# PREVIEW





## TOGETHER AS ONE

**A**s the saying goes, "There is no 'I' in team." For LSU volleyball in 2003, that statement rings true. After losing five senior starters from last season, the Tigers return a squad without a senior and with no proven leader, but their dedication to each other more than compensates for their lack of experience. As a team, they will work together to once again battle for the Southeastern Conference Western Division title and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

"This is a very close knit group," said head coach Fran Flory. "They are devoted and committed to the team and to each other and not to themselves. I think this will be the least selfish group I have ever coached."

With four returning juniors, a pair of sophomores and two redshirt freshmen, LSU is a young, hungry team this season. With the addition of six talented true freshmen, LSU will be an exciting team to watch.

"We are athletic and, although we are very young and are going to take some knocks early because of our schedule, I think our learning curve is going to go up really fast," said Flory. "I think we are going to surprise some people who don't expect us to be as physical as we are."

"We are going to run a faster offense. We are going to be very dynamic and we are going to be fun to watch. The kids are going to have fun because they want to be successful and they really worked hard throughout the spring and summer."

### MIDDLE BLOCKER

The Tigers return a pair of outstanding middle blockers in Regan Hood and Cara Causey in 2003. Both garnered All-Louisiana honors last season and should anchor the LSU defense this season.

In her sophomore campaign a year ago, Hood led the team in block solos, block assists and total blocks. An impact

player, she has a dominating presence in the middle and has become more versatile this year. She will also see considerable playing time at outside hitter.

"Regan has developed into a true impact player as a middle or an outside and we are going to use her at both," said Flory. "She understands what is expected of her. Last year she was young and inexperienced and now she is going to be one of the most experienced players on the team. She'll have to develop into a leader for us."

Causey led the team and ranked in the top 10 in the SEC in blocks per game. A starter as a freshman, she earned second-team All-Louisiana honors and was named to the Florida State Invitational all-tournament team. With an excellent spring, Causey increased her ball control ability and should have a productive sophomore campaign.

"Cara is a very disciplined player and will create many opportunities for us," said Flory. "Her blocking is a real factor now. She enjoyed a successful offensive freshman year but we need her to be more defensive minded while keeping up her offensive pace."

One of the smartest and most versatile players on the team, Megan Heinz returns for her sophomore season. After limited action her first year, she will see increased playing time and will be called upon to be more of a force for the Tigers.

"Megan has a great feel for the rally scoring game," said Flory. "She made a great transition, probably better than most of the members of the team. She is a very balanced player and one that you may not notice until you look at the scorebook and see just how significant she was."

A pair of freshman round out the Tiger middle blockers. Vanessa Freeman is a tremendous athlete but lacks some of the experience of the other newcomers because she did not





play club ball. A very intelligent player, Melody Clark brings in both experience and a great understanding of the game.

"Vanessa is a fast, dynamic player," said Flory. "It will take her a little time to move into the style of play and the intensity of play on the collegiate level, but she should challenge for time on the court once SEC play begins.

"A sought after athlete, Melody has a great feel for the game. She truly understands how to be successful."

#### OUTSIDE HITTER

As Hood and Heinz both split time between middle blocker and outside hitter, the Tigers will look to several new faces on the outside. Redshirt freshman Markeisha Constant should make an immediate impact for LSU. Despite her lack of experience, she has great put-away ability and just needs some time on the court to prove herself.

"After redshirting a year, Markeisha is going to be a great player for us," said Flory. "She is a terminating player with both her blocking and hitting and those are the roles that she will fill. She's going to be a big factor for us in terms of our success this season."

Another redshirt freshman, Christie Ruttlely will also make an impact for the Tigers. Her attitude and spirit help drive the team to succeed.

"She's one of those that, behind the scenes, makes your team go," said Flory. "People may not know all that she means to the team but she means a tremendous amount both on and off the court. Those are the people that are invaluable."

LSU brings in a trio of hitters this season that are all tough competitors and proven fighters. Kassi Mikulik has won in everything she has ever competed and should make an immediate impact on this team. Lauren Leaumont joins the team after a year away from volleyball. She is well trained and highly developed, while walk-on Lacey Galliano is a tremendous person that has all the tools to be successful at the collegiate level.

"Kassi is a tremendous athlete and she's going to challenge for playing time right off the bat," said Flory. "She may be small in stature, but she's big in heart and big in drive."

"Lauren is a mature player and brings another highly competitive person to the team. She knows that winning is important and will fight you for anything. She is also a local kid and is going to bring a nice Louisiana attitude to the team. Also a great local talent, Lacey needs to develop more as a player, but has the tools to make the transition to this level very well."

#### SETTER

With the loss of three-year starter Katie Kubena, junior Beth Cowley was primed to step into the role of starting setter until an offseason injury sidelined her this spring. Cowley is recovering from wrist surgery and should return to the court once SEC play begins. Despite limited action, she made great strides offensively during the spring.

"Beth came a long way in learning to run an offense this spring but unfortunately was unable to be on the court," said Flory. "She will be limited in the beginning of the season, but we look to have her back at the start of SEC play."

With Cowley injured, freshman Daniela Romero will be forced to come in and start immediately for the Tigers. Having played a lot longer than most of the players in the

program, she is going to have a significant impact on the team from the start.

"Daniela is a very savvy player," said Flory. "She's a true volleyball player and then an athlete, but she's also a tremendous athlete. She will have a great grasp of running the offense and running the team."

#### LIBERO/DEFENSIVE SPECIALIST

Despite losing last season's starter, the Tigers return a pair of experienced liberos in 2003. Junior Rachel Pittman dramatically increased her ball control ability during the spring and LSU should not feel a defensive loss this season.

"The true libero, Rachel is feisty, competitive, and will fight for anything," said Flory. "I look for her to be very significant in winning games and matches for us."

Becoming more of a factor for the Tigers in the spring, junior Blaise DeRouen increased her defensive range and her reading ability

"Blaise has great passing ability," said Flory. "She always seems to be the one making the big play and that's the knack of a great player."

#### SCHEDULE

This season the LSU faces one of the most challenging schedules in years. With two of last season's NCAA Final Four teams and five nationally ranked opponents topping the field, the Tiger have their work cut out for them.

"We chose to play a really tough schedule," said Flory. "Our goal is to play for a championship. Every time we step on the court we should create the opportunity to do that. I think that the schedule we are playing this year will afford us that opportunity."

"With a young team we have everything to gain and nothing to lose to step out on the court against the best in the country. We are just going to go out and play hard and see what happens. That's why we play the game. I am excited and I think we are going to get some

people."

Just five games into the season, the Tigers will be tested with a match against 2002 NCAA Regional Finalist Nebraska in the Sugar Bowl Classic.

LSU will face its toughest challenge at the Wildcat Classic, where the Tigers will take on a trio of 2002 NCAA Tournament participants. LSU will face Kansas State and South Florida, which both advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, and Colorado State, which concluded its season in the first round of the tournament.

