THE GAME

• In an unprecedented matchup of last year's Division I national champions, three-time defending NCAA Division I (FCS) national champion Appalachian State University opens the 2008 season at 2007 BCS champion LSU.

• Kickoff is set for 5 p.m. ET on ESPN. ASU is 12-0 all-time when playing on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU and has won 13-straight nationally televised games.

• Appalachian and LSU have combined to win five of the last 10 Division I FCS (Football Championship Subdivision — formerly Division I-AA) and FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision — formerly Division I-A) national championships (ASU in 2005, '06 and '07; LSU in '03 and '07).

• In last year's opener, Appalachian became the first Division I FCS team to ever defeat a nationally ranked Division I FBS opponent when it shocked AP No. 5 Michigan, 34-32.

• ASU has an opportunity to equal the feat this week, as LSU is ranked No. 7 in the pre-season AP Top 25 college football poll.

• Since the inception of Division I subdivisions in 1978, Appalachian is 7-35-1 versus FBS/I-A opponents.

• Saturday's meeting is the second all-time between ASU and LSU. In 2005, Appalachian trailed just 14-0 going into the fourth quarter despite dropping a touchdown pass and having a field goal carom off an upright on separate drives in the third quarter. ASU went on to fall, 24-0, marking the last time that the Mountaineers were shut out.

• The setback at LSU in 2005 immediately preceded a six-game winning streak for Appalachian to end the season, culminating with the first of ASU's three-consecutive national titles.

• The Mountaineers are 1-10 all-time versus current members of the Southeastern Conference. In 1975, ASU quarterback Robbie Price led the Apps to a 39-34 triumph at then-independent South Carolina.

• LSU is one of only four teams that ASU has ever played that has won an FBS national championship. Auburn, Clemson and Michigan are the others. Appalachian has never played a team the year after it won an FBS national title.

• The Mountaineers return 13 starters from last year's team (five offense, six defense, two specialists). The Tigers return 16 (seven offense, five defense, four specialists).

AN APPALACHIAN WIN WOULD:

• give Appalachian its eighth win over an FBS opponent since Division I split into subdivisions in 1978.

• be just ASU's third in its last seven season openers.

• make Appalachian the first program in FCS history with two wins over nationally ranked FBS opponents.

• be LSU's first at the hands of an FCS opponent.

AN APPALACHIAN LOSS WOULD:

• be ASU's fifth in its last seven season openers.

• drop the Mountaineers to 7-36-1 all-time versus FBS/I-A opponents.

• be Appalachian's first in 13 all-time games televised by ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU.

ASU VERSUS FBS OPPONENTS

• Since the inception of Division I subdivisions in 1978, Appalachian is 7-35-1 versus FBS opponents.

• In last year's season opener, Appalachian became the first FCS team to ever defeat a nationally ranked FBS opponent when it shocked No. 5 Michigan, 34-32, in front of 109,218 fans at U-M's famed "Big House."

• ASU's six other wins and its lone tie versus FBS foes came against local-rival Wake Forest.

FBS NEAR MISSES

• In addition to its seven victories over FBS opponents, ASU also has had its share of competitive losses to FBS squads, including two from the SEC.

• 2005 at LSU (No. 6 LSU 24, ASU 0)

Appalachian trailed the JaMarcus Russell-led Tigers just 14-0 going into the fourth quarter and dropped a touchdown pass and missed a field goal on separate drives in the third period that would have cut the deficit to 14-10 heading into the final stanza.

• 1999 at Auburn (AU 22, ASU 15)

The Mountaineers led 15-7 late in the third period and appeared to be headed to overtime with the SEC power before Auburn marched 77 yards in 1:04 to score the winning touchdown with just 38 seconds left to play in regulation. ASU out-gained Auburn, 323-288, for the game and held AU to just 54 yards of offense in the first half.

ASU-LSU TIES

• One of ASU head coach **Jerry Moore's** most prolific wins as a player came in 1960, when his Baylor Bears defeated LSU — which was just a season removed from its 1958 national title — 7-3 at Tiger Stadium. Moore was a senior wide receiver and team captain for the BU squad that went on to finish 8-3 and ranked No. 12 nationally.

