

"My goal for every student-athlete who competes on my team is to allow and help them develop into a successful person in all aspects of life."

Consistency, it's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

In today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it's virtually impossible to maintain consistency at a high level from year-to-year.

Fran Flory and the LSU volleyball program have defied those odds. The Tigers have exploded for 140 wins and garnered nine American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-America selections since the 2005 season.

Flory has guided LSU to six consecutive SEC Western Division titles and added the overall league championship in 2009, the program's first since 1991. The Tigers also notched their sixth straight NCAA Tournament appearance during the 2010 campaign and are one of only 18 programs in

the nation to accomplish that impressive feat during each of the last six seasons.

Flory has built LSU from the bottom up after taking over a team that posted a 9-21 record which included a 0-15 mark in SEC play during the 1997 season with her ability to identify and develop talent, relate to her players and surround herself with top-notch assistant coaches.

But winning championships is only the beginning of defining the legacy of LSU volleyball.

Flory's goal for every student-athlete who puts on the Tiger uniform is to develop into a successful person in all aspects of life.



Since 2000, 36 players have earned their degree from the University, including five who went on to earn graduate degrees. From 1997 to 2010, 28 of 29 four-year letterwinners have received degrees.

"LSU has everything a student-athlete could ask for, from the facilities to the administration. We expect to win championships and every LSU student-athlete has those expectations. Our teams are committed to winning both on the court and in the classroom.

"Team togetherness and team ownership are two very important factors in our program. Our teams are committed not only to LSU, but also to each other. Team ownership is vital to the success of any team, company or organization. Everyone must have a clear understanding of the goals and direction of the program. We are very careful to define roles and responsibilities so everyone is headed in the same direction."

When athletes sign to play for LSU and Coach Flory, they sign not only to maximize their potential as a volleyball player, but also to maximize their potential as a person.



"My goal for every student-athlete who competes on my team is to allow and to help them develop into a successful person in all aspects of life," Flory said. "When they graduate, I want them to truly feel prepared for the next step in their lives, whatever that may be. We are not just about developing successful volleyball players, our program is about developing successful people."

"Our philosophy is one that we all control our own destiny. Each day we make choices in all aspects of our lives that will influence who and what we become. We strive to provide the freedom and correct environment to make the choices that will prepare our student-athletes for their future."

Now, entering her 14th season, Flory will continue to build on the solid foundation that she has laid out for LSU and continue to design her program around the fundamentals that have made the Tigers a success.

NCAA Final Four Appearances LSU is one of only two schools in SEC history with multiple Final Four appearances. The Tigers went to back-to-back Final Fours in 1990 and 1991.

States won silver in the Games of the XXIII Olympiad played in Los Angeles.

USA Volleyball A2 Team In each of the last four seasons, LSU has won a medal at the USA Adult Open Championships as part of the USA Volleyball Women's National A2 Team. Head coach Fran Flory led her USA A2 Blue squad to an impressive 7-1 mark and captured a gold medal in 2011. Former AVCA All-Americans Brittnee Cooper and Elena Martinez also took home gold in 2008 before Cooper added a silver medal in 2009. Assistant coach Steve Loeswick came away with a bronze medal in 2010.


SEC Regular Season Championships LSU claimed the SEC regular season titles in 1986, 1989, 1990, 1991 and 2009. The '09 Tigers ended Florida's 18-run year at the top of the league. LSU posted undefeated marks in both 1990 and 1991 only dropping six sets during the two-year

Fifth Set Dominance Over the last five seasons, LSU has won 21 of its 33 five-set matches sparked by nine triumphs in 2007. The Tigers overcame a 2-1 deficit to upend No. 14 New Mexico State at the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

SEC Western Division Titles The Tigers have won six consecutive SEC Western Division crowns and are an impressive 47-3 over the last five seasons against their division rivals, including 32 consecutive home wins dating back to the 2004 season.


NCAA Tournament Appearances LSU has made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, which is tied for second-most among SEC schools. The Tigers have strung together six consecutive bids from 2005-10 for a program record passing up the five straight postseason bids recorded between the 1989-93 seasons.

All-Americans The Tigers have 12 AVCA All-Americans in program history, second-most of any SEC school. Brittnee Cooper was one of 14 players to earn AVCA First-Team honors in 2009. LSU garnered a pair of AVCA All-Americans from 2007-09, the first time in program history the Tigers have had two All-Americans in three straight



Media



MEDIA TRAINING

LSU is one of the few schools where student-athletes go through media training to enhance their communication skills. Dr. Tommy Karam and Dr. Shirley White are two experts in the field who give training sessions to studentathletes here on campus. The Academic Center features a mock press conference setting to get student-athletes acclimated to giving interviews in front of both print



and electronic media. Karam and White record the mock interviews on camera and then provide feedback, allowing student-athletes to become more comfortable and confident when doing actual interviews.



SEC ON ESPN

In 2009-10, ESPN and the Southeastern Conference reached a milestone 15-year agreement. ESPN acquired the rights as the exclusive cable home and the syndication

rightsholder for the conference. As part of this historic agreement, LSU made three appearances on ESPNU over the last two seasons highlighted by a 3-0 sweep of No. 6 Florida in 2009 at the Maravich Center.

LSU volleyball celebrates its 30th anniversary at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in 2011, the largest volleyball venue in the SEC. The structure, which was renamed in honor of the all-time LSU and NCAA men's basketball scoring leader on July 22, 1988, seats 13,215 and ranks as one of the finest college athletic arenas in the nation.

Over the last six seasons, the Tigers have racked up a dominant 62-10 (.861) mark at home sparked by a 32-match winning streak versus SEC Western Division opponents.

LSU volleyball moves into a new state-of-the-art locker room facility off the southwest corridor starting in 2011. Decorated by numerous graphics showcasing the program's prominent history, the fully carpeted facility also features a new film, equipment and training rooms.

The auxiliary gym located underground in the north section of the arena was converted to a volleyball only practice facility leading into the 2010 season. Volleyball fans also can see a redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that play in the building.

The Tigers have posted 13 consecutive seasons without a losing record in the Maravich Center under

head coach Fran Flory, making it once again a tough place for visiting teams to play. Over that span, LSU has a record of 114-43 (.726), including double digit wins during four of the last five seasons.

The Maravich Center has played host to SEC and NCAA Tournaments for volleyball, basketball and gymnastics. The 1982, 1987 and 1995 SEC Volleyball Championships were all held in the arena. The Tigers have produced a winning record in 26 of 29 seasons at the PMAC.

Nutrition First

LSU is one of the few schools nationally who maintain a state-of-the-art nutritional program for today's student-athlete. Senior Associate Athletic Trainer Shelly Mullenix coordinates with LSU dining services to provide a balanced training table diet. LSU athletic trainers also meet one-on-one with student-athletes to give them expert nutritional information.

TRAINING



LSU boasts the largest and most complete athletic training facilities in all of collegiate athletics with both the Operations Center and the Broussard Center for Athletic Training in Tiger Stadium. Both are furnished with the latest in technology and equipment. The Operations Center training room features a full view of the practice fields, two hot/cold jacuzzis and an underwater treadmill. The

Broussard Center includes an on-site x-ray room, an in-house pharmacy and a hydrotherapy pool. It is also one of the few collegiate training centers with a full-service pharmacy, vision center and dental center.



Hydrotherapy Treatment

An integral part of rehabbing and developing LSU student-athletes is the operations center's hot/cold jacuzzis and an underwater treadmill in a fully equipped Hydrotherapy room. The Broussard training center boasts the largest hydrotherapy pool in both collegiate and professional sports.

