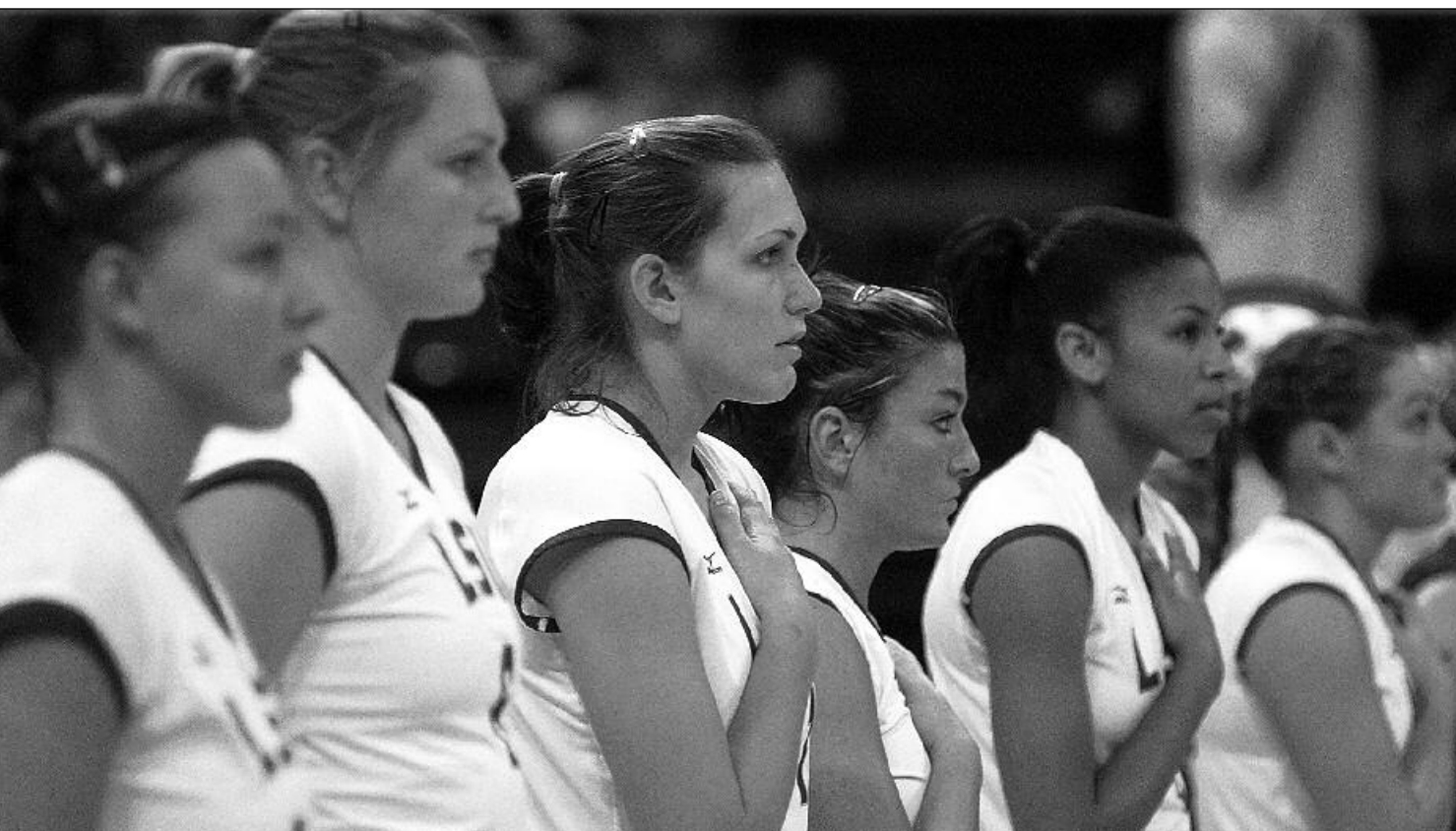

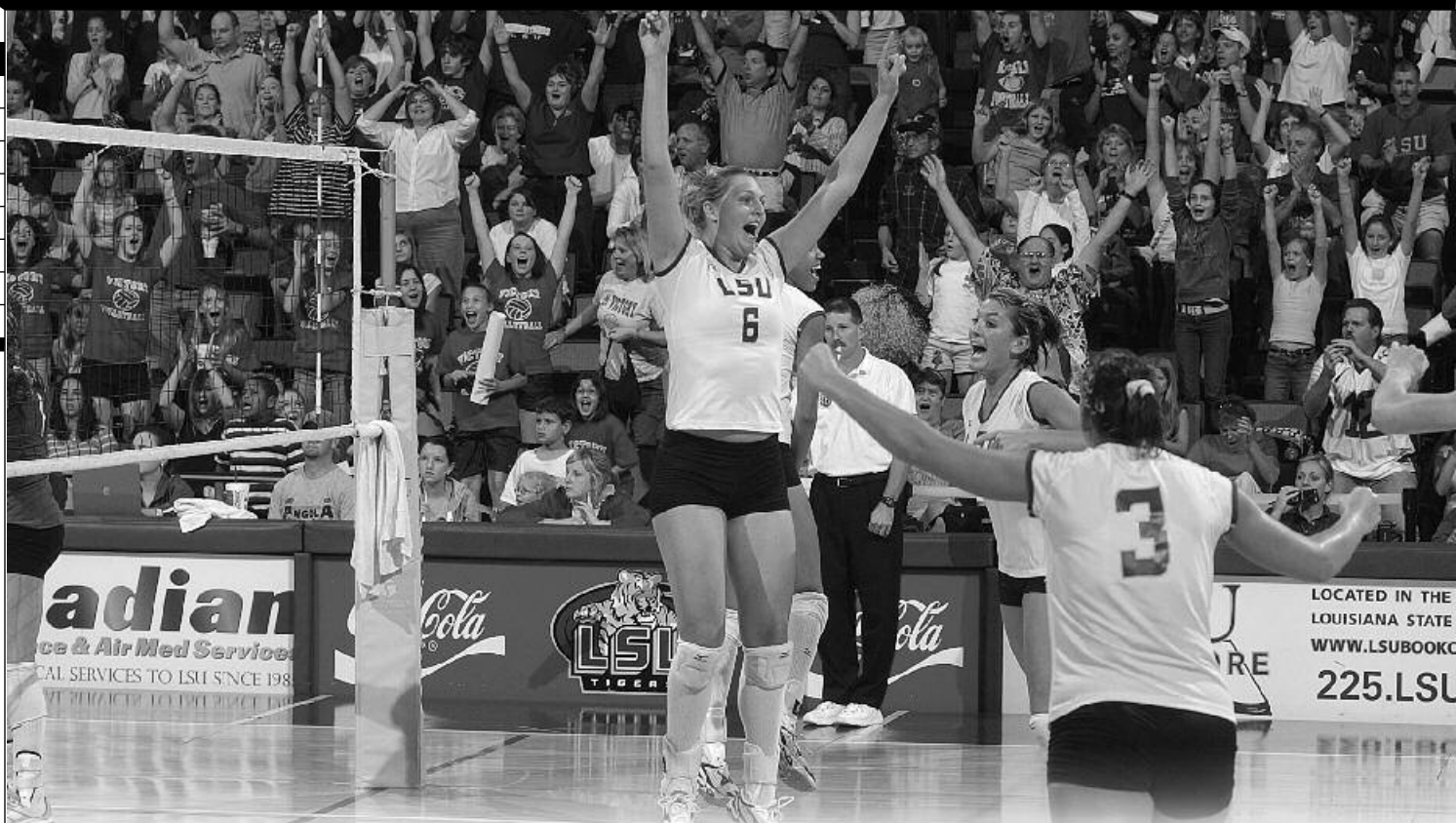

Eyes on the Goal

The Tigers are focused on advancing to the NCAA Tournament after coming up just short in 2004

After falling just short of their goal of qualifying for the NCAA Tournament last season, the 2005 LSU volleyball team returns to the court with a confidence that this season they can use their maturity to accomplish that goal.

"We ended last season as one of the last teams left out of the NCAA Tournament and that's a huge driving force for us this year," said LSU head coach Fran Flory. "To work so hard and miss it by just that much is tough.

"Every program has a turning point and we certainly hope that was ours," Flory continued. "We feel like we were good enough to be there last year and this year we know that we have to go out and take care of business each and every day. We can't overlook anybody. We have to prepare to be our best and compete at the highest level possible regardless of who is across the net from us. I think this group did a great job with that during the spring and that they will do a great job in the fall."

Returning all but one starter from a year ago, the Tigers have the much-needed game experience they lacked over the last several years. LSU's roster includes two proven seniors and a quintet of juniors that have played an integral role on the team for the last two seasons.

"The group of people that we have relied on for the last two years are juniors this year, or in their third year of training, and typically that is a very positive year," said Flory. "With their maturity and experience level, we are now able to rely on them.

