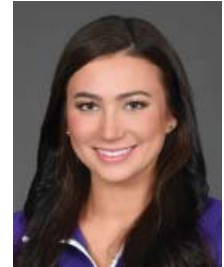

Outstanding talent who competed in all four lineups as a freshman ... Consistent performer on vault who competed in the leadoff spot in 2016 ... Could push for a spot in any lineup as a sophomore.

FRESHMAN SEASON (2016)

Saw action on vault in 10 meets, competed on beam in eight meets, competed on bars in four meets and performed one floor routine ... By the latter portion of the schedule she established herself as a mainstay in the vault and beam lineups ... Leadoff performer on vault ... Had her best meet of the season in the NCAA Super Six (4/16) when she posted a career-high 9.90 on vault and 9.85 on beam to help LSU become national runners-up, the best finish in school history ... Also scored a 9.90 on vault at the NCAA Athens Regional (4/2) at Georgia ... Posted a season-high 9.85 on bars in the win at Florida (2/26) ... Averaged a 9.843 on vault, 9.663 on bars and 9.603 on beam ... Tallied five scores of 9.85 or higher on vault.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2015)

Saw action on beam in 12 of 13 meets, competed on floor in nine of 13 meets and vaulted in eight of 13 ... Tallied Second-Team All-America honors on beam and floor at the NCAA Championships Semifinal II (4/17) ... Scored a 9.90 on floor to tie for sixth and a 9.85 on beam to tie for eighth in the NCAA Semifinal ... Established career highs on vault, beam and floor in a fantastic sophomore campaign ... Earned a 9.925 on vault twice – at Auburn (2/13) and at Centenary (3/13) ... Posted a career-high tying 9.90 on beam vs. Missouri (1/23) ... Scored a career-best 9.925 on floor vs. Minnesota (3/6) ... Competed in the leadoff spot on beam half the season ... Achieved nine scores of 9.90 or higher this season (5 vault, 1 beam, 3 floor) ... FRESHMAN SEASON (2014)

Competed all season long on beam and delivered strong performances in the postseason ... Earned First-Team All-America honors on beam after posting a season-high tying 9.90 at the NCAA Championships Semifinal I (4/18) ... Followed up her fantastic beam routine in the semifinal with another solid performance to score a 9.875 in the NCAA Super Six Finals (4/19) ... Wrapped up her freshman season in stellar fashion by scoring a 9.8875 at the NCAA Individual Event Finals (4/20) to finish in a tie for third place nationally on beam ... Is the first freshman in LSU history to qualify to the NCAA Individual Event Finals and her third-place national finish is the highest finish for an LSU gymnast on beam since Susan Jackson won the beam national title in 2010 ... Became the first LSU freshman to earn All-America honors on beam since Colleen Barger in 1997, and she became only the second LSU gymnast in history to earn First-Team All-America honors on beam as a freshman, joining Jeanie Beadle who accomplished the feat in 1977 ... Tallied the first 9.90 of her career on beam at the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional (4/5) as she helped LSU earn a 49.600 in the event, the second-best beam total in program history ... Competed once in the vault lineup and scored a 9.875 versus Kentucky (3/14) ... Averaged a 9.797 on beam and competed in the event in 12 of 15 team meets ... Posted a 9.825 or higher 10 times in 13 beam routines during the season ... Earned NACGC/W Scholastic All-America honors and SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition.

Competed on bars and beam in all 14 meets, competed on vault in 10 meets and saw action on floor in three meets ... Appeared in the all-around at the Metroplex Challenge (1/30), vs. Arkansas and at Georgia (2/13) ... Posted career highs of 9.925 on vault, 9.95 on bars (twice), 9.925 on beam (four times), 9.90 on floor and 38.975 in the all-around ... Her 9.925 on vault came at Texas Woman's, and her 9.90 on floor was at the Metroplex Challenge ... Named SEC Freshman of the Week three times after stellar performances against Oklahoma, at Florida (2/26) and at Texas Woman's ... Became the first gymnast in school history to post a 9.95 on bars in the first road meet of her career (at Lady Luck) ... Her 9.925 vs. Oklahoma is the highest score in an LSU gymnast's first career beam routine in school history ... Averaged a 9.840 on vault, 9.732 on bars, 9.834 on beam, 9.692 on floor and 38.825 in the all-around ... Tallied 18 scores of 9.90 or higher with eight on bars, seven on beam, two on vault and one on floor ... Recorded 31 scores of 9.825 or better with 12 on beam, 10 on bars, seven on vault and two on floor ... Member of the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

