# CHAMPIONSHIP LEGACY

### 1 WCWS MOST OUTSTANDING PLAYER

Kristin Schmidt earned Women's College World Series Most Outstanding Player honors at the 2004 WCWS, making her the only player to not win the national championship and earn the honor.

### 2 WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES APPEARANCES

LSU is one of five schools in SEC history with multiple Women's College World Series appearances. The Tigers along with Florida, Georgia and Tennessee have tallied a winning record in WCWS play.

### 3 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

The Tigers have had three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans in the 13-year history of the program, while only one program in the SEC has had more than four.

### 5 SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

LSU claimed an unprecedented four consecutive league championships from 1999-2002. Only two other schools in SEC history have claimed multiple regular season titles.

### 5 SEC TOURNAMENT TITLES

LSU has won an unrivaled five SEC Tournament titles and advanced to the championship game in eight of the past 11 seasons.

### 6 SEC TOURNAMENT MVP'S

Six of the 14 SEC Tournament Most Valuable Player honors have been won by the Tigers, including an unparalleled five straight from 1999-2004.

### 8 SEC WESTERN DIVISION TITLES

LSU has won more Division titles than any school in the SEC. Only the Tigers and Alabama have claimed the division crown.

### 9 50-WIN SEASONS

LSU is one of only two programs in the nation, along with Arizona, to have posted nine 50-win seasons over the past 14 years.

### 10 NFCA ALL-TIME RANKING

LSU ranks No. 10 in the NFCA All-time poll, the second highest ranking of any team in the SEC. In addition, the Tigers are tied for the youngest program ranked in the top 10.

### 12 NCAA REGIONAL APPEARANCES

LSU has racked up 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, including seven-straight from 1998-2004. The Tigers are tied for the most NCAA trips among SEC schools since 1997.

### 12 ALL-AMERICANS

The Tigers have 12 NFCA All-Americans in the 13-year history of the program, second most of any school in the SEC.

### 48 WINS PER SEASON

LSU is averaging 48 wins a season over the past 14 years, the seventh best average in the nation.

### 114 WEEKS RANKED IN THE ESPN/USA SOFTBALL POLL

The Tigers have been in the ESPN/USA Softball poll for 114 of the 123 weeks since the poll's inception during the 2003 season, while spending 44 weeks ranked inside the Top 10.

### 179 WEEKS RANKED IN THE NFCA/USA TODAY POLL

LSU has been ranked in the NFCA/USA Today Coaches poll for 179 of the 200 weeks since the Tigers began play in 1997, including a span of 103 consecutive weeks between Feb. 20, 1998, and March 30, 2005. The Tigers also have been among the nation's Top 10 for 93 of those weeks.

### .775 WINNING PERCENTAGE

LSU has compiled the ninth-best winning percentage in the nation over the last 14 seasons.

### .741 WINNING PERCENTAGE IN SEC GAMES

LSU has posted the second-best winning percentage of any school in conference action.

### .720 WINNING PERCENTAGE IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT

LSU has the best winning percentage in SEC Tournament history by 111 percentage points.

### .600 WINNING PERCENTAGE IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Tigers have the ninth-best winning percentage in NCAA Tournament play.

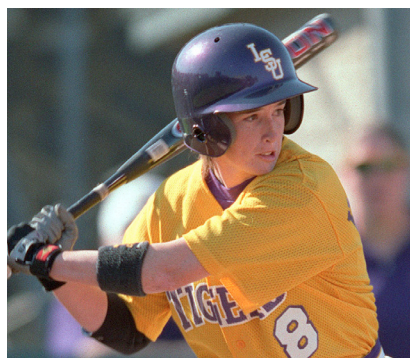

## MEDIA TRAINING

Dr. Tommy Karam and Dr. Shirley White are two experts in the field who give training sessions to student-athletes here on campus. The Academic Center features a mock press conference

setting to get student-athletes acclimated to giving interviews in front of both print and electronic media. Karam and White record the mock interviews on camera and then provide feedback, allowing student-athletes to become more comfortable and confident when doing actual interviews.

In 2009-10, ESPN and the Southeastern Conference reached a milestone 15-year agreement. ESPN acquired rights to every SEC home football game -- excluding those on the CBS network broadcast package -- and serves as the exclusive national cable home and the syndication rightsholder for the conference. LSU made seven appearances on ESPN family of networks in 2010 as part of that package.

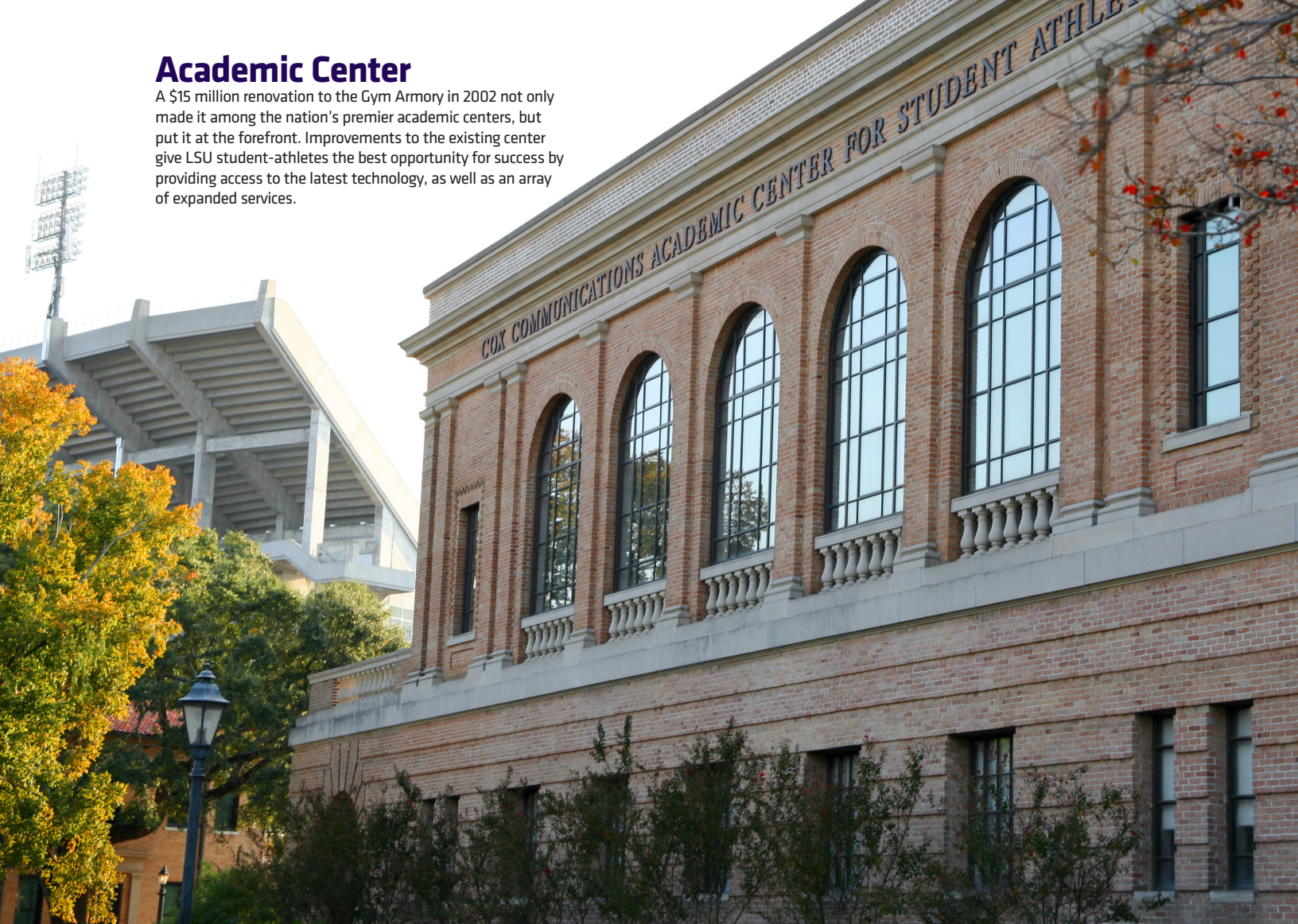

Senior Associate Athletic Trainer Shelly Mullenix coordinates with LSU dining services to provide a balanced training table diet. LSU trainers also meet one-on-one with student-athletes to give them expert nutritional information.

# ATHLETIC TRAINING



LSU boasts the largest and most complete athletic training facilities in all of collegiate athletics with both the Operations Center and the Broussard Center for Athletic Training in Tiger Stadium. Both are furnished with the latest in technology and equipment. The Operations Center training room features a full view of the practice fields, two hot/cold

jacuzzis and an underwater treadmill. The Broussard Center includes an on-site x-ray room, an in-house pharmacy, as well as the largest hydrotherapy pool in both collegiate and professional sports and is one of the few collegiate training centers with a full-service pharmacy and a full-service vision center.



## Hydrotherapy Treatment

An integral part of rehabbing and developing LSU student-athletes is the operations center's hot/cold jacuzzis and an underwater treadmill in a fully equipped Hydrotherapy room. The Broussard training center boasts the largest hydrotherapy pool in both collegiate and professional sports.

## Broussard Athletic Training Center



The two story, 22,000 square foot facility contains 20 treatment tables with the newest forms of modalities available, 14 taping stations, a 1,600 square foot rehabilitation area which contains the latest rehabilitation equipment including the Cybex Norm, Woodway treadmills and Body Master select rise equipment. LSU's multi-million dollar athletic training facility is named in honor of Dr. Martin J. Broussard (left), the legendary trainer whose career spanned over 40 years at LSU.

- LSU is one of only a handful of universities in the nation having land-grant, sea-grant and space-grant status.

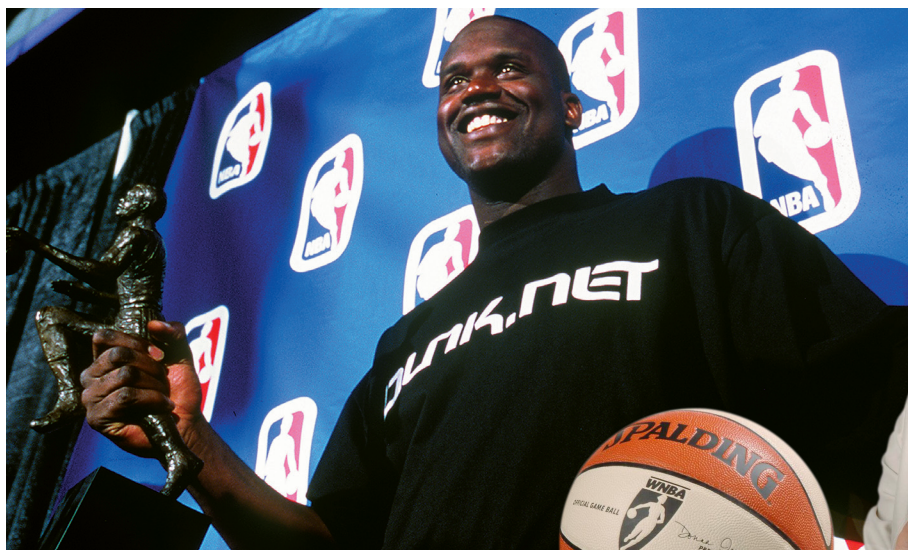

### Shaquille O'Neal

A four-time NBA champion and 15-time All-Star, Shaquille O'Neal is one of the most dominant centers in league history. O'Neal, one of the most quotable athletes on the planet, joined the long list of prominent LSU alumni when he earned his degree in general studies in December 2000. O'Neal was traded to the Cleveland Cavs in June 2009.