• ASU strength and conditioning coach **Jeff Dillman** spent three years as a member of LSU's strength and conditioning staff from 2003-06. In addition to his work with LSU's 2003 BCS championship football squad, he also oversaw the strength and conditioning programs for LSU's men's and women's basketball teams that both reached the Final Four in 2006.

• Appalachian defensive back **Jared Reine**, a New Orleans native, played his first two years of high school football at St. Augustine H.S., where he was teammates with LSU defensive end Rahim Alem. Reine's family was displaced by Hurricane Katrina in 2005, forcing him to conclude his prep career with two seasons at Brookwood H.S. in suburban Atlanta (Snellville, Ga.).

• ASU defensive lineman **Anthony Williams** and LSU kicker Andrew Crutchfield were teammates at Northwest Cabarrus H.S. in Concord, N.C. Crutchfield is the only Carolinas native on LSU's roster.

• ASU offensive lineman **Xan Thomas** and LSU wide receiver Ian Harding both prepped at Fork Union Military Academy in Virginia.

• Legendary LSU coach Paul Dietzel served as the color commentator for Appalachian football radio broadcasts for two seasons (1983 and '84) following his retirement from coaching and athletics administration. This year marks the 50th anniversary of Dietzel leading LSU to its first national title in 1958.

ASU VERSUS THE SEC

• Appalachian is 1-10 all-time versus current members of the Southeastern Conference.

• Nine of ASU's 11 all-time matchups versus current SEC programs came against South Carolina, all before the Gamecocks joined the conference in 1992.

• The Mountaineers topped then-independent USC, 39-34, on the road in 1975. For more on this game, see page 164 of the 2008 ASU media guide.

• Appalachian has performed well in its most recent matchups versus SEC opponents — a 22-15 loss to Auburn in 1999 and a 24-0 setback at the hands of No. 6 LSU in 2005. For more on those games, see page two.

VIEW FROM THE TOP

• For the third-straight year, Appalachian enters the season as the nation's top-ranked FCS team according to both *The Sports Network* media poll and the American Football Coaches Association coaches' poll.

• Appalachian received a total of 121 of a possible 125 first-place votes to easily out-distance No. 2 North Dakota State in both polls.

• Coming into the 2008 campaign, the Mountaineers have played 42-consecutive games as a nationally ranked team.

• ASU has been ranked in the top 10 for each of its past 37 contests, including No. 1 14 times.

WHEN ASU IS RANKED

• Appalachian is 155-62-1 (.713) all-time in games in which it is nationally ranked.

• Under **Jerry Moore**, ASU is 128-52 (.711) when nationally ranked. Twelve of those losses have come at the hands of FBS foes.

"APPALACHIAN STATE RULE" MAKES FCS TEAMS ELIGIBLE FOR AP POLL

• Appalachian's 34-32 win over AP No. 5 Michigan in last season's opener — the first ever by an FCS team over a nationally ranked FBS team — prompted the AP to change its policy which previously allowed voters to include only FBS teams on their ballots. The new policy has been dubbed the "Appalachian State Rule" by some.

• Thanks to the new policy that makes all Division I teams eligible to receive votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, Appalachian received votes on three occasions in 2007, including seven points in the season's final poll, good for a tie for 34th overall.

• Saturday's matchup is ASU's fourth versus a team ranked in the AP Top 25. Previous matchups versus nationally ranked FBS squads include last year's win over No. 5 Michigan and losses to No. 6 LSU in 2005 and No. 19 Marshall in 2002.

SIX MOORE TO 200

Appalachian head coach **Jerry Moore** needs just six more victories to reach 200 for his head coaching career.

Moore's 194 victories as a head coach (including stints at North Texas and Texas Tech prior to his arrival at ASU) are the third-most among active FCS coaches, behind only Albany's Bob Ford (225) and Florida A&M's Joe Taylor (197).

Moore's 167 victories at ASU are by far the most in Southern Conference history, far surpassing the 110 compiled by Duke's Wallace Wade from 1931-41 and '46-50.

FOR OPENERS

ASU is 46-29-3 (.609) all-time in season openers.