A non-conference match against Hawaii is the Tigers' only break from conference action the remainder of the season. The Wahine participated in the 2002 Final Four and were ranked No. 3 in the final poll.

"We are playing Nebraska, Florida, Hawaii, Kansas State and Colorado State," said Flory. "We may very well play three of the top five teams in the country this year. I think this schedule will afford us the opportunity to be very prepared for SEC play."

The SEC schedule proves to be tough for LSU as the Tigers go on the road against Florida, which finished the season ranked No. 4 and advanced to the Final Four. LSU will also play a pair of matches against divisional rival Arkansas and South Carolina, which advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament last season.

# Fran Flory

**HEAD COACH**  
**Sixth Season**

**E**ntering her sixth year at the helm of the Tigers, coach Fran Flory continues to raise the level of success of the

LSU volleyball program and break down barriers that have plagued the Tigers for the past decade.

Last season, Flory's Tiger team recorded the most wins by any LSU team since posting 17 wins during the 1999 season. The Tigers also picked up back-to-back winning Southeastern Conference records for the first time since 1992-93. With that came back-to-back runner-up finishes in the SEC Western Division.

While finishing fourth overall in the league with a 17-11 overall record, the Tigers had their best inning percentage in eight years. She also coached Jennifer Hampton to back-to-back All-SEC honors, as the senior was named to the second team. In her five years, Flory has now coached

eight all-conference players, including three first-teamers.

LSU became the first team in 19 regular-season SEC matches to take a game from nationally ranked Florida, winning game one. Prior to the game one loss, the Gators last lost a game on Sept. 21, 2001, when they fell behind 2-0 in an eventual 3-2 win over South Carolina in Columbia, S.C. Florida had not lost a regular-season SEC game at home since dropping the third game to the Gamecocks in a 3-1 win on Oct. 8 2000, a string of 12 consecutive matches.

However, her success has not solely on the court. LSU has had the players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll of any school in the league during her tenure. In each of the past five seasons, the Tigers have led the conference.

The LSU volleyball program has also been recognized nationally for its academic success, picking up an American Volleyball Coaches Association Academic Award in three of the last four years.

In 2001, the Tigers recorded the third most conference wins in season history and picked up its first winning conference season since 1995, finishing second in the SEC Western Division. LSU owned the best intra-division record among Western Division teams at 9-1 while finishing fourth overall in the conference.

Flory guided her 2000 squad to the SEC Tournament Championship match against perennial-powerhouse Florida. Despite the loss in the final, LSU had made a breakthrough as it had not been to the championship match since 1992 and had not won a tournament match since 1993.

Flory's 2000 team also became the first LSU team to beat Arkansas when it did so in three games on the Lady'Backs' home floor. She led the Tigers to their first win at Auburn in 10 years en route to a third place finish in the SEC Western Division.

She made an immediate impact at LSU in 1998 as she led the Tigers to a 15-16 record, six games better than the 9-21 mark the team had the year before. More impressive was the five-match improvement in SEC play. After a win-

less 1997 in conference action, LSU notched five conference victories in 1998 to finish third in the West.

In 1999, Flory led her injury-riddled squad to a 17-15 overall record, the best for an LSU team since the Tigers won 20 matches in 1995. Of the 17 wins, seven came in conference play, also a Tiger best since the 1995 season.

This is Flory's second stint at LSU as the Baton Rouge native was an assistant for four years under LSU's winningest coach, Scott Luster. She served as a graduate assistant coach in 1988, before being named a full-time assistant in 1989. During her four seasons as a member of the Tiger coaching staff, Flory helped LSU to unprecedented success with three SEC championships, three SEC Tournament championships and two Final Four appearances.

After winning the first of the three consecutive conference championships in 1989, Flory and the Tigers became the first school in SEC history to advance to the NCAA Final Four in 1990. The Tigers would duplicate the Final Four feat in 1991, while earning conference titles in both seasons. The 1991 team was the only SEC team to win a game in the Final Four until Florida in 2002.

In 1992, Flory left LSU to assume the head coaching duties at Southeastern Louisiana. In her first season as a Division I head coach, she led the Lions to a 21-13 record. In March 1993, Flory returned to the SEC as she became an assistant coach at Kentucky. Five months later, she was named the Wildcats head coach as then-Kentucky coach Kathy DeBoer was named an Associate Athletic Director at the school.

In her first season at Kentucky, Flory led the Wildcats to a 29-4 record, while advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. For her efforts in the 1993 season, she was named the Tachikara/AVCA Region IV Coach of the Year.

A 1984 graduate of Texas, Flory has also experienced much success as a player. In 1981, she was a member of Texas' AIAW National Championship squad. She received All-Southwest Conference and All-South Region honors during three seasons with the Longhorns.

Following her playing career, Flory was named the head coach at Wittenberg University, where she coached for one season before being named an assistant at Texas A&M for the 1987 season.

A member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, Flory has also assisted in coordinating both the Louisiana Senior Olympic Games and the Special Olympics, and hosting the Senior Olympic Games in 2001. She is also a member of the United States Volleyball Association coaching accreditation program.

She is married to Ken Flory. The two have a daughter, Lindsay (6), and a son, Nicholas (4).

**ASSISTANT COACH**  
**First Season**

Darrell McLean enters his first season as an assistant coach under Fran Flory for the Tiger volleyball program.

He joins the staff after five seasons as the top assistant coach at Cincinnati, where he had proven himself as a recruiter and a valuable part of the Bearcat staff.

McLean joined the UC staff in 1998 and was primarily responsible for recruiting, practice planning and scouting.

His innovative and creative coaching techniques helped the Bearcats to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Conference USA championships.

McLean was instrumental in signing three C-USA Freshmen of the Year and members of UC's recruiting classes during his time garnered eight first team all-conference nods.

Along with Cincinnati head coach Reed Sunahara, McLean spent two weeks in the spring of 2001 coaching a group of collegiate seniors on a trip through Spain and Portugal as part of a showcase for American players looking to continue their volleyball careers overseas.

Prior to joining the Bearcat staff, McLean spent two seasons as an assistant at Xavier and six years as head coach at Thomas More College.

At Xavier, McLean's primary duties included practice planning, on-court training, scouting, scheduling and recruiting. He helped the Musketeers to a 34-31 record, including a 21-14 mark in 1996.

McLean's years at Thomas More produced an impressive resume, building a perennial national power from scratch.

McLean took over a team that won 13 matches in three years and turned it into a 35-match winner in one season. The team qualified for five-consecutive NCAA Division III tournaments and recorded a 205-75 mark (.732) in his six seasons. For his efforts he was named the 1991 and 1992 American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) South Region's Coach of the Year.

McLean coached four Division III All-Americans, 16 AVCA all-region, 19 all-conference selections and four conference player of the year honorees at Thomas More.

McLean, 59, had equal success at the high school level, coaching the Elder High School boy's team to a 56-29 record in three seasons, including consecutive regional semifinals.