The two story, 22,000 square foot facility contains 20 treatment tables with the newest forms of modalities available, 14 taping stations, a 1,600 square foot rehabilitation area which contains the latest rehabilitation equipment including the Cybex Norm, Woodway treadmills and Body Master select rise equipment. LSU's multi-million dollar athletic training facility is named in honor of Dr. Martin J. Broussard (left), the legendary athletic trainer whose career spanned over 40 years at LSU.

The following nine individuals are the only athletes to have their jerseys retired by LSU. Men's basketball has retired the No. 23 for Pete Maravich, No. 50 for Bob Pettit, Jr., No. 33 for Shaquille O'Neal and No. 40 for Rudy Macklin. Women's basketball retired the No. 33 for Seimone Augustus. Football's only two retired jerseys are the No. 20 worn by Billy Cannon and the No. 37 worn by Tommy Casanova. Baseball retired the No. 15 in honor of longtime coach and former athletics director Skip Bertman and the No. 20 for Ben McDonald. Casanova, Macklin and McDonald joined the prestigious list in May 2009. Augustus became the first woman in LSU Athletics history to have her jersey retired in January 2010.

50 Bob Pettit

Pettit led LSU to its first NCAA Final Four in 1953 and he later became the first player in NBA history to exceed the 20,000-plus point barrier. Pettit is a member of the NBA Hall of Fame, and in 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



23 Pete Maravich

"Pistol Pete," Maravich still holds the NCAA record for career points with 3,667 and for career scoring average with 44.2 points a game. He was selected the National Player of the Year in 1970 after leading the Tigers to the NIT Final Four. He scored 50-plus points an amazing 28 times. He went on to a 10-year professional career and was selected as one of the NBA's 50 greatest players in 1997.



20 Billy Cannon

One of the true legends of college football in the South, Cannon was the 1959 Heisman Trophy winner and helped the Tigers to the 1958 national title. Cannon's most memorable performance came in 1959 against Ole Miss when No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss 3-0 in the fourth quarter. He fielded a punt, broke seven tackles and returned it 89 yards for the 7-3 victory. He went on to a successful 11-year professional career.



33 Shaquille O'Neal

O'Neal was the first pick in the 1992 NBA Draft. He was named MVP of the league in 2000 and was a three-time NBA Finals MVP after leading the Los Angeles Lakers to three World Championships. At LSU, O'Neal averaged 21.6 points and 13.6 rebounds for his career, and in 1991, he was named the World's Amateur Athlete of the Year as well as SEC Athlete of the Year and National Player of the Year. In 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



15 Skip Bertman

A legend in the college baseball ranks, Bertman created a dynasty at LSU, guiding the Tigers to five national titles in a 10-year stretch from 1991-2000. He also coached the United States to a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and was an assistant on the gold medal-winning U.S. squad in Seoul, Korea, in 1988. Bertman retired from coaching following the 2001 season and served as LSU's athletics director for seven years. Bertman was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006.

About LSU Retired Jerseys

The retirement of the jerseys of Casanova, McDonald, Macklin and Augustus comes under a new provision of the LSU jersey retirement bylaws that says the retirement of an athlete's jersey in a particular sport does not preclude a current student-athlete in that sport from wearing the jersey number in that or any other sport, subject to the discretion of the head coach. This provision applies only to jerseys retired after January 1, 2007, so the numbers worn by Maravich, Pettit, O'Neal, Cannon and Bertman may never again be worn by future student-athletes in their respective sports. To have a jersey retired at LSU, an athlete must have completed intercollegiate competition for LSU a minimum of five years prior to nomination. Athletes must have demonstrated truly unusual and outstanding accomplishments, exceeding and in addition to all criteria used for Hall of Fame selection. Nominees must have a unanimous vote of support from the Hall of Fame committee.


Rudy Macklin 4

Rudy Macklin was a two-time basketball All-American selection during his Tiger career from 1976-81 during which time he became LSU's all-time leading rebounder with 1,276 boards and the second-leading scorer in school history behind only the legendary Pete Maravich with 2,080 points. He led the Tigers to two Elite Eight appearances and the 1981 Final Four in Philadelphia. He still holds the school single game rebound record with 32, a mark like some of the great records in any sport that may never be broken.



Tommy Casanova Tommy Casanova is the only three-time All-American in

the history of LSU football and is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame. During his Tiger career from 1969-71, Casanova personified versatility for his myriad of talents as he played offense, defense, returned punts and kickoffs. One of just two three-time All-SEC performers at LSU, he played six seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals of the NFL while earning his medical degree.

He was selected by the Baltimore Orioles as the No. 1 pick in the major league draft in 1989 and went on to enjoy a 10-year major league career with the Orioles and the Milwaukee Brewers.



The level of opportunity for the 2011 LSU volleyball team is endless. For Tiger players, the anticipation for the season began last December after a tough loss to Tulsa during the NCAA Tournament First Round handed the group a wrong ending to a memorable 25-5 campaign.

A core group of returnees fueled by All-SEC performers Michele Williams and Desiree Elliott coupled with a top 20 recruiting class from PrepVolleyball.com has positioned LSU to make a run at its unprecedented seventh consecutive SEC Western Division title and NCAA Tournament appearance.

"Our strength in the middle with Michele and Desi is definitely one of the major building blocks for our team and for our 2011 season," head coach Fran Flory said. "They've been through a lot since they've been at LSU. They know how hard they have to work and what it takes to be successful on this level. As a program, we know the target on our back doesn't get any smaller. Our players have come to embrace the rising expectations with each year we continue to perform at a high level."

With the combined drive of five upperclassmen that each saw action in over 100 sets last season, youth will still be a big part of LSU's 2011 squad. With 11 underclassmen on a roster of 16, the Tigers will see a few new faces sprinkled into the lineup.

"The ingredients of this group are different after losing veteran players like Angela Bensend, Brittney Johnson and Tania Schatow," Flory said. "It's fun as a coach to mesh together a talented group with so much ability and work them into a unit that can function at a very high level."

LSU has put together an impressive 140-44 record and averaged 23.3 wins per season since 2005. The Tigers are one of only 18 programs in the nation to collect six straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

Flory has once again tested her squad with another series of high-caliber opponents. The Tigers will play 12 matches versus 2010 NCAA Tournament foes and rely on their dominating 62-10 home record during their six-year run.

"We're looking forward to the challenge to uphold LSU volleyball's championship tradition," Flory said. "Our young team will play an up-tempo, exciting brand of volleyball. We'll have a lot of competition for playing time, and I believe we'll have some very spirited practices once fall camp begins. We still have a lot of work to do before taking the floor on August 26, but it will be exciting to see how this group develops."

Below is a look at the 2011 Tigers position-by-position.

MIDDLE BLOCKERS

Senior Michele Williams and sophomore Desiree Elliott give LSU a dynamic 1-2 punch in the middle. Both were All-SEC performers in 2010 with Elliott capturing the SEC's Freshman of the Year award. The duo teamed to rack up 600 kills which accounted for 39 percent of LSU's offense last season.

Williams, an AVCA All-South Region Honorable Mention pick, powered home 3.12 kills per set to check in at eighth place in the SEC rankings. She blasted 13 of her 18 double figure kill performances against league opponents and registered 90 blocks, tied for second-most on the team.

Elliott broke loose for over a .300 hitting percentage in 20 of LSU's 30 matches highlighted by a .337 clip to pace SEC freshman in league play. She also was dominant at the net en route to a team-best 109 blocks and




a 1.02 per set average which was 10th in the SEC.

"We are fortunate to have two outstanding middles in Michele and Desi that bring something unique to the table," Flory said. "I think Michele is extremely motivated for her senior year and has a lot of confidence which will show on the court. Desi has a chance to build on her very special freshman season. She picks things up quickly on the court and continues to maximize her athletic ability."

