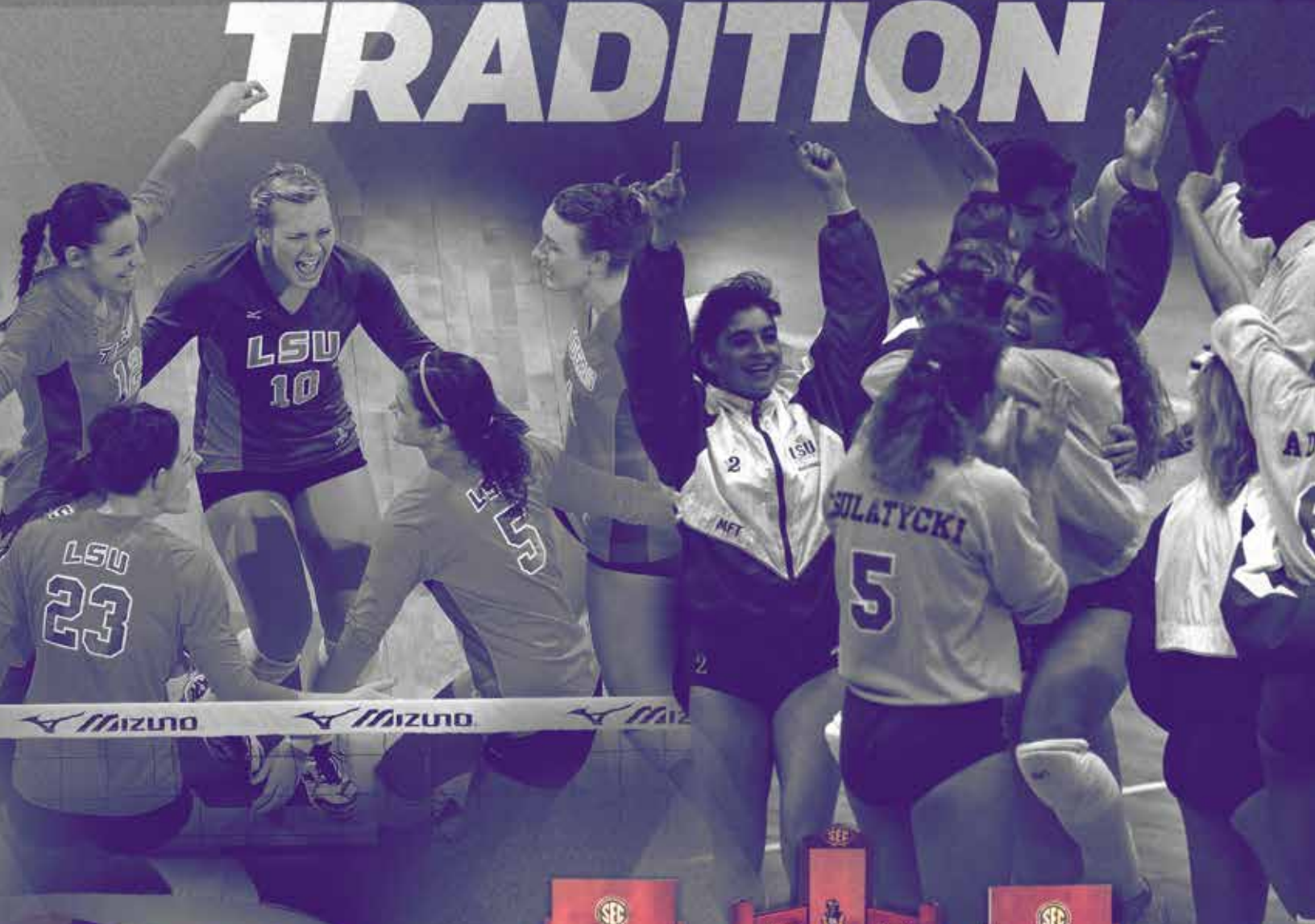

JUNIOR SEASON (2015)

Played in 24 matches in her first season at LSU, starting 10 matches and playing in 66 total sets... Hit .253 on the year with 68 kills for a 1.03 kills per set average... Finished third on the team in blocks with 45, with six solo blocks and 39 assisted for a 0.68 blocks per set average... Had 11 digs on the season... Earned her first LSU start in the opener against UC Irvine, earning six kills on a .308 hitting percentage to go along with three blocks and a dig... Earned three more blocks along with three kills against Rice... Had two blocks with four kills and no errors against No. 3 Texas... Tallied six kills and hit .308 with a block at Ohio... Earned another match with three blocks in the win over Xavier... Had four kills with a block against Purdue... Earned four kills and no errors with three blocks against Miami... Produced three blocks with a kill and a dig in a sweep of LIU Brooklyn... Hit .500 with four kills and no errors with three blocks against Arkansas... Tied for the match high with six blocks, hitting .444 with four kills against South Carolina... Tied for the match lead with five blocks in the win at Georgia... Hit .667 with four kills and no errors, while stopping two shots against Tennessee... Produced a season-high eight kills on a .438 hitting percentage on 16 attempts at Kentucky.

SOUTH DAKOTA STATE (2013 & 2014)

Played in every match and every set for South Dakota State over the past two seasons, earning 60 starts during that stretch and over 200 sets played... Was one of the top players for the Jackrabbits the past two seasons, as in 2014 she led SDSU in kills (236) and kills per set (2.02), while finishing second in hitting percentage (.205), points (291.5), points per set (2.49), blocks (96) and blocks per set (0.82)... As a freshman the year before, she was just as solid, hitting .229 with 161 kills for a 1.75 kills per set average with a team-leading 69 blocks and a 0.75 blocks per set mark.

Amassed over 700 kills, 300 blocks and 140 service aces while participating in three other sports on the prep level at Deuel High School... Three-year letterwinner... Finished high school career with 707 kills, 416 digs, 321 total blocks and 143 services aces... .370 as a senior... Also earned three letters in basketball, four in track and field and one in cross country, earning numerous honors in all sports... REDSHIRT JUNIOR SEASON (2015)

Sat out the 2015 season after sustaining a knee injury during the preseason which required surgery.

JUNIOR SEASON (2014)

Earned a medical redshirt after sustaining a knee injury during the preseason and having surgery, requiring her to miss the entire 2014 season.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2013)

Appeared in 21 matches which included 17 starts ... Notched 1.86 kills and 0.85 blocks per set over her three rotations ... Knocked at least five kills during 13 of her 21 outings, while her 0.85 blocks per set were third on the team ... Her .273 hitting percentage was second on the team only behind Briana Holman ... Registered five-plus blocks on five occasions ... Started season with six consecutive matches with over .300 hitting percentage (Aug. 30-Sept. 13) and was one of three players to earn Rice Invitational All-Tournament Team accolades ... Powered home nine kills on a .500 hitting clip and registered six blocks at Rice (Sept. 7) ... Cranked 12 kills and added five blocks during LSU's 3-2 comeback win over Baylor (Sept. 20) ... It marked the first time in Fears' career that she produced 10-plus kills ... Exploded for a career-high 15 kills on a .387 hitting ratio and tacked on four blocks against Georgia (Sept. 27) ... Secured 10 kills on a .435 hitting percentage to go along with a season's best nine blocks versus No. 11 Missouri (Oct. 25) ... Added seven kills and four blocks at Tennessee (Nov. 17) ... Started three of LSU's final four matches of the regular season (Nov. 22-30) ... Slapped four kills on seven error less swings at No. 7 Florida (Nov. 22) ... Did not play during the NCAA Seattle Regional (Dec. 6-7).

FRESHMAN SEASON (2012)

Totaled 27 appearances, including 24 starts ... Made an instant impact on the LSU front row ... Chipped in 1.28 kills and 1.03 blocks per set ... Her 1.03 blocks per set were ninth in the SEC, second among freshmen ... Led the Tigers in blocks a team-leading 16 times and registered five stuffs or more on a team-best eight occasions ... Opened her career by starting in 22-straight matches (Aug. 24-Oct. 22) ... One of two freshmen to earn the starting nod in the season opener at No. 2 Texas



(Aug. 24) ... Notched four kills, one block and one dig during the Texas match ... Added six blocks against No. 19 San Diego (Aug. 25) ... Ripped eight kills on a .462 hitting percentage and tacked on four stuffs at Rice (Aug. 31) ... Buried eight kills on a career-high .636 hitting ratio and recorded six blocks against Western Michigan (Sept. 8) ... Picked up seven blocks highlighted by a trio of solo stuffs and popped four kills at South Carolina (Sept. 16) ... Cranked eight kills on a .412 hitting clip and tallied five blocks versus Georgia (Oct. 3) ... Collected a career-high 10 blocks during the Tennessee match (Oct. 10), the first Tiger to record double digit stuffs since former All-American Brittnee Cooper during the 2009 season ... Came away with seven kills and six blocks against Alabama (Oct. 14) ... Hammered a season's best nine kills and registered four blocks versus Texas A&M (Oct. 26) ... Turned in five kills and three blocks at No. 16 Florida (Nov. 16).

Coached by Ap Clarke at Bellaire High School in Texas ... LSU's 2012 recruiting class checked in with a No. 29 national ranking by PrepVolleyball.com ... Earned three All-District 20-5A First-Team selections from 2009-11, including 2010 MVP honors ... Team captured four district titles ... Ranked No. 27 on PrepVolleyball.com's Senior Aces and was among the organization's Top 50 juniors ... Named among 2012 Volleyball Magazine/Rox Girls' Fab 50 ... Plays club volleyball for the Houston Juniors Volleyball.

HEAD COACH FRAN FLORY



Fran Flory, the winningest coach in program history, enters her 19th season at the helm of the LSU volleyball program after leading the Tigers to eight NCAA Tournament berths in the last 11 seasons. The 2009 Southeastern Conference [SEC] and American Volleyball Coaches Association [AVCA] South Region Coach of the Year, Flory was hired as the program's fifth coach leading into the 1998 season and has returned the Tigers to national prominence during her tenure.

LSU has been nothing short of spectacular and continues to raise its level of success under Flory. The Tigers have averaged 19.9 wins per season since 2005, including the 2009 SEC championship which ended Florida's 18-year reign atop the conference and seven-of-eight SEC Western Division titles from 2005 to 2011. The seven-straight division titles was the second-longest streak in SEC history, while the six-consecutive NCAA Tournament bids from 2005-10 are a program record.

