RADIO: Ole Miss Radio Network (David Kellum, play-by-play; Pete Cordelli, color analyst; Stan Sandroni, sideline reporter). Satellite radio: TBA.

WEB: OleMissSports.com will provide live audio, live stats and an in-game blog. The official Rebel athletics website will also provide a full game recap and a photo gallery.

POLLS: LSU is ranked 18th in both the AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. Ole Miss is receiving votes in the AP rankings. The Rebels also received votes in both week 5 polls.

SERIES INFO: This game will be the 97th all-time between the Ole Miss Rebels and LSU Tigers dating back to 1894. LSU is Ole Miss' second-most played opponent besides Mississippi State, whom the Rebels will play for the 105th time on November 28. LSU holds a 55-37-4 advantage in the series. The Tigers have won six straight overall and three in a row at Tiger Stadium. LSU holds a 36-24-1 edge in Baton Rouge and prevailed 23-20 in overtime in 2006. Ole Miss' last victory in the series was a 35-24 triumph in Baton Rouge in 2001.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR: This will mark the first game of the Magnolia Bowl series, established by the schools' student governments ... The last three games played in

Baton Rouge in the Ole Miss-LSU series have been decided by three points or less ... The Rebels are bowl eligible for the first time since 2003 ... Ole Miss is off to its best start and has recorded its most wins since 2003 ... The Rebels are riding their longest win streak since 2003 ... Ole Miss ranks third in the SEC in both rushing offense (187.9 ypg) and rushing defense (103.4 ypg) ... **Cordera Eason** has registered back-to-back 100-yard rushing games ... Groza Award semifinalist **Joshua Shene** is the SEC's most accurate kicker (87.5 percent FGs, 1,000 PATs) ... **Michael Oher** is the reigning SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH HOUSTON NUTT: Houston Nutt (Oklahoma State, 1981) is in his first season at the Ole Miss helm, after being named the University's 36th head football coach on Nov. 28, 2007. During his 10 years as the head coach at Arkansas, Nutt guided the Razorbacks to eight bowl berths, three SEC Western Division titles, two SEC Championship game appearances and an average of more than seven wins per season. He also served head coaching stints at Boise State and Murray State, where he captured two OVC Championships. Nutt is 4-6 against LSU as a head coach, including last year's 50-48 triple OT victory in Baton Rouge. (*see page 3 for more info on Nutt and the coaching staff*).

LSU HEAD COACH LES MILES: Les Miles is 41-9 in his fourth season as the head coach of the LSU Tigers. Miles guided the Tigers to a BCS Championship last season and the school's third-straight top five ranking in as many years. He has a career mark of 69-30 in eight seasons as a collegiate head coach. Prior to LSU, Miles served four seasons as the head coach at Oklahoma State from 2001-2004, posting a 28-21 record and guiding the Cowboys to three bowl appearances. One of those post-season berths was the 2004 Cotton Bowl, where his

OSU squad lost to Ole Miss 31-28 in Miles' only confrontation with the Rebels. The 2002 Big 12 Coach of the Year, Miles served as an assistant with Michigan, Colorado and the Dallas Cowboys before taking over at OSU. He is 3-1 in his career against Ole Miss.

LSU SCOUTING REPORT: After a 4-0 start, the Tigers are 3-3 in their last six games and rallied for a 40-31 victory over Troy Saturday on homecoming. LSU ranks second in the SEC in scoring offense (32.1 ppg) and third in total offense (394.2 ypg). Junior RB Charles Scott leads the way with 1,071 yards and 14 TDs. Redshirt freshman QB Jarrett Lee has completed 139-of-257 passes for 1,824 yards with 14 TDs and 15 interceptions. Junior WR Brandon LaFell boasts 55 receptions for 772 yards and seven scores, while senior Demetrius Byrd has hauled in four TD passes. On the defensive side, junior SS Harry Coleman tops the squad with 55 total tackles. Junior LB Perry Riley has collected 42 stops with 4.0 TFLs. On the line, junior end Rahim Alem has notched 8.5 TFLs and 6.0 QB sacks. Junior K Colt David has connected on 10-of-13 field goals and 34-of-35 PAT attempts this season.

LSU 41, Ole Miss 24: Trindon Holliday returned a kickoff 98 yards for a score, and LSU forced two turnovers during goal-line stands to defeat Ole Miss, 41-24. Marshay Green had a 44-yard punt return for the Rebels to knot the game at 7-7, but LSU regained the lead and never looked back. Reserve quarterback Brent Schaeffer sparked some second-half offense for the Rebels, but his 302 yards of total offense weren't enough.

November 18, 2006 • Baton Rouge, La.

LSU 23, Ole Miss 20: Colt David kicked a 26-yard FG in overtime to lift No. 9 LSU to a 23-20 victory. Ole Miss built a 20-7 lead, before JaMarcus Russell tossed two TDs in the last 8:46, including a fourth down scoring toss to Dwayne Bowe in the final seconds of regulation. LSU could have won after that TD, but the Rebels blocked the extra point to force overtime.

November 19, 2005 • Oxford, Miss.

LSU 40, Ole Miss 7: JaMarcus Russell threw two TD passes in a 40-7 victory for LSU, who held Ole Miss to 7 yards rushing. The Rebels avoided their first shutout since 1998 when Micheal Spurlock threw a 7-yard TD

pass to Taye Biddle with under three minutes to play.

November 20, 2004 • Baton Rouge, La.

LSU 27, Ole Miss 24: Alley Broussard ran for a school-record 250 yards with 3 TDs and No. 14 LSU rallied to beat Ole Miss 27-24. The Rebels held a 24-17 lead early in the third quarter after Trumaine McBride intercepted JaMarcus Russell and returned it 48 yards for a TD, followed by a 2-point conversion. Chris Jackson connected on a 42-yard kick to pull LSU to 24-20 at the end of the third, and in the fourth, the Tigers drove 61 yards, with Broussard giving LSU the lead on a 7-yard scoring run with 10:51 left in the game.

November 22, 2003 • Oxford, Miss.