CLUB/HIGH SCHOOL

Trained as a senior international elite competitor at Great American Gymnastics Express (GAGE) under coaches Al Fong and Armine Barutyan Fong ... Served as an alternate for the U.S. Gymnastics Olympic team, known as the "Fierce Five," that won gold at the 2012 Summer Olympics in London ... Missed the entire 2013 club season after suffering an injury but returned to health in 2014 while competing for St. Louis Gymnastics Centre ... Ranks fourth in LSU history with six career perfect 10.0 scores ... Ranks in the Top 10 for most vault and floor titles in LSU history entering her final season ... The reigning SEC Specialist of the Year and the 2016 SEC Floor Exercise Champion ... Outstanding all-around performer who is a vocal team leader ... Performs a huge double-twisting Yurchenko vault.

JUNIOR SEASON (2016)

A dominant performer who set LSU record and played a pivotal role in leading the Tigers to a national runner-up finish at the NCAA Super Six (4/16), the best finish in school history ... Led the team with 25 individual titles this season (10 on vault, 10 on floor, three on beam and two in the all-around) ... Finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally on vault and floor ... Also ranked No. 17 on beam in the final rankings ... Led the nation with six perfect 10.0 scores this season with four on floor and two on vault ... Became the first gymnast in LSU history to score six perfect 10s in one season ... Tied the LSU single-season record with 10 floor titles ... Averaged a 9.945 on floor, 9.939 on vault, 9.788 on beam, 9.727 on bars and a 39.397 in the all-around ... Competed on vault, beam and floor in all 14 meets and saw action on bars in eight meets ... Set career highs of 10.0 on vault, 10.0

on floor and matched her best of 9.95 on beam ... Perfect 10s on vault came against Kentucky (1/22) and at the Metroplex Challenge (1/30) ... Perfect 10s on floor came vs. Auburn (2/19), vs. Alabama (3/4), at Texas Woman's (3/12) and at the SEC Championship (3/19) ... Crowned the NACGC/W Central Region Gymnast of the Year and named the SEC Specialist of the Year ... Earned a total of six All-America honors this season with four at the NCAA Championships and two during the regular season ... Named a First-Team Regular Season All-American on vault and floor ... Achieved First-Team All-America honors on vault (9.925) and beam (9.90) during NCAA Semifinal I (4/15), and also earned Second-Team All-America honors on floor (9.875) and the all-around (39.500) at the semifinal ... Tallied All-SEC honors by winning the floor title and placing second on vault (9.90) at the SEC Championship ... 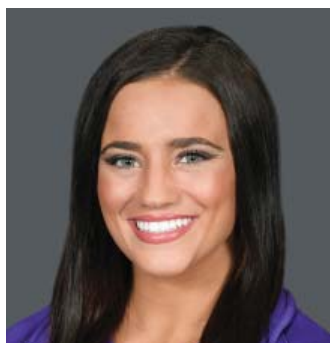

D-D Breaux

HEAD COACH • 40TH SEASON

With each passing season, LSU gymnastics continues to collect more honors and titles to its storied program, and head coach D-D Breaux has been the catalyst behind LSU's sustained success.

Led by Breaux, LSU has seen increasing accomplishments that includes 14 NCAA Championships appearances in the last 15 seasons, five Super Six appearances since 2008 and nine individual national titles since 2002.

Under Breaux's leadership and coaching, LSU has reached new heights in individual and team success.

Now entering her 40th season as the mastermind of the LSU gymnastics program, Breaux exudes the same passion and enthusiasm to coach the Fighting Tigers as she did in her first season on the job.

Breaux led the 2016 team to the best season in school history as LSU finished second in the nation. During the season, Breaux reached the exclusive 700 career win milestone as the team compiled a 31-6 overall record, the first time in school history LSU had reached the 30-win mark.

The Tigers score a 197.300 to win the NCAA Athens Regional for the fourth-consecutive regional title and 15th title in program history. Individually, six gymnasts earned 17 All-America honors and Ashleigh Gnat became the fifth gymnast to earn the SEC Floor

In 2015, Breaux guided LSU to a 13-1 overall regular season record, which included a perfect 7-0 record against SEC competition for the first time in school history.

