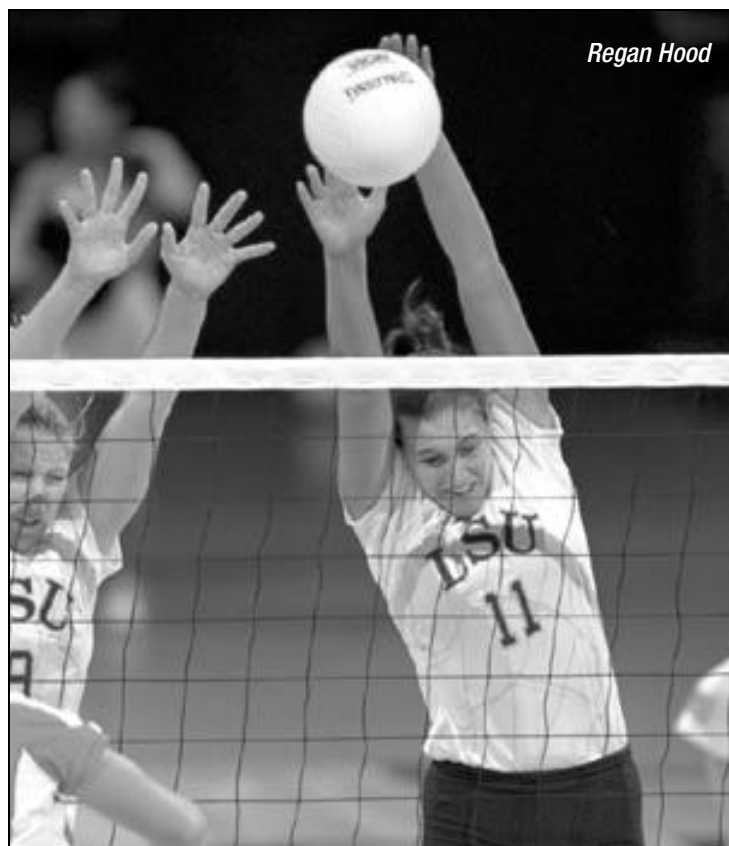

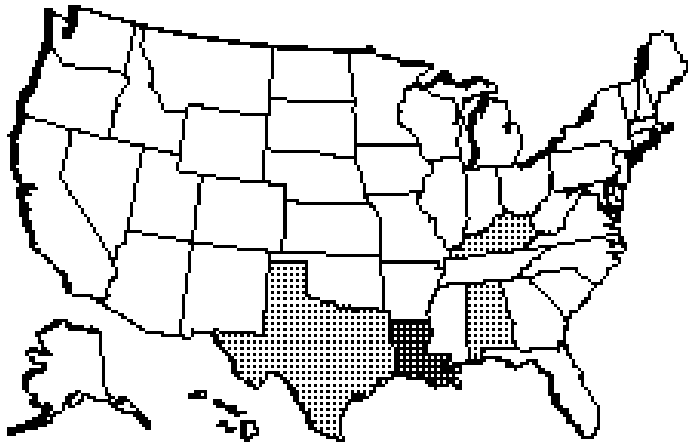

# Season Preview



## TIGERS ON THE Prowl

The 2001 LSU Volleyball team had one of the most successful seasons in recent years, posting the best overall record since 1995.

Despite that performance, the team was not satisfied.

Having entered the season determined to win the SEC Western Division and make the NCAA Tournament, the Tigers fell just short of their lofty goals, contending for the Western Division crown late into the year.

Coming so close in 2001 has made the 2002 Tiger team hungry to be the best it can be. However, to accomplish what it wants this year, the Tigers must overcome the loss of a pair of starters, including the best player to don an LSU uniform in nearly a decade, Meagan Davis.

"We've taken that step to where we got double-digit wins in the conference and we certainly want to maintain that status. I think the interesting thing for our team is there is a huge turnover in personnel. We lost a lot of experience from this past year's team, but we are going to have to have some people who have started for four years and they should be able to come in and do a great job leading us," said head coach Fran Flory.

With five returning seniors, including three starters and the squad's top defensive specialist, LSU will have the experience and leadership it needs to contend for the conference crown once again.

"The question mark for the team this year is leadership, and certainly the seniors have a great basis to be able to step in and lead us. But the key to most team's leadership is their junior class, and unfortunately for us we don't have one, so that is going to be a little bit of an uncertain situation until people get established in the fall.

The Tigers will look to attain the same goals they set last year in winning the division and reaching the NCAA Tournament.

"I think our goals for this season are the same as ever, and the interesting part for the season is just about everybody in our division, except for Alabama, lost their best players, so I think our division is up for grabs. We are on the right cycle with everybody else to step in and get a chance to get back up there."

With its recent successes, LSU has turned into a team that expects to win every time it steps on the court and expects to realize its goals by season's end. There is a new yardstick by which Tiger volleyball teams will be measured for the next few years.

"I think we've finally established ourselves. We beat everybody in our division either once or twice, and it's the first time in a long time that we've been able to do that. We have established a different standard for ourselves and now it's time to reap the benefits and bring the young people in and have them understand what's expected when they walk in the door."

### Outside Hitter

The outside hitter position should anchor the LSU offense in 2002 as the Tigers return both starters from a year ago, Jennifer Hampton and Kyra Lancon. Hampton was a Second-Team All-SEC performer last season and figures to improve on that this season. A four-year starter, she needs just 47 kills to become just the fourth player in LSU history to reach 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career.

"Hampton is primed for a great senior year. She has matured offensively, and has always been a great defender. She is amongst the best, if not the best in the league. Her focus has always been defense and that has been her priority for us as a team. For us to be successful, she has had to be the ball control person. But now she is becoming more of a factor offensively and I think she is going to surprise some people with her offensive output in the fall."

Lancon is a young, talented player with tremendous potential. She jumped into the starting lineup as a freshman last season and finished third on the team in kills. With her killer instinct at the net, she becomes a go-to player in clutch situations for the Tigers.

"Kyra is a cannon offensively. Our question mark with Kyra is physically, can we get her to a level that she can play well day in and day out? She has periods of unbelievable performance, then she has periods where she disappears, so consistency will be the key for her. Her attitude and spirit will be also very important to us, because she's got a burning desire to be successful. As long as we adapt the offense a little bit around her, we are going to benefit from her speed and her ability to get up in the air and hit the ball at a higher point than almost anybody else on this team."

Senior Rachel Vogt will also see playing time at the outside hitter position. In her four years with LSU, Vogt has been the consummate teammate as she has played outside hitter, middle blocker and right side when called upon. A walk-on to begin her career, she has worked her way into the rotation and will also start on occasion.

"Rachel is a workhorse. She is the most determined person on our team to be successful. I think the change to a faster offensive system will help her because timing has always been a factor for her and the lower ball reduces the timing factor. We are going to be a fast, dynamic team, and if we are that, she will be on the court."

LSU also has two freshmen entering the fray at outside hitter in Megan Heinz and Markeisha Constant. Heinz who was the Houston



Player of the Year last season, is a big physical player who can play outside or in the middle and be effective.

"Megan truly understands the balance offensively between power game and a finesse game. She's somebody that will be very frustrating to defenses because she's just going to hit the ball where you're not. She has great court vision and great court awareness. She doesn't look like the flashiest player, but she's somebody when you look at the stat sheet at the end of the match, you're gonna think, wow."

Constant will immediately be the best athlete on the team when she joins it in August. At 5-11, she has great leaping ability and tremendous quickness. Having not played much organized volleyball, she will likely redshirt the season to gain valuable experience.

"Markeisha needs experience in the worst way, but she's one of the best athletes, fastest, jumps higher, jumps quicker than we've ever had here. She has an unlimited amount of potential. She has a great desire to take it to the next level and be a factor."

### Middle Blocker

For the second straight season, middle blocker will be a position where LSU has an abundance of talent, but not much depth. With one returning starter, who has fought through injuries the past three seasons, and a player whose natural position is outside hitter, the Tigers have simply put two of their best athletes at the spot.

