TULANE HOSTS INSTATE RIVAL NO. 2 LSU ON ESPN2:

Green Wave hosts the Tigers for the first time since 1994

• The Tulane football team (1-2, 0-1 C-USA) concludes a four-game home stand this Saturday when the Green Wave hosts second-ranked (AP/USA Today) LSU live on ESPN2 at 11 a.m. in the Louisiana Superdome. The game will be the 96th meeting between these in-state rivals, but will mark the first time Tulane has hosted LSU in New Orleans since the 1994 season, and just the 11th time since the Superdome opened in 1975.

Nike, which sponsors both the Tulane and LSU football programs, will outfit each team with a special jersey for this game. Both jerseys will feature a special Pelican emblem designed by Nike. The Pelican emblem is a tribute to the state bird of Louisiana and stylistically resembles a Phoenix, a symbol of the city of New Orleans' rebirth. However, Tulane will wear a white jersey, which normally would be worn on the road, while LSU will wear a purple jersey.



NOTING THE GREEN WAVE:

- Tulane is making its first appearance on ESPN2 since 2004 when it played Mississippi State in Starkville, Miss. The LSU game marks the first of back-to-back appearances for the Green Wave on the ESPN networks. TU will face Army on ESPNU the following week (Oct. 6) at West Point, N.Y.

- Saturday's contest marks the first nationally televised game featuring Tulane-LSU since 1983 when that contest was aired on TBS.

- Tulane is hosting its highest ranked opponent since second-ranked Florida State visited the Superdome on Sept. 22, 1990, and handed the Green Wave a 31-13 defeat. Previously, the highest ranked team to play Tulane at home was third-ranked Texas on Sept. 28, 2002 (49-0).

- Tulane is 17-12 vs. non-conference opponents (at the time of the competition) since the 2000 season, and boasts a mark of 10-2 record against Louisiana schools since 1998.

- Senior **Matt Forte** was named Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, the Walter Camp Football Foundation announced Sunday afternoon, after he reestablished the Tulane record books with 303 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 40 carries, and completed the game with 312 yards of total offense (nine receiving yards). His rushing total set a Tulane and Conference USA record and his touchdowns set a Tulane mark while tying the league's standard.

- Forte's effort last week gives him the best single-game rushing performance by an NCAA player this season, while his five scores is tied for first with DeMarco Murray (Oklahoma) and P.J. Hill (Wisconsin).

- Senior **Antonio Harris** has started every game of his career and will make his 38th consecutive start in this week's game against the Tigers. Harris' streak is the longest such streak on the Green Wave team and longest in the nation among NCAA Division I-Bowl Subdivision defensive linemen.

- Harris posted career highs in tackles (11), tackles for loss (4.0 for 16 yards lost) and sacks (3.0 for 15 yards lost) last week vs. SE Louisiana. His three sacks eclipsed his previous high of one and a half, and were the most by a Tulane player since Daniel Nevil nabbed the quarterback three times in a 41-7 win over Southern on Sept. 29, 2001, in the Louisiana Superdome.

- Senior **Joe Goosby** posted a career-high with 16 tackles (10 solo, six assists) vs. SE Louisiana. His previous high of 11 came last season in a 38-24 victory over Rice in the Superdome.

ABOUT THE GREEN WAVE:

• Tulane (1-2, 0-1 C-USA) is coming off its first win of the season with a 35-27 decision against Southeastern Louisiana last week. The Green Wave rolled up a season-best 410 yards and scored on four of its five red-zone opportunities.

• TU senior running back **Matt Forte** leads the Wave's rushing attack with 435 yards on 71 carries (6.1 ypc) and is averaging 145 yards on the ground per game.

• Forte has eight career 100-yard rushing performances and is coming off a 300-yard effort in his last game.

• Forte also leads the team in receptions with 11, while freshman red-shirt **Casey Robottom** is tops on the team in receiving yards with 142 yards on seven catches (20.3 ypc).

• Defensively, four different Tulane players have registered 10 or more tackles in a single game this season, including junior **James Dillard** with 16 in the opener against Mississippi State, junior **Evan Lee** with 12 vs. Houston, while seniors **Joe Goosby** (16) and **Antonio Harris** (11) finished in double figures last week.

• Senior **David Skehan** leads the team with two interceptions.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS:

• No. 2 (AP/USA Today) LSU (4-0, 2-0 SEC) bring an 11-game win streak into Saturday's game at Tulane. In fact, the Tigers' last loss was at Florida, the defending national champion, last season during week six. Ironically, LSU hosts the Gators next week in Baton Rouge.