### Seimone Augustus

Seimone Augustus received her degree in 2005 after just three years at LSU and while earning NCAA Women's Basketball National Player of the Year honors twice. She was the first pick of the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Minnesota Lynx and teamed with fellow LSU alum Sylvia Fowles to claim an Olympic gold medal for the United States in 2008.

### Eduardo Aguirre, Jr.

Named the first Director of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) for the Department of Homeland Security in 2003, Aguirre, Jr., was the U.S. Ambassador to Spain from 2005 until 2009.



### James Carville

Carville received both a bachelor's degree and law degree from LSU and gained fame in the 1990s as the chief campaign strategist for Bill Clinton and Al Gore. Carville also penned a best-selling memoir titled "All's Fair: Love, War and Running for President".



### Lod Cook

Cook graduated from LSU with a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 1955 and then earned his Master's degree in petro engineering in 1955. Cook served as CEO of ARCO for nine years.



### Carlos Roberto Flores

The president of Honduras from 1997-2001, Flores helped the nation recover after Hurricane Mitch devastated the country in 1998. Flores is married to the former Mary Carol Flake, also an alumnus of LSU.



### Jim Flores

Flores graduated with two bachelor's of science degrees; one in corporate finance in 1981 and the second in petroleum land management in 1982. Flores is currently Chairman, President and CEO of Plains Exploration & Production Company.



### Sylvia Fowles

Sylvia Fowles was a two-time State Farm All-American at LSU before going onto a career in the WNBA with the Chicago Sky. Fowles and Seimone Augustus became the first LSU basketball players to claim Olympic gold when they did so in 2008 for the United States.



## Mike Papajohn

The starting centerfielder on LSU's inaugural College World Series team in 1986, Mike Papajohn today is a prominent actor in Hollywood. Papajohn was the only actor to star in four \$150 million movies in the same calendar year doing so in 2009. The LSU alumnus has appeared in blockbuster films: Spiderman, Terminator Salvation, Transformers: Revenge of the Fallen and For the Love of the Game.

# LSU GREATS

The following nine individuals are the only athletes to have their jerseys retired by LSU. Men's basketball has retired the No. 23 for Pete Maravich, No. 50 for Bob Pettit, Jr., No. 33 for Shaquille O'Neal and No. 40 for Rudy Macklin. Women's basketball retired the No. 33 for Seimone Augustus. Football's only two retired jerseys are the No. 20 worn by Billy Cannon and the No. 37 worn by Tommy Casanova. Baseball retired the No. 15 in honor of longtime coach and former athletics director Skip Bertman and the No. 20 for Ben McDonald. Casanova, Macklin and McDonald joined the prestigious list in May 2009. Augustus became the first woman in LSU Athletics history to have her jersey retired in January 2010.

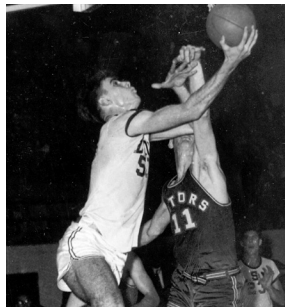

## 50 Bob Pettit

Pettit led LSU to its first NCAA Final Four in 1953 and he later became the first player in NBA history to exceed the 20,000-plus point barrier. Pettit is a member of the NBA Hall of Fame, and in 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



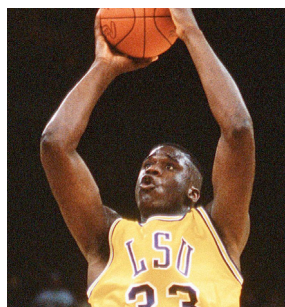
## 23 Pete Maravich

"Pistol Pete," Maravich still holds the NCAA record for career points with 3,667 and for career scoring average with 44.2 points a game. He was selected the National Player of the Year in 1970 after leading the Tigers to the NIT Final Four. He scored 50-plus points an amazing 28 times. He went on to a 10-year professional career and was selected as one of the NBA's 50 greatest players in 1997.



## 20 Billy Cannon

One of the true legends of college football in the South, Cannon was the 1959 Heisman Trophy winner and helped the Tigers to the 1958 national title. Cannon's most memorable performance came in 1959 against Ole Miss when No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss 3-0 in the fourth quarter. He fielded a punt, broke seven tackles and returned it 89 yards for the 7-3 victory. He went on to a successful 11-year professional career.



## 33 Shaquille O'Neal

O'Neal was the first pick in the 1992 NBA Draft. He was named MVP of the league in 2000 and was a three-time NBA Finals MVP after leading the Los Angeles Lakers to three World Championships. At LSU, O'Neal averaged 21.6 points and 13.6 rebounds for his career, and in 1991, he was named the World's Amateur Athlete of the Year as well as SEC Athlete of the Year and National Player of the Year. In 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



## 15 Skip Bertman

A legend in the college baseball ranks, Bertman created a dynasty at LSU, guiding the Tigers to five national titles in a 10-year stretch from 1991-2000. He also coached the United States to a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and was an assistant on the gold medal-winning U.S. squad in Seoul, Korea, in 1988. Bertman retired from coaching following the 2001 season and served as LSU's athletics director for seven years. Bertman was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006.

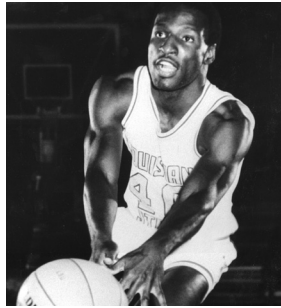


## About LSU Retired Jerseys

The retirement of the jerseys of Casanova, McDonald, Macklin and Augustus comes under a new provision of the LSU jersey retirement bylaws that says the retirement of an athlete's jersey in a particular sport does not preclude a current student-athlete in that sport from wearing the jersey number in that or any other sport, subject to the discretion of the head coach. This provision applies only to jerseys retired after January 1, 2007, so the numbers worn by Maravich, Pettit, O'Neal, Cannon and Bertman may never again be worn by future student-athletes in their respective sports. To have a jersey retired at LSU, an athlete must have completed intercollegiate competition for LSU a minimum of five years prior to nomination. Athletes must have demonstrated truly unusual and outstanding accomplishments, exceeding and in addition to all criteria used for Hall of Fame selection. Nominees must have a unanimous vote of support from the Hall of Fame committee.

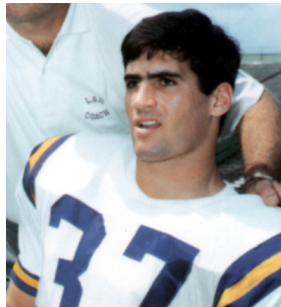
### Rudy Macklin 40

Rudy Macklin was a two-time basketball All-American selection during his Tiger career from 1976-81 during which time he became LSU's all-time leading rebounder with 1,276 boards and the second-leading scorer in school history behind only the legendary Pete Maravich with 2,080 points. He led the Tigers to two Elite Eight appearances and the 1981 Final Four in Philadelphia. He still holds the school single game rebound record with 32, a mark like some of the great records in any sport that may never be broken.



### Tommy Casanova 37

Tommy Casanova is the only three-time All-American in the history of LSU football and is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame. During his Tiger career from 1969-71, Casanova personified versatility for his myriad of talents as he played offense, defense, returned punts and kickoffs. One of just two three-time All-SEC performers at LSU, he played six seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals of the NFL while earning his medical degree.



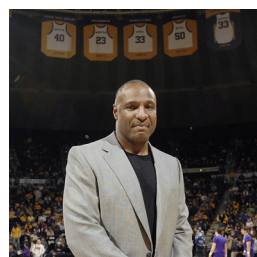
### Ben McDonald 19

Ben McDonald won the prestigious Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's most outstanding player, in 1989 and is a member of the College Baseball Hall of Fame. He led LSU to two College World Series appearances. In 1989, McDonald was named National Player of the Year by Baseball America, The Sporting News and Collegiate Baseball. He was selected by the Baltimore Orioles as the No. 1 pick in the major league draft in 1989 and went on to enjoy a 10-year major league career with the Orioles and the Milwaukee Brewers.



### Seimone Augustus 33

Seimone Augustus is the only women's basketball player in school history to earn State Farm Coaches Association All-America honors three times: 2004, 2005 and 2006. Augustus became LSU's first NCAA National Player of the Year and she claimed the honor twice in 2005 and 2006. A 2006 graduate of LSU, Augustus was the WNBA's No. 1 draft pick in 2006. She went on to lead the United States to a gold medal at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games.

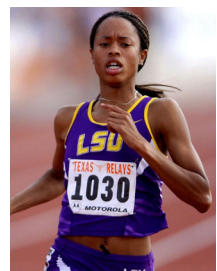

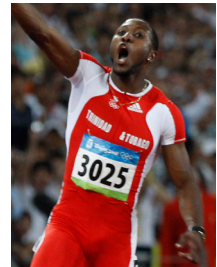

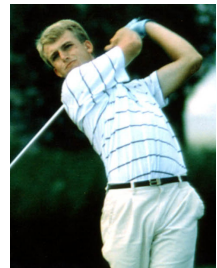

The 2011 LSU softball team is ready to build on its legacy and tradition of two Women's College World Series trips, five SEC championships and 12 NCAA Regional appearances. Head coach Yvette Girouard knows the Tigers have all the necessary ingredients in place with a solid nucleus of experience, depth and talented newcomers to return to the pinnacle of the softball world.

"The players have embraced four important mottos heading into the season," Girouard said. "Celebrate the little things, show up and show out, win the inning and strength in sisters. Each of those things encompasses what we'll need to accomplish every day if we want to be successful and reach our goals."

LSU also heads into its third season of softball on the berm at Tiger Park. The park has gone through many additions from when it first opened its gates in 2009.

"We've continued to upgrade the park with a state-of-the-art ticket and training facilities," Girouard said. "I'm most excited for the fans to see the graphics on the third base side that showcase our program's All-Americans. These women have been instrumental in building LSU's rich heritage. Our goal is to continue to make Tiger Park one of the coolest and prettiest ballparks in the country."

## THE BATTERY

As is the case for any collegiate softball program, LSU's pitching staff will have the biggest impact on the Tigers.

Reigning SEC Freshman of the Year and NFCA All-South Region First-Team pick Rachele Fico headlines a three-arm arsenal and is looking to build on a 20-7 season where she picked up 10 victories over RPI Top 50 opponents. She ranked among the SEC's elite in ERA (1.15), runs allowed (31), opponent batting average (.184) and strikeouts (161).

"Rachele lived up to the hype after coming to LSU as one of the most heralded pitchers since Britni Sneed and Kristen Schmidt," Girouard said. "Going into her sophomore year, she knows what it takes to be successful at this level and has worked extremely hard during the offseason to become more versatile in the circle. She always wants the ball and that competitive spirit will carry her far."

Brittany Mack, an All-Louisiana Honorable Mention selection, posted a 9-3 record and picked up 81 strikeouts over 80.0 innings of work in 2010. She compiled a 1.59 ERA to rank fourth, while her 27 total runs allowed were second-fewest in the SEC. She finished last season winning eight of her last nine decisions.

"Brittany has all the tools to be an All-SEC pitcher," Girouard said. "Unfortunately, her first two seasons have been cut short due to injury. I'm been impressed with how she's been able to release negative pitches and done a fantastic job of living in the present. She's not as hard on herself as she used to be, and the best is yet to come for her."

Meghan Patterson joins the Tigers after racking up 98 victories and 1,220 strikeouts en route to 2009 and 2010 Louisiana Gatorade Player of the Year awards at Mount Carmel Academy.