"I think we may have two of the biggest, most physical middles in the league, but we aren't necessarily going to have two of the most experienced middles in the league. Physically, they have the tools and what matters is how quickly we can bring Regan Hood around and how effective Lauren Cuyler can be offensively."

Cuyler's return to the court in 2002 will be one of the best stories at LSU in the fall. After a pair of surgeries on her right shoulder, Cuyler will be back on the floor, primarily as a blocking factor. Despite the physical limitations she will have due to the injuries, she will be someone who can provide an offensive spark when needed.

"Cuyler took the spring off and we trained her very little. She will still be the best blocker on this team. She is one of the most gifted athletes ever to play here and should pass up some people in the record books in terms of blocking. She will not be able to be the force offensive leader she wants to be or that we could probably use her to be, but after two shoulder surgeries, what more can you ask? She is our emotional leader, she's a competitive leader, she will be the heart and soul of this team in the fall."

Hood will look to step in and fill the shoes of three-time All-SEC performer Meagan Davis at the other middle spot. In limited action as a freshman, Hood showed tremendous blocking ability as she led the team in blocks per game. Her training at the position in the spring has improved her offensive efficiency and, because of that, she will be a crucial part to the Tiger offense.

"Regan came a long way in the spring and made tremendous strides. She will become, over the course of this next season, a terminating player for us offensively. Her blocking has developed as well and she's going to end up a good ball control player. She's going to end up being a complete player for us and certainly we hope that's in the fall."

Freshman Cara Causey joins the team this fall as the team's third middle blocker. She has the ability to become an instant force on the offensive side of the ball for LSU. Causey fits in with the Tigers' current middle blockers as a true athlete, who will take up a lot of space at the net and be a terminating blocker.

"Cara is a very talented athlete and has a huge reach like Regan. She's going to take up a whole lot of space blocking and be a force offensively. She can hit the ball but she needs experience against big blockers because she's played above everybody. But I think she will come around very fast because she's very competitive, she's grown up in a coach's household, she knows what athletics is about."

### Setter

Returning in as the starting setter for the third straight season is senior Katie Kubena. As a junior, Kubena ran the LSU offense and led the Tigers to their best hitting percentage in over a decade. With one season left, she should move into second place all-time in school history in assists.

"Katie is traditionally a very high percentage type setter. She finds the best opportunity, and gives the highest percentage hitter the ball. We have asked her to do something different, and be a little more risky, a little more on the edge this year which should translate well in our new offense."

Beth Cowley will be back for her sophomore season after seeing spot duty a season ago. The new offense should fit her better as she is more accustomed to setting low balls and running a fast paced attack.

"We've changed our offense. We've gone to a very low-fast offense that will create better match-ups for our hitters. We are going to be very quick and that up-tempo type of offense fits into her style a little better than it has in any other setter that we had previously. Beth did a great job this spring and ended very well and very confidently."

### Defensive Specialist/Libero

College volleyball has adopted the libero rule used by international organizations for the 2002 season. The libero is a player who can enter the game to play on the back row at any time without it being charged against a team's number substitutions per game. However, the libero is not allowed to serve.

Returning for her senior season is defensive stopper Jenny Greco, who has ranked second on the team in digs for the past two years. Also the Tigers' top server, Greco is pivotal to the LSU's success.

"Greco pushes everybody. She's extending and diving, and flying all over the court for every ball. She is the type of person that will maybe not get the glory, but will be the reason we're successful. It's that kind of behind-the-scenes player that pushes a team through."

Sophomore Rachel Pittman entered last year as a walk-on freshman and took the season to become better acclimated to the college game. By season's end, she saw action in a number of matches as the team's second defensive specialist off the bench.

"Pittman made great strides in the spring. She has developed into somebody that's a very good defensive player in terms of lining up on hitters one-on-one. She has fought and challenged Greco everyday which is a healthy competitiveness between them. Pittman is going to get a whole lot better when she gets experienced in game situations. That's all she's lacking right now."

Fellow sophomore Blaise DeRouen also returns for her second season of defensive specialist duties. With the addition of the libero this season, DeRouen will become an impact player for the Tigers.

"Blaise works as hard as she can everyday, she fights every practice, fights through every drill, she's challenging herself. There are days when she is our best defender. I think the competition for libero and for the DS's that we use this year is going to be real good."

# Opponents

The Southeastern Conference will hold the 24th-annual SEC Tournament this year in Fayetteville, Ark.

The tournament is a single-elimination team competition involving the top eight league schools based on regular season records. The first round of competition takes place on Friday, Nov. 21, with four matches. Semifinal matches are held on Saturday, Nov. 22, with the tournament final on Sunday, Nov. 23. The final match of the tournament will be broadcast on SEC-TV and the winner will be awarded the conference's automatic bid into the 2002 NCAA Tournament.

The NCAA Division I Volleyball Championship consists of a 64-team field that competes over the course of two weeks for the National Championship. First and second round matches take place at campus sites to be announced the first weekend of December. Winners of the second round matches move on to a four-team regional at campus sites to be announced. Each regional winner advances to the 2002 Final Four which takes place on Dec. 19 and 21 at the New Orleans Sports Arena.