• Quarterback **Matt Flynn** has started three games this season, but has been slowed by an ankle injury. Flynn has completed 37-of-65 pass attempts for 415 yards and three scores. However, **Ryan Perrilloux** has been a steady back-up and started the Middle Tennessee State game. Perrilloux's has completed 27-of-34 pass attempts for 403 yards and six touchdowns.

• Running back **Jacob Hester** has rushed for 294 yards and two scores, while **Keiland Williams** is second in rushing with 207 yards and four scores.

• **Early Doucet** leads LSU with 15 receptions (153 yds), while **Brandon LaFell** leads the team in receiving yardage with 203 yards.

• Defensively, **Ali Highsmith** leads the Tigers in tackles with 31, while **Craig Steltz** has a team-best four interceptions.

SERIES & NOTES:

• Saturday's game marks the 96th all-time meeting between Tulane and LSU, and the Tigers lead the series, 65-23-7. LSU has won the last 15 games with TU, including the last six meetings in the Superdome.

• This is the oldest rivalry for each team in their histories. The two teams first played in 1893, the first football season for each school. Tulane and LSU met in November of that year, with the Greenies winning that game 34-0.

• Tulane's last win in the series came in 1982 when the Green Wave capped a 4-7 season with a 31-28 upset of the Orange Bowl-bound Tigers. TU trailed 28-24 late in the fourth quarter, but quarterback Mike McKay found fullback Reggie Reginelli open in the flat on fourth down for a 31-yard game-winning touchdown.

• The biggest Tulane win in the series came in 1981 when the Green Wave downed LSU, 48-7. The Green Wave blocked a punt to set up a touchdown and recovered another block in the end zone for another score. Tulane Hall of Famer and long-time NFL tight end Rodney Holman capped his career with a touchdown reception in that ballgame.

• Tulane and LSU played every year from 1911-94 (with the exception of 1918 when LSU did not field a team due to World War I). The teams played single games in 1996 and 2001 and began a 10-year, home-and-home deal last season in Baton Rouge.

TO THE VICTORY GOES THE...RAG?:

• The winner of the Tulane-LSU game traditionally received a banner known as "The Rag". The Rag is decorated half Tulane and half LSU with each school's logo on the respective sides. The Rag exchanged hands with each team's victory from the first game of the series in 1893 until 1981. The original "Rag" was lost between LSU's victory in 1980 and Tulane's win in 1981. Some speculate that "The Rag" was delivered to Tulane following the Green Wave's 1981 victory, but was destroyed in a fire at the Tulane Student Center prior to the 1982 game. A replacement flag was created for the 2001 game and was present last year at Tiger Stadium.

TULANE-LSU, A LOUISIANA TRADITION:

• The crowds at the Tulane-LSU games have been tops in both programs history as the 1973 (86,958 in Tulane Stadium) is the largest crowd ever to see a home Tulane athletic event. The 1979 attendance of 73,496 still stands as the largest college crowd in Tulane-LSU Superdome history. Last year's announced crowd of 92,135 in Tiger Stadium is the largest crowd to ever watch a Tulane athletic event.

TULANE-LSU HAS VERY PASSIONATE FANS:

• One of the most bizarre games between Tulane and LSU came in Baton Rouge on Nov. 26, 1938. As Tulane was putting the finishing touches on a 14-0 win over the Tigers, a huge brawl broke out both on the field and in the stands. In an attempt to quell the melee, the Tulane band began playing the National Anthem and it worked as all participants in the fight stopped to honor their country. The move was only a momentary stoppage, however, as the brawl resumed when the final note sounded.

THE LAST TIME:

• Tulane and LSU began a 10-year series last season in Baton Rouge, and the 10th-ranked Tigers tallied 373 yards of total offense and scored on seven of its 13 possessions to hand Tulane a 49-7 loss in front of 92,135 at Tiger Stadium.

Redshirt-freshman quarterback **Anthony Scelfo** rallied the Green Wave for a pair of long drives late in the game, including a one-yard touchdown run of his own, but the game belonged to the Bayou Bengals. While the Tigers' offense was putting points on the scoreboard, the LSU defense forced six punts, a pair of interceptions and a blocked field goal attempt.