A retired Cincinnati firefighter of 24 years, McLean and his wife, Veda, have a son, Dennis, and three grandchildren, Katelyn, Mitchell and Madison Rose.

Danijela Tomic begins her first season with the Tiger volleyball program after eight seasons at Arkansas-Little Rock as both a player and a coach.

An assistant at Arkansas-Little Rock for four years, also spent two seasons as a player and two as a student assistant with the Trojans before taking the assistant coaches position in 1999. At UALR, she was involved in practice planning, recruiting, game strategy and on-the-floor coaching.

The native of Kakanj, Bosnia-Herzegovina, was critical in the recruitment of several foreign athletes to the Arkansas-Little Rock program that aided in their success over the years.

The first foreign athlete to play volleyball for the Trojans, she was followed by four players who combined to earn five All-Sun Belt Conference honors, three All-SBC Tournament MVP honors, a conference Freshman of the Year honor and an all-tournament selection.

In all during her tenure as a student assistant and assistant coach, she helped coach 14 all-conference selections, two Sun Belt Players of the Year and two Sun Belt Freshman of the Year. Last season, she coached the NCAA statistical leader in blocks per game.

In 2000, she helped guide Arkansas-Little Rock to its third Sun Belt regular season title and its fourth conference tournament championship, advancing to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in five seasons.

After joining the coaching staff in 1997 as a student assistant, Tomic helped UALR to its first Sun Belt championship as the Trojans also advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

In two seasons as a player, Tomic was selected to the All-SBC second team and named to the All-SBC Tournament team twice. She also was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player in 1996 as the Trojans captured their first tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

As an outside hitter and setter, she recorded over 500 digs, almost 500 kills, over 300 assists, over 100 blocks and almost 100 service aces in just two seasons while maintaining a .264 hitting percentage. She remains ranked in the top 10 in eight of the nine UALR career statistical categories.

She currently holds the Sun Belt record for most digs in a conference tournament four-game match at 32, set during the championship match of the 1996 tournament.

Tomic graduated from Arkansas-Little Rock in 1997 with a degree in health education.

# RISING TO THE TOP

***With one of the best seasons in nearly a decade, the LSU volleyball program continued its rise to the top of the Southeastern Conference in 2002.***

In 2002 the LSU volleyball program posted its best winning percentage in seven years, continuing its rise into the upper echelon of the Southeastern Conference. With a 17-11 record, the Tigers also matched the 1999 team for the most single-season victories in that same period.

Picked to finish third in the Western Division by the league's coaches in the preseason, LSU bested that prediction with a runner-up showing for the second-straight year. With fourth-place overall league finishes in both 2001 and 2002, the Tigers recorded their highest back-to-back conference rankings since the 1992-1993 seasons.

LSU finished with consecutive winning records in league play for the first time in nine years, recording a 9-7 mark, and again showed just how far the program had come in the five years since going winless in league play.

For the second-straight year, Jennifer Hampton earned second-team All-SEC and first-team All-Louisiana honors. The senior led the team in kills and digs and became one of just four players in school history to record over 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs. In addition, she was named the SEC Player of the Week on Nov. 5 after leading the Tigers to key wins over Auburn and Alabama.

Freshman Cara Causey earned second-team All-Louisiana honors after leading the team in blocks per game. Sophomore Regan Hood also picked up honorable mention All-Louisiana honors. She led the team in block solos, block assists and total blocks.

Once again the Tigers shined in the classroom as a league-high 12 players were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Lauren Cuyler, Beth Cowley, Blaise DeRouen, Hampton, Regan Hood, Katie Kubena, Kyra Lancon, and Rachel Pittman were all named to the honor roll while former Tigers, Meghan Bedford, Lyndsey Benson, Meagan Davis and Addie Prewitt, also made the list.

In addition, Cuyler, a May 2001 magna cum laude management degree graduate with a 3.80 undergraduate grade point average, was named to the Verizon Academic All-America third team. She played her senior season while pursuing a graduate degree in LSU's prestigious MBA program.

LSU began the 2002 season on a roll, winning five of its first six matches. The Tigers swept Texas-San Antonio and Alcorn State to open the season at the Texas A&M Invitational before falling to the 17th-ranked Aggies, 3-2, in the tournament's final match. LSU stormed out to the early 2-0 lead before Texas A&M mounted a dramatic comeback to defeat the Tigers.



LSU then went on to claim the Sugar Bowl Classic title with wins over in-state rivals Louisiana Tech, New Orleans and Tulane. Hampton earned Most Valuable Player honors after recording 59 kills with 40 digs, five aces, eight blocks and a .304 attacking percentage in the three matches. Cuyler and Kubena were also named to the all-tournament team. Cuyler led the team with a .370 hitting percentage, while Kubena led the team with 10.7 assists per game. She recorded nine services aces, including a season-high five against Louisiana Tech.

In their home debut, the Tigers lost a heartbreaker to Florida A&M, 3-2, before hitting the road again. At the Florida State Invitational, LSU swept Brown before dropping a five-game decision to Florida State. Against the Seminoles, the Tigers hit at a .347 clip as a team, a mark that ranks second in school history in five-game matches. LSU closed out the tournament with a 3-1 win over in-state rival UL-Lafayette. Topping the .347 hitting percentage against Florida State, the Tigers posted a .352 mark against the Lady Cajuns to rank ninth among four-game matches in LSU history.

Causey and Hampton went on to earn all-tournament honors at the FSU Invitational. Causey recorded 30 kills and a .500 hitting percentage in matches against Brown and UL-Lafayette. Hampton led the team with 45 kills, 32 digs and three solo blocks in the Tigers' three matches.

LSU opened conference play at home against division rival Arkansas. After winning the first game, however, the Tigers lost a hard-fought 3-1 decision. Just two days later, LSU rebounded with a decisive 3-0 victory over Tennessee on SEC-TV.

The Tigers then stepped out of league play for a rematch with New Orleans. LSU swept the Privateers in the New Orleans Arena, 3-0.

Returning to conference play, LSU lost back-to-back matches to South Carolina at home and Alabama on the road. The loss to the Crimson Tide ended the Tigers' 14-match first-game winning streak. LSU had won the first game in every match before being swept by Alabama in Tuscaloosa.

The Tigers stormed back to a 3-0 win over Auburn before taking on third-ranked Florida. Although LSU lost the match 3-1, the Tigers became the first SEC team to take a regular-season game from Florida at home in 31 consecutive games over 12 matches dating back to Oct. 8, 2000, shocking the Gators with a 32-30 victory in game one.

After that loss, LSU rattled off five straight wins and won seven of its next eight matches beginning with a marathon five-game victory over Georgia on the road, symbolizing a turning point in the conference schedule. In the third game, the Tigers recorded a 39-37 win, marking the most points scored by an LSU team in a single game in school history.

The Tigers then returned home to sweep Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Auburn to set up a rematch with Alabama. This time LSU rebounded from a 1-0 deficit to defeat the Crimson Tide, 3-1. The Tigers hit at a .366 clip in the four-game win over Alabama, topping the .352 against ULL as the best hitting percentage since 1993. The .366 also tied the seventh-best hitting performance in a four-game match in school history.

