LSU Looks To Get Back On Track Against South Carolina

LSU will look to get back on track on Saturday as the No. 13/14 Tigers travel to Columbia, S.C. to face South Carolina at 7 p.m. CDT. The game will be televised to a national audience on ESPN. LSU goes into the South Carolina game with a 4-1 overall mark and a 2-1 league record. The Tigers are coming off a 51-21 setback to then-No. 11 Florida last week. South Carolina, winners of four straight games, stands at 5-2 overall and 2-2 in conference action. South Carolina posted a 24-17 road win over Kentucky in its last outing. Saturday's game will see the Tigers return to Williams-Brice Stadium for the first time since the 2003 national championship season when LSU posted a 33-7 win over the Gamecocks in what was the first of eight straight victories to close out the year. Last year, LSU edged the Gamecocks 28-16 in a rain-soaked Tiger Stadium. LSU goes into the South Carolina game looking to avoid back-to-back losses for the first time since the 2002 season when Arkansas beat the Tigers 21-20 to close out the regular season and Texas followed with a 35-20 victory in the Cotton Bowl. LSU hasn't lost consecutive regular season games since 2001 when the Tigers fell to Tennessee and Florida in back-to-back weeks. LSU coach Les Miles is 6-0 with the Tigers in games following a loss. Saturday's game will feature an LSU offense that is averaging 32 points and 406 yards per game against a South Carolina defense that is rated first in the SEC in both total yards per game (240.9) and pass defense (132.0). LSU RB Charles Scott had his streak of consecutive 100-yard games snapped at four vs. Florida, but he still ranks third in the SEC with 114 yards per game. LSU QB Jarrett Lee is third in the SEC in pass efficiency having completed 68 of 115 passes for 852 yards and eight TDs. Tiger WR Brandon LaFell ranks first in the conference in both receptions per game (5.8) and yards per game (81.4). Defensively, the Tigers are allowing 22 points and 303 yards a contest.

Tebow, Gators Too Much For Tigers In 51-21 Win Over LSU

An emotionally charged Florida team proved to be too much for LSU as the 11th-ranked Gators jumped out to a 20-0 first half lead on their way to a 51-21 victory over the No. 3/4 Tigers in Gainesville. Florida scored on the third play of the game and was up 17-0 before the Tigers had even managed a first down. Trailing 20-0, LSU went 60 yards in 44 seconds for a score to cut the deficit to 20-7 at halftime when Jarrett Lee found Chris Mitchell in the back of the endzone for a 6-yard TD. LSU took the opening kickoff of the second half and marched 80 yards on 12 plays to cut the deficit to 20-14 on a 3-yard run by Andrew Hatch. However, that was as close as the Tigers would get as Florida and Tebow responded with a TD drive to stretch the margin to 27-14. After a three-and-out by the Tigers, the Gators went 60 yards on four plays to increase the lead to 34-14. Florida put the game out a reach on LSU's next possession as Brandon Spikes returned an interception 52 yards for a score and a 41-14 advantage. For the game, Lee completed 23 of 38 passes for 209 yards and 2 TDs. Charles Scott led the Tigers with 35 yards rushing, while Brandon LaFell caught seven passes for 59 yards

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

It has been said that LSU is in the midst of the Golden Era of football at the school and head coach Les Miles has been the driving force behind the Tigers' dominance at the national level for the past three years.

been the driving force behind the Tigers' dominance at the national level for the past three years. Since taking over as head coach at LSU in January of 2005, Miles has guided the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Title and to three straight top five rankings, a first at the school. Miles' record with the Tigers is an astonishing 34-6, which marks the best three-year stretch in the history of the program.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 11 wins for the past three years, the Tigers have had 51 players earn a spot on the SFC Academic Honor Roll with another 51 earning their college diploma. Of the 25 seniors on the 2007 a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 51 earning their college diploma. Of the 25 seniors on the 2007 national championship team, 15 have already earned their college degree with the remainder of the class on pace to graduate within the next year.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 19 NFL Draft picks over the past three years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history winning four national awards - the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies - as well as being the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American.

Now, with the Tigers becoming first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for LSU football is more stable than ever. After 34 wins, including 14 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, Miles and the Tigers have solidified their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

The LSU Years

Les Miles' first three years with the Tigers have been unmatched in the history of the program. One would be hard pressed to find a better three-year stretch in major college football. The results are impressive and staggering: 34 wins, 20 SEC victories, 14 wins over top 25 teams, eight wins over top 10 teams, three bowl victories, including a win over Ohio State in last year's BCS National Championship Game, an SEC title and three straight top five final rankings.