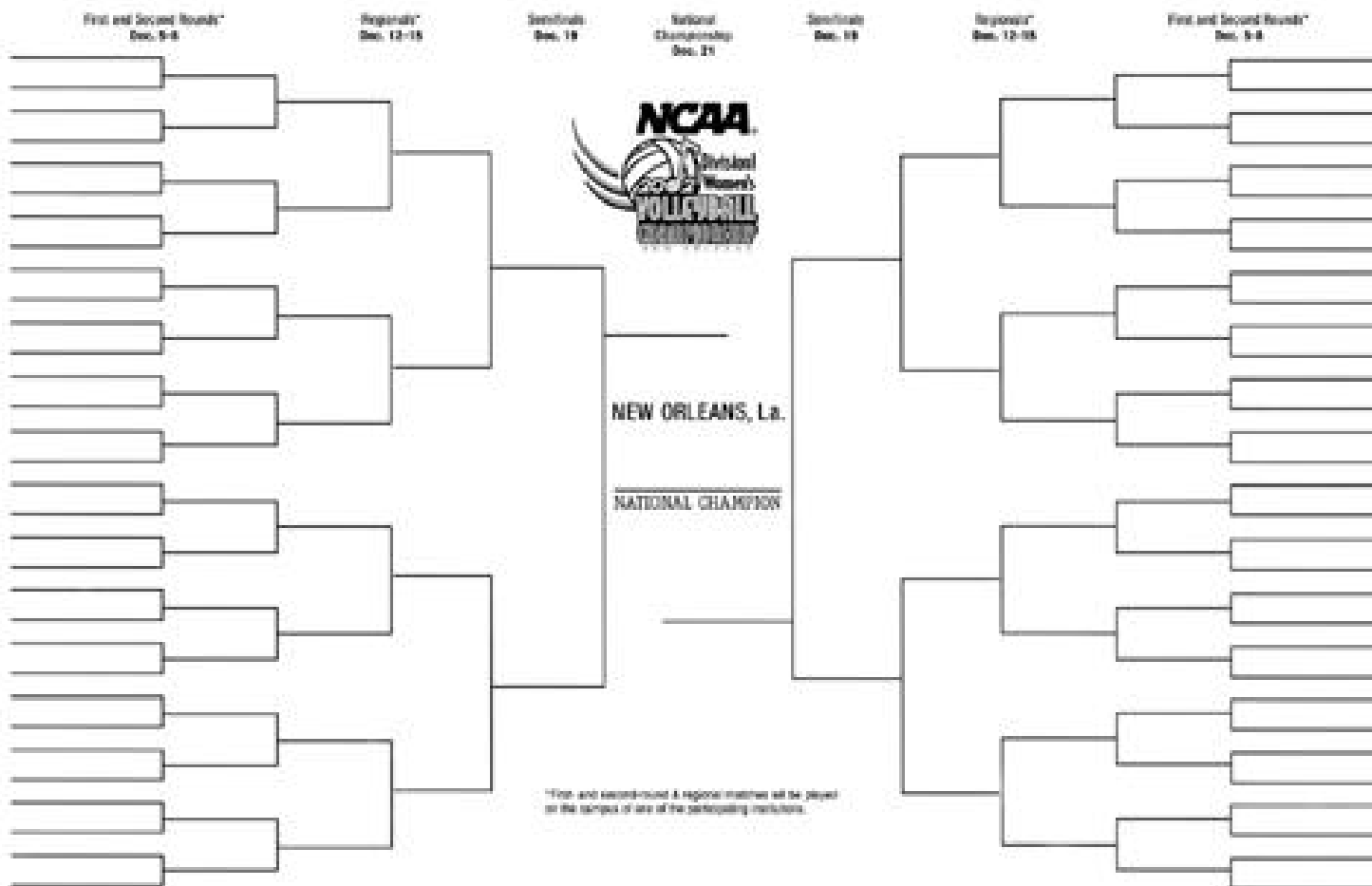

# Head Coach



## Fran Flory

HEAD COACH  
Fifth Season

Entering her fifth year at the helm of the Tigers, coach Fran Flory continues to raise the level of success of the LSU volleyball program and break down barriers that have plagued the Tigers for the past decade.

Last season, Flory's Tiger team recorded the third most conference wins in season history with 10 and picked up its first winning conference season since 1995. With that came a runner-up finish in the Southeastern Conference Western Division.

LSU owned the best intra-division record among Western Division teams at 9-1 while finishing fourth overall in the conference. At 16-11 overall, the Tigers had their best winning percentage in seven years.

She also coached Meagan Davis to First-Team All-SEC honors while Lauren Cuyler and Jennifer Hampton each picked up second-team honors. In her four years, Flory has now coached seven all-conference players, including three first-teamers.



However, her success has not been solely on the court. LSU has had the most players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll of any school in the league during her tenure. In each of the past three seasons, the Tigers have led the conference.

The LSU volleyball program has also been recognized nationally for its academic success, picking up an American Volleyball Coaches Association Academic Award in each of the last three years.

Flory guided her 2000 squad to the SEC Tournament Championship match against perennial-powerhouse Florida. Despite the loss in the final, LSU had made a breakthrough as it had not been to the championship match since 1992 and had not won a tournament match since 1993.

Flory's 2000 team also became the first LSU team to beat Arkansas when it did so in three games on the Lady Backs' home floor. She led the Tigers to their first win at Auburn in 10 years en route to a third-place finish in the SEC Western Division.

She made an immediate impact at LSU in 1998 as she led the Tigers to a 15-16 record, six games better than the 9-21 mark the team had the year before. More impressive was the five-match improvement in SEC play. After a winless 1997 in conference action, LSU notched five conference victories in 1998 to finish third in the West.

In 1999, Flory led her injury-riddled squad to a 17-15 overall record, the best for an LSU team since the Tigers won 20 matches in 1995. Of the 17 wins, seven came in conference play, also a Tiger best since the 1995 season.

This is Flory's second stint at LSU as the Baton Rouge native was an assistant for four years under LSU's winningest coach, Scott Luster.

She served as a graduate assistant coach in 1988, before being named a full-time assistant in 1989. During her four seasons as a member of the Tiger coaching staff, Flory helped LSU to unprecedented success with three SEC championships, three SEC Tournament championships and two Final Four appearances.

After winning the first of the three consecutive conference championships in 1989, Flory and the Tigers became the first school in SEC history to advance to the NCAA Final Four in 1990. The Tigers would duplicate the Final Four feat in 1991, while earning conference titles in both seasons. The 1991 team remains the only SEC team to win a game in the Final Four.

In 1992, Flory left LSU to assume the head coaching duties at Southeastern Louisiana. In her first season as a Division I head coach, she led the Lions to a 21-13 record.

In March 1993, Flory returned to the SEC as she became an assistant coach at Kentucky. Five months later, she was named the Wildcats head coach as then-Kentucky coach Kathy DeBoer was named an Associate Athletic Director at the school.

In her first season at Kentucky, Flory led the Wildcats to a 29-4 record, while advancing to the second round of the NCAA

Tournament. For her efforts in the 1993 season, she was named the Tachikara/AVCA Region IV Coach of the Year.

A 1984 graduate of Texas, Flory has also experienced much success as a player. In 1981, she was a member of Texas' AIAW National Championship squad. She received All-Southwest Conference and All-South Region honors during three seasons with the Longhorns.

Following her playing career, Flory was named the head coach at Wittenburg University, where she coached for one season before being named an assistant at Texas A&M for the 1987 season.

A member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, Flory has also assisted in coordinating both the Louisiana Senior Olympic Games and the Special Olympics, hosting the Senior Olympic Games in 2001. She is also a member of the United States Volleyball Association coaching accreditation program.

She is married to Ken Flory. The two have a daughter, Lindsay (5), and a son, Nicholas (3).

# Tonya Johnson

ASSISTANT COACH  
Fifth Season

Tonya Johnson, who came with head coach Fran Flory to LSU prior to the 1998 season, returns to LSU for her fifth season as an assistant coach.

In her four-year stint, Johnson has helped LSU rise from the lower half of the conference to a fourth-place finish in the SEC a season ago. Johnson looks to continue that improvement this year.

As the team's top assistant, Johnson handles a majority of the Tigers recruiting and is responsible for much of the current roster choosing LSU. As captain on the Tigers' first Final Four team in 1990, she is familiar with the type of outstanding players it takes to be successful on a national scale.

"Tonya has developed into someone that does most of our recruiting," said Flory. "She has a great eye for talent and she has a very good balance of her recruiting and her ability to coach and develop those recruits."

Heading into her eighth year as an assistant to Flory, the duo has developed the kind of continuity that leads to success on the court.

"I think she's done a great job of balancing me and anytime you have somebody who's coached together for this long, we don't really have to talk a whole lot," Flory added. "We can just look at each other and walk out and know what we're supposed to do, so she is invaluable to me on and off the court."

In 1995, Johnson began her collegiate coaching career at the University of Kentucky. She spent three seasons with the Wildcats under Flory before joining Flory's staff at LSU in 1998.

A native of Zachary, La., Johnson was a four-year letterwinner at LSU from 1987-1990. Her playing days culminated as a senior in 1990 with the trip to the national semifinal. She won consecutive SEC titles in 1989 and 1990 as well.

"Tonya certainly has a tremendous desire to see this program go to the next level and be in the NCAA tournament and be successful like they were in the early '90s," Flory said. "That's where we're headed, that's everybody's goal to start the season, to still be playing in December."

Prior to joining the collegiate coaching ranks, Johnson taught at Wellington Landings Middle School in Boca Raton, Fla. While teaching, Johnson coached the Florida Gold Coast club team and served as an assistant coach at Olympic Heights High School.

# Ainsley Grimes

ASSISTANT COACH  
Fourth Season

Returning for her fourth season as an LSU assistant is Ainsley Grimes. Grimes joined the LSU staff in 1999 season after taking a season off from collegiate coaching in 1998.

Since joining the Tigers staff four years ago, Grimes has continued to improve as a coach and take on more responsibilities with each passing year, while helping LSU to two winning seasons and a berth in the SEC Tournament championship match.

"I think through the course of the last year, she has really seen what we are capable of and she understands what it is going to take to get there," said head coach Fran Flory. "When you move in from a player's perspective to a coaching perspective, it's a four to six year

process to truly see that."

As a Southeastern Conference setter at Kentucky, she gained valuable experience that she has been able to translate to two of the top four career assist leaders in LSU history. Grimes deals directly with the Tigers setters on a daily basis in practice as well as coaching them in the games.

"Ainsley has added a new perspective to us. She has become more of a voice in the gym, she's become more of a voice running our offense," added Flory. "She has had great input into adapting our offense to the strength of our hitters and to our setters. She has great insight in that which is something that I think, she has matured into and has gained confidence in that last few years."