THE COACHES:

Tulane: Bob Toledo (San Francisco State, 1968) is in his first season as the head coach of the Green Wave. Toledo has a 1-2 mark at Tulane and a career record of 79-70 in 14 years as a Division I head coach. He became the 37th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2006, and has coached in 13 bowl games, including seven traditional New Year's Day bowls.

Toledo's last head coaching stint was at UCLA (1996-2002), where he led the Bruins to two Pac-10 titles, a school-record 20-game win streak, two final top-10 national rankings and was twice named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

LSU: Les Miles (Michigan, 1976) is in his third season at LSU and boasts a record of 26-4 at the school and a collegiate record of 54-25. Miles has led the Tigers to back-to-back 11-win seasons and wins in the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl (2005) and in the AllState Sugar Bowl (2007). Prior to LSU, Miles spent four years as the head coach at Oklahoma State and led the Cowboys to a mark of 28-21 with three bowl appearances. Miles was a two-year letterman at Michigan (1974, 1975) and helped the Wolverines to consecutive Big 10 titles and to the 1976 Orange Bowl.

FORTE REWRITES TU'S SINGLE GAME RUSHING LIST:

• Senior **Matt Forte**'s 303 rushing yards broke the former Tulane record of 249 (28 carries, 1 TD) set by Mewelde Moore (currently plays with Minnesota Vikings) vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 6, 2001. The former C-USA rushing record was 300 yards, set by Houston's Jeffrey Reynolds vs. East Carolina on Nov. 9, 2002.

• Forte's 312 all-purpose yards (303 rushing, nine receiving) against Southeastern Louisiana stands ranks second in school history, trailing only the mark of 336 (249 rushing, 87 receiving) set by Mewelde Moore vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 6, 2001. Moore's record is also the C-USA standard.

• Forte's five touchdowns eclipsed the former Tulane mark of four set by Charles "Peggy" Flournoy vs. La. Tech on Nov. 7, 1925 and tied by Tony Converse vs. La. Tech on Nov. 26, 1998. Prior to Saturday's ballgame, five C-USA backs scored five touchdowns on the ground - Houston's Antowain Smith vs. Southern Miss (Nov. 9, 1996), Louisville's Leroy Collins vs. Western Kentucky (Oct. 31, 1998), Army's Carlton Jones vs. South Florida (Oct. 16, 2004), Louisville's Eric Shelton vs. East Carolina (Oct. 2, 2004) and Marshall's Ahmad Bradshaw vs. UTEP (Nov. 18, 2006). It also ties a Superdome record, originally set by TCU's Tony Jeffery vs. Tulane on Sept. 13, 1986.

FORTE VS. THE NCAA:

- According to ESPN, Forte tallied more rushing yards last weekend than seven I-A teams have all season. Included in that group is Notre Dame, which has totaled exactly 200 fewer rushing yards than what Forte gained in a mere three hours time.

TULANE MAKING MOST OF RED ZONE OPPORTUNITIES:

- Although the Green Wave is averaging just 20.7 points per game this season, Tulane has been very productive in the opponents' red zone. TU has converted 8-of-10 opportunities (.800) into points. Tulane was 2-of-2 vs. Mississippi State, 2-of-3 against Houston and found the scoring column 4-of-5 times vs. Southeastern Louisiana. The Wave has produced eight touchdowns and two field goals.

LOCAL PRODUCT ROBOTOM EVOLVING INTO CLUTCH RECEIVER:

- Freshman-redshirt **Casey Robottom** earned his first career start last week against Southeastern Louisiana and led the team with three receptions for 27 yards. A native of LaPlace, La., Robottom was hampered by a leg injury through much of preseason camp which set him back. However, against Houston he made his debut as a wide receiver and hauled in four passes for 115 yards. Robottom showed the knack for making the big play with a 42-yard reception from **Scott Elliott** in the second quarter and a 41-yard catch from **Kevin Moore** in the fourth. His receiving yardage was the most by a Tulane rookie wideout since Robert Griffin had 126 vs. Air Force on Oct. 18, 1980. Robottom leads Tulane with 142 yards on seven receptions.

TULANE VS. IN-STATE SCHOOLS:

- When Tulane takes the field against Southeastern Louisiana this Saturday, it game will mark the 125th time in school history that the Green Wave has faced an in-state opponent. TU has a record of 51-66-7 against Louisiana schools, but has a mark of 28-1 against teams not names LSU. Here's a look at the match-ups against Louisiana schools:

THIS-N-THAT ABOUT TULANE AND LSU:

A win against LSU would...