LSU 17, Ole Miss 14: No. 3 LSU held Eli Manning and the Ole Miss offense in check for three quarters, then withstood a fourth-quarter rally to earn a 17-14 win. Trailing 17-7, Manning connected with Brandon Jacobs for a 10-yard TD pass to make it 17-14 with 10:51 remaining in the game. Ole Miss later had a chance to tie the game, but Jonathan Nichols missed on a 36-yard FG with 4:15 remaining.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Has guided Ole Miss to bowl eligibility in his first season following a four-year bowl drought for the Rebels. Nutt could become just the fifth Ole Miss coach to guide the Rebels to a bowl in his first season.
- The Sept. 27 victory over No. 4 Florida was his fifth career win over a top-five opponent as a head coach. Nutt is 5-8 all-time against top-five teams, including a 50-48 triple OT victory at No. 1 LSU last year. In all five wins, Nutt's team entered the game unranked, and four of the wins came on the road.
- Named the 36th head coach of the Ole Miss Rebel football program on Nov. 28, 2007.
- Coached Arkansas to eight bowl berths in 10 years, which is the most in the SEC Western Division during that span.
- Guided the Razorbacks to SEC Western Division titles in 1998, 2002 and 2006, with Championship Game appearances in the last two.
- Directed the Razorbacks to 15 victories over top-25 opponents, with five in the top five and three in the top three.
- Mentored 15 All-America, 67 All-SEC, 153 SEC Academic Honor Roll and 33 NFL Draft selections at Arkansas.
- Led the SEC's top-ranked team in scoring offense from 2002-04. The Hogs averaged 29.8 points per game during that stretch. They were also the top-scoring team in the Western Division during Nutt's tenure. The Razorbacks averaged 28.89 points per game (3,553 points) since 1998 and scored 20 points or more 92 times in Nutt's 123 games. The Hogs averaged a school-record 39.8 points per game in 2007.
- Fielded the top rushing offense in the SEC over his 10 years in Fayetteville. UA rushed for 200.1 yards per game in that time.
- His Razorbacks led the SEC in rushing in 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006 and 2007. The 2002 Hogs averaged 218.9 yards rushing per game, while the 2003 squad cranked out 241.9 yards per game. Arkansas finished second in the league in rushing in 2004, pounding out 187.4 yards per game. The 2005 Razorbacks averaged 216.9 yards per game, while the 2006 squad rushed for 228.5 yards per game, which also ranked fourth nationally. Arkansas was No. 4 in the nation in 2007 at 296.8 yards per game.
- His Arkansas teams had 28 games with 200 yards or more passing. Nutt's quarterbacks have accounted for 20 of the 36 three-or-more passing touchdown games in school history.
- Ranks second all-time in Arkansas history in coaching wins and bowl appearances.

OLE MISS-LSU RIVALRY NOW MAGNOLIA BOWL

Student governments from Ole Miss and LSU have worked to enhance the spirit of the football rivalry and this year are introducing the Magnolia Bowl.

After first garnering the support of the universities' athletics departments and alumni associations, student leaders set forth in April with a "Name that Rivalry" campaign for students to provide input on the name via text messaging. The student governments then voted in their respective Student Senates.

"After narrowing down the hundreds of names we received, we asked students at both Ole Miss and LSU to vote on their favorite title from a list of five choices," said Elizabeth Yerger, Director of Student Services for the Ole Miss Associated Student Body. "The title Magnolia Bowl was the obvious winner at both of the schools, because the Magnolia serves as the state flower for both Mississippi and Louisiana."

The Ole Miss ASB played a major role in the development and finalization of the logo, which was designed by an Ole Miss student from Cultigraphic. The logo contains the LSU, Ole Miss and SEC logos as well as the magnolia flower.

The trophy was designed by LSU senior sculpture major Evan Trapp with input from the leaders of the two student bodies. The trophy is carved from bass wood with a stained finish. The game's logo is emblazoned on the base, as will all of the scores following Saturday's game. The top of the base has four wood-carved leaves cradling a bronze-cast magnolia flower.

The trophy and all parties involved will be introduced on the field before the game. The student body president of the winning school will then present the trophy to their team following the game, and the prize will remain with that team until the following year's encounter.



NUTT RETURNS: Ole Miss head coach **Houston Nutt's** last trip to Baton Rouge supplied one of the most memorable games of the 2007 college football season. In his final contest as Arkansas head coach, Nutt guided the Razorbacks to a stunning triple-overtime upset of the top-ranked and eventual national champion LSU, 50-48. In his first year in Oxford, Nutt has directed Ole Miss to bowl eligibility for the first time since 2003 and is poised to become the fifth head coach in school history to lead the Rebels to a bowl in his debut season.

LOUISIANA REBELS: Fifteen members of the Ole Miss roster hail from the Pelican state, including **Ben Benedetto** (Metairie), **Brandon Bolden** (Baton Rouge), **Chris Bowers** (Shreveport), **Lionel Breaux** (New Orleans), **Daverin Gerald** (Baton Rouge), **Marshay Green** (Bastrop), **David Hankins** (Shreveport), **Don Hargroder** (Abbeville), **Rishaw Johnson** (Hammond), **Kendrick Lewis** (New Orleans), **Kentrell Lockett** (Hahnville), **Jeremy McGee** (New Orleans), **Patrick Trahan** (Baton Rouge), **Mike Wallace** (New Orleans) and **Alex Washington** (Monroe).

OLE MISS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Ole Miss faces its fourth top-25 foe of the year and fourth on the road ... The Rebels are 1-2 thus far this season, defeating No. 4 Florida 31-30 and falling at No. 2 Alabama 24-20 and No. 20 Wake Forest 30-28.
- The Rebels' win over the Gators snapped a 15-game skid to ranked teams ... Ole Miss' last win over a top-25 foe had been 31-28 road win at No. 25 South Carolina in 2004.
- Ole Miss is 54-128-2 all-time versus ranked teams.

REBEL NOTEBOOK

- The last time Ole Miss had six or more wins after 10 games was 2003, when the Rebels started 8-2 and finished with a 10-3 mark and an SEC Western Division title.
- Ole Miss is riding its longest win streak since taking six in a row in 2003 ... The Rebels' previous win streak of any length was in 2004 with two straight, which was also the last time the team had consecutive SEC victories.

- Ole Miss' victory over No. 4 Florida marked the 600th win for the Rebel football program ... Ole Miss became the 34th FBS school and eighth SEC member to reach 600 victories ... The Rebels boast an all-time record of 603-464-35 (.563 winning percentage).

- With the 31-30 upset at No. 4 Florida on Sept. 27, Ole Miss earned its first victory over a top-five foe since a 20-13 triumph over No. 3 Notre Dame in 1977 in Jackson ... The Rebels' previous road win over a top-five team had been a 15-7 triumph over LSU on Nov. 3, 1962, when Ole Miss was ranked No. 6 and LSU was No. 4 ... The Rebels' win over the Gators snapped a 15-game skid to ranked teams.

- This marks the 114th football season at The University of Mississippi dating back to 1893 ... Ole Miss did not field teams in 1897 due to an epidemic of yellow fever, and also in 1943 when football was abolished at all Mississippi state-supported institutions by the Board of Trustees.

RECORD-BREAKING PERFORMANCE: Saturday's blowout of ULM was a win for the Rebel record book. At 59-0, Ole Miss notched its largest margin of victory since a 69-7 win over Southern Miss in 1969. The last time the Rebels scored 59 points was ironically against ULM in the 59-14 triumph in 2003. At 38-0, Ole Miss held its largest halftime lead since a 40-0 advantage on Memphis in 1980 on the way to a 61-7 Rebel victory. The last time Ole Miss scored 38 points in a half was against Southern Illinois in 1994, when the Rebels were up 38-3 en route to a 59-3 victory.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: In their first season under **Houston Nutt**, the Rebels have cranked up the offense and the scoring. Ole Miss is posting 391.4 yards per outing, which ranks fourth in the SEC and is the most since 2003 when the team finished with a school-record 433.2 clip. The Rebels outgained ULM 520 yards to 131, Samford 424 to 198, Vanderbilt 385 to 202, Florida 360 to 348 and Alabama 359 to 326. Ole Miss' 29.4 scoring clip is also the highest since 2003. The 31 points against Florida equaled the most against an SEC foe since the 43-40 win over South Carolina in 2003.