Under **Jerry Moore**, ASU is just 9-10 in season openers. However, 11 of Moore's previous 19 lid-lifters have come against FBS competition.

LSU has won five-straight season openers and nine-straight season openers played at Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss at home in a season opener came in 1994, when it fell to No. 15 Texas A&M, 18-13.

LSU has not dropped a season opener at home to a team not ranked in the AP Top 25 since a 31-21 setback to unranked Colorado in 1971.

UNDER THE HOT AUGUST SUN

Saturday's game is Appalachian's eighth all-time played in the month of August.

ASU sports a 4-3 all-time record in games played in August.

The Mountaineers have not played in August since 2003, when they opened the season with a 40-17 loss at Hawaii on Aug. 30.

ON THE TUBE

Appalachian is 51-26 all-time in televised games.

ASU has never lost when playing on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU, as it sports a perfect 12-0 record on the networks.

The Mountaineers have won 13-straight nationally televised affairs, dating back to a 38-17 win over Wofford on CSTV (now CBS College Sports) in 2004.

Thirty-six of ASU's last 67 games have been televised, including 16 on national networks.

THRICE IS NICE

With its third-straight NCAA Division I national championship in 2007, Appalachian became the first school to ever win three-consecutive national championships at the Division I FCS level.

ASU is one of only five programs in NCAA football history to boast three-straight national titles, regardless of division.

Appalachian is the first Division I program (regardless of subdivision) in 61 years to accomplish the rare "three-peat."

SHIFTY SIGNAL-CALLER

- ASU quarterback **Armanti Edwards** 1,588 rushing yards in 2007 were the third-most by a quarterback in NCAA Division I FCS.
- Edwards 1,588 rushing yards in 2007 were just 33 less than any ASU signal-caller other than Edwards had ever amassed *in a career*. Prior to Edwards shattering in '07, current ASU quarterbacks coach Scott Satterfield held the school record for career rushing yards by a quarterback with 1,621 (1992-95).

WHAT A RUSH

- Thanks in large part to Edwards, Appalachian turned in three of the top rushing performances in school history in the final seven games of the '07 campaign.
- ASU's 439 rushing yards at The Citadel on Nov. 3 were its most since tallying 572 yards on the ground versus Lenoir-Rhyne on Oct. 18, 1975.
- The squad's 435-yard rushing performance versus Richmond in the national semifinals marked only the fifth time in the 30 years — but second time in six weeks — that the Mountaineers had rushed for 400 yards or more.
- Additionally, the Mountaineers nearly topped the 400-yard rushing mark again on Nov. 10 vs. Western Carolin when they finished with 396 yards on the ground.
- In all, Appalachian averaged 349.3 rushing yards per game over the final seven contests of the 2007 season (all wins).

BIG SHOES TO FILL

- Appalachian's vaunted rushing attack certainly wasn't fueled by Edwards alone in 2007, as **Kevin Richardson**, ASU's all-time leading rusher, contributed with 1,348 yards a year ago to give him 4,804 for his record-setting career.
- The past two seasons were the only two in ASU history that featured two 1,000-yard rushers (Edwards and Richardson). The feat has been achieved just 25 times in FCS history.
- Four backs will be asked primarily to fill the void left by the graduation of Richardson — junior **Devon Moore** (459 yds., seven TD in 2007), sophomore **Robert Welton**, Virginia Tech transfer **Devin Radford** and redshirt freshman **Cedric Baker**.

