### LSU Travels To Face Arkansas In Fourth Road Game Against Top 10 Team This Year

For the fourth time in as many tries this year, LSU will face a top 10 team on the road as the eighth-ranked Tigers travel to face No. 5-ranked Arkansas at 1:30 p.m. on Friday in Little Rock. The game will be played in a sold out War Memorial Stadium and will be televised to a national audience on CBS. It's believed to be the first time in NCAA history that a team has had all of its road games come against top 10 teams in the same season. LSU, winners of five straight, brings a 9-2 overall mark and a 5-2 league record into the contest. The Tigers are ranked No. 8 in the USA Today/Coaches poll, No. 9 in the AP poll and No. 10 in the BCS Standings following last week's 23-20 overtime win over Ole Miss. Arkansas claimed the SEC Western Division title and a berth in the SEC Championship Game last week with its 28-14 win over Mississippi State. The Razorbacks have won 10 consecutive games and stand at 10-1 overall and 7-0 in conference action. The Razorbacks are No. 5 in both the AP and Coaches polls and they are No. 6 in the BCS Standings. LSU goes into the game with a 1-2 road mark, beating then-No. 8 Tennessee, and losing to then-No. 3 Auburn, 7-3, and then-No. 5 Florida, 23-10. The Tigers bring a streak of having won 14 consecutive games in the month of November into the contest. LSU is 3-0 in November this year and the Tigers haven't dropped a contest in the month of November since a 21-20 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2002. LSU brings the SEC's No. 1 rated offense and defense into the contest as the Tigers stand atop the league in scoring offense (33.3 ppg), scoring defense (11.3 ppg), total offense (411.1 ypg) and total defense (227.7 ypg). LSU QB JaMarcus Russell ranks No. 6 in the nation in pass efficiency with 167.7 rating as he's completed 197 of 286 passes for 2,587 yards and 24 TDs. LSU's trio of receivers - **Dwayne Bowe**, **Early Doucet** and **Craig Davis** - have combined for 154 receptions for 2,208 yards and 21 touchdowns. LSU RB **Jaob Hester** leads the Tigers in rushing with 397 yards and 6 TDs, while Keiland Williams has emerged in recent weeks and has accounted for 261 yards and a pair of scores. Defensively, FS **LaRon Landry** leads the squad with 59 tackles, including 3 tackles for losses, while LB **Ali Highsmith** has 57 tackles and 3 sacks. DT **Glenn Dorsey** and DE **Tyson Jackson** have combined for 17 tackles for losses and 10.5 sacks for the Tigers.

### LSU Rallies From 13-Point Fourth Quarter Deficit To Beat Ole Miss, 23-20, In OT

LSU rallied from a 13-point fourth quarter deficit to post a 23-20 overtime win over Ole Miss. LSU PK **Colt David** clinched the comeback victory for the Tigers with a 26-yard field goal in overtime. David's game-winning points came after the Tigers recovered an Ole Miss fumble on its overtime possession. Trailing 20-7 with just over 10 minutes left, the Tigers cut the deficit to 20-14 at the 8:46 mark when **JaMarcus Russell** connected with **Early Doucet** on a 4-yard TD pass. The Tigers forced Ole Miss to punt on its next two possessions, the second of which had LSU start its potential game-winning possession at the 50-yard line. From there, Russell marched the Tigers to 50 yards in 11 plays, capped with a 5-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** on fourth down with 14 seconds to play. With the game tied at 20-20, Ole Miss blocked the David PAT to send the contest to overtime. LSU took a 7-0 first quarter lead when Russell hit Bowe with a 13-yard TD pass. Ole Miss then scored 20 unanswered points to take its biggest lead, 20-7, on a 45-yard field goal by Joshua Shene late in the third quarter. Ole Miss led 14-7 at halftime, marking the first time this year that the Tigers trailed at halftime at home. For the game, the Tigers held the Rebels to only 195 yards of total offense (100 rushing, 95 passing). Russell paced the Tigers by connecting on 20 of 36 passes for 223 yards and 3 scores. **Jacob Hester** led the Tigers with 42 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 7 passes for 64 yards and 2 scores. DT **Glenn Dorsey** and LB **Jacob Cutrera** each had 11 tackles, while DB **Daniel Francis** had 2 sacks and forced a fumble to pace the Tigers defense.

# Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SECOND YEAR

It was nothing short of remarkable what LSU coach Les Miles accomplished during his inaugural season with the Tigers in 2005. Consider that Miles led the Tigers to only the third 11-win season in school history, to a top five national ranking and a berth in the Southeastern Conference Championship Game despite numerous distractions that covered most of the months of September and October.

Then, with starting quarterback JaMarcus Russell out with an injury, Miles, along with backup quarterback Matt Flynn, guided the Tigers to the most impressive bowl win in school history, a 40-3 thrashing of ninth-ranked Miami in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win over the Hurricanes in the Peach Bowl capped a season that saw the Tigers post an 11-2 overall mark and finish ranked No. 5 in the final USA Today/Coaches Poll and No. 6 in the Associated Press poll.

To appreciate just how adverse the conditions that Miles and the Tigers had to overcome in 2005, you have to go back to late August and Hurricane Katrina, the first of two storms to devastate the state of Louisiana during the fall.

Days before LSU's originally scheduled season opener against North Texas in Tiger Stadium, Hurricane Katrina blew ashore, packing tremendous winds, and turned the state, in particular New Orleans and southeastern Louisiana, upside down.

Massive flooding followed in the wake of the storm as more than 30 LSU players had their families and their homes affected by the hurricane and Miles' first game in Tiger Stadium against North Texas was postponed. With the LSU campus serving as the recovery center for those sick, homeless and displaced due to Hurricane Katrina, football seemed to be the farthest thing from most people's minds. However, Miles was able to successfully manage a delicate situation, one that saw his team and coaching staff volunteer time to those in need, while still attempting to focus on football for at least two hours a day.