Miles' 34 victories is the most of any coach during a three-year span in the history of the school and his 19 SEC regular season wins rank as the best among any Tiger coach in their first three seasons with the program. His 34 wins since taking over at LSU in 2005 also ties with Pete Carroll as the most by any head coach in college football during that

Áfter two of the most successful seasons in school history in 2005 and 2006, Miles again led the Tigers to a season of firsts in 2007. LSU became the first school in the Bowl Championship Series era to claim a second BCS National Title with its 38-24 win over Ohio State. LSU's first BCS title came in 2003 when the Tigers beat Oklahoma, 21-14.

With a 12-2 final record in 2007, the Tigers became the first team in school history to win at least 10 games in three straight years. The 2007 Tigers also set the school record for wins over Top 25 teams (7), won the SEC Championship with a backup quarterback and were ranked No. 1 in the BCS Standings during the regular season for the first time in school history. LSU finished the year ranked No. 1 in the nation in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the AP Poll.

After leading LSU to an 11-2 mark and a top five national ranking in his first year as LSU's head coach in 2005, many wondered just what Miles would do for an encore. His second year with the Tigers proved to be another year full of milestones and firsts as he guided the Tigers to another 11-2 overall record, culminating with a 41-14 dismantling of

The Tigers finished their second year under the direction of Miles ranked No. 3 in the nation, marking the first time since the 1958-59 seasons that LSU was ranked in the top five in the country in back-to-back years.

LSU's at-large berth in a BCS bowl was a first in school history and it also represented the third time this decade

that the Tigers ended their season in the Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, Miles became the first coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to back-to-back 10-wins seasons, something

that he added to with another 10-plus win season in 2007.

He became the first LSU coach since Jerry Stovall in 1982 to beat two top 10-ranked teams on the road in the same season as the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee in Knoxville followed by a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock


The Oklahoma State Years

As head coach at Oklahoma State, he built a consistent winner out of a program that had recorded only one winning season since 1988, and had posted a record of 13-20 in the three years prior to his arrival at OSU. After going 4-7 in his first year as head coach in 2001, he took the Cowboys to consecutive winning marks of 8-5 in 2002, 9-4 in 2003

Miles led Oklahoma State to a four-year record of 28-21 for a winning percentage of 57.1, the best career winning percentage for an OSU coach since Jim Lookabaugh ended his career in Stillwater in 1949.

In 2004, Miles took Oklahoma State as high as No. 15 in the country with five wins to open the season. The 2004 season included road wins at UCLA, Colorado and Missouri, and the Cowboys never lost to a team outside of the top 25. In addition, his 2004 Cowboys ranked 12th in the nation in rushing, averaging 237 yards per game, and Oklahoma State was among the national leaders in scoring offense with 32.3 points a contest

LSU will play its second straight road game on Saturday as the No. 13/14 Tigers travel to Columbia, S.C. to face South Carolina. LSU is 4-1 overall and 2-1 in league play following last week's 51-21 setback to Florida in Gainesville. South Carolina, winners of four straight, is 5-2 overall and 2-2 in conference action. Last year, LSU posted a 28-16 win over the Gamecocks in a rain-soaked Tiger Stadium. This will be LSU's first trip to South Carolina since a 33-7 win in 2003.

Up Next

LSU returns home to Tiger Stadium next Saturday to face Georgia in the first of five consecutive home games for the Tigers. After the South Carolina game, only one more road contest remains on LSU's schedule - that coming against Arkansas in Little Rock on Nov. 28. The five-game homestand will be the longest for the Tigers since 1970 when LSU opened that season by playing five straight games in Tiger Stadium.

This week's game with South Carolina coupled with the Florida contest last week marks the first time since 2005 that the Tigers will play back-to-back road games. In 2005, LSU won at Alabama on Nov. 12 and then followed that with a victory over Ole Miss in Oxford on Nov. 19.

LSU Ranked No.13 In AP Poll; Tigers No. 14 In Coaches Poll This Week

For the first time this year, LSU dropped out of the top 10 as the Tigers fell to No. 13 in the Associated Press Top 25 and to No. 14 in the USA Today Coaches Poll following the loss to Florida in Gainesville. LSU entered the Florida game ranked No. 3 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 4 in the AP Poll. By falling out of the top 10, LSU saw its school record streak of consecutive weeks in the top 10 snapped at 29 straight periods. Prior to Sunday's poll, LSU had been ranked in the top 10 of every USA Today Coaches Poll and the AP Top 25 since Nov. 12, 2006.

LSU Ranked In Every Coaches And AP Poll Since Start of 2003 Season

With its No. 13/14 ranking this week in the AP Top 25 and the USA Today Coaches Poll, LSU extended its streak of consecutive weeks in the top 25. LSU has been ranked for 90 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll and for 89 straight weeks in the AP Poll. The last time LSU failed to make the top 25 in either poll came following the Tigers loss to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl to conclude the 2002 season. LSU's current streak of consecutive weeks in both polls is a school record.