RUSHING POWER: Led by junior RB **Cordera Eason**, the Ole Miss running game has risen to third in the SEC at 187.9 yards per game. The unit is averaging 291.5 yards over the last two contests. With 350 rushing yards against ULM, the Rebels topped the 300-yard mark for the first time since posting 323 against LSU in 1999. Eason is averaging 97.0 rushing yards over the last three games and has posted his first two 100-yard rushing performances in the last two outings. However Eason is not alone, as he is one of four players with more than 50 carries, including **Dexter McCluster**, **Brandon Bolden** and **Enrique Davis**. Each has led the team in rushing in at least one game, each has two or more TDs and three boast 400 or more yards.

THRICE AS NICE: With **Shay Hodge**, **Mike Wallace** and **Dexter McCluster**, Ole Miss has arguably the best trio of wide receivers in the SEC. The Rebels are the only team in the conference with three players in the top 10 in receiving yards per game. Each wideout has at least 26 receptions and 498 yards.

SEC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK: **Michael Oher** was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week, as announced Monday. A senior tackle from Memphis, Oher graded out at 82 percent with one knockdown block and eight finishes in the 59-0 win blanking of ULM. The Rebels gained 520 total offensive yards, including 350 yards rushing against the Warhawks. In 65 offensive plays, Oher's line lost yardage on only two plays and allowed no sacks. Ole Miss scored on nine of 13 offensive drives against ULM and converted 8 of 12 on third downs. Oher picks up the Rebels' sixth weekly award from the conference this year and the first of his career. He is the second offensive lineman honoree as Maurice Miller took home POW accolades following the Auburn game.

SNEAD AMONG SEC LEADERS: Sophomore QB **Jevan Snead** ranks second in the SEC in TD passes (17) and third in both passing average (198.3 ypg) and pass efficiency (132.5). Snead has tossed multiple TD passes six times this year, including the last three, and has thrown for 200 or more yards four times. Snead is on pace for the highest yards per completion average ever by a Rebel QB (14.6) and has already completed the two longest pass plays in school history, including the record-setting 88-yard toss to Mike Wallace on Saturday. Against ULM, Snead became the first Rebel to account for five TDs (three passing, career-high two rushing) since Eli Manning was responsible for a school record-tying six in the Arkansas seven-OT game in 2001. Against South Carolina, Snead set a season high in completions, completing 21-of-32 for 243 yards, one TD and one interception.

At Wake Forest, Snead became the first Rebel with four TD passes since Eli Manning in the 2003 Memphis game. He finished 20-of-31 for 253 yards with one interception and was named the Scout.com SEC Offensive Player of the Week.

BIG PLAY MIKE: Whether on offense or special teams, senior **Mike Wallace** has proved to be a big play threat for the Rebels. Last time out, Wallace scorched ULM for his fifth career 100-yard receiving game and third of the year with 111 yards on two catches, including a 23-yard TD. The other grab went for 88 yards in the longest pass play in school history. At Arkansas, Wallace posted a career-high 120 yards on five catches, including a 42-yard grab and an 11-yard TD. He also hauled in a 42-yard pass and surpassed the century mark with 101 yards on four catches against Samford. Including his record-setting heroics on kickoffs (*see page 6*), Wallace ranks first in the SEC in yards per catch (19.2), third in all-purpose yards (124.9 ypg) and eighth in receiving yards (50.0 ypg). He piled up 222 yards at Arkansas and a career-high 238 against Vanderbilt.

SHAY FOR SIX: Despite a quiet game against ULM, junior WR **Shay Hodge** is tied for the SEC lead in touchdown catches with seven and ranks seventh in receiving yards per game (54.5 ypg) and 10th in receptions (3.1 rpg). Hodge had his streak of 22 straight games with a reception snapped against ULM. Prior to that, he had hauled in at least four catches in each of the previous four games and had a TD grab in three straight. After five career games of 77 or more receiving yards, Hodge finally cracked the century mark at Florida with a career-high 133 yards on three catches. He also stamped his name in the Ole Miss record book, as his 86-yard, fourth-quarter catch was not only the go-ahead score in the upset of the No. 4 Gators, but was also the longest pass play in Rebel history at the time. Hodge's 13 career TD grabs rank third among active SEC players and is tied for third all-time at Ole Miss.

CATCH 22: Whether in the slot or behind center in the "Wild Rebel", junior **Dexter McCluster** has truly become an all-purpose threat. A native of Largo, Fla., McCluster posted 176 all-purpose yards against Vanderbilt, 139 vs. South Carolina and 135 against Auburn. As a receiver, McCluster is eighth in the SEC in both all-purpose yards (95.5 ypg) and receptions (3.4 pg) and 10th in receiving yards per game (49.8 ypg). Against the Gamecocks, McCluster just missed his second 100-yard receiving effort of the year, finishing with six receptions for a game-high 99 yards. He recorded a career-high 132 receiving yards and equaled his career best of seven receptions

against the Commodores. As a rusher, he tops the team with four TD runs and ranks second in yards with 457. He is averaging 81.0 ypg over the last two contests and tallied 78 yards last time out against ULM. McCluster has led the rushing attack in two games, totaling 60 yards at Florida and 40 against Carolina. He turned in career highs in rushing yards with 84 and carries with 14 against Auburn and ran for 64 yards against Memphis en route to a 125-yard all-purpose day.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- The Rebels are 6-0 when turning the ball over two times or fewer, including the last three outings ... Ole Miss had no turnovers against ULM for the third time this season and second straight game.
- The Rebels have scored first in nine of 10 games this season ... Ole Miss is 6-3 in those games.
- Sophomore RB **Derrick Davis** has notched a three-yard scoring reception in the last two games ... It marks the only two receptions and touchdowns of his career.
- Junior TE **Gerald Harris** hauled in his second TD pass of the season on a 22-yard toss against ULM.
- Freshman WR **Andrew Harris** collected a career-high two receptions for 34 yards against ULM.
- The Rebels' 520 yards of total offense against ULM is the most since piling up 534 against Missouri in 2007.
- Ole Miss' 359 yards and 158 rushing yards was then the most surrendered by the Alabama defense, which entered the game giving up 262.2 yards per contest and 50.8 on the ground ... The Rebels outrushed the Tide 158-107 and was the first time Alabama had been outrushed this year.
- Ole Miss' 361 yards against South Carolina was the most allowed by the then top-ranked Gamecock defense, which entered the game giving up 221.4 per contest.

RUN STOPPERS: The Rebel defense has proved to be tough on the run, ranking third in the SEC and 13th in the nation in fewest rushing yards allowed (103.4 ypg). Ole Miss has held the opposition under 82 rushing yards five times this season and in the last two contests. The Rebels limited ULM to 72 yards on the ground and Auburn to 75.