"Certainly having Jelena and Ivana as seniors is very important because they are players who are going to work very hard to prepare for the season. They realize this is their last shot to be successful and to be in the NCAA Tournament. They are going to prepare as well as they can possibly prepare."

With a seasoned lineup and four highly acclaimed freshmen coming in, the Tigers now believe that they can reach a level of success that had been just beyond their reach.

"We had a very successful spring season that we feel will catapult us into a very successful fall season," said Flory. "I think the biggest step that we have made since last season is the confidence level and the expectation level of this group."

OUTSIDE HITTERS

This season, LSU will have a depth of quality at outside hitter that the Tigers have not seen over the last several years. With the addition of one of the most heralded recruits in recent history and an international standout, players will battle for time on the court as LSU will improve its ability to play to its strengths and adapt to its opponents.

"Our outside hitting position is very deep and I think that will lend itself to some great competition," said Flory.

After transferring from Northwood University in Michigan last year, Jelena Mijatovic (Belgrade, Serbia) joined the Tigers last season and made an immediate impact on the team. The senior led the team

in kills and kills per game and ranked fourth in the nation in service aces per game.

"Jelena did a great job this spring and summer preparing for the fall," said Flory. "She expects to go out with a great showing her senior year and hopefully get the opportunity to move on.

"She is becoming a much more physical player. She always had the tools, but her physicality didn't always match her ability to play that game and I think that definitely has come closer together. I think that she is going to be able to be a force and be a major factor for us."

Kassi Mikulik (Flatonia, Texas) returns for her junior campaign as a two-year starter, raking third on the team in kills per game and fourth in digs per game last year.

"Kassi enjoyed the best semester of her collegiate career in the spring after not training last spring because of playing softball," said Flory. "She took a huge step forward and became much more creative and deceptive. She also became a much better finesse player.

"We always knew that Kassi could hit the ball hard, but being able to balance the finesse and the power game is what differentiates top level outsiders. Kassi certainly took a step in that direction."

Limited by injury last season, Lauren Leaumont (New Orleans, La.) begins her junior season with a healthy start and hopes to return to her freshman form, when she ranked second on the team in kills and led the Tigers in digs.

"Lauren struggled physically last year and after her physical setback is just now getting back to the fitness level where she will be able to achieve the level of play her freshman year, and we certainly hope that she'll surpass that," said Flory.

"Lauren's a competitor and a fighter and she's also a great team member. I think that, regardless of whether she's in the lineup or not, she'll be a huge portion of our mental approach and our team spirit. She may in fact be the heart of our team."

Redshirt freshman Kate Spytek (Pewaukee, Wisc.) was hampered by a knee injury in the spring that forced her to have surgery. As she makes up for the time she lost on the court, her playing time this fall should increase.

"Kate was enjoying a great spring until she suffered a knee injury that required surgery and was a little slow coming back," said Flory. "She is going to have to play catch up a little bit because of her experience level. She made some good strides technically and, provided she comes back physically prepared, she will definitely see some playing time and challenge for more as the season goes on and she catches up to what she missed out on in the spring."

One of the most prominent volleyball recruits in recent memory, Kyna Washington (Houston, Texas) joins the Tigers as one of the top rated high school players in the nation. After she makes the conversion to the collegiate game, she will become a key to the LSU offense.

"Kyna is one of the most heralded players that we've recruited to LSU," said Flory. "She is a tremendous leaper and a tremendous ath-

lete. She has had some outstanding experiences as a high school player and she brings a great attitude of winning and success.

"Certainly she is going to be a factor for us, but will have to compete for a spot along with the rest of the outsides. It's going to take a little while for her to move into the collegiate game and transition into the speed and the pace, but I look for her to be a very important part of our season."

A member of the Croatian National Team, Marina Skender (Zagreb, Croatia) brings international success to the Tigers. She led her club team to the 2003 European Youth Championship title and a fourth-place finish in the 2004 European Junior Championship.

"Marina is a very intelligent, seasoned volleyball player, having played the game on a different level," said Flory. "She was very successful with the Croatian Junior National Team and has a tremendous arm swing and is a very creative offensive player. As with any freshman, it will take her a little time to transition, but we look for her to come in an impact fairly early in the season."

MIDDLE BLOCKERS

The middle blockers will be one of the strengths for the Tigers again this season. LSU returns senior honorable mention All-South Region selection Ivana Kuzmic (Split, Croatia). An imposing force, she has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in blocks per game in two of the last three seasons.

"After playing injured all fall, Ivana was finally healthy this spring and able to compete in all matches and all games," said Flory. "She became a much more physical player. She also became a much more technically sound player and therefore a more efficient player."

"Blocking was always very successful for her, but offensively she became more of a weapon and available in more opportunities as she became more comfortable in our system. We will use her as much as we can possibly use her."

After seeing considerable playing time at middle blocker and right side over the last two seasons, Melody Clark (Colorado Springs, Colo.) returns for her junior campaign after ranking second in blocks last season.

"Melody's speed is her asset," said Flory. "She is becoming a much more physical player, but speed is always going to be her most important asset. We tried to create some new things in our offense with her and will continue to do that in the fall. She will have a little bit of a new look."

"Blocking wise she became very efficient and just matured in the game. She was one of those that was always pretty high in the stats,

but maybe not really noticed, maybe a quiet contributor all the time and I think that she will be much more noticeable and a much more important part of our offense in the fall."

A talented two-sport standout, Lauren DeGirolamo (Belleville, Ill.) joins the Tiger squad after leading her team to a third-place finish in the Illinois state tournament last season.

"Lauren is a very talented athlete," said Flory. "She was probably underrecruited because she played for a smaller club and was also a very heralded basketball player and didn't decide to play volleyball until late in her senior year. We are thrilled to have her. We think she has a very bright future."

"She just lacks a little bit of experience and we actually think she may be the most improved player through preseason, and she may push some people in the middle about the start of SEC once she gets in the gym with people of like athletic ability. I think she is really going to take off."

RIGHT SIDE

Sophomore Vanessa Freeman (Granger, Texas) returns to action on the right side after a strong finish to her freshman season, which saw her average over 13 kills and three blocks in her final three matches.

"Vanessa had a great season last year as a freshman," said Flory. "This spring she developed into a tremendous offensive threat. Actually, she was able to train all spring and develop both offensively and defensively. She is going to be a force."

"She will be a very integral part of our offense. We have changed a few things to create more opportunities for her. She is somebody that we are going to rely on very heavily on throughout the season."

Junior Lacey Galliano (Baton Rouge, La.) returns after seeing action on the right side the last two years. An outstanding practice player, she again adds depth to the position this season.

"Lacey battled all spring through illness and injury," said Flory. "Perhaps, she didn't make the strides we were hoping she would make. She is a fighter and is a true part of the spirit and the heart of this team. She challenges everybody everyday in practice and certainly adds and sometimes sets the competitive level of our team. Everybody needs those types of players and Lacey is one of those behind the scenes players that maybe doesn't get the glory but is very important to the team's success."

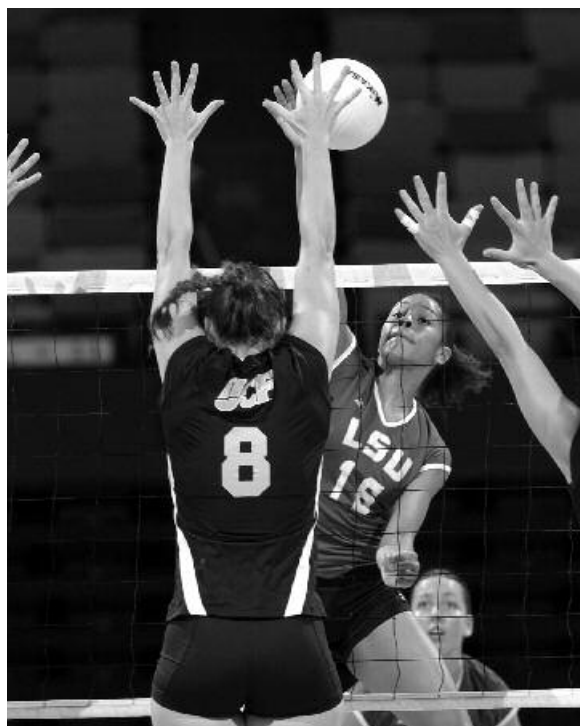

SETTERS

After one of the most productive years by a setter in recent history, Daniela Romero (Arlington, Texas) returns for her junior season ranked sixth in career assists in LSU history. A year ago, she ranked sixth in the SEC in overall assists and fifth in assists in league games, while also ranking 10th in service aces per game in SEC games.

"Dee really matured as a setter this spring," said Flory. "She now truly understands our offense and what we expect. She became a better weapon offensively."

"I think Dee is going to have a tremendous year. She is very comfortable with our hitters and she is comfortable with our system and she's committed to making this team successful and leading them through the season."