Miles vs. The SEC East

LSU coach Les Miles is 6-4 against teams from the SEC Eastern Division in games played during the regular season. Counting the SEC Championship Game, Miles has a 7-5 mark vs. the SEC East.

Miles' 38 Wins In First 44 Games Ranked First In SEC History

Les Miles' list of achievements at LSU is both lengthy and impressive. However, perhaps the most impressive item on his list of accomplishments is the fact that he ranks first in SEC history for wins after 44 games with 38. Miles' 38 wins puts him ahead of such names as Mark Richt (35), Steve Spurrier (34) and Bernie Moore (33). The following is a quick look at some of Miles' highlights during his four years with the Tigers:

- · Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season and he's done it twice
- · Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game
- · Has 6 wins over coaches who have won national titles
- · Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons a first at the school
- · Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings

Senior LB Darry Beckwith (leg - unspecified injury) returned to action last week vs. Florida and went this distance in the loss to the Gators ... DL Ricky Jean-Francois missed the Florida game and his status for this week's contest is uncertain at this time.

LSU's Won 14 Straight Overall On ESPN Family Of Networks; Streak At 13 On ESPN

LSU brings a 14-game winning streak on the ESPN family of networks into the Mississippi State game. The 14-game streak goes back to the 2005 season when Tennessee rallied for a 30-27 overtime win over the Tigers on a Monday night in a game televised by ESPN2. Since then, the Tigers have reeled off 14 straight victories on the all sports network. Breaking down the 14-game streak has the Tigers winning seven straight on ESPN, six in a row on ESPN2, and one time on ESPN Classic. In ESPN only games, the Tigers have won 13 straight, a streak that dates back to the 2002 season.

LSU Does It Again...Records 10th Fourth-Quarter Comeback Under Miles

For the 10th time under Les Miles, LSU won a football game despite trailing in the fourth quarter as the Tigers rallied from a 21-20 deficit with four minutes to play to beat Auburn on Sept. 20. The following is a look at LSU's fourth quarter comebacks under Miles, how many points the Tigers had to overcome in the final frame to win and the quarterback who engineered the comeback:

LSU's Best After Dark - Despite Florida Loss Tigers Have Won 19 OF Last 20 Night Games

Night games in Tiger Stadium seem to bring out the best in LSU. However, lately LSU has been at its best no matter the location just as long as it dark outside. LSU goes into the South Carolina game having won 19 of its last 20 night games. (Note: NCAA determines that a kickoff at 5 p.m. or later is a night game). Florida snapped LSU's streak of consecutive night wins at 19 last week. LSU's streak of 19 wins in its last 20 night games includes three games this year, seven games in 2007, eight in 2006 and the win over Miami in the Peach Bowl to cap the 2005 season. Prior to the Florida game last week, LSU hadn't lost a night game since a 34-14 loss to Georgia in the SEC Championship Game in 2005. Overall, LSU coach Les Miles has guided the Tigers to a 25-3 mark in night games, which includes a 4-1 mark in road night games.

Chuck The Truck's 100-Yard Streak Snapped; Still Among Best In SEC In Rushing

Charles Scott's streak of four straight 100-yard games was snapped vs. Florida as he rushed for 35 yards on 12 carries. Scott goes into the South Carolina game ranking No. 3 in the SEC in rushing with 114 yards per contest. In five games this year, Scott has rushed for 570 yards and six touchdowns. He's averaging 6.9 yards per rush. Earlier this year, Scott became the first LSU player in school history to rush for 100 yards at Auburn as he racked up 132 yards in the LSU win. By rushing for 100 yards in LSU's first four games, Scott joined Charles Alexander (1978) and Steve Van Buren (1943) as the only players in school history to accomplish such a feat. Alexander did it in the first four games in 1978 before having the streak snapped in week 5 against Georgia, while Van Buren did in LSU's first seven games in 1943.

LaFell Leads SEC In Both Receptions And Yards Per Game

LSU junior WR **Brandon LaFell** is turning in quite a season as he's caught 29 passes for 407 yards and three touchdowns. LaFell currently leads the SEC in receptions per game (5.8) and receiving yards per game (81.4). LaFell has caught at least seven passes in three of LSU's five games this season, which includes back-to-back games vs. Mississippi State and Florida. Against Florida, LaFell hauled in seven passes for 59 yards and he had seven catches for 100 yards against Mississippi State. LaFell has caught at least one pass in 20 straight games.

Dickson Up To No. 6 In School History For Receptions By Tight End With 52

Richard Dickson continued his climb up the LSU record charts for receptions by a tight end as he hauled in six passes for 36 yards against Florida. The six receptions by Dickson set a career high and ran his career total to 52. His 52 career receptions tie Chris Hill for the sixth-highest total by a tight end in school history. Mitch Andrews holds the LSU career mark with 87. This year, Dickson ranks fourth on the team with 14 catches for 130 yards and a pair of scores. For his career, Dickson has caught 52 passes for 601 yards and six touchdowns.