- Give head coach Bob Toledo his second straight victory at Tulane
- Give Tulane its first win against the Tigers since 1981 (48-7)
- Snap a 15-game skid dating back to the 1983 campaign
- Give Tulane its first win against a nationally-ranked team since defeating 12th-ranked LSU on Nov. 27, 1982, which ironically is the last time the Green Wave defeated the Tigers.
- Give Tulane a 11-2 record against Louisiana schools since 1998
- Give LSU its first loss in the Superdome since the 1987 Sugar Bowl (Nebraska 30, LSU 15)
- Improve Bob Toledo's record as a head coach to 16-13 against Top-25 teams.

A loss against LSU would...

- Extend the Tigers' win streak to 16 straight in the series.
- Drop the Green Wave's record in New Orleans vs. the Tigers to 13-36-6
- Mark LSU's seventh straight win against Tulane at the Superdome
- Give the Tigers their eighth-straight win in the Superdome which includes a 4-0 record vs. Tulane and a 3-0 mark in the Sugar Bowl.
- Give the Green Wave an 0-33 record vs. Top-25 teams since 1982.
- Drop Bob Toledo's record as a head coach to 15-14 against Top-25 teams.

SKEHAN STRIKES AGAIN:

• Junior **David Skehan** robbed Houston two weeks with a pair of interceptions that prevented two possible scoring opportunities for the Cougars, and increased his career interception total to six, all of which have come over the past two seasons.

Last season, he started 10 of 12 games and led the team in tackles with 80 stops, including 55 unassisted tackles, 6.5 stops for lost yardage, 0.5 sacks, three pass breakups, four interceptions, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. He led the team in both tackles and interceptions.

Not bad for a former walk-on. Skehan journeyed 1,370 miles from the Bronx, N.Y., to walk-on the Tulane football team in 2004. He did not see any action as a freshman, but did play in all 11 games on special teams in 2005.

Skehan received a scholarship at the conclusion of the fall 2006 preseason camp and quickly earned a starting role, which he has yet to relinquish.

TULANE'S FORTE NAMED TO DOAK WALKER WATCH LIST:

• Tulane football standout **Matt Forté** was recognized as one of the nation's premier players as the senior from Slidell, La., was named to the 2007 Doak Walker Award Watch List, the Guaranty Bank SMU Athletics Forum.

The Doak Walker Award is presented annually to the top running back among NCAA Division I-A teams, and Forté becomes the second Tulane player to be named to the watch list in the last five years, joining 2003 honoree and current Minnesota Viking ball-carrier Mewelde Moore.

FORTE READY TO CARRY THE LOAD FOR TULANE:

• Senior **Matt Forte** moved into sole possession of third place on the school's career rushing list with 2,573 yards and is currently 522 yards behind Eddie Price (3,095 from 1946-49) for second place on Tulane's all-time list. Mewelde Moore holds the Tulane career rushing mark of 4,364 yards from 2000-03.

Forte's 543 carries (4.7 ypg) ranks third, and he ranks fifth on TU's career list for yards per game (76.0), sixth for yards per carry and sixth for rushing attempts, seventh for rushing touchdowns (21) and his seven 100-yard rushing games, including five last season, rank him third among TU's all-time leaders.

MORE ON FORTE:

• **Matt Forte** is more than just a good running back. Last season, he proved to be a dual threat out of the backfield, both in the running game and the passing attack. Forte led TU in rushing with 859 yards on 163 attempts (5.3 ypg), scoring with eight touchdowns and averaged 95.4 yards per game on the ground. In the passing game, he was third on the team in receptions with 28 for 360 yards (12.9) and two scores.

Prior to a season ending injury, Forte ranked 20th in the nation in rushing yardage. His 1,219 all-purpose yards this season, placed him 17th in the country and second in the league at one point.

LEADER OF THE PACK:

• Senior **Antonio Harris** has been one of Tulane's most consistent players during his three-year career as a Green Wave. He has proven his reliability by starting all 37 games of his career and has been productive as well by leading the Wave's defensive line in tackles during all three years of his career.

As a freshman, he led the D-line in tackles with 35, chalked up 34 as a sophomore and notched 33 stops a year ago. He earned honorable mention all-conference honors in 2006, but was a member of the Conference USA third team and all-freshman team in 2004.