A 3-1 loss to Kentucky on Senior Night ended the Tigers' winning streak, before LSU went on the road to defeat Mississippi State and Ole Miss in a pair of five-game matches.

The Tigers concluded the regular season on the road with rematches at Arkansas and Tennessee. After playing so well during their winning streak, LSU could not keep up the pace and was swept by both the Lady Backs and the Lady Vols to finish second in the Western Division and fourth overall in the league standings.

As the fourth seed in the SEC Tournament, the Tigers squared off with fifth-seeded Georgia for a second time. This time, however, LSU was without the services of Lancon after the first game because of injury and could not recover, falling 3-1 to the Bulldogs to conclude the season.

Despite the disappointing finish, the 2002 season saw many milestones. In addition to becoming just the fourth player in school history to record 1,000 career kills and digs, Hampton recorded the third-most attempts and 10th-most digs in a five-game match with 67 and 24 respectively against Ole Miss. In addition, she recorded 44 attempts against New Orleans in a three-game match, tying her for 10th in school history.

LSU just missed having two players reach 1,000 career kills in the same season as Cuyler came up just 27 shy of the 1,000 mark. Missing 10 of the final 12 matches because of injury, she recorded 132 kills in 2002 and completed her career with 973 kills.

It would have marked just the second time in school history that two players had recorded 1,000 career kills in the same season.

With 1,159 assists in 2002, Kubena became one of just three players in school history to record 3,000 career assists. She concluded her career with 3,702 assists, just 38 shy of Lauren O'Connor, ranking her third in LSU history.

Once again the Tigers solidified themselves as a contender for the SEC Western Division title in 2002. LSU recorded a tough five-game loss to nationally ranked Texas A&M and became the first team to win a game at Florida in two seasons. The Tigers also posted an impressive 3-0 win over Tennessee on SEC-TV, helping LSU prove that it is a team on the rise and one that can not be overlooked in the future.

Making its second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, LSU did not last long as Florida ousted the Tigers from the tournament in a five-game thriller in Gainesville, Fla. The Tigers returned to the NCAA Tournament after a one year absence from the event in 1988. Coming off the second conference championship in as many years, LSU cruised into the South Regional with a sweep of Louisville in the first round of the tournament. In Austin, Texas, the Tigers ousted Texas Tech and knocked off Texas on the Longhorns home court with a 17-15 game five win to advance to the Final Four for the first time in school history. In College Park, Md., LSU fell to eventual national champion UCLA, 3-0, in the national semifinals.

With only one loss, LSU entered the NCAA Tournament as a favorite to return to the Final Four and the Tigers did not disappoint. After sweeping Texas Tech, LSU ran into a Florida team that had handed the Tigers their only loss. A tough four-game victory later and LSU was back in the Final Four. This year in Los Angeles, Calif., the Tigers fell in four games to Long Beach State. Until Florida in 2002, the 1991 LSU team was the only team from the SEC to win a game in the NCAA Final Four.



# 1992

**SEC Tournament Runner-Up**

LSU had to travel for its first round match for the first time since 1987, this time to Lubbock, Texas, where the Tigers ousted Texas Tech from the tournament in just three games for the third consecutive year. At the South Regional in Gainesville, Fla., Texas knocked LSU out of the tournament in four games, ending hopes of a third straight Final Four appearance by the Tigers.

# 1993

**Overall Record: 21-16**  
**NIVC Champions**

For the first time since 1988 and only the second since 1985, LSU was left out of the NCAA Tournament. Despite not making the tournament, the Tigers showed why they deserved a bid by coasting to the NIVC Championship in Kansas City, Mo., by dropping only three games in the team's six tournament victories. LSU swept Baylor in the tournament final.