The list of achievements in 2014 includes a program-record third-place national finish in the NCAA Super Six Finals, another individual national title by Rheagan Courville on vault, the 13th regional title in school history, the highest score in program history on three different occasions, 20 total All-America honors including a nation-leading five First-Team All-Americans, and a school-record 13 consecutive meets with at least a 197 score.

In 2013, LSU recorded the 12th regional team title in school history, and the Tigers reached the NCAA Super Six for the third time in 2013,

recording a fifth-place finish. Three gymnasts won five individual SEC titles in Courville (VT, BB, AA), Lloimincia Hall (FX) and Jessica Savona (FX).

In 2010 LSU reached the NCAA Championships for the ninth straight year while senior Susan Jackson became the first LSU gymnast to capture the NCAA All-Around national title, and she also won the 2010 balance beam title to become LSU's first three-time NCAA champion.

In 2008 LSU joined elite company by advancing to the NCAA Super Six Finals as Breaux and the Tigers broke through into the six-team field for the first time in program history to compete for college gymnastics' national championship. The Tigers placed fifth.

As the "Dean of Coaches" at LSU, Breaux has represented the University at the highest level both in the gym and, most importantly, in the classroom for more than 35 years. Her dedication to the student-athlete on an individual basis has transcended into academic success, community involvement. Coach of the Year honors, an SEC Championship, NCAA Regional Championships and Top-10 national rankings throughout her tenure. In fact, there is a tremendous balance between academics and athletics as LSU has produced 184 All-Americans and 141 Scholastic All-Americans during Breaux's tenure.

During her tenure Breaux has established and maintained LSU's reputation as one of the premier collegiate gymnastics programs in the country. Under her tutelage, the Tigers have placed among the nation's top-10 teams 27 times in 39 seasons, finishing a program-best second in 2016, third in 2014, fourth in 1988, fifth in 2008 and 2013 and sixth on four separate occasions.

LSU has also placed among the top three in regional competition on 31 separate occasions, winning regional titles 15 times in four different decades, including back-to-back first-place regional finishes in 2008 and 2009 and four straight in 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016.

Under her leadership, LSU has captured 10 individual national titles, 184 All-America honors and 70 All-SEC selections.

Jay Clark

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH • 5TH SEASON

Jay Clark enters his fifth season as associate head coach at LSU in 2017, and his impact has been felt far and wide in his first four seasons with the Tigers.

With the help of Clark's leadership and expertise in collegiate gymnastics, LSU has earned the best performance in school history as the NCAA Runner-Up in 2016, appearances in the NCAA Super Six in 2013, 2014, and 2016, produced two NCAA individual national titles, captured four NCAA regional team titles and tallied numerous school records.

His work with the Fighting Tigers of LSU has not gone unnoticed. In fact, Clark was named the Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year, sharing the honor with fellow LSU assistant Bob Moore, in his first three seasons with the team.

Clark also earned the 2014 National Co-Assistant Coach of the Year award, along with Moore, and it marked the second time in his distinguished coaching career he has garnered the nation's top award.

Clark carries a wealth of championship experience and recruiting prowess in collegiate gymnastics, and he has shown the ability to help programs reach the highest level throughout his coaching career.

Highly regarded as one of the nation's best recruiters, Clark serves as recruiting coordinator at LSU, and he assists in coaching every event for the Tigers with an emphasis on uneven bars.

In his four seasons at LSU, Clark has coached the Tigers to 14 All-America honors on bars, four Top-10 bars team scores in school history and the top two bars title winners in LSU history. Sarie Morrison captured a school-record 28 bars titles, and Rheagan Courville won 19 bars title to rank first and second in school history. Both put up record numbers under Clark's guidance.

For the third-consecutive season, LSU earned a Top-5 national ranking on bars in 2016 with an average score of 49.252. Sarah Finnegan, Myia Hambrick and Lexie Priessman combined to tally four All-America honors during the historic season. Hambrick also earned All-SEC honors on bars after finishing second with a 9.925.

The Tigers posted a Top 5 national ranking on bars in 2015, and the team totaled the second-highest bars total in school history with a 49.600 against Iowa. The Tigers also accumulated the second-best season average on bars in school history with a 49.288 average.