"Meghan has been very impressive during the fall," Girouard said. "Rachele and Brittany have done a great job of taking her under their wing and showing her the ropes. The key for any freshman pitcher is to be able to work ahead in the count ensuring that the power over the batter remains in the circle."

Calling the shots for LSU behind the plate will be Morgan Russell and Lauren Houston. The duo was instrumental and limited the opposition to 34 stolen bases last season, the program's lowest total since the 2006 campaign.

"Morgan and Lauren's biggest asset is they've done a wonderful job of getting to know the strengths of their pitchers," assistant coach Kristen Hobbs Cain said. "They're both valuable defensive catchers and have taken on more of a leadership role. I've been impressed with them as students of the game. They continue to push each other and their friendly competition will only make our catching position better because we will need them both at different points of the season."

## THE INFIELD

LSU's infield was key as the Tigers compiled a sparkling .976 fielding percentage in 2010 en route to a program single season mark. The fielding clip also was first in the SEC and eighth nationally.

Jessica Mouse, an All-SEC Defensive Team selection, returns to the hot corner. Her 302 career assists entering the season are fifth in program history. Offensively, Mouse chipped in a .278 batting average and 25 RBIs from the No. 9 spot to double her career RBI total.

"Jessica is everything a coach could ask for and continues to make strides at one of the most difficult defensive positions to play in our game," Cain said. "The extraordinary plays look routine because her fundamentals are so sound. Her leadership value on our infield is immeasurable because she makes everyone around her better."

Opposite Mouse on the diamond is Anissa Young at first base, who has made 114 consecutive starts during her first two seasons. Young became the seventh infielder in program history to notch NFCA All-South First-Team honors and was second on the team with eight home runs to go along with 39 RBIs.

"Anissa is the consummate example of what a prototypical first baseman should be," Cain said. "Vocally, she leads the charge and has a comforting presence on our infield unit. Her ability to go all out on every play allows her stop every ball and dig out any throw that comes her way."

Allison Falcon, Juliana Santos, Cassie Trosclair and Tammy Wray will all see time in the middle of the infield. When not in the field, the quartet could see time in the lineup at designated hitter.

Falcon was strong defensively as LSU won 30 of 33 games when she was the starting shortstop in 2010. She made 18 of those starts during the Tigers program-best 24-game winning streak.

After battling injuries in 2010, Santos looks to regain the form of her 2009 NFCA All-South Region First-Team season. She tallied hits in 12 of her last 20 appearances to cap the 2010 campaign.

"I'm extremely proud of the heart and commitment that Juliana showed battling back from her offseason ailments," Cain said. "She's been dynamite out there, and that's a great thing for our lineup. Allison is such a smooth defensive player especially with her glove. She's very scrappy, makes a lot of plays with her range and her bat is getting better every day."

Trosclair had to sit out last season due to SEC regulations after transferring from Auburn, while Wray comes to LSU as an ESPN RISE Top 25 recruit in addition to a 2010 NFCA All-America First-Team and New York Gatorade Player of the Year selection.

"Coming from Auburn, Cassie has valuable SEC experience and knows what it takes to be a successful player at this level," Cain said. "There's no doubt how excited we are to add a player like Tammy to our lineup. She's a difference maker and will make an immediate impact on our program."

"Heidi Pizer is workhorse with a strong arm who will balance the infield," Cain continued. "Her utility skills allow her to play any position and she also can be used in pinch hitting situations when needed."

## THE OUTFIELD

LSU's outfield will have to fill the void left by two-time All-American Kirsten Shortridge and the program's all-time home runs leader Rachel Mitchell. The Tigers have the ability to not miss a beat and will once again be characterized by speed, power and depth.

Ashley Langoni had a breakout season highlighted by 10 outfield assists and numerous ESPN type web gem diving catches from her left field post. Her explosive bat belted team-best nine homers and added 34 RBIs on a .288 batting average despite missing 10 games due to injury.

"Lang has the perfect outfield mentality, attacks every ball and isn't shy of sacrificing her body to make a play," associate head coach James DeFeo said. "Her comfort and confidence levels at the plate also have grown by leaps and bounds. We'll rely heavily in her in clutch situations, she's on the cusp of being one of the elite players in the SEC."

Ashley Applegate moves into right field after seeing a majority of time at designated player in 2010. She spent a majority of the season with over a .300 hitting clip in the No. 2 spot in the lineup and paces all returnees with 12 multi-hit efforts.

"Ashley has an extremely accurate and strong arm," DeFeo said. "I also was impressed but not surprised with how she was able to contribute at the top of the lineup. We look to her to have an amazing senior season, and I know she will battle back from her hand injury with flying colors."

Simone Heyward is the frontrunner to take over the reigns at centerfield. She earned a pair of All-Metro honors and set multiple program records while at Rosemont High School in California. Her defensive range and ability to steal bases give the LSU lineup its own dynamic.

"Simone is the real deal, and we're expecting big things from her as a freshman," DeFeo said. "Her foot speed and ability to take the extra base can take over games and is something you can't teach. Our fans are going to fall in love with the way she plays the game."

Both also were utilized as pinch runners last season. Shaw scored 26 runs as LSU won 21 of 25 games when Shaw crossed the plate. She also represented the game's tying or go-ahead run on 10 occasions.

Jacee Blades and Alex Boulet came from successful Louisiana high school programs where they were trained by former Tigers Ashlee Ducote and Lauren Delahoussaye, respectively. Blades was selected as the LSWA's 3A Most Outstanding Player and garnered NFCA All-America Second-Team status in 2010.

"All four of these players have been working hard and each has positions where they can contribute right away," DeFeo said. "Tiffany's role as a pinch runner is something you can't replace late in games and she has really progressed at the plate. Jacee and Alex are both sponges that continue to get better each day. It's key for our outfield to have interchangeable parts because that allows us to give teams different looks with our lineup."

#### THE SCHEDULE

The Tigers have had a long-standing reputation of facing a challenging slate and 2011 will be no different.

"We're very excited about our 2011 schedule, the home portion in particular," Girouard said. "Our scheduling philosophy has always been that you have to beat the best to become the best. We look forward to the difficult task ahead and there's no doubt that our schedule will test us for where we want to go this season."

For the first time since the 2008 season, LSU will spend opening weekend inside the friendly confines of Tiger Park. Bowling Green, Louisiana Tech and Purdue head to the Capitol City as part of the Wilson/DeMarini Tiger Classic [Feb. 11-13].

The Tigers hit the road for the first of back-to-back weekends at the Hilton Plaza Classic [Feb. 18-20] in

Houston, Texas. LSU faces tournament host Houston twice along with Nicholls State, Oklahoma State and Southern.

Up next is the prestigious Cathedral City Classic [Feb. 25-27] in Palm Springs, Calif., where the Tigers square off with Arizona and California in addition to tilts with Fordham and Cal Poly.

"Our weekend in Palm Springs rivals none other especially when you face three NCAA Tournament teams in a weekend," Girouard said. "We also recruit heavily in California and it will be a special for the four Californians on our roster."

The Tigers returns home to welcome Hofstra, Pittsburgh and Texas for the Tiger Purple & Gold Challenge [March 4-6] to wrap up the non-conference tournament schedule.

LSU also has midweek home-and-home series against McNeese State [Feb. 23 & April 13], Nicholls State [March 23 & April 6], Southeastern Louisiana [Feb. 16 & March 29] and Southern Miss [March 16 & April 27] on the docket.

A new wrinkle in the 2011 schedule is the SEC format. Like baseball, weekend series will have single games on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

LSU embarks on league action against three-time defending regular season champion Florida [March 9] before traveling to WCWS participant Georgia [March 11-13].

The Tigers also play host to NCAA Tournament heavy hitters Kentucky [March 18-20], Alabama [April 8-10] and Tennessee [April 15-17] before concluding the regular season against South Carolina [May 6-8].

LSU also has conference road trips to SEC West foes Arkansas [April 1-3], Auburn [April 20], Ole Miss [April 22-24] and Mississippi State [April 29-May 1].

"Every SEC series is a battle, each team gives one other their best shot week in and week out," Girouard said. "We're fired up about the new three-game weekend format. Having the likes of Florida, Alabama, Tennessee, Kentucky and South Carolina visit the Capitol City will provide entertaining Softball on the Berm for our fans."

## THE GIROUARD PHILOSOPHY

**I believe fully in trying to instill in our athletes a knowledge and a love for the qualities and virtues that comprise good character.**

Character is what we are inside. It is often revealed by how we act when no one is looking. Winning in our program should occur both on the field as well as in the classroom, in society and in personal lives after Tiger softball. When our players leave our program, hopefully we have developed successful people that will feel that their Tiger family will always have a unique and lasting place in their hearts.

**LSU is a very special place with everything provided for success; from athletic facilities to the very best academic center in the country and a first-class administration all at the disposal of our student athletes.**

In addition to having the friendliness of Louisiana people, LSU has one of the most beautiful campuses in the country. Our players will know from their first visit to the LSU campus that their number one goal is to leave this institution with their degree in hand.

**In setting our high standards for the athletes that represent this program, the number one characteristic I look for in student-athletes is discipline.**

We want disciplined people in our program. It all starts with someone who can control her choices in a respectable way, both on and off the field. The ability to choose right from a wrong should not be a battle. We expect to play for championships here at LSU and every student-athlete who competes for the Tiger softball team will have to have that same discipline and expectations. Our staff is dedicated to LSU, our program and our players.

**Concerning the softball side, we will incorporate the 'Tiger Attack' mind set for our games.**

I'd like to think that my teams are aggressive and hard-nosed, and that they will play the game hard until the final out. We must attack every inning as if the score were 0-0, always thinking 'it is never enough'. We will always be a fundamental team with high emphasis placed on this aspect of the game throughout the entire year. Playing the game with pride, emotion and respect for tradition and class should be a goal for every LSU team. This team will embody those qualities.





Pick whatever criteria you want to use and you'll get the same result: Yvette Girouard is synonymous with outstanding softball.

A pioneer of the game and one of the greatest coaches in history, the 2005 National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Hall of Fame inductees' effect on LSU has been powerful. Girouard's legacy continues to grow as the Tigers have maintained their place among the nation's elite and are one of only eight programs to post 48 wins per season since the 2001 season.

Girouard, who also was inducted into the Louisiana Softball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2002, heads into the 2011 season among the career NCAA Division I coaching leaders in wins (No. 3) and winning percentage (No. 5) in addition to being listed among the active NCAA Division I coaching leaders in wins (No. 2) and winning percentage (No. 5).

Are team accomplishments the criteria for an outstanding coach? With 29-consecutive winning seasons under her belt, Girouard's teams have won nine conference championships, racked up 10 national Top 10 finishes, earned 19 NCAA Regional appearances and are no strangers to Oklahoma City. She became just the third coach in NCAA history to steer two programs to the Women's College World Series when she led LSU during the 2001 and 2004 seasons after taking UL-Lafayette to a trio of WCWS appearances in the 1990's.

Girouard's first season at LSU ended in storybook fashion as the 2001 squad matched a school record with 59 victories en route to the program's first clean sweep of the SEC's three major league titles (SEC Western Division, SEC Regular Season Championship, SEC Tournament Championship).

Sparked by SEC Player of the Year, NCAA Regional MVP and three-time All-American Britni Sneed, LSU knocked out Girouard's former school, UL-Lafayette, in the championship game to punch its ticket to the WCWS. The Tigers fell to Stanford in the opening round but bounced back to knock off Iowa along with defending national champion Oklahoma before bowing out to UCLA.