After a week of trying to minimize the distractions for a football team that had their apartments and dorm rooms filled with displaced family members and friends due to the storm, it appeared that the Tigers would finally get to play a home game, this time against 15th-ranked Arizona State.

However, just as the Tigers began to prepare for the Sun Devils and the season opener in Tiger Stadium, it was learned that the devastation to New Orleans was much greater than originally thought. With the Maravich Center on the LSU campus serving as what would become the largest field triage unit in United States history, it was mutually decided to move the LSU vs. Arizona State game to Tempe.

Still, with many in Louisiana under the distress of Hurricane Katrina, the Tigers were going to have to take to the desert to face a powerful offense in their first game of the season.

These were certainly trying times for everyone in the state of Louisiana, but even more so for a football coach who now had his team carrying the banner for a state in need of a diversion. LSU football had become a release for those consumed with the hurricane. LSU even re-stated its team goals, putting playing for the state of Louisiana at the top of the list.

The Tigers didn't disappoint as Miles and his LSU team used a 28-point fourth quarter rally to come back to beat Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe.

Now with the Arizona State game behind them, it looked as if things for the LSU football team would gradually get back to normal as the Tigers now had a week off before facing Tennessee in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 24.

Then, the unthinkable happened. Another storm, this one named Rita, hit southwest Louisiana, causing severe damage to more homes, leaving thousands without electricity and displacing even more Louisianians. The combination of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita forced LSU to again shuffle its schedule. Instead of playing Tennessee on a Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers would now be forced to face the Volunteers on a Monday night. An emotionally drained LSU team saw a 21-0 halftime lead evaporate into a 30-27 overtime loss against the Vols.

There was no coaching handbook for Miles to refer to when it came to dealing with the hurricanes and preparing a team for competition during extreme adverse conditions. Miles was on his own, forced to navigate his LSU team through a treacherous stretch of games, while also being sympathetic to those still under the influence of the natural disasters.

With just five days between the Tennessee loss and the Mississippi State game, Miles and the Tigers were obviously dealt an unfair hand, however, he asked his team to respond and they did. The Mississippi State contest was the starting point for a stretch of games for the Tigers that saw LSU win nine straight. The 37-7 win over the Bulldogs was followed by a 34-6 road victory over Vanderbilt as the Tigers had re-established themselves as one of the nation's elite on the football field. During what would be 11-consecutive weeks of play, the Tigers posted a win over Florida along with overtime victories against Auburn and Alabama. In all, the Tigers beat four teams ranked among the top 15 in the nation, a school record for regular season victories over ranked opponents.

After 10 straight weeks of play during the regular season, the Tigers had fashioned a 7-1 conference mark and a berth in the SEC title game.

Miles became the only coach in his first year in the SEC to lead his squad to the league's title game. He also became the first coach in LSU history to beat Alabama, Auburn and Florida in the same season.

Following a loss to Georgia in the league's title game, Miles and the Tigers re-grouped, this time to beat No. 9 Miami, 40-3, in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win gave the Tigers 11 victories for the year, making Miles the winningest first-year coach in school history.

## LSU Looks For 10th Victory Of Season On Friday Against Arkansas

LSU will look to win its sixth straight contest and 10th overall on Friday when the eighth-ranked Tigers travel to Little Rock to face No. 5 Arkansas. LSU goes into the contest with a 9-2 overall mark and a 5-2 league record. Arkansas, winners of 10 in a row, has already clinched the SEC Western Division title and berth in next week's SEC Championship Game against Florida. The Hogs enter Friday's contest with a 10-1 overall mark and a 7-0 league record.

## LSU and Arkansas Battle For "The Boot"

For the 11th consecutive year, LSU and Arkansas will battle for "The Boot", a 24-karat gold trophy in the shape of the states of Arkansas and Louisiana that resembles a boot. LSU has won the trophy 7 times - 1996, 1997, 1999, 2001, 2003, 2004, and 2005, while Arkansas has claimed the trophy 3 times 1998, 2000 and 2002. "The Boot" will sit on the LSU sidelines during game and will be given to the winning team following the contest.

Its only the second time that both teams go into the game ranked in the top 25 and first since the 1947 Ice Bowl when No. 8 LSU and No. 16 Arkansas froze their way to a 0-0 tie in the Cotton Bowl ... The No. 5 ranking for Arkansas represents the highest ranking for the Hogs in a game against LSU since the 1966 Cotton Bowl when the unranked Tigers stunned No. 2 Arkansas, 14-7.

## LSU Looks For At Least 10 Wins In Consecutive Seasons For First Time In School History

A win over Arkansas will give the Tigers at least 10 wins in back-to-back season for the first time in school history. In its history, LSU has won at least 10 games eight times with the most recent coming last year during an 11-2 campaign. As a matter of fact, of the times that LSU has won at least 10 games, three have come since 2001. LSU won a school-record 13 games during the BCS National Title season in 2003.

## All Four LSU Road Opponents Ranked In Top 10; Believed To Be A First In College Football

LSU's game against No. 5 Arkansas marks the fourth time this year the Tigers have faced a top 10 team on the road. It's the ONLY time in school history that LSU has faced four top 10 teams on the road in the same season. It's also believed to be the first time in college football history that all of a teams road games came against teams ranked in the top 10. LSU has already played then-No. 3 Auburn (lost 7-3), then-No. 5 Florida (lost 23-10), then-No. 8 Tennessee (won 28-24).

## Just How Tough Is The Road Slate? LSU's Road Foes A Combined 38-7 In 2006

All four of LSU's road opponents have come against teams that were ranked in the top 10 at the time of the contest. The combined record this year for LSU's road opponents is 38-7. Three of LSU's four road foes have already won 10 games this year (Florida and Arkansas both are 10-1, Auburn is 10-2 and Tennessee is 8-3).