Freshmen Marissa Maas, Madi Mahaffey and Brittani Peska are additional candidates that can see time in the middle. Maas notched multiple 23-5A All-District honors as a standout at Travis High School in Texas, while Mahaffey secured 6A All-State First-Team accolades at Vestavia High School in Alabama. Peska is a versatile threat who could also see swings at right side.

"Our depth at middle is a strength of this team," Flory said. "Marissa, Madi and Brittani come to us with a solid base of fundamentals and will raise the level of play on both sides of the net in our gym significantly. They still have individual things to work on, but each possess attributes that fit directly into our system."

OUTSIDE HITTERS/RIGHT SIDE

Junior Madie Jones is the lone upperclassmen and headlines a young group of gifted outside hitters. She broke into the starting lineup during the final 11 matches of the season and popped 10 of her 13 double digit kill performances in SEC play. Her 283 kills at a 2.64 per set ratio ranked third on the team in both categories.

Freshmen Helen Boyle and Avery Striebel also will compete for time on the outside. Boyle won a pair of 4A state championships while at St. Joseph's Academy in Missouri and was a three-time 4A All-State First Team pick. She also claimed 2010 St. Louis Post-Dispatch Player of the Year and participated at the 2010 USA Volleyball's Women's Junior A2 Program.

Coming off a medical redshirt, Striebel looks to show her talents after she picked up 2009 Carolina 3A Conference Player of the Year for Cardinal Gibbons High School in North Carolina. She also collected three state championships during her prep career.

"We're pleased with Madie's development," Flory said. "We'll rely upon her to do a lot for us this season, and I believe she can take that next step like Angela did for us last season to become an All-SEC caliber player. Both Avery and Helen know how to win. They have a enormous amount of shot-making ability and can make good things happen on the court."

On the right side, Nicole Willis is looking to take the next step after seeing limited action as a freshman last season. The southpaw chipped in seven kills, eight digs and four blocks over 12 sets of action. She came away with three CAP All-Conference First-Team selections during her prep career at Needham Broughton High School in North Carolina.

Peska, a multiple All-District 5A-17 performer from Taylor High School in Texas, will be in the mix on the right side when not taking swings in the middle.

"We feel great about the progress that Nicole continues to make," Flory said. "I'm confident she's ready to step forward and rise to the challenges that are ahead."

SETTERS

For the second straight season, LSU will have to reload to fill a hole left in one of the most critical positions on the court. Waiting in the wings are sophomore Shelby Pursley and freshman Malorie Pardo to fill the void left by Brittney Johnson, an AVCA All-South Region Honorable Mention performer.

Pursley distributed 8.00 assists per set during her three matches as LSU's backup setter in 2010. She received two All-Central Florida First-

Team picks and was named 2009 Seminole County Player of the Year while at Winter Springs High School.

Pardo was showered with a variety of awards during her prep career highlighted by 2009 & 2010 TGCA All-State and 2009 District MVP out of Pearland High School in Texas. She also was selected to play at the 2008 USA Girls Youth Team High Performance Championships.

"Great programs have two good setters, and we're excited about what this young pair can bring to the table" Flory said. "Both Shelby and Malorie possess a tremendous work ethic and are outstanding students of the game. A major key to our season will be the ability of this pair to put our hitters into good situations and become playmakers in our high octane offense."

DEFENSIVE SPECIALIST/LIBERO

LSU returns all three members of its stout back row that garnered a 97 percent serve-receive effort coupled with an impressive 65 percent sideout efficiency during SEC play. The Tigers also scooped up 15.98 digs per set last season, second-highest in the SEC.

Senior Lauren Waclawczyk anchored the unit behind 425 digs for the second consecutive season, and is on the verge of becoming the 11th player in program history to eclipse 1,000 career digs. Her 4.05 digs per set were sixth in the SEC sparked by 27 double digit digs efforts. The San Antonio, Texas, native cranked a team-high 28 aces fueled by a deadly jump serve.


Juniors Sam Delahoussaye and Meghan Mannari also were key cogs to LSU's ability to play excellent defense and pass well. Both amassed over 250 digs en route to securing 10 or more digs on 13 occasions apiece. The duo also combined for 42 perfect-passer ratings as the Tigers won 35 of 36 sets when posting a 70 percent or better sideout rating last season.

Victoria Jacobson and Brittany Steele, a pair of sophomores, will add depth to the backcourt. Steele played sparingly during her freshman campaign, but averaged 0.82 digs per frame in her 11 sets of action. Jacobsen was used primarily as a serving specialist with nine of her 15 appearances coming during SEC play.

"Our philosophy will continue to be that the first touch is the most important," Flory said. "The back row did a phenomenal job of making match-changing plays when we needed them the most last season. Lauren, Meghan and Sam are all extremely comfortable playing with each other. I don't doubt that they'll continue to provide our team with outstanding energy and having another year in our system will only benefit this group."

Fran Flory HEAD COACH

Fran Flory charges into her 14th season at the helm of the LSU volleyball program, and has guided the Tigers back to the national spotlight during her tenure in Baton Rouge.

LSU has been nothing short of spectacular and continues to raise its level of success under Flory. Dating back to the 2005 season, the Tigers have won six consecutive SEC Western Division crowns and are one of only 18 programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last six seasons. The six straight division titles is the second-longest streak in SEC history, while the six consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances are a program record.

LSU has posted 23.3 wins per season and spent 50 weeks ranked inside the Bison/AVCA Top 25 poll climbing as high as No. 10 on two occasions during the six-year run. The Tigers also have tallied eight American Volleyball Coaches Association [AVCA] All-South Region First-Team picks, including a pair of AVCA All-Americans from 2007-09 for the first time in program history.

LSU raced out to a program-best 13-0 start to open the 2010 season. Angela Bensend and Desiree Elliott collected All-SEC First-Team accolades to give the Tigers multiple picks on the league's premier squad for the fourth time in the last five seasons. Elliott also notched SEC Freshman of the Year status as LSU racked up a 25-5 record

LSU climbed to new heights in 2009 and claimed the SEC overall championship to

close Florida's 18-year reign at the top of the conference. The Tigers finished with a 25-7 record highlighted by a pair of historic wins over the Gators, including their first win in UF's O'Connell Center since 1991.

LSU returned to the NCAA Tournament and rolled past Tulane during their opener before falling in a five-set affair to Texas A&M in the second round.

Following the successful season, the individual accolades began to pour in for the Purple and Gold. Flory was recognized as the AVCA South Region, SEC and Louisiana Coach of the Year. Brittnee Cooper added to LSU's rich heritage with the program's first SEC Player of the Year award along with AVCA All-America First-Team honors to join the elite company of Monique Adams (1991) and Angie Miller (1992). She headlined the SEC and ranked among the NCAA's Top 20 in blocks and hitting percentage. Her .409 hitting clip also set a

program single-season mark.

Under Flory's guidance, LSU has secured 34 All-SEC selections, including 14 First-Team picks. Cooper was joined by Sam Dabbs and Marina Skender to become the first Tiger trio to notch All-SEC First-Team honors in the same season. Elena Martinez notched 2007 & 2008 SEC Defensive Player of the Year in addition

to AVCA All-America Honorable Mention accolades. She finished her career second in program history reeling in 1,414 digs and her professional team, Llaneras de Toa Baja in Puerto Rico, earned a runner-up finish in 2010.

LSU has dominated with 41 All-Louisiana selections highlighted by 24 First-Team honors. The five-time Louisiana Coach of the Year also has led her players to every individual state award, including four players, four freshmen, two defensive players and two newcomers of the Year.