Flory sees one of Grimes' biggest assets being the way she complements fellow assistant Tonya Johnson. The pair, together for the past three seasons, assists tremendously in the heavy recruiting trail that college teams must travel.

"The balance between Tonya and Ainsley recruiting is Tonya has a really good perspective on certain types of players, and Ainsley has a good perspective on the other types," notes Flory. "So I have a great balance between the two of them because I know what type of player each of them recruits, and they know what I want. We can kind of mix them all together and find the right combination for us."

Grimes is no stranger to the competition of the SEC as she was an assistant coach under Flory at Kentucky in 1997 and played for the Wildcats from 1993-96, also under Flory.

While at Kentucky, she finished her career ranked fourth on the Wildcats career charts for assists. In her freshman season, she was a part of the Wildcat team that finished second in the SEC and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament while going 29-4.

Between her assistant coaching positions at Kentucky and LSU, Grimes served as the head volleyball coach for her alma mater, Louisville Holy Cross High School. As a high school player, Grimes was a four-year starter and led the team to the state Final Four twice while coming away with four regional championships.

Twice she earned all-state honors and she was also a member of the U.S. Volleyball Association National Invitational Team in that time.

## JUNIOR SEASON (2001)

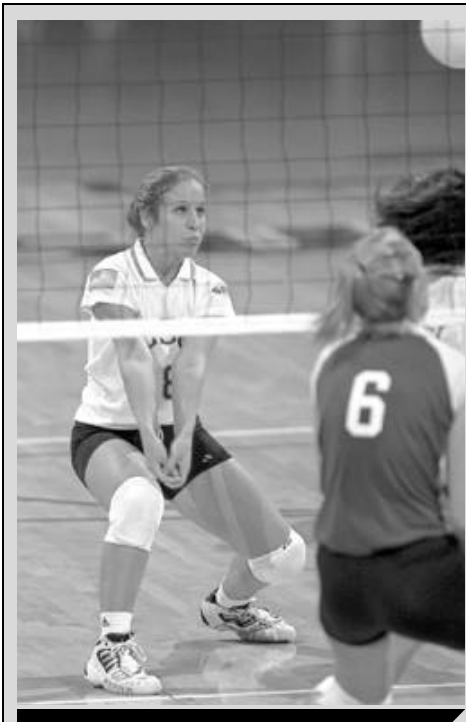

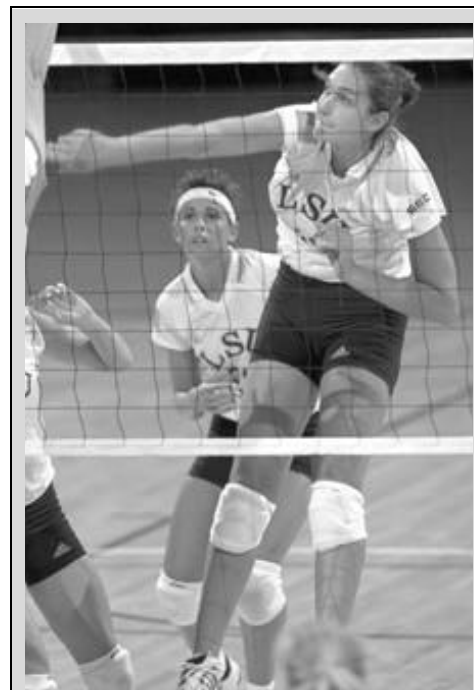

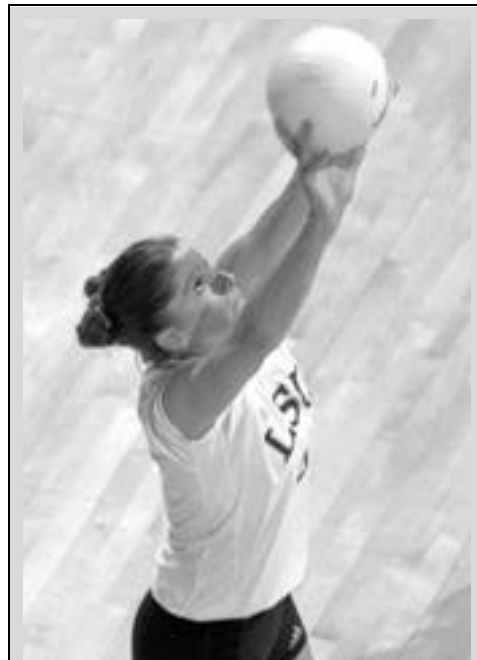

# STEP

***Over the past four seasons, the LSU volleyball program has shown continual growth as it has moved into the top tier of the Southeastern Conference.***

LSU continued its ascent back to the top of the Southeastern Conference in 2001 as it finished the year with its best record in seven years and the third most conference wins in school history. While a record of 16-11 is not as gaudy as some LSU records of the past, it is leaps and bounds ahead of where the program was just a few short years ago.

At 10-5 in the conference, the Tigers recorded the most league wins since they posted 12 in 1992 and had their best league finish since 1995, second in the Western Division.



Along the way, many Tigers picked up individual accolades. Meagan Davis collected the most hardware as she was named First-Team All-SEC, Louisiana Player of the Year and SEC Player of the Week for Oct. 22.

Davis was the first LSU player in nearly a decade to be named to the all-conference team three consecutive years. She also earned first-team honors twice, becoming the first Tiger to accomplish that feat in the same span.

Jennifer Hampton and Lauren Cuyler were not far behind. Hampton, who led LSU in both kills and digs, earned Second-Team All-SEC and First-Team All-Louisiana honors while also being named SEC Player of the Week for Nov. 12.

Cuyler was a Second-Team All-SEC and Second-Team All-Louisiana honoree despite playing in just three-fourths of LSU's

matches. Katie Kubena also garnered recognition, being named to the All-Louisiana second team.

Once again the Tigers shined in the classroom as a league-high 12 players were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Lyndsey Benson, Meghan Bedford, Cuyler, Davis, Jenny Greco, Hampton, Kubena, Addie Prewitt and Rachel Vogt all made the Honor Roll. Three other previously graduated players, Christy Carr, Jill Lytle and Lauren O'Connor also made the list.

The Tigers were forced to overcome a slow start to the season to accomplish such lofty feats. After the first six matches of the season, LSU owned a paltry 2-4 record and had lost its previous three matches, all in three games.

After opening the season with a 3-0 victory over in-state rival Tulane in the Sugar Bowl Classic, the Tigers dropped a 3-0 decision to Baylor. Later that day, LSU rebounded to score a 3-0 win over New Orleans to finish second in the tournament.

A week later, the Tigers traveled to Atlanta for the Georgia Tech Classic. There they would drop consecutive 3-0 decisions to Georgetown, Colorado State and Georgia Tech.

Reeling from the losses, LSU was looking forward to its first home match of the year in the Tiger Classic. However, the tournament was not to be as the tragic events of Sept. 11 cancelled all athletic events scheduled that week.

Due to the cancellation of the Tiger Classic, LSU added another in-state foe, Louisiana-Lafayette, to its schedule. A quick 3-0 dismissal of the Lady Cajuns and the Tigers were ready for SEC action.

In its conference opening weekend LSU was scheduled to fly to Tennessee and Kentucky before returning home. However, fears over flying caused the Tigers to bus to Knoxville, Tenn., and Lexington, Ky.

After a 13-hour bus ride on Thursday, LSU came out Friday surprisingly fresh and rolled to a 3-1 victory over the Lady Vols. The win was the Tigers' first in Knoxville since 1993. It was also the first time LSU opened the conference slate with a win since 1995.

However, the victory celebration was short lived as the Wildcats downed the Tigers 3-0 just two days later, leaving LSU with a 4-5 overall mark.

Following that loss, the Tigers went on a roll that would define their season. In its next nine matches, LSU's only loss came on the road to No. 20 South Carolina in a hard-fought 3-1 decision.