## In The Polls

The Tigers moved up one spot to No. 8 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll this week. The Tigers remained No. 9 in the AP Poll. LSU also moved up one spot to No. 10 in this week's BCS Standings. LSU has now been ranked for 61 consecutive polls by USA Today and 60 straight polls by the AP.

## Arkansas Tigers

LSU has 1 player on its roster who calls Arkansas home. Starting center **Brett Helms** is a native of Stuttgart, Ark. He played his high school football at Stuttgart High School.

## LSU-Arkansas Ties

LSU special teams coordinator/linebacker coach **Bradley Dale Peveto** coached at Arkansas in the same capacity in 1994 and 1995 ... LSU OL coach **Stacy Searels** played on the same Auburn team as Arkansas DL coach **Tracy Rocker**.

## November Reign - Tigers Have Won 14 Straight Games In November

LSU brings a 14-game winning streak in games played in November into the Arkansas contest. LSU hasn't lost in the month of November since a 21-20 last-second defeat to Arkansas in 2002. LSU was 4-0 in November in 2003 and then followed that with a 3-0 mark in November, 2004 and a 4-0 mark in November games last year. Dating back to the 2000 season, LSU is 21-3 in games played in November, which includes a 9-2 mark in road games. Both of those road losses have come at the hands of Arkansas in Little Rock. LSU coach Les Miles has won 9 straight November games dating back to his final season (2004) with Oklahoma State.

## LSU Brings SEC's Top Rated Offense And Defense Into Arkansas Contest

LSU is currently ranked No. 1 in the SEC in both scoring offense and scoring defense as well as being first in the league in total offense and total defense. For the eighth time during his 33-game career, LSU QB JaMarcus Russell led the Tigers to a fourth quarter or overtime victory in the 23-20 win over Ole Miss. Against the Rebels, Russell guided the Tigers back from a 13-point fourth quarter deficit before LSU won on a field goal in overtime. It marked the second time in three weeks that Russell rallied the Tigers to a win despite being down in the fourth quarter. He also did it against Tennessee with a TD pass to Early Doucet with 9 seconds left. Against Ole Miss, he connected with Dwayne Bowe for a TD on fourth-and-goal with just 14 seconds left. The last minute win over Ole Miss represents the 15th time since the 2000 season that the Tigers have rallied to win games despite trailing in either the fourth quarter or in overtime. With 2 TD receptions against Ole Miss, WR Dwayne Bowe ran his career record total to 25. He also is now tied with Michael Clayton (2003) and Wendell Davis (1986) for the most TD catches in a single season with 11. Bowe's 25 career TDs rank as the ninth-highest total in SEC history along with Joey Kent of Tennessee. Chris Doering of Florida holds the career SEC mark with 31 TD receptions.

## Bowe, Doucet And Davis Closing In On A Milestone

LSU trio of receivers - Dwayne Bowe, Craig Davis and Early Doucet - are closing in on a milestone. The group has a chance to become the first set of receivers in school history to have 50 recpetions in a single season. Currently, Bowe leads the group with 55 catches, while Doucet has 50 and Davis 49. The closest LSU has ever come to having 3 players with 50 receptions in a season came in 2003 when Michael Clayton caught 73 passes, Devery Henderson 53, and Skyler Green 48.

## Bowl Eligible Again; Tigers Have Won 8 Games In A Season For 7 Straight Years

With the win over Fresno State, LSU became bowl-eligible for a school-record seventh straight season. Since the 2000 season, LSU has played in the Peach Bowl (2000 and 2005), Sugar Bowl (2001 and 2003), Cotton Bowl (2003) and Capital One Bowl (2005) in consecutive years. In addition, the Tigers have now recorded at least 8 wins for the seventh straight season, also a first for LSU.

## Tigers On CBS For Fourth Time; All Road Games In 2006 On CBS

LSU returns to CBS for the fourth time this year when they face Arkansas in Little Rock. LSU is 1-2 this year on CBS after beating Tennessee and falling to Auburn and Florida on the network. LSU is 20-18-1 all-time on CBS, which includes a 4-3 mark under Les Miles.

## No 100-Yard Rushers Allowed

LSU goes into the Arkansas game having not allowed a 100-yard rushing game by an individual this year. LSU is one of only 10 teams in the nation that haven't allowed a 100-yard rusher this year. The last time a player rushed for 100 yards against LSU came last season against Alabama when **Kenneth Darby** accounted for 104 yards on the ground. LSU has since gone 15 games without allowing a player to reach the 100-yard mark. The most yards rushing by an individual against LSU this year came last week when **BJ Green-Ellis** had 96 yards on 28 carries for Ole Miss.

## LSU Is 6-2 In Road Games Under Miles

LSU brings a 6-2 mark in road games under Les Miles into the Arkansas contest. LSU won all five of its road games a year ago. The Tigers are 1-2 on the road this season. Of LSU's 8 road games under Miles, five have come against teams ranked in the top 25. LSU is 3-2 in those games with its biggest victory coming a year ago in a 16-13 overtime win against No. 3 Alabama.

## Tigers Win 8 Home Games For First Time In School History

The win over Ole Miss last week gave the Tigers their first 8-win home season in school history. It also marks only the 12th time in school history that the Tigers have gone undefeated at home. LSU last did it in 2004 by posting a 7-0 mark. Prior to that, LSU hadn't gone undefeated at home since a 7-0 record in 1972. This year marks only the second time in school history that the Tigers have played eight games in Tiger Stadium. The other came in 1949 when LSU recorded a 7-1 mark at home.