LSU has been represented on the national stage as a part of USA Volleyball Women's A2 National Team in each of the last four seasons. Flory captured a gold medal in 2011 after leading the USA A2 Blue squad to a 7-1 record. Cooper and Martinez won gold at the USA Adult Open Volleyball Championships in May 2008, Cooper added a silver medal in May 2009 and assistant coach Steve Loeswick garnered a bronze medal in May 2010.

Flory's success at LSU, however, hasn't been solely on the court. The Tigers have registered the second-most players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll of any school in the league during her tenure, leading the league on four occasions. LSU also has been recognized nationally for its academic success, picking up an AVCA Academic Award three times.

The 2008 Tigers overcame injuries and finished the regular season with six straight wins to collect their fourth straight divisional title. Cooper emerged as one of the top middle blockers in the nation en route to All-SEC, All-Louisiana, AVCA All-South Region First-Team and AVCA All-America Honorable Mention accolades.

LSU compiled a stellar 25-8 campaign in 2007. The Tigers broke through with an NCAA Tournament victory, a gritty five-set triumph over New Mexico State, in its third-straight year in the postseason. Lauren DeGirolamo and Kyna Washington took home All-SEC First-Team honors, while DeGirolamo teamed with Martinez for AVCA All-America Honorable Mention.

The Tigers made the 2006 season a year to remember after racking up a 26-6 mark. The 26 victories and No. 19 final national ranking were accomplished for the first time in program history since the 1992 season. LSU also won the SEC Western Division crown outright setting a program mark along the way with 16 league victories.

Flory garnered her second consecutive Louisiana Coach of the Year award. Daniela Romero tacked on AVCA All-America Honorable Mention after securing All-SEC First Team and Louisiana Player of the Year. She was joined by Skender to give the Tigers two All-SEC First-

Team picks for the first time since 1999.

LSU's return to volleyball prominence began in 2005 as the Tigers finished 21-8 sharing its first SEC Western Division championship and garnered its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1992. After Hurricane Katrina turned the Maravich Center into the largest field hospital in the United States, LSU played its first 17 matches on the road traveling over 14,000 miles.

Ivana Kuzmic became LSU's first All-American since 1992 after being named All-SEC First Team and Louisiana Player of the Year. Skender added SEC Freshman of the Year and Second-Team accolades. LSU totaled a pair of second-place finishes and five third-place showings in the SEC West over Flory's first seven seasons. She made an immediate impact on the program moving LSU within a game of

the .500 mark in 1998 after the Tigers went winless in SEC action the year before.

The 1999 Tigers improved to 17-15 overall as Meagan Davis and Kelly Thompson notched All-SEC First-Team accolades. In 2000, LSU took another step forward making the SEC Tournament finals. Despite the setback, LSU broke a six-year winless draught at the SEC Tournament.

The Tigers picked up its first winning conference record under Flory during the 2001 season. LSU won nine of its 10 matches against Western Divisions squads en route to a second-place finish. Flory kept the momentum going into 2002 and strung together back-to-back SEC winning seasons for the first time since 1992-93.

LSU bounced back from an 11-19 mark in 2003 and fired back with a 17-12 record during the 2004 season. Kuzmic earned Louisiana Player of the Year as the Tigers won three matches against NCAA Tournament squads.

This is Flory's second stint at LSU as the Baton Rouge native served as an assistant for four seasons under LSU's winningest coach, Scott Luster. She served as a graduate assistant in 1988, before being named a full-time assistant prior to the 1989 season.

During her four seasons with the Tigers, Flory helped LSU to unprecedented success with three SEC championships, three SEC Tournament championships and two Final Four appearances, the first school in SEC history to advance to the NCAA Final Four.

Flory left LSU to assume the head coaching duties at Southeastern Louisiana in 1992. In her first season as a head coach, SLU turned in a 21-13 record. She returned to the SEC as an assistant coach at Kentucky in 1993. Five months later, Flory assumed the head coaching duties when Kathy DeBoer, who is currently the Executive Director of the AVCA, was named Associate Athletic Director.

The 1993 Wildcats stormed to a 29-4 record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round. For her efforts, Flory was named the Tachikara/AVCA Region IV Coach of the Year. She remained at Kentucky through the 1997 season.

Before entering coaching, Flory experienced a successful playing career at the University of Texas. She was a member of the Longhorns 1981 AIAW National Championship squad. She received AII-Southwest Conference and AII-south Region honors during her three seasons. Flory graduated from Texas in 1984 and was named head coach at Wittenberg University in 1986, where she coached for one season before moving on to Texas A&M as an assistant coach.

A member of the AVCA and chair of the NCAA Rules Committee starting in Fall 2010, Flory has assisted in coordinating both the Louisiana Senior Olympic Games and the Special Olympics; hosting the 2001 Senior Olympic Games. She also is a member of the United States Volleyball Association coaching accreditation program.

Flory and her husband, Ken, live in Baton Rouge. The couple has a daughter, Lindsay (14), and a son, Nicholas (12).

Steve Loeswick moves into his fifth season as an assistant coach on the LSU volleyball staff. Loeswick's main duties with the Tigers include setter training, film and opponent breakdown along with lead beach coach responsibilities during the spring season.

Loeswick has been a key component as LSU has won four consecutive SEC Western Division titles sparked by the 2009 SEC overall championship, the program's first since 1991. The Tigers also have accumulated 93 victories and are one of 25 programs nationally to put together four straight NCAA Tournament appearances fueled by a trio of 25-win campaigns in 2007, 2009 and 2010, respectively.



A former setter, Loeswick developed Brittney Johnson into an American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-South Region Honorable Mention performer in 2010. The Tigers started the season with a program-best 13-0 record. LSU's offense boasted 14.35 kills per set on a .260 team hitting percentage which not only ranked among the SEC's best, but the NCAA's Top 25 in both categories.

Loeswick also molded transfer Sam Dabbs into a 2009 All-SEC First-Team selection and AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recipient. She passed out 2,089 assists during her two-year career to join LSU's setting legacy of former All-Americans Daniela Reis (1991 & 1992) and Daniela Romero (2006).

After the Tigers defeated No. 6 Florida for the first time since 1991, Dabbs was the first player in program history to be selected AVCA National Player of the Week on October 13, 2009. Between Dabbs and Johnson, the Tigers have checked in among the NCAA's Top 30 in assists per set, hitting percentage and kills per set during each of the last two seasons.


LSU's offense was retooled under Loeswick in 2007 after the graduation of Romero. The Tigers used the setting tandem of Johnson and Maggie Lonergan to distribute 1,587 assists. LSU raced out to a 15-2 start and emerged with a five-set triumph of No. 14 New Mexico State in NCAA Opening Round.

During his tenure at LSU, the quartet of Brittnee Cooper, Lauren DeGirolamo, Marina Skender and Kyna Washington have eclipsed the 1,000-kill plateau. Skender is one of only five players to record 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs. The Tigers have racked up a bounty of awards and featured at least two players on the AVCA All-South Region First Team during three of his first four seasons.

LSU has notched 11 All-SEC selections since 2007 highlighted by Cooper's 2009 SEC Player of the Year, Desiree Elliott's 2010 SEC Freshman of the Year and Elena Martinez's 2007 & 2008 SEC Defensive Player of the Year award.

Loeswick guided LSU to its first beach championship as all four Tiger squads made the gold bracket playoff on the sands of Siesta Key, Fla.

in April 2010. He also represented LSU on the national stage as an assistant coach of the USA National A2 Red Team and received a bronze medal for his efforts at the 2010 USA Adult Open Volleyball Championships.

Prior to his arrival at LSU, Loeswick spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Oklahoma from 2004-06. As a member of 2006 AVCA Central Regional Coach of the Year Santiago Restrepo's staff, Loeswick aided the Sooners record turnaround in 2006 highlighted by a 28-6 record and a trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The 28 victories and .824 winning percentage were school records, while the 15 more league wins marked the best one-year turnaround in Big 12 history.