TULANE'S 2007 TEAM CAPTAINS:

• Tulane's 2007 team captains as selected by their teammates are senior running back **Matt Forte** and senior defensive tackle **Antonio Harris**. Harris was also a team captain last season and is just the seventh two-time Green Wave captain, joining J.P. Losman (2002, 2003), Mewelde Moore (2002, 2003), Floyd Dorsey (2001, 2002), Patrick Ramsey (2000, 2001), Hugh Krumbhaar (1900, 1901), Charles Eshelman (1898, 1899) and Terrence Jones, who is the school's lone three-year game captain (1986, 1987, 1988).

Forte is a first-time game captain, but follows his father, Gene, who played at Tulane from 1975-77, and served a game captain during his senior season of 1977.

SEVEN IN TWELVE:

• For the second straight year, Tulane had a "bye" during the first week of the 2007 collegiate football season, and will play 12 opponents during a 12-week stretch. However, this season the Wave will play a total of seven home games, including four straight to open the season. Tulane's seven home dates are the most since the 2002 campaign. Among the seven games are two contests against SEC schools (Mississippi State, LSU), defending Conference USA champion Houston, 2005 C-USA champion Tulsa, a homecoming game against Memphis and against nearby Southeastern Louisiana.

Green Wave Game Notes

FORTE READY TO JOIN ELITE CLUB IN 2007:

- Senior **Matt Forte** was well on his way to his first career 1,000-yard season a year ago with 859 yards through the first nine games. However, a knee injury against Marshall forced Forte to miss the final three games and deny his goal.

After months of constant rehabilitation and the new installation of the West Coast offense which features the running game, Forte is primed to become just the third running back in the 113-year history of the Tulane football program to reach 1,000 yards in a single season, joining former stars Eddie Price (1946-49), who gained 1,178 yards in 1948, and Mewelde Moore (2000-03), who accomplished the feat twice in 2001 (1,421) and 2002 (1,138).

PARENTON NAMED TO LOMBARDI WATCH LIST:

- Tulane junior offensive lineman **Michael Parenton** was recognized as one of the nation's top players as he was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List on Monday. A native of Thibodaux, La., and a 2004 graduate of E.D. White High, Parenton has started 22 of 23 games during his career along the offensive line. He earned Conference USA All-Freshman Honors in 2005 after starting all 11 games at right guard, and started 11 games last season at center. Parenton is currently penciled in as the Green Wave's starting right guard for the 2007 season.

FASHION STATEMENT:

- Tulane is under new management this season with **Bob Toledo** as its head coach, and one of Toledo's first acts was to change the uniforms. The Green Wave will retain its current helmet design, which has been used since the 1998 campaign. However, the helmet remains the lone hold over. The Tulane jersey will remain green for home games and white for road games. The home green jersey features numbers on the front, back and on the shoulders and the name "Tulane" on the front in white letters and blue trim. The trim on the collar and sleeves are outlined in dark green and sky blue.

Tulane will wear white pants both on the road and at home this season. The pants feature two green stripes with one sky blue strip in between on each side, and an outline of the state of Louisiana appears on the top left side with the Tulane logo in the middle.

MISC. NOTES:

- **Aryan Barto's** younger brother, Aja, is a sophomore outfielder on the Green Wave's baseball.

- In the new offensive system installed by head coach **Bob Toledo**, the Green Wave will utilize both the tight end and fullback as every down positions. Last season, Tulane has just one true tight end (Jerome Landry) and he recorded just 10 receptions. The Wave had just one fullback on last year's roster (Ian Miller) and he carried the ball one time for one year.

This year, the roster features three fullbacks and four tight ends.

- **Anthony Scelfo's** father, Frank, is the offensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech University. Last season, Scelfo came in late in Tulane's loss at LSU, but scored the Wave's lone touchdown of the game with a one-yard plunge. This past April on the baseball diamond as a starting shortstop for Tulane, Scelfo crushed a home run and registered four RBI in a 16-9 victory over the Tigers.

- Seniors **Joe Goosby**, **Gabe Ratcliff** and **Ade Tuyo** each played on the same high school football team at Jersey Village HS in Houston, Texas.

- True freshman **Devin Holland** captured the 2007 Louisiana state title in the 200-meter dash at the state track & field meet. Holland prepped at Istrouma HS in Baton Rouge, La.