## First Quarter Dominance

LSU has outscored its opponents 122 to 14 in the first quarter this year, which includes a 101-0 point difference in home games. The only teams to score in the first quarter against LSU this year was Florida, who scored with 11 seconds left in the opening frame, and Alabama.

## Hester's 31 Receptions Most For Tiger Running Back Since 1989

With 31 receptions this year, LSU RB **Jacob Hester** has the most catches by a Tiger running back since 1989 when Eddie Fuller hauled in 38 passes. In 11 games this year, Hester has 31 catches for 213 yards and 3 TDs, including a 17-yard catch-and-run for a score in the fourth quarter against Alabama. Hester has caught at least 1 pass in 10 of LSU's 11 games this year. The only game that he went without a reception came against Tulane.

## Run, JaMarcus, Run

LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** has used the month of November to show off his legs. In 3 games this month, Russell has rushed for 109 yards on 21 carries. Prior to LSU's game against Tennessee, when Russell had his rushing coming out party, he had only accounted for 23 yards rushing. On Saturday against Ole Miss, Russell finished with just 2 net rushing yards, but on LSU's game-tying TD drive late in the fourth quarter, he had runs of 15 yards and 12 yards. His 12-yard run came on a 3rd-and-6 situation at the Ole Miss 17-yard line. Russell opened the month of November with a career-best 71 yards on 7 carries against Tennessee. Russell had runs of 25 and 34 yards against the Vols. He followed that with 36 yards on 7 carries in the win over Alabama. The 71 yards rushing were the most for a Tiger quarterback since **Marcus Randall** rushed for 79 yards in a 43-14 win over Arkansas to cap the 2004 regular season.

## Keiland Williams Impressive In Win Over Alabama; Sits Out Ole Miss Game With Injury

LSU true freshman RB **Keiland Williams** was again impressive in the Tiger backfield as he rushed for a team-best 79 yards on 9 carries in the win over Alabama. Williams added a 38-yard TD run in the first quarter for the second TD of his career. Over the last two games, Williams has rushed for 132 yards and 2 scores in what has been the most extensive action he's seen all year. Williams sat out the Ole Miss game nursing a sore ankle. He is expected to be back on the field against Arkansas this week.

## Hester The Workhorse

LSU RB **Jacob Hester** continues to prove to be invaluable for the Tigers as he saw action in 47 of LSU's 69 offensive plays against Ole Miss. That came a week after he played on 44 of 55 snaps against Alabama. Against Tennessee, Hester played a career-best 72 offensive snaps. Hester, who can play both tailback and fullback, leads the Tigers with 397 yards rushing and 6 TDs. He also has caught 31 passes for 213 yards and 3 scores.

## Holliday Makes The Most Of His Touches

**Trindon Holliday**, all 5-foot-5 and 159 pounds of him, makes things happen with the football. In the 10 games that he's appeared in this season, Holliday has touched the ball 18 times and he's accounted for 235 yards. Holliday is averaging 13.1 yards every time he touches the football. Holliday has rushed for 161 yards on 13 carries, he's returned 4 kickoffs for 70 yards and a punt for 6 yards. Holliday rushed for 26 yards on 3 carries against Tennessee. Against Fresno State, Holliday rushed for 58 yards and 1 TD (38 yard) on 3 carries.

## Zinger and Arnold Out For Season

LSU TE **Keith Zinger** (stomach ailment) and OG **Will Arnold** (knee, ankle) are out for the season. Zinger, who has played in just 3 games this year, will apply for a medical redshirt and will return for a fifth year next season. Arnold is expected to be healthy for spring practice and be ready for his senior season in 2007.

## LSU Defense Rated Among Nation's Top 8 In Seven Categories; LSU No. 1 In Total Defense

## Russell No. 2 In School History In Passing TDs; He's No.4 In Passing Yards

LSU QB JaMarcus Russell has now climbed into the top 5 in LSU history in both TD passes and passing yards. Russell ranks No. 2 in school history in TD passes with 48 and he's fourth in passing yards with 6,083. For his career, Russell has connected on 458 of 741 passes for 6,083 yards, 48 TDs and just 20 interceptions. Russell's 458 completions ranks No. 4 in LSU history, while his 741 attempts is also No. 4.

## LSU Sack Streak At 17 Straight Games

LSU ran its streak of games with a sack to 17 straight against Ole Miss after the Tigers had 4 sacks against the Rebels. In 11 games this year, the Tigers have recorded 36 sacks with DE Tyson Jackson leading the way with 7.5. The last time LSU failed to record a sack came last year against North Texas.

## Defense Finally Allows A 300-Yard Game

For the first time this year, the LSU defense allowed a 300-yard game as Alabama accounted for 369 yards against the Tigers. That snapped LSU's streak of 16-games of not allowing an opponent to eclipse the 300-yard mark. Prior to the Alabama game, the most yards given up by the Tigers in 2006 was 288 by Florida. The last time a team reached the 300 total yards mark against LSU came in week 6 last year when Auburn produced 451 yards of offense in a 20-17 LSU overtime victory.

## Tigers Have Scored At Least 40 Points Five Times This Year

By racking up 49 points against Kentucky, LSU has now gone over the 40-point mark a school-record tying five times this year. The 2003 team scored 40 points five times in 14 games that year. This year's team became the first squad in school history to score 40 or more points during the first seven weeks of a season.

## SEC Has Honored LSU With Player of the Week Honors 8 Times This Year

LSU has picked up player of the week honors from the SEC seven times in 2006. Tiger QB JaMarcus Russell has been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week a league leading three times, while LSU DT Glenn Dorsey has been picked as the league's defensive lineman of the week on two occasions. The Sporting News said of the LSU defense, "it starts with the best defensive player in the country, tackle Glenn Dorsey, the leader of a wicked-good front seven. The emergence of shutdown corner Chevis Jackson completes the unit. Other teams on the list include Michigan at No. 2, Texas at No. 3, Florida at No. 4 and Ohio State at No. 5.