MORE SHOES TO FILL

- Appalachian has a number of other spots where it must make up for the departure of a core group of veterans.
- ASU lost all four of its starters in the secondary from last year's team to graduation, including three four-year starters in cornerbacks **Jerome Touchstone** and **Justin Woazeah** and safety **Corey Lynch**.
- Touchstone, Woazeah and Lynch combined to make 165 starts during their time in the Black and Gold.
- Lynch and Woazeah are ranked Nos. 1 and 2 in FCS history in passes defended with 52 and 51, respectively.
- Despite the loss of the mainstays in the ASU secondary, the new starters in the defensive backfield are not completely lacking in experience, especially in big games.
- Senior nickel **Leonard Love** made two starts a season ago, including the season-opening win at Michigan, where he made a crucial interception deep in ASU territory in the fourth quarter.
- Junior cornerback **Cortez Gilbert** also made a pair of starts in '07, both coming in the postseason. He started for an injured Touchstone in ASU's national quarterfinal win over Eastern Washington and started in place of Woazeah versus Delaware in the national title game.
- Appalachian also graduated three all-Americans from its offensive line — guards **Kerry Brown** and **John Holt** and center **Scott Suttle**.
- Despite the loss of three of the nation's top linemen, injuries across the offensive front last season ensured that all five starting linemen in '08 have plenty of experience.
- Center **Brett Irvin** made just one start a season ago, but it was a critical one, as he made all 72 snaps in ASU's season-opening win at Michigan.
- Right guard **Daniel Kilgore** saw significant action in nine games last season, making a pair of starts at guard and suiting up as a blocking tight end late in the season, even scoring in the national championship game by recovering a fumble in the end zone.
- Appalachian's line is also buoyed by the return of a healthy **Mario Acitelli** in 2008. Acitelli earned all-conference accolades as a true freshman at left tackle in '06, but suffered through an injury-plagued '07. He is back at 100 percent and will help anchor the ASU front five at left guard.

LINEBACKERS AS GOOD AS IT GETS

- One spot where Appalachian certainly doesn't have to worry about inexperience is at linebacker, where ASU returns perhaps the nation's top group at the position in **Pierre Banks**, **Jacque Roman** and **D.J. Smith**.
- Banks, the preseason Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Year, has recorded 275 career tackles, just 47 shy of ASU's all-time top 10.
- Banks' 47 career games, 33 career starts and 30 consecutive starts are all tops on the squad.
- Perhaps more impressively, the academic all-district honoree just began his final semester of coursework for a master's degree in educational media. He needed just three years to earn a bachelor's degree in communication — electronic media/broadcasting and will complete his master's in a year-and-a-half.
- The defense's anchor at middle linebacker, Roman led ASU with 127 total tackles a season ago.
- Roman also tied for third in the conference with two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.
- Perhaps the most dynamic of the linebacking corps is Smith, who finished second on the squad with 121 tackles despite not starting at weakside linebacker until the seventh game of the season.
- Smith's 121 stops were the most by an ASU freshman since Dexter Coakley recorded 159 in 1993.
- Smith notched double-digit tackles in five of his nine starts as a true freshman and was named the SoCon's Defensive Player of the Month after leading ASU in tackles (49) and interceptions (2) in November.

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS

- Junior quarterback **Armanti Edwards** and senior linebacker **Pierre Banks** were voted Appalachian's 2008 captains by their teammates.
- In addition to being leaders on the field, the duo also leads by example in the classroom, as both earned ASU Academic Honor Roll status for achieving grade point averages of at least 3.25 during the spring semester.
- In addition to being role models to their teammates on and off the field, Edwards and Banks are the 2008 SoCon Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year and 2007 all-America honorees.



20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

- Appalachian is 150-24 in 19 seasons under head coach **Jerry Moore** and 55-8 since 2002 when scoring on at least 20 points.
- ASU is also 109-9 under Moore and 32-1 since 2002 when it holds its opponent to less than 20 points.

SEEING RED

- Appalachian came away with points on 69 of its 75 trips (92 percent) into the red zone (inside the opponent's 20 yard line) in 2007 (56 touchdowns, 13 field goals).
- The Mountaineers scored on each of their first 24 trips into the red zone last season (19 touchdowns and five field goals), a streak that wasn't snapped until the final possession of the sixth game of the season.
- Conversely, ASU has held its opponents to a 77.2-percent success rate in the red zone this season (44-of-57 — 35 TD, nine FG).

TIME FLIES

- Of Appalachian's 79 offensive touchdown drives last season, 33 lasted less than two minutes (41.8 percent).

- Since the beginning of the 2004 season, when Appalachian switched to a no-huddle, spread offense, ASU has gained 20-plus yards 268 times (7.4 percent of 3,619 total offensive plays).