Miles Is 21-6 In SEC Regular Season Games

LSU coach **Les Miles** is now 21-6 in SEC regular season games following the loss to Florida. Miles was 7-1 in 2005 in conference games followed by a 6-2 record in both 2006 and 2007. Miles is 9-4 in SEC road games and 12-2 in league games played in Tiger Stadium. Counting the SEC Championship Game, Miles has posted 22 wins over SEC foes during his three years with the Tigers.

Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 35-2 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 26-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 24-0. Upon further review, the fumble that was charged to **Charles Scott** against Florida should have gone to QB **Andrew Hatch**, thus keeping LSU's streak of consecutive carries by its tailbacks intact. LSU's stable of tailbacks - Scott, Keiland Williams, Richard Murphy and Stevan Ridley - go into the South Carolina game having combined for 396 carries without losing a fumble. Charles Scott, the SEC's No. 3 rated rusher, leads the group with 174 carries without a lost fumble, followed by **Keiland Williams** (163 carries), **Richard Murphy** (52 carries) and **Stevan Ridley** (7 carries). An LSU back lost a fumble against Mississippi State, however it was fullback **Quinn Johnson** and not a tailback who coughed up the football in the second quarter against the Bulldogs. David goes into the South Carolina game ranked second in LSU history in career scoring with 310 points, just nine from moving past Kevin Faulk. In addition, David is third in school history in career field goals with 44 and field goal attempts with 58. David already holds the LSU career record for points by a kicker (310) and PATs (172).

Dalfrey Has Breakout Game As LSU's Punter

Senior P Brady Dalfrey had what could be considered his breakout game against Auburn as he punted 6 times for 290 yards and a 48.3 average. Four of Dalfrey's punts were downed inside the 20-yard line. Dalfrey had a long punt of 59 yards and added another 52-yarder. Of his 6 punts, four came to rest at the 1, 11, 13, and 14-yard line during the contest. His punts also had tremendous hanglime which kept Auburn from returning any of the punts. For the season, Dalfrey is averaging 40.1 yards on his 17 punts. Of his 17 punts, 8 have been downed inside the 20-yard line.

Miles Is 9-3 In October Games At LSU

Les Miles brings a 9-3 mark in games played in October as head coach of the Tigers into the South Carolina Florida contest. LSU was 5-0 under Miles in October of 2005, followed by 2-1 records in October in 2006 and 2007.

Hatch Got First SEC Start At Auburn; Lee Followed Against Mississippi State

Sophomore Andrew Hatch made his first career start vs. Auburn before being knocked out of the game with an injury midway through the third guarter. Jarrett Lee followed a week later, going the distance in LSU's win over Mississippi State. Hatch is 3-0 as LSU's starting quarterback and Lee is 1-1. In between those two Florida games in 2006 and 2008, the Tigers were 20-2 overall with the only two losses during that span coming in triple overtime to Kentucky and Arkansas in 2007.

Tigers Have Scored At Least 21 Points In 29 Straight Games; Dates Back To Florida 2006

LSU goes into the South Carolina game riding a streak of having scored at least 21 points in a school-record 29 consecutive games. LSU scored 21 points in all 14 games a year ago. The last time LSU failed to score at least 21 points in a game came in 2006 when Florida held the Tigers to 10 points in a 23-10 win in Gainesville.

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

Here are some notable trends for LSU in the 45 games its played under head coach Les Miles ... The Tigers are 35-2 when rushing for 100 yards or more ... On the contrary, the Tigers are just 3-5 under Les Miles when failing to reach the 100-yard mark in net rushing yards ... The Tigers are 27-2 when leading after the first quarter with the only losses during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005 and Arkansas in 2007 ... LSU is 36-4 when scoring 20 or more points and 31-3 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 26-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing, while the record goes to 12-4 under Miles when allowing opponents to go over the 100-yard mark.

LSU Is Now 12-4 In Road Games Under Miles

LSU is now 12-4 in road games under Les Miles following the loss to Florida in Gainesville on Oct. 11. The Tigers were 3-1 on the road in 2007 after going 2-2 on the road in 2006. Miles guided LSU to a 5-0 mark on the road in his first season with the Tigers. All four of LSU's road opponents in 2006 were ranked in the top 10 at the time of the LSU game, including Auburn. Of LSU's 12 road wins under Miles, five have come against teams ranked in the top 15 with four of those coming against top 10 ranked teams. LSU's top 10 road wins under Miles include a 16-13 victory over No. 3 Alabama in 2005; a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee and a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in 2006; and a 26-21 win over No. 9/10 Auburn in 2008.