The Tigers also bring in redshirt freshman Heather Fierce (Muncie, Ind.), who should battle for playing time. A member of the 2001 Junior Olympic All-Tournament team, Fierce returns to the court after sitting out a year ago.

"Heather is going to start the season ready to go because she had to sit a year," said Flory. "She's anxious to get the chance to play and prove herself. She's a fighter and has overachieved at every level that she could possibly overachieve. She's done a great job transitioning into college life here and she's going to provide much needed competition and/or support for Dee."

LIBERO/DEFENSIVE SPECIALIST

After seeing considerable action as a defensive specialist last season, where she ranked sixth on the team in digs and fifth in service aces, Michelle Hensgens (Morgan City, La.) returns for her sophomore season with the Tigers.

"Michelle made some very positive strides this spring," said Flory. "Her defense is the area she probably improved the most. I think her passing became much more reliable."

"I think she became much more comfortable and confident. She became a more balanced player after transitioning into a defensive player from a setter in high school."

The second star of the outstanding 2005 Tiger freshman class is Elena Martinez (New Orleans, La.). The MVP of the Louisiana state tournament, she led Isidore Newman School to three state titles in

the last four years, and will make an immediate impact on the court for LSU.

"Elena may be the second most heralded player that we've had come into our program since I've been here," said Flory. "She will compete on the USA Junior National team in July. It's great to have an in-state kid to choose LSU, certainly someone as sought after as she was. Many said she was the best libero in the country in this year's class."

"I think passing is her asset. I think she's a very good defensive player, but she's a tremendous passer and she will have an opportunity very early to play."

SCHEDULE

LSU has an outstanding schedule in 2005, with seven teams that advanced to the 2004 NCAA Tournament. The slate includes four preconference tournaments, featuring the eight-team UTSA Dome Rally. With ongoing renovations to the Maravich Center, the Tigers are limited to just their eight home SEC matches this season, but that schedule includes a match against 2004 NCAA Sweet 16 participant Tennessee.

"Our schedule is going to lend itself to a start against several very balanced teams that will have the opportunity to win their conference or that we project will have very successful seasons," said Flory. "Not playing at home is certainly going to be a factor in that we are on the road for the first four weekends in a row, but it's a choice that we had to make given the Maravich Center renovations. We are going to be thrilled that we took the time to allow the renovations to occur and not hold things back."

LSU opens up the season with back-to-back weekends in Georgia. The Tigers first travel to Statesboro for the Georgia Southern Invitational to face the host Eagles, Jacksonville and Campbell. Georgia Southern has recorded four consecutive 20-win seasons, while Jacksonville advanced to the 2004 NCAA Tournament. LSU then travels to Atlanta for the Georgia State Invitational to take on the host Lady Panthers, Jacksonville State and Wright State.

"Georgia Southern is a nice staring tournament for us," said Flory. "I think we'll be able to get some people some good experience and likewise at Georgia State."

The Tigers then face their first test at the UTSA Dome Rally in San Antonio. LSU will face the host Roadrunners, Texas A&M and Rice. The elite eight-team tournament also features Florida and USC, who faced off in the 2003 national championship game, and Notre Dame.

"The San Antonio tournament is a tremendous event for volleyball and we are thrilled to be a part of it," said Flory. "It's an eight-team tournament that is going to be a great place for us to showcase our abilities in front of a more nationally based audience in terms of the other teams that are participating. As far as the teams that we are playing, we have some nice matchups against some teams that are going to have successful seasons and be well known on the national level. It's going to be a nice challenge for us."

Playing in Louisiana for the first time in 2005, the Tigers will next participate in the Sugar Bowl Classic in New Orleans. LSU will face the host Green Wave, along with Arizona State and 2004 NCAA Tournament participant Notre Dame.

"Tulane is going through a bit of a rebuilding year after losing their coach and a lot of their players, but they are going to have some international flavor," said Flory. "Arizona State and Notre Dame give us another chance to play some teams that are going to be recognized nationally."

The Tigers finally begin play at home with the start of the SEC schedule. With a fortunate draw in the league schedule, LSU will host Tennessee and South Carolina, while also playing Florida and Georgia only once. The Tigers will also play home and home matches with its six remaining conference opponents, including divisional rivals Arkansas, Alabama, Auburn, Ole Miss and Mississippi State and Eastern Division foe Kentucky.

"Our conference schedule is a very good schedule for us," said Flory. "We play South Carolina and Tennessee only once and it's at our place, while we play Georgia and Florida only once, at their place."

"We feel like we have a great opportunity to be successful in pre-season, nationally, and in our conference, certainly in our division, throughout our schedule."

It hasn't taken Fran Flory long to turn around the LSU volleyball program. She took over a team that had hit rock bottom in 1997 and has methodically turned it into a team that expects to win every time it steps on the court. From 0-15 in the SEC the season prior to her arrival to a 33-30 league mark over the last four years, Flory has made her impact felt on the court. With her ability to identify and develop talent, relate to her players and surround herself with top-notch assistant coaches, Fran Flory has made this a great time to be a part of LSU volleyball.

"LSU has everything a student-athlete could ask for, from the facilities to the administration. We expect to win championships and every LSU student-athlete has those expectations. Our teams are committed to winning both on the court and in the classroom.

"Team togetherness and team ownership are two very important factors in our program. Our teams are

committed not only to LSU, but also to each other. Team ownership is vital to the success of any team, company or organization. Everyone must have a clear understanding of the goals and direction of the program. We are very careful to define roles and responsibilities so everyone is headed in the same direction."

Flory came to LSU from the head coaching position at Kentucky, where she led the Wildcats to one NCAA Tournament appearance and was named the AVCA South District Coach of the Year in 1993. Prior to that, she served as an assistant at LSU where she helped the Tigers to three SEC Championships and two Final Four appearances.

Now, entering her eighth season, Flory will continue to build on the solid foundation that she has laid out for the LSU volleyball program and continue to design her program around the fundamentals that have made her a success at every stop of her coaching career.

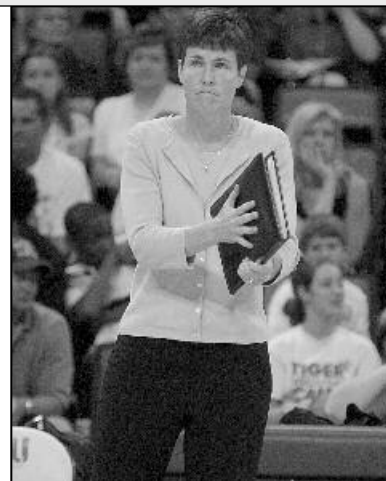
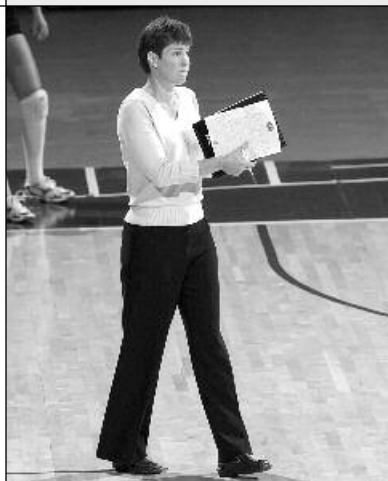

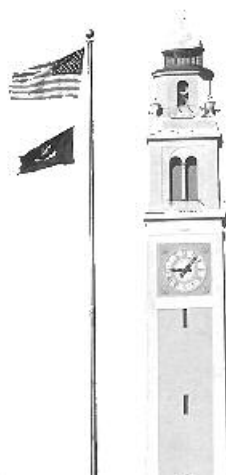

2004 LSU SPRING COMMENCEMENT

Strong supporters of education throughout the state have provided resources for a variety of innovative projects that are attracting world-class researchers and their expertise to LSU. The National Flagship Agenda is working to improve the standing of the University, as well as strengthen its position as an economic engine for the state of Louisiana. As a result, the University community is even more determined to achieve excellence at every level.

LSU remains firmly focused on attaining national flagship status by 2010, the University's 150th anniversary. The resolve of the LSU community and the support of the state make these goals attainable. And, if the last five years are any indication of success, the next phase of this agenda will guarantee LSU's place in the arena of national prominence.

Because of its designation as a doctoral/research university by the Carnegie Foundation, LSU ranks in the top 2 percent of the nation's colleges and universities. This designation is shared by only 59 public and 29 private universities across the nation. LSU is also one of only 25 universities nationwide designated as both a land-grant and sea-grant college.

History and tradition began with LSU's founding in 1853 by the General Assembly of Louisiana as the Louisiana State Seminary of Learning and Military Academy near Pineville, Louisiana. The

institution opened January 2, 1860. When the Civil War began, the school's first superintendent, William Tecumseh Sherman, resigned to assume a command in the Union Army. The seminary reopened in 1869, but was soon destroyed by fire. The institution moved to Baton Rouge, opening on Nov. 1, 1869.