ASU PICKED TO WIN SoCON AGAIN

- The Southern Conference's coaches picked Appalachian to win its fourth-straight SoCon championship in the league's annual pre-season poll.
- ASU was a unanimous choice of its rival conference coaches to win the 2008 SoCon title, receiving 8-of-9 first-place votes (coaches may not vote for their own team) in the pre-season poll.

- Quarterback **Armanti Edwards** and linebacker **Pierre Banks** hauled in the goods during the preseason awards season.
- Highlighting the duo's accolades, both were named preseason all-Americans by *The Sports Network*. Edwards was a first-team selection and Banks was a second-team honoree.
- The duo also swept the Southern Conference's preseason awards, with Edwards being named the SoCon Preseason Offensive Player of the Year and Banks being tabbed the conference's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.
- Edwards and Banks headlined 12 Mountaineers recognized by the league's coaches as preseason all-conference selections.

WELCOME TO THE ROCK

- Appalachian won the FCS regular-season attendance title for both average (27,140) and total attendance (162,841) in 2007.
- ASU claimed the total attendance title despite playing one fewer home game than runner-up Montana.
- The Mountaineers averaged a whopping 163 percent of Kidd Brewer Stadium's 16,650-seat capacity during the 2007 regular season.
- Since the beginning of the 2005 season, ASU has drawn 24,440 fans per regular-season home game (146.79 percent of capacity).
- The crowd of 24,140 that witnessed ASU's 55-35 win over Richmond in the national semifinals was the largest for a non-championship game in I-AA/FCS postseason history.
- Despite the net addition of nearly 4,000 seats with the construction of an upper deck on the stadium's east side, reserved seats for the entire 2008 season are already sold out.

HOME SWEET HOME

- ASU has won 35 of its last 36 games Kidd Brewer Stadium, dating back to the beginning of the 2003 season.
- Appalachian's 30-game home winning streak, the nation's longest in Division I, was snapped with a 38-35 loss to Georgia Southern on Oct. 20, 2007.
- No player on ASU's roster has suffered more than one loss at home. Last year's senior class closed their collegiate careers with a gaudy 29-1 record at home.

CAROLINAS' BEST

- Prior to winning its first national championship in 2005, a quantitative study by the *Charlotte Observer* tabbed Appalachian as the Carolinas' most successful Division I football program over the previous two decades (1985-2004).
- A look at the numbers since the turn of the millenium seem to back up the *Observer's* findings. Since 2000, Appalachian has the best winning percentage of any Division I program in North or South Carolina.

ROAD WARRIORS

- While much was made of Appalachian's school-record 30-game home winning streak, ASU has also proven to be a force to be reckoned with away from Kidd Brewer Stadium in recent years.
- Since going winless on the road in 2004, Appalachian is 13-2 versus FCS competition and 14-4 overall away from Kidd Brewer Stadium.
- Under **Jerry Moore**, Appalachian is 67-52 in road games. However, 17 of the 52 losses have come against FBS competition.
- ASU's drawing power translates to the road too. Since the beginning of the 2006 season, Appalachian has played in front of capacity crowds in 18-of-22 regular-season games.

ALL-AMERICA TRADITION

- Appalachian has placed at least one player on an all-America squad after each of the past 22 seasons. In 19 of those seasons, including each of the past 12, the Mountaineers have produced at least one first-teamer.
- In 2007, a national-record 11 Apps garnered all-America accolades, including three first-teamers that return in '08: LB **Pierre Banks**, QB **Armanti Edwards**, and DL **Anthony Williams**.

MOUNTAINEERS IN THE NFL

- Five former Mountaineers currently grace NFL rosters: DE **Jason Hunter** (Green Bay Packers — third year), WR **Dexter Jackson** (Tampa Bay Buccaneers — first year), DB **Corey Lynch** (Cincinnati Bengals — first year), LB **Marques Murrell** (New York Jets — second year) and TE **Daniel Wilcox** (Baltimore Ravens — eighth year).
- When Jackson (second round — 58th overall) and Lynch (sixth round — 177th overall) were selected in the 2008 NFL Draft, it marked the only the third time in school history and first time since 1992 that two Mountaineers were drafted in the same year.