## LSU's Jackson On Mid-Season Watch List For Hendricks Award

LSU DE Tyson Jackson is one of 28 players named to the mid-season watch list for the Hendricks Award, the Ted Hendricks Foundation announced. The award goes to the top defensive end in college football. Jackson, a sophomore from Edgard, La., has 34 tackles, 9.0 tackles for losses, 7.5 sacks and 6 QB hurries.

## LSU'S Landry Named Quarterfinalist For Lott Trophy

LSU S LaRon Landry is one of 17 players who have been named as quarterfinalists for the Lott Trophy, the Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation announced. Named after Hall of Famer Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year. Now in its third year, The Lott Trophy is the first and only college football award to equally recognize athletic performance and the personal character attributes of the player. CBS Sportsline.com has named Tiger DT **Glenn Dorsey** and FS **LaRon Landry** to their Halfway to All-America Team. Dorsey and Landry lead an LSU defensive unit that ranks first in the nation in total defense and the Tigers are No. 3 nationally in scoring defense. Dorsey, a junior from Gonzales, La., has 53 tackles, 8 tackles for losses and 3 pair of sacks for the eighth-ranked Tigers. Dorsey earned Southeastern Conference Defensive Lineman of the Week twice this year for his performances against Arizona and Auburn. Against Arizona, Dorsey recorded four tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss in the 45-3 LSU victory. ## First Half 3-And-Outs For The Opposition

One of the keys to LSU's defensive success has been keeping the Tigers fresh early in the game. First half drives of over three plays are anything but common for the Tiger opposition this year. Through 11 games, LSU has allowed only 61 first half points and of the 67 first half possessions for Tiger opponents, 30 ended after 3 plays or less. The longest first half drive allowed by the Tigers this year is 80 yards (vs. Tennessee - resulted in TD) and the longest the LSU defense has been on the field in the first half is 8:31 (vs. Auburn). In SEC games against Auburn and Mississippi State, LSU held both of those teams to a combined 25 first quarter yards (minus 1-yard for Auburn and 25 yards for Miss. State). ## Tigers Have 3 Receivers With Over 1,000 Career Yards

LSU's trio of receivers - **Buster Davis**, **Dwayne Bowe** and **Early Doucet** - all have over 1,000 yards receiving in their career. Doucet went over the 1,000-yard mark against Kentucky with 4 catches for 54 yards. Bowe is tops on the list with 2,257 yards on 144 catches, while Davis has 1,986 yards on 135 receptions. Doucet has 1,296 yards on 94 receptions. This year, the trio has combined for 154 catches for 2,158 yards and 21 touchdowns.

## Craig Davis Reception Streak At 33 Straight

Senior WR **Craig Davis** has caught at least one pass in 33 straight games. The streak dates back to LSU's season-opener in 2003 against Oregon State. Davis caught at least one pass in all 12 games a year ago. Davis missed the Mississippi State and Florida contests with injuries a year ago. In 11 games in 2005, Davis caught 35 passes for 559 yards and 2 TDs. This year, Davis has caught 49 passes for 714 yards and 3 TDs.

## Colt David PAT Streak Snapped At 77 Straight

LSU PK **Colt David** had his streak of successful PATs snapped at 77 straight when Ole Miss blocked his attempt in the fourth quarter last week. The 77 straight PATs ranks as the second-longest streak in school history, trailing only David Browndyke (109 straight).

## 2005: A Year of Firsts For LSU and Les Miles

A year ago, **Les Miles** set several milestones for first-year LSU coaches as he guided the Tigers to 11 wins, making him the winningest first-year Tiger coach in school history. In addition, Miles became the only coach in school history to beat Florida, Auburn and Alabama in the same season. LSU beat Florida 21-17 on Oct. 15, then followed that with a 20-17 overtime win over Auburn a week later. The 16-13 overtime win over Alabama clinched the feat for Miles. He was also the first coach in SEC history to lead his team to the SEC Championship Game in his first year in the league. Miles currently is 18-4 as LSU's head coach and he's 46-25 overall in 5-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach.

## LSU's Allowed Only 12 TDs In Last 52 Quarters

The LSU defense goes into the Arkansas game having allowed only 12 touchdowns over the last 52 quarters of play. The streak dates back to the second half of the SEC Championship Game against Georgia. Over the span of those 52 quarters, LSU has had streaks of 16 quarters and 10 quarters without allowing an offensive touchdown. Through 11 games in 2006, LSU has allowed only 54 first half points.

## Tigers Have Outscored Opponents 407-127 Over Last 48 Quarters

Dating back to the Miami (Fla.) game in last year's Peach Bowl, the Tigers have outscored their opposition 407-127. That stretch has had the Tigers scoring over 40 points six times, while holding their opponents to a combined 14 touchdowns (3 by Florida and Tennessee, 2 by Miss. State, Alabama, and Ole Miss, and 1 by Auburn and Tulane), 9 field goals (2 by Fresno State and Ole Miss, 1 by Miami, UL-Lafayette, Arizona, Miss. State, and Tennessee) and a safety (by Florida).

## Keeping Them Under 20 Points

LSU goes into the Arkansas game having held 19 of its last 21 opponents, 12 of which are SEC foes, to 20 points or less, a streak that dates back to early last year. Prior to the Georgia game in the SEC Championship, LSU held 9 straight opponents to 20 points. It was the longest streak since 2003 when the Tigers did it for the first 11 weeks of the season on their way to claiming both the SEC and National titles.