Flory has coached 10 AVCA All-South Region First-Team picks, which includes a pair of AVCA All-Americans from 2007-09. It marked the first time in program history that LSU recorded three-straight seasons with multiple All-America selections, as Brianna Holman was the most recent All-America selection in 2014. The Tigers also have secured 41 All-SEC selections during Flory's nearly two-decade stay in Baton Rouge, as Cati Leak earned her first All-SEC nod in 2014.

Brittnee Cooper added to LSU's rich heritage as the program's first player to collect SEC Player of the Year accolades in 2009. She also became the third player in program

history to secure AVCA All-America First-Team honors joining the elite company of Monique Adams (1991) and Angie Miller (1992).

Elena Martinez picked up 2007 and 2008 SEC Defensive Player of the Year in addition to a pair of AVCA All-America Honorable Mention nods. She reeled in 1,414 career digs to rank second in program history.

LSU has been represented on the national stage as a part of USA Volleyball Women's A2 National Team during six of the last nine seasons. Flory captured a gold medal in May 2011 after leading the USA A2 Blue squad to a 7-1 record. Cooper and Martinez won gold in May 2008, Cooper added a silver medal in May 2009, former assistant coach Steve Loeswick garnered a bronze medal in May 2010 and Meghan Mannari tallied a silver medal in June 2012. In 2014, Helen Boyle won gold with the USA Blue squad at the Girls Junior National Championships in Minnesota, while Holman went on a tour of China with one of the collegiate national teams, where her side finished second overall after 10 days of competition abroad.

On the state level, LSU has dominated with 56 All-Louisiana selections highlighted by 33 first-team honors. The five-time Louisiana Coach of the Year also has led her players to every individual state award which includes six overall players, four defensive players, four freshmen and two newcomers of the year.

However, Flory's success at LSU hasn't been solely on the court. The Tigers have registered 118 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, and Madie Jones was LSU's nominee for the prestigious SEC H. Boyd

McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award in April 2013.

In each of the last five seasons, LSU's senior classes have created and championed their own philanthropic projects to benefit the Baton Rouge community. In 2015, the seniors partnered with the Blue Star Mothers of Louisiana to acquire household goods that were packaged and sent to troops overseas. The 2014 "Meals from Mike" initiative collected hundreds of pounds of food that were distributed to Baton Rouge area food banks. In 2013, the "Geaux Kids" initiative collected a host of clothing and other related items for needy children, while "PAWS in the PMAC" collected close to 1,250 items ranging from food to toys that were donated to the Capital Area Animal Welfare Society in 2012. LSU donated nearly 3,000 books as part of the "Geaux Books" campaign to replenish the library at Dufrocq Elementary School following the 2011 season.

The Tigers fought through a string of injuries to key players in 2015, continuing to compete on the highest level of collegiate volleyball by winning the Days Inn and Suites Lobo Invitational title at New Mexico, while opening league play by winning five of their first eight matches to start the SEC season.

Earning their first 20-win season since 2010, the 2014 Tigers went on one of the longest winning streaks in program history in winning 11-straight contests over the course of the year, finishing third in the SEC and making it to the NCAA Tournament where they won their opening round game for the second consecutive year. LSU finished 20-9 on the year and 14-4 against league competition, finishing the season winning 14 of its last 15 matches to close out the year.

After not making the postseason since the 2010 season, the 2013 Tigers won 10 of their first 11 contests en route to a 19-13 finish and 8-10 finish in the SEC, earning an NCAA Tournament berth that led to its first opening round win since 2009 with a thrilling, 3-2 comeback win over No. 24 Michigan. LSU has had eight players over the last two seasons join the program's illustrious 1,000-dig and 1,000-kill clubs, respectively. In total, LSU has had 16 players added to those lists going back to 2006.

LSU raced out to a program-best 13-0 start to open the 2010 season. Angela Bensend and Desiree Elliott collected All-SEC First-Team accolades to give the Tigers multiple picks on the league's premier squad for the fourth time in a five-season span. Elliott also notched SEC Freshman of the Year status as LSU racked up a 25-5 record.

LSU climbed to new heights in 2009 and claimed the SEC overall championship to close Florida's 18-year reign at the top of the conference. The Tigers finished with a 25-7 record highlighted by a program mark of 18 SEC victories and a pair of historic wins over the Gators which included the program's first triumph in UF's O'Connell Center since 1991. Cooper was joined by Sam Dabbs and Marina Skender to become the first Tiger trio to notch All-SEC First-Team honors during the same season. LSU rolled past Tulane in its NCAA opener before falling in a five-set affair to

Texas A&M in the NCAA Second Round.

The 2008 Tigers overcame injuries and finished the regular season with six-straight wins to collect their fourth-straight divisional title. Cooper emerged as one of the top middle blockers in the nation en route to All-SEC and AVCA All-South Region First-Team along with AVCA All-America Honorable Mention accolades.

LSU compiled a stellar 25-8 campaign in 2007. The Tigers broke through with an NCAA Tournament victory, a gritty five-set triumph over New Mexico State, in its third-straight year in the postseason. Lauren DeGirolamo and Kyna Washington took home All-SEC First-Team honors, while DeGirolamo teamed with Martinez for AVCA All-America Honorable Mention status.

The Tigers made the 2006 season a year to remember after turning in a 26-6 mark. The 26 victories and No. 19 final national ranking were accomplished for the first time in program history since the 1992 season. LSU also won the SEC Western Division crown

outright for the first time in program history. Daniela Romero tacked on AVCA All-America Honorable Mention after securing All-SEC First Team and Louisiana Player of the Year. She was joined by Skender to give the Tigers two All-SEC First-Team picks for the first time since 1999.

LSU's return to volleyball prominence began in 2005 as the Tigers finished 21-8 sharing its first SEC Western Division championship and garnered its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1992. After Hurricane Katrina turned the Maravich Center into the largest field hospital in the United States, LSU played its first 17 matches on the road traveling over 14,000 miles. Ivana Kuzmic became the first LSU's player to earn AVCA All-America accolades since 1992 after being named All-SEC First Team and Louisiana Player of the Year. Skender added the SEC's Freshman of the Year award.

LSU totaled a pair of second-place finishes and five third-place showings in the SEC West over Flory's first seven seasons. She made an



immediate impact on the program moving LSU within a game of the .500 mark in 1998 after the Tigers went winless in SEC action the year before.

The 1999 Tigers improved to 17-15 overall as Meagan Davis and Kelly Thompson notched All-SEC First-Team accolades. In 2000, LSU took another step forward and made a run to the SEC Tournament finals. The Tigers kept the momentum going and strung together back-to-back winning campaigns during 2001 and 2002 campaigns. It marked the program's first consecutive winning seasons since 1992-93. LSU bounced back from an 11-19 mark in 2003 and fired back with a 17-12 record during the 2004 season.

This is Flory's second stint at LSU as the Baton Rouge native served as an assistant for four seasons under the program's winningest coach, Scott Luster. She helped the Tigers accomplish unprecedented success with three SEC championships, three SEC Tournament championships and two Final

Four appearances. The Tigers were the first school in SEC history to advance to the NCAA Final Four.

Flory left LSU to assume the head coaching duties at Southeastern Louisiana in 1992. In her only season with the Lions, SLU compiled a 21-13 record. She returned to the SEC as an assistant coach at Kentucky in 1993. Five months later, Flory assumed the head coaching duties when Kathy DeBoer, who is currently the Executive Director of the AVCA, was named Associate Athletic Director.

The 1993 Wildcats stormed to a 29-4 record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round. For her efforts, Flory was named the Tachikara/AVCA Region IV Coach of the Year. She remained at Kentucky through the 1997 season.

Before entering coaching, Flory experienced a successful playing career at the University of Texas. She was a member of the Longhorns 1981 AIAW National Championship squad and was a two-time team captain. She received

All-Southwest Conference Second-Team and NCAA Tournament All-South Region team in 1982.

Flory graduated from Texas in 1984 where she served as a student assistant before being named head coach at Wittenberg University in 1986. After Wittenburg, Flory was an assistant coach at Texas A&M in 1987 before joining the LSU staff as a graduate assistant in 1988.

A member of the AVCA and chair of the NCAA Rules Committee since Fall 2010, Flory has assisted in coordinating both the Louisiana Senior Olympic Games and the Special Olympics; hosting the 2001 Senior Olympic Games. She also is a member of the United States Volleyball Association coaching accreditation program.

Flory and her husband, Ken, live in Baton Rouge. The couple has a daughter, Lindsay (19), and a son, Nicholas (17). Lindsay is a sophomore on the Tiger roster this season.





ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH JILL LYTLE WILSON

Jill Lytle Wilson moves into her fourth season as associate head coach and 10th overall season on the LSU volleyball staff. She will continue to serve as the program's recruiting coordinator in addition to training the team's defense.

LSU has racked up 172 victories, an average of 20.4 wins per season, during Lytle Wilson's time with the program. The Tigers have picked up six NCAA Tournament berths sparked by three 25-win seasons in 2007, 2009 and 2010. LSU also has built on its championship legacy and secured five SEC Western Division titles highlighted by the 2009 SEC overall championship, the program's first since 1991.

The Tigers have placed four players on the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-South Region First Team in five of her 10 seasons. Brittnee Cooper came away with the program's first SEC Player of the Year award in 2009, as she also added to the program's storied tradition as the third player to earn AVCA All-America First-Team honors. Additionally, she joined the elite company of Monique Adams (1991) and Angie Miller (1992), with four total first team All-Americans in LSU's history.

On the back row, Elena Martinez capped her illustrious career with back-to-back SEC Defensive Player of the Year awards accompanied by AVCA All-America Honorable Mention status in 2007 and 2008. She reeled in 1,414 career digs, second-most in program history. In total, seven players have eclipsed 1,000 career digs under Lytle Wilson's watch,

including Malorie Pardo and Haley Smith in 2014.

LSU has garnered 15 All-SEC selections sparked by eight first-team picks, before the debut of the 18-member All-SEC team at the dawn of the new league configuration that eliminated divisional play in 2013. Desiree Elliott, LSU's first freshman to claim All-SEC First Team since 1981, also tallied 2010 SEC Freshman of the Year. In 2009, Cooper teamed with AVCA Honorable Mention picks Sam Dabbs and Marina Skender to become the first LSU trio to notch All-SEC First-Team accolades during the same season.