As a team LSU produced four All-America honors on bars in 2015 with three gymnasts (Rheagan Courville, Randii Wyrick and Shae Zamardi) earning First-Team All-America honors at the NCAA Championships. It marked the first time in program history that three gymnasts secured First-Team All-America honors on bars in one season.

The 2014 season was arguably the finest in LSU history as the Tigers earned the then best finish in program history by taking third place in the NCAA Super Six, and Clark played a prominent role in the Tigers' success throughout the year.

Under Clark's direction, LSU shattered the school record with a 49.330 average on bars and

finished the 2014 season ranked No. 5 nationally in the event. In addition, the Tigers tallied three of the top-10 bars scores in school history, including a 49.600 that ranks as the second best, and LSU produced three All-America honors on bars.

Clark coached Courville to a First-Team All-America honor at the 2014 NCAA Championships, and Courville went on to finish fifth in the event at the NCAA Individual Finals.

LSU reached the Super Six in the 2013 season, and under Clark's guidance the Tigers finished the season with a 49.260 regional qualifying score on bars, the highest final RQS in that event since the 2009 season.

Clark coached Morrison and Wyrick to First-Team All-America honors on bars in his first season with the Tigers, and it marked the first season LSU produced at least two All-Americans on bars since 2010.

Because of his recruiting success, ESPNU and ESPN the Magazine selected Clark as the ninth-best recruiter in all of collegiate athletics in 2011.

Before Clark joined LSU he spent 20 seasons at the University of Georgia where he helped guide the Gym Dogs to seven NCAA National Titles and 14 Southeastern Conference Championships.

Clark primarily coached bars at Georgia, and he coached the Gym Dogs to 64 All-America honors and seven NCAA individual national titles on bars, including two-time champions Courtney Kupets and Kat Ding.

From 2009-12, Clark served as the head coach at Georgia, and during that time the Gym Dogs captured three NCAA individual national championships, won the 2012 NCAA Auburn Regional, and produced 23 All-America honors. In 2012, his Georgia team won the Bulldog Cup, which recognizes the UGA team that excels academically, supports their peers in athletics and consistently serves the community.

Prior to his stint as head coach, Clark was the recruiting coordinator at Georgia from 1999-2009 while serving as assistant coach from 1999-2004 and associate head coach from 2005-09 when Georgia won an NCAA record five-straight national titles.

In 2006, he earned National Assistant Coach of the Year and Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors after Georgia won a second-straight national title, and in 2001 Clark was named USA Gymnastics State of Georgia Coach of the Year.

Clark also coached at the club level for 13 years from 1992-2005 as the founder, owner and head coach of Classic City Gymnastics in Athens, Ga. He coached several Classic City gymnasts to state, regional, national championships and to the Junior Olympic National Team, and eight gymnasts went on to compete collegiately at the NCAA Division I level.

Clark is married to the former Julie Ballard, an All-American Georgia gymnast from 1994-98 and a native of Mandeville, Louisiana. The couple has two children – a son, Cole, 14, and a daughter, Kinsey, 11.

ASSISTANT COACH • 18TH SEASON

For 17 seasons at LSU, Bob Moore has consistently proven that he is one of the nation's best vault coaches.

During his outstanding career with the Tigers, Moore has been recognized several times for his exceptional work. Besides earning National Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 2014, he has been named Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year on six occasions – 2005, 2007, 2009, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

A longtime Southeastern Conference assistant, Moore begins his 18th season with the LSU gymnastics program in 2017, and his presence has been undeniable. He has helped the Tigers maintain their status as one of the nation's premier programs that includes 10 NCAA Championships appearances in the last 11 years, five Super Sixes in the last nine seasons and nine individual national titles since 2002.

Heading into the final rotation of the NCAA Super Six in 2016, LSU needed a record performance on vault to complete the Tigers' comeback to finish in second place. Led by Moore, the Tigers put on a vaulting clinic with a score of 49.5250 for LSU's best ever performance on the event at NCAA Championships. After all was said and done, Moore led the Tigers to an average 49.495 for the best regional qualifying score in the country.

Moore coached Ashleigh Gnat to First Team All-America honors on vault during her junior campaign. Gnat became the eighth gymnast in LSU history to record a perfect 10.0 score on vault as she did it twice, amazingly the Lake Mary, Florida, native also became the first to do it by competing a double-twisting Yurchenko.