## LSU O-Line Goes From Grey to Green

A year ago, LSU had one of the most experienced offensive lines in school history, as the starting five up front combined for 146 career starts (Andrew Whitworth - 52, Nate Livings - 34, Rudy Niswanger - 31, Brian Johnson - 16, and Will Arnold - 14). This year, the Tigers went into the season with an offensive line that had combined for 32 career starts. Johnson and Arnold combined for 30 of the 32 starts, while center Brett Helms made up the other two. **Peter Dyakowski** and **Ciron Black** both made their first career starts against Louisiana-Lafayette in the season opener. LSU All-America free safety **LaRon Landry** ran his streak of consecutive starts to 46 straight against Ole Miss. Landry, from Ama, La., has been in the LSU lineup since the Mississippi State contest (week 5) in 2003. The 46 straight starts ranks as the fifth-longest streak in the Division IA.

## Charles Scott Gives Tigers First 100-Yard Back In 2006

LSU true freshman **Charles Scott** rushed for a career-best 101 yards and 2 touchdowns against Tulane becoming the first Tiger to reach the 100-yard mark this year. In reaching the 100-yard mark in his third career game, Scott becomes the quickest LSU true freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since 1995 when Kevin Faulk went for 171 yards against Mississippi State in the second game of his career. Scott is also the first LSU true freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since 2003 when both Justin Vincent and Alley Broussard did it.

## Zenon Joins Elite Club

With his 41-yard interception return for a touchdown against Arizona, LSU CB **Jonathan Zenon** is the first Tiger since at least the 1960s to return interceptions for scores in back-to-back games. Zenon is also the first LSU player since Jack Hunt in 2003 to have two interceptions returned for touchdowns in the same season.

### Quick Strike Tigers

LSU goes into the Arkansas contest having scored 18 touchdowns this year in 5 plays or less. That figure ranks eighth nationally and second among SEC schools. ## 75 YEARS UNDER THE LIGHTS SATURDAY NIGHT IN DEATH VALLEY



• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 82nd year in the venerable stadium. LSU is also celebrating the 75th anniversary of playing under the light of Tiger Stadium. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.

• LSU has won 31 OF ITS LAST 34 games at home.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 47 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 37 times, including a school-record 92,664 for the Oct. 22, 2005 game that pitted No. 7 LSU against No. 15 Auburn. LSU won the game 20-17.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 46 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 44 of the 46 years and in the top 10 on 38 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP SIX IN THE NATION, including the last five.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 202-59-3 (.771) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 19-22-3 (.466) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised. ## Tigers Defense Comes up Big in 19-17 Win Over Arkansas

LSU held the SEC's top ranked rushing offense to just 35 yards, 200 below its season average, as the third-ranked Tigers held off a late Arkansas rally for a 19-17 win in Tiger Stadium. With the win, the Tigers clinched a spot in the SEC Championship Game for the third time in five years. After a scoreless first quarter, the Tigers got on the board first with a 26-yard field goal by **Colt David** at the 13:24 mark in the second quarter. LSU stretched the lead to 10-0 just three minutes later when **JaMarcus Russell** connected with Bennie Brazell on a 50-yard TD pass. LSU led 12-3 at halftime when **Early Doucet** tackled Arkansas punter Jacob Skinner in the endzone with 12 seconds left before intermission. LSU appeared to have the game in hand when **Justin Vincent** scored from 4-yards out early in the third quarter to put the Tigers up 19-3. However, the Razorbacks battled back, cutting the deficit to 19-17 on a 1-yard run by Darren McFadden early in the fourth quarter. The Tiger defense held Arkansas to 1-net yard on its next three possessions to secure the victory and a spot in the league's title game. Vincent led LSU with 59 yards rushing and 1 TD, while Russell completed 13 of 29 passes for 194 yards, 1 TD and 2 interceptions for the Tigers. Defensively, Melvin Oliver led the Tigers with 9 tackles and 3 sacks as LSU held Arkansas to only 12 first downs and just 241 yards of total offense.

**Russell, Defense Dominant In 45-3 Dismantling Of Louisiana-Lafayette**

JaMarcus Russell looked to be in mid-season form and the Tiger defense seemed to pick up where last season left off as eight-ranked LSU rolled to a 45-3 season-opening win over Louisiana-Lafayette. Russell, seeing his first action since the SEC title game a year ago, connected on 13-of-17 passes for 253 yards and threw a career-high 3 TD passes in the victory, including a 58-yarder to Brandon LaFell on LSU's first possession of the contest. Minutes later CB Jonathan Zenon returned an interception 20-yards for a touchdown, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead just five minutes into the game. ULL's only points came early in the second quarter on a field goal as the Tiger defense stretched its streak of not allowing a touchdown to 10 quarters. The Tigers closed out the first half with Russell throwing TD passes to Early Doucet and Dwayne Bowe as LSU led 28-3 at halftime. Jacob Hester and Alley Broussard added TD runs in the second half for the Tigers as LSU rolled up 469 yards of offense compared to just eight first downs and 176 yards for the Cajuns. For the contest, LSU's three quarterbacks combined to connect on 17-of-23 passes for 299 yards and 3 scores, while the Tigers racked up 170 yards on the ground, with Broussard leading the way with 46 yards on eight carries in his first action since a severe knee injury in August of 2005.

**LSU Overwhelms Arizona, 45-3**

LSU struck early and often and never looked back as the Tigers scored on their first possession for the second straight week on their way to a 45-3 win over Arizona. LSU's defense also added first quarter points for the second straight week when **Jonathan Zenon** returned an interception 41 yards for a score, giving LSU a 14-0 lead. The Tigers extended their lead to 24-0 early in the second quarter on a 17-yard run by **Alley Broussard**. LSU extended the lead to 38-0 in the third quarter with a pair of touchdowns in a two minute span, the first coming on a 28-yard run by **Jacob Hester** and the second coming on a 29-yard TD pass from **JaMarcus Russell** to **Dwayne Bowe**. **Charles Scott** capped the LSU scoring midway through the fourth quarter with a 38-yard run. Defensively, the Tigers intercepted 3 passes and forced a fumble in limiting the Wildcats to just three fourth quarter points. LB **Darry Beckwith** led the Tigers with 9 tackles and 1.5 sacks, while SS **Jessie Daniels** had 5 tackles, a tackle for a loss and forced a fumble.