The future continues to be bright for the Purple and Gold as Lytle Wilson has been instrumental in bringing in five Top-30 recruiting classes ranked by PrepVolleyball.com. The class of 2015 freshman was considered among the nation's best, with four seeing extensive action last season.

The Tigers fought through a string of injuries to key players in 2015, continuing to compete on the highest level of collegiate volleyball by winning the Days Inn and Suites Lobo Invitational title at New Mexico, while opening league play by winning five of their first eight matches to start the SEC season.

The Tiger offense ripped 14.35 kills per set on a .260 team hitting percentage to not only rank among the SEC leaders, but the NCAA's Top 25 in both categories.

Prior to LSU, Lytle Wilson spent one season as an assistant coach at Wake Forest. The Demon Deacons matched a school record for

most ACC wins in 2006. She trained the outside and right side hitters on the court in addition to serving as team travel coordinator, recruiting assistant and camp director assistant off the court.

Lytle Wilson was an assistant coach at the University of North Carolina from 2002-2004. The Tar Heels put together a 32-4 record en route to the 2002 ACC regular season championship, its first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance and a No. 11 final national ranking during her first season. Laura Greene took home the 2002 ACC Player of the Year award and was an AVCA All-America Third-Team pick. UNC posted another 20-win season in 2003 despite losing four starters, while Molly Pyles picked up an AVCA All-America Honorable Mention selection in 2004.

Before joining the North Carolina staff, Lytle Wilson served as a graduate assistant at Tennessee-Martin in 2001. The Skyhawks compiled a 24-7 record and won the Ohio Valley Conference regular season title.

Lytle Wilson started her coaching career at LSU as a student assistant in 2001 while earning her Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. She was a four-

year starter at outside hitter from 1997-2000 and ranked sixth in the SEC with 23 service aces during her senior campaign. LSU also appeared in the 2000 SEC Tournament finals.

One of the hardest workers on her team and considered one of the most determined players Flory has ever coached, Lytle Wilson played in 98 career matches being limited only by a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee suffered 11 matches into her junior season.

A three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, Lytle Wilson also was the Tigers' representative on the women's at-large SEC Good Works Team in 1999-2000. Her good works didn't go unnoticed as Lytle Wilson was named the LSU Student-Athlete Volunteer of the Year in 2000. She served on the CHAMPS Student-Athlete Advisory Board for four years, the last year serving as president of the organization. She also was a member of the LSU tennis team in 2001.

Lytle Wilson, originally from Richmond, Texas, is the daughter of Mike Lytle and Kim Lytle. She is married to Jared Wilson, and the couple lives in Baton Rouge.

ASSISTANT COACH **ETHAN PHEISTER**

Ethan Pheister is in his second year as an assistant coach for the LSU volleyball team, joining the Tigers in February of 2015 after a stint as an assistant coach at Duquesne previously.

Pheister works primarily with the setters, while also assisting with offensive strategies.

A standout athlete in the men's volleyball ranks while in college, Pheister has spent the last few years as a coaching piece in helping various teams make postseason berths, honing his skills in the Big East, Southeastern Conference and the Atlantic-10 over the course of the last five years.

Pheister, has worked with setters primarily at his other stops, drawing from the experience that made him three-time all-conference selection and two-time academic all-conference pick while with the Ball State Cardinals, even being named the national player of the week by the AVCA. By the time his career was over, his 4,103 assists ranked fourth all-time at Ball State, as his 11.21 assist per set average was fifth all-time.

For two seasons, Pheister helped lead the Dukes to consecutive winning seasons, as in 2013 Duquesne won the conference regular season and tournament title and the first-ever NCAA tournament berth for the school. That season, he helped produce the A-10 Setter of the Year in Mary Henry, who had 1,016 for the season and 40 assists in a match 14 times.

In 2014, Duquesne hit .256 for the year, which was good enough for 35th in the nation,

while leading the conference with a .281 clip against league competition.

As a volunteer assistant coach in 2012 at SEC member Arkansas, Pheister was a part of the most successful Razorback team in program history in winning 22 games that year, booking a trip to the postseason and having the highest hitting percentage in nine years at .248. He was integral in all aspects of the Razorback program, helping run practice, while organizing team footage and stats for the coaching staff.

The first stop on the coaching ladder for Pheister was at the University of Cincinnati, where in the first of two seasons with the Bearcats, his team finished the year 27-10 overall to claim the Big East Tournament Championship and making it to the second round before falling to eventual Final Four participant Florida State in Tallahassee.

That year, he helped freshman setter Caylin Mahoney earn second-team All-BIG EAST honors as one of five first-year players on just two teams, while being named the BIG EAST Freshman of the Week three times and second in the league averaging 10.90 per set.

Along with his coaching stints, he also served as the camp coach at all three stops while also assisting with camps at Michigan, Kentucky, Ball State, and serving as the club coach for the Munciana Volleyball Club and High Performance Volleyball Club in Missouri.

Pheister is engaged to Jen Vilkoski and resides in Baton Rouge.

Whalen, a former LSU volleyball player and native of Littleton, Colorado, joins the staff after a stellar four-year overall playing career, including spending her final two in the Purple and Gold. Whalen will be involved in all facets of the indoor and beach volleyball programs and her responsibilities include team travel, team budget, equipment and camps. She will also serve as the program's liaison to several departments.

"Having the opportunity to hire one of your own is very special. Throughout her playing career, Laura was one of the hardest-working and most dedicated student-athletes in our program," Flory said. "Her loyalty and passion for LSU and our program set her apart in our search for the right fit. It truly is special to have someone grow through the program and develop into an amazing addition that we can now add to our staff."

At LSU as a junior and senior, Whalen played in 27 total matches in 2013 and 2014,

as for her LSU career she played in 91 sets. She made four starts as a junior, finishing the year with 164 digs for a 1.95 digs per set average, while also earning 16 service aces for a 0.19 aces per set average.

Prior to joining the Tigers, she totaled 718 digs over 65 matches and served as Texas State's primary libero as a freshman and sophomore before transferring to LSU. Whalen was a key contributor to the Bobcats winning the 2011 Southland Conference regular season and tournament championships, where the team went 27-8 and she earned all-tournament honors during the postseason event.

She also spent two years playing for the beach volleyball team, playing in seven matches at the two, three, four, five and six positions throughout the year as a senior and primarily on courts four and five as a junior, winning seven matches in the two seasons.

Whalen earned her bachelor's degree in kinesiology from LSU in 2015.

LSU made a run toward the Final Four sweeping Texas-Arlington before falling to host Texas in the South Regional final.

Coming off its second undefeated conference championship in as many seasons, LSU cruised past Louisville behind a .337 team hitting percentage in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at the Maravich Center.

The Tigers dismissed Texas Tech 3-0 in round two as Daniela Reis set a balanced attack that featured 15 kills from Nyla Shepherd, 12 kills from Monique Adams and 10 kills from Julie Stempel.

LSU had its 1986 season end one step shy of the Final Four at Texas and were swept by the Longhorns during the 1990 regular season in Austin. Down 2-0 to the host Longhorns, LSU mounted a rally behind Adams, Shepherd and Stempel.

The trio combined for 74 of the Tigers' 91 kills and posted double-doubles as LSU fought back for a 8-15, 4-15, 15-10, 15-11, 17-15 triumph to advance to the program's first Final Four.

The Tigers fell to eventual national champion UCLA, 3-0, in the national semifinals, but the future was bright as Adams, Shepherd and Stempel would return for their senior seasons in 1991.

LSU fired out to a 12-0 record to start the 1991 season highlighted by wins over No. 11 New Mexico and No. 17 Texas before being upended at Florida to open SEC play.

The Tigers bounced back in a big way reeling off 20 consecutive victories en route to its third consecutive SEC regular season and tournament championships.

Only losing 12 games during the season, LSU entered the NCAA Tournament as a favorite to return to the Final Four and the Tigers did not disappoint shutting down Houston in the first round to advance to the South Regional, which the Tigers hosted.

After sweeping Texas Tech, LSU faced off with Florida for the fourth time in '91. Monique Adams and Daniela Reis set a program-high single-game mark. Adams cranked 43 kills on an amazing .507 hitting percentage, while Reis dished out 82 assists. Angie Miller (10 kills, 29 digs), Luciana Reis (12 kills, 22 digs) and Julie Stempel (11 kills, 12 digs) also tacked on double-doubles as LSU punched its second-straight ticket to the Final Four.

LSU dropped a hard-fought, four-game duel with Long Beach State in the national semifinals. Until Florida in 2002, the 1991 Tigers were the only SEC squad to win a game in the Final Four.

LSU qualified for its fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance as the SEC regular season and tournament runner-up. The Tigers traveled to Lubbock, Texas for its NCAA First Round tilt and swept the Red Raiders for the third-straight season.

Angie Miller and Tess Sulatycki powered home a combined 29 kills on 49 swings for a .469 hitting percentage, while Daniela Reis (47 assists, 13 digs) and Luciana Reis (10 kills, 17 digs) chipped in double-doubles.

Texas edged LSU in four games at the South Regional in Gainesville, Fla., ending the Tigers hopes of a third-straight Final Four appearance.

NIVC Champions

LSU had its string of four consecutive NCAA Tournaments come to a close as 11 of the squad's 16 setbacks came against Top-20 opponents in 1993. Despite being left out of the big dance, the Tigers showed why they deserved a bid by rolling to the NIVC Championship.

LSU dropped just three games over a six-match span. Luciana Santana earned Tournament MVP honors after racking up three double-doubles and passing out 14.0 assists per game. Tiffany Miller and Luciana Reis also picked up All-Tournament accolades as the Tigers defeated Baylor in the NIVC Finals.

SEC Western Division Co-Champions

LSU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1992 overcoming having to play a majority of the season on the road in the aftermath of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

The Tigers played their first 17 matches on the road and traveled 9,751 total miles over the 46-day period.

LSU shared the SEC Western Division title after wins during eight of its last 10 matches, and put forth a gutsy effort before losing to Texas in the first round of the NCAA's.

SEC Western Division Champions

LSU made it back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances after winning the SEC Western Division outright. Daniela Romero and Marina Skender notched All-SEC First-Team selections.

The Tigers spent a majority of 2006 inside the Top 15, but were forced to travel to the west coast for a first-round match-up against California, another Top 16 team that failed to garner a national seed.