IN THE BACKFIELD: Ole Miss has risen to No. 1 in the SEC and sixth in the nation in TFLs at 8.10 per game. After just four TFLs and one sack in the opener, the Rebel defense has totaled 76 TFLs (8.4 per game) and 20 sacks (2.2 pg) over the nine games since. Ole Miss posted 12 TFLs against Samford, 11 against both Vanderbilt and Auburn, and sacked Wake's Riley Skinner four times and Florida's Tim Tebow three. Senior DT **Peria Jerry** is fifth in the SEC with 10.5 TFLs and has 6.0 in his last four games.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- The Rebels contained ULM to 131 total yards, the fewest since holding The Citadel to 81 in 2005 ... ULM's seven first downs were also the least since that game, in which The Citadel tallied only four ... ULM's 59 passing yards were the least by a Rebel foe since Wake Forest in 2006 (43).
- Senior DE **Chris Bowers** was credited with a career-high and team-leading six total tackles, including 1.5 sacks, against ULM ... His only previous sack came in 2006.
- Junior DE **Greg Hardy** collected his first career interception against ULM ... Hardy finished with three tackles, including a sack to raise his team-high total to 4.5.

- Ole Miss' three interceptions against Auburn marked the most since picking off Memphis four times in the 2007 season opener ... It marked the second game this season with multiple interceptions, having picked off two passes against Memphis ... Junior cornerbacks **Cassius Vaughn** and **Marshay Green** notched their first career interceptions, while junior S **Kendrick Lewis** collected his team-high third interception of the year.
- Senior S **Jamarca Sanford** has recorded double-figure tackles thrice this year and 10 times in his career ... He led the team and equaled his career high of 13 tackles against South Carolina ... Sanford is 11th in the SEC in tackles per game (7.1) and is the league's active career leader (276 total stops).

STREAKING SHENE: Junior K **Joshua Shene**, who was recently named as one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, has now converted 58 straight PATs, which is the third-longest streak in school history, passing Steve Lavinghousse's 54 straight (1973-75). Against ULM, Shene tied the school record with eight extra points made and tied his career high with 11 points scored. The Oklahoma City native ranks first in the SEC in field goal percentage (14-of-16, 87.5) and tied for first in PATs (36-for-36, 1.000). Shene matched his career bests at Arkansas, connecting on three field goals from 28, 34 and 39 yards, and scoring 11 points. He has connected on 80-of-81 career PATs.

RECORD BREAKING MIKE: Despite no kickoff returns in the first three games, senior **Mike Wallace** has already established an Ole Miss single-season record with 680 kickoff return yards on the year. The previous record was Deuce's McAllister's 1999 total of 652. Wallace became the Rebel all-time career leader at Arkansas and now boasts 1,211 career KR yards. Wallace ranks fourth in the SEC in average at 25.2 yards per return, and he has posted three of the top-11 single-game totals in school history, including the best ever. Against Vanderbilt, the New Orleans native earned his first kickoff returns of the year and responded with 202 KR yards, easily shattering the Ole Miss record (Marshay Green's 159 against Florida in 2007) and notching the fourth-highest total in SEC history. Wallace also registered the second kickoff return TD of his career and the fifth-longest in school history with his 98-yard score. At Florida, Wallace followed up with the seventh-best total ever by a Rebel with five

Other players seeing their first action include **Brandon Green** (Jr., C); **Gerald Harris** (Jr., TE); **Rishaw Johnson** (RFr., OL); **Jeremy McGee** (So., CB); **Jerme Parnell** (Sr., DE); **Jerrell Powe** (So., DT); **Garrett Ryan** (Jr., DE); **Jevan Snead** (So., QB); **Bradley Sowell** (RFr., OL); **Emmanuel Stephens** (Jr., DE); **Billy Tapp** (Jr., QB); **Patrick Trahan** (Jr., LB) and **Alex Washington** (RFr., OL).

OHER RISING UP DRAFT BOARDS:

Senior OL **Michael Oher** decided to return for his senior season and is already drawing heavy notoriety as a 2009 NFL Draft prospect. Amongst the numerous NFL Draft websites, Oher is commonly a top-five choice for next year, and on Sept. 17, Rivals.com/nationalfootball-post.com projected the Memphis tackle to be the No. 1 overall pick. Defensive lineman **Greg Hardy** and **Peria Jerry** are also regarded as players that could be drafted on the first day. NFLDraftDog.com ranks Hardy 10th on its board, while FanNation.com has Jerry in the No. 17 slot.

REBELS ADD OSU TRANSFER:

Ole Miss picked up a transfer from the Big Ten in September, as sophomore DB **James Scott** came to Ole Miss from Ohio State. Scott must sit out the 2008 campaign due to the NCAA transfer rule and will have three years of eligibility remaining. The 5-foot-10, 170-pounder saw special teams action as a true freshman for the Buckeyes in 2007, posting six tackles. A native of Dayton Beach, Fla., Scott was ranked as the No. 10 cornerback in the nation and the No. 11 overall recruit in Florida coming out of Seabreeze Senior High School. He totaled 121 tackles and six interception during his junior and senior seasons.

VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM HONORED:

USA Today recently named Vaught-Hemingway Stadium to its list of the "10 great places to watch college football". As the article says, "the day-long party is one of the great scenes in all of college football, and it will hit a fevered pitch when the Rebels walk through on their way to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium." Other nominees include Beaver Stadium (Penn State), Camp Randall Stadium (Wisconsin), Folsom Field (Colorado), Husky Stadium (Washington), Lane Stadium (Virginia Tech), Memorial Stadium (Clemson), Neyland Stadium (Tennessee) and Royal Memorial Stadium (Texas).

SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM:

Senior TE **David Traxler** was featured as the SEC Community Service Team Player of the Week on Sept. 27. A Jackson native, Traxler visits local retirement homes and takes part in "Reading with the Rebels", a program that helps promote reading to area students. He is currently involved in the SEC's "Together We Can" food drive for the second straight year. A two-time SEC Academic Honor Roll recipient, Traxler is an accounting major and a member of Ole Miss' Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. In 2005, he received the Scholar-Athlete Award from the Ole Miss Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. After beginning his career as an offensive lineman, Traxler moved to tight end in the spring of 2007. He has appeared in all four of the Rebels' games this season, including three starts.

OLE MISS ANNOUNCES FRESNO STATE SERIES:

Ole Miss recently announced a three-game football series with Fresno State, which will mark the first gridiron meetings between the two schools. The first game is scheduled for Oxford on Sept. 25, 2010, while Ole Miss will then return the game to Fresno, Calif., on Oct. 1, 2011. The final game of the series will be in Oxford in 2015, with the date yet to be determined.

2008 TEAM CAPTAINS: On August 29, **Houston Nutt** announced the team captains for the 2008 season. This year's permanent captains are fullback **Jason Cook** (Suwanee, Ga.), defensive tackle **Peria Jerry** (Batesville), offensive tackle **Michael Oher** (Memphis, Tenn.) and strong safety **Jamarca Sanford** (Batesville). Linebacker **Ashlee Palmer** (Compton, Calif.), cornerback **Dustin Mouzon** (Orlando, Fla.) and punter **Rob Park** (Memphis, Tenn.) will serve as substitutes.