The run began with a 3-0 home domination of Auburn before the Tigers outlasted defending Western Division champion Alabama, 3-2. From there, LSU went on the road to sweep Mississippi State and Ole Miss, both by 3-0 scores.

Returning home, the Tigers downed both New Orleans, 3-0, and Rice, 3-0, before heading to South Carolina, where their six-match win streak would be snapped.

Back at home the next weekend, LSU ran its home court win streak to seven with a pair of 3-1 victories over Ole Miss and Mississippi State. The win streak was the longest at home for the Tigers since 1992.

However, the streak came to an end when Florida and Georgia each came in to the Pete Maravich Assembly Center and escaped with victories. Facing the Gators, who entered ranked ninth in the nation, LSU held leads late in each of the first two games, but was unable to capitalize in falling 3-0.

Two days later, the Bulldogs jumped out to a quick lead in each of the three games and managed to hold off a furious Tiger rally each time. Following the losses, LSU held a 12-8 record, including a 7-4 SEC record.

With back-to-back matches against division-leader Arkansas

forthcoming, the Tigers needed a pair of wins to remain in the hunt for the division title. At home, LSU made quick work of the Lady Backs with a 3-0 win.

In the return match two days later at Fayetteville, Ark., the match was knotted at one game a piece before Arkansas took control and scored the 3-1 win.

The Tigers rebounded with a pair of wins at Alabama and at Auburn. LSU downed the Crimson Tide, 3-0, before beating Auburn by a 3-0 count for the second time. The two wins left the Tigers at 10-5 in the conference and gave them second place in the SEC West.

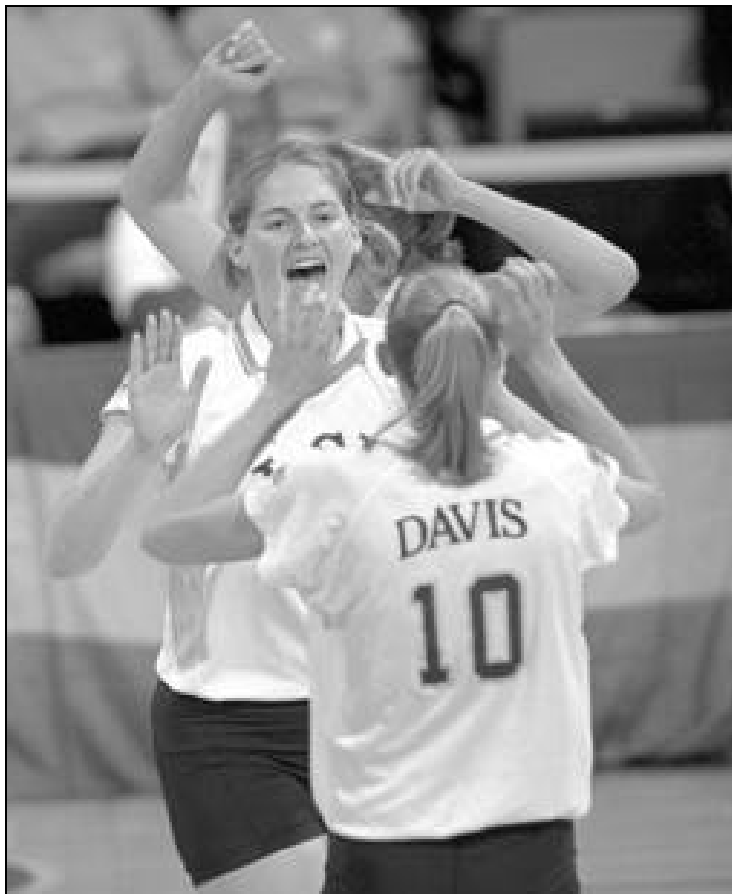
Heading into the SEC Tournament, the Tigers owned the No. 4 seed and were scheduled to face fifth-seeded Alabama for the third time in the first round.

This time, things would be different as the Crimson Tide battled for the five-game victory to advance to the second round of the tournament. The teams traded blows for each of the first four games before Alabama seized control of the match in game five.

A pair of matches remained in the Disney SEC/BIG EAST Challenge at Orlando, Fla., for the Tigers. LSU fell 3-0 to Notre Dame its first match before closing out the season with an impressive 3-1 victory over Virginia Tech.

The season netted many team milestones as the Tigers took yet another step on their way back to prominence in the SEC and the nation. LSU owned the best intra-division record of any SEC West team at 9-1 and solidified itself as a contender each year for the division crown.

A fourth-place finish in the conference was the Tigers' best in eight years while big wins over Tennessee and Arkansas gave LSU the respect it had looked to regain in the past five years.