OU finished the 2006 season ranked No. 12 in the AVCA poll, its highest ranking in program history as Elaine Santos and Joanna Schmitt notched All-America honors. Santos also tallied Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, while Anna Monsen picked up Big 12 Libero of the Year.

Prior to Oklahoma, Loeswick served as an assistant coach for six seasons at Cornell. During his tenure, the Big Red racked up a 93-38 record and 16 All-Ivy League selections, including 2000 Player of the Year Robin Moore. Cornell posted a top three finish in the Ivy League standings during three of Loeswick's final four seasons, including a 21-4 mark and a second-place finish in 2003.

Loeswick began his coaching career in 1997 where he was an assistant coach for the Martinus Club, a professional women's club in Holland, for one season. He entered coaching after a year of playing in Germany's top professional volleyball league.

A four-year starting setter for the University of Southern California, Loeswick was just the third Trojan to start in a single position for all four seasons. As a freshman, he ranked 10th nationally with 15.86 assists per game before earning 1993 Volleyball Monthly All-Freshman Team honors and being named to the 1996 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation All-Academic Team.

In 1993 and 1994, Loeswick participated in the U.S. Olympic



LSU fired out to a program-best 13-0 to start the 2010 campaign. Angela Bensend collected All-SEC First-Team honors after leading the league for most of the season in kills per set. The Tiger offense ripped 14.35 kills per set on a .260 team hitting percentage to not only rank among the SEC leaders, but the NCAA's Top 25 in both categories.

LSU has placed two players on the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-South Region First Team in three of her four seasons, while Brittnee Cooper added to the program's storied tradition as the first SEC Player of the Year in 2009. In the process, Cooper also joined the elite company of Monique Adams (1991) and Angie Miller (1992) as an AVCA All-America First-Team selection. The Tigers also have had Sam Dabbs, Lauren DeGirolamo, Elena Martinez and Marina Skender take home AVCA All-America Honorable Mention status since 2007.

LSU has garnered 11 All-SEC selections sparked by eight First-Team picks. Desiree Elliott, LSU's first freshman to claim All-SEC First Team since 1981, also tallied 2010 SEC Freshman of the Year. In 2009, Cooper, Dabbs and Skender became the first LSU trio to pick up All-SEC First-Team accolades during the same season. Both Cooper and DeGirolamo also eclipsed 1,000 career kills in 2009.

Elena Martinez capped her illustrious career with back-to-back SEC Defensive Player of the Year awards in 2007 and 2008. She reeled in 1,414 career digs, second-most in program history. Her and Cooper teamed for a gold medal as part of the USA National A2 Red Team at the 2008 USA Adult Open Volleyball Championships.

Skender and Kyna Washington surpassed the 1,000 career kills plateau during the 2007 season. The duo was the first pair of juniors since Nyla Shepherd and Julie Stempel to accomplish this historic feat since LSU's run to the Final Four in 1990.

The future is bright for LSU as the Tigers incoming freshman class for 2011 received a No. 18 national ranking from PrepVolleyball. com. Helen Boyle, Marissa Maas, Madi Mahaffey and Malorie Pardo were all ranked among PrepVolleyball.com's Senior Aces Top 150.

Prior to LSU, Lytle Wilson spent one season as an assistant coach at Wake Forest. The Demon Deacons matched a school record for most ACC wins in 2006. She trained the outside and right side hitters on the court in addition to serving as team travel coordinator, recruiting assistant and camp director assistant off the court.

Lytle Wilson was an assistant coach at the University of North Carolina from 2002-2004. The Tar Heels put together a 32-4 record en route to the 2002 ACC regular season championship, its first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance and a No. 11 final national ranking during her first season. Laura Greene took home the 2002 ACC Player of the Year award and was an AVCA All-America Third-Team pick.

UNC posted another 20-win season in 2003 despite losing four starters, while Molly Pyles picked up an AVCA All-America Honorable Mention selection in 2004.

Before joining the North Carolina staff, Lytle Wilson served as a graduate assistant at Tennessee-Martin in 2001. The Skyhawks compiled a 24-7 record and won the Ohio Valley Conference regular season title.

Lytle Wilson started her coaching career at LSU as a student assistant in 2001 while earning her Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. She was a four-year starter at outside hitter from 1997-2000 and ranked sixth in the SEC with 23 service aces during her senior campaign. LSU also appeared in the 2000 SEC Tournament finals.

One of the hardest workers on her team and considered one of the most determined players Flory has ever coached, Lytle Wilson played in 98 career matches, being limited only by a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee suffered 11 matches into her junior season.

A three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, Lytle Wilson also was the Tigers' representative on the women's at-large SEC Good Works Team in 1999-2000. Her good works didn't go unnoticed as Lytle Wilson was named the LSU Student-Athlete Volunteer of the Year in 2000. She served on the CHAMPS Student-

BEST START EVER

After running through the non-conference schedule with a trio of tournament titles, LSU made program history and secured the team's first 13-0 start with a sweep at Mississippi State [Sept. 26].

In the process, the Tigers eclipse the 12-0 mark set by the 1991 team during LSU's second consecutive Final Four run.

"I'm proud of our team because we made a great step," head coach Fran Flory said after the Mississippi State match. "I challenged them before the match in the locker room and asked them are we going to make history or let history make us. I'm proud of their response."

During the run, LSU posted eight sweeps and registered a .288 team hitting percentage. The Tigers claimed wins over 2009 NCAA Tournament teams Texas A&M [Aug. 28], TCU [Sept. 3] and Rice [Sept. 11]. Angela Bensend posted an impressive 4.56 kills and 3.12 digs per set to fuel the Tigers.

Conversely, the Tiger defense held their opponents a .148 clip and limited the opposition to under a .100 ratio four times.

SIX STRAIGHT SEC WESTERN DIVISION CROWNS

LSU ran away with its sixth consecutive SEC Western Division title by a four-match margin. The Tigers clinched the crown with a 3-0 rout of South Carolina [Nov. 19]

LSU's championship run started in 2005 when the Tigers shared the division crown with Arkansas. The Tigers have won the division title outright over the last five seasons and are an impressive 47-3 [.940] against fellow Western Division foes, including a stretch of 39 wins of its 40 matches going back to the 2006 season.

LSU and Florida as the only two programs in the conference to win sixstraight divisional titles. The Gators won 14 Eastern Division titles from 1995-2008, sharing the title with Tennessee in 2004.

SIX STRAIGHT NCAA TOURNAMENT BERTHS

LSU racked up its sixth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth in 2010 and earned a national seed for the second straight season.

The No. 13 seeded Tigers were shipped to Norman, Okla. to square off against No. 22 Tulsa. The match was one of only three NCAA First Round tilts to feature two ranked teams.

Tyler Henderson, the nation's leader in kills per set, ripped 26 spikes on a .435 hitting percentage to vault the Golden Hurricane past LSU. Tulsa extended the nation's longest winning streak at the time to 30 straight matches.

"We had a great season, but the wrong ending for this group," Flory said. "They played hard, but Tulsa is a very talented team. We knew Tyler Henderson was the real deal, and she certainly showed that tonight. Tonight doesn't diminish what this team accomplished this season. At this time last year, no one could have dreamt we would be in this position."

Overall, LSU made its 12th NCAA appearance. The Tigers are one of only 18 programs in the nation with an active streak of six straight NCAA Tournament berths.

LSU was joined by five other SEC teams, but Florida was the only league team to appear in the Sweet 16. The Tigers are one of only three teams in the SEC [Florida and Tennessee] to advance to the NCAA Final Four, making appearances in both 1990 and 1991.

