SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ This weekend serves as the 10th edition of the Easton Purple & Gold Challenge. LSU is 42-3 (.933) all-time in the tournament with six undefeated weekends. The three setbacks were against Southern Miss (2000), Houston (2003) and Penn State (2008).
- ▶ LSU has racked up an impressive 74-7 (.914) record at home during the month of February under head coach Yvette Girouard.
- ▶ Girouard enters the weekend 28 wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 48 consecutive weeks in the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN/USA Softball Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 22 and No. 25 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has already played four extra inning games and had two additional games decided in the final two innings this season
- The Tigers overcame a four-run hole in the seventh inning to win 6-5 at Hawai'i (Feb. 7). The last time LSU accomplished that feat came at Georgia (March 22) during the 2003 season.
- Pitcher/outfielder Kirsten Shortridge has hit safely in seven of her last eight games, including four multi-hit efforts. She also is 7-of-8 in the stolen base department.
- Shortridge and shortstop Juliana Santos have combined for seven of LSU's 13 multi-hit games this season.
- Outfielder Ashley Applegate has already picked up five RBIs this season after driving in six runs during the 2008 season.
- Outfielder Rachel Mitchell is on a three-game hitting streak and paces the Tigers with six RBIs.
- Pitcher Cody Trahan has made four starts this season without recording a decision. She paces the Tiger pitching staff with a 1.19 ERA.
- Pitcher Casey Faile is 3-1 in the circle with a save after going 4-1 during the 2008 season.

A LOOK BACK AT THE EASTON TIGER CLASSIC

- LSU went 2-2 with a two wins over No. 5 Texas A&M and extra inning setbacks to Ohio State and Sam Houston State.
- Pitcher Brittany Mack made her first two starts and racked up 25 strikeouts in 16 innings of work. She fanned 13 batters against No. 5 Texas A&M (Feb. 14), the first time a LSU pitcher has reached that feat since Dani Hofer punched out 15 batters against Auburn (March 21, 2008).
- Mack also recorded a save against the Aggies (Feb. 15) and was the tough-luck loser in a 1-0 decision to Sam Houston State. She tallied 12 strikeouts and allowed only four hits against the Bearkats.

- Infielder Juliana Santos became the first LSU player to hit a home run out of the new Tiger Park. The Tigers had 74 plate appearances before Santos gave LSU a 3-2 lead to open the fifth inning against No. 5 Texas A&M (Feb. 14)
- Infielder Ashley Langoni belted her first career homer, a solo shot, to open the second inning against Texas A&M (Feb. 15).

TIGER TERRIFIC IN GRAND OPENING

LSU embarked on the next chapter of its storied history by christening the new Tiger Park Wednesday with a 6-0 victory over McNeese State in front of 2,172 fans.

Prior the game, LSU honored its softball past and present as former alumni joined the current team on the field for the ribbon cutting ceremony.

Head coach Yvette Girouard cut the ribbon and spoke during the dedication along with Chancellor Mike Martin, Athletic Director Joe Alleva and former Athletic Director Skip Bertman. The 2,172 fans were the second-most to view a Tiger softball game.

Each of the head coaches from LSU's women's athletic teams threw out the ceremonial first pitch, including D-D Breaux (Gymnastics), Fran Flory (Volleyball), Brian Lee (Soccer), Adam Schmitt (Swimming & Diving), Dennis Shaver (Track & Field), Karen Bashen (Golf) and assistant coach Kenya Larkin-Landers (Basketball)

"First, I want to thank the tremendous crowd that came out here this evening," Girouard said. "Now we can breathe. The players were very nervous trying to get acclimated and they didn't look like they were very focused. We had some great things go our way and we pulled through."

LSU dented the scoreboard in the third inning as Kirsten Shortridge slapped a single to third base. She stole second and third base before Jazz Jackson ripped a double into the right centerfield gap to give the Tigers a 1-0 edge.

"I wanted our first game [in the new Tiger Park] to be memorable," Jackson said. "I didn't really think about driving in the first

LSU struck for five runs in the fifth inning without a hit for the final margin of 6-0. The Tigers capitalized on two McNeese State (0-6) errors and five passed balls in the frame.

MITCHELL AND SHORTRIDGE ON USA SOFTBALL POY LIST

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was joined by junior pitcher/outfielder Kirsten Shortridge as two of 50 players named to the eighth annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year watch list as announced by the Amateur Softball Association.

The pair were two of 12 players from the SEC to be represented on the list. LSU has had at least two players on this list in four of the last five seasons.

A First-Team SEC pick and Second-Team NFCA All-South Region selection in 2008, Mitchell paced LSU's offense by ranking inside the SEC's Top 10 in seven offensive categories, including batting average (.374), home runs (11), RBIs (51) and slugging percentage (.665).

Shortridge was a dual threat on Baylor's 2007 Women's College World Series team and looks to return to the form that won her the Big 12 Freshman of the Year award. She hit .340 and posted 16 multi-hit efforts for the Bears.

In the circle, Shortridge compiled a 17-6 mark in the circle and secured three wins over nationally ranked foes.

The USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, considered the Heisman Trophy of women's collegiate softball, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

Former Tiger three-time All-American Britni Sneed was one of 10 finalists for the award in 2002 followed by two-time All-American Kristin Schmidt during the 2003 season. In 2006 and 2007, three-time All-American Leslie Klein was one of 25 finalists for the honor.

The 2009 Preseason Watch List is comprised of 50 players representing 32 schools and 13 different NCAA Division I Conferences. The ASA will announce the 25 finalists on April 1. A player does not have to appear on the initial watch list to be considered as a Top 25 finalist, but once the Top 25 is named, the remaining finalist must be selected from that list.

Just days before the start of postseason play, a list of 10 finalists will be named and released on May 6. The final three finalists will be announced May 20 with the winner of the 2009 USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award being announced prior to the start of the 2009 NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

MITCHELL NABS SPOT ON PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was one of 12 players to earn a spot on the second annual Preseason All-SEC Team as selected by the league's coaches.

Mitchell, a First-Team All-SEC and Second-Team NFCA All-South Region pick in 2008, finished the season by hitting safely in 13 of her last 16 games with a .438 batting clip to go along with six homers, 20 RBIs and a .958 slugging percentage.

TIGERS PICKED SECOND IN SEC WEST

LSU was picked to finish second in the Southeastern Conference Western Division as chosen by the conference's coaches in the league's annual preseason poll.

The Tigers totaled 21 points, 11 points behind division favorite Alabama. Mississippi State was selected third with 30 points, followed closely by Auburn with 35 points. Arkansas and Ole Miss finished out the Western Division with 49 and 50 points, respectively. Florida led the Eastern Division with 10 points. The Gators also picked up 10 of the 11 votes for the overall conference championship. Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina and Kentucky complete the Eastern Division.