LSU won game one before the Golden Bears fired back to win the next three games limiting the Tigers to a .156 hitting percentage. Marina Skender and Kyna Washington popped 12 kills each.

LSU ran away with its third-straight SEC Western Division crown and NCAA Tournament appearance after a 15-2 start. Lauren DeGirolamo and Kyna Washington were All-SEC First-Team picks.

By storming back from a 2-1 hole against No. 14 New Mexico State in the first round, LSU ended a 15-year winless draught in the NCAA's.



Brittney Johnson set a balanced attack fueling Angela Bensend, Marina Skender and Washington to double-figure kills. The Tigers fell at No. 4 Texas during the NCAA Second Round.

The Tigers connected four NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since 1989-92 overcoming a string of injuries as Elena Martinez won her second-straight SEC Defensive Player of the Year.

After splitting its first 14 SEC matches, LSU reeled off six-straight wins to conclude the regular season and claimed another SEC West crown. Brittnee Cooper picked up All-SEC First-Team honors.

LSU battled No. 14 UCLA to four sets in the NCAA opening round.

Tulane 3-0 but dropped a 3-2 epic decision to Texas A&M in the second round.

LSU earned a national seed for the second-consecutive season, but was shipped to Norman, Okla. for the NCAA's. The Tigers dropped a 3-0 decision to No. 22 Tulsa in the opening round.

Rose Magers represented the Tigers on the international stage as the United States won silver in the Games of the XXIII Olympiad played in Los Angeles (1984).

2 NCAA FINAL FOUR APPEARANCES

LSU is one of only two schools in SEC history with multiple Final Four appearances. The Tigers went to back-to-back Final Fours in 1990 and 1991.

5 SEC PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARDS

The Tigers have notched five postseason SEC honors highlighted by Brittnee Cooper's 2009 SEC Player of the Year award. Elena Martinez reeled in 2007 and 2008 SEC Defensive Player of the Year, while Marina Skender and Desiree Elliott tallied SEC Freshman of the Year honors in 2005 and 2010, respectively.

5 SEC REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONSHIPS

LSU claimed the SEC regular season titles in 1986, 1989, 1990, 1991 and 2009. The '09 Tigers ended Florida's 18-run year at the top of the league. LSU posted undefeated marks in both 1990 and 1991 only dropping six sets during the two-year span.

7 USA VOLLEYBALL

In seven of the last nine years, LSU has been involved with various USA Volleyball programs, most notably being Regan Hood as a member of the US Women's National Team at the 2014 Pan American Cup and 2013 FIVB World Grand Prix. The Tigers have also won seven medals with the prestigious USA Collegiate National Teams (Formerly known as the A2 program). Former All-Americans Brittnee Cooper and Elena Martinez won gold in 2008, while Cooper picked up a Silver Medal in 2009. Former assistant coach Steven Loeswick added a bronze medal

in 2010, followed by head coach Fran Flory's gold medal in 2011 and Meghan Mannari's silver medal in 2012. Most recently, Helen Boyle earned gold at the Girls Junior National Championships in Minnesota.

7 SEC WESTERN DIVISION TITLES

The Tigers won seven SEC Western Division crowns and were an impressive 60-9 over the seven seasons against their division. LSU pieced together a run of 35-straight home wins over the SEC West from 2004-11.

13 ALL-AMERICANS

The Tigers have 13 AVCA All-Americans in program history, fourth-most of any SEC school. Brittnee Cooper was one of 14 players to earn AVCA First-Team honors in 2009. LSU garnered a pair of AVCA All-Americans from 2007-09, the first time in program history the Tigers have had two All-Americans in three straight seasons.

14 NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

LSU has made 14 NCAA Tournament appearances, which is tied for fourth among SEC schools. The Tigers strung together six-consecutive bids from 2005-10 for a program record passing up the five-straight postseason bids recorded between the 1989-93 seasons.

17 DOUBLE-DIGIT DOMINATION

In 17 of the last 18 seasons, the LSU volleyball program has earned no less than double-digit victories in a season, averaging more than 18 wins per year during that stretch. Since the program started in 1974, the Tigers have earned double-digit wins 40 times in 43 total seasons. In 24 of those seasons, LSU has won 20 or more games, earning at least 20 victories in six of the last 11 years.

Maravich Center

LSU volleyball heads into its 35nd season at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in 2016. The structure, which was renamed in honor of the all-time LSU and NCAA men's basketball scoring leader on July 22, 1988, seats 13,215 and ranks as one of the finest college athletic arenas in the nation.

LSU volleyball moved into a new state-of-the-art locker room facility off the southwest corridor starting in 2011. Decorated by numerous graphics showcasing the program's prominent history, the fully carpeted facility features locker, film, equipment and training rooms.

The auxiliary gym located underground in the north section of the arena was converted to a volleyball-only practice facility leading into the 2010 season. Volleyball fans also can see a redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that play in the building.

On July 1, 2004, the management of the Maravich Center came under the direction of the LSU Athletics Department and underwent a multi-year refurbishment. The renovations have included new television lighting, an interior makeover and new roof surface.

Prior to the 2007 season, the main arena got a new subfloor and a new playing floor. In the summer of 2008, the auxiliary practice gym also received a new floor.

In addition, all seats in the 100 lower level were replaced leading into the 2010-11 basketball season.

Between 1985 and 1992, the Maravich Center was one of the top home courts in the nation, as LSU ran up a 110-10 (.917) record. During that time, LSU recorded a 37-match home-court win streak which is the second-longest streak in SEC history.

In 1991, the Tigers enjoyed possibly their finest season in the arena as LSU recorded a perfect 16-0 record and advanced to the Final Four through the NCAA South Regional in Baton Rouge.

The Tigers have posted a winning record in 15 of the last 16 seasons in the Maravich Center under head coach Fran Flory, making it once again a tough place for visiting teams to play. Over that span, LSU has a record of 146-68 (.682), including double digit wins in five of those seasons.

The Maravich Center has played host to SEC and NCAA Tournaments for volleyball, basketball and gymnastics. The 1982, 1987 and 1995 SEC Volleyball Championships were all held in the arena. The Tigers have produced a winning record in 28 of 31 seasons at the PMAC.

LSU won its final eight league home matches in 2009 highlighted by a 3-0 sweep of No. 6 Florida to clinch the program's fifth SEC championship. The Tigers also welcomed back postseason volleyball to the Maravich Center in 2009 for the first time since 1991. In total, the Maravich Center has been the site of four NCAA Championships as well as the 1991 NCAA South Regional.

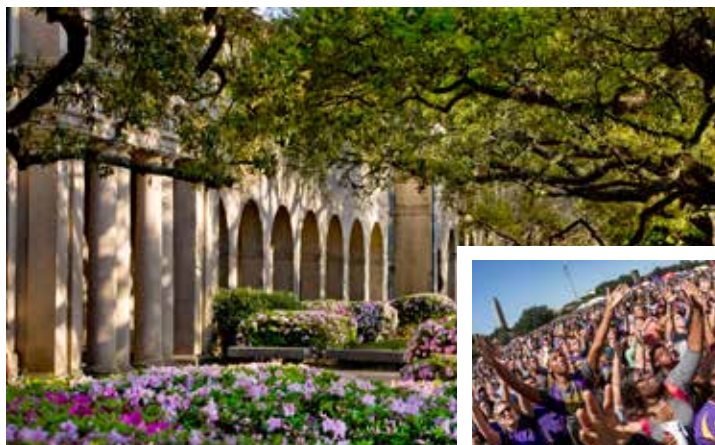

Did You Know?

- In the 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015 editions of *U.S. News & World Report's America's Best Colleges*, LSU is ranked in the first tier for "Best National Universities."
- The LSU College of Engineering announced that more than 450 individual and corporate donors pledged \$52.5 million in private funds, fulfilling the college's commitment to a \$100 million public/private partnership to renovate Patrick F. Taylor Hall.
- LSU is the only public university in Louisiana with top-tier designation by *U.S. News and World Report* and "Very High Research Activity" designation by the Carnegie Foundation. LSU's commitment to coastal studies is world-renowned.
- According to a study published in the June 2014 *Journal of Chemical Education*, LSU is the top university in the nation in granting PhD degrees in chemistry to women and underrepresented minority students.
- LSU ranks among the top 30 public universities in total research awards. The University's total federal funding -- from agencies such as the National Science Foundation, National Institutes of Health, and the Department of Homeland Security -- has increased 86 percent or more than \$90 million in recent years.
- LSU's student newspaper, *The Daily Reveille*, was recently awarded the prestigious Society of Professional Journalists' top honor, as it was named the "Best All-Around Daily Student Newspaper" in the United States.

Gifts this year included LSU's largest in-kind gift ever, premier geoscience and engineering software valued at \$62 million; an anonymous planned gift commitment of \$40 million split between the LSU Foundation and TAF; the largest unrestricted endowed gift in LSU's history as part of Roger Ogden's \$12 million Honors investment; and record membership in the LSU Alumni Association.
- Thanks to generous donations from loyal supporters and continued capital outlay from the Louisiana Legislature, campus construction continues on a number of major projects, including the \$110 million College of Engineering renovation.
- For the second time, LSU researchers at LIGO in Livingston, La., observed gravitational waves - ripples in the fabric of spacetime. LIGO spokesperson and LSU physicist Gabriela Gonzalez made the announcement nationally and said it's a promising start to mapping black holes in the universe.
- LSU researchers have described a new genus and species of cavefish from Mexico - the Oaxaca Cave Sleeper. It has not been collected or seen in more than 20 years and lives in a cave system threatened by damming. LSU expert fish and TED Fellow Prosanta Chakrabarty recently spoke on the finding.
- Next year, LSU research associate and recent LSU Master of Public Administration graduate Alvaro Armas will be one of two Knauss Fellows from the Louisiana Sea Grant College Program serving in Washington, D.C.
- LSU microbiologists have concocted artificial seawater that can be used to successfully cultivate abundant marine microorganisms.

President, LSU



Dr. F. King Alexander is the President of Louisiana State University, which enrolls more than 45,000 students and includes institutions across Louisiana. He began at LSU on June 24, 2013. During his tenure as president, the university has seen consecutive record-breaking graduating classes in terms of both size and diversity and enrollment growth across all campuses.