Moore guided LSU to elite status on vault as the Tigers ranked second nationally in the event at the end of the 2015 season. LSU shattered the school record for highest vault score with a 49.825 against Minnesota, and that event score ranked as the highest total of any team on any event in the 2015 season. Once again, Moore shared Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors with fellow LSU assistant Jay Clark.

In 2014, his coaching peers across the nation recognized his efforts by voting him not only the Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year but also the National Co-Assistant Coach of the Year along with Clark.

The 2014 season was arguably the finest in LSU history, and Moore was a major reason why. He coached Rheagan Courville to a second-straight NCAA national title on vault, led the Tigers to the No. 1 national ranking on vault for the second-consecutive season, set the school record with an astonishing 49.483 season average on vault, and coached four gymnasts to All-America honors in the event.

In addition, Moore guided the Tigers to five of the Top-10 vault scores in LSU history in 2014, including a then program-record 49.650 total in the NCAA Regional. LSU ranked No. 1 nationally as a team on vault for half the 2013 season, including the final rankings, and Moore coached Courville to the SEC vault title and NCAA national title.

Moore earned NCAA Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 2013,

sharing the award with Clark, and Moore guided the Tigers to one of the best seasons on vault in school history.

Not only did Moore coach Courville to the vault national title, but he guided Courville and Sarie Morrison to perfect 10.0 scores in 2013.

Moore coached Susan Jackson to the 2008 NCAA vault national title, and he followed that up by coaching Ashleigh Clare-Kearney to the 2009 NCAA vault title while Jackson was the runner up – giving LSU back-to-back national titles in the event. On top of that, Moore guided three Tigers to First-Team All-America status on vault in 2009 – Clare-Kearney, Jackson and Staci Schwitkis.

In 2010, Moore guided Jackson to a second-place finish on vault again, and he coached former walk-on Ashley Lee to a ninth-place finish – giving LSU back-to-back years with two gymnasts in the national Top 10.

With more than 30 years of outstanding coaching across the southeast, Moore received one of the highest honors in his profession by being inducted into the USA Gymnastics Region 8 Hall of Fame in 2011.

Moore's primary responsibility with the Tigers is vaulting where the team has flourished under his watch as the team has finished in the top 10 of the national rankings in the event 12 of his 17 years at LSU, including four-straight seasons from 2007-10, as well as the No. 1 national ranking in 2013, 2014 and 2016

In his 17 previous seasons at LSU, Moore has coached his athletes to 30 All-America honors on vault, four national titles, and two national runner-up finishes. In fact, LSU's one-two finish on vault in 2009 marked only the fourth time in NCAA history that two gymnasts from the same team finished first and second in the vault national finals.

As well as strengthening the Tigers on the vault, Moore plays a significant role with LSU's Bengal Gymnastics program, a highly successful youth age group program that practices in the Tigers' gymnastics training facility.

Moore is also LSU's academic coordinator as he works closely with the gymnastics academic advisor to ensure each gymnast is on the right track each season. In Moore's 16 years with the team, LSU has produced 89 Scholastic All-Americans and 151 SEC Academic Honor Roll members.

Moore's expertise was fine tuned at two other SEC programs. Before joining the Tigers, Moore spent six years at the University of Florida where he served as the program's top assistant. To his credit, Moore coached two national champions on the vault, in addition to numerous All-Americans and SEC champions. Prior to his stint in Gainesville, Moore coached for five seasons as an assistant at Auburn.

A native of Birmingham, Alabama, Moore graduated from Samford University in 1976 with a degree in general studies with an emphasis in music. Bob is married to the former Sandra Ballard, and "Pops" and "Momme" are the proud grandparents of Brayden, Isabella, Sophia, Trey, Brooklyn, Lyla and Maggie.

Jeanie Beadle**1977 AIAW Balance Beam National Champion**

A pioneer in LSU gymnastics history, Jeanie Beadle won the Tigers' first individual national championship, claiming the AIAW beam title in 1977. She competed for LSU from 1976-80 and earned All-America status in 1977 and 1978. Her national title marked the first individual title for any female student-athlete in LSU history, and her All-America honors were also a first for a female student-athlete at LSU. As the leader of the team during her career, Beadle guided the Tigers to three straight first-place finishes at the AIAW Regionals. For all her accomplishments and firsts at LSU, the Baton Rouge native was inducted into the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999.