- Freshman offensive guard **Andrew Nierman** prepped at John Curtis High School and played on the same team as USC highly-touted freshman, Joe McKnight. Together the two offensive players led JCHS to a combined record of 50-3 with three state championships during his final three seasons. During his senior season, he helped lead the way for one of the nation's top prep offenses as the Patriots amassed 4,310 yards and 58 touchdowns.

- A total of 16 player on this year's squad were named to the 2007 Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

TULANE UNIVERISTY

- Tulane University was named by Kaplan/Newsweek's college guide as one of the 25 "Hot Schools" in the nation in 2008.

- Tulane is the only American university that has been converted from a public institution to a private institution.

- According to U.S. News and World Report, Tulane University is among the top 50 national universities in the United States. Tulane is ranked 50th among the best national universities, 48th in the magazine's "Great Schools/Great Prices" category and is also cited for its excellent service learning programs.

- The A.B. Freeman School of Business has been highly ranked by Forbes magazine (44th overall and 28th among private universities); London's Financial Times (EMBA program, 54th; MBA, 73rd internationally and 46th nationally); U.S. News and World Report (MBA, 45th and undergraduate, 48th); America Economia (EMBA program, 32nd internationally); and Entrepreneur magazine (13th in graduate programs for entrepreneurs). In addition, London's Financial Times ranked the finance department of the A.B. Freeman School of Business sixth in the world.

- U.S. News and World Report ranked the School of Law 47th in the nation, with its environmental law program ranked fifth. The School of Law is also included on a list of schools that have the most racially diverse student bodies.

- In its most recent report, the Gourman Report of Undergraduate and Professional Programs in American and International Universities ranked Tulane's Latin American studies program second in the United States.

- U.S. News and World Report ranked Tulane University's undergraduate biomedical/biomedical engineering program 19th in the nation.

- Tulane University ranked 27th overall and 11th among private universities in income received from technology transfer.

- The average SAT score for the 2006-07 first-year class is 1306, which is 285 points above the national average.

- Founded 1834 as the Medical College of Louisiana

- Tulane's uptown campus includes 110 acres and 80 buildings, housing the majority of its schools and colleges.

- Tulane assistant coach **Greg Jackson** was a four-year letterwinner at LSU from 1985-88, and garnered first-team All-SEC and All-America honors in 1988. He helped lead the Tigers to two conference titles and four straight bowl appearances. Jackson was drafted by the NFL's New York Giants in 1989 and helped that team to a Super Bowl title in 1991. He spent 12 years in the NFL and played with the Giants, Philadelphia Eagles, New Orleans Saints and Sand Diego Chargers.

- Tulane offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** has spent 16 years in collegiate coaching. However, he is most noted for scoring a touchdown on a Fumblerooski in the 1988 Orange Bowl against Miami (Fla.). As an All-America guard at Oklahoma against Miami in the fourth quarter of the 1988 Orange Bowl, Hutson picked up the ball after Sooners quarterback Charles Thompson had taken the snap and laid it on the ground and rambed 29 yards for a touchdown. However, OU lost the game for the national championship 20-14.

- TU receivers coach **Thomas "TD" Woods** completed his collegiate career at Tennessee as the Volunteers' single-season and career receiving leader. Woods was a two-time All-SEC selection.