Prior to this appointment, Dr. Alexander was president of California State University, Long Beach (2005-2013) one of the nation's largest public universities.

During his more than seven-year tenure at California State University, Long Beach, Dr. Alexander was twice named the California State University Student Association (CSSA) "President of the Year," which represents all 23 California State Universities and its more than 440,000 students.

Prior to becoming president of California State University, Long Beach, Dr. Alexander was president of Murray State University in Kentucky (2001-05) and was a faculty member at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana, where he was the director of the graduate higher education program.

A Kentucky native who grew up in north Florida, Dr. Alexander received his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in higher education administration with a focus on finance and educational policy analysis, and a Master of Science degree in comparative educational studies from the University of Oxford in Oxford, England.

As a teacher and administrator, Dr. Alexander has received many

honors, including the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Education Alumni Achievement Award (2002) and has research university faculty affiliations at the University of Wisconsin-Madison Center for the Study of Postsecondary Education (WISCAPE) and Cornell University Higher Education Research Institute (CHERI).

Dr. Alexander also has been asked to represent public higher education colleges and universities on numerous occasions to the United State Congress on issues of college affordability, student indebtedness, and institutional efficiency and effectiveness in efforts to address many of the growing challenges facing American higher education. He has testified before the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor & Pensions (HELP), the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, and the Advisory Committee on Student Financial Assistance, to name a few. Due to his national recognition and involvement in higher education issues, Dr. Alexander has served on numerous U.S. higher education and statewide organizational leadership boards, and remains very active in policy and planning discussions.

Dr. Alexander and his wife, Shenette, have three children: Kylie, Savannah and Madison.



Dr. Bill Demastes

Faculty Athletics Representative

Dr. Bill Demastes, a professor of English at LSU, is in his fifth year as Faculty Athletics Representative. Dr. Demastes earned his Ph.D. in English in 1986 from the University of Wisconsin-Madison with a Field of Study of Drama as Genre and a specialization in 20th-Century American and British Drama. He

earned his masters in English in June 1979 from the University of Georgia in Athens, where he specialized in 19th-Century American Literature.

At LSU, he served as Associate Dean of the College of Arts and

Sciences from 2001-04 and Director of Undergraduate Studies for the Department of English from 1999-01 and 2010-11. He has also served as Associate Chair of the Department of English (1998-99); Director of the Master of Arts in Liberal Arts Program (1996-2004); and Director of Graduate Studies in the Department of English (1992-94; 2005-06).

He was honored with the LSU Alumni Association Faculty Excellence Award in 2000, and in 2002 he won the LSU Distinguished Faculty Award. He was named in 2009 an LSU Rainmaker, which is given to the top 100 LSU Faculty. In 2010 and 2013 he received the Tiger Athletic Foundation Undergraduate Teaching Award, and in the summer of 2011, he was named the Harry Ransom Summer Fellowship recipient by the University of Texas.



Joe Alleva

LSU Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics



Joe Alleva continues to bring unprecedented national recognition to LSU as Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics. Under Alleva's leadership, LSU enjoys one of the country's premier athletics programs with success on and off the field of competition. Now in his ninth year at LSU, Alleva is dedicated to athletic and academic excellence, and he is committed to providing the opportunities and the resources necessary for student-athletes to excel in competition, in the classroom and in the community. Alleva joined the LSU family on April 4, 2008 after a highly successful tenure as director of athletics at Duke University for 10 years. He was named vice chancellor at LSU in August of 2009, marking the first time in school history that the director of athletics has also held a vice chancellor position.

Alleva completed a five-year term last spring on the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Committee, enhancing his reputation as one of the most respected athletic administrators in the country. He has been appointed to numerous national committees throughout his career, including the Football Bowl Certification Committee, the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet and several Southeastern Conference and Atlantic Coast Conference committees.

Upon his arrival at LSU, Alleva unveiled a strategic master plan for the LSU athletics program -- "LSU: Defined by Excellence" -- to confirm the advancement and future of LSU Athletics as an exemplary enterprise. The central mission of the plan is to create an environment for student-athletes to reach their ultimate potential, prepare them to be champions in life and to set goals and values for the entire athletics program.

Living up to Alleva's mantra of "competition, classroom, community," a total of 83 proud Tigers received their degrees from the university during LSU commencement ceremonies in December and May. LSU's Graduation Success Rate as reported by the NCAA remains at an all-time high for the university with a score of 84. LSU student-athletes in 2015-16 logged 5,612 hours in community service work across 21 sports through LSU's "Geaux Givers" program.

Alleva's strong commitment to academics ensures that the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is a first-class facility that cultivates success in the classroom and the development of life skills. And with an emphasis on community outreach programs, the implementation under Alleva's direction of the "Geaux Givers" fosters a relationship between the local citizens and LSU student-athletes. Alleva has also bolstered the L-Club program to connect with former student-athletes, and he

has supervised the thriving "Project Graduation" program in which former student-athletes return to LSU to earn their degrees.

Alleva's tenure has been distinguished by a number of significant athletic achievements, including four 10-win seasons and 78 total victories by the football team. The Tigers have played in a bowl game in each of Alleva's eight gridiron seasons and LSU has finished in the Top 20 six times in that period. LSU under Alleva's leadership has claimed the 2009 baseball national championship and three College World Series berths, the 2015 men's golf national championship, two women's basketball Sweet 16 appearances, four gymnastics Super Six berths, three softball College World Series appearances and 18 NCAA Top 5 finishes indoors and outdoors by the men's and women's track and field teams.

The Tigers in the past eight seasons have earned 37 individual NCAA championships in the sports of men and women's track and



field, gymnastics, men's golf and women's golf. LSU has captured 14 Southeastern Conference team championships, and the Tigers have won 102 individual SEC titles during Alleva's term.

LSU in 2014-15 became the first school in SEC history to play in a football bowl game, have both its men's and women's basketball teams reach the NCAA Tournament, and advance to the College World Series in baseball and softball in the same athletic year.

LSU enjoyed another banner year in 2015-16, as the school produced five Top-5 NCAA finishes and earned a No. 19 national ranking in the annual Learfield Directors' Cup, which measures the overall excellence of collegiate athletic programs. Fifteen LSU teams competed in an NCAA championship event, and the Tigers finished in the Top 10 in seven sports.

The Fighting Tiger football squad played in a bowl game for a school-record 16th straight season and finished the year ranked No. 17 in the nation after posting a dominating 56-27 win over Texas Tech in the Texas Bowl.

The gymnastics team completed the season No. 2 in the nation, the highest finish in program history, and the softball squad appeared in the Women's College World Series for the second straight year, reaching the semifinals to finish No. 3 in the country.

LSU's storied track and field program produced three Top 10 finishes in 2015-16. The men's team placed fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships and fifth at the NCAA Outdoor meet, while the Lady Tigers placed sixth outdoors. The men's golf team advanced to match play at the NCAA Championships for a school-record third straight season and the Tigers tied for fifth overall.

LSU in 2016 became just the second baseball program in NCAA history to earn five straight NCAA Tournament National Seeds. The Tigers advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals and finished the year tied for ninth nationally.

LSU advanced to the NCAA Tournament second round in both men's and women's tennis, while also reaching NCAA postseason in women's golf, women's soccer, and men's and women's swimming and diving.

Alleva's vision keeps LSU among the nation's leaders in athletic facilities. Last year, LSU unveiled two new venues -- a magnificent Gymnastics Practice Facility and a tremendous Tennis Center featuring both indoor and outdoor courts. Construction will begin this year on a Nutrition Center within the expansive existing space at the South End of Tiger Stadium. The new facility will feature 30,000 square feet of dining and kitchen area and all of the elements necessary to ensure that the Tigers receive the absolute finest in dietary support.

In the fall of 2014, LSU opened the expansion of the South End Zone

of Tiger Stadium -- a project that added premium seating, general public seating and two state-of-the-art video boards -- continuing an effort to augment one of the most iconic venues in all of college sports. Since 2010, Alleva has directed an aggressive campaign to preserve and enhance the appearance of Tiger Stadium that has included the installation of new windows, lighting systems, gating systems, and championship plazas. The Football Operations Building is undergoing a significant renovation to maintain its status as a high-functioning workplace for coaches and players.

LSU's world-renowned track and field program in 2010 received a new running surface in Bernie Moore Stadium, and extensive renovations to the Maddox Field House in the spring of 2014 gave the Tigers a first-class indoor track and field venue. Alleva directed a major renovation to the University Club golf course that was completed in September 2010 and allows the LSU men's and women's golf teams to play on one of the most challenging courses in the country. An overhaul of the LSU soccer facility was completed in the fall of 2011, converting the stadium into fan-friendly venue.

Alleva is an innovator with bold ideas that benefit all of Greater Baton Rouge. He has been instrumental in the planning of the Bayou Country Superfest, a three-day country music concert and festival held in Tiger Stadium each spring. The event attracts over 100,000 visitors to the LSU campus and makes a tremendous economic impact upon the local community.

Alleva became director of athletics at Duke in 1998 and his impressive tenure there propelled the university into the ranks of America's top all-around collegiate programs. Among his outstanding list of accomplishments includes the greatest 10-year period in Duke Athletics, winning more ACC and NCAA championships than in any other decade in school history.

Alleva, whose hometown is Suffern, N.Y., majored in finance at Lehigh University and received his bachelor's degree in 1975. While at Lehigh, Alleva was the quarterback of the football team and team captain in 1974. Alleva also played on the Lehigh baseball team. He served as a graduate assistant football coach and earned an MBA in 1976.

While at Duke, Alleva played a key role in Durham's community sports scene. He started Little League Baseball in Durham over 20 years ago, and he also began the American Legion baseball program.

He is a member of the North Carolina American Legion Hall of Fame, the Suffern High School Hall of Fame and the Rockland County Hall of Fame.

Alleva and his wife, Annie, have three children, J.D., Jeff, and Jenny, and four grandchildren.



Verge Ausberry

Deputy Director of Athletics

A former LSU football standout, Verge Ausberry joined the athletics administrative staff in August 2001 as the Associate Athletics Director for Operations and was appointed to the position of Senior Associate Athletics Director in May 2006. He was named Deputy Director of Athletics in January of 2016.