LSU Third In Nation In Games Away From Home Since 2003

A Unique Situation At Left Tackle

Starting left tackle Ciron Black made his 32nd career start against Florida, continuing a unique trend at that position for the Tigers. Since the start of the 2002 season, a stretch that spans 84 games, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Black and Andrew Whitworth. Whitworth, now a starting guard for the Cincinnati Bengals, set an LSU record by starting 52 straight games for the Tigers from 2002-05. Black then picked up where Whitworth left off, starting the next 32 games at that position for the Tigers.

An Experienced Offensive Line; Tigers Front Five Have Combined For 116 Starts

LSU boasts six players who have combined for 116 career starts on the offensive line. The Tigers lost only one starter from their offensive line of a year ago - Carnell Stewart. Senior Brett Helms leads the way with 33 career starts - 31 of those from under center. Junior Ciron Black has started at left tackle in all 32 career games he has played in. Senior Ryan Miller has two starts, senior Herman Johnson has 30 starts and junior Lyle Hitt owns 18 starts. Andrew Whitworth (2002-05) holds the LSU record for career starts with 52.

Lee Comes Up Big In Second Half At Auburn; Follows That With Big Game vs. Miss. State

LSU QB Jarrett Lee looked anything but a redshirt freshman in the second half vs. Auburn as he completed 11 of 17 passes during the final two quarters for 182 yards and a pair of TDs. Not bad after he started the game by going 0-for-5 in the first half with one of his passes being returned for a TD that gave Auburn a 14-3 lead at intermission. Lee followed that second half performance against Auburn with another big outing against Mississippi State as he connected on 18 of 27 passes for 261 yards and a pair of scores in the 34-24 victory. The 261 yards were the most by a first-time starter for the Tigers since 1999 when Josh Booty threw for 280 yards in a loss at Georgia.

Six true freshmen saw action in LSU's season-opening win over Appalachian State. Finally, A Normal Routine Without Hurricanes

It's been like déjà vu for LSU this year as the Tigers have had flashbacks to the 2005 season when the first month of football season was disrupted by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. In 2005, LSU didn't finally settle into a normal week of practice followed by a regularly-scheduled Saturday contest until the week the Tigers played at Vanderbilt on Oct. 8. This year, it's been very similar as LSU's first two games were altered. In week one, the Appalachian State game was moved up six hours to 10 a.m. because of Hurricane Gustav and the following week the Troy contest was postponed until Nov. 15 because of that storm. The North Texas game appeared to be in jeopardy for most of the week before Hurricane lke took a path away from Baton Rouge. This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 207-59-4 (.773) at night under the lights compared to a 21-23-3 (.479) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 52-7 overall at home, which includes a 41-4 (.909) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 11-3 (.786) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted an 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Another August 30 Start - Could It Be A Sign Of Things To Come?

For the third time in school history, LSU opened a football season on Aug. 30 when the Tigers beat Appalachian State, 41-13. The other two years in which the Tigers opened a season on Aug. 30 came in 2003 and 2007, both years that LSU went on to win the BCS National Championship. LSU is 3-0 in games played on Aug. 30, beating Louisiana-Monroe, 49-7, in 2003 and then Mississippi State, 45-0, in 2007.

LSU's 20-Plus Yards Play Breakdown

LSU's Won 30 Straight Saturday Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU's school-record streak of 19 consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium may have been snapped in the home-finale last year against Arkansas, but the Tigers have another home streak intact. LSU has won 30 straight Saturday games played in Tiger Stadium, a streak that goes all the way back to 2003. The last time LSU lost a game played on a Saturday in Tiger Stadium came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU's only two home losses have come against Tennessee in 2005 and Arkansas in 2007. Tennessee beat LSU, 30-27, in overtime on a Monday night, while the Arkansas victory came in triple-overtime on a Friday afternoon.

LSU's Won 28 Consecutive Saturday Night Games In Tiger Stadium

In addition to its streak of having won 30 straight Saturday games in Tiger Stadium, LSU has also won 28 consecutive Saturday night games in Death Valley. LSU's streak of consecutive Saturday night wins in Tiger Stadium goes back to the 2002 season when the Tigers beat Ole Miss, 14-13, to get the run started. The last time LSU lost a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium came against Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002 by a 31-0 count.

Lee Named SEC Freshman of the Week For Performance Against Mississippi State

LSU QB Jarrett Lee earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors for his performance in the Tigers' 34-24 win over Mississippi State. Lee, a redshirt freshman from Brenham, Texas, completed 18 of 27 passes for 261 yards and two touchdowns in what was his first career start. The 261 passing yards were the most by a first-time LSU starter since 1999 when Josh Booty threw for 280 yards in a loss to Georgia. Lee also became the first LSU freshman to go the distance and win his first SEC start since Herb Tyler helped the Tigers past Ole Miss, 38-9, in 1995.