In 1870, the Seminary was renamed Louisiana State University. In 1874, under the United States Morrill Act, the Louisiana State Agricultural & Mechanical College was established in New Orleans. The two institutions were merged by the Legislature in 1877 to become Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College.

Construction on the present campus began in 1922 and the first classes were held in 1926. LSU experienced major growth in the 1930s and 1940s, expanding its student body, curricula, and services. During the 1960s, the University began to place increasing emphasis on research.

Recognizing the importance and extent of statewide agricultural activities of units in the LSU System, the LSU Board of Supervisors established the Center for Agricultural Sciences & Rural Development in 1972. This unit was renamed the LSU Agricultural Center in 1982. Components of the LSU Agricultural Center include the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service and

International Programs.

The primary mission of the LSU Agricultural Center is to conduct research in agricultural and natural resource development and to provide off-campus extension education that disseminates technological, economic, and management information to Louisiana residents.

In 1977, the Paul M. Hebert Law Center, established as the LSU Law School in 1906, was made an autonomous division of the LSU System. The Law Center provides legal education characterized by an unyielding demand for academic excellence. Its unique curriculum, based on civil law as well as substantial elements of common law, provides law graduates with qualifications and training for not one, but two legal systems. The Hebert Law Center holds membership in the Association of Law Schools and is on the approved list of the American Bar Association.

LSU, located on more than 2,000 acres in the southern part of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, is bordered on the west by the Mississippi River. The University's more than 250 principal buildings are grouped on a 650-acre plateau that constitutes the main part of the campus.

LSU and A&M College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

But as times change and technology advances, the need for further improvements still exists. As a result, the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes opened its doors in November of 2002. A \$15 million renovation to the Gym Armory not only made it among the nation’s premier centers, but put it at the forefront. Improvements to the existing center give LSU student-athletes the best opportunity for success by providing access to the latest technology, as well as an array of expanded services.

Throughout the Academic Center are 75 computer stations, providing student-athletes with a quiet working environment for research, writing and studying.



Bo Campbell Auditorium

The 1,000-seat auditorium is used throughout the year as a classroom and lecture hall. Each seat in the auditorium has space for a laptop and a modem hookup, providing each student unlimited learning opportunities. The auditorium also contains a movie theatre size screen to aid professors with lectures and classroom activities.

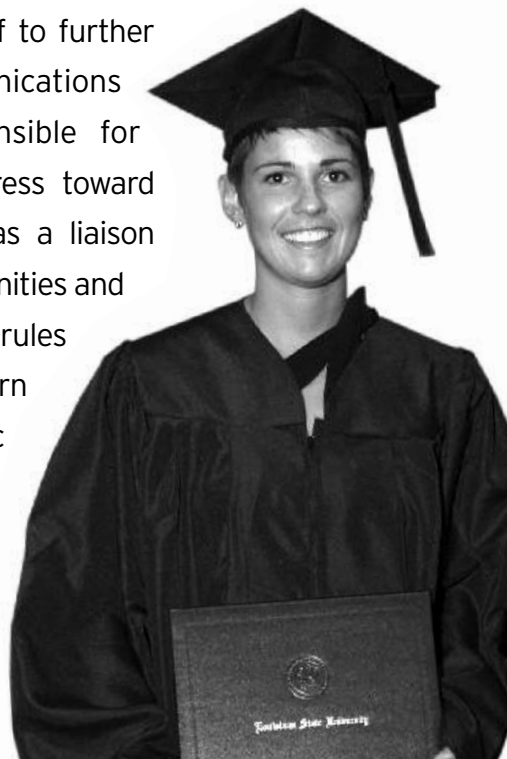

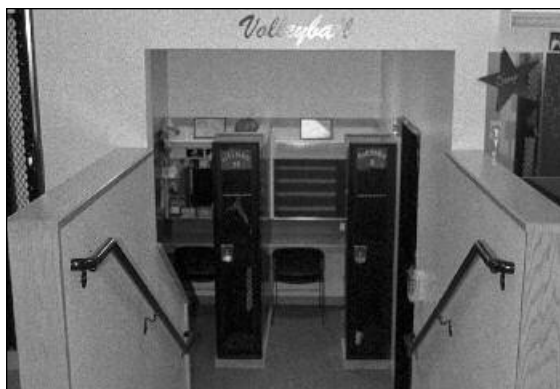

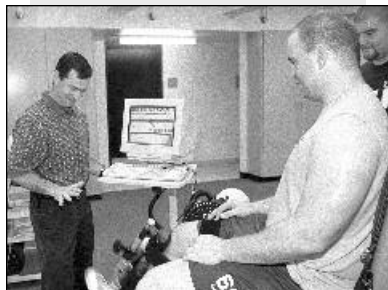

Dr. William L. Jenkins

President, LSU

On April 1, 1999, Dr. William L. Jenkins, formerly Chancellor of Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College, became president of the LSU System, which includes nine institutions on 10 campuses in five cities, as well as 10 public hospitals in 10 cities.

A native of South Africa, Dr. Jenkins studied at the University of Pretoria, where he received his professional veterinary medicine degree in 1958 and specialist credentials in 1968. He received his Ph.D. degree from the University of Missouri, Columbia, in 1970. After practicing veterinary medicine for four years, he joined the faculty at the University of Pretoria, advancing through the ranks to become professor and head of the Department of Veterinary Physiology, Pharmacology, & Toxicology in 1971.

He moved to the United States in 1978 and joined the faculty in the Department of Veterinary Physiology & Pharmacology at Texas A&M University. He was appointed dean of the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine in 1988, and was named LSU's provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs in September 1993.

When he was appointed LSU's fifth chancellor in November 1996, Dr. Jenkins reorganized the campus administration to be more effective and more responsive, and oversaw the development of a strategic plan to guide the University in its preparation for the challenges of the next century.

Over the years, Dr. Jenkins has received numerous teaching and service awards and recognitions, having been named the 1997 Communicator of the Year by the Public Relations Association of Louisiana and a Distinguished Alumnus by the University of Missouri in 1999. The regional chapter of Toastmasters International also presented him with its 1999 Communication and Leadership Award, and he was awarded the Vision of Excellence Award 2000 by the New Orleans Regional Chamber of Commerce and the New Orleans Chapter of MetroVision. In addition, the

University of Pretoria awarded an honorary doctoral degree to Dr. Jenkins in September 2000.

Dr. Jenkins has been active in continuing education and has delivered more than 150 lectures and addresses to diverse groups in both the United States and abroad. He has taught extensively at both the professional and graduate levels. He has published more than 60 scientific articles and has contributed 15 chapters to various textbooks. He is co-author of a textbook on veterinary pharmacology.

Dr. Jenkins has been and continues to be a member of many professional organizations and select committees. Most recently he served on the National Institute of Health's Alcohol Abuse and Misuse on College Campuses Committee and on a special Steering Committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to review accreditation criteria for colleges and universities. Dr. Jenkins also is a member of the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges' Committee on Food and Society and currently serves on the Governor's Advisory Commission on Coastal Restoration and Conservation.

His current community engagement includes serving on the boards of the Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities, Greater Baton Rouge Chamber of Commerce, Academic Distinction Fund, Council for a Better Louisiana, Arts Council of Greater Baton Rouge, The Nature Conservancy of Louisiana, and the Baton Rouge board of the National Conference for Community and Justice.

Dr. Jenkins and his wife, Peggy, have four children - Sharon, Gwynn, Anthea, and Warren - and nine grandchildren.

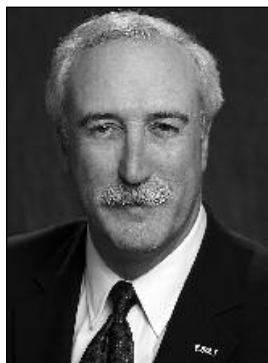

Sean O'Keefe

Chancellor, LSU

Sean O'Keefe has been appointed chancellor of Louisiana State University and Agricultural & Mechanical College, becoming the seventh chancellor to lead the state's flagship University.

Nominated by President George W. Bush and confirmed by the United States Senate, Sean O'Keefe was appointed by the President as the 10th Administrator of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration on December 21, 2001, his fourth Presidential appointment. As Administrator, O'Keefe led the NASA team and managed its resources as NASA sought to advance exploration and discovery in aeronautics and space technologies.

O'Keefe joined the Bush Administration on inauguration day and first served as the Deputy Director of the Office of Management and Budget until December 2001, overseeing the preparation, management and administration of the Federal budget and government wide-management initiatives across the Executive Branch.

Prior to joining the Bush Administration, O'Keefe was the Louis A. Bantle Professor of Business and Government Policy, an endowed chair at the Syracuse University Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs. He also served as the Director of National Security Studies, a partnership of Syracuse University and Johns Hopkins University, for delivery of executive education programs for senior military and civilian officials. Appointed to these positions in 1996, he was previously Professor of Business Administration and Assistant to the Senior Vice President for Research and Dean of the Graduate School at the Pennsylvania State University.