Girouard reeled in her 100th win at LSU in just 119 games during the 2002 season, the fastest coach to reach 100 victories in school history. She reached 900 career wins and produced another 50-win season along with a Top 15 finish in 2003.

The 2004 Tigers took it to the next level and were ranked as high as

No. 2 in the ESPN/USA Softball poll on two separate occasions. LSU turned in its third SEC titles sweep in four seasons and rolled through NCAA Regional play defeating Illinois to return to the WCWS.

LSU came within seven outs of the national championship game. After defeating Michigan in extra innings in its first game, the Tigers fell to eventual national champion UCLA in game two.

Weather postponed play for a day and forced LSU into the unenviable situation of having to win three games in a single day to advance to the national championship game. The Tigers began the day with a win over Florida State before defeating California to force the "if necessary" game.

Unfortunately, LSU couldn't get past California a second time. The Tigers remarkable run marked the first time since 1984 a school from east of the Mississippi River had advanced to within a game of the national championship. Kristin Schmidt was named the WCWS Most Outstanding Player, becoming the first player to earn the honor who was not a member of the national championship team.

For their efforts, Girouard, associate head coach James DeFeo and assistant coach Lori Osterberg were named NFCA South Region Coaching Staff of the Year during both of LSU's WCWS seasons. She went onto to earn her 1,000th career victory against Arkansas on April 6, 2005.

Are All-America selections the criteria? Girouard has coached 22 different players to 42 All-America selections. Five players including Leslie Klein have been deemed three-time All-America picks. She also has guided her athletes to 16 Academic All-America honors, including two-time selection Stephanie Hill.



Perhaps it's giving back to the game by molding successful coaches for the next generation. Girouard has left her stamp as 11 former players/coaches associated with her over the years currently hold Division I jobs, including former All-Americans LaDonia Hughes and Trena Peel. The duo is currently playing professionally for the USSAA Pride and Philadelphia Force in the National Pro Fastpitch league.

Over her career, Girouard has been named coach of the year by three separate conferences: the SEC (2001 & 2002), the Sun Belt (2000) and the Southland (1984, 1985 & 1987). Her UL-Lafayette squads were independent from 1988-1999, but that didn't stop Girouard from taking home NFCA National Coach of the Year honors in 1990 and 1993. She also has collected an unprecedented 13 Louisiana Coach of the Year awards.

LSU's 2010 campaign continued to see program firsts under Girouard. The Tigers ran off a record 24-game winning streak, which marked the third longest run in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads. Rachel Mitchell also became LSU's all-time home run leader, Kirsten Shortridge notched her second consecutive NFCA All-American season and Rachele Fico earned the program's first SEC Freshman of the Year award.

The 2009 season saw LSU usher in the next chapter of its storied history with the opening of the new Tiger Park, the single largest monetary investment LSU has made exclusively to any women's sport. Girouard placed her own personal touch by giving the architects many of the ideas for the park's unique features, including the arches at the front of the stadium and the 1,000-seat outfield berm.







In September 2007, Girouard lost her most loyal fan as her beloved mother, Rose Mary (shown here at Girouard's 1000th win celebration), passed away. Mama G will be missed by softball fans everywhere.

At the 2009 NCAA Regionals, Girouard secured her 1,200th career victory with a 10-2 rout of Arizona State and became only the third coach in NCAA history to reach that historic feat.

After missing the postseason with a 31-23 mark in 2005, LSU rocketed back to the nation's upper echelon and returned to prominence in 2006. Girouard guided the Tigers back into the Top 10 nationally after firing out to an impressive 25-3 start. LSU swept through its NCAA Regional in Baton Rouge and advanced to the NCAA Super Regional for the first time.

The Tigers toppled Arizona, the nation's No. 1 team and eventual national champion, 3-2 in the second game of the Super Regional behind All-America hurler Emily Turner and a three RBI performance from Lauren Delahoussaye. LSU became the first program to knock off the Wildcats in a game at home that could send UA to the Women's College World Series and wrapped up 2006 with a 55-14 record.

The 2007 season ran true to form as Girouard kept the Tigers among the Top 10 nationally for the entire year and racked up a 55-12 record. Led by Turner and Dani Hofer, the nation's premier one-two pitching punch, LSU notched series wins from both No. 1 Tennessee and No. 2 Alabama to compile its fourth SEC Western Division crown and fourth SEC Tournament title during the Girouard era.

LSU ran through the NCAA Regional in Palo Alto unblemished aided by the bats of three-time All-America Leslie Klein, Regional MVP Rachel Mitchell and Diamond Sports National Catcher of the Year Killian Roessner to proceed to its second straight NCAA Super Regional. Dee Dee Henderson also earned Academic All-America honors to give LSU a third consecutive season with an Academic All-American.

Girouard's 2008 Tigers produced another successful campaign as LSU went 44-18 and hosted a NCAA Regional in its final season at the old Tiger Park. Mitchell continued her development into an All-SEC First-Team performer.

In her two decades as the UL-Lafayette head coach, Girouard built the team from the ground floor with no scholarships and a \$3,000 budget to one of the nation's perennial powers. The Cajuns totaled 10 NCAA Regional berths and tacked on three WCWS trips. With a .815 winning percentage, her teams posted the third-best winning percentage nationally in the 1990's behind only Arizona and UCLA.

The daughter of the late Rose Mary and Alton Girouard, Yvette was born in Broussard, La., and attended Comeaux High School. She earned a Bachelor of Science degree from USL in 1976 in health and physical education. During her college days, she played on the Lady Cajun volleyball team and was named the school's 1976 Female Athlete of the Year.

Following college, Girouard served as head coach at Lafayette High School where she began the softball program in 1977. She moved onto to coach at her alma mater, Comeaux High School, in 1980 before beginning the USL softball program the following season.

Girouard served a three-year term as the South Region Representative on the NCAA All-America Committee and served a pair of two-year stints on the NCAA South Regional ranking committee. She also served as a member of the nine-person NCAA Softball Rules Committee.

With a list of accomplishments and awards that speak for themselves, what is left for a woman who has won over 75 percent of her games on the collegiate level? College softball's ultimate prize: Girouard's mind and energy are squarely focused on bringing home LSU's first softball national championship.

## James DeFeo

### Associate Head Coach 11th Season

James DeFeo enters his seventh season as the associate head coach and his 11th season overall at LSU. It also marks his 12th season under head coach Yvette Girouard after serving a year with her at Louisiana-Lafayette.

DeFeo's main duties with the program include working with the hitters and outfielders as well as recruiting, scouting and practice management.

In 2004, he, Girouard and former assistant coach Lori Osterberg were named the National Fastpitch Coaches Association South Region Coaching Staff of the Year after leading LSU to its second Women's College World Series berth. The trio also won the same honor after the Tigers made their first WCWS appearance during the 2001 season.

Over the previous seven seasons, LSU's offense has not only been a mainstay at the top of the SEC rankings but in the upper echelon of the NCAA. The Tiger hitters as a unit have compiled an impressive 21 NCAA Top 30 team finishes in various offensive categories, including five Top 10 rankings. A remarkable 13 of those 21 feats over the six-year span have been in batting average, runs per game, home runs per game and slugging percentage.

Four Tiger outfielders over DeFeo's tenure have earned Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American accolades, including Kirsten Shortridge in both 2009 and 2010. Her .417 career batting average and .453 on-base percentage are tops in program history.

Leslie Klein, a three-time All-America pick, placed in the SEC's Top 10 in virtually every hitting category as LSU connected for 58 home runs by 10 different players in 2007. She finished her career as one of the most prolific hitters in both LSU and SEC history. The Florida native currently holds four LSU career records – doubles (64), RBIs (192), slugging percentage (.607) and total bases (467). Her 64 doubles and 192 RBIs also are inside the SEC's Top 5 marks.

LaDonia Hughes and Klein notched All-America selections in 2004 as the Tigers set four school records with 60 home runs, 336 RBIs, 385 runs and 875 total bases. Klein posted three NCAA Top 50 marks in slugging percentage (.662), runs per game (0.78) and RBIs per game (0.84).

LSU also ranked second in five additional categories highlighted by 583 hits on a .310 team batting average during the 2004 season. The Tigers also placed at least two players in the Top 10 individually in each of the SEC's hitting categories and five players in the league's Top 10 in total bases.

Trena Peel picked up All-America honors in 2002 as she led the nation knocking 14 triples en route to breaking the LSU and SEC single-season marks. She was two shy of the NCAA record.

Four additional Tiger outfielders, Lauren Castle, Camile Harris, Jazz Jackson and Rachel Mitchell, have tallied Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-South Region awards under DeFeo's tutelage. Mitchell also eclipsed LSU's career home run and walks mark during the 2010 season. Prior to joining Girouard's staff, DeFeo was a graduate assistant at Southern Miss in 1999 when the Golden Eagles became the first, first-year program to advance to the Women's College World Series.

DeFeo has served as sole proprietor and instructor of the All-American Softball Clinics in New Jersey, New York, Florida, Pennsylvania and Mississippi for 13 years. He has coaching experience at nearly every level of fastpitch softball, including Under-12, Under-16, 18 and Under and Women's Major.

A native of New Jersey, DeFeo graduated from Rutgers University in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in sport management. He received his master's in sports administration from Southern Miss in 1999. His sister, Stephanie DeFeo, was a three-time All-American under Girouard at UL-Lafayette and is currently an assistant coach at Ball State.

In 2000, DeFeo married the former Samantha Rock. The couple has two daughters, Victoria (8) and Zoe (6) and son, Zachary (4).







## Kristen Hobbs Cain

### Assistant Coach Second Season

Kristen Hobbs Cain moves into her second season as an assistant coach and her fourth overall season on the staff after spending the previous two seasons as a student and volunteer coach. She works with the Tiger infield and catchers along with assisting with the hitting and recruiting aspects of the program.

LSU's defense put together a sparkling .976 fielding percentage in 2010 en route to a program single season mark. The fielding clip also was first in the SEC and eighth nationally. The Tiger catchers also limited the opposition to 34 stolen bases, the program's lowest total since the 2006 season when Cain was a player.

Anissa Young notched NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2010. She ranked second on the team with eight home runs and 39 RBIs. Rachele Fico and Jessica Mouse also notched All-SEC Defensive Team accolades last season.

As a student-athlete, Cain was awarded the Brad Davis SEC Community Service Scholarship in 2008 for her work with the CHAMPS/Life Skills program and volunteering in the area. She also was a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and the SEC Good Works Team.

Cain's best season as a player came in 2007 during her senior campaign. She batted .283 and belted a career-best eight home runs en route to being selected Most Valuable Player of the Easton Tiger Classic and NCAA Tempe Super Regional All-Tournament Team. The Florida native also currently shares LSU's career fielding percentage record after having committed just five errors in over 600 changes for a .992 mark.