Ausberry supervises and is responsible for football operations, football scheduling and football management. He also oversees the LSU men's and women's track and field programs, the equipment staff, the strength and conditioning staff, the Dr. Martin Broussard training room, the video department and football game management. Ausberry, from New Iberia, La., played inside linebacker for the Tigers, lettering in 1986-89. He was part of two SEC championship teams, playing on teams that went to four bowl games.

Before joining the LSU athletic administration, he was very closely involved in the athletic program, first serving for almost seven years as a member of LSU's highly regarded Academic Center for Athletes.

After leaving the Academic Center, he moved in July 1999 to the Tiger Athletic Foundation staff as part of LSU's fundraising arm.

Ausberry received his Bachelor of Science degree in education in May of 1990, his Master of Education degree in May of 1992 and his specialist in higher education administration in 2004. He is presently a doctoral candidate in higher education administration at LSU. He is married to the former Cheri Morial of New Orleans and they have two boys, Austin (11) and Jaiden (10).



Bo Bahnsen

Senior Associate AD/Compliance and Planning

Returning in 2009 to serve the department in the Compliance Office, Bahnsen is once again proving to be a very versatile member of the athletic department.

Before moving back to Compliance, Bahnsen served the previous five years, in a valuable role as Associate Athletics Director for Internal Relations, overseeing the ticket office and all customer service operations.

Prior to December of 2003, Bahnsen's primary responsibility for the previous 14 years was to serve as LSU's NCAA compliance officer.

Bahnsen served as manager of the LSU basketball team as an undergraduate at LSU. In 1982, he became the administrative assistant for the men's basketball team, where he worked for five years.

In July 1987, he became administrative assistant to Athletics Director Joe Dean, overseeing the purchasing office and departmental travel operations until his promotion in 1989. In 1989, he was assigned his primary responsibility as NCAA compliance officer as assistant athletics director, and then was promoted to associate AD in 1996.

Bahnsen has been responsible for overseeing the successful implementation of LSU's Tradition Fund Program, a football-seating plan that requires contributions for the right to purchase approximately 45,000 seats in Tiger Stadium. In 2009, he helped organize the highly successful LSU celebration of the 100th anniversary of the Men's Basketball Program.

A native of Wharton, Texas, Bahnsen attended Wharton County Junior College for two years before transferring to LSU in 1979. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in physical education.

Bahnsen, 57, is married to the former Karen Mayson, a former LSU golfer and current head coach of the Lady Tigers golf program. The couple has two children, Darren and Devin.



Mark Ewing

Senior Associate AD/Business

Mark Ewing, a 32-year employee of Louisiana State University, is in his 16th year with the Athletics Department, and serves as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Business and the department's Chief Financial Officer.

His duties as the department's Chief Financial Officer includes oversight of the departments over \$126 million budget, management of the athletic business office, oversight of all travel, human resources, and purchasing. Senior Associate AD/Athletic Facility Management

Senior Associate AD/Senior Woman Administrator

Associate AD/Ticket Sales and Operations

Michael Bonnette enters his 17th year as LSU's Communications Director and 10th as Associated Athletic Director. Bonnette was originally elevated to Sports Information Director in August of 2000 and the promoted to Assistant Athletic Director in July of 2004.

As Communications Director, Bonnette serves as the chief contact for LSU's nationally-ranked football team as well as overseeing all publicity activities for the 21 sports sponsored by the Athletic Department.

The 46-year-old Bonnette, who served as an Associate Sports Information Director for seven years, is in his 23rd year with the LSU Athletic Department.

His 2012 LSU Football media guide as named "Best in the Nation" by CoSIDA, one of several awards he has received from the organization and in the Louisiana Sports Writers Association annual writing contests. His 2014 football media guide was ranked second in the nation.

The Lake Charles, La., native has been around the sports media profession his entire life as he is the son of retired McNeese State Sports Information Director Louis Bonnette, a member of the CoSIDA Hall of Fame. The field at Cowboy Stadium in Lake Charles is named "Louis Bonnette Field". His brother, Matthew, continued the family tradition at McNeese by being named Sports Information Director in July 2012, following his Dad, who held that position for 46 years.

Bonnette, who is a 1993 graduate of LSU, is past president of SIDs for the Southeastern Conference and is currently the vice-president for SIDs for the LSWA. He is married to the former Robin Arnaud of Opelousas, La and the couple has three sons: Peyton (18), Grant (17) and Max (11). Peyton recently graduated from University High and will be a freshman at LSU this fall.

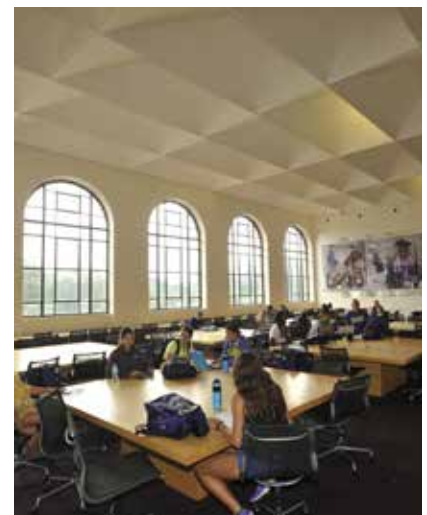
STUDY AREA

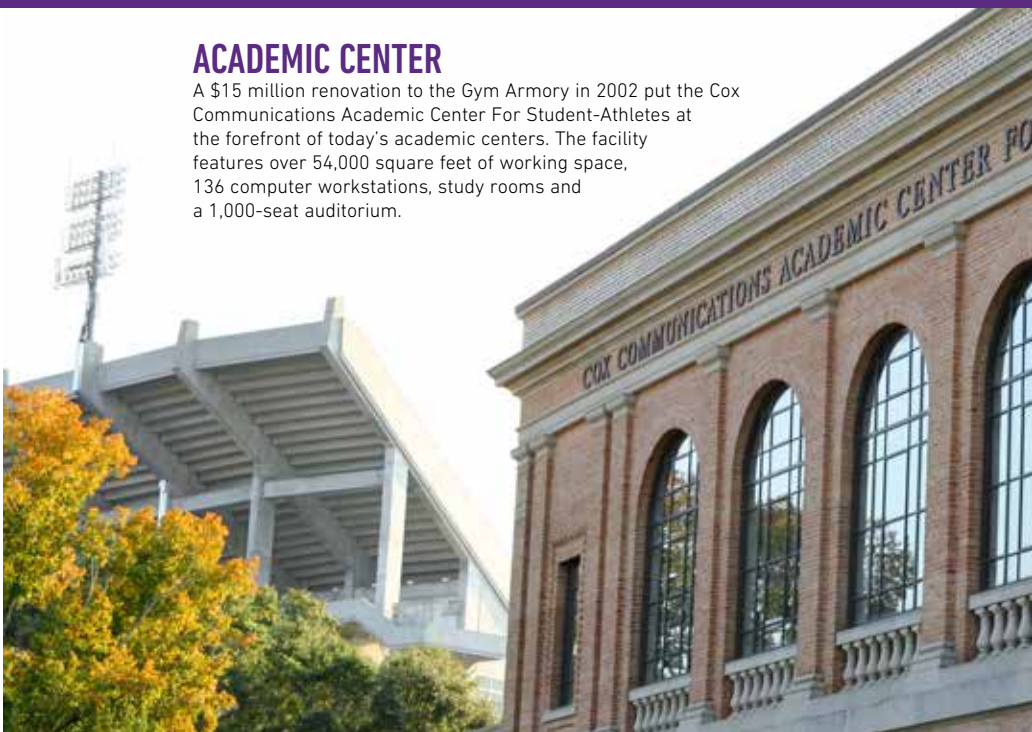

The Nation's Elite Teams



Gymnastics

After winning its fourth straight NCAA Regional championship, the LSU gymnastics team easily qualified for its fifth NCAA Super Six appearance with an outstanding performance in the NCAA Semifinal on April 15, 2016. In a season of fantastic performances, none was more exciting than the Super Six. In that championship meet, the Tigers rallied from behind to finish as the 2016 National Runner-Up, the best finish in school history. With a second-place finish in the Super Six, LSU defeated rivals Alabama, Florida and Georgia by posting a 197.450. Not only was it the highest finish in school history, it marked the fifth Super Six appearances in nine years and the third Top-5 national finish in the last four years, cementing LSU as one of the nation's best gymnastics teams.

Track & Field

For the 15th time in 17 seasons, the Tigers cracked the Top 5 of the final men's team standings at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in 2016. The Tigers tallied 41 points to take fifth place. The Lady Tigers clinched sixth place at the Outdoor Championships, giving the LSU track & field teams one of the best finishes of any team in 2016.

Softball

The LSU softball team has made three of its five total appearances in the Women's College World Series in the last five years, qualifying for the postseason in each of the last 11 years which is a program-record run. In 2016 the Tigers finished third at the Women's College World Series for the second-straight season, and the Tigers wrapped up the year with a 52-18 record.

Men's Golf

One year after clinching the NCAA national title, the LSU men's golf team reached the quarterfinal round of match play at the NCAA Championships, making the 2016 season another rousing success. LSU is only the third team in the match-play era to qualify for "Match Play 8" in three-straight seasons, and the Tigers also earned a Top-5 finish for the third-consecutive season.

Women's Tennis

The 2015-16 season marked another year of firsts for the LSU women's tennis team under the direction of Julia and Michael Sell. LSU reached the ITA Team Indoor Championships for the first time in school history and also reached a program-best ranking on three separate occasions. The Lady Tigers cracked the Top 10 for the first time in program history, reaching No. 9 in March.



Ashleigh Gnat

Ashleigh Gnat had one of the finest seasons in LSU gymnastics history. The junior ranked No. 1 nationally on vault and floor and led the nation with an LSU single-season record six perfect 10.0 scores. An 11-time All-American, Gnat was named the 2016 SEC Specialist of the Year, the 2016 Central Region Gymnast of the Year, and she won the SEC floor exercise title with a perfect 10 at the SEC Championship. She was a major catalyst in LSU's national runner-up finish.



Nethaneel Mitchell-Blake

Before anchoring the Tigers to the NCAA title in the 4x100-meter relay to end the 2016 season, Nethaneel Mitchell-Blake won the SEC Commissioner's Trophy as the top individual point scorer at the SEC Outdoor Championships. Mitchell-Blake was crowned the SEC Champion in the 100 meters, 200 meters and 4x100-meter relay to become the first Tiger to sweep all three events since three-time Olympic Silver Medalist Richard Thompson in 2008.