Appointed as the Secretary of the Navy in July 1992 by President George Bush, O'Keefe had previously served as Comptroller and Chief Financial Officer of the Department of Defense since 1989. Before joining then Defense Secretary Dick Cheney's Pentagon management team in these capacities, he served on the United States Senate Committee on Appropriations staff for eight years, and was Staff Director of the Defense Appropriations Subcommittee. His public service began in 1978 upon

selection as a Presidential Management Intern.

O'Keefe is a Fellow of the National Academy of Public Administration, a member of the Committee on Climate Change Science and Technology, and a Fellow of the International Academy of Astronautics. During his academic postings, he was a Visiting Scholar at the Wolfson College of the University of Cambridge in the United Kingdom, a member of the Naval Postgraduate School's civil-military relations seminar team, and conducted seminars for the Strategic Studies Group at Oxford University. He served on the national security panel to devise the 1988 Republican platform and was a member of the 1985 Kennedy School of Government program for national security executives at Harvard University.

In 1993, President Bush and Secretary Cheney presented him the Distinguished Public Service Award. He was the 1999 faculty recipient of the Syracuse University Chancellor's Award for Public Service; recipient of the Department of the Navy's Public Service Award in December 2000; and has been awarded honorary doctorate degrees from several prestigious educational institutions. In March 2003 and 2004, he was recognized and honored by the Irish American Magazine as one of the Top 100 Irish Americans.

He is the author of several journal articles, contributing author of "Keeping the Edge: Managing Defense for the Future" released in October 2000, and in 1998 co-authored "The Defense Industry in the Post-Cold War Era: Corporate Strategies and Public Policy Perspectives."

Sean O'Keefe earned his Bachelor of Arts in 1977 from Loyola University in New Orleans, Louisiana, and his Master of Public Administration degree in 1978 from The Maxwell School. O'Keefe and his wife Laura have three children- Lindsey, Jonathan and Kevin.



Kenneth E. Carpenter, Faculty Athletics Representative

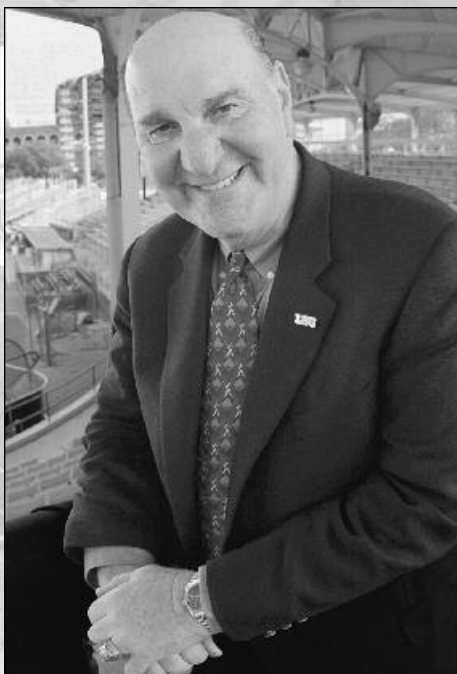
Kenneth E. Carpenter is in his second year as LSU's faculty representative in NCAA and Southeastern Conference matters.

Carpenter, a professor in the School of Architecture, has taught at LSU since 1986. He received his bachelor's degree in architecture from the University of Oklahoma in 1962 and his master's from the University of Minnesota in 1967. Before joining the LSU faculty, he served at Clemson University as associate professor of architecture from 1967-77; Ball State University, where he was professor and chairman of the Department

of Architecture, 1977-81; and, Iowa State University, serving as professor and chairman, Department of Architecture from 1981-86.

At LSU he served as the dean of the College of Design from 1986-1997; Interim Executive Director of International Programs from 1997-98; and Interim Dean of the College of Art and Design from 2001-02.

Carpenter is a member of Phi Kappa Phi, the American Institute of Architects, and the American Association of University Professors.

Already a Louisiana Legend and one of the greatest college baseball coaches of all time, J. Stanley "Skip" Bertman has made the seamless transition into the athletics director's chair with the same enthusiasm, vision and demand for excellence that were trademarks of his stellar coaching career.

In just four years as LSU's director of athletics, Bertman has already added to his impressive list of on-the-field achievements. Under his direction, LSU enjoyed arguably the greatest athletics years in the history of the institution. In 2003-04 three teams won national championships, nine teams finished in the nation's top ten, and fourteen teams ranked in the top 25 and in 2004-05 14 teams advanced to the post-season. LSU teams also enjoyed improved grade point averages across the board, making the LSU student-athlete experience a success on and off the fields of competition.

While supervising the Tigers' progress on the playing fields, he has begun to implement measures necessary to realize his vision of building the LSU athletics department into the best in the country. Bertman's bold and innovative plans promise to keep the Tigers among the nation's elite in all phases of collegiate athletics.

Bertman is now in the midst of upgrading LSU's athletics complex. Working hand in hand with the Tiger Athletic Foundation, Bertman has already overseen the completion of the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes while renovating Tiger Stadium and the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, and constructing the Football Operations Center.

It was also Bertman who took the bold but essential move to implement a seat contribution program in Tiger Stadium to fund facility improvements and ensure the financial stability of the LSU Athletics Department for the next decade.

Bertman was named LSU's athletics director on January 19, 2001. With Bertman, LSU gained an athletics director who provides the leadership and experience necessary to manage the Tigers' \$52 million budget.

Bertman guided LSU to five NCAA baseball titles, and his teams drew huge crowds to venerable Alex Box Stadium, as the Tigers led the nation in attendance in each of his final six seasons (1996-2001).

He also served as head coach of the 1996 U.S. Olympic team which captured the bronze medal in Atlanta.

Bertman continues to be honored for his remarkable coaching tenure, as he was inducted in June, 2002, into the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January, 2003.

In a Baseball America poll published in 1999, Bertman was voted the second greatest college baseball coach of the 20th century, trailing only Rod Dedeaux of Southern California. Bertman and Dedeaux are the only coaches to win five CWS titles.

He had previously earned recognition as one of the nation's brightest assistant coaches while at the University of Miami (Fla.) for eight seasons (1976-83). Before working at Miami, Bertman was renowned for his coaching excellence. In 11 seasons at Miami Beach High School, he directed the Hi-Tides to a state championship and two runners-up finishes and he was named Florida's Coach of the Year on three occasions.

In 1975, Bertman coached at Miami-Dade Downtown, leaving after one season to join legendary head coach Ron Fraser at Miami. The move was a homecoming of sorts, as Bertman spent his collegiate playing days with the Hurricanes as an outfielder and catcher from 1958-60. He earned his B.A. in health and physical education from Miami in 1961 and received his master's degree from UM in 1964.

Bertman and his wife Sandy are the parents of four daughters - Jan, Jodi, Lisa and Lori. The Bertmans have three grandchildren - Sophie Faith and Isaac Stanley, the children of Emile and Lori Bertman Guirard, and Samuel Aaron, the son of Drew and Lisa Pate.