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD: Senior S **Jamarca Sanford** was selected as the 2008 recipient of the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a rising senior defensive player each year. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away on May 6, 1991. Sanford, who wears No. 13, has the honor of wearing a "38" patch on his jersey during his senior campaign. Mullins wore No. 38 as a player at Ole Miss.

SEC DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK AGAIN: For the second time this year, **Peria Jerry** was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 27. A senior tackle from Batesville, Miss., Jerry was credited with five total tackles, including career highs of two sacks and two quarterback pressures. The Rebel defense held Arkansas to 104 net rushing yards with 38 yards lost on tackles for losses. Jerry also earned SEC defensive lineman honors following the Vanderbilt game, when he scored his first career touchdown on a 13-yard fumble return, marking the first by a Rebel since 2005. He posted six total tackles, including 2.5 TFLs and helped limit the Commodores to 202 yards of total offense.

SEC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK: **Maurice Miller** was named the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week following the win over Auburn. A senior guard from West Helena, Ark., Miller graded out at 92 percent in the 17-7 victory over the Tigers and had 16 finishing blocks and four knockdowns. The Ole Miss offensive attack had 233 rushing yards, the most by the Rebels since posting 240 in 2006, and Ole Miss kept the football for 16:50 time of possession in the second half. Miller picks up the Rebels' fifth weekly award from the conference this year and the first of his career.

SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior safety **Jamarca Sanford** was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 29. A native of Batesville,

Miss., Sanford registered a game-high 11 total tackles, including four solos. Sanford helped direct a Rebel defense that stopped the Gators on downs twice and held Florida to three-plays-and-out five times. Ole Miss forced five Gator fumbles, recovering three.

SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK: **Brandon Bolden** was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Sept. 2. Bolden led the team in rushing in his collegiate debut, racking up 76 yards on eight carries and breaking several tackles in a 10-yard touchdown run. He also completed a 37-yard pass to Jevan Snead. Bolden becomes the first Rebel to be chosen SEC Freshman of the Week since 2006, when both Dexter McCluster and Marshay Green received the honor.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Rebels face four teams that appeared in the **USA Today** preseason top-25 poll, including No. 5 Florida, No. 6 LSU, No. 11 Auburn and No. 23 Wake Forest ... In addition, Alabama and South Carolina were tops amongst the others receiving votes.
- Of Ole Miss' 12 foes, only two teams failed to have a .500 or better record a season ago ... Four foes won nine of more games, including defending national champion LSU.
- For the third straight year, Ole Miss is playing seven home games, hosting Memphis (Aug. 30), Samford (Sept. 13), Vanderbilt (Sept. 20), South Carolina (Oct. 4), Auburn (Nov. 1), Louisiana-Monroe (Nov. 15) and Mississippi State (Nov. 28).

AUSTIN BACK IN OXFORD: While the majority of Houston Nutt's first Ole Miss coaching staff came with him from Arkansas, one assistant coach came from north of the border and is a familiar name to Ole Miss fans. **Kent Austin**, who was a record-setting quarterback for the Rebels from 1981-85, is serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He joined Nutt's staff after leading Saskatchewan to the Grey Cup Championship and was named Canadian Football League Coach of the Year. Austin spent 15 seasons in the CFL and won championships as a player, assistant coach and head coach. He retired as a player in 1996 as the league's ninth all-time passer with 36,030 yards. His 57.6 yard completion average is third best, and he remains one of only four players to pass for more than 6,000 yards in a single season. As a Rebel, Austin still ranks second in career completions (566) and attempts (981), third in passing yards (6,184) and 200-yard games (11), and fourth in passing touchdowns (31) and total offense (6,179).

REBELS GET NEW HD VIDEO BOARD: Ole Miss partnered with Daktronics Inc., to design, manufacture and install a \$6 million integrated system featuring a large high definition video display at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, which debuted at the season opener. The board can serve as a single giant display or be divided into multiple zones. In addition, the back of the display will use the latest LED technology to greet visitors. A complete sound system with speakers above the video display rounds out the integrated system.

REBELS GRACE COVER OF SPORTS ILLUSTRATED

The historic upset of No. 4 Florida in The Swamp earned the Ole Miss Rebels the honor of starring on the cover of Sports Illustrated. The issue hit newsstands on Sept. 30.

The magazine's headline read "Rebels Rise" and the cutline of the cover photo was "Ole Miss defensive end Greg Hardy clobbers QB Tim Tebow of the Gators, No. 4 no more".

It marked the third time Ole Miss has been solely featured on the cover of SI. The Sept. 24, 1962 college football preview showcased the Rebelettes, while Archie Manning "Idol of Ole Miss" donned the Sept. 14, 1970 edition. The Manning 1970 cover was also a part of the Sept. 26, 1996 issue along with son Peyton.

In addition, several former Rebels have appeared on the front of Sports Illustrated as professional athletes, including New York Giants QB Charlie Conerly on Dec. 3, 1956, PGA golfer Cary Middlecoff on June 10, 1957 and Giants QB Eli Manning on Jan. 28, 2008 and Feb. 8, 2008.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Jevan Snead threw three touchdowns and added two rushing scores as Ole Miss became bowl eligible for the first time since 2003 with a 59-0 win over Louisiana-Monroe.

It was the Rebels' greatest margin of victory since a 69-7 win over Southern Miss in 1969.

Ole Miss (6-4) built a 38-0 halftime lead after scoring on six of seven possessions. The first half offensive outburst was the most productive since a 40-0 halftime lead against Memphis in 1980.

Snead was 6-of-12 for 170 yards and rushed three times for 11 yards to account for five touchdowns. Cordera Eason added 107 yards in 14 carries as the Rebels finished with 520 yards, 341 in the first half, in total offense.

ULM (3-8) managed to cross midfield only twice and was limited to 131 yards in total offense

Ole Miss covered 72, 54, 37, 31 and 94 yards on the first half touchdown series. Snead had scoring passes of 22 and 23 yards to Gerald Harris and Mike Wallace, between touchdown runs of 17 and 22 yards by Eason and Dexter McCluster.

Snead capped the first half with a 1-yard scoring run before connecting on a 3-yard touchdown pass to Derrick Davis and a 9-yard scoring run for a 52-0 lead with 5:54 left in the third period. Enrique Davis added a 1-yard touchdown run in the fourth period.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- Behind second-half heroics by Brent Schaeffer, Ole Miss outgained No. 1 LSU 466 to 396 yards in total offense but fell short on the scoreboard, 41-24, at a packed Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Trindon Holliday returned a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown, and LSU (10-1, 6-1) forced two turnovers during goal-line stands. Craig Steltz had rally ending interceptions late in each half, and Jacob Hester and Charles Scott each rushed for touchdowns after unsuccessful Ole Miss onside kicks in the fourth quarter to ensure the win. Colt David added second-half field goals of 48 and 43 yards as well.

Ole Miss backup Schaeffer added some juice to the offense in relief, hitting several long passes and cutting LSU's lead to 10 with a serpentine 38-yard scoring run midway through the fourth.