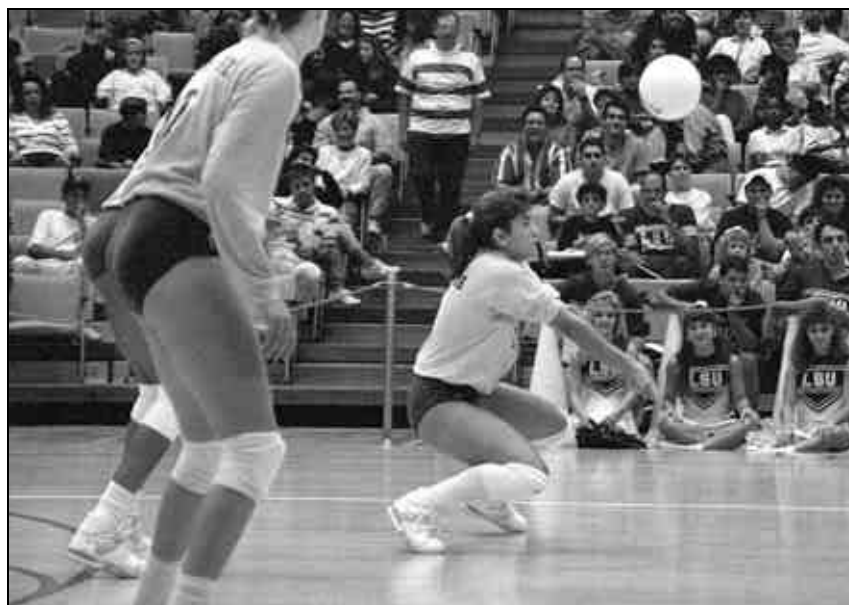

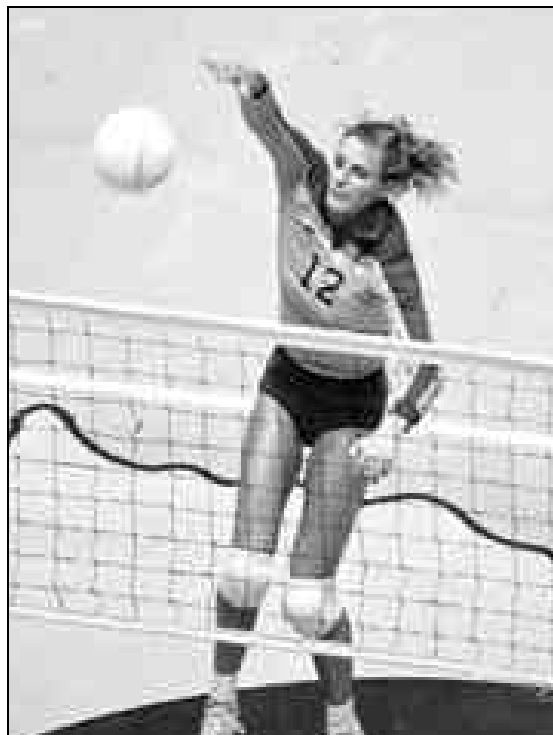

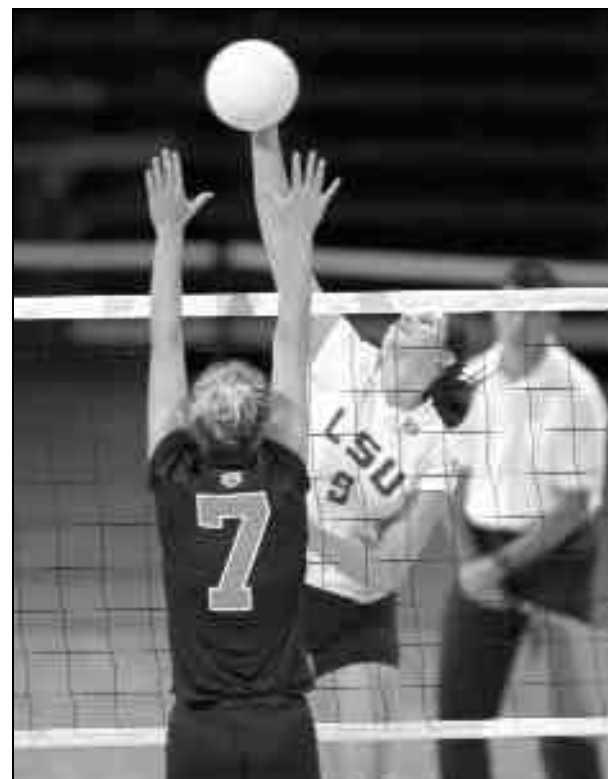

# Pete Maravich Assembly Center Records

The LSU volleyball program begins its 22st season in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, the largest volleyball venue in the Southeastern Conference.

The \$11.5 million structure, which was renamed in honor of the all-time LSU and NCAA men's basketball scoring leader on July 22,1988,seats 14,164 spectators and ranks as one of the finest college athletic arenas in the nation.

Containing over one-and-a-quarter million square feet of space and over three million cubic feet,the PMAC competes with Tiger Stadium,home to LSU football,as the most visible structure on the LSU campus.

"The assembly center is a great place to play," LSU head coach Fran Flory said. "It is a very volleyball friendly facility. In it we can create a great atmosphere for our student-athletes and for opposing teams."

Recently, the PMAC has undergone many renovations, the latest being a new portable wood floor which was added for the 2000-01 basketball season. In 2000,the arena was equipped with a brand new scoreboard and video screen that can be used for all sports.

In 1998, the Tiger volleyball team enjoyed the comforts of a newly renovated locker room. The two-tiered fully carpeted facility features individual cubicles for each athlete,a squad meeting room,and a storage area.

"I know we can provide an atmosphere which is a true home court advantage in the assembly center," added Flory. "I have seen it done before." Between 1985 and 1992,the PMAC became one of the top home-court advantages in the nation as LSU ran up a 110-10 (.917) record in that span.Included in that time was a 37-match home-court win streak, which is the second-longest streak in Southeastern Conference history.

In 1991,LSU enjoyed possibly its finest season in the Assembly Center as the Tigers recorded a perfect 16-0 record.They also advanced to the Final Four through the NCAA South Regional which was held in Baton Rouge.

The Tigers have now posted back-to-back winning marks in the PMAC, making it once again a tough place for visiting teams to play. Over that span, LSU has a record of 13-6 (.684).

Overall since beginning play in the Assembly Center in 1982, the Tigers have notched an amazing 232-97 (.705) record.In that time,LSU has had a losing record at home in just three seasons.

The PMAC has often played host to SEC and NCAA Tournaments for volleyball as well as men's and women's basketball and gymnastics.

The 1982, 1987 and 1995 SEC Volleyball Championships were all held in the arena. The PMAC has also been the site of the three NCAA Volleyball Championship First Round Matches as well as the NCAA South Regional in 1991.

The NCAA Women's Basketball First/Second Rounds in 1997, 1999 and 2000,as well as the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament in 1988 were also hosted in the arena. The SEC Gymnastics Championships came to the PMAC in 1999.Most recently, the 2002 NCAA Central Regional for gymnastics was held at the PMAC.

Along with the main court area,an auxiliary gym with a recently refinished court,is located underground in the north section of the arena.Nearly all Tiger volleyball practices take place in the auxiliary gym.

It hasn't taken Fran Flory long to turn around the LSU volleyball program. She took over a team that had hit rock bottom in 1997 and has methodically turned it into a team that expects to win every time it steps on the court. From 0-15 in the SEC in the season prior to her arrival to a 9-7 league mark last year, Flory has made her impact felt on the court. With her ability to identify and develop talent, relate to her players and surround herself with top-notch assistant coaches, Fran Flory has made this a great time to be a part of LSU volleyball.

"LSU has everything a student-athlete could ask for, from the facilities to the administration. We expect to win championships and every LSU student-athlete has those expectations. Our teams are committed to winning both on the court and in the classroom.

It is difficult to be successful in the classroom and on the court. It is a true balancing act and one that requires an incredible amount of dedication and discipline.

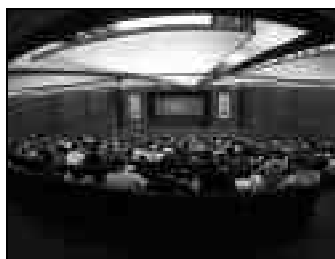
**P**aramount to the success of the “student” half of the term student-athlete is providing LSU athletes with the best possible resources

But as times change and technology advances, the need for further improvements still exists. As a result, the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes opened its doors in November of 2002. A \$15 million renovation to the Gym Armory not only made it among the nation’s premier centers, but put it at the forefront. Improvements to the existing center give LSU student-athletes the best opportunity for success by providing access to the latest technology, as well as an array of expanded services.

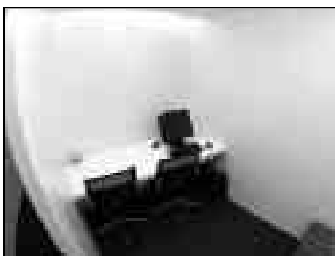

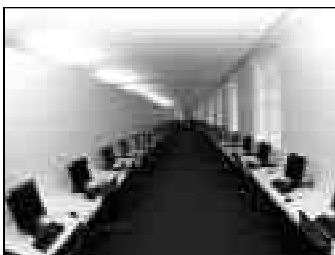
The 1,000-seat auditorium is used through the year as a classroom and lecture hall. Each seat in the auditorium has space for a laptop and a modem hookup, providing each student unlimited learning opportunities. The auditorium also contains a movie theatre size screen to aid professors with lectures and classroom activities.



The library provides a perfect setting for individual study, or with a tutor as group.



Included in the 54,000 square feet of the Academic Center are individual study areas as well as 14 private computer rooms for student-athletes to work one-on-one with tutors or by themselves.



Throughout the Academic Center are 75 computer stations, providing student-athletes with a quiet working environment for research, writing and studying.





Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College has, throughout its 143-year history, served the people of Louisiana, the region, the nation, and the world through extensive multipurpose programs encompassing instruction, research and public service. The University continuously develops programs of breadth and quality that make it one of the nation's outstanding educational institutions.

The University influences the educational, economic, social and cultural lives of its citizens throughout the state – indeed, in some way, it touches the life of every person in Louisiana.

Because of its designation as a Research I University – the top category of the Carnegie Foundation's ranking of research institutions – LSU ranks in the top 2 percent of the nation's colleges and universities. The Research I designation is shared by only 59 public and 29 private universities across the nation. One of only 25 universities nationwide designated as both a land-grant and sea-grant college, LSU is also actively pursuing space-grant status.

History and tradition began with LSU's founding in 1853 by the General Assembly of Louisiana as the Louisiana State Seminary of Learning and Military Academy near Pineville, Louisiana. The institution opened January 2, 1860. When the Civil War began, the school's first superintendent, William Tecumseh Sherman, resigned to assume a command in the Union Army. Fire demolished the Seminary in 1869 and the school moved to Baton Rouge.

In 1870, the Seminary was renamed Louisiana State University. In 1874, under the United States Morrill Act, the Louisiana State Agricultural & Mechanical College was established in New Orleans. The two institutions were merged by the Legislature in 1877 to become Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College.

Construction on the present campus began in 1922 and the first classes were held in 1926. LSU experienced major growth in the 1930s and 1940s, expanding its student body, curricula and services. During the 1960s, the University

began to place increasing emphasis on research.

Recognizing the importance and extent of statewide agricultural activities of units in the LSU System, the LSU Board of Supervisors in 1972 established the Center for Agricultural Sciences & Rural Development. This unit was renamed the LSU Agricultural Center in 1982. Components of the LSU Agricultural Center include the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, International Programs and Administrative Services.

The primary mission of the LSU Agricultural Center is to conduct research in agricultural and natural resource development and to provide off-campus extension education that disseminates technological, economic, and management information to Louisiana residents.

In 1977, the Paul M. Hebert Law Center, established as the LSU Law School in 1906, was made an autonomous division of the LSU System. The Law Center provides legal education characterized by an unyielding demand for academic excellence. Its unique curriculum, based on civil law as well as substantial elements of common law, provides law graduates with qualifications and training for not one, but two legal systems.

LSU, located on more than 2,000 acres in the southern part of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, is bordered on the west by the Mississippi River. The University's more than 250 principal buildings are grouped on a 650-acre plateau that constitutes the main part of the campus.

LSU and A&M College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. The Hebert Law Center holds membership in the Association of Law Schools and is on the approved list of the American Bar Association.





### THE TIGERS' HOME AWAY FROM HOME

LSU has 18 residence halls with architectural styles ranging from a Renaissance style typical of the older core of the campus to modern high-rise buildings. Below is the newest addition, the highly popular East Campus and West Campus apartments, a co-ed dormitory that includes furnished rooms with connecting suites and e-mail workstations in the lobby, all within a short walk from the dining hall.