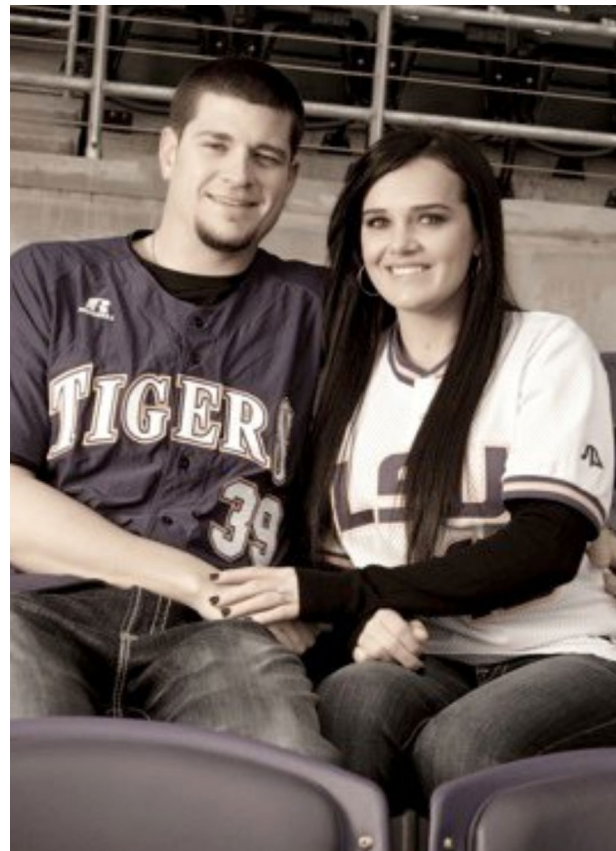
One of the three team captains, the 2007 squad spent the entire season in the nation's Top 10 and racked up an impressive 55-12 record. The Tigers notched series wins from both No. 1 Tennessee and No. 2 Alabama during the regular season to win its fourth SEC Western Division crown and fourth SEC Tournament title during the Yvette Girouard era.

Overcoming Tommy John surgery that limited her to just seven games and no starts in 2006, Cain closed out her career on a high note. She caught both of Dani Hofer's no-hitters against Missouri State and Southern Miss during the 2007 season. She also surpassed

her season-bests with 32 hits, 20 runs scored and 22 RBIs.

Cain appeared in 34 games and made 19 starts as a freshman on LSU's 2004 Women's College World series squad. The Tigers were ranked as high as No. 2 in the ESPN/USA Softball poll on two separate occasions and turned in a clean sweep of the SEC's three major league titles (SEC Western Division, SEC Regular Season Championship, SEC Tournament Championship).

Cain earned both of her degrees, a bachelor's degree in mass communications, followed by her master's degree in sports management from LSU. She is married to Nolan Cain, a four-year letterwinner on the LSU baseball team and member of the 2009 national championship team. The couple lives in Baton Rouge.





**Quinlan Duhon**  
**Director of Softball Operations**

Quinlan Duhon heads into second season as the Director of Operations for the LSU softball program after her exceptional four-year career from 2005-08. She also served as a student marketing assistant during the 2008-09 year.

Duhon will coordinate team travel along with assisting the program with recruiting functions. She also will supervise the academic progress and handle video motivation for the Tigers.

During her playing career, Duhon was a part of three NCAA Regional teams highlighted by the 2006 and 2007 Super Regional squads. She scored the walk-off, game-winning run in a 5-4 triumph over Louisiana-Lafayette in the 2006 NCAA Regional championship game.

LSU spent the duration of the 2007 season in the nation's Top 10 and compiled an impressive 55-12 record. The Tigers tallied series victories over both No. 1 Tennessee and No. 2 Alabama during the regular season to win its fourth SEC Western Division crown and fourth SEC Tournament title during the Girouard era.

Duhon had an outstanding postseason being named to both the NCAA Palo Alto Regional and Tempe Super Regional All-Tournament teams. She cranked three home runs in NCAA play, including a two-run shot as part of a 3-2 win against Cal State Northridge in the NCAA Regional opening round. As one of three captains for the 2008 team, Duhon posted career-bests in batting average (.333), hits (54), home runs (11), RBIs (38), on-base (.424) and slugging percentage (.605) en route to an All-SEC and All-Louisiana Second-Team honors.

Duhon finished her LSU career ranked third belting 30 career home runs and is listed among the school's Top 10 in walks (68), RBIs (128), total bases (300) and sacrifice flies (13). She is one of only 11 players in program history to score over 100 runs and post over 150 career hits. The Youngsville native also was a four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection.

Duhon earned her bachelor's degree in general business and currently is pursuing her master's degree in sports management. She lives in Baton Rouge.



**Matt Dunaway**  
**Associate SID/Softball Contact**

Matt Dunaway heads into his third year as an associate sports information director at LSU. He serves as the primary media relations contact for the Tiger softball and volleyball teams in addition to promoting LSU athletics community service efforts.

Dunaway publicized All-Americans Kirsten Shortridge and Brittnee Cooper while at LSU. He also filled in as an analyst during road softball games and was the play-by-play announcer for NCAA Tournament volleyball matches.

He was a student assistant in the sports information office where he shared media relations duties for the 2005 Golden Knight NCAA Regional Softball team that posted a 47-29-1 record. Stephanie Best was selected Atlantic Sun Player of the Year and NFCA All-Southeast Region honors.

As a student, Dunaway wrote for the Central Florida Future and KnightVision. He also held sports director duties for the student chapter of the UCF ISP Sports Network responsible for broadcasting Golden Knight volleyball, women's basketball, softball and baseball.

Dunaway lives in Baton Rouge.

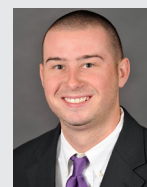

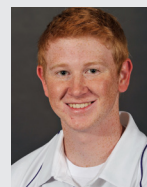

## It's Time: LSU Softball Stays Strong in 2010

### RECORD STREAK SPARKS 2010 CAMPAIGN

The LSU softball team continued to make history during the 2010 season as the Tigers pieced together a program-best 24-game winning streak.

LSU outscored its opponents by an impressive 158-18 margin and racked up a .328 team batting average to go along with a stifling 0.58 staff ERA during the streak.

The Tigers claimed three non-conference tournament titles where Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico [3x], Lauren Houston, Courtney Hollier [2x], Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge [2x] and Cody Trahan [2x] all garnered All-Tournament Team accolades.

The streak marked the third longest run in school history by any LSU team only behind the 1980-81 men's basketball and 1996 & 97 baseball squads.

### A BIG STAGE FOR LSU'S NEW HOME RUN QUEEN

A Thursday night in front of a packed Tiger park and the ESPN national stage were the ingredients that Rachel Mitchell needed to set a new home run mark at LSU.

The record-breaking two-run blast during the second inning was the signature moment in LSU's 5-1 win over No. 8 Georgia. The historic dinger landed on the left centerfield berm as Mitchell eclipsed three-time All-American Leslie Klein [2004-07], who had 32 long balls for her career.

"The thought didn't occur to me until I was rounding second base, and then as I was coming up to third base, I thought, 'I broke the record!' I'm very excited," Mitchell said. "Leslie Klein is always out at the field helping us out. She always tells me that she wants me to break the record and now I have it."

### A MEMORABLE RUN AT THE SEC TOURNAMENT

Following a three hour and 30 minute rain delay, LSU erased a 1-0 deficit to Kentucky in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals.

Allison Falcon started the rally with an inning-ending double play to get the Tigers out of a jam during the top half of the seventh. With two outs and facing a 0-1 count, Falcon laced a double down the right field line. Kirsten Shortridge followed with a line-drive laser over the centerfield wall for her first homer of the season to vault LSU to a dramatic 2-1 triumph.

"We played with a lot of heart," Shortridge said. "I just wanted to do anything I could to help the team. We know we have what it takes to get the job done. All we can do is control the things that we can."

The next day in the semifinals, LSU handed head coach Yvette

Girouard the best birthday gift of all. The Tigers ended a nine-game losing streak and notched a 9-1 victory over No. 5 Florida to return to the SEC Championship for the first time since 2007.

Cody Trahan hurled a complete game and kept the high-octane Gators out of rhythm. She was touched up for only one run on four hits. Offensively, every LSU player in the starting lineup reached base and the Tigers erupted for eight runs during the first four frames.

"The key was mixing pitches up and [catcher] Morgan [Russell] did a great job of getting into position to frame the pitches," Trahan said. "The offense did an excellent job, they took a lot of weight off my shoulders. All I had to do was hit my spots."

The Tigers were poised for more dramatics in the finals and fired back from a 4-0 hole against No. 4 Alabama. Ashley Applegate, Rachel Mitchell and Juliana Santos provided RBIs to fuel a four-run fifth inning. The Crimson Tide responded with a Jazlyn Lunceford homer to claim a 5-4 win.

### POSTSEASON SOFTBALL RETURNS TO TIGER PARK

LSU made its 12th NCAA Regional appearance in 2010, but it marked the first time that postseason softball was played inside the new Tiger Park.

The Tigers earned the No. 12 national seed as the four-time regional featured Texas A&M, Louisiana-Lafayette and McNeese State.

LSU opened the NCAA's with a 6-0 victory over the Cowgirls. Kirsten Shortridge and Ashley Langoni provided a pair of RBIs, while Jessica Mouse ripped off a 3-for-3 performance. In the circle, Rachele Fico and Shortridge teamed for the shutout.

Fans came out in droves for the 2010 NCAA Baton Rouge Regional as LSU's games with Louisiana-Lafayette and McNeese State ranked third and fourth in program history.

### BORN TO RUN

LSU racked up 125 stolen bases, the third-most in program history, after the Tigers totaled only 46 stolen bases in 2009. LSU's 2.05 stolen bases per game ranked 13th in the nation.

The 125 steals were the most during the Yvette Girouard era, while the .912 stolen base success rate shattered a program record.

Kirsten Shortridge was third in the SEC and equaled a program-record with 45 stolen bases. The Keller, Texas, native was joined by Ashley Applegate, Ashley Langoni, Rachel Mitchell and Tiffany Shaw with double digit steals.





### SHORTRIDGE ADDS TO HER LEGACY

Kirsten Shortridge (pictured above) added to her legacy and became the fifth player in program history to secure Louisville Slugger/NFCA First-Team All-America accolades. She joined Ashlee Ducote (1999 & 2001), Stephanie Hastings (2000), Britni Sneed (2001 & 2002) and Killian Roessner (2007) on the prestigious list of Tigers to accomplish this feat.

"Kirsten will be remembered as one of the finest players to wear a LSU uniform," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "I'm extremely proud of her and for our program as she represents the Tigers as a member of this elite group. She's one of the most exciting players I've had the opportunity to coach and made LSU softball worth the price of admission. Her record setting, thrilling performances will be sorely missed in the years to come."

Shortridge paced the Tigers with a .410 batting average and ranked among the SEC's Top 11 in four other categories, including hits (89), runs (50) and stolen bases (45). Her 89 hits on 29 multi-hit efforts were both second, while her .410 hitting clip was third for a single season in program history.

Shortridge amassed 45 stolen bases to equal Dee Douglas' single season mark from 1999. She swiped multiple bags 11 times and recorded a stolen base against every SEC team in 2010 highlighted by a steal of home plate versus No. 8 Georgia to spark a 5-3 comeback win during the middle game of the series.

The two-time All-SEC First-Team performer finished her career as LSU's all-time leader in batting average (.417) and on-base percentage (.453). Shortridge racked up 71 career stolen bases to tie for fifth place and notched 55 career multi-hit performances to share eighth place in program history.

### THE BEAST FROM THE EAST STARTS STRONG CAREER

Rachele Fico garnered numerous impressive accolades during her freshman season. She posted a 20-7 record with a SEC-leading 1.15 ERA and became the first freshmen to win the conference's ERA title.

Fico's strong freshman season included a program single-season record of five saves to go along with 10 wins against the RPI Top 50.

After winning three SEC weekly awards during the regular season, Fico picked up SEC Co-Freshman of the Year, All-SEC Second-Team and All-SEC Defensive Team accolades.

A NFCA All-South and All-Louisiana First-Team pick, Fico totaled four or more strikeouts in 20 of her 22 appearances over 3.0 innings of work, including a career-best 11 Ks against Texas A&M en route to NCAA Baton Rouge Regional All-Tournament accolades.