San Francisco State, 1968



- Named the 37th head coach in the 112-year history of the Tulane football program on Dec. 11, 2006.
- Has a 1-2 record in his first season at Tulane.
- Sports an overall record of 79-70 in 14 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Brings more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Green Wave football team, including head coaching stints at Cal Riverside (15-6 with two championships from 1974-75), University of the Pacific (14-30 from 1979-82) and UCLA (1996-2002). He has coached in 13 bowl games during his career, including seven of the traditional New Year's Day bowls.
- Spent seven years (1996-2002) as the head coach at UCLA where he compiled a 49-32 record overall. The Bruins produced a school-record 20-game winning streak, plus two Pac-10 titles, one Rose Bowl appearance and non-conference victories over Texas (twice), Alabama (twice), Michigan, Ohio State and Texas A&M.
- Under Toledo, UCLA went 10-2 in 1998, climbing to No. 2 in the national polls. The Bruins finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (40.5) and eighth in total offense (482.6). They set school records for total offense (5,487 yards), passing yards (3,658) and passing touchdowns (29) and Toledo was a finalist for three Coach of the Year awards.
- Quarterback Cade McNown won the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, presented to the nation's top senior quarterback, and finished third in balloting for the Heisman Trophy. He was the 12th player taken in the 1999 NFL Draft.
- Offensive tackle Kris Farris won the 1998 Outland Trophy, awarded to the nation's top interior lineman, and was named first team All-America. In 1997, Punter/place kicker Chris Sailer, offensive tackle Chad Overhauser, tailback Skip Hicks and free safety Shaun Williams were all named first team All-America.
- The 1997 UCLA team finished 10-2 and ranked No. 5 in the nation after rallying to defeat Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl. The Bruins trailed the Aggies 16-0 before making a dramatic second-half comeback to win 29-23. UCLA averaged 40.7 points and more than 430 yards during the regular season.
- Prior to becoming UCLA head coach in January of 1996, Toledo was the Bruins' offensive coordinator for two seasons (1994-95) under Terry Donahue. Offensive tackle Jonathon Ogden won the Outland Trophy and tailback Karim Abdul-Jabbar was first team All-America in 1995.
- Served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for R.C. Slocum at Texas A&M for five years (1989-93). During that span, the Aggies posted a gaudy 49-12-1 record with three Southwest Conference titles and five straight bowl games, including three consecutive Cotton Bowl appearances. His 1990 Aggie offense still holds the school record for total yards in a single game (774 yards on 76 plays against Louisiana-Lafayette) and season game average with 471.1 yards per game that year.
- Toledo served as the offensive coordinator at Oregon for six seasons (1983-88), and helped tutor two of the Pac-10's most productive quarterbacks - Chris Miller and Bill Musgrave.
- Before his head coaching stint at Pacific, Toledo guided the secondary under John Robinson at Southern Cal from 1976-78. The Trojans went 31-6 in three seasons and were co-national champs after the 1978 campaign. Toledo's most heralded pupils included Dennis Thurman, Ronnie Lott and Dennis Smith.
- Toledo's first collegiate head coaching position was at Cal Riverside from 1974-75. The Highlanders were 15-6 and captured a pair of California Collegiate Athletic Association championships.

NEW ORLEANS, La.-Running back Anthony Dixon rambled for 141 yards and two touchdowns to spark a 489-yard effort by the Mississippi State offense as the Tulane University football team dropped a 38-17 decision to the Bulldogs in the Green Wave's season opener in the Louisiana Superdome.

Junior linebacker James Dillard posted a career-best 16 tackles - 10 solo stops to go along with six assists - and forced a fumble, but it was not enough as the Bulldog defense held Tulane to just 49 yards and no first downs in the second half. The Green Wave turned the ball over three times on the day - two fumbles and an interception - and Mississippi State turned them into a trio of touchdowns.

Junior quarterback Scott Elliott completed 15-of-26 passes for 197 yards and a score. But on the third play of the game, Elliott had a pass tipped at the line of scrimmage that linebacker Gabe O'Neal plucked it out of the air and returned 47 yards for the opening score of the ballgame.

The Green Wave came right back with a 61-yard drive on the ensuing possession, capped by a 39-yard touchdown run by senior running back Matt Forté. The Bulldogs, however, turned a Forté fumble later in the quarter into a score as quarterback Michael Henig found paydirt on an 18-yard scramble to put Mississippi State ahead, 14-7.

As it had done the first time the Bulldogs scored, Tulane answered with a touchdown of its own - this time culminating with an eight-yard pass from Elliott to sophomore fullback Jeremy McKinney to tie things up.

The two teams traded field goals in the second quarter to make it a 17-all ballgame at halftime, but the Bulldogs began to assert themselves from there as they took the opening kickoff and drove 61 yards on nine plays to take a 24-17 lead 3:30 into the third quarter.

Mississippi State took advantage of a short field following another Tulane fumble five drives later as Dixon ran over left guard for a 27-yard touchdown jaunt to stake the Bulldogs to a 14-point lead. Dixon capped the scoring with a seven-yard run over right guard with 9:33 left to play in regulation.

The Bulldogs amassed 192 of their 266 rushing after the bands played, including 91 second-half yards by Dixon. Justin Williams added to the MSU rushing totals with 60 yards on nine carries while Christian Ducreé chipped in with 46 yards on nine totes. State quarterback Michael Henig completed 20-of-31 passes for 223 yards and a touchdown, while Jamayel

NEW ORLEANS, La.-David Skehan picked off a pair of passes and Casey Robottom hauled in four passes for 115 yards, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a 34-10 decision to Conference USA foe Houston in the Louisiana Superdome.