Ben Simmons

Ben Simmons was the consensus National Freshman of the Year and was named the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2015-16. The No. 1 overall draft pick of the Philadelphia 76ers, Simmons averaged 19.2 points, 11.8 rebounds and 4.8 assists per game, which ranked in the top five in the SEC in each category. Simmons also led all major conference players with 23 double-doubles and posted six of the SEC's eight 20-10-5 games during the season.



Sahvanna Jaquish

Sahvanna Jaquish became only the third player in LSU softball history to earn three All-America honors when she earned the distinction in 2016. She batted .343 with a team-high 19 doubles to go along with 13 home runs this past season. She tied her own school record of 76 RBI which also ranked fifth nationally. Jaquish started all but one of LSU's 70 games and served as a catalyst in LSU's run to a third-place national finish at the Women's College World Series.

Zach Wright
MEN'S GOLF

In his final season at LSU, Zach Wright led the Tigers back to match play at the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championships for the third-straight season as they tied for fifth-place nationally in defense of their national championship from the spring of 2015. Wright was the team's leading scorer with a career-low 71.51 scoring average while finishing the 2015-16 season as the No. 13-ranked player in the country in the final Golfweek rankings. Wright was honored for that performance as a PING Second-Team All-American by the Golf Coaches Association of America, as well as a First-Team All-SEC performer for the first time in his career.



Alex Lange
BASEBALL

Alex Lange in his first two seasons at LSU has established himself as one of the top pitchers in college baseball. The right-hander was named the 2015 National Freshman Pitcher of the Year, the SEC Freshman of the Year and a First-Team All-American after posting a 12-0 mark and a 1.97 ERA with 131 strikeouts in 114 innings. He became the first freshman in LSU history to record over 100 strikeouts in a season, and he helped lead the Tigers to the College World Series. Lange fired 125 strikeouts in 111.2 innings in 2016, and he was named to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team. Lange will enter the 2017 season with a 20-4 LSU career record in 34 starts with 256 strikeouts in 225.2 innings.



Jordan Daigle
MEN'S TENNIS

Jordan Daigle spent his junior season exclusively on court one for the Tigers. He was named to the 2016 All-SEC Second Team, which marked the second time in his career that he earned All-SEC honors. Daigle and doubles partner Boris Arias finished the season ranked 13th in the nation after compiling a 16-11 record overall after advancing to their second-straight NCAA Round of 16. Arias and Daigle were named ITA All-Americans in their second-straight season, which marked the first time in LSU history that a pair earned honors in back-to-back years.



Jorian Baucom
SOCCER

Jorian Baucom proved to be one of the most prolific strikers in college soccer throughout the 2015 season while scoring 15 goals in 22 appearances on the season to lead the Tigers back to the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in program history. Among her 15 goals were a team-leading five game-winning goals, including a 1-0 win over 15th-ranked and eventual NCAA runner-up Duke. Baucom's performance earned her a First-Team All-SEC selection by the league's head coaches and a First-Team All-South Region selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

ON THE PROWL

Mike the Tiger was recently ranked by ESPN as the best mascot in the SEC. Mike's habitat is one of the most visited attractions in the state of Louisiana, located in the shadows of the north endzone of Tiger Stadium.



MIKE THE TIGER

HISTORY OF MIKE

Few mascots in the country are as admired as Mike the Tiger. LSU's live Bengal mascot serves as the graphic image of all LSU athletic teams. The school has had six mascots, with the most recent, Mike VI, taking over the reign prior to the 2007 national championship football season.

The Bengal/Siberian mix, formerly known as "Roscoe," turned 11 on July 23, 2016. He was donated to LSU by Great Cats of Indiana in Idaville, Ind., a nonprofit sanctuary and rescue facility for big cats and other large carnivores.

Traditionally, Mike rides through Tiger Stadium in a travel trailer topped by the LSU cheerleaders before home games. Before the field parade, Mike is parked next to the opponent's locker room in the southeast corner of the stadium. Opposing players must make their way past Mike's trailer to reach their locker room.

It was believed that the Tigers would score a touchdown for every growl issued by Mike before a football game. For many years, Mike was prompted to roar by pounding on the cage. Objections of cruel punishment brought about the use of recorded growls to play to the crowd before the games. That practice was discontinued shortly afterward.

In the mid-1980s, pranksters cut the

locks on Mike IV's cage and freed him in the early-morning hours just days before the annual LSU-Tulane clash. Mike roamed free, playfully knocking down several small pine trees in the area, before being trapped in the Bernie Moore Track Stadium where police used tranquilizer guns to capture and return the Bengal Tiger to his home.

The incident was reminiscent of a kidnapping of Mike I many years ago by Tulane students before a Tiger-Green Wave battle.

1936-1956

MIKE I

The original Mike was purchased from the Little Rock Zoo in 1936 for \$750, with money contributed by the student body. Originally known as "Sheik" at the time of his purchase, his name was changed to Mike to honor Mike Chambers who served as LSU's athletic trainer when the first mascot was purchased. The first Mike was housed in the Baton Rouge Zoo for one year before a permanent home was constructed near Tiger Stadium. Mike I reigned for 20 years before dying of pneumonia.



MIKE'S HABITAT

In 2005, a new environment (above) was created for Mike that is 15,000 square feet with lush foliage, a large Live Oak tree, a beautiful waterfall and a stream evolving from a rocky backdrop overflowing with plants and trees. The habitat has, as a backdrop, an Italianate tower - a campanile - that creates a visual bridge to the Italianate architectural vernacular that is the underpinning of the image of the entire LSU campus. This spectacular habitat features state-of-the-art technologies, research, conservation and husbandry programs, as well as educational, interpretive and recreational activities. It is, in essence, one of the largest and finest Tiger habitats in the United States.



SNEAX DAY

On Dec. 11, 2008, a winter storm blanketed Baton Rouge that hadn't been seen in decades. The early white Christmas gave Mike VI, LSU's live Bengal/Siberian tiger, a chance to relax and play in nearly two inches of accumulation.



1956-1958

MIKE II

The second Mike served a brief reign, lasting only through the 1957 season before dying of pneumonia in the spring of 1958. He was born at the Audubon Zoo in New Orleans and came to LSU on Sept. 28, 1956. The young tiger was held overnight in Tiger Stadium and unveiled Sept. 29, the opening day of the football season.



1958-1976

MIKE III

Just in time for the 1958 national championship season, Mike III was purchased from the Woodland Park Zoo in Seattle, Wash., following a "national search" by then-athletic director Jim Corbett. The student body contributed \$1,500 for the purchase of the tiger. Mike III served as mascot for 18 seasons, dying after the only losing season of his reign, as LSU posted a 5-6 record in 1975.



1976-1990

MIKE IV

Mike IV reigned over Tiger athletics for 14 years after being donated to the school by August A. Busch III from the Dark Continent Amusement Park in Tampa, Fla., on Aug. 29, 1976. Born on May 15, 1974, Mike's age and health were determining factors in his retirement to the Baton Rouge Zoo in 1990. Mike IV died of old age in March of 1995 at the age of 21.



1990-2007

MIKE V

Mike V was donated by Dr. Thomas and Caroline Atchison of the Animal House Zoological Park in Moulton, Ala. Dr. Sheldon Bivin of the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine traveled to Alabama and brought the baby tiger back to Baton Rouge. Born Oct. 18, 1989, the new tiger was introduced to LSU fans at a basketball game against Alabama in February of 1990. He officially began his reign on April 30, 1990, when he was moved into the tiger habitat across from Tiger Stadium. Mike V died on May 18, 2007, at the age of 17.



2007-present

MIKE VI

Mike VI arrived on Aug. 25, 2007, thanks to the donation by Great Cats of Indiana. He was designated as the successor to Mike V on Sept. 8, when LSU played Virginia Tech. On Sept. 14, 2007, a ceremony was held to honor Mike V and dedicate the habitat to Mike VI. The 11-year-old Bengal/Siberian mix, formerly known as "Roscoe," reigned over a football national title in his first year and a 2011 SEC championship and perfect regular season. Mike VI was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer in May 2016 and underwent first-of-its-kind radiation treatment at Mary Bird Perkins Cancer Center at OLOL in Baton Rouge.

LSU GREATS

The following ten individuals are the only athletes to have their jerseys retired by LSU. Men's basketball has retired the No. 23 for Pete Maravich, No. 50 for Bob Pettit, Jr., No. 33 for Shaquille O'Neal and No. 40 for Rudy Macklin. Women's basketball retired the No. 33 for Seimone Augustus. Football's only two retired jerseys are the No. 20 worn by Billy Cannon and the No. 37 worn by Tommy Casanova. Baseball retired the No. 15 in honor of longtime coach and former athletics director Skip Bertman, the No. 19 for Ben McDonald and the No. 36 for Eddy Furniss. Augustus became the first woman in LSU Athletics history to have her jersey retired in January 2010. Furniss joined the prestigious list in April 2016.



50 BOB PETTIT

Pettit led LSU to its first NCAA Final Four in 1953 and he later became the first player in NBA history to exceed the 20,000-plus point barrier. Pettit is a member of the NBA Hall of Fame, and in 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



23 PETE MARAVICH

"Pistol Pete," Maravich still holds the NCAA record for career points with 3,667 and for career scoring average with 44.2 points a game. He was selected the National Player of the Year in 1970 after leading the Tigers to the NIT Final Four. He scored 50-plus points an amazing 28 times. He went on to a 10-year professional career and was selected as one of the NBA's 50 greatest players in 1997.



20 BILLY CANNON

One of the true legends of college football in the South, Billy Cannon was the 1959 Heisman Trophy winner and helped the Tigers to the 1958 national title. Cannon's most memorable performance came in 1959 against Ole Miss when No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss 3-0 in the fourth quarter. He fielded a punt, broke seven tackles and returned it 89 yards for the 7-3 victory. He went on to a successful 11-year professional career.



33 SHAQUILLE O'NEAL

Shaquille O'Neal was the first pick in the 1992 NBA Draft. He was named MVP of the league in 2000 and was a three-time NBA Finals MVP after leading the Los Angeles Lakers to three World Championships. At LSU, O'Neal averaged 21.6 points and 13.6 rebounds for his career, and in 1991, he was named the World's Amateur Athlete of the Year as well as SEC Athlete of the Year and National Player of the Year. In 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



15 SKIP BERTMAN

A legend in the college baseball ranks, Skip Bertman created a dynasty at LSU, guiding the Tigers to five national titles in a 10-year stretch from 1991-2000. He also coached the United States to a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and was an assistant on the gold medal-winning U.S. squad in Seoul, Korea, in 1988. Bertman retired from coaching following the 2001 season and served as LSU's athletics director for seven years. Bertman was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006.