### MITCHELL FINISHES AS ONE OF THE BEST EVER

Rachel Mitchell connected for a .345 hitting clip and notched seven homers to go along with a team-best 45 RBIs. In the process, Mitchell became LSU's all-time home run and walks leader.

She also finished among LSU's Top 7 in career on-base percentage (.436), slugging percentage (.573), total bases (392), hits (229), RBIs (174), runs scored (172), multi hit games (61), doubles (52) and multi RBI games (47).

### TIGERS SCORE EARLY... AND SCORE OFTEN

LSU continued its strong tradition and put together a 34-6 record when scoring first in 2010. The Tigers have compiled an impressive 400-38-1 mark during the Yvette Girouard era when reaching this feat.

LSU doubled up its opponents with a 40-20 margin in first inning scoring and the Tigers won 19 of 22 games when denting the scoreboard during the opening frame.

LSU also won all 23 games when ripping off six or more runs last season. The Tigers have emerged victorious in 235 of 240 games when scoring six or more runs since 2001.

### LSU DOMINATES SEC SERIES

LSU has now competed in 136 series against conference foes and has tallied a league series record of 101-23-12. The Tigers have swept 40 three-game series since the SEC adopted the three-game format in 2001 and taken 26 more series wins in that time period.

Over the last four seasons, LSU 13-3 in mid-week doubleheader games since the SEC changed to a 28-game schedule.

Prior to 2001, the league played four-game series against divisional opponents and doubleheaders against cross divisional rivals. LSU swept nine four-game series and 15 doubleheaders while taking six series, 3-1.

### LSU AMONG NATION'S ELITE IN GIROUARD ERA

LSU has picked up 486 wins, the sixth most in the nation, since Yvette Girouard took the reigns of the program in 2001.

The Tigers have averaged close to 49 wins per season to rank ahead of past national champions Arizona State, California, Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Michigan, Oklahoma, Texas A&M, UCLA and Washington.

LSU is one of five SEC teams with multiple Women's College World Series appearances (Alabama, Florida, Georgia and Tennessee).

The Tigers advanced through the NCAA Regionals to the WCWS on two occasions (2001 & 2004) and finished seven outs from the national championship game in 2004.

## 2004 WCWS

For Yvette Girouard and the LSU softball program, the second run to the Women's College World Series was filled with as much joy, drama and excitement as the original.

Like in 2001, the Tigers accomplished the SEC triple crown and claimed the SEC Western Division, Regular Season and Tournament championships.

LSU also won a heart-stopping 13-inning affair and nearly pulled off an impossible feat at the WCWS.

After starting the 2004 campaign with a 5-3 record, the Tigers strung together a 17-game winning streak that stretched into the heart of SEC action.

LSU continued its climb up the polls sparked by a three-game sweep at No. 7 Alabama to end March. The Tigers rocketed up to a program-high and checked in at the No. 2 spot heading into postseason play.

A trio of wins over Alabama, Auburn and Georgia, all ranked among the Top 15 at the time, allowed the Tigers to win their third SEC Tournament in five years.

Unlike 2001, LSU's quest to Oklahoma City didn't start inside the friendly confines of Tiger Park. Instead, the Tigers were shipped to Waco, Texas for the NCAA Regionals.

After wins over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and Seton Hall, LSU found itself down 3-0 to regional host Baylor after two innings.

Camille Harris kickstarted a three-run third inning with a solo home run to left field. Three batters later, future All-American Leslie Klein belted a two-run triple down the right field line to even the score at 3-3.

The Tigers exploded for a quartet of runs in the 10th inning. Stephanie Hill and Lauren Delahoussaye provided RBIs coupled with a Baylor error and wild pitch.

The next day against Illinois, Julie Wiese jumpstarted LSU with a solo shot in the second inning followed by RBI hits from Delahoussaye in the third and fifth innings.

That would be more than enough run support for two-time All-American Kristin Schmidt. She was touched up for only an unearned run on three hits to go along with nine strikeouts as the Tigers raced past the Fighting Illini 4-1 to return to the WCWS.

Another Big 10 team, No. 6 Michigan, would bite the dust in LSU's opening game in Oklahoma City.

After 11 scoreless frames, the Wolverines took a 2-0 advantage to open the 12th inning. In the home half, the Tigers used an RBI-single by Leigh Ann Danos and a passed ball to knot the score at 2-2.

LSU won the game in the 13th on a Harris infield single. After two throwing errors, Sara Fitzgerald crossed home for the game-winning run. In the circle, Schmidt fired all 13 innings and tallied 13 strikeouts.

Following a 2-0 setback to No. 2 UCLA, rain altered the WCWS schedule. The Tigers were faced with the task of winning three games in one day to advance to the championship game.

A Fitzgerald RBI-single in the fourth inning proved to be the game winner as LSU edged No. 4 Florida State 2-1 to start the day. Schmidt provided another 13 strikeouts and surrendered only one run on four hits.

The Tigers fought off elimination for a second time and erased an early 1-0 deficit against No. 5 California. Klein opened the second inning with a solo home run, Harris followed with a two-out, two-run double in the third and Delahoussaye tacked on an insurance run with an RBI-double of her own during the sixth.

Schmidt added eight strikeouts and pitched around trouble to close out the 4-1 victory for her third win of the WCWS.

LSU was poised to finish out the hat trick and carried a 1-0 lead into the fifth inning. Seven outs away, the Golden Bears struck for a quartet of runs to take the win.



After her amazing performance, Kristin Schmidt was named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2004 Women's College World Series.

"What more could you ask for from your team," Girouard said after the game. "I told the team before we got off the bus this morning that we weren't leaving the park until they turned out the lights on us tonight and we are doing just that. Unfortunately, we came up just a little short.

"This team did everything my staff asked of them. They played with total heart. Kristin Schmidt pitched her heart out and this team never died. If I have ever coached a team that deserved to go to the national championship game, then it is certainly this group of girls."

Yvette Girouard's first season at LSU ended in storybook fashion as the Tigers racked up a school record 59 wins and qualified for the program's first Women's College World Series.

LSU also completed the SEC triple crown for the first time en route to the SEC Western Division, Regular Season and Tournament championships.

After splitting a doubleheader at No. 21 Louisiana-Lafayette on April 18, the Tigers reeled off 12 consecutive victories to climb up to No. 3 in the national rankings.

Girouard refocused her team after a 7-3 setback at Auburn in the regular season finale and fired back with a 6-0 win over Auburn to open the SEC Tournament.

Three days later, All-American Stephanie Hastings belted a solo home run that stayed just inside the left field foul pole to open the SEC Championship against No. 22 South Carolina.

The first-inning blast coupled with a stellar effort from SEC Player of the Year Britni Sneed in the circle were more than enough to avenge a 1-0 setback to the Gamecocks from the season before.

Sneed hurled a three-hitter to complete her undefeated SEC season and recorded a tournament-record 11 strikeouts against zero walks to secure the MVP honor and 1-0 triumph.

LSU opened NCAA Regional action with victories over Cornell, Penn State and No. 9 Arizona State before facing No. 19 Louisiana-Lafayette in the finals.

The Tigers broke through for a pair of runs in the third inning as Hastings and future All-American Trena Peel provided RBIs.

An Alana Addison homer brought ULL within 2-1, but Sneed shut the door on the Cajuns retiring 12 of the final 15 batters highlighted by a strikeout of Heather Bertrand to vault LSU to the Women's College World Series.

Following a 2-1 hard-fought, extra inning loss to No. 4 Stanford, the Tigers bounced back behind a Julie Wiese two-run homer to dismiss No. 15 Iowa and set up an elimination tussle with No. 5 Oklahoma, the defending national champion.

The teams battled deep into the night before LSU emerged with a gritty 2-1 triumph in the 13th inning. An errant throw off an Ashley Lewis ground ball allowed Jennifer Schuelke to cross the plate for the game winning run.

Sneed willed her way to an impressive 18 strikeouts, a program single-game record. She escaped multiple jams during extra innings, none more impressive than back-to-back Ks to get out of a bases loaded situation in the 10th.

The game was viewed by 1.57 million fans, a softball record at the time according to NCAA Productions.

## The Southeastern Conference

SETTING THE STANDARD FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS IN SOFTBALL

SEC Softball will celebrate its 15th year of existence in 2011 and has established itself as one of the leading conferences in the sport.

The Southeastern Conference qualified seven teams for the 2010 NCAA Tournament - Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU and Tennessee, as the conference made its 13th overall, eighth consecutive, Women's College World Series appearance.

For the third consecutive year, an SEC team received the No. 1 national seed, as the Alabama Crimson Tide coveted the honor in 2010. Overall, five teams earned national seeds: No. 1 Alabama, No. 4 Florida, No. 6 Georgia, No. 12 LSU and No. 15 Tennessee. The SEC also advanced three teams to Oklahoma City for the second consecutive season: Florida, Georgia and Tennessee, while Georgia and Tennessee advanced to the semifinals.

Alabama won the 2010 conference title as they posted a 23-4 SEC record, marking their second title in school history. It was quite the year for the Tide as they posted a 52-11 overall record and swept league honors. Pat Murphy was named Coach of the Year while Kelsi Dunne earned Pitcher of the Year honors and Charlotte Morgan defended her Player of the Year title. Kayla Braud was named Co-Freshman of the Year along with LSU's Rachele Fico and Tennessee's Kat Dotson. Arkansas' Jessica Bachkora was selected as Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Softball came under the auspices of the Southeastern Conference in the 1996-97 season. Since that time, 10 different conference teams have made appearances in the NCAA Championship, including six teams earning Women's College World Series berths - one by South Carolina in the inaugural season, Alabama in 2000, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2008, 2009, Florida in 2008, 2009, 2010 Georgia in 2009, 2010 LSU in 2001 and 2004 and Tennessee in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2010.

Eight teams (Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State, South Carolina and Tennessee) have made Top 25 appearances and six teams have climbed into the Top 10 (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee) of the NFCA/USA Today Poll. At least one SEC team has been ranked in the poll each week since the inception of SEC Softball.

South Carolina is the flagship team of the league with a rich history in softball dating back 35 seasons. The Gamecocks have made 15 NCAA Regional and three Women's College World Series appearances.

Mississippi State played softball for five seasons during the 1980's before resuming the sport when it was added to the SEC. Tennessee added softball in 1995-96, one year before its inception in the SEC. Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU and Ole Miss began softball programs in 1996-97 to give the league 11 representatives (Vanderbilt does not sponsor softball).

The 1999 season was the first in which the conference was eligible for an automatic berth to the NCAA Championships. As the sport continues to grow in competitiveness and popularity, the SEC has had six different regular season champions and five different conference tournament champions.

- The SEC reached the 200K mark! More than 212,449 fans attended SEC home softball games in 2010. Alabama led the league in average attendance with 2,217 per date, 70,954 total.
- 2010 is the first year of the SEC on ESPN agreement and SEC softball was televised more than any other league. On the ESPN family of networks, there were 11 regular season games and each game of the SEC Tournament televised. Regional networks such as FSN/SPSO and CSS televised 12 games, giving the league a total of 30 broadcasts.
- At the 2010 SEC Softball Tournament, the total attendance was 4,477, the second largest total in tournament history since going to single-elimination. The session four attendance figure of 1,510 is the largest in tournament history since going to single-elimination.
- The SEC had four national Player of the Week honors by four different players.
- The SEC set another record with four teams in the top 10 in both final polls: 3/4) Georgia, 4/3) Tennessee, 6) Florida and 9/8) Alabama.
- In 2010, two SEC student-athletes which included LSU's Kirsten Shortridge were named NFCA First-Team All-Americans. Overall, 13 players were named to first, second and third teams combined. The record is 14 in 2009.
- The SEC has earned 122 Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-America honors since 1997. 50 First-Team selections, 43 Second-Team selections, 29 Third-Team selections.
- The SEC had 29 student-athletes named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Region teams in 2010. 19 were named First-Team, 10 were named Second-Team.
- The SEC had 15 student-athletes named to the 2010 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District teams, including LSU's Brittany Mack.