The Cougars tallied 505 yards of total offense, including 87 yards rushing and 49 yards receiving by running back Anthony Alridge.

Houston quarterbacks threw a pair of balls to Skehan in the first half, but scored on every other possession over the first 30 minutes to take a 24-0 lead into the locker room at halftime. The Green Wave defense stiffened in the second half, but the Cougars still managed 10 more points as Alridge scored on a 49-yard pass from Blake Joseph in the third quarter and T.J. Lawrence connected on a 33-yard field goal in the fourth.

Tulane avoided the shutout with a 28-yard field goal by Ross Thevenot with 7:16 left to play, and closed out the scoring when Kevin Moore connected with Chris Dunn from six yards out with 32 seconds remaining.

Robottom showed the knack for making the big play with a 42-yard reception from Elliott in the second quarter and a 41-yard catch from Moore in the fourth. His receiving yardage was the most by a Tulane rookie since Robert Griffin had 126 yards on six catches vs. Air Force on Oct. 18, 1980.

Evan Lee paced the Tulane defense with a career-high 12 tackles, including eight solo stops, while Josh Lumar was next with seven. The Green Wave defense forced three turnovers on the night as Joe Goosby recovered a fumble caused by Matt Harding during the fourth quarter.

Lawrence put Houston on the board early by capping a seven-play, 53-yard opening drive with a 33-yard field goal 2:59 into the ballgame. It quickly became a 10-0 affair as Houston's Cody Lubojasky picked off a Scott Elliott pass just over six minutes later and returned it 62 yards to set up a six-yard touchdown jaunt by Alridge.

From there, the Cougar defense forced a Tulane punt, and Houston embarked on a 14-play, 64-yard drive that culminated with a Case Keenum-to-Mark Hafner, nine-yard scoring strike to push the lead to 17. Four drives later, Houston capped its first-half scoring when reserve Blake Joseph hooked up with Teric Williams from 27 yards to make a 24-0 ballgame.

Matt Forté led the Tulane offensive attack with 85 yards rushing and tied for the team lead with four receptions for another 22 yards through the air.

NEW ORLEANS, La.-Senior running back Matt Forté rushed for a Tulane and C-USA record 303 yards and five touchdowns as Tulane defeated Southeastern Louisiana, 35-27, in the Louisiana Superdome.

Down by six at the break, the Green Wave went to their All-American candidate and Forté responded with 177 yards and three scores on 25 carries in the second half alone. Forté averaged 7.6 yards per carry for the night and his 312 all-purpose yards ranks second in Tulane single-game history.

His 303 rushing yards breaks the previous team record of 249 set by Mewelde Moore vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 6, 2001. The former C-USA rushing record was 300 yards, set by Houston's Joffrey Reynolds vs. East Carolina on Nov. 9, 2002. Forté's five TDs eclipsed the previous mark of four set by Charles "Peggy" Flournoy vs. Louisiana Tech on Nov. 7, 1925 and tied by Tony Converse vs. Louisiana Tech on Nov. 26, 1998 and tied him with five other student-athletes for the C-USA standard.

Southeastern Louisiana drew first blood as Donald Frazier returned a blocked punt 12 yards for a touchdown midway through the first quarter. But Forté tied the game with a 20-yard run on the ensuing possession to cap a seven-play, 50-yard Green Wave drive.

Forté struck again with a 21-yard jaunt in the second quarter to give Tulane a 14-7 lead, but the Lions roared right back with 22- and 37-yard field goals by Jeff Turner and a 63-yard scoring strike from Brian Babin to Merrick Laneaux to make it a 20-14 ballgame at halftime.

Going into the second half, the Tulane defense stiffened. After allowing 232 yards on 38 plays in the first two quarters, the Green Wave held Southeastern Louisiana to just 109 yards in 39 plays following the break, including just 25 rushing yards on 13 carries.

While the defense caged the Lion offense, Forté carried Tulane the rest of the way with three- and four-yard touchdown runs in the third quarter and an 11-yard dive in the fourth to give the Green Wave a commanding 35-20 advantage. Southeastern Louisiana capitalized on a Tulane turnover late in the fourth quarter when Babin connected with Byron Ross for a 14-yard touchdown, but that would be the Lions' final possession as Forté and the Tulane offense were able to run out the clock from there.

Senior defensive back Joe Goosby, who lined up at linebacker for most