Nicki Arnstad**2002 NCAA Floor Exercise National Champion**

Nicki Arnstad capped an exceptional four-year career by winning the NCAA floor title at the 2002 national championships in Tuscaloosa, Ala. In the final performance of her career, Arnstad tallied a 9.950 to claim LSU's first NCAA individual national title. She earned a total of four All-America honors during her career as she was recognized twice on the floor and twice in the all-around. Also a two-time First Team All-SEC performer, she still shares the school record on the floor exercise (10.00), posting the perfect score twice during her senior season including at the NCAA Central Regional to lead LSU to the NCAA Championships.

April Burkholder**2006 NCAA Balance Beam National Champion**

One of the most decorated gymnasts in LSU history, April Burkholder ended a stellar four-year career by winning the national beam title at the 2006 NCAA Championships. In her final meet as a Tiger, Burkholder posted a 9.9125 on the beam in Corvallis, Ore., to become LSU's second beam national champion. She recorded a school record 14 All-America honors during her career and was named to the All-SEC team four times. Burkholder was also selected as both the NCAA Central Region and SEC Gymnast of the Year twice (2004 and 2005) and was named the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2003. She is also second in school history with eight perfect 10.00's and the only Tiger with at least one on three different events - scoring four on floor, two on vault and two on beam.

Ashleigh Clare-Kearney**2009 NCAA Vault National Champion****2009 NCAA Floor Exercise National Champion**

Ashleigh Clare-Kearney finished her outstanding career April 18, 2009, by becoming LSU's first two-time national champion as she captured the vault national title with a 9.900 average and the floor national title with a 9.950 score in Lincoln, Neb. The five-time First Team All-American capped her senior season by earning NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year recognition, and she recorded her third straight First Team All-SEC honor after repeating as SEC Floor Exercise Champion. She was also the SEC Gymnast of the Year as a junior as she became LSU's second SEC All-Around champion in 2008. Clare-Kearney ended her career as LSU's all-time leader in individual titles as she finished with 114, and she was instrumental in leading the Tigers to back-to-back NCAA Super Six appearances in 2008 and 2009.

Susan Jackson**2008 NCAA Vault National Champion****2010 NCAA All-Around National Champion****2010 NCAA Balance Beam National Champion**

Susan Jackson became LSU's first gymnast to win a national title before her senior season as she earned the vault national title with a 9.8563 average as a sophomore at the 2008 NCAA Championships in Athens, Ga. After finishing as national runner up on vault in 2009 behind Ashleigh Clare-Kearney, Jackson went out on top as a senior in 2010 by capturing two more national titles to become LSU's first three-time champion. She tallied a 39.625 all-around score at the NCAA Championships in Gainesville, Fla., to earn LSU's first All-Around national title, and two days later she punctuated her career with a near-flawless performance to earn the beam national title with a 9.9625 score. Displaying consistency all season as a senior, Jackson was named the SEC Gymnast of the Year and NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year, and she became the first LSU gymnast to receive the prestigious AAI Award and Gymnastics Honda Sports Award that both go to the nation's top gymnast. Jackson further cemented her legacy by winning 11 all-around titles in 2010, breaking a 30-year-old school record for the most in a single season.

Rheagan Courville**2013 NCAA Vault National Champion****2014 NCAA Vault National Champion**

Rheagan Courville capped one of the best seasons in LSU history by winning the vault national title on April 21, 2013 inside Pauley Pavilion in Los Angeles, Calif. Courville performed a fantastic vault to score a 9.9250 and take home the title. Her sophomore campaign in 2013 will go down as one of the finest in LSU gymnastics. She won SEC Gymnast of the Year and became the first Tiger gymnast to win three titles at one SEC Championship as she captured the vault, beam and all-around titles. Courville was also named the NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year after she led the nation with nine all-around victories in 2013. She became the first LSU gymnast in history to repeat as national champion in an event as she captured the 2014 NCAA vault national title. Courville earned the highest score on vault ever in the NCAA Individual Event Finals competition with a 9.9750 to win the national title on April 20, 2014 inside BJCC Arena in Birmingham, Ala. The national title capped another fantastic season for the Baton Rouge native. In 2014, Courville earned Central Region Gymnast of the Year honors for the second straight year, finished No. 2 nationally in the all-around rankings, tallied eight All-America honors including multiple first-team honors on vault and the all-around, and she became only the fourth gymnast in school history to record two or more perfect 10 scores on vault in her career.