Charles Scott Named SEC Offensive Player of the Week

RB Charles Scott was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week after rushing for 132 yards in LSU's 26-21 win over Auburn. The 100-yard game was the third straight for Scott to open the season. Scott became the first LSU running back to break the 100-yard mark in a game at Auburn. He averaged 6.3 yards per carry against an Auburn defense that was allowing just 53 rushing yards per game going into the contest. Scott had eight carries of at least nine yards vs. Auburn, including a long run of 31 yards to setup an LSU field goal in the third quarter. He also caught 2 passes for 15 yards. The honor is the first of Scott's career.

Holliday Named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week vs. North Texas

LSU RS/RB/WR **Trindon Holliday** was been named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the 41-3 win over North Texas. Against the Mean Green, Holliday returned a punt 92-yards for a touchdown and finished the contest with four punt returns for a total of 163 yards. The 92-yard punt return ties for the second longest in LSU history and his 163 punt return yards is the second most in school history and the most in the SEC since 1983. For the game, Holliday averaged 40.3 yards per return. He other returns went for 59, 8, and 4-yards.

Oh Brother

LSU has three sets of brothers on this year's team - defensive end Rahim Alem (formerly Al Jones) and defensive back Chad Jones are brothers as are center Brett Helms and offensive lineman Trey Helms. In addition, the Taylor trio of Curtis (senior DB), Brandon (true freshman DB) and Jhyryn (true freshman WR) are brothers. Alem is on the defensive line rotation for the Tigers and is often on the field at the same time as his brother Chad, who serves as LSU starter at either nickel or dime back. Brett Helms is LSU's starter at center, while Trey is a walkon redshirt freshman. Curtis Taylor is a starting safety for the Tigers, while Brandon plays on special teams and is a backup cornerback. Jhyryn will likely redshirt this season.

Cap and Gown Tigers

Two members of the LSU football team - C Brett Helms, DE Kirston Pittman - have already earned their bachelor's degree. Helms graduated last spring with a degree in management, while Pittman graduated in the fall of 2007 with a degree in general studies.

#1 Brandon LaFell - WR

Nickname is JoJo ... Said former LSU WR and current Kansas City Chief Dwayne Bowe served as an inspiration to him to improve his game and with the help of strength coach Tommy Moffitt, add muscle weight.

#2 Demetrius Byrd - WR

One of the few players in the history of college football who have played for a national title in both junior college and at a four-year institution (as he did for LSU) ... Considered the best dancer on the team with his Michael Jackson moonwalk ... Credits Ali Highsmith for starting "Can't see me" hand motion but told him he would carry it on for the offensive side of the ball. First used it after scoring a touchdown against Florida.

#5 Keiland Williams - RB

Is one of the few vegetarians in the history of LSU football.

#8 Trindon Holliday - WR/RS

One of the fastest players in the history of college football who is a standout on the track as well ... His 60-meter dash time at the NCAA Indoor meet of 6.54 seconds was the third-fastest time in the world in 2008 ... Compared to Herman Johnson's size 18 shoe, Trindon wears a size 9 shoe and stands at 5-foot-5 ... Born at 7 lbs. and 12 ounces.

#12 Jarrett Lee - QB

Father, Stephen, was his coach at Brenham High School in Texas ... Father played college football at Angelo State ... Enjoys playing golf with fellow quarterback Andrew Hatch ... Both consistently shoot in the 80s ... Credits Hatch with the better short game while Lee is longer off the tee.

#14 Andrew Hatch - OB

Was recruited to Harvard out of high school with a 3.9 grade point average ... Pursued a Mormon mission in Chile after his freshman year at Harvard ... Attended Coach Crowton's passing camps while growing up and was given a chance to walk on at LSU when Crowton became the offensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2007 ... An avid golfer with fellow quarterback Jarrett Lee ... Both shoot consistently in the 80s.

#18 Richard Dickson - TE

Switched from No. 82 to No. 18 prior to the 2008 season ... Taking the No. 18 jersey is part of a new tradition among the Tigers ... Former LSU quarterback Matt Mauck of the 2003 national championship team bequeathed the number to former running back and current San Diego Charger Jacob Hester when Jacob became a Tiger ... Now, Hester has passed the tradition on to tight end Dickson.

#28 R.J. Jackson - RB

Played alto saxaphone in a band in high school ... Participated in gymnastics when he was younger.

#32 Charles Scott - RB

An extremely hard worker ... Says former LSU RB and current San Diego Charger Jacob Hester, "I don't think anybody on this team has worked as hard as Charles has the last two years."

#53 T-Bob Hebert - OL

Son of former New Orleans Saints and Atlanta Falcons quarterback Bobby Hebert.

#63 Ryan Miller - C

Is a big fan of the Beatles.

#65 Lyle Hitt - OG

Brother, Mason, is a defensive tackle at Louisiana Tech ... Father, Joe, played football at Southeastern Louisiana ... Wants to apply to PA school ... Decided to go into the medical profession because serving people has always been in his heart and also finds science and anatomy interesting ... Looked up to his grandfather, Richard Pullig, and how he affected people in an unselfish way ... Pullig started the Department of Medical Technology at Louisiana Tech in the 1940s.