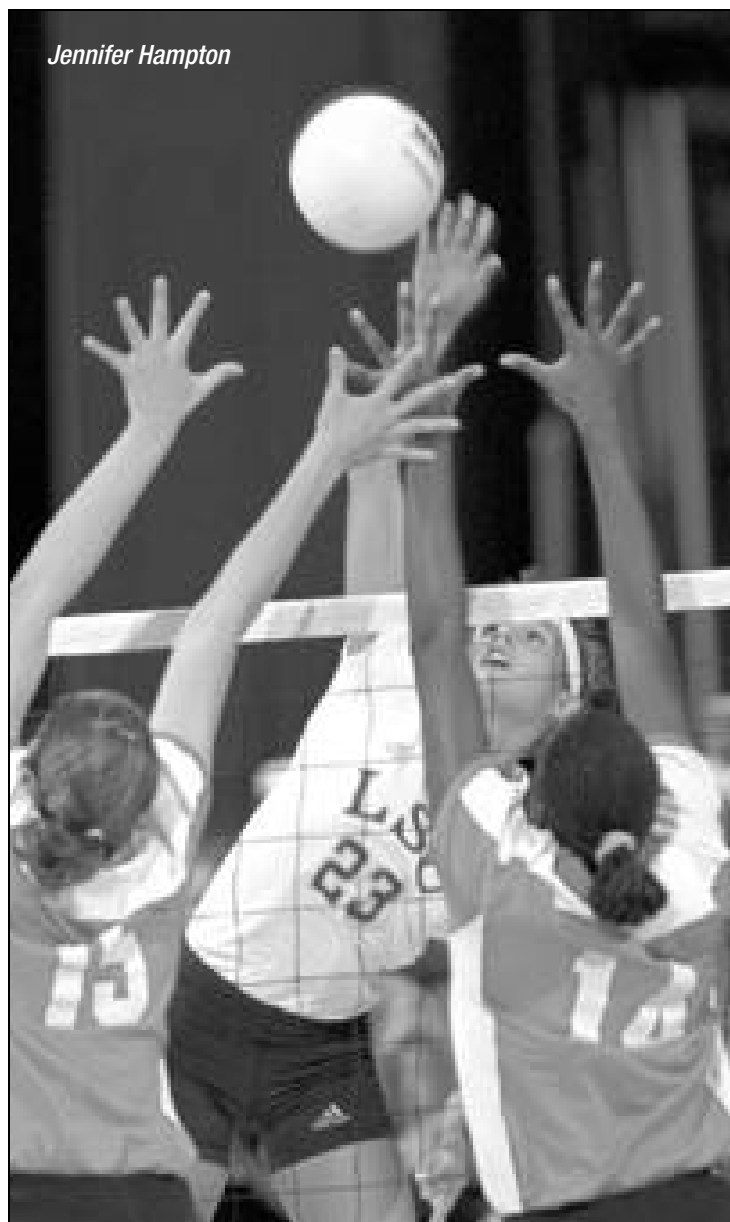

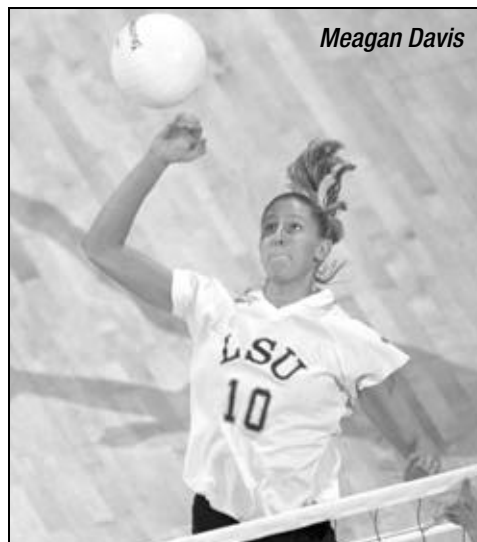

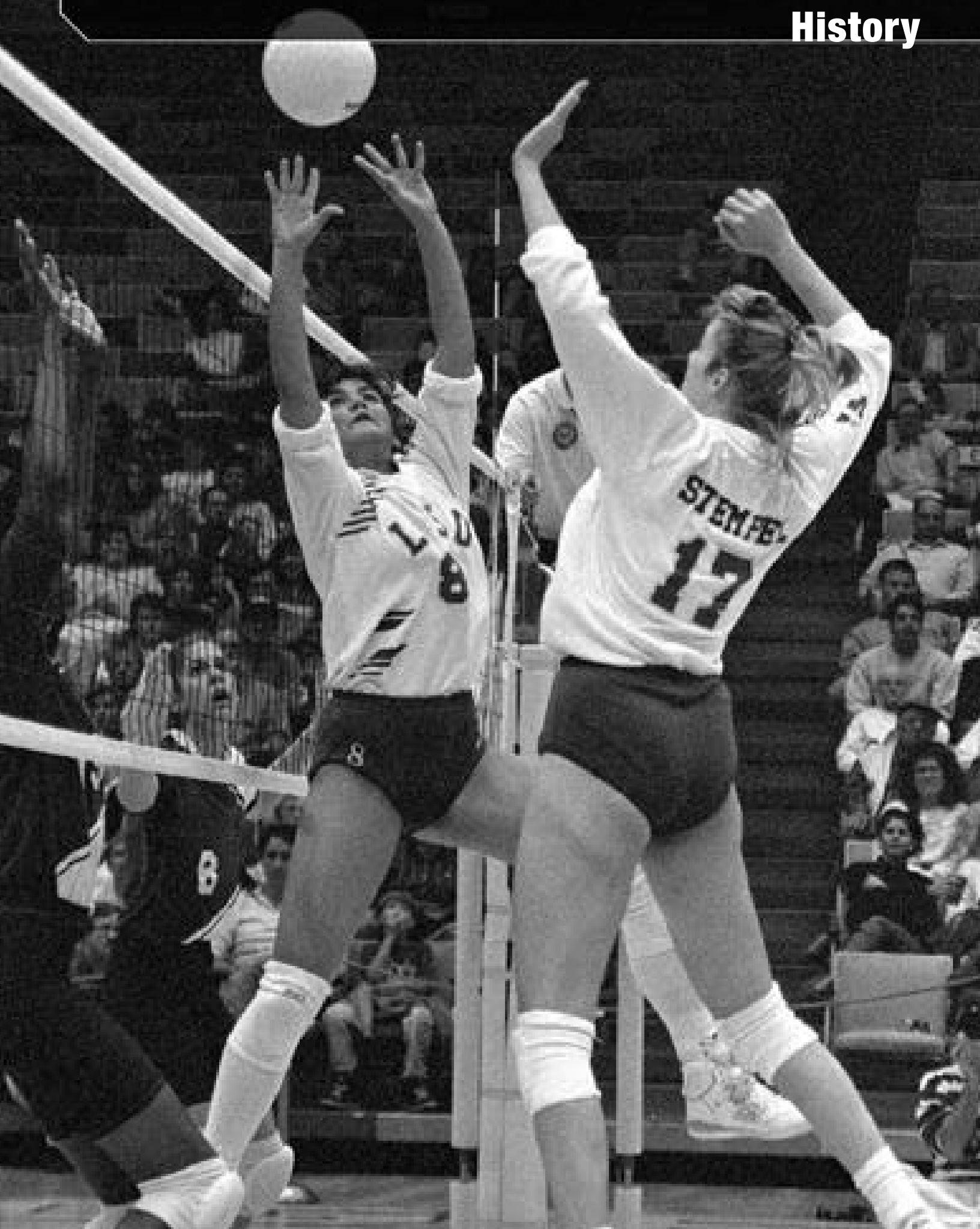

After sweeping Texas Tech, LSU ran into a Florida team that had handed the Tigers their only loss. A tough four-game victory later and LSU was back in the Final Four. This year in Los Angeles, Calif., the Tigers fell in four games to Long Beach State. The 1991 LSU team remains the only team from the SEC to win a game in the NCAA Final Four.



# 1992

LSU had to travel for its first round match for the first time since 1987, this time to Lubbock, Texas where the Tigers ousted Texas Tech from the tournament in just three games for the third consecutive year. At the South Regional in Gainesville, Fla., Texas knocked LSU out of the tournament in four games, ending hopes of a third straight Final Four appearance by the Tigers.

# 1993

For the first time since 1988 and only the second since 1985, LSU was left out of the NCAA Tournament. Despite not making the tournament, the Tigers showed why they deserved a bid by coasting to the NIVC Championship in Kansas City, Mo., by dropping only three games in the team's six tournament victories. LSU swept Baylor in the tournament final.

# Pete Maravich Assembly Center



The LSU volleyball program begins its 21st season in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, the largest volleyball venue in the Southeastern Conference.

The \$11.5 million structure, which was renamed in honor of the all-time LSU and NCAA men's basketball scoring leader on July 22, 1988, seats 14,164 spectators and ranks as one of the finest college athletic arenas in the nation.

Containing over one-and-a-quarter million square feet of space and over three million cubic feet, the PMAC competes with Tiger Stadium, home to LSU football, as the most visible structure on the LSU campus.

"The assembly center is a great place to play," LSU head coach Fran

Flory said. "It is a very volleyball friendly facility. In it we can create a great atmosphere for our student-athletes and for opposing teams."

Recently, the PMAC has undergone many renovations, the latest being a new portable wood floor which was added for the 2000-01 basketball season. In 2000, the arena was equipped with a brand new scoreboard and video screen that can be used for all sports.

In 1998, the Tiger volleyball team enjoyed the comforts of a newly renovated locker room. The two-tiered fully carpeted facility features individual cubicles for each athlete, a squad meeting room, and a storage area.

"I know we can provide an atmos-

phere which is a true home court advantage in the assembly center," added Flory. "I have seen it done before."

Between 1985 and 1992, the PMAC became one of the top home-court advantages in the nation as LSU ran up a 110-10 (.917) record in that span. Included in that time was a 37-match home-court win streak, which is the second-longest streak in Southeastern Conference history.

In 1991, LSU enjoyed possibly its finest season in the Assembly Center as the Tigers recorded a perfect 16-0 record. They also advanced to the Final Four through the NCAA South Regional which was held in Baton Rouge.

In 1999, the PMAC was once again a tough place for visiting teams to play as LSU notched a 8-4 mark at home en route to its first winning record in four years. The Tigers were even better at home a season ago, going 10-2 and holding a seven-match win streak at one point.

Overall since beginning play in the Assembly Center in 1982, the Tigers have notched an amazing 227-93 (.709) record. In that time, LSU has had a losing record at home in just three seasons.

The PMAC has often played host to SEC and NCAA Tournaments for volleyball as well as men's and women's basketball and gymnastics.

The 1982, 1987 and 1995 SEC Volleyball Championships were all held in the arena. The PMAC has also been the site of the three NCAA Volleyball Championship First Round Matches as well as the NCAA South Regional in 1991.

The NCAA Women's Basketball First/Second Rounds in 1997, 1999 and 2000, as well as the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament in 1988 were also hosted in the arena. The SEC Gymnastics Championships came to the PMAC in 1999. Most recently, the 2002 NCAA Central Regional for gymnastics was held at the PMAC.

Along with the main court area, an auxiliary gym with a recently refinished court, is located underground in the north section of the arena. Nearly all Tiger volleyball practices take place in the auxiliary gym.