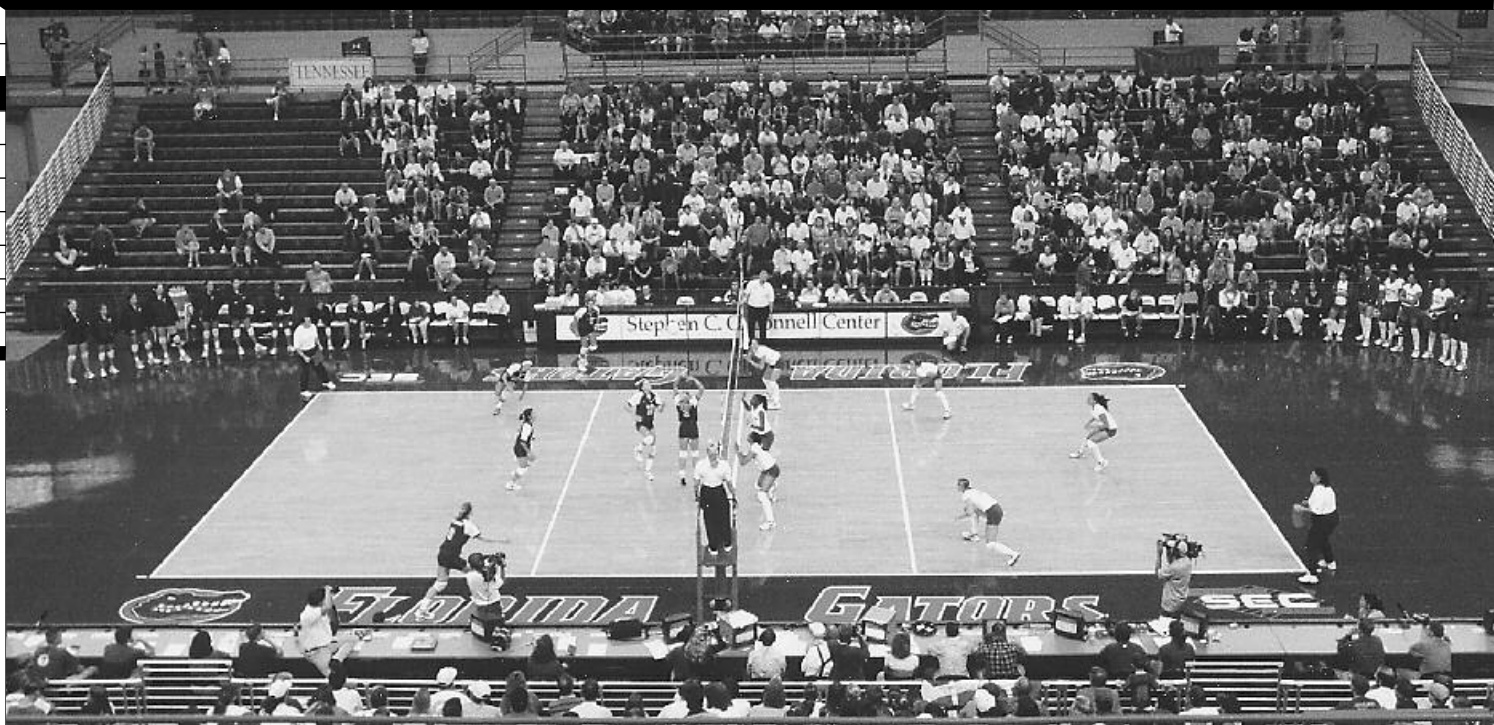

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

The 2000 Tigers advanced through the SEC Tournament to face Florida in the championship game.

Year after year, the Southeastern Conference shows why it is considered to be one of the premier volleyball conferences in the nation. In the 1990's and continuing into the 2000's, the SEC made stellar contributions to the sport of volleyball.

The conference has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in every season for the last 15 years. The SEC had a team reach the Final Four nine of the last 15 seasons, with Florida advancing to the National Championship game against Southern California in 2003.

In 2004, Florida competed in its 14th straight NCAA Tournament. Tennessee, Georgia and Arkansas were also selected to the field.

Since the inaugural SEC volleyball championship in 1979-80, many changes have occurred in the conference. The addition of Arkansas and South Carolina to the league in 1991 brought the divisional format to the sport with five teams competing in the Eastern Division and six teams in the Western Division. The most recent change came in 1999 as the tournament format moved to an eight team field participating in a three-day league tournament.

Along with the popularity growth throughout the country, women's volleyball has also grown in the SEC. A benchmark in that growth came in 1995 when SEC volleyball was first broadcast on SEC-TV on a tape-delay basis. For the past 10 seasons the coverage has grown, especially in the last five years, to live telecasts of several regular season matches and the SEC Tournament championship match. SEC volleyball will continue to enjoy live coverage on SEC-TV in 2005, reaching almost 22 million subscribers in the conference's nine-state region.

A STANDARD OF EXCELLENCE

- ▶ The 2004 season marked the 15th consecutive year the SEC has placed at least two teams in the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ Every team posted wins in double-digits, with three teams posting 20-plus wins in 2004. Tennessee led the way with 32 victories. Florida posted 28 wins, while Alabama notched 21.
- ▶ Florida made its 15th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 14th in a row in 2004, falling in the second round to eventual national champion Stanford
- ▶ Florida's appearance in the National Championship game in 2003 marked the first appearance by the SEC in the title game in conference history.
- ▶ Three players were named AVCA All-Americans and nine players were named to All-Region teams in 2004.
- ▶ In the past 14 years, 775 athletes have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Fran Flory

Head Coach • Eighth Season at LSU

Entering her eighth year at the helm of the Tigers, head coach Fran Flory continues to raise the level of success of the LSU volleyball program and break down barriers that plagued the Tigers in the previous decade.

In her seventh season at the helm of the LSU program, Flory earned her 100th victory as a Tiger in 2004 with a sweep of Louisiana Tech. She also passed former head coach Gerry Owens to become the third winningest head coach in LSU history, needing just 21 wins to move into second place in school history.

Last season, Flory led the Tigers to a third place finish in the Southeastern Conference Western Division, marking the seventh consecutive season LSU finished at least third in the West, including every year in her tenure. She also matched the most overall wins in a season since she has been head coach with 17, including three wins over teams in the NCAA Tournament field.

In addition, junior Ivana Kuzmic was named the Louisiana Sports Writer's Association Louisiana Newcomer of the Year, while she and senior Regan Hood earned first-team All-Louisiana honors. Flory has now guided players to 16 All-Louisiana honors, including nine first-team selections, and every individual award, including player of the year, freshman of the year and newcomer of the year.

Flory's success, however, has not been solely on the court. LSU has had the second-most players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll of any school in the league during her tenure. In four of the past seven seasons, the Tigers have led the conference.

The LSU volleyball program has also been recognized nationally for its academic success, picking up an American Volleyball Coaches Association Academic Award in three of the last six years.

In 2003, Flory guided a youthful Tiger team, one with eight freshmen and no seniors, to a third place finish in the SEC West. In addition, Regan Hood earned All-SEC honors under her tutelage, being named to the second team as a junior. Lauren Leamont was also an All-Freshman selection in the team's inaugural year.

For the first time since she became head coach at LSU, Flory's Tigers defeated South Carolina in Columbia, S.C., on Oct. 19, 2003, knocking off the Gamecocks, 3-1. The win was the first win for LSU in Columbia since 1995.

In 2002, Flory's Tiger team recorded the most wins by any LSU team since posting 17 victories during the 1999 season. The Tigers also picked up back-to-back winning SEC records for the first time since 1992-93. With that came back-to-back runner-up finishes in the SEC Western Division.

LSU became the first team in 19 regular-season SEC matches to take a game from nationally ranked Florida, winning game one. Prior to the game one loss, the Gators last lost a game on Sept. 21, 2001, when they fell behind 2-0 in an eventual 3-2 win over South Carolina in Columbia, S.C. Florida had not lost a regular-season SEC game at home since dropping the third game to the Gamecocks in a 3-1 win on Oct. 8, 2000, a string of 12 consecutive matches.

In 2001, the Tigers recorded the third most conference wins in season history and picked up their first winning conference season since 1995, finishing second in the SEC Western

Division. LSU owned the best intra-division record among Western Division teams at 9-1 while finishing fourth overall in the conference.

Flory guided her 2000 squad to the SEC Tournament Championship match against perennial-powerhouse Florida. Despite the loss in the final, LSU had made a breakthrough as it had not been to the championship match since 1992 and had not won a tournament match since 1993.

Flory's 2000 team also became the first LSU team to beat Arkansas when it did so in three games on the LadyBacks' home floor. She led the Tigers to their first win at Auburn in 10 years en route to a third place finish in the SEC Western Division.

She made an immediate impact at LSU in 1998 as she led the Tigers to a 15-16 record, six games better than the 9-21 mark the team had the year before. More impressive was the five-match improvement in SEC play. After a winless 1997 in conference action under the former head coach, LSU notched five conference victories in 1998 to finish third in the West.

In 1999, Flory led her injury-riddled squad to a 17-15 overall record, the best for an LSU team since the Tigers won 20 matches in 1995. Of the 17 wins, seven came in conference play, also a Tiger best since the 1995 season.

This is Flory's second stint at LSU as the Baton Rouge native was an assistant for four years under LSU's winningest coach, Scott Luster. She served as a graduate assistant coach in 1988, before being named a full-time assistant in 1989. During her four seasons as a member of the Tiger coaching staff, Flory helped LSU to unprecedented success with three SEC championships, three SEC Tournament championships and two Final Four appearances.

After winning the first of the three consecutive conference championships in 1989, Flory and the Tigers became the first school in SEC history to advance to the NCAA Final Four in 1990. The Tigers would duplicate the Final Four feat in 1991, while earning conference titles in both seasons. The 1991 team was the only SEC team to win a game in the Final Four until Florida in 2002.

In 1992, Flory left LSU to assume the head coaching duties at Southeastern Louisiana. In her first season as a Division I head coach, she led the Lions to a 21-13 record. In March 1993, Flory returned to the SEC as she became an assistant coach at Kentucky. Five months later, she was named the Wildcats head coach as then-Kentucky coach Kathy DeBoer was named an Associate Athletic Director at the school.

In her first season at Kentucky, Flory led the Wildcats to a 29-4 record, while advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. For her efforts in the 1993 season, she was named the Tachikara/AVCA Region IV Coach of the Year.

A 1984 graduate of Texas, Flory has also experienced much success as a player. In 1981, she was a member of Texas' AIAW National Championship squad. She received All-Southwest Conference and All-South Region honors during three seasons with the Longhorns.

Following her playing career, Flory was named the head coach at Wittenberg University, where she coached for one season before being named an assistant at Texas A&M for the 1987 season.