40 RUDY MACKLIN

Rudy Macklin was a two-time basketball All-American selection during his Tiger career from 1976-81 during which time he became LSU's all-time leading rebounder with 1,276 boards and the second-leading scorer in school history behind only the legendary Pete Maravich with 2,080 points. He led the Tigers to two Elite Eight appearances and the 1981 Final Four in Philadelphia. He still holds the school single-game rebound record with 32, a mark like some of the great records in any sport that may never be broken.

ABOUT LSU RETIRED JERSEYS

The retirement of the jerseys of Casanova, Furniss, McDonald, Macklin and Augustus comes under a new provision of the LSU jersey retirement bylaws that says the retirement of an athlete's jersey in a particular sport does not preclude a current student-athlete in that sport from wearing the jersey number in that or any other sport, subject to the discretion of the head coach. This provision applies only to jerseys retired after January 1, 2007, so the numbers worn by Maravich, Pettit, O'Neal, Cannon and Bertman may never again be worn by future student-athletes in their respective sports. To have a jersey retired at LSU, an athlete must have completed intercollegiate competition for LSU a minimum of five years prior to nomination. Athletes must have demonstrated truly unusual and outstanding accomplishments, exceeding and in addition to all criteria used for Hall of Fame selection. Nominees must have a unanimous vote of support from the Hall of Fame committee.



37 TOMMY CASANOVA

Tommy Casanova is the only three-time All-American in the history of LSU football and is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame. During his Tiger career from 1969-71, Casanova personified versatility for his myriad of talents as he played offense, defense, returned punts and kickoffs. One of just two three-time All-SEC performers at LSU, he played six seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals of the NFL while earning his medical degree.



19 BEN MCDONALD

Ben McDonald won the prestigious Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's most outstanding player, in 1989 and is a member of the College Baseball Hall of Fame. He led LSU to two College World Series appearances. In 1989, McDonald was named National Player of the Year by Baseball America, The Sporting News and Collegiate Baseball. He was selected by the Baltimore Orioles as the No. 1 pick in the major league draft in 1989 and went on to enjoy a 10-year major league career with the Orioles and the Milwaukee Brewers.



33 SEIMONE AUGUSTUS

Seimone Augustus is the only women's basketball player in school history to earn State Farm Coaches Association All-America honors three times: 2004, 2005 and 2006. Augustus became LSU's first NCAA National Player of the Year, and she claimed the honor twice in 2005 and 2006. A 2006 graduate of LSU, Augustus was the 2012 WNBA Finals MVP after winning a world title. She also led the United States to Olympic gold medals at the 2008 Beijing and 2012 London Games.



36 EDDY FURNISS

Eddy Furniss enjoyed one of the best four-season stretches (1995-98) in college baseball history. Furniss is still the Southeastern Conference all-time leader in hits (352), home runs (80), RBI (308), doubles (87) and total bases (689). He was selected in the fourth round of the 1998 Major League Draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates and played five seasons in the minor leagues before retiring to concentrate on a career in medicine.

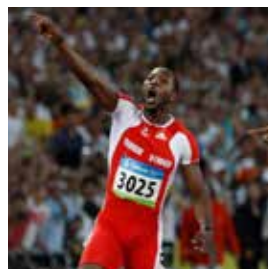

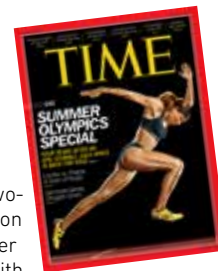


SHAQUILLE O'NEAL

A four-time NBA champion and 15-time All-Star, Shaquille O'Neal was one of the most dominant centers in NBA history. He announced his retirement from the NBA in June 2010 after a brilliant Hall of Fame career and has since become a television analyst on TNT. One of the most quotable figures on the planet, O'Neal earned his bachelor's degree from LSU in December 2000. In 2011, he penned his own biography, "Shaq Uncut, My Story," and then received his doctorate degree from Florida's Barry University in May 2012.

LOLO JONES

A three-time national champion hurdler at LSU, Lolo Jones continues to take the sporting world by storm. Jones became an inspirational figure as a two-time World Indoor Champion and the world record holder in the 60-meter hurdles with a time of 7.72. She competed in both the 2008 Beijing and 2012 London Olympic Games and became the first LSU athlete to ever grace the cover of Time Magazine in July 2012. A 2005 graduate of LSU, Jones is now a two-sport star. She was named to the U.S. National Bobsled Team that went on to claim gold at the 2013 FIBT World Championships and compete at the 2014 Winter Olympics.



PROMINENT LSU ALUMNI



EDUARDO AGUIRRE, JR.

Named the first Director of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) for the Department of Homeland Security in 2003, Aguirre, Jr., was the U.S. Ambassador to Spain from 2005 until 2009.



SIMONE AUGUSTUS

A two-time NCAA Women's Basketball National Player of the Year, Augustus graduated from LSU in 2006. She is a two-time U.S. Olympic gold medalist and continues an All-Star pro career with the WNBA's Minnesota Lynx. She was named WNBA Finals MVP in 2012 after winning a WNBA title. She was selected to the 2016 U.S. Olympic team.



JAMES CARVILLE

Carville received both a bachelor's degree and law degree from LSU and gained fame in the 1990s as the chief campaign strategist for Bill Clinton and Al Gore. Carville also penned a best-selling memoir titled "All's Fair: Love, War and Running for President."



LOD COOK

Cook graduated from LSU with a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 1955 and then earned his Master's degree in petro engineering in 1955. Cook served as CEO of ARCO for nine years.



CARLOS ROBERTO FLORES

The president of Honduras from 1998-2002, Flores helped the nation recover after Hurricane Mitch devastated the country in 1998. Flores is married to the former Mary Carol Flake, also an alumnus of LSU.



JIM FLORES

Flores graduated with two bachelor's of science degrees; one in corporate finance in 1981 and the second in petroleum land management in 1982. Flores serves as both chairman and CEO of Flores and Rucks, Inc., a publicly held independent oil and gas company.

LSU's enrollment is more than 30,000 students, including more than 1,600 international students and nearly 5,000 graduate students.

The starting centerfielder on LSU's inaugural College World Series team in 1986, Mike Papajohn today is a prominent actor in Hollywood. Papajohn was the only actor to star in four \$150 million movies in the same calendar year, doing so in 2009. The LSU alumnus has appeared in blockbuster films: Spiderman, Terminator Salvation, For the Love of the Game and most recently in Jurassic World.

DR. JAMES ANDREWS

Arguably, the world's most renowned orthopedic surgeon for knee and shoulder injuries, Andrews is a 1963 graduate of LSU and a 1967 graduate of LSU Medical School. He has worked on numerous all-star athletes, including Michael Jordan, Drew Brees, Brett Favre and Albert Pujols. Andrews is also the founder of the American Sports Medicine Institute (ASMI).



SYLVIA FOWLES

Fowles was a two-time WBCA first-team All-American before her pro career with the WNBA's Chicago Sky and Minnesota Lynx. She was named the WNBA Finals MVP in 2015. Fowles was a member of U.S. Olympic Gold Medal teams in 2008 Beijing and 2012 London, and was chosen again in 2016 to represent USA Basketball for the Rio Olympics.



JOHN HAVENS

A 1978 LSU graduate in geology, Havens is president of Seismic Exchange (SEI) and vice-chairman of the Houston Astros. He is also owner of Cal-a-Vie Health Spa in San Diego that was voted the No. 1 destination spa by "Travel + Leisure" magazine in 2013.



MARY L. LANDRIEU

Landrieu became the first woman from Louisiana selected to a full term in the United States Senate in 1996. In 2014 she was appointed chair of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee.



SUZANNE PERRON

A 1991 LSU graduate, Perron is a rising star in the design world having worked with top designers Vera Wang and Carolina Herrera. Perron has designed dresses for Hollywood stars Jennifer Lopez, Mariska Hargitay and Holly Hunter, among others.



MARTY SIXKILLER

Senior Technical Director for PDI/DreamWorks' movies "Antz," "Shrek," "Shrek 2," "Shrek the Third," "Madagascar" and "Over the Hedge".



DAVID STEINER

A 1982 LSU graduate, Steiner has served as the CEO of Waste Management since 2004. Under Steiner's leadership, the Houston-based company was named one of the World's Most Ethical Companies by Ethisphere in 2008.

To be eligible for the LSU Hall of Fame in the Athlete category, an individual must have earned a college degree and gained national distinction through superlative performance. Hall of Fame candidates must also have established a personal reputation for character and citizenship.

To be eligible in the Coach/Administrator category, the individual must have made significant contributions to LSU Athletics and gained national distinction through exceptional accomplishments in his or her field of expertise while establishing an image that reflects favorably upon the University.

The LSU Athletics Hall of Fame presently includes 136 members, which includes the latest Class of 2015: gymnast April Burkholder; hurdler Kim Carson; javelin thrower and Olympian Laverne Eve; Olympic gold medalist in women's basketball Sylvia Fowles; swimmer Todd Torres; football NFL All-Pro Ebert Van Buren; athletic trainer Mike Chambers, for whom LSU's live mascot "Mike" The Tiger is named; and trainer Herman Lang, who worked with three generations of LSU athletes. The next class to the Hall will be inducted in 2017.

SEC Network

The first two years of the SEC Network have proven to be one of the most successful launches by a network in all of cable television. Plus, it has brought Southeastern Conference sports to audiences nationwide.

That was the vision when the SEC and ESPN signed a 20-year agreement through 2034 to create and operate a multiplatform network which launched on Aug. 14, 2014. The network and its accompanying digital platform carries SEC contest 24/7 including some 1,500 events each year.

These events were made exclusively through the WatchESPN site as part of SEC Network+ on computers, phones and tablets, allowing fans anywhere and almost anytime to watch their favorite teams play their favorite sports.

The SEC Network has also become known for its studio show "SEC Now" and its traveling weekly football pregame show "SEC Nation" besides its weekly coverage