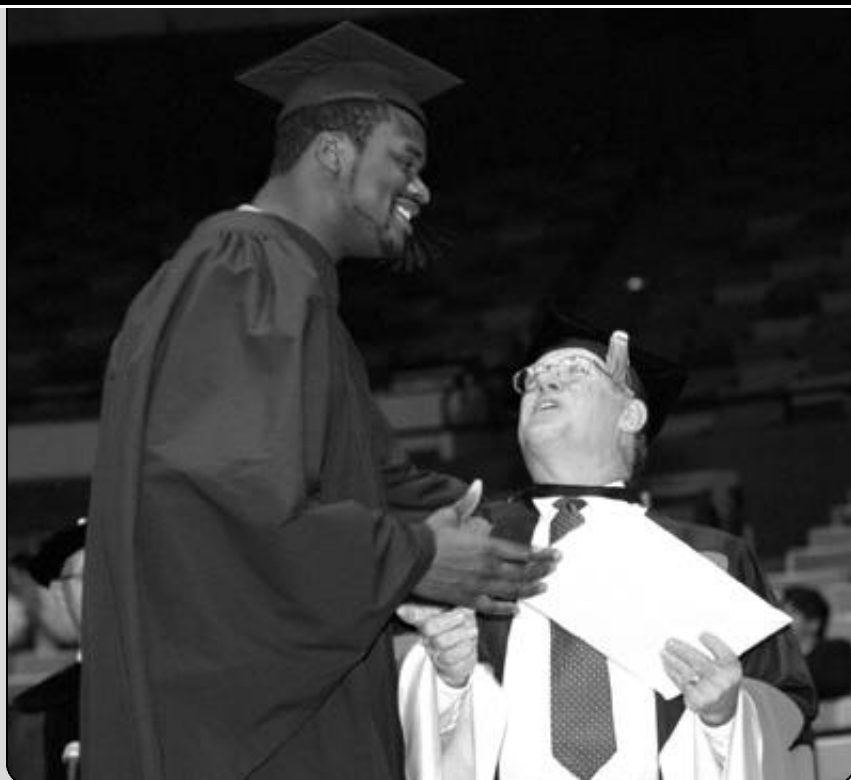

## Campus Life

Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College has, throughout its 141-year history, served the people of Louisiana, the region, the nation, and the world through extensive multipurpose programs encompassing instruction, research, and public service. The University continuously develops programs of quality that make it one of the nation's outstanding educational institutions.

The University influences the educational, economic, social, and cultural lives of citizens throughout the state - in some way, it touches the life of every person in Louisiana.

Because of its designation as a Research University I - the top category of the Carnegie Foundation's ranking of research institutions - LSU ranks in the top two percent of the nation's colleges and



universities. The Research I designation is shared by only 59 public and 29 private universities in the country. One of only 25 universities nationwide designated as both a land-grant and sea-grant college, LSU is also actively pursuing space-grant status.

History and tradition began with LSU's founding in 1853 by the General Assembly of Louisiana as the Louisiana State Seminary of Learning and Military Academy near Pineville, Louisiana. The institution opened Jan. 2, 1860. When the Civil War began, the first superintendent, William Tecumseh Sherman, resigned to assume a command in the Union Army. Fire demolished the Seminary in 1869, and the school moved to Baton Rouge.

In 1870, the Seminary was renamed Louisiana State University. In 1874, under the United States Morrill Act, the Louisiana State Agricultural & Mechanical College was established in New Orleans. The two institutions were merged by the Legislature in 1877 to become Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College.

Construction of the present campus began in 1922, and the first

classes were held in 1926. LSU experienced major growth in the 1930s and 1940s, expanding its student body, curricula, and services. During the 1960s, the University began to place increasing emphasis on research.

Recognizing the importance and extent of statewide agricultural activities of units in the LSU System, the LSU Board of Supervisors in

1972 established the Center for Agricultural Sciences & Rural Development. This unit was renamed the LSU Agricultural Center in 1982. Components of the LSU Agricultural Center include the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, International Programs, and Administrative Services.

In 1977, the Paul M. Hebert Law Center, established as the LSU Law School in 1906, was made an autonomous division of the LSU System. It provides a legal education characterized by an unyielding demand for academic excellence. Its unique curriculum, based on civil law and substantial elements of common law, provides law graduates with qualifications and training for not one, but two legal systems.

LSU, located on more than 2,000 acres in the southern part of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, is bordered on the west by the Mississippi River. The University's more than 250 principal buildings are grouped on a 650-acre plateau that constitutes the main part of the campus.

LSU is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. The Hebert Law Center is a member of the Association of American Law Schools and is on the approved list of the American Bar Association.



## The city of Baton Rouge

## Volleyball at the PMAC

**T**he Pete Maravich Assembly Center, which seats 14,164 people, is the largest volleyball venue in the Southeastern Conference. LSU has been able to use the PMAC as a great home court advantage since beginning play



there in 1982. In that time, the Tigers have amassed an incredible 227-93 (.709) record at home. Twice in the last 20 years, LSU has put together an undefeated season in the Assembly Center. In addition, the Tigers have produced home winning streaks of 37 and 30. Just last year, LSU opened the home slate with a seven-match streak before finally succumbing to Florida late in October.

The PMAC has hosted six NCAA Volleyball Tournament matches, including the 1991 South Regional which LSU won to advance to the Final Four. In the north end of the facility, there is an underground auxiliary gym, which provides the LSU volleyball team with its own practice facility. The PMAC also boasts a volleyball locker room which was recently renovated and has a player's lounge along with locker's for each athlete.





## Locker Room

The LSU locker room is located in the northwest corner of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, directly between the playing floor of the PMAC and the auxiliary gym, which serves as the Tigers practice facility. The locker room, a two-tiered facility which is equipped with a players lounge, was remodeled prior to the 2000 season and has locker space for each athlete.





## Auxiliary Gym

The LSU volleyball team has the luxury of its very own practice facility in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. Located underground in the north portion of the arena, the auxiliary gym provides the Tigers with an area that can hold two volleyball courts side-by-side. The auxiliary gym is located just down the stairs from the LSU locker room.





## Weight Room

The LSU strength and conditioning facility, located in the North end zone of Tiger Stadium, was built in 1997 and features the latest in both strength training and cardiovascular equipment. Measuring 10,000-square feet, LSU has one of the finest strength and conditioning facilities in the nation.





## Training Room

LSU boasts the largest and most complete athletic training facility in all of collegiate athletics. Focused on aggressive rehabilitation, the Broussard Center for Athletic Training is furnished with the latest in technology and equipment. Some of the features of the 23,000-square foot facility include an on-site x-ray room, an in-house pharmacy, as well as state of the art hydrotherapy pools. The Broussard Center for Athletic Training is equipped with the largest hydrotherapy pools in

both collegiate and professional sports and is one of the few collegiate training centers with a full-service pharmacy, as well as on-site x-ray room. LSU is

also the only school in college athletics with a training room equipped with a full-service vision center. The facility is named in honor of legendary trainer Dr. Martin J. Broussard, who served as LSU's athletic trainer for several decades.

## SEC Volleyball

### A STANDARD OF EXCELLENCE

- The 2001 season marked the 12th consecutive year the SEC has placed at least two teams in the NCAA Tournament.
- Four of the league's 11 teams posted 20-plus wins in 2001 while six recorded winning records. Florida led the way with 28 victories, while Alabama was right behind with 22. Arkansas and South Carolina notched 21 and 20, respectively.
- Florida made its 12th NCAA appearance and 11th in a row in 2001 advancing to the Regional Final.
- Ten players were named to the AVCA All-District team in 2001.
- In the past 12 years, 597 athletes have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

## Southeastern Conference

Year after year, the Southeastern Conference shows why it is considered to be one of the premier volleyball conferences in the nation.

In the decade of the 1990s, the SEC made stellar contributions to volleyball. The conference has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in every season for the last 12 years. The SEC had a team reach the Final Four seven of the 10 seasons in the '90s with the league having a team advance to the regional final nine of those 10 seasons.