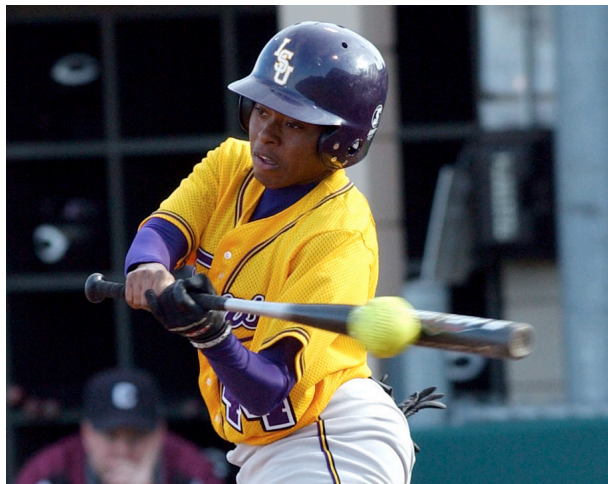

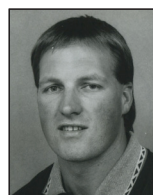

## Dr. John V. Lombardi

President, Louisiana State University System



Dr. John V. Lombardi is the fifth individual to serve as the President of the Louisiana State University System. As its Chief Executive Officer, Dr. Lombardi oversees 11 institutions, including five academic campuses, as well as 10 public hospitals located throughout the state. He is also a Professor of History at Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College.

Dr. Lombardi was born in Los Angeles, California and attended Pomona College where he earned his bachelor's degree. He received his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in history from Columbia University. He joined the faculty in the Department of History at Indiana University, where he later served as Dean of International Programs and Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. In 1987, he became Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at the Johns Hopkins University. From 1990-1999, Dr. Lombardi was President of the University of Florida. Prior to his appointment as President of the LSU System, he served as Chancellor of the University of Massachusetts Amherst.

He is a Latin American historian, with a special interest in Venezuela. Dr. Lombardi is also one of the country's foremost authorities in higher education, serving as Co-Editor of The Top American Research Universities. He is the author of numerous professional publications, and along with his wife, Cathryn, co-authored a teaching atlas on Latin American History. He has taught courses in history, intercollegiate sports, and university management.

## Dr. Michael V. Martin

Chancellor, LSU



**Dr. Michael V. Martin assumed the chancellorship of Louisiana State University and A&M College on August 1, 2008. Prior to his appointment as LSU's eighth chancellor, Dr. Martin established a distinguished career in higher education, serving most recently as president of New Mexico State University.**

Before arriving at NMSU in 2004, Dr. Martin served for six years as vice president for agriculture and natural resources at the University of Florida, leading the university's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences. He was elevated to senior vice president of the University of Florida shortly before being selected as NMSU's president. Previously, he was vice president for agricultural policy and the dean of the College of Agricultural, Food and Environmental Sciences at the University of Minnesota. He began his academic career at Oregon State University as a faculty member in the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics.

An academic leader dedicated to the land-grant mission, Dr. Martin is recognized as a strong voice for higher education. In 2007, he received the Justin Smith Morrill Memorial Award, named after the author of the bill creating land-grant universities, which honors outstanding service on behalf of the land-grant mission. Only six individuals have been designated to receive this award since it was first given in 1980. For his leadership in improving the quality of life for New Mexico citizens and future generations, he was awarded the 2008 Distinguished Leadership Award by Leadership New Mexico.

Other recent awards include his recognition as a powerbroker by The New Mexico Business Weekly in 2006, being named Outstanding Alumnus of Minnesota State University Mankato in 2006, and receiving the NMSU Social Justice Award in 2005.

Dr. Martin is involved in a wide array of professional and community organizations and activities.

An active scholar, Dr. Martin has authored numerous book chapters and articles for academic journals, trade publications, and the popular press and recently published pieces for The Chronicle of Higher Education and University Business.

Some of his philosophy is summed up in the following quote: "It is the tradition of land-grant universities to be non-traditional," written as part of a 2001 article titled "The Land-Grant University in the 21st Century," published in the Journal of Agricultural and Applied Economics. He traced the history of the land-grant movement from the mid-1800s and concluded that "the fundamental land-grant principles of accessibility, practical as well as classical education, research and discovery in the public interest, and connectedness to all the people remain powerful and profound."

A native of Crosby, Minn., Dr. Martin earned a bachelor's degree in business and economics and a master's degree in economics at Mankato State College (Minnesota State University) in Minnesota. He received his Ph.D. in applied economics from the University of Minnesota in 1977.

Dr. Martin and his wife, Jan, have two children, both adopted from South Korea. Amanda, a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, is a graphic artist in Saint Paul, Minn. Sam, who holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Minnesota and a master's from Sarah Lawrence College, is a genetics counselor at Beth Israel Hospital in New York City.



## Dydia DeLyser

Faculty Athletics Representative

Dydia DeLyser, an associate professor in the Department of Geography and Anthropology, serves in her fifth year as LSU's Faculty Athletics Representative.

DeLyser, a native of Santa Monica, Calif., earned her bachelor's degree in 1992 from UCLA, and her master's and doctoral degrees from Syracuse University (in 1996 and 1998).

DeLyser arrived at LSU in August 1998 as an Instructor before becoming an assistant professor one year later. She was promoted to associate professor with tenure in August 2005.

DeLyser is a cultural-historical geographer. Her research has been both ethnographic and historical, and most of it questions how different built landscapes can help make the past meaningful in the present.

Much of her published research has focused on two different studies. One was a many-year ethnographic study of a ghost town in California (Bodie State Historic Park) where she examined how images and ideas about the American mythic West became meaningful to the tourists

who visited the town. The second was an historical study that examined a 19th century novel (Ramona) and how it changed the way people understood (and still understand) southern California's past.

Her current research concerns early women aviators and how they used their practices of flying to advance feminism in the post-suffrage era.

DeLyser teaches graduate courses in cultural geography, qualitative research, and academic and professional writing. She has also taught undergraduate courses in cultural, and urban geography, and an introductory world-regional geography course.

DeLyser is a first-generation American -- her parents were Dutch immigrants and English is her second language. She also has language abilities in Russian and Spanish.

DeLyser's hobbies include driving/riding antique cars and motorcycles. She is also a licensed pilot and co-owns a Citabria, which is a two-place aerobatic airplane.



## Joe Alleva

LSU Vice-Chancellor/Director of Athletics



**Joe Alleva enters his third year as LSU's Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics after being hired to lead one of the nation's most powerful athletic programs on April 4, 2008. Alleva joined LSU after 10 years of outstanding leadership as the director of athletics at Duke University. He officially took over at LSU on July 1, 2008.**

The LSU Board of Supervisors approved a promotion in August 2009 for Alleva, adding vice chancellor to his title and expanding his role to the academic side of the university. It's the first time at LSU that the director of athletics has also held a vice chancellor position.

"I am honored to be named vice chancellor at this outstanding institution and thank Chancellor (Michael) Martin, President (John) Lombardi and the Board of Supervisors for the confidence they have shown in me," Alleva said. "Athletics is the window through which many people view LSU and it is important that we excel in competition and in the classroom while demonstrating the utmost of integrity. I believe my promotion ties athletics closer to the university and that is a good thing for everyone; we are all on the same team."

Under Alleva's guidance, LSU has reached new heights in terms of athletic success while continuing to be recognized as one of the top enterprises in college athletics.

A veteran leader in college athletics, Alleva is dedicated to athletic and academic excellence. He is committed to providing the opportunities and the resources necessary for student-athletes to excel in competition, in the classroom and in the community.

Alleva, 57, is well-respected for sustaining high standards of excellence and integrity in athletic programs, hiring the finest coaches in the country and the high level of success achieved by student-athletes.

One of Alleva's big initiatives on the LSU campus is the launching of a strategic plan for the continued success and future improvement of LSU Athletics.

LSU Athletics has produced a new booklet called "LSU: Thru and True" designed to introduce a strategic plan for operating a top tier athletics program. The strategic plan booklet is titled "LSU: Thru and True" because, in the words of Alleva, "Our core values run deep and our commitment to excellence is relentless. At LSU, college athletics is an avenue for providing opportunities, for achieving goals, for generating enthusiasm and for nurturing passion."

The subtitle of the booklet is "Excellence in Competition, Distinction in the Classroom, and Contribution to the Community." The strategic plan addresses various topics including quality of life for student-athletes; academic and athletic excellence; compliance and ethics; financial responsibility; diversity, inclusion and equity; tradition and history, and service and communication.

The plan also includes a vision for the future of LSU athletics facilities, highlighted by plans to improve North Stadium Drive between Tiger Stadium and the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

Alleva is an innovator with bold ideas that benefit not only LSU but all of Greater Baton Rouge. Alleva was instrumental in the planning of the inaugural Bayou Country Superfest, a two-day country music concert and festival held in Tiger Stadium last spring. The event attracted nearly 100,000 visitors to the LSU campus and made a tremendous economic impact upon the local community.

Seventeen of LSU's 20 sports programs participated in post-season competition in 2009-10, including the Tiger football squad that played in a bowl game for the 10th straight season. Six LSU teams posted Top 10 national finishes last season, and 12 were ranked among the Top 25. LSU finished in the Top 20 of the Learfield Director's Cup rankings, which measure overall athletic success for institutions across the country.

Under Alleva's direction in 2008-09, all 20 LSU sports competed in NCAA post-season play for the first time in school history, and it culminated with the baseball team winning the



national championship. In addition, six teams finished in the top 10 nationally. LSU was the only school in the Southeastern Conference to participate in a bowl game and the men's and women's NCAA basketball tournaments during 2008-09. Furthermore, LSU student-athletes volunteered a total of 2,360 hours for community service projects.

LSU earned a ninth place ranking in the 2008-09 Learfield Director's Cup, as the Tigers were second only to Florida among SEC institutions. LSU accumulated points in 18 of a possible 20 categories in the standings, also a first for the school.

Upon being hired at LSU, Alleva immediately made an impact by hiring Trent Johnson to lead the men's basketball program. Johnson, the 2009 SEC Coach of the Year, wasted little time in turning the Tigers into a winner as LSU claimed the 2009 SEC regular season title and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

LSU also had top 10 national finishes in 2008-09 in gymnastics, men's and women's indoor track and field and men's and women's outdoor track and field. Thirteen of LSU's 20 sports finished the year ranked among the top 25 in the nation.

The Tiger football team capped their 2008 season with a 38-3 win over 14th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. During the offseason, Alleva helped secure the funding necessary for the addition of a state-of-the-art artificial turf practice field, which complements the surface the Tigers have in their indoor practice facility. The addition of the outdoor artificial turf field gives the LSU football program one of the nation's finest all-around facilities.

Not only did LSU teams set records but so did the fans, as over 1.5 million fans filled venues on the LSU campus in 2008-09. LSU set the school record for overall attendance in the sports of football, baseball, and softball.

