was arguably the finest in LSU history, and Moore was a major reason why. He coached Rheagan Courville to a second straight NCAA national title on vault, led the Tigers to the No. 1 national ranking on vault for the second consecutive season, set the school record with an astonishing 49.483 season average on vault, and coached four gymnasts to All-America honors in the event.

In addition, Moore guided the Tigers to five of the Top 10 vault scores in school history in 2014, including a then program-record 49.650 total in the NCAA Regional.

LSU ranked No. 1 nationally as a team on vault for half the 2013 season, including the final rankings, and Moore coached Courville to the SEC vault title and NCAA national title.

Moore earned NCAA Central Region Co-Assistant

Coach of the Year honors in 2013, sharing the award with Clark, and Moore guided the Tigers to one of the best seasons on vault in school history.

Not only did Moore coach Courville to the vault national title, but he guided Courville and Sarie Morrison to perfect 10.0 scores in 2013.

Moore coached Susan Jackson to the 2008 NCAA vault national title, and he followed that up by coaching Ashleigh Clare-Kearney to the 2009 NCAA vault title while Jackson was the runner up – giving LSU back-to-back national titles in the event. On top of that, Moore guided three Tigers to First-Team All-America status on vault in 2009 – Clare-Kearney, Jackson and Staci Schwitkis.

In 2010, Moore guided Jackson to a second place finish on vault again, and he coached former walk-on Ashley Lee to a ninth place finish – giving LSU back-to-back years with two gymnasts in the national top 10.

With more than 30 years of outstanding coaching across the southeast, Moore received one of the highest honors in his profession by being inducted into the USA Gymnastics Region 8 Hall of Fame in 2011.

Moore's primary responsibility with the Tigers is vaulting where the team has flourished under his watch as the team has finished in the top 10 of the national rankings in the event 11 of his 16 years at LSU, including four straight seasons from 2007-10, as well as the No. 1 national ranking in 2013 and 2014.

In his 16 previous seasons at LSU, Moore has coached his athletes to 26 All-America honors on vault, four national titles, and two national runner-up finishes. In fact, LSU's one-two finish on vault in 2009 marked only the fourth time in NCAA history that two gymnasts from the same team finished first and second in the vault national finals.

As well as strengthening the Tigers on the vault, Moore plays a significant role with LSU's Bengal Gymnastics program, a highly successful youth age group program that practices in the Tigers' gymnastics training facility.

Moore is also LSU's academic coordinator as he works closely with the gymnastics academic advisor to ensure each gymnast is on the right track each season. In Moore's 16 years with the team, LSU has produced 82 Scholastic All-Americans and 137 SEC Academic Honor Roll members.

Moore's expertise was fine tuned at two other SEC programs. Before joining the Tigers, Moore spent six years at the University of Florida where he served as the program's top assistant. To his credit, Moore coached two national champions on the vault, in addition to numerous All-Americans and SEC champions. Prior to his stint in Gainesville, Moore coached for five seasons as an assistant at Auburn.

A native of Birmingham, Ala., Moore graduated from Samford University in 1976 with a degree in general studies with an emphasis in music. Bob is married to the former Sandra Ballard, and "Pops" and "Momme" are the proud grandparents of Isabella, Sophia, Trey, Brooklyn, Lyla and Maggie.

Jeanie Beadle

1977 AIAW Balance Beam National Champion

A pioneer in LSU gymnastics history, Jeanie Beadle won the Tigers' first individual national championship, claiming the AIAW beam title in 1977. She competed for LSU from 1976-80 and earned All-America status in 1977 and 1978. Her national title marked the first individual title for any female student-athlete in LSU history, and her All-America honors were also a first for a female student-athlete at LSU. As the leader of the team during her career, Beadle guided the Tigers to three straight first-place finishes at the AIAW Regionals. For all her accomplishments and firsts at LSU, the Baton Rouge native was inducted into the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999.