In 2001, Florida competed in its 11th straight NCAA Tournament and made it to the Regional Finals. South Carolina and Arkansas were also selected to the NCAA field in 2001, as both teams made their fifth NCAA Tournament Appearances.

Since the inaugural SEC volleyball championship in 1979-80, many changes have occurred in the conference. The addition of

Arkansas and South Carolina to the league in 1991 brought the divisional format to the sport with five teams competing in the Eastern Division and six teams in the Western Division. The most recent change came in 1999 as the tournament format now features only eight teams participating in a three-day conference tournament.



Along with the popularity growth throughout the country, women's volleyball has also grown in the SEC. A benchmark in that growth came in 1995 when SEC volleyball was first broadcasted on SEC-TV (FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and Sunshine Network) on a tape-delay basis. For the past five seasons the coverage has grown, especially in the last two years, to live telecasts of several regular season matches and the SEC Tournament championship match. SEC volleyball will continue to enjoy live coverage on SEC-TV in 2002, reaching almost 19 million subscribers in the conference's nine-state region.

## The BERTMAN Legacy

Bertman's unyielding desire to succeed drove him to the pinnacle of his profession, and his astute knowledge of the game -- obtained from over 40 years of coaching -- combined with his steadfast determination and irrepressible enthusiasm transformed LSU Baseball into the nation's premier program.

## Director of Athletics

Already a Louisiana Legend and one of the greatest college baseball coaches of all time, J. Stanley "Skip" Bertman augmented his impressive list of achievements in his first season as LSU's director of athletics. While supervising the Tigers' magnificent progress on the playing fields, he began to implement measures necessary to realize his vision of building the LSU athletics department into the best in the country. Bertman's bold and innovative plans promise to keep the Tigers among the nation's elite in all phases of collegiate athletics.

LSU's programs enjoyed remarkable success under Bertman's direction in 2001-02, as 18 of the Tigers' 20 sports participated in post-season competition. That accomplishment, along with improved graduation rates, increased team grade point averages and the construction of new academic facilities, foreshadow even more significant deeds in the second season of Bertman's tenure.

Bertman was named LSU's athletics director on January 19, 2001. With Bertman, LSU gained an athletics director who provides the leadership and experience necessary to manage the Tigers' nearly \$35 million budget.

Bertman guided LSU to five NCAA baseball titles, and his teams drew huge crowds to venerable Alex Box Stadium, as the Tigers led the nation in attendance in each of his final six seasons (1996-2001).

He also served as head coach of the 1996 U.S. Olympic team which captured the bronze medal in Atlanta.

Bertman continues to be honored for his remarkable coaching

tenure, as he was inducted in June, 2002, into the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame. He is scheduled to be inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January, 2003.

In a Baseball America poll released in January, 1999, Bertman was voted the second greatest college baseball coach of the 20th century, trailing only Rod Dedeaux of Southern California. Bertman and Dedeaux are the only coaches to win five CWS titles.

He had previously earned stellar recognition as one of the nation's brightest assistant coaches while at the University of Miami (Fla.) for eight seasons (1976-83). Before working at Miami, Bertman was renowned for his coaching excellence. In 11 seasons at Miami Beach High School, he directed the Hi-Tides to a state championship and two runners-up finishes. He was named Florida's Coach of the Year on three occasions.

In 1975, Bertman coached at Miami-Dade Downtown, leaving after one season to join legendary head coach Ron Fraser at Miami. The move was a homecoming of sorts, as Bertman spent his collegiate playing days with the Hurricanes as an outfielder and catcher from 1958-60. He earned his B.A. in health and physical education from Miami in 1961 and received his master's degree from UM in 1964.

Bertman and his wife Sandy are the parents of four daughters -- Jan, Jodi, Lisa and Lori. The Bertmans have two grandchildren -- Sophie Faith and Isaac Stanley, the children of Emile and Lori Bertman Guirard.

# University Administration

## Dr. William L. Jenkins

*President, LSU System*

On April 1, 1999, Dr. William L. Jenkins, formerly Chancellor of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, became President of the LSU System, which includes nine institutions on 10 campuses in five cities as well as 10 public hospitals in 10 cities.

A native of South Africa, Dr. Jenkins studied at the University of Pretoria, where he received his professional veterinary medicine degree in 1958 and specialist credentials in 1968. He received his Ph.D. degree from the University of Missouri in Columbia in 1970. After practicing veterinary medicine for four years, he joined the faculty at the University of Pretoria, advancing through the ranks to become professor and head of the Department of Veterinary Physiology, Pharmacology and Toxicology in 1971.

He moved to the United States in 1978 and joined the faculty in the Department of Veterinary Physiology and Pharmacology at Texas A&M University. He was appointed dean of the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine in 1988 and was named LSU's provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs in September 1993.

When he was appointed LSU's fifth Chancellor in November 1996, Dr. Jenkins reorganized the campus administration to be more effective and more responsive, and oversaw the development of a strategic plan to guide the University in its preparation for the challenges of the next century.

Over the years President Jenkins has received numerous teaching and service awards and recognitions, having been named the 1997 Communicator of the Year by the Public Relations Association of Louisiana and a Distinguished Alumnus by the



University of Missouri. The regional chapter of Toastmasters International also presented him with its 1999 Communication and Leadership Award, and he was awarded the Vision of Excellence Award 2000 by the New Orleans Regional Chamber of Commerce and the New Orleans Chapter of MetroVision. In addition, the University of Pretoria bestowed an Honorary Doctorate on Dr. Jenkins in September of 2000.

Dr. Jenkins has been active in continuing education and has delivered more than 150 lectures and addresses to diverse groups in both the United States and abroad. He has taught extensively at both the professional and graduate levels. He has published more than 60 scientific articles and has contributed 15 chapters to various textbooks. He is co-author of a textbook on veterinary pharmacology.

Over the years, Dr. Jenkins has been a member of many professional organizations and select committees. Most recently, he served on the National Institute of Health's Alcohol Abuse and Misuse on College Campuses Committee and on a special Steering Committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to review accreditation criteria for colleges and universities. Dr. Jenkins also is a member of the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges' Committee on Food and Society as well as the Committee on the Future of Coastal Louisiana.

His current community engagement includes serving on the boards of the Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities, Greater Baton Rouge Chamber of Commerce, Academic Distinction Fund, Council for a Better Louisiana, Arts Council of Greater Baton Rouge, and the Baton Rouge board of the National Conference for Community and Justice.

Dr. Jenkins and his wife, Peggy, have four children – Sharon, Gwynn, Anthea, and Warren – and nine grandchildren.



## Dr. Mark A. Emmert

*Chancellor, LSU*

Dr. Mark A. Emmert was appointed chancellor of Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College on April 16, 1999, becoming the sixth chancellor to lead the state's flagship University.

Prior to joining LSU, Emmert served as chancellor of the University of Connecticut, as provost and vice president for academic affairs at Montana State University, and held various faculty and administrative positions at the University of Colorado. He has served as a member of numerous academic and civic boards and organizations.

Both the Fulbright Commission and the American Council on

Education have awarded fellowships to Emmert. He has also been inducted into Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society, Alpha Lambda Delta Scholastic Society, Golden Key Honor Society, and the Connecticut Academy of Arts and Sciences. He is active in the American Council on Education, the New England Council of Presidents, and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges, where he served as chair of the Council on Academic Affairs.

A native of Tacoma, Washington, Emmert holds a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Washington and master's and doctoral degrees from the Maxwell School of Syracuse University. His scholarly work has focused on public policy topics, as well as issues in organizational theory. He has published his research in leading journals within his field and has served on several editorial boards. He has also served as a visiting scholar and lecturer internationally, working in Australia, Hong Kong, Japan, and Panama.

He is married to DeLaine S. Emmert, a former elementary school teacher, who is active in community, university, and philanthropic organizations. They have two children, Stephen and Jennifer.