Alleva oversaw in the spring of 2009 the grand opening of two of the premier baseball and softball facilities in college athletics, Alex Box Stadium and Tiger Park.

In addition, LSU opened a new gift center for its fans - the LSU SportShop. The LSU SportShop, a spectacular, free-standing facility that features the latest in LSU apparel and merchandise, is located adjacent to Mike's Habitat.

Under Alleva's guidance, LSU has one of the most lucrative apparel and shoe contracts with Nike while also having one of the nation's most attractive multi-media rights contracts with CBS Collegiate Sports Properties. LSU athletic budget is

now approaching \$85 million, which allows the university to compete at the highest level in the nation.

Alleva has a long-term vision for continued improvements to LSU's athletic facilities in order to insure that the Tigers are among the best in the country well into the 21st Century. One of his top priorities is the enhancement of Tiger Stadium and making Tiger Stadium and the North Stadium Drive corridor a showplace for the university. Alleva's innovative plan is to make a plaza area between the Maravich Assembly Center and Tiger Stadium that would recognize LSU's national championship teams and distinguished alumni. This special area, along with Mike's Habitat, and the LSU SportShop, would become the focal point for visitors to campus.

LSU opened in the spring of 2010 a basketball practice facility that houses both the men's and women's basketball teams. The new basketball practice facility features two full length courts as well as locker rooms and other amenities for both squads.

Alleva is also overseeing a major renovation to the golf course at the University Club that will be completed in September 2010, and he is developing plans for a new gymnastics practice facility, indoor tennis center and improved soccer facility. LSU's world-renowned track and field program will receive a state-of-the-art running surface this year when a new track is installed in Bernie Moore Stadium.

"Joe Alleva brings a wealth of experience and accomplishment to LSU," LSU President John Lombardi said of hiring Alleva. "I'm confident we've found a new leader for LSU athletics who exemplifies the vision and integrity needed to lead our sports programs to new heights, a champion of student athletes who believes in the highest standards of competition both on the field and in the classroom."

Alleva's impressive tenure as director of athletics at Duke propelled the university into the ranks of America's top all-around collegiate programs. Among his outstanding list of accomplishments includes the greatest 10-year period in Duke athletics, winning more ACC and NCAA championships than in any other decade in school history.

Also, his fundraising reached extensive heights providing new facilities or renovations for all 26 sports at Duke, which enhanced the experience for every student-athlete.

Alleva is active on the national collegiate athletics scene, having served on the Football Bowl Certification Committee. He sat on several Atlantic Coast Conference committees and served on the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet.

Alleva majored in Finance at Lehigh University and received his bachelor's degree in 1975. While at Lehigh, Alleva was the quarterback of the football team and team captain in 1974. Alleva also played on the Lehigh baseball team. He served as a graduate assistant football coach and earned an MBA in 1976.

Alleva began his 32-year career at Duke University in 1976. He spent 28 years in the athletic administration prior to becoming director of athletics in 1998.

Alleva played a key role in Durham's community sports scene. He started Little League Baseball in Durham over 20 years ago, and also began the American Legion baseball program.

Alleva is a member of the North Carolina American Legion Hall of Fame, Suffern High School Hall of Fame and the Rockland County Hall of Fame.

He currently serves on the Louisiana State Board of the Special Olympics.

Alleva and his wife, Annie, have three children, J.D., Jeff, and Jenny.





**Verge Ausberry**  
Senior Associate AD/Operations

A former LSU football standout, Verge Ausberry joined the athletics administrative staff in August 2001 as the Associate Athletics Director for Operations. He was appointed to the position of Senior Associate Athletics Director in May 2006.

Ausberry supervises and is responsible for football operations, football scheduling and new projects. He also oversees the LSU men's and women's track and field programs, the equipment staff, the strength and conditioning staff, the Dr. Martin Broussard training room, the video department and football game management.

Ausberry, from New Iberia, La., played inside linebacker for the Tigers, lettering in 1986-89. He was part of two SEC championship teams, playing on teams that went to four bowl games.

Before joining the LSU athletic administration, he was very closely involved in the athletic program, first serving for almost seven years as a member of LSU's highly regarded Academic Center for Athletes.

After leaving the Academic Center, he moved in July 1999 to the Tiger Athletic Foundation staff as part of LSU's fundraising arm.

Ausberry received his Bachelor of Science degree in education in May of 1990, his Master of Education degree in administration, supervision and certification in child welfare in May of 1992 and his specialist in higher education administration in 2004. He is presently a doctoral candidate in higher education administration at LSU. He is married to the former Cheri Morial of New Orleans and they have two boys, Austin and Jaiden.



**Miriam Segar**  
Senior Associate AD/Senior Woman Administrator

Former LSU women's basketball player Miriam Segar has been a part of the athletics administration since June of 1995 and was most recently named Senior Associate AD and the department's Senior Woman Administrator after having served as Associate Athletics Director for Student Services since April 2007. She had served as Assistant Athletics Director since 2004.

As LSU's Senior Woman Administrator, Segar's responsibilities include oversight of the highly successful Tiger Olympic Sports program including 17 men's and women's sports. Segar began her administrative career at LSU as the compliance coordinator where she served for three years. Following that, in 1998, Segar was named the director of the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program where she worked until 2001 when she became the Director of Student Services.

While working with CHAMPS/Life Skills, Segar guided the program to the Division I Athletic Directors Program of Excellence Award in 2001.

**Mark Ewing**  
Senior Associate AD/Business

Mark Ewing, a 26-year employee of Louisiana State University, joined the Athletics Department in January 2001, and serves as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Business.

Ewing is responsible for the athletic business operations including budget, travel, personnel and purchasing as well as responsibility for concession operations. He also handles financial forecasting and management of facility maintenance operations.

Associate Vice-Chancellor for University Relations  
Senior Associate AD/External Affairs

Herb Vincent serves in the dual position of Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs in the athletic department and Associate Vice Chancellor for University Relations. He was appointed Senior Associate AD in May of 2006 and assumed the additional duties of oversight of University Relations in August of 2009.

Vincent manages communications and serves as the primary public relations officer for the University and all its entities. In his role in athletics, he supervises the sports information office and marketing and promotions office, serves as the primary liaison with LSU Sports Properties, and is the department administrator for the sport of baseball.

Vincent was the LSU sports information director from July 1988 to July 2000. During that time he was named Assistant AD in November of 1989, and then was elevated to Associate AD for Communications in 1992.

In August of 2000 Vincent became Vice President for Communications for the College Sports Southeast regional cable network, headquartered in Birmingham, Ala., before returning to LSU in 2002.

**Sr. Associate AD/Compliance and Planning**

Returning in 2009 to serve the department in the Compliance Office, Bahnsen is once again proving to be a very versatile member of the athletic department.

Before moving back to Compliance, Bahnsen served the previous five years, in a valuable role as Associate Athletics Director for Internal Relations, overseeing the ticket office and all customer service operations.

Bahnsen oversees the Pete Maravich Assembly Center and game management for all sports except football.

A native of Wharton, Texas, Bahnsen attended Wharton County Junior College for two years before transferring to LSU in 1979. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in physical education.

## Eddie Nunez

**Sr. Associate AD/Operations, Project Development**

Eddie Nunez joined the Athletics Department in October 2003 as the Director of Game and Event Management and was promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Operations and Project Development in June of 2007.

Nunez's responsibilities include oversight of the men's basketball program, men's tennis program and the women's tennis program. He supervises the Game/Event Management department as well as directs all capital project for the athletic department. 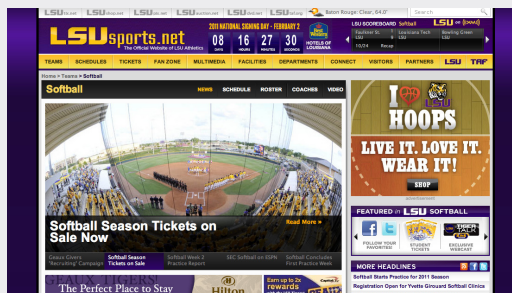

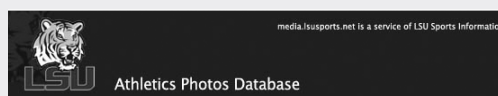

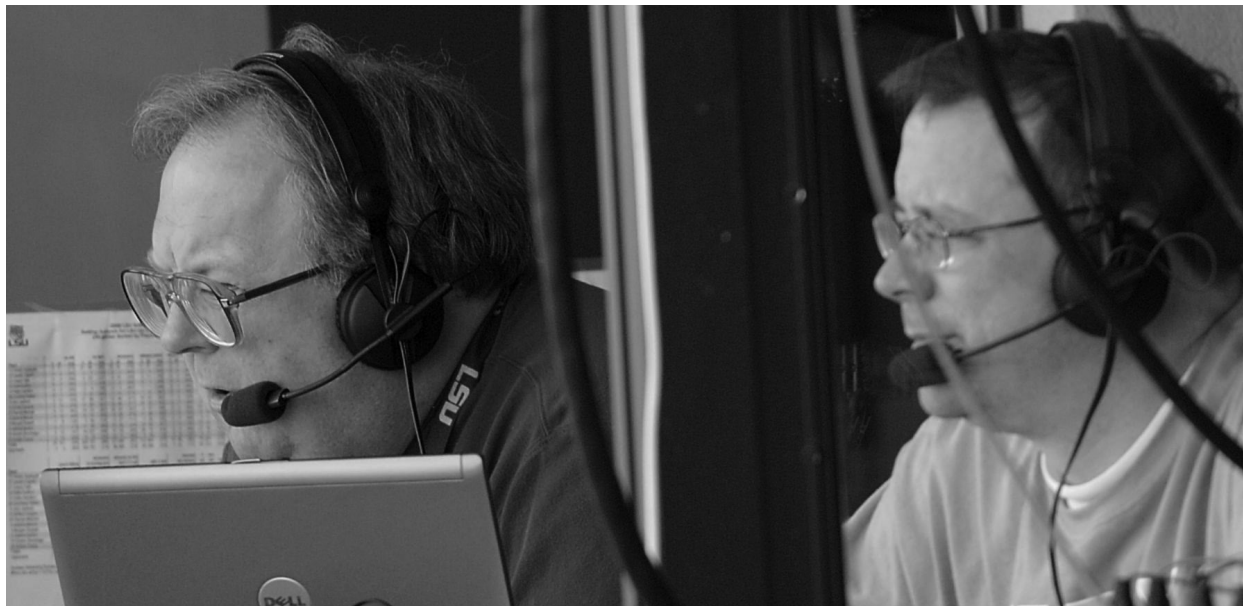

The LSU Sports Radio Network gives Tiger softball one of the most comprehensive audiences across the nation. As Tiger softball begins its 15th season of extensive radio coverage, the LSU Sports Radio Network is scheduled to all 28 SEC games beginning with the March 9 doubleheader against Florida. In addition, the network also will broadcast a pair of non-conference games.

The LSU Sports Radio Network brings Tiger softball to its many fans with broadcasts in the Baton Rouge area on 104.5/104.9 FM. This marks the 11th season LSU softball has been on the station.

Patrick Wright, the voice of Tiger softball for the previous 14 seasons, will provide all of the play-by-play action. Wright also is the voice of LSU women's basketball and serves as one of the locker room reporters for radio broadcasts of LSU football games.

For the 15th season, LSU Senior Associate SID Kent Lowe will serve as the color analyst for Tiger softball home games. LSU Associate SID Matt Dunaway joins Wright for his third season on the air during road games.

The LSU Sports Radio Network also will cover all of the Tigers postseason games from the SEC and NCAA Tournaments.
