## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ Tonight serves as the highly acclaimed much anticipated grand opening of the new Tiger Park and is LSU's 800th game since the Tigers reinstated softball in 1997.
- ▶ Before the game, LSU will hold a ribbon cutting ceremony down on the field as Yvette Girouard, the 2009 team and program alumni will be joined by Chancellor Mike Martin, Athletic Director Joe Alleva and former Athletic Director Skip Bertman.
- ▶ Throwing out tonight's first pitches are the head coaches from the women's athletic teams at LSU.
- ▶ LSU is 12-0 in home openers and has posted a shutout in 10 of 12 games. Overall, the Tigers have outscored their opponents 85-2, racking up double-digit runs four times.
- ▶ LSU is 70-5 (.933) at home during the month of February under Girouard, including a streak of 51 consecutive wins dating back to the 2004 season.
- ▶ LSU has spent 47 consecutive weeks in the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN/USA Softball Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 21 and No. 20, respectively in this week's edition of the polls.

**A LOOK BACK AT HAWAII**

LSU had an amazing trip to the islands that included stops at Pearl Harbor and the Polynesian Culture Center.

The Tigers went 3-2 at the Oceanic Time Warner Cable Paradise Classic, including a pair of wins over host Hawaii (Feb. 6 & 7) and an opening game triumph over UAB (Feb. 5).

LSU overcame a four-run deficit in the seventh inning and won 6-5 in nine innings during the tournament's consolation game. The last time the Tigers accomplished that feat came at Georgia in 2003.

Sophomore outfielder Ashley Applegate provided the game-tying hit and game-winning bases loaded walk to complete the comeback.

Junior pitcher/outfielder Kirsten Shortridge and freshman shortstop Juliana Santos earned All-Tournament honors for LSU.

Shortridge compiled a pair of three-hit games against Hawaii (Feb. 6) and UAB (Feb. 7) en route to a .471 batting average. She also went 3-for-4 in the stolen base department.

Santos hit .353 and belted her first career home run against Hawaii (Feb. 6). She also had a solid weekend on defense with a 1.000 fielding percentage, including 10 putouts and three assists.

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell picked up where she left out in 2008 with a pair of doubles and four RBIs.

Freshman first baseman Anissa Young hit a grand slam during her first collegiate at-bat against UAB (Feb. 5).

Freshman infielder Katie Hamilton went 2-for-3 with all of her at-bats coming with runners in scoring position.

Sophomore pitcher Casey Faile hurled a complete game in LSU's 6-5 win against Hawaii (Feb. 6) during pool play. She also picked up a save against UAB (Feb. 5).

Freshman pitcher Brittany Mack turned in an impressive six-strikeout, five-inning performance against Hawaii (Feb. 7) that included two scoreless innings during the international tiebreaker.

**TRAHAN AND MOUSE SELECTED AS 2009 CAPTAINS**

Junior pitcher Cody Trahan and sophomore third baseman Jessica Mouse will serve as team captains for the 2009 season.

"Cody and Jessica could not be more deserving of serving as team captains for the 2009 season," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "Both of these student athletes are role model student athletes. Hard working on and off the field, they will lead this young group of Tigers in a positive, hard working atmosphere that will lead to success in all areas of this program."

Trahan (Little Cypress, Texas) earned All-SEC Second-Team honors after going 18-6 with a 2.24 ERA in the circle last season. She ranked inside the SEC's Top 10 in wins, earned run average, opposing batting average and strikeouts during conference play. She fired six complete-game shutouts in 2008, including a one-hitter with eight strikeouts against No. 16 Georgia.

Mouse (Tampa, Fla.) stepped into the role of starting third basemen as a freshman and was solid defensively with a .963 fielding percentage in 54 starts. In her first collegiate at-bat, on her first career pitch, she hit a home run against St. John's. She finished the season with four multi-hit games and 11 RBI hitting primarily out of the No. 8 hole.

**MITCHELL AND SHORTRIDGE ON USA SOFTBALL POY LIST**

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was joined by junior pitcher/outfielder Kirsten Shortridge as two of 50 players named to the eighth annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year watch list as announced by the Amateur Softball Association.

The pair were two of 12 players from the SEC to be represented on the list. LSU has had at least two players on this list in four of the last five seasons.

A First-Team SEC pick and Second-Team NFCA All-South Region selection in 2008, Mitchell paced LSU's offense by ranking inside the SEC's Top 10 in seven offensive categories, including

batting average (.374), home runs (11), RBIs (51) and slugging percentage (.665).

Mitchell finished the season on a strong note hitting safely in 13 of her last 16 games with a .438 batting clip to go along with six homers, 20 RBIs and a .958 slugging percentage.

Shortridge was a dual threat on Baylor's 2007 Women's College World Series team and looks to return to the form that won her the Big 12 Freshman of the Year award. She hit .340 and posted 16 multi-hit efforts for the Bears.

In the circle, Shortridge compiled a 17-6 mark in the circle and secured three wins over nationally ranked foes, including Texas A&M to clinch the Big 12 regular-season title.

The USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, considered the Heisman Trophy of women's collegiate softball, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

Former Tiger three-time All-American Britni Sneed was one of 10 finalists for the award in 2002 followed by two-time All-American Kristin Schmidt during the 2003 season. In 2006 and 2007, three-time All-American Leslie Klein was one of 25 finalists for the honor.

The 2009 Preseason Watch List is comprised of 50 players representing 32 schools and 13 different NCAA Division I Conferences. The ASA will announce the 25 finalists on April 1. A player does not have to appear on the initial watch list to be considered as a Top 25 finalist, but once the Top 25 is named, the remaining finalist must be selected from that list.

Just days before the start of postseason play, a list of 10 finalists will be named and released on May 6. The final three finalists will be announced May 20 with the winner of the 2009 USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award being announced prior to the start of the 2009 NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

**MITCHELL NABS SPOT ON PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM**

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was one of 12 players to earn a spot on the second annual Preseason All-SEC Team as selected by the league's coaches.

Mitchell, a First-Team All-SEC and Second-Team NFCA All-South Region pick in 2008, ranked inside the league's Top 10 in batting average (.374), home runs (11), RBIs (51), runs scored (48), total bases (126), multi-hit games (22) and slugging percentage (.665).

"Kudos to Rachel," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "This honor from the SEC coaches recognizes her for how good of a ballplayer she is. It's imperative that she has a great season. When you're semi rebuilding with 10 new players, your best players have to step up with big seasons."

**TIGERS PICKED SECOND IN SEC WEST**

LSU was picked to finish second in the Southeastern Conference Western Division as chosen by the conference's coaches in the league's annual preseason poll.

The Tigers totaled 21 points, 11 points behind division favorite Alabama. Mississippi State was selected third with 30 points, followed closely by Auburn with 35 points. Arkansas and Ole Miss finished out the Western Division with 49 and 50 points, respectively.

Florida led the Eastern Division with 10 points. The Gators also picked up 10 of the 11 votes for the overall conference championship. Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina and Kentucky complete the Eastern Division.