BENSEND LEADS FROM THE FRONT

Angela Bensend had a banner senior campaign en route to All-SEC and All-Louisiana First Team picks. She also was selected Louisiana's Player of the Year and was the fifth Tiger to collect the state's top honor.

"Angela truly carried our team during several key matches this season," head coach Fran Flory said. "She performed like an all-conference first-team member all season. She's the ultimate team player, and was a key part to our success."

Bensend cranked a team-best 383 kills and her 3.68 per set average ranked third in the SEC. She racked up 10 or more kills 22 times.

During non-conference play, Bensend notched a trio of All-Tournament Team selections, including MVP honors at the TCU Molten Invite. She powered home 20 kills and added up a career-best 26 digs versus TCU [Sept. 3]. It was LSU's first 20-20 performance since former All-American Marina Skender at Alabama on Oct. 8, 2006.

Bensend was second on the squad with 283 digs at a 2.72 per set clip and compiled nine doubles-doubles for the season. She finished her career with 956 kills, 44 shy of becoming the 18th player in program history to reach the 1,000-mark. LSU tallied a solid 34-3 clip over Bensend's career when she reached double figure kills.



ELLIOTT SHINES IN FRESHMAN SEASON

Desiree Elliott turned in a memorable rookie season for the Tigers and became the first LSU player since Leah Bennent in 1981 to notch All-SEC First-Team accolades as a freshman.

Elliott secured the SEC's and Louisiana's Freshman of the Year awards after she connected for over a .300 hitting percentage in 20 of 30 matches, including 14 times during SEC play. Her .337 clip first among freshmen and seventh overall, during conference play.

"We knew Desiree was a special player," head coach Fran Flory said. "She has already left her mark on our program and in the SEC. Being named the SEC Freshman of the Year and to the All-SEC First Team as a freshman is no small feat."

Elliott won four SEC Freshmen of the Week awards throughout the season to join former All-Americans Marina Skender and Lauren DeGirolamo, who accomplished that same feat during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, respectively.

Elliott belted 10 or more kills on 13 occasions highlighted by a 20-spike performance at Kentucky (Nov. 14). She also paced the Tigers with 109 blocks, while her 1.07 per frame average ranked sixth in SEC matches.

Following the season, Elliott was one of 19 players nationally to be chosen a CVU.com Rising Star.



FLORY CAPTURES GOLD WITH USA A2 TEAM

Fran Flory secured a gold medal as part of the USA National A2 Blue Team at the USA Volleyball Open National Championships held during the end of May at the Dallas Convention Center.

Flory's USA A2 Blue squad won seven of its eight matches at the tournament and defeated the USA A2 Red team in four sets during the first title match [19-25, 25-23, 25-18, 25-23] to gain revenge on its lone sethack.

"It's a great honor anytime you get to represent the USA," Flory said. "This was a wonderful experience in every capacity. All of the players and staff are not only great players, but they're great people. Our team goal was to win the tournament, and our team showed great poise and resiliency in coming back to succeed. Every player made significant contributions throughout the tournament, and our team played very well together. To not only have this opportunity but to win gold was very rewarding."

It marked the fourth consecutive season that LSU has won a medal at the event. Brittnee Cooper and Elena Martinez won gold in 2008, while Cooper picked up a silver medal in 2009. Assistant coach Steve Loeswick came away with a bronze medal in 2010.

WILLIAMS GETS AVCA ALL-REGION AND ALL-SEC NOD

Michele Williams garnered an All-SEC Second-Team pick along with American Volleyball Coaches Association [AVCA] All-South Region Honorable Mention status.

Williams powered home 334 kills and her 3.12 per set average is eighth in the SEC. She notched double digit kills 18 times sparked by 13 efforts during SEC play.

The Magnolia, Texas, product attacked at over a .300 hitting percentage on 17 occasions and was second on the team with 90 blocks.

"Michele is one of the most versatile players in our conference," Flory

said. "Her willingness to swing on the outside and play a different role has made a tremendous impact on the success of our season. For Michele to be honored as one of the conference's top players while playing that role is a true tribute to her athleticism and work ethic."

JOHNSON NABS ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

Brittney Johnson notched ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Second-Team honors as voted upon by the College Sports Information Directors of America [CoSIDA]. It marked the fourth straight season that LSU has had at least one player secure a spot on the prestigious academic list.

Johnson, a two-time Jesse Owens Award recipient which is given to highest GPA for a LSU African-American student-athlete, has been a major part of LSU's offensive success.

Johnson also represented LSU on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. She was joined by Victoria Jacobsen, Madie Jones, Tania Schatow and Lauren Waclawczyk.

Since Fran Flory's arrival at LSU in 1998, the Tigers have amassed 98 honor roll selections. Members are required to maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better over the previous academic year [Fall-Spring-Summer Semesters].

Johnson also took home COBRA Magazine's Setter of the Year and All-National First Team honors. She wrapped up her career with 1,958 assists, 42 shy of becoming the eighth player in program history to reach the 2,000-mark

"At the beginning of the season, Brittney was a work in progress," head coach Fran Flory said. "She did a wonderful job of putting in the time to get the extra reps and really improved with each week that passed during the season. Her versatility gave our offense a unique look.

Johnson not only headlined the SEC but checked in No. 42 nationally with 10.80 assists per set. She was instrumental to LSU's offense as the Tigers rank among the NCAA Top 25 in assists per set (13.28), kills per set (14.35) and hitting percentage (.260).

The Tigers outlasted Arizona in five games during the opening round as Detra Brown (19 kills, 13 digs), Alice Card (10 kills, 18 digs), Simone DePaula (33 assists, 15 digs), Wendy Stammer (21 kills, 13 digs) and Lisa Smith (12 digs and 13 blocks) all posted double-doubles.

LSU made a run toward the Final Four sweeping Texas-Arlington before falling to host Texas in the South Regional final.



1987 • Record: 25-11 SEC Runner-Up

Along the way to its second straight NCAA Tournament appearance, LSU knocked off No. 10 Texas at the Maravich Center in five sets behind a 22-kill, 22-dig performance from Monica Freitas.

The Tigers fell to SEC rival Florida for the second time in 13 days. LSU put up a valient effort before they ran out of gas in the fifth set. Lisa Smith slapped 18 kills on a .469 hitting percentage.

LSU returned to the NCAA Tournament after a one year absence and turned the tables on Houston coming back from a 2-1 hole. Nyla Shepherd led the comback, racking up 21 kills on a .354 hitting percentage.

The Tigers headed to Austin, Texas where Texas-Arlington rallied from a two-game hole to stun LSU. Five players knocked double-figure kills for the Tigers, highligted by 23 and 22 kills from Monique Adams an Shepherd.

1990 • Record: 34-7 SEC Champions • SEC Tournament Champions NCAA Final Four

Coming off its second undefeated conference championship in as many seasons, LSU cruised past Louisville behind a .337 team hitting percentage in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at the Maravich Center.

The Tigers dismissed Texas Tech 3-0 in round two as Daniela Reis set a balanced attack that featured 15 kills from Nyla Shephered, 12 kills from Monique Adams and 10 kills from Julie Stempel.

LSU had its 1986 season end one step shy of the Final Four at Texas and were swept by the Longhorns during the 1990 regular season in Austin. Down 2-0 to the host Longhorns, LSU mounted a rally behind Adams, Shepherd and Stempel.

The trio combined for 74 of the Tigers' 91 kills and posted double-doubles as LSU fought back for a 8-15, 4-15, 15-10, 15-11, 17-15 triumph to advance to the program's first Final Four.