Steltz picked off Schaeffer's errant pass on Ole Miss' next drive with 5:05, however. And Hester punched it in from 2-yards out to secure the win, though Schaeffer would hit Shay Hodge with a 33-yard touchdown pass with 2:54 left to make it 34-24.

Rebels tailback BenJarvus Green-Ellis earned his second-straight 1,000-yard season, with 53 yards rushing for a total of 1,020 with a game to go.

Ole Miss (3-8, 0-7) drove 57 yards to the LSU 2 on its second drive. But as Green-Ellis started to stretch the ball across the goal line on the next play, backup middle line-backer Jacob Cutrera, making the start for injured Darry Beckwith, caused the fumble at the 1.

Ole Miss forced LSU to punt after three plays and Marshay Green broke three tackles on the way to a 44-yard punt return to tie the score at 7.

LSU answered 14 seconds later when Holliday broke a tackle around the 30 and returned the ensuing kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown that put the Tigers back on top 14-7 with 3:04 left in the first quarter.

Ole Miss threatened to tie the game going into halftime after driving to LSU's 4, but LSU's Steltz intercepted a pass by Adams in the back of the end zone.

Schaeffer started the second half, and finished with a career-high 208 yards passing. He also rushed for a career-best 94 yards on eight carries.

LSU's 98-yard scoring drive to open the game was its longest of the season, but Ole Miss held the Tigers to their fourth-lowest offensive output of the season with 396 yards.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -Jevan Snead hit Shay Hodge with touchdown passes of 64 and 15 yards and Ole Miss beat Memphis 41-24 in Houston Nutt 's debut as Rebels coach.

With all eyes on Snead, making his first start, and Nutt, it was Dexter McCluster who provided the spark with 125 total yards and a touchdown run out of Ole Miss' new Wild Rebel formation.

Despite Snead's long touchdown to Hodge in the first quarter, the Rebels struggled early. McCluster, working out of the shotgun in the same "Wildcat" role played by Darren McFadden under Nutt the last two seasons at Arkansas, got Ole Miss rolling with a 32-yard run around the right end for a touchdown and a 14-7 lead late in the first quarter.

It was the first time Ole Miss scored 40 or more points against a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent since a 43-40 win over South Carolina on Nov. 1, 2003.

The Wild Rebel had a lot to do with the point total. Ole Miss rolled up 148 yards on 10 plays out of the formation and capped off the scoring with a 10-yard run from freshman tailback Brandon Bolden. He debuted with 61 of his 76 yards rushing coming in the new formation and hit Snead with a 37-yard pass out of the shotgun.

McCluster finished with 64 yards rushing - 50 out of the Wild Rebel - and four catches for 61 yards receiving.

With 56,127 fans in the stands and players making few mistakes, about the only setback for Nutt was the overeager fan who surprised him with a chestbump as the team made its way through The Grove a few hours before kickoff.

Snead's debut was solid, though not particularly sharp as he completed 10 of 22 passes for 185 yards. He made few mistakes, but overthrew several receivers in his first action since 2006 when he played in a handful of games for Texas before sitting out last season under NCAA transfer rules.

And Nutt appears to have made a difference for the Southeastern Conference's last-place defense. The Rebels intercepted two passes, setting up two field goals by Joshua Shene, and held Memphis in check except for a late 43-yard touchdown pass from Will Hudgens to Maurice Jones and a 1-yard scoring dive by Hudgens once the game was out of hand.

Hudgens and starter Arkelon Hall struggled. Hall finished with 159 yards passing before leaving due to injury and Hudgens passed for 102 yards. Each threw an interception.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (AP) -Sam Swank kicked a 41-yard field goal with 3 seconds left to cap a dramatic final minute and give No. 20 Wake Forest a 30-28 win over Ole Miss on Saturday.

After Jevan Snead's 5-yard touchdown pass to Cordera Eason on fourth down with 1:01 left gave Ole Miss the lead, Riley Skinner led the Demon Deacons on a 56-yard drive, keyed by a pass interference penalty against Marshay Green.

Swank, the nation's active career leader with 65 field goals, calmly drilled the game-winning field goal for the sixth lead change of the game.

Skinner completed 32-of-43 passes for a career-high 348 yards and two touchdowns and no interceptions, and D.J. Boldin caught 11 passes for 123 yards, including a 22-yard catch on the final drive..

The Rebels (1-1) were a minute away from giving first-year coach Houston Nutt a signature win in only his second season, when Snead led a 7-minute, 80-yard drive. Facing fourth-and-3 from the Wake Forest 5, Snead was quickly flushed out of the pocket, scrambled right, then left and back right again before finding Eason in the front of the end zone.

Justin Sparks' extra-point broke the tie, but the experienced Demon Deacons weren't finished.

Snead showed poise all afternoon, completing 20-of-33 for 360 yards and three touchdowns, often creating after the pocket collapsed.

Snead scrambled away from a sack and found Dexter McCluster open in the flat, who raced past three defenders for a 31-yard touchdown to give Ole Miss a 21-20 lead early in the fourth quarter.

It made up for Snead throwing interceptions on consecutive plays early in the third quarter. The second, a diving grab by Brandon Ghee, led to Swank's 27-yard field goal to get Wake Forest within 14-13.

Early, Nutt's "Wild Rebel" formation of direct snaps to running backs and receivers caused Wake Forest problems.

Nutt promised to add wrinkles to the formation, and a gimmick play set up the tying touchdown late in the first quarter. A direct snap to McCluster turned into a reverse-flea flicker, with Snead finding Brandon Bolden for a 33-yard gain. That set up Snead's 4-yard TD pass to Gerald Harris.

Samford (2-1), which plays in the Southern Conference, made it interesting until the final four minutes of the second quarter.

The Bulldogs held a 7-6 advantage, scoring on a 13-yard run by Riley Hawkins after Jeremy Richardson set up the touchdown with a 36-yard interception return.

Ole Miss (2-1) answered with 31 consecutive points in the next 20 minutes to make it a blowout.

The Rebels assumed control with consecutive touchdown drives of 53, 91 and 63 yards late in the second quarter and early in the third quarter.

The Rebels led 20-7 at halftime as Brandon Bolden and Cordera Eason had touchdown runs of 6 and 12 yards, respectively.

OXFORD, Miss (AP) - Mike Wallace returned a kickoff 98 yards and Peria Jerry scored on a 13-yard fumble return, but the Rebel offense could not capitalize in the red zone in a 23-17 loss to Vanderbilt in the Rebels' SEC opener.

Ryan Hamilton tied a school record with three interceptions, scored a touchdown on an interception return and saved a score with a goal-line tackle to help Vanderbilt remain undefeated and notch its second league victory.

The Commodores intercepted four of Jevan Snead's passes to put themselves in position to be ranked for the first time since 1984 by surviving an early and odd Rebels scoring flurry. Vanderbilt was one spot out of the Top 25 entering the week and is 4-0 for just the fourth time since World War II.

But the Commodores (2-0 Southeastern Conference) needed a pair of goal-line stands and a final interception as time expired to win.

The Rebels (2-2, 0-1) appeared as if they might run away early after forcing a fumble deep in Vanderbilt territory with a 10-0 lead. But Hamilton stepped in front of Snead's pass and returned it 79 yards for a score.