The head coach at the University of Southern Indiana from 2002-03, Bere led the Screaming Eagles to one Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament title and to within three points of a second consecutive championship and bid to the NCAA Division II Tournament.

He guided setter Kim Boehmer to honorable mention All-America honors, the first player in USI history to earn the honor, after she was named to the 2002 and 2003 All-GLVC first team. Kristi Kavanaugh was also named a CoSIDA first-team Academic All-American under his helm.

In 2002, Bere led the Screaming Eagles to their first bid in the NCAA Division II Tournament and first tournament win after winning the GLVC Tournament crown. Despite just two seasons at Southern Indiana, he was the third winningest head coach in the program's 24-year history, posting a 47-17 (.734) record.

Prior to taking the job at USI, Bere was an assistant coach at Mississippi State from 1997-2002, where he coached along side current Tiger assistant John Blackwell. He served as the coordinator of the Bulldog defense and worked closely with MSU's outside hitters on the court. Bere coordinated MSU's recruiting efforts and handled additional administrative duties off the court.

A native of Louisville, Kentucky, Bere was a standout four-sport letterman at Doss High School, competing in football, basketball, baseball, and soccer.

He attended Morehead State University, where he was a three-year letterwinner on the Eagle football team and became a member of the men's volleyball club team, leading to his career as a volleyball coach.

He joined Morehead's varsity women's volleyball coaching staff in 1993 as a student assistant. He was appointed to a full-time assistant coach's position in 1994, first as an undergraduate and then as a graduate student.

While Bere was on the Morehead State staff, the Eagles claimed regular season Ohio Valley Conference runner-up honors, captured the OVC Tournament title, and advanced to the 1993 National Invitational Volleyball Classic. In 1995 Morehead State marched to the finals of the OVC Tournament, taking runner-up honors.

A member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, Bere has served as a camp instructor in summer volleyball camps in Alabama, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, and Michigan.

He earned a bachelor's degree in health in 1995 from Morehead State before receiving his master's degree in health, physical education, and recreation in 1997. He is married to his wife, Shannon, who also works at LSU.

Last season as an assistant at Rice, he helped the Owls advance to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history and post a 25-5 record overall, including a 12-1 record in Western Athletic Conference play, the best overall and conference records in school history.

A school-record six players were named to the All-WAC teams, the most of any school in the league, including four on the first team. Additionally, one player earned All-WAC Tournament team honors and one was named to the AVCA All-West Region squad.

In the classroom, the Owls placed one player on the Academic All-America first team and four on the Academic All-District teams.

Prior to his stay at Rice, Blackwell was an assistant coach at Mississippi State, along with current Tiger assistant Craig Bere. In his four years with the Bulldogs, he oversaw MSU's middle blockers and served as the team's recruiting coordinator. In 2004, his recruiting class was ranked in the top 50 nationally by PrepVolleyball.com. In each of his four seasons, the middle blockers led the team in hitting percentage.

Additionally, Blackwell oversaw the Bulldogs in the classroom as the volleyball contact for the athletic academic office. In his tenure, Mississippi State earned the AVCA/Molten academic team award in 2000 and 2001.

From 1996-1999, he was the head coach at NAIA Division I Belhaven College in Jackson, Miss. Under his leadership, the team improved from a 1-29 record in 1996 to a 21-15 mark in 1999 while finishing as the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference runner-up. Ranked fifth in their region his final season, he had five players named to the All-GCAC teams while the program set school records in wins, kills, assists, aces and digs.

Equally as successful in the classroom as on the court, Blackwell's Belhaven teams earned the AVCA team academic award each year and two players were named to the NAIA Academic All-America team.

While working at Belhaven, he was active in the development of club volleyball in Mississippi as the club director and head coach for the Jackson Volleyball Club, founding the first girls volleyball club in the Jackson area in 1996. Helping the club double in size in three years, he also worked at numerous collegiate camps across the southeast.

A 1992 graduate of Millsaps College with a bachelor of business administration degree in accounting, Blackwell began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater in 1992, where he coached the Majors for three seasons.

A three-year basketball standout at John Curtis High School, the New Orleans native is married to the former Jackie Batte. The couple has two sons, Taylor (12) and Carter (8).

FLORY RECORDS 100TH VICTORY AS A TIGER

With a 3-0 win over Georgia on Sept. 24, head coach Fran Flory recorded her 100th win at the helm of the Tiger volleyball program. With a 3-0 win over Louisiana Tech on Sept. 11, Flory passed Gerry Owens to become the third winningest head coach in LSU history behind only Scott Luster and Ruth Nelson.

MIJATOVIC LED SEC, FOURTH IN NCAA IN ACES PER GAME

Jelena Mijatovic led the SEC and ranked fourth in the NCAA in service aces per game. She averaged 0.77 service aces per game, while Jana Milin of Maryland-Eastern Shore led the nation with 0.94 aces per game. Mijatovic's mark would have ranked second in LSU history if she had reached 75 aces for the year (she had 71). Wendy Stammer holds the Tiger record with 0.95 aces per game in 1986.

KUZMIC LED SEC, 16TH IN NCAA IN BLOCKS PER GAME

Ivana Kuzmic led the SEC and ranked 16th in the NCAA in blocks per game. She averaged 1.59 blocks per game, behind Melissa Elmer of Nebraska, who led the nation with 1.89 blocks per game. As a freshman at Arkansas-Little Rock, Kuzmic led the NCAA in blocks per game and she led the Sunbelt Conference each of the last two years. Kuzmic's mark ranks third in the LSU blocks per game record book. Angie Miller holds the school record with a 1.67 blocks per game average in 1991.

HOOD HITS 1,000 CAREER KILLS

With her first kill against No. 10 Florida on Oct. 15, Regan Hood became the 13th player in LSU history with 1,000 career kills. With 1,172 total kills for her career, she ranks 11th in LSU history.

PITTMAN POSTS 700 CAREER/300 SEASON DIGS

With her third dig against Arkansas on Nov. 12, Rachel Pittman recorded her 700th career dig, becoming just the 23rd player in LSU history to record 700 career digs. She finished her career with 785 digs and a 2.36 career digs per game average. For the season, she led the team with 348 digs and 3.19 digs per game. She was the first player since Jennifer Hampton in 2002 to post 300 digs in a season.

PITTMAN NAMED SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Rachel Pittman was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Nov. 15 after leading the team with a 4.43 digs per game average as LSU went 2-0 on the week, knocking off the SEC West Champion Lady'Backs and Ole Miss. Against Arkansas, she led the match with her third 20-plus dig performance of the season as the Tigers recorded only their third win over the Lady'Backs in the programs' 24 meetings. She also posted double-figures with 11 digs against Ole Miss as LSU swept the Lady Rebels on the road for the first time since 2001.

KUZMIC NAMED SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Ivana Kuzmic was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 20 after leading the Tigers with 2.00 blocks per game as LSU went 3-0 for the weekend, defeating three teams that posted 20-win seasons last year. Against Miami, Kuzmic recorded her first double-double of the season with 10 blocks, including four block solos, and 12 kills. It marked just the fourth time in three seasons a Tiger has recorded double-figure block numbers. Two matches later, she came one block shy of repeating the feat, recording nine total blocks against SMU. Additionally, she led the team with 18 kills against the Mustangs.

KUZMIC POSTS QUARTET OF 10+ BLOCK MATCHES

With 14 blocks against Houston to close out the season, back-to-back double-figure block performances against Mississippi State and Ole Miss, and 10 blocks against Miami earlier in the year, Ivana Kuzmic became the first player at LSU to post four double-figure block matches since Stacey Samuels recorded five double-figure performances in 1986. Kuzmic posted 10 blocks against Miami on Sept. 17, 10 vs. Mississippi State on Oct. 1, 11 vs. Ole Miss on Oct. 3 and a season-best 14 against Houston on Nov. 27. She was one of only two players in the SEC with four double-figure block performances.

KUZMIC RECORDS MEMORABLE FIVE-GAME MATCH

Against Houston on Nov. 27, Ivana Kuzmic recorded a season-best 14 total blocks, including six solo blocks, tying her for the sixth most total blocks and second most solo blocks in a five-game match in school history. Her total block mark was 11 behind the school record of 25 recorded by Lisa Smith against Wyoming on Sept. 11, 1987. Her solo block mark was three behind the school record of nine recorded by Lisa Smith against Wyoming on Sept. 11, 1987. It also marked the most total blocks in an LSU match since Miranda Cantu recorded 15 against Auburn in 1994.

MIJATOVIC POSTS THIRD MOST SERVICE ACES

Against South Carolina on Nov. 5, Jelena Mijatovic recorded eight service aces, tying her for the third most service aces in a five-game match in LSU history. The mark is only one behind the school record of nine aces by Sibel Gurkan against Tulane on Sept. 22, 1987 and Lisa Sulatycki against Auburn on Oct. 9, 1988. It also marks the first time since Tonya Johnson on Sept. 1, 1990, that a player recorded eight service aces in a match.