#70 Ciron Black - OT

Played at the same high school as quarterback Matt Flynn (Robert E. Lee HS) in Tyler, Texas ...Wants to work in sports broadcasting after he finishes his football career ... Notables

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 84th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 77th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 22 of its last 23 games at home. Only one time since 2000 have the Tigers lost more than one home game, that coming in 2001 when LSU dropped a pair of contests in Tiger Stadium.
- More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 57 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 47 times, including a school-record 92,910 for the Oct. 6, 2007 game that pitted No. 1 LSU against No. 9 Florida. LSU won the game, 28-24.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 44 of the past 51 seasons. The Tigers have drawn 24,134,535 fans since 1957.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 207-59-4 (.776) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 21-22-3 (.479) at home during the day in that span.
- Death Valley is the sixth largest on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

Defense, Special Teams Trickery Leads Tigers Past Gamecocks, 28-16

Another stout defensive performance to go along with some first half special teams trickery was too much for 12th-ranked South Carolina to overcome as No. 2 LSU posted a 28-16 win over the Gamecocks. South Carolina actually led early in this contest, scoring the first first half points against LSU this year with a 1-yard TD run by Mike Davis at the 2:46 mark in the first quarter. The Tigers, who hadn't trailed this year until falling behind the Gamecocks in this contest, responded on their next possession, using the speed of Trindon Holliday to go 69 yards on four plays, capped with a 33-yard TD run by Holliday, to tie the score at 7-7. LSU took the lead for good early in the second quarter when Matt Flynn hit Richard Dickson on a 1-yard TD pass to cap a 9-play, 69-yard drive. Following an interception by Danny McCray, LSU drove to the South Carolina 15-yard line where the drive stalled and forced what appeared to be a field goal attempt by the Tigers with just over a minute left in the first half. However, with South Carolina bringing a heavy rush, holder Flynn flipped the ball over his shoulder on the fake field goal attempt, right into the hands of placekicker Colt David, who raced 15 yards for his first career TD and a 21-7 LSU lead at halftime. The Tigers stretched the margin to 28-7 midway through the third quarter on a 9-yard run by Jacob Hester. Hester led the Tigers with 88 yards rushing and 1 TD, while Holliday rushed for a career-best 73 yards and a score. Flynn connected on 8 of 19 passes for 70 yards and 1 TD. Defensively, the Tigers limited the Gamecocks to only 17 yards rushing and only 269 yards of total offense.



LSU Has Little Trouble In 41-13 Win Over Appalachian State To Open 2008

Charles Scott rushed for 160 yards and a pair of TDs and LSU QBs Andrew Hatch and Jarrett Lee combined to complete 13 of 24 passes for 193 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 41-13 win over Appalachian State to open the 2008 season. The game, which was originally scheduled for a 4 p.m. start, was moved to a 10 a.m. kickoff due to Hurricane Gustav. The move had little effect on the Tigers as LSU's first play from scrimmage in 2008 had Scott rushing for a 56-yard gain. A play later, Scott scored from eight yards out giving the Tigers a 7-0 lead. The Tigers scored on their next two possessions, stretching the lead to 17-0 early in the second quarter. LSU extended the lead to 31-0 at halftime after scores by Brandon LaFell - a 31- yard pass from Lee - and Scott - a 29-yard run. Appalachian State scored its only TD on a 44-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter with the game's outcome already decided. For the game, the Tigers rolled up 459 yards of total offense, compared to just 239 yards for Appalachian State. The Tiger defense held Appalachian State QB Armanti Edwards, a possible Heisman Trophy candidate, to just 23 rushing yards and only 13 of 31 on passing attempts. Danny McCray led the Tigers with 7 tackles, while DE Rahim Alem added two tackles for losses and a sack in the

Scott, Holliday Lead LSU Past North Texas, 41-3

Charles Scott rushed for 102 yards and a pair of TDs and Trindon Holliday returned a punt 92 yards for another score as LSU had little trouble with North Texas, winning 41-3 in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers showed no signs of having not played a game in two weeks as LSU scored on four of its first five possessions in the first half in building a 27-3 lead at halftime. Scott opened the scoring with a 39-yard run minutes into the contest. Colt David followed with a 41-yard field goal four minutes later to give the Tigers a 10-0 lead. The Mean Green pulled to within 10-3 early in the second quarter, before Scott busted loose on a 43yard TD run to stretch the margin to 17-3. Another stop by the LSU defense setup the Tigers next score as Holliday fielded a punt on his own 8-yard line and raced 92 yards, untouched, for the score and a 24-3 advantage. Andrew Hatch and Quinn Johnson each added rushing TDs for the Tigers in the third quarter as Les Miles substituted freely in the fourth quarter. For the game, the Tigers racked up 425 yards of offense (216 rushing, 209 passing), while holding the Mean Green to only 199 yards (44 rushing, 155 passing). Hatch connected on 10 of 17 passes for 125 yards, while Lee hit on 10 of 18 attempts for 84 yards. Brandon LaFell led all receivers with seven catches for 69 yards.