The Tigers fell to eventual national champion UCLA, 3-0, in the national semifinals, but the future was bright as Adams, Shepherd and Stempel would return for their senior seasons in 1991.



1991 • Record: 35-2 SEC Champions • SEC Tournament Champions NCAA Final Four

LSU fired out to a 12-0 record to start the 1991 season highlighted by wins over No. 11 New Mexico and No. 17 Texas before being upended at Florida to open SEC play.

The Tigers bounced back in a big way reeling off 20 consecutive victories en route to its third consecutive SEC regular season and tournament championships.

Only losing 12 games during the season, LSU entered the NCAA Tournament as a favorite to return to the Final Four and the Tigers did not disappoint shutting down Houston in the first round to advance to the South Regional, which the Tigers hosted.

After sweeping Texas Tech, LSU faced off with Florida for the fourth time in '91. Monique Adams and Daniela Reis set a program single-game marks. Adams cranked 43 kills on an amazing .507 hitting percentage, while Reis dished out 82 assists. Angie Miller (10 kills, 29 digs), Luciana Reis (12 killls, 22 digs) and Julie Stempel (11 kills, 12 digs) also tacked on double-doubles as LSU punched its second straight ticket to the Final Four.

LSU dropped a hard-fought, four-game duel with Long Beach State in the national semifinals. Until Florida in 2002, the 1991 Tigers were the only SEC squad to win a game in the Final Four.

LSU qualified for its fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance as the SEC regular season and tournament runner-up.

The Tigers traveled to Lubbock, Texas for its NCAA First Round tilt and swept the Red Raiders for the third straight season. Angie Miller and Tess Sulatycki powered home a combined 29 kills on 49 swings for a .469 hitting percentage, while Daniela Reis (47 assists, 13 digs) and Luciana Reis (10 kills, 17 digs) chipped in double-doubles.

Texas edged LSU in four games at the South Regional in Gainesville, Fla., ending the Tigers hopes of a third straight Final Four appearance.



1993 • Record: 21-16 **NIVC Champions**

LSU had its string of four consecutive NCAA Tournaments come to a close as 11 of the squad's 16 setbacks came against Top 20 opponents in 1993. Despite being left out of the big dance, the Tigers showed why they deserved a bid by rolling to the NIVC Championship.

LSU dropped just three games over a six-match span. Luciana Santana earned Tournament MVP honors after racking up three double-doubles and passing out 14.0 assists per game. Tiffany Miller and Luciana Reis also picked up All-Tournament accolades as the Tigers defeated Baylor in the NIVC Finals.



2005 •Record: 21-8 **SEC Western Division Co-Champions**

LSU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1992 overcoming having to play a majority of the season on the road in the aftermath of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

The Tigers played their opening 17 matches away from the Maravich Center and traveled 9,751 total miles over the 46 day period highlighted by a five set triumph over No. 8 Notre Dame.

LSU shared the SEC Western Division title after wins during eight of its last 10 matches, and put forth a gutsy effort before losing to Texas in the first round of the NCAA's.



2006 • Record: 26-6 **SEC Western Division Champions**

LSU made it back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances after winning the SEC Western Division outright to dethrowne Arkansas. Daniela Romero and Marina Skender notched All-SEC First-Team selections as the Tigers set a new benchmark for conference

The Tigers spent a majority of 2006 inside the Top 15, but were forced to travel to the west coast for a first round match-up against California, another Top 16 team that failed to garner a national seed.

LSU won game one before the Golden Bears fired back to win the next three games limiting the Tigers to a .156 hitting percentage. Marina Skender and Kyna Washington popped 12 kills each.



2007 • Record: 25-8 **SEC Western Division Champions**

LSU ran away with its third-straight NCAA Tournament appearance after notching a third consecutive SEC Western Division title.

The Tigers jumped out to a 15-2 start as Lauren DeGirolamo and Kyna Washington were All-SEC First-Team picks.

By storming back from a 2-1 hole against No. 14 New Mexico State in the first round, LSU ended a 15-year winless draught in the NCAA's.

Brittney Johnson set a balanced attack fueling Angela Bensend, Marina Skender and Washington to double-figure kills. The Tigers fell at No. 4 Texas during the NCAA Second Round



2008 • Record: 18-10 **SEC Western Division Champions**

The Tigers connected four NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since 1989-92 overcoming a string of injuries as Elena Martinez won her second-straight SEC Defensive Player of the Year.

After splitting its first 14 SEC matches, LSU reeled off six straight wins to conclude the regular season and claimed another SEC West crown. Brittnee Cooper picked up All-

Not only did LSU capture its fifth straight SEC Western Division crown, the Tigers ended Florida's 18-year stay at the top of the conference. LSU snapped a 26-match losing streak to the Gators and swept the season series for the first time since 1991.

The Tigers racked up a program-best 18 league wins aided by 12 sweeps as Brittnee Cooper, Sam Dabbs and Marina Skender secured All-SEC First-Team selections.

Cooper was the first Tiger to win SEC Player of the Year. She joined Monique Adams and Angie Miller as the program's only AVCA All-America First-Team honors.

LSU played host to its first NCAA Regional at the Maravich Center since 1991. The Tigers dismissed Tulane 3-0 as Dabbs fueled LSU to a .351 team hitting percentage.

The Tigers dropped an epic 3-2 decision to Texas A&M in the second round where Cooper ripped a career-high 28 kills on a .700 hitting clip without an error, while Dabbs dished out a career-best 64 assists.

LSU swept through the non-conference slate en route to a program-best 13-0 start. The Tigers also collected their sixth straight SEC Western Division title.

Angela Bensend and Desiree Elliott raced their way to All-SEC First-Team selections, while Elliott also secured the SEC's Freshman of the Year award.

LSU earned a national seed for the second consecutive season, but was shipped to Norman, Okla. for the NCAA's. The Tigers dropped a 3-0 decision to No. 22 Tulsa in the opening round.

The Tigers are 140-34 [.761] and one of only 18 teams to qualify for the last six NCAA Tournaments.

Dr. John V. Lombardi

President, Louisiana State University System



Dr. John V. Lombardi is the fifth individual to serve as the President of the Louisiana State University System. As its Chief Executive Officer, Dr. Lombardi oversees 11 institutions, including five academic campuses, as well as 10 public hospitals located throughout the state. He is also a Professor of History at Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College.

Dr. Lombardi was born in Los Angeles, California and attended Pomona College where he earned his bachelor's degree. He received his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in history from Columbia University, He joined the faculty in the Department of History at Indiana University, where he later served as Dean of International Programs and Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. In 1987, he became Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at the Johns Hopkins University. From 1990-1999, Dr. Lombardi was President of the University of Florida. Prior to his appointment as President of the LSU System, he served as Chancellor of the University of Massachusetts Amherst.

He is a Latin American historian, with a special interest in Venezuela. Dr. Lombardi is also one of the country's foremost authorities in higher education, serving as Co-Editor of The Top American Research Universities. He is the author of numerous professional publications, and along with his wife, Cathryn, co-authored a teaching atlas on Latin American History. He has taught courses in history, intercollegiate sports, and university management.

Dr. Michael V. Martin

Chancellor, LSU



Dr. Michael V. Martin assumed the chancellorship of Louisiana State University and A&M College on August 1, 2008. Prior to his appointment as LSU's eighth chancellor, Dr. Martin established a distinguished career in higher education, serving most recently as president of New Mexico State University.

Before arriving at NMSU in 2004, Dr. Martin served for six years as vice president for agriculture and natural resources at the University of Florida, leading the university's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences. He was elevated to senior vice president of the University of Florida shortly before being selected as NMSU's president. Previously, he was vice president for agricultural policy and the dean of the College of Agricultural, Food and Environmental Sciences at the University of Minnesota. He began his academic career at Oregon State University as a faculty member in the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics.