PITTMAN TIED FOR SIXTH MOST DIGS

Against Kentucky on Oct. 24, Rachel Pittman recorded 25 digs in the match, tying her for the sixth most digs in a four-game match in school history. It marked the third match in 2004 that Pittman posted top 10 marks in school history in digs after she recorded the 10th most digs in a three-game match against Wisconsin-Milwaukee and the fourth most digs in a five-game match against Miami. The 25 digs is tied with Luciana Reis and is six behind the school record of 31 by Reis against Kansas in 1993. It also marked the most digs in a four-game match since 1994.

HOOD/MIJATOVIC POST 20-20 MATCHES

Against Arkansas on Nov. 19, Regan Hood recorded 24 kills and 20 digs, giving her the second 20-20 performance of the season. Her 24 kills was a season high, while her 20 digs was a career high.

Against Kentucky on Oct. 24, Jelena Mijatovic recorded 26 kills and 21 digs, giving her the first 20-20 performance of 2004 and the first at LSU since 2002. Her 26 kills is tied for 12th place in LSU history in a four-game match, while the 21 digs is tied for 15th place all-time in a four-game match.

The last time a player recorded 20 kills and 20 digs in the same match was Jennifer Hampton with 24 kills and 24 digs against Ole Miss on Nov. 10, 2002.

TIGERS TIED FOR EIGHTH MOST SERVICE ACES

Against Ole Miss on Oct. 3, the LSU volleyball team recorded 16 service aces, tying them for the eighth most team service aces in a five-game match in school history. The school record for service aces in a five-game match is 20 recorded against Kentucky in 1987. The 16 aces by the 2004 Tiger team marks the eighth time LSU has posted 16 service aces in a five-game match in the program's history.

MIJATOVIC TIED FOR THIRD MOST SERVICE ACES

Against Ole Miss on Oct. 3, Jelena Mijatovic recorded seven service aces, tying her for the third most service aces in a five-game match in LSU history. The mark is only two behind the school record of 10 aces by Wendy Stammer against Texas Tech on Sept. 14, 1986 and one behind Monica Freitas against Texas-Arlington on Nov. 27, 1987. It was the second time this season that Mijatovic recorded seven aces in a match. Against UCF on Sept. 5, she recorded seven aces in the three-game match, which tied for the ninth most in school history.

KUZMIC POSTS SEVENTH MOST BLOCK ASSISTS

Against Ole Miss on Oct. 3, Ivana Kuzmic recorded 11 block assists, tying her for the seventh most block assists in a five-game match in school history. It marked the third of four double-figure blocking performances on the season for Kuzmic and the second in a row. Her mark was five behind the school record of 16 recorded by Lisa Smith against Wyoming on Sept. 11, 1987. It also marked the most block assists in a five-game match since Meagan Davis recorded 11 against San Jose State in 1999.

KUZMIC RECORDS 500 CAREER BLOCKS



Against Arkansas on Nov. 12, transfer Ivana Kuzmic recorded the 500th block of her career and finished the season with 534 career blocks. If she had competed at LSU her entire career, she would rank fourth in career blocks in school history. In 2004, she led the Tigers with 1.59 blocks per game, a mark which ranked third in LSU history. As a freshman at Arkansas-Little Rock, she led the NCAA with 2.16 blocks per game while setting the UALR single-season record for block assists with 180. In 2004, she ranked 38th in the nation with 1.33 blocks per game. For her career, she is averaging 1.68 blocks per game, a mark that would break the current LSU record.

PITTMAN DIGS THE RECORDS

Against Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Sept. 17, Rachel Pittman recorded 19 digs in a match, tying her for the 10th most digs in a three-game match in school history. It marked the second-straight match that Pittman posted top 10 marks in school history in digs after she recorded the fourth most digs in school history in a five-game match against Miami earlier in the day.

The 19 digs is tied with five other players for 10th place in school history and is 11 behind the school record of 30 by Luciana Reis against Arkansas State in 1993. The last time a player recorded 19 digs in a three-game match was setter Daniela Romero against Nebraska in 2003.

Against Miami, Pittman recorded 26 digs in the five-game match. With her career best, the senior became the first player since Jennifer Hampton on No. 7, 2001, to record over 25 digs in a match. Pittman's performance ranked second in a five-game match behind the school record of 28 digs recorded on by Wendy Stammer, Monica Freitas, Daniela Reis and Meg Norwood. It was also tied for the 10th best dig performance overall in school history.

PAIR NAMED TO TEXAS INVITATIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Ivana Kuzmic and Regan Hood were named to the Time-Warner Cable Texas Invitational All-Tournament team. Kuzmic led the team in kills in all three matches and led the team in blocks against Texas and Liberty. She also led the team in hitting percentage in the tournament. Hood ranked second on the team in kills against Texas and Liberty and was third against La. Tech.

HOOD NAMED MVP; THREE ON ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Regan Hood was named the Hurricane France Invitational Most Valuable Player after leading the Tigers to a 3-0 record and the tournament title. Hood led LSU with a 3.25 kills per game average a .310 hitting percentage. In addition, she recorded 13 blocks and 28 digs. Against Rice, she recorded her first double-double of the season with 17 kills and 14 digs. She also led the match in kills in the first match against Central Florida and tied for the team lead in blocks.

Junior Ivana Kuzmic, sophomore Melody Clark and sophomore Daniela Romero were also named to the All-Tournament team. Kuzmic led the team in blocking in all three matches and led the team in kills in the second match against Central Florida. Clark recorded the third most kills and the third-most blocks on the team, while hitting at a .250 clip. Romero recorded 122 assists, while picking up a career-high 22 digs against Rice along with a career-best 54 assists.

In 2005, the LSU volleyball program will begin its 24th season in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, the largest volleyball venue in the Southeastern Conference. The structure, which was renamed in honor of the all-time LSU and NCAA men's basketball scoring leader on July 22, 1988, shortly after his death, seats 14,164 and ranks as one of the finest college athletic arenas in the nation.

On July 1, 2004, the management of the Pete Maravich Center came under the direction of the LSU Athletics Department. The building is now undergoing a multi-year refurbishment that will continue to make it one of the great volleyball venues in the South.

The renovation began two years ago with new television lighting and continued last season with a new roof surface. This season, the inside of the building will see an upgrade as the seats are replaced and the interior is given a complete makeover, continuing the bright look the building had in the 1970s and 1980s.

Also the outside windows of the building now feature the Tiger mascot running around the building, which can be seen for miles as people enter the city on the Mississippi River Bridge. Volleyball fans can also see a redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that play in the building - men's and women's basketball, volleyball and gymnastics.

In 1998, the Tiger volleyball team enjoyed the comforts of a newly renovated locker room. The two-tiered fully carpeted facility features individual cubicles for each athlete, a squad meeting room, and a storage area.

Between 1985 and 1992, the Maravich Center was one of the top home courts in the nation, as LSU ran up a 110-10 (.917) record. During that time, LSU recorded a 37-match home-court win streak, which is the second-longest streak in SEC history.

In 1991, the Tigers enjoyed possibly its finest season in the arena as LSU recorded a perfect 16-0 record. It also advanced to the Final Four through the NCAA South Regional, which was held in Baton Rouge.

The Tigers have now posted seven consecutive seasons without a losing record in the Maravich Center, making it once again a tough place for visiting teams to play. Over that span, LSU has a record of 52-33 (.612).

Since beginning play in the arena in 1982, the Tigers have notched an 246-108 (.695) record. In that time, LSU has posted only three losing records at home.

The Maravich Center has also played host to SEC and NCAA Tournaments for volleyball as well as basketball and gymnastics.

The 1982, 1987 and 1995 SEC Volleyball Championships were all held in the arena. The Maravich Center has also been the site of the three NCAA Championship first round matches as well as the NCAA South Regional in 1991.

The NCAA Women's Basketball First/Second Rounds in 1997, 1999, 2000 and 2004, as well as the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament in 1988, were held in the Maravich Center. The SEC Gymnastics Championships came to the arena in 1999 and the NCAA Central Regionals for gymnastics were held in 2002 and 2004.

Along with the main court area, an auxiliary gym with a recently refinished court is located underground in the north section of the arena. Nearly all Tiger volleyball practices take place in the auxiliary gym.

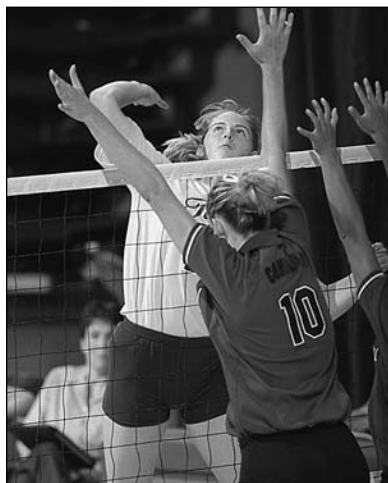