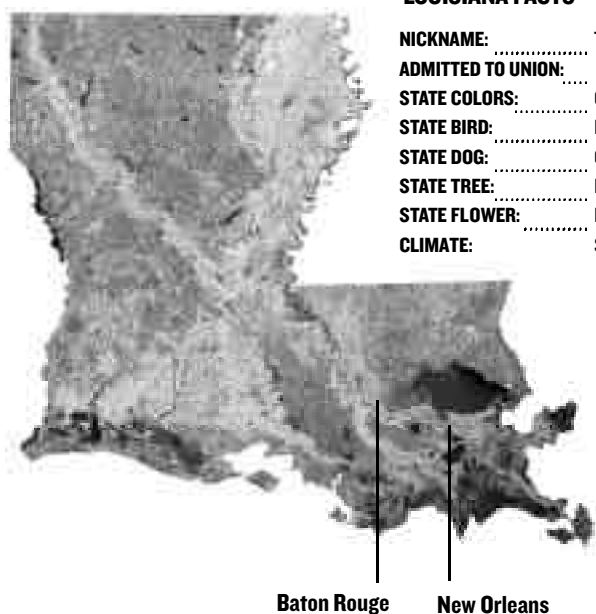

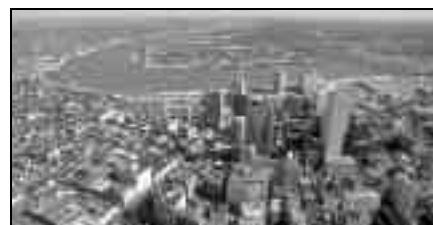

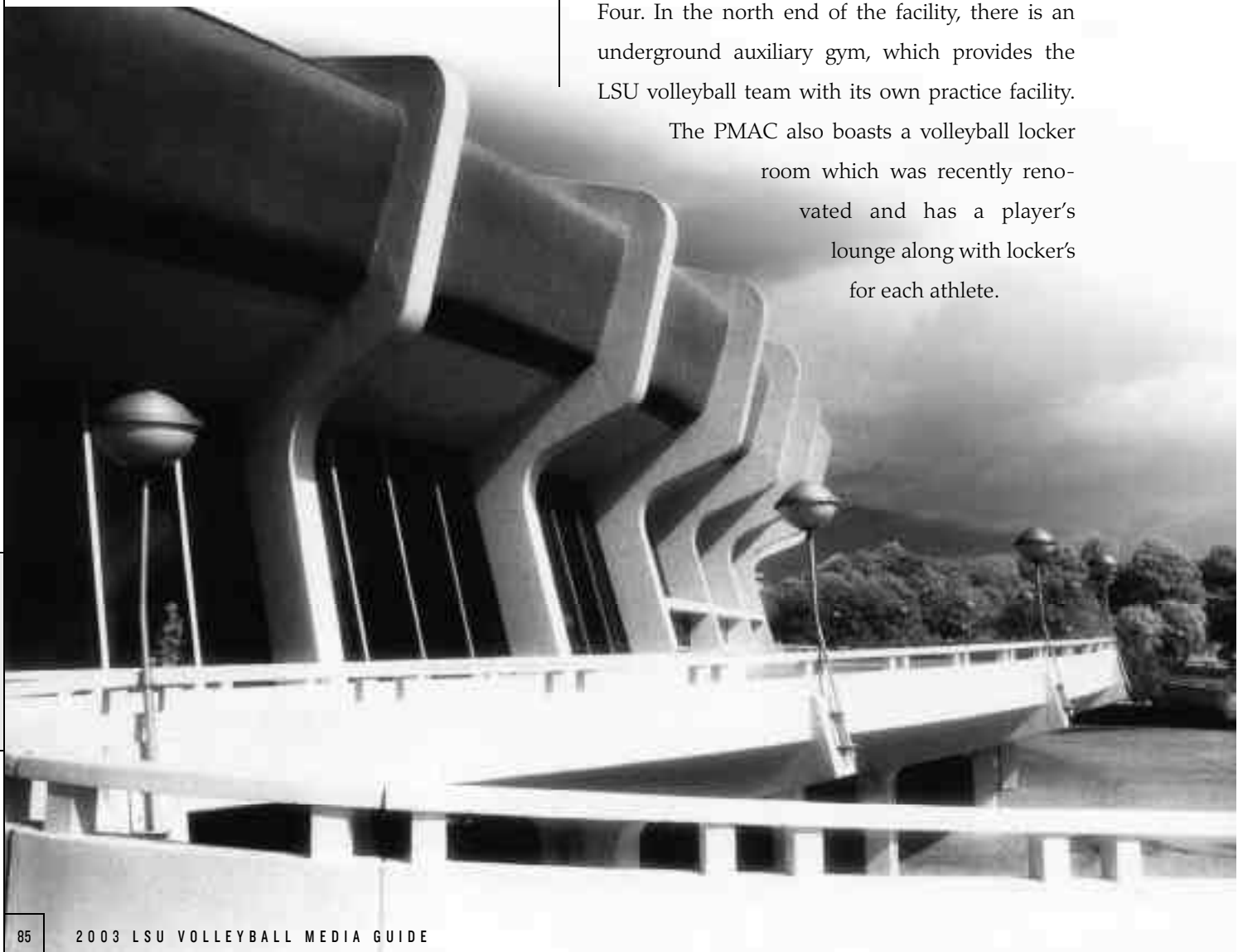


**T**he Pete Maravich Assembly Center, which seats 14,164 people, is the largest volleyball venue in the Southeastern Conference. LSU has been able to

use the PMAC as a great home court advantage since beginning play there in 1982. In that time, the Tigers have amassed an incredible 232-97 (.705) record at home. Twice in the last 20 years, LSU has put together undefeated seasons in the Assembly Center -- 1986 and 1991. In addition, the Tigers have produced home winning streaks of 37 and 30.

The PMAC has hosted six NCAA Volleyball Tournament matches, including the 1991 South Regional which LSU won to advance to the Final Four. In the north end of the facility, there is an underground auxiliary gym, which provides the LSU volleyball team with its own practice facility.

The PMAC also boasts a volleyball locker room which was recently renovated and has a player's lounge along with locker's for each athlete.





**T**he LSU locker room is located in the northwest corner of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, directly between the playing floor of the PMAC and the auxiliary gym, which serves as the Tigers practice facility. The locker room, a two-tiered facility which is equipped with a players lounge, was remodeled prior to the 2000 season and has locker space for each athlete.



## Auxillary Gym



**T**he LSU volleyball team has the luxury of its very own practice facility in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. Located underground in the north portion of the arena, the auxiliary gym provides the Tigers with an area

that can hold two volleyball courts side-by-side. The auxiliary gym is located just down the stairs from the LSU locker room.







The LSU strength and conditioning facility, located in the North end zone of Tiger Stadium, was built in 1997 and features the latest in both strength training



and cardiovascular equipment. Measuring 10,000-square feet, LSU has one of the finest strength and conditioning facilities in the nation.





## Training Room

**LSU** boasts the largest and most complete athletic training facility in all of collegiate athletics. Focused on aggressive rehabilitation, the Broussard Center for Athletic Training is furnished with the latest in technology and equipment. Some of the features of the 23,000-square foot facility include an on-site x-ray room, an in-house pharmacy, as well as state of the art hydrotherapy pools. The Broussard Center for Athletic Training is equipped with the largest hydrotherapy pools in both collegiate and professional sports and is one of the few collegiate training centers with a full-service pharmacy, as well as on-site x-ray room. LSU is also the only school in college athletics with a training room equipped with a full-service vision center. The facility is named in honor of legendary trainer Dr. Martin J. Broussard, who served as LSU's athletic trainer for several decades.





# Dr. William L. Jenkins

President, LSU

On April 1, 1999, William L. Jenkins, formerly Chancellor of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, became President of the LSU System, which includes nine institutions on 10 campuses in five cities, as well as 10 public hospitals in 10 cities.

A native of South Africa, Dr. Jenkins studied at the University of Pretoria, where he received his professional veterinary medicine degree in 1958 and specialist credentials in 1968. He received the Ph.D. degree from the University of Missouri, Columbia, in 1970. After practicing veterinary medicine for four years, he joined the faculty at the University of Pretoria, advancing through the ranks to become professor and head of the Department of Veterinary Physiology, Pharmacology, and Toxicology in 1971.

He moved to the U.S. in 1978 and joined the faculty in the Department of Veterinary Physiology and Pharmacology at Texas A&M University. He was appointed dean of the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine in 1988 and was named LSU's provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs in September 1993.

When he was appointed LSU's fifth Chancellor in November 1996, Dr. Jenkins reorganized the campus administration to be more effective and more responsive, and oversaw the development of a strategic plan to guide the University in its preparation for the challenges of the next century.

Over the years President Jenkins has received numerous teaching and service awards and recognitions, having been named the 1997 Communicator of the Year by the Public Relations Association of Louisiana and a Distinguished Alumnus by the University of Missouri. The regional chapter of Toastmasters International also presented him with its 1999 Communication and Leadership Award, and he was awarded the Vision of Excellence Award 2000 by the New Orleans Regional Chamber of Commerce and the New Orleans Chapter of MetroVision. In addition, the University of Pretoria bestowed an honorary doctorate on

Dr. Jenkins in September of 2000.

Dr. Jenkins has been active in continuing education and has delivered more than 150 lectures and addresses to diverse groups in both the United States and abroad. He has taught extensively at both the professional and graduate levels. He has published more than 60 scientific articles and has contributed 15 chapters to various textbooks. He is coauthor of a textbook on veterinary pharmacology.

Over the years, Dr. Jenkins has been a member of many professional organizations and select committees. Most recently, he served on the National Institute of Health's Alcohol Abuse and Misuse on College Campuses Committee and on a special Steering Committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to review accreditation criteria for colleges and universities.

Dr. Jenkins also is a member of the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges' Committee on Food and Society as well as the Committee on the Future of Coastal Louisiana.

His current community engagement includes serving on the boards of the Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities, Greater Baton Rouge Chamber of Commerce, Academic Distinction Fund, Council for a Better Louisiana, Arts Council of Greater Baton Rouge, and the Baton Rouge board of the National Conference for Community and Justice.

Dr. Jenkins and his wife, Peggy, have four children—Sharon Gwynn, Anthea, and Warren—and nine grandchildren.



## Dr. Kenneth E. Carpenter, Faculty Athletics Representative

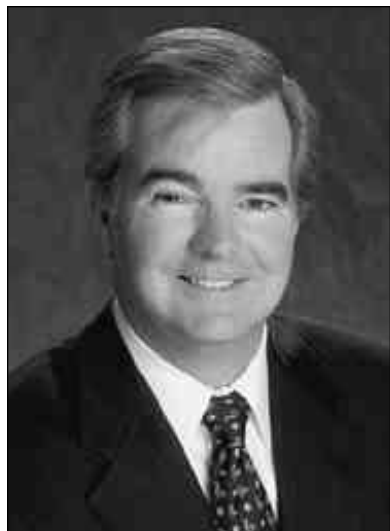
Dr. Kenneth E. Carpenter is in his first year as LSU's faculty representative in NCAA and Southeastern Conference matters.