**LSU Loses Defensive Battle to No. 3 Auburn, 7-3**

LSU held Auburn to only 7 points and just 182 yards of total offense, but it wasn't enough as No. 3 Auburn held off LSU, 7-3, in Jordan-Hare Stadium. Trailing 3-0 late in the third quarter, Auburn used a 12-play, 75-yard drive capped with a 1-yard run by QB Brandon Cox to take a 7-3 lead against LSU. That score would hold up as LSU had a last-minute drive stopped at the Auburn 4-yard line as time expired. In a game that featured two of the nation's top defenses, LSU took a 3-0 halftime lead when PK **Colt David** drilled a 42-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter. The David field goal capped a 13-play, 55-yard drive for the Tigers. QB **JaMarcus Russell** highlighted the Tiger offense by completing 20 of 35 passes for 269 yards. LSU, which had 311 yards of total offense in the contest, managed just 42 yards on the ground with RB **Alley Broussard** and **Justin Vincent** each totaling 16 yards rushing. The Tiger defense, led by LB **Darry Beckwith** and DT **Glenn Dorsey**, held Auburn to only 72 yards rushing in the contest. Of its 9 possessions, Auburn went 3-and-out five times, including all four of its first quarter possessions.

**Tigers Dominant In All Phases in 49-7 Win Over Tulane**

LSU bounced back from its disappointing loss to Auburn a week earlier with a 49-7 victory over Tulane in Tiger Stadium. LSU scored early and often in the contest, building a 14-0 first quarter lead and then stretching it to 28-0 at halftime. Early Doucet scored three first half touchdowns, two on passes from JaMarcus Russell and the other coming on a 17-yard run. Freshman Charles Scott added an 8-yard run to cap the first half scoring for the Tigers. Scott added another scoring run in the third quarter as the Tigers built a 35-0 lead. Scott finished the game with a career-best 101 yards rushing as the Tigers had 201 yards on the ground in the contest. LSU rounded out the scoring with TD runs of 7-yards by Matt Flynn and 6-yards by Jacob Hester. For the game, LSU limited the Green Wave to just 231 total yards and one fourth quarter touchdown, which came against LSU's defensive backups. Tulane did become the first team in 2006 to surpass the 200-yard mark on the Tigers as the Green Wave eclipsed the mark late in the fourth quarter against LSU defensive reserves. Russell connected on 17 of 23 passes for 198 yards and 2 TDs. As a team, the Tigers rushed for 5 scores in the game.

**Russell Passes LSU Past Mississippi State, 48-17**

LSU scored touchdowns on its first five possessions, building a 35-0 lead just 20 minutes into the contest as the ninth-ranked Tigers rolled to a 48-17 win over Mississippi State. The game was delayed 52 minutes just after halftime due to lightning. LSU led 35-3 when the game was halted with just over 10 minutes left in the third quarter. **JaMarcus Russell** completed 15 of his first 16 passes on his way to the best passing day of his career. Russell finished 18 of 20 for a career-best 330 yards and 3 TDs. Russell threw first half TD passes of 9, 37, and 6 yards. For the game, the Tigers piled up 446 yards of total offense, including 338 passing and 108 rushing. **Charles Scott**, making his first career start, rushed for 27 yards and 2 TDs for the Tigers. **Jacob Hester** led the Tigers in rushing with 49 yards and 1 TD. **Craig Davis** led LSU in receiving with 6 receptions for 101 yards and a TD, while **Dwayne Bowe** added 5 catches for 95 yards and a score. Defensively, LSU limited State to just 14 yards rushing and 226 yards of offense. LSU sacked MSU quarterbacks five times as the Tigers held the Bulldogs to 3-and-out on five of their seven first half possessions.

**Special Teams Blunders Doom Tigers in 23-10 Loss to Florida**

Fumbles on a punt return and a kickoff return along with a blocked punt were too much for LSU to overcome as the Tigers dropped a 23-10 decision to Florida in Gainesville. In all, LSU turned the ball over five times, including once at the Florida 1-yard line, leading to 16 of the Gators' 23 points, including all 14 of their first half points. LSU took the early lead in the contest, scoring on a 2-yard pass from **JaMarcus Russell** to **Jacob Hester** midway through the first quarter. The Tigers appeared to be in control of the game after forcing the Gators to punt on their next possession. However, **Chevis Jackson** muffed the punt and Florida recovered at the LSU 19-yard line. The Gators tied the game six plays later. LSU again looked to have regained control of the contest, going 75 yards on 17 plays before a fumble on the center-quarterback exchange at the Florida 1-yard line. The Gators took the lead for good just before halftime on a 1-yard scoring pass play. LSU then fumbled the second half kickoff resulting in a safety for the Gators. Florida took the ensuing kickoff and went 67 yards on five plays to take a 23-10 lead early in the third quarter. LSU had its chances down the stretch, but interceptions deep in Florida territory, erased those scoring opportunities for the Tigers. Russell finished the game with 228 yards passing and 1 TD as he connected on 24 of 41 attempts. **Craig Davis** led the Tigers with 8 catches for 85 yards, while Hester rushed for 43 yards on 9 carries. **LaRon Landry** tallied 12 tackles and blocked a fourth quarter punt to pace a Tiger defense that limited Florida to 288 yards of offense.