His second interception of Snead and 23-yard return helped set up a field goal that rallied Vanderbilt to a 17-17 halftime tie. The Commodores could only manage two more Bryant Hahnfeldt field goals in the second half, but Hamilton and the defense made it stand up.

Hamilton made a crucial tackle on Ole Miss' first series of the second half, when he caught running back Cordera Eason from behind on fourth-and-inches at the goal line. Hamilton later recovered a fumble on a punt return to negate another Ole Miss drive and finished the game off with a pick on Snead's pass around the Vanderbilt 10.

Hamilton also recovered a fumble, but wasn't the only playmaker on the Commodores defense. Reshard Langford killed another drive with a bobbling interception of Snead at midfield, then Chris Marve finished off another Rebels' goal-line chance for a rally when he forced Dexter McCluster to fumble into the end zone. D.J. Moore fell on the loose ball.

Ole Miss had plenty of chances to pick up the program's 600th victory after an early fumble return by Peria Jerry and a kickoff return by Mike Wallace put the Rebels up 17-7. But six turnovers, poor play from an out-of-sync Snead, who finished 12-of-25 for 184 yards in his first bad game, and seven penalties for 82 yards sent them to their ninth straight SEC loss and 13th in the last 14 games.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (AP) - Houston Nutt needed just five games to get a signature win at Ole Miss. Jevan Snead threw two touchdown passes, ran for another score and led the Rebels to a stunning 31-30 victory at No. 4 Florida.

Snead outplayed last year's Heisman Trophy winner, and he did it in The Swamp, where Florida (3-1, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) had won 21 of its last 22 games.

In his fifth career start, Snead was 9-of-20 passing for 185 yards, not great numbers, but he made plays when the Rebels (3-2, 1-1) needed them. His biggest was an 86-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge that put the Rebels ahead 31-24 with 5:26 to play.

Tim Tebow brought the Gators back, driving them 78 yards in about 2 minutes, but the game-tying extra point was blocked by defensive lineman Kentrell Lockett. Florida coach Urban Meyer argued that Lockett illegally jumped over the offensive line, but the officials did not agree.

Florida forced a punt and had one more chance, but Tebow was stuffed for no gain on fourth-and-1 at the Ole Miss 32-yard line.

Snead took a couple of knees from there, running out the clock and setting off a raucous celebration in and around the small section of Ole Miss who made the trip.

Tebow was 24-of-38 passing for 319 yards and a touchdown. He ran 15 times for 7 yards and two scores, a far cry from the 166 yards he had in Oxford last season.

He also misfired on several long passes and underthrew one in the end zone. And on his lone TD toss to Percy Harvin, it came on a deflected pass that Kendrick Lewis nearly intercepted.

Florida's biggest problem was three turnovers and a miserable third quarter that might go down as the worst 15 minutes in the Meyer era.

Leading 17-7, Harvin fumbled on the second play of the third. Ole Miss turned it into a field goal. Tebow fumbled on the next play, and Snead found Cordera Eason on a perfectly called screen pass for an 18-yard touchdown. Eason leapt over Markihe Anderson at the 5 and rolled into the end zone to tie the game.

It got worse for the Gators, too.

Tebow, under heavy pressure all day long, just couldn't find a rhythm. Ole Miss did. Dexter McCluster, who lined up countless times in the "Wild Rebel" formation made famous by Darren McFadden under Nutt at Arkansas, busted through the line and rambled 40 yards for a touchdown that made it 24-17.

The Gators regrouped in the fourth - Tebow even tied it with a short run early in the quarter - but the defensive collapse on the long pass play and the blocked extra point turned out to be the difference.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Ole Miss put together a solid day offensively against the nation's top defense, but fell 31-24 in its homecoming game against South Carolina.

On-again, off-again starter Chris Smelley threw three touchdown passes for South Carolina. Given the starting job Thursday, Smelley completed 22 of 31 passes for a career-high 327 yards and led an 11-play, 95-yard drive midway through the fourth quarter to put away Ole Miss, which stumbled a week after knocking off then-No. 4 Florida.

The Rebels (3-3, 1-2 Southeastern Conference) appeared to take control early, but a pair of fumbles helped the Gamecocks (4-2, 1-2) earn a critical win that kept them from exiting the SEC East race in early October.

Smelley, who sat last week after coach Steve Spurrier chose to start Stephen Garcia, made several strong throws in the game and only one big mistake, a third-quarter interception that didn't hurt South Carolina.

After Smelley hit Jason Barnes with a touchdown pass on third-and-goal from the 20 early in the second quarter, Gamecocks defensive lineman Nathan Peppers scooped up Jevan Snead's fumble and returned it 29 yards for a 14-point swing in exactly a minute that gave South Carolina a 17-14 lead.

Ole Miss answered to take a 21-14 halftime lead on a 24-yard pass from Snead to Brandon Bolden, but another fumble in the second half turned the game for the Gamecocks.

Chris Culliver forced Dexter McCluster to fumble at the South Carolina 6 midway through the third quarter. Emmanuel Cook returned the fumble to the 42. It was McCluster's second critical fumble near the opponent's goal line in the last three games. A similar play at the 1 helped Vanderbilt beat Ole Miss two weeks ago.

Smelley was especially sharp on the ensuing drive, converting a pair of first downs with quarterback sneaks, including fourth-and-inches at the Ole Miss 10. That set up the second of his two touchdown passes to Barnes, a 6-yarder that put the Gamecocks up 24-21.

After Ole Miss downed the ball at the 5 following a punt on the ensuing drive, Smelley and tailback Mike Davis marched South Carolina down the field. Davis rushed for 28 yards on the drive and Smelley hit 5 of 6 passes for 54 yards, including a 4-yard touchdown pass to Joe Hills.

The Gamecocks were the nation's top defense entering the game, allowing 105 yards passing and 221 total yards per game coming in. But the Rebels surpassed both marks by halftime. Snead completed 12 of 15 passes for 154 yards by the break and the team added another 78 yards rushing, including 29 yards and a 5-yard touchdown by McCluster out of the Wild Rebel formation.

Ole Miss closed to within 24-20 on Joshua Shene's 35-yard field goal with 6:09 left. The Tide pushed the ball across midfield on its next possession aiming to put the game away but the drive stalled. P.J. Fitzgerald's short punt gave Ole Miss the ball at its own 24 with 3:03 left.

Snead ran it on the first three plays, including one 5-yard gain on a pass that was batted right back into his arms by Bobby Greenwood. Brandon Deaderick then had a sack, Snead threw an incompleteness and hit McCluster for a 10-yard gain to set up fourth down.

Houston Nutt's team cashed in on two big gambles on the opening drive of the second half to make it 24-10. Snead ran up the middle for 17 yards on fourth-and-4. Then, Ole Miss faked a field goal, with blocking back Jason Cook taking a shovel pass from holder Rob Park for a 9-yard touchdown.

A later fourth-down try in Alabama territory didn't pay off, when Don'ta Hightower stuffed Davis on fourth-and-inches late in the third. Ole Miss got more chances, though.