Nicki Arnstad

2002 NCAA Floor Exercise National Champion

Nicki Arnstad capped an exceptional four-year career by winning the NCAA floor title at the 2002 national championships in Tuscaloosa, Ala. In the final performance of her career, Arnstad tallied a 9.950 to claim LSU's first NCAA individual national title. She earned a total of four All-America honors during her career as she was recognized twice on the floor and twice in the all-around. Also a two-time First Team All-SEC performer, she still shares the school record on the floor exercise (10.00), posting the perfect score twice during her senior season including at the NCAA Central Regional to lead LSU to the NCAA Championships.

April Burkholder

2006 NCAA Balance Beam National Champion

One of the most decorated gymnasts in LSU history, April Burkholder ended a stellar four-year career by winning the national beam title at the 2006 NCAA Championships. In her final meet as a Tiger, Burkholder posted a 9.9125 on the beam in Corvallis, Ore., to become LSU's second beam national champion. She recorded a school record 14 All-America honors during her career and was named to the All-SEC team four times. Burkholder was also selected as both the NCAA Central Region and SEC Gymnast of the Year twice (2004 and 2005) and was named the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2003. She is also second in school history with eight perfect 10.00's and the only Tiger with at least one on three different events - scoring four on floor, two on vault and two on beam.

Ashleigh Clare-Kearney

2009 NCAA Vault National Champion

2009 NCAA Floor Exercise National Champion

Ashleigh Clare-Kearney finished her outstanding career April 18, 2009, by becoming LSU's first two-time national champion as she captured the vault national title with a 9.900 average and the floor national title with a 9.950 score in Lincoln, Neb. The five-time First Team All-American capped her senior season by earning NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year recognition, and she recorded her third straight First Team All-SEC honor after repeating as SEC Floor Exercise Champion. She was also the SEC Gymnast of the Year as a junior as she became LSU's second SEC All-Around champion in 2008. Clare-Kearney ended her career as LSU's all-time leader in individual titles as she finished with 114, and she was instrumental in leading the Tigers to back-to-back NCAA Super Six appearances in 2008 and 2009.

Susan Jackson

Susan Jackson became LSU's first gymnast to win a national title before her senior season as she earned the vault national title with a 9.8563 average as a sophomore at the 2008 NCAA Championships in Athens, Ga. After finishing as national runner up on vault in 2009 behind Ashleigh Clare-Kearney, Jackson went out on top as a senior in 2010 by capturing two more national titles to become LSU's first three-time champion. She tallied a 39.625 all-around score at the NCAA Championships in Gainesville, Fla., to earn LSU's first All-Around national title, and two days later she punctuated her career with a near-flawless performance to earn the beam national title with a 9.9625 score. Displaying consistency all season as a senior, Jackson was named the SEC Gymnast of the Year and NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year, and she became the first LSU gymnast to receive the prestigious AAI Award and Gymnastics Honda Sports Award that both go to the nation's top gymnast. Jackson further cemented her legacy by winning 11 all-around titles in 2010, breaking a 30-year-old school record for the most in a single season.

Rheagan Courville

2014 NCAA Vault National Champion

Rheagan Courville capped one of the best seasons in LSU history by winning the vault national title on April 21, 2013 inside Pauley Pavilion in Los Angeles, Calif. Courville performed a fantastic vault to score a 9.9250 and take home the title. Her sophomore campaign in 2013 will go down as one of the finest in LSU gymnastics. She won SEC Gymnast of the Year and became the first Tiger gymnast to win three titles at one SEC Championship as she captured the vault, beam and all-around titles. Courville was also named the NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year after she led the nation with nine all-around victories in 2013. She became the first LSU gymnast in history to repeat as national champion in an event as she captured the 2014 NCAA vault national title. Courville earned the highest score on vault ever in the NCAA Individual Event Finals competition with a 9.9750 to win the national title on April 20, 2014 inside BJCC Arena in Birmingham, Ala. The national title capped another fantastic season for the Baton Rouge native. In 2014, Courville earned Central Region Gymnast of the Year honors for the second straight year, finished No. 2 nationally in the all-around rankings, tallied eight All-America honors including multiple first-team honors on vault and the all-around, and she became only the fourth gymnast in school history to record two or more perfect 10 scores on vault in her career.