Lee Comes Off Bench To Lead Tigers Past Auburn, 26-21

Jarrett Lee spelled an injured Andrew Hatch and rallied LSU from a 14-3 halftime deficit by throwing a pair of second half TDs in the Tigers 26-21 win over No. 9/10 Auburn. It was the first win by LSU at Auburn since 1998. LSU grabbed the early lead in the contest, taking a 3-0 advantage on a 46-yard field goal by Colt David late in the first quarter. That lead was short lived as Auburn responded with 14 unanswered points in the second quarter, which included a 24-yard interception return of a Lee pass for a TD by Gabe McKenzie, stretching the margin to 14-3 at halftime. LSU starting QB Hatch went down midway through the third quarter with a head injury as was not able to return, setting up the dramatic turn over events engineered by Lee, a redshirt freshman. Lee put his first half jitters behind him to light up the Auburn secondary over the final 22 minutes of the contest as he completed 11 of 17 attempts in during that span for 182 yards and two scores. Lee connected with Chris Mitchell on a 39-yard TD pass to pull the Tigers to with 14-10 at the 6:28 mark in the third quarter. LSU took a 17-14 lead on the final play of the third quarter when RB Keiland Williams threw a halfback pass for a TD to Demetrius Byrd. LSU extended the lead to 20-14 on a 32-yard field goal by David with 8:27 to go. Auburn regained the lead at 21-20 with 6:40 left setting up yet another fourth quarter comeback by LSU. After a stop by the LSU defense on Auburn's next possession, Lee and the LSU offense took over at the four minute mark. Lee guided LSU on a 7-play, 54-yard game-winning drive, capped when he connected with Brandon LaFell on an 18-yard TD pass. RB Charles Scott led the Tigers ground game with 132 yards rushing, while LaFell caught four passes for 92 yards and a score.

Scott Runs, Lee Passes Tigers Past Mississippi State

Charles Scott rushed for 141 yards and a pair of scores and Jarrett Lee threw for 261 yards and two touchdowns as LSU remained undefeated with a 34-24 win over Mississippi State. Scott, who rushed for 100-plus yards in his fourth straight game, broke open a tie game with a pair of 1-yard TD runs in the first half. Scott's first TD run capped a 15-play, 88-yard drive that gave LSU its first lead of the game at 10-3 late in the first quarter. Scott added another 1-yard scoring plunge at the 10:10 mark in the second quarter to stretch the lead to 17-3. LSU led 17-10 at halftime. The Tigers extended the lead to 24-10 on its first possession of the second half when Richard Dickson recovered a Brandon LaFell fumble in the endzone. Colt David stretched the margin to 27-10 following a 39-yard field goal at the 4:42 mark in the third quarter. After MSU pulled to within 27-17 early in the fourth quarter, Lee connected with Demetrius Byrd on a 43-yard TD pass to put the game out of reach. LSU racked up 427 yards of offense, including 261 in the air, while limiting the Bulldogs to just 13 first downs and 285 yards of offense. The Tigers were hampered by a pair of turnovers - one interception and one fumble. A year after forcing seven turnovers in a 45-0 win over Mississippi State, LSU did not force any Bulldog turnovers in the victory.

Tebow, Gators Too Much For Tigers In 51-21 Win Over LSU

An emotionally charged Florida team proved to be too much for LSU as the 11th-ranked Gators jumped out to a 20-0 first half lead on their way to a 51-21 victory over the No. 3/4 Tigers in Gainesville. Florida scored on the third play of the game and was up 17-0 before the Tigers had even managed a first down. Trailing 20-0, LSU went 60 yards in 44 seconds for a score to cut the deficit to 20-7 at halfitime when Jarrett Lee found Chris Mitchell in the back of the endzone for a 6-yard TD. LSU took the opening kickoff of the second half and marched 80 yards on 12 plays to cut the deficit to 20-14 on a 3-yard run by Andrew Hatch. However, that was as close as the Tigers would get as Florida and Tebow responded with a TD drive to stretch the margin to 27-14. After a three-and-out by the Tigers, the Gators went 60 yards on four plays to increase the lead to 34-14. Florida put the game out a reach on LSU's next possession as Brandon Spikes returned an interception 52 yards for a score and a 41-14 advantage. For the game, Lee completed 23 of 38 passes for 209 yards and 2 TDs. Charles Scott led the Tigers with 35 yards rushing, while Brandon LaFell caught seven passes for 59 yards.