An academic leader dedicated to the land-grant mission, Dr. Martin is recognized as a strong voice for higher education. In 2007, he received the Justin Smith Morrill Memorial Award, named after the author of the bill creating land-grant universities, which honors outstanding service on behalf of the land-grant mission. Only six individuals have been designated to receive this award since it was first given in 1980. For his leadership in improving the quality of life for New Mexico citizens and future generations, he was awarded the 2008 Distinguished Leadership Award by Leadership New Mexico.

Other recent awards include his recognition as a powerbroker by The New Mexico Business Weekly in 2006, being named Outstanding Alumnus of Minnesota State University Mankato in 2006, and receiving the NMSU Social Justice Award in 2005.

Dr. Martin is involved in a wide array of professional and community organizations and

An active scholar, Dr. Martin has authored numerous book chapters and articles for academic journals, trade publications, and the popular press and recently published pieces for The Chronicle of Higher Education and University Business.

Some of his philosophy is summed up in the following quote: "It is the tradition of landgrant universities to be non-traditional," written as part of a 2001 article titled "The Land-Grant University in the 21st Century," published in the Journal of Agricultural and Applied Economics. He traced the history of the land-grant movement from the mid-1800s and concluded that "the fundamental land-grant principles of accessibility, practical as well as classical education, research and discovery in the public interest, and connectedness to all the people remain powerful and profound."

A native of Crosby, Minn., Dr. Martin earned a bachelor's degree in business and economics and a master's degree in economics at Mankato State College (Minnesota State University) in Minnesota. He received his Ph.D. in applied economics from the University of Minnesota in 1977.

Dr. Martin and his wife, Jan, have two children, both adopted from South Korea. Amanda, a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, is a graphic artist in Saint Paul, Minn. Sam, who holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Minnesota and a master's from Sarah Lawrence College, is a genetics counselor at Beth Israel Hospital in New York City.

Dydia DeLyser

Faculty Athletics Representative

Dydia DeLyser, an associate professor in the Department of Geography and Anthropology, serves in her fifth year as LSU's Faculty Athletics Representative

DeLyser, a native of Santa Monica, Calif., earned her bachelor's degree in 1992 from UCLA, and her master's and doctoral degrees from Syracuse University (in 1996 and 1998).

DeLyser arrived at LSU in August 1998 as an Instructor before becoming an assistant professor one year later. She was promoted to associate professor with tenure in August 2005.

DeLyser is a cultural-historical geographer. Her research has been both ethnographic and historical, and most of it questions how different built landscapes can help make the past meaningful in the present.

Much of her published research has focused on two different studies. One was a many-year ethnographic study of a ghost town in California (Bodie State Historic Park) where she examined how images and ideas about the American mythic West became meaningful to the tourists who

visited the town. The second was an historical study that examined a 19th century novel (Ramona) and how it changed the way people understood (and still understand) southern California's past.

Her current research concerns early women aviators and how they used their practices of flying to advance feminism in the post-suffrage era.

DeLyser teaches graduate courses in cultural geography, qualitative research, and academic and professional writing. She has also taught undergraduate courses in cultural, and urban geography, and an introductory world-regional geography course.

DeLyser is a first-generation American -- her parents were Dutch immigrants and English is her second language. She also has language abilities in Russian and Spanish.

DeLyser's hobbies include driving/riding antique cars and motorcycles. She is also a licensed pilot and co-owns a Citabria, which is a two-place aerobatic airplane.

Joe Alleva

LSU Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics



Joe Alleva continues to bring unprecedented national recognition to LSU as Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics. Under Alleva's leadership, LSU enjoys one of the country's premier athletics programs with success on and off the field of competition. Now in his fourth season at LSU, Alleva is dedicated to athletic and academic excellence, and is committed to providing the opportunities and the resources necessary for student-athletes to excel in competition, in the classroom and in the community.

Alleva joined the LSU family on April 4, 2008 after a highly successful tenure as director of athletics at Duke University for 10 years. Alleva's role at LSU was further expanded in August of 2009 when vice chancellor was added to his title by the LSU Board of Supervisors. It is the first time in school history that the director of athletics has also held a vice chancellor position.

Alleva was recently appointed to a five-year term on the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Committee, reinforcing his position as one of the most respected athletic administrators in the country.

Upon his arrival at LSU, Alleva unveiled a strategic master plan for the LSU athletics program -- "LSU: Thru and True" -- to ensure the advancement and future of LSU Athletics as an exemplary program. The central mission of the plan is to create an environment for student-athletes to reach their ultimate potential, prepare them to be champions in life and to set out goals and values for the entire athletics program.

Alleva's vision for LSU athletics facilities includes plans to enhance the appearance of Tiger Stadium and transform the North Stadium Drive corridor into a showplace for the university. Under his direction, LSU's world-renowned track and field program received a state-of the-art running surface last year when a new track was installed in Bernie Moore Stadium. Extensive renovations to the Tiger soccer facility will be completed this fall, and future plans include a new gymnastics practice facility, a tennis complex, and renovations to the Maravich Center and field house.

Alleva directed a major renovation to the University Club golf course that was completed in September 2010 and allows the LSU men's and women's golf teams to compete on one of the most challenging courses in the country. The renovated course helped prepare Tiger golfers John Peterson and Austin Ernst, respectively, to win 2011 NCAA men's and women's individual championships, marking the first time both titles were claimed by players from the same school. The Lady Tiger golfers were third in the final team standings, marking the highest finish in LSU history.

LSU Athletics completed another highly successful year in 2010-11, highlighted by a Fighting Tiger football squad that posted an 11-2 mark – including a Cotton Bowl victory – and finished the season ranked No. 8 in the nation. The 2010-11 athletic year also featured Top 5 national finishes both indoors and outdoors by the men's and women's track and field teams.



In 2008-09, all 20 LSU sports competed in NCAA postseason play for the first time in school history and the Tiger baseball team won the national championship. This past year LSU ranked second among Southeastern Conference teams in the Learfield Director's Cup All-Sports standings and finished in the Top 20 for the sixth year in a row.

Alleva ensures that the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is a first-class facility that provides student-athletes the resources necessary for success in the classroom and personal development. The facility was recently enhanced by the addition of a media training center that gives student-athletes valuable assistance in improving their communications skills. And with a strong emphasis on community service and outreach programs, the implementation under Alleva's direction of the "Geaux Givers" program fosters a relationship between the local community and LSU student-athletes, who regularly participate in philanthropic events.

In addition, Alleva has bolstered the department's L-Club program to reach out and connect with former student-athletes.

Alleva oversees a staff of outstanding coaches and he made two critical additions to LSU's coaching staff in the off-season. He lured the dynamic Nikki Caldwell to LSU to coach the Lady Tiger basketball team and then hired Beth Torina to direct the Tiger softball program, bringing a new wealth of knowledge and passion to the LSU women's sports program.

Alleva is an innovator with bold ideas that benefit not only LSU but all of Greater Baton Rouge. He has been instrumental in the planning of the Bayou Country Superfest,

a two-day country music concert and festival held in Tiger Stadium each spring. The event attracts nearly 100,000 visitors to the LSU campus and makes a tremendous economic impact upon the local community.

While at Lehigh, Alleva was the quarterback of the football team and team captain in 1974. Alleva also played on the Lehigh baseball team. He served as a graduate assistant football coach and earned an MBA in 1976.

While at Duke, Alleva played a key role in Durham's community sports scene. He started Little League Baseball in Durham over 20 years ago, and also began the American Legion baseball program.

He is a member of the North Carolina American Legion Hall of Fame, Suffern High School Hall of Fame and the Rockland County Hall of Fame