After the teams exchanged fumbles in the fourth quarter, Snead hit Shay Hodge for a 17-yard touchdown with 9:27 left.

Alabama went three-and-out to give Ole Miss the ball back near midfield. Snead kept the drive alive with a 31-yard pass to Lionel Breaux on third-and-11. His next two passes fell incomplete, forcing the Rebels to settle for Shene's kick.

Enrique Davis gained 70 yards on 11 carries for Ole Miss, most of that coming on a 62-yarder that set up Shene's first field goal. It was the longest play from scrimmage yielded by Alabama this season.

The Tide had outscored opponents 88-0 in the first quarter before that.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) - Jevan Snead threw two touchdown passes, and Ole Miss held off an Arkansas rally to give coach Houston Nutt a 23-21 win over his former team.

The Rebels (4-4, 2-3 Southeastern Conference) led 23-14 with 1:45 remaining, but Arkansas quickly cut the deficit to two on Casey Dick's 22-yard touchdown pass to Greg Childs. The Razorbacks (3-5, 1-4) then tried an onside kick, and Arkansas' Aaron Fenton appeared to recover it.

Officials initially ruled the play out of bounds, but the call was reversed on review, giving the Razorbacks the ball with 1:03 to play. London Crawford caught a pass near the Ole Miss 20, but it was called back for offensive pass interference, and Arkansas didn't threaten again.

Nutt coached the Hogs for 10 seasons before leaving after last regular season to take over for SEC West Ole Miss. The Rebels took control early with a pair of scores near the end of the first half. The win was a major boost to the Rebels' bowl hopes and their first over Arkansas since 2003.

Arkansas trailed 20-14 after Dick's 8-yard touchdown pass to Lucas Miller with 4:28 remaining, but Snead found Mike Wallace for a 42-yard pass on the next Ole Miss possession, and Joshua Shene kicked a 28-yard field goal with 1:45 to play.

After that kick appeared to put the game out of reach, the Ole Miss fans in one corner of the stadium began chanting "Houston Nutt! Houston Nutt!"

The Arkansas fans booed, and a few of them began chanting "Bobby" in reference to Nutt's replacement, Bobby Petrino.

Petrino made a key call in the second quarter. The Razorbacks had already missed one field goal, so he decided to go for it on fourth-and-1 from the Ole Miss 13. Michael Smith took a pitch to the left and went untouched to the end zone for a 7-3 lead.

The Rebels answered, scoring twice in the final two minutes of the half. Snead threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge to give Ole Miss the lead with 1:58 remaining, then Fon Ingram intercepted a pass and returned it 38 yards to the 17. The Rebels had time for one more play, a 34-yard field goal by Shene that made it 13-7 at halftime.

Ole Miss went ahead 20-7 with 13:21 left in the game when Snead found Wallace wide open in the back of the end zone for an 11-yard touchdown. Arkansas' offense came back to life after that with a 97-yard scoring drive.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Jevan Snead threw two touchdown passes, Cordera Eason rushed for 104 yards and Ole Miss capitalized on a series of fourth-quarter mistakes by Auburn to beat the Tigers 17-7 and move within a game of bowl eligibility.

With representatives of six bowls in attendance, Ole Miss converted Kodi Burns' second interception into a game-clinching touchdown late in the fourth quarter on a drive that was aided by three Auburn penalties.

It was the third Southeastern Conference win for Ole Miss (5-4, 3-3 SEC) under first-year coach Houston Nutt, matching the total put up in last three seasons. The win snapped a four-game losing streak to the Tigers (4-5, 2-4), who were 8-1 in Oxford coming into the game.

The Rebels need one more win to clinch one of the SEC's nine bowl bids. After a week off, they play Louisiana-Monroe before finishing the season at LSU and against Mississippi State.

Ole Miss cornerbacks Cassius Vaughn and Marshay Green each had their first career interceptions, helping to kill drives with the game on the line. Ole Miss' three interceptions of Burns were the most since four in the 2007 season opener against Memphis.

Burns' third and final interception ended Auburn's last threat with less than 4 minutes left.

The Tigers' offense continued to sputter and had as many points as punts. It was the fewest points for Auburn against Ole Miss since the Rebels beat the Tigers 13-7 in the 1965 Liberty Bowl.

The Tigers never crossed midfield in the first half and had just 80 yards in the first two quarters. They finished with 394 total yards of offense thanks to a handful of long pass completions, but never put together a consistent drive and were held to 75 yards rushing.

Burns completed 27 of 43 passes for 319 yards in playing his second straight complete game, but was a liability late.

Snead, meanwhile, got stronger as the game went on. He shook off a bad start to connect with Shay Hodge on a 2-yard touchdown late in the second quarter that was set up by a 29-yard catch and a 22-yard run by Dexter McCluster.

Despite the difficult first half, Auburn quickly got back in the game on the opening drive of the second half on a 27-yard run by Ben Tate to make it 10-7.

Two drives later, Auburn nosed into Ole Miss territory on a 29-yard pass from Burns to Montez Billings. But two plays later Johnny Brown tipped Burns' pass and Vaughn picked it off at the Ole Miss 40.

The Rebels drove to the Auburn 6, but a personal foul penalty backed them up and Joshua Shene missed a 45-yard field goal attempt.

On the next drive, Burns led the Tigers to the Rebels' 17, hitting Slaughter with a 42-yard pass. But three plays later Green stepped in front of a pass in the right flat and returned it to the 34.

The Rebels drove 66 yards for the clinching score - a 3-yard pass to a wide-open Derrick Davis in the right flat. The touchdown was set up by two facemasks and a pass interference penalty.

Snead finished 15-for-30 for 140 yards, connecting six times with Hodge for 62 yards. And Eason's rushing total was a career high.

The most important statistic for the Rebels, though, was zero turnovers. The team is now 5-0 when turning the ball over two or fewer times.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - Jevan Snead threw three touchdowns and added two rushing scores as Ole Miss became bowl eligible for the first time since 2003 with a 59-0 win over Louisiana-Monroe.

It was the Rebels' greatest margin of victory since a 69-7 win over Southern Miss in 1969.

Ole Miss (6-4) built a 38-0 halftime lead after scoring on six of seven possessions. The first half offensive outburst was the most productive since a 40-0 halftime lead against Memphis in 1980.

Snead was 6-of-12 for 170 yards and rushed three times for 11 yards to account for five touchdowns. Cordera Eason added 107 yards in 14 carries as the Rebels finished with 520 yards, 341 in the first half, in total offense.

ULM (3-8) managed to cross midfield only twice and was limited to 131 yards in total offense.

Ole Miss covered 72, 54, 37, 31 and 94 yards on the first half touchdown series. Snead had scoring passes of 22 and 23 yards to Gerald Harris and Mike Wallace, between touchdown runs of 17 and 22 yards by Eason and Dexter McCluster.

Snead capped the first half with a 1-yard scoring run before connecting on a 3-yard touchdown pass to Derrick Davis and a 9-yard scoring run for a 52-0 lead with 5:54 left in the third period. Enrique Davis added a 1-yard touchdown run in the fourth period.