**LSU Defense Shuts Down Fresno State in 38-6 Win in Wet Tiger Stadium**

The LSU defense stretched its streak of not allowing a TD to 9 straight quarters as the Tigers had little trouble in a 38-6 non-conference win over Fresno State in a wet Tiger Stadium. Despite an afternoon filled with rain and lightning in the Baton Rouge area, the game was delayed just four minutes after the teams mutually agreed upon a 10-minute warm-period. It didn't seem to bother the Tigers as LSU needed only 5 plays to score its first TD, which came on a 38-yard run by **Trindon Holliday** at the 10:52 mark in the first quarter. LSU's **Craig Davis** followed that with a 77-yard punt return for a TD, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead just seven minutes into the contest. LSU led 17-3 at halftime. In the second half, **Alley Broussard** scored on a 21-yard to stretch the margin to 24-6 late in the third quarter. LSU opened the fourth quarter with a 58-yard TD pass from **JaMarcus Russell** to **Dwayne Bowe**, which tied the school record for career receiving TDs at 21. Russell connected with Davis on a 30-yard scored four minutes later to cap the scoring for the Tigers. For the game, LSU gained 394 yards of offense, while holding Fresno State to just 211 yards and only 11 first downs. Russell paced the Tigers by connecting on 15 of 19 passes for 210 yards and 2 TDs, while Broussard rushed for 67 yards and 1 score. Defensively, LB **Derry Beckwith** and S **Craig Steltz** each had 11 tackles for the Tigers, while LB **Ali Highsmith** added 8 tackles and a pair of sacks.

**Russell's Last Minute Heroics Leads Tigers Past Tennessee, 28-24**

LSU QB JaMarcus Russell connected with Early Doucet on a 4-yard TD pass with 9 seconds left to lift the 13th-ranked Tigers to a 28-24 come-from-behind win over No. 8 Tennessee. The win was only the second ever for LSU in Knoxville and the first since a 34-9 victory in 1988. Trailing 24-21 with just over 7 minutes left in the contest, Russell engineered a 15-play, 80-yard scoring drive, which included converting on a fourth-and-8 situation, to lead the Tigers to the victory. The victory came despite a fourth quarter that saw the Tigers lose a pair turnovers as well as a 21-17 lead. Tennessee took a 24-21 lead at the 7:29 mark following a Dwayne Bowe fumble at the UT 46-yard line. On UT's first play following the turnover, Jonathan Crompton completed a 54-yard TD pass to Robert Meacham. The Tigers controlled the contest early, taking a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter on a 23-yards pass from Russell to Craig Davis. Tennessee added 10 second quarter points to take a 10-7 lead at halftime. Tennessee scored its 17th unanswered point just two minutes into the third quarter when Demetrice Morley returned an interception 31-yard for a TD, giving the Vols a 17-7 lead. LSU didn't fold, however, as the Tigers responded with a 10-play, 77-yard drive to pull to within 17-14 on a 5-yard pass from Russell to Dwayne Bowe. The Tigers then took the lead on their next possession as Keiland Williams raced 7-yards for a scoring, putting LSU up 21-17 with just under three minutes left in the quarter to setup the fourth quarter fireworks between the teams. For the game, the Tigers racked up 478 yards compared to just 248 for the Vols as LSU had 41 minutes of possession time to UT's 19 minutes. Russell led the Tigers with 247 yards passing and 3 TDs. He also added 71 yards rushing on 7 carries. Doucet led all LSU receivers with 8 catches for 73 yards and the game-winning TD.

**LSU Uses Balanced Attack in 28-14 Win Over Alabama**

LSU scored on its first three possessions in building a 21-7 lead just 16 minutes into the contest as the Tigers went on to a 28-14 win over Alabama in Tiger Stadium. The win was the fourth straight for the Tigers in the series against the Crimson Tide. LSU wasted little time in getting on the board as the Tigers went 73 yards on 5 plays capped with a 38-yard TD run by **Keiland Williams** to take a 7-0 lead at the 13:34 mark in the first quarter. **JaMarcus Russell** connected with **Early Doucet** on a 30-yard TD pass just six minutes later to stretch the lead to 14-0. **LSU Rallies From 13 Down To Beat Ole Miss In Overtime, 23-20**

LSU rallied from a 13-point fourth quarter deficit to post a 23-20 overtime win over Ole Miss. LSU PK Colt David clinched the comeback victory for the Tigers with a 26-yard field goal in overtime. David's game-winning points came after the Tigers recovered an Ole Miss fumble on its overtime possession. Trailing 20-7 with just over 10 minutes left, the Tigers cut the deficit to 20-14 at the 8:46 mark when JaMarcus Russell connected with Early Doucet on a 4-yard TD pass. The Tigers forced Ole Miss to punt on its next two possessions, the second of which had LSU start its potential game-winning possession at the 50-yard line. From there, Russell marched the Tigers to 50 yards in 11 plays, capped with a 5-yard TD pass to Dwayne Bowe on fourth down with 14 seconds to play. With the game tied at 20-20, Ole Miss blocked the David PAT to send the contest to overtime. LSU took a 7-0 first quarter lead when Russell hit Bowe with a 13-yard TD pass. Ole Miss then scored 20 unanswered points to take its biggest lead, 20-7, on a 45-yard field goal by Joshua Shene late in the third quarter. Ole Miss led 14-7 at halftime, marking the first time this year that the Tigers trailed at halftime at home. For the game, the Tigers held the Rebels to only 195 yards of total offense (100 rushing, 95 passing). Russell paced the Tigers by connecting on 20 of 36 passes for 223 yards and 3 scores. Jacob Hester led the Tigers with 42 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 7 passes for 64 yards and 2 scores. DT Glenn Dorsey and LB Jacob Cutrera each had 11 tackles, while DB Daniel Francis had 2 sacks and forced a fumble to pace the Tigers defense.