Carpenter, a professor in the School of Architecture, has taught at LSU since 1986. He received his bachelor's degree in architecture from the University of Oklahoma in 1962 and his master's from Minnesota in 1967. Before joining the LSU faculty, he served at Clemson University as Associate Professor of Architecture from 1967-77; Ball State University, where he was Professor and

Chairman of the Department of Architecture, 1977-81; and, Iowa State University, serving as Professor and Chairman, Department of Architecture from 1981-86.

At LSU he served as the Dean of the College of Design from 1986-1997, Interim Executive Director of International Programs from 1997-98; and, Interim Dean, College of Art and Design, 2001-02.

Carpenter is a member of Phi Kappa Phi, the American Institute of Architects and the American Association of University Professors.



## Dr. Mark A. Emmert

Chancellor, LSU

Dr. Mark A. Emmert was appointed chancellor of Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College on April 16, 1999, becoming the sixth chancellor to lead the state's flagship University.

Prior to joining LSU, Emmert served as chancellor of the University of Connecticut, as provost and vice president for academic affairs at Montana State University, and held various faculty and administrative positions at the University of Colorado. He has served as a member of numerous academic and civic boards and organizations.

Both the Fulbright Commission and the American Council on Education have awarded fellowships to Emmert. He has also been inducted into Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society, Alpha Lambda Delta Scholastic Society, Golden Key Honor Society, and the Connecticut Academy of Arts and Sciences. He is active in the American Council on Education, the New England Council of Presidents, and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges, where he served as chair of the Council on Academic Affairs.

A native of Tacoma, Washington, Emmert holds a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Washington and master's and doctoral degrees from the Maxwell School of Syracuse University. His scholarly

work has focused on public policy topics, as well as issues in organizational theory. He has published his research in leading journals within his field and has served on several editorial boards. He has also served as a visiting scholar and lecturer internationally, working in Australia, Hong Kong, Japan, and Panama.

He is married to DeLaine S. Emmert, a former elementary school teacher, who is active in community, university, and philanthropic organizations. They have two children, Stephen and Jennifer.

Bertman's unyielding desire to succeed drove him to the pinnacle of his profession, and his astute knowledge of the game -- obtained from over 40 years of coaching -- combined with his steadfast determination and irrepressible enthusiasm transformed LSU Baseball into the nation's premier program.

Already a Louisiana Legend and one of the greatest college baseball coaches of all time, J. Stanley "Skip" Bertman has augmented his impressive list of achievements in two seasons as LSU's director of athletics. While supervising the Tigers' magnificent progress on the playing fields, he has begun to implement measures necessary to realize his vision of building the LSU athletics department into the best in the country. Bertman's bold and innovative plans promise to keep the Tigers among the nation's elite in all phases of collegiate athletics.

LSU's programs enjoyed remarkable success under Bertman's direction in 2002-03, as 16 of the Tigers' 20 sports participated in NCAA post-season competition. That accomplishment, along with improved graduation rates, increased team grade point averages and the construction of new academic facilities, foreshadow even more significant deeds in Bertman's tenure.

Bertman was named LSU's athletics director on January 19, 2001. With Bertman, LSU gained an athletics director who provides the leadership and experience necessary to manage the Tigers' nearly \$40 million budget.

Bertman guided LSU to five NCAA baseball titles, and his teams drew huge crowds to venerable Alex Box Stadium, as the Tigers led the nation in attendance in each of his final six seasons (1996-2001).

He also served as head coach of the 1996 U.S. Olympic team which captured the bronze medal in Atlanta.

Bertman continues to be honored for his remarkable coaching tenure, as he was inducted in June, 2002, into the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January, 2003.

In a *Baseball America* poll released in January, 1999, Bertman was voted the second greatest college baseball coach of the 20th century, trailing only Rod Dedeaux of Southern California. Bertman and Dedeaux are the only coaches to win five CWS titles.

He had previously earned stellar recognition as one of the nation's brightest assistant coaches while at the University of Miami (Fla.) for eight seasons (1976-83). Before working at Miami, Bertman was renowned for his coaching excellence. In 11 seasons at Miami Beach High School, he directed the Hi-Tides to a state championship and two runners-up finishes. He was named Florida's Coach of the Year on three occasions.

In 1975, Bertman coached at Miami-Dade Downtown, leaving after one season to join legendary head coach Ron Fraser at Miami. The move was a homecoming of sorts, as Bertman spent his collegiate playing days with the Hurricanes as an outfielder and catcher from 1958-60. He earned his B.A. in health and physical education from Miami in 1961 and received his master's degree from UM in 1964.

Bertman and his wife Sandy are the parents of four daughters -- Jan, Jodi, Lisa and Lori. The Bertmans have two grandchildren -- Sophie Faith and Isaac Stanley, the children of Emile and Lori Bertman Guirard.

- Five of the league's 11 teams posted 20-plus wins in 2002 while seven recorded winning records. Florida led the way with 34 victories, while Arkansas was right behind with 27. South Carolina notched 22, while both Georgia and Tennessee had 20.
- Florida made its 13th NCAA appearance and 12th in a row in 2002 advancing to the Final Four.
- 12 players were named to the AVCA All-District team in 2002.
- In the past 13 years, 683 athletes have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

**Y**ear after year, the Southeastern Conference shows why it is considered to be one of the premier volleyball conferences in the nation.

In the 1990's and continuing into the 2000's, the SEC made stellar contributions to the sport of volleyball. The conference has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in every season for the last 12 years. The SEC had a team reach the Final Four eight of the last 13 seasons with the league having a team advance to the regional final 10 of those 13 seasons.

In 2002, Florida competed in its 12th straight NCAA Tournament and made it to the Final Four in New Orleans. South Carolina was also selected to the NCAA field in 2002, making its sixth NCAA Tournament Appearance.

Since the inaugural SEC volleyball championship in 1979-80, many changes have occurred in the conference. The addition of Arkansas and South Carolina to the league in 1991 brought the divisional format to the sport with five teams com-

peting in the Eastern Division and six teams in the Western Division. The most recent change came in 1999 as the tournament format now features only eight teams participating in a three-day conference tournament.



Along with the popularity growth throughout the country, women's volleyball has also grown in the SEC. A benchmark in that growth came in 1995 when SEC volleyball was first broadcasted on SEC-TV (FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Southwest and Sunshine Network) on a tape-delay basis. For the past five seasons the coverage has grown, especially in the last two years, to live telecasts of several regular season matches and the SEC Tournament championship match. SEC volleyball will continue to enjoy live coverage on SEC-TV in 2003, reaching almost 19 million subscribers in the conference's nine-state region.
