SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU returns to action for a mid-week contest against Nicholls at the new Tiger Park on CST.
- ▶ The Tigers have won five consecutive games and are hitting .342 as a team during the streak.
- ▶ LSU has won 15 of 16 meetings against Nicholls. A complete series history is available to the right.
- ▶ The Tigers have tallied an impressive 69-4 (.945) mark against Louisiana schools under head coach Yvette Girouard.
- ▶ Girouard enters tonight's game 23 wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 50 consecutive weeks in both the USA Today/ NFLCA and ESPN/USA Softball Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 19 and No. 22 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has already played five extra inning games and had two additional games decided in the final two innings this season.
- Kirsten Shortridge is on a five-game hitting streak, including three consecutive multi-hit efforts. She also has racked up seven RBIs during that stretch and is 9-of-10 in the stolen base department.
- Ashley Applegate has already matched her RBI total from a season ago. Her six RBIs are tied for fourth on the team.
- Jazz Jackson has reached base in six of her last eight games. She drew three walks against UAB (Feb. 21).
- Rachel Mitchell has hit safely in seven of her last eight games with four RBIs.
- Seven of Anissa Young's eight RBI's have come via her two home runs.
- Jessica Mouse has picked up RBIs in back-to-back games.
- Juliana Santos has scored a run in four of her last five outings.
- Lauren Capello has reached base in three of her four at-bats as a pinch hitter.
- Brittany Mack has allowed only one earned run in her last 18.1 innings of work. She was named LSWA Pitcher of the Week for her efforts.
- Cody Trahan has been touched up for only a pair of hits in her last two starts, both wins. She also has notched 14 strikeouts.
- Casey Faile is 3-1 with a pair of saves in the circle after registering a 4-1 record during the 2008 season.

A LOOK BACK AT THE EASTON PURPLE & GOLD CHALLENGE

- LSU went 4-0 and outscored its opponents 30-5 en route to the Easton Purple & Gold tournament title.
- The LSU offense hit .354 as a team as Ashley Applegate, Jessica Mouse and Kirsten Shortridge picked up All-Tournament honors. The trio each batted over .400 and combined for 15 hits.

- Brittany Mack took home Tournament MVP honors after firing her first career no-hitter against Texas State. She also earned a relief win against Northern Iowa.
- Morgan Russell belted her first two career hits as a Tiger. The Oklahoma native racked up five RBIs in the process.
- Katie Guillory's first career at-bat produced a RBI-single against UAB (Feb. 22).
- Infielder Juliana Santos became the first LSU player to hit a home run out of the new Tiger Park. The Tigers had 74 plate appearances before Santos gave LSU a 3-2 lead to open the fifth inning against No. 5 Texas A&M (Feb. 14)
- Infielder Ashley Langoni belted her first career homer, a solo shot, to open the second inning against Texas A&M (Feb. 15).

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU is 7-0 when hitting a home run against a 4-4 mark when not hitting a homer.
- The Tigers have won five of its six decisions decided by one run in addition to its games decided by five or more runs.
- LSU is 8-0 when scoring first, including a 5-0 mark when scoring in the first inning.
- The Tigers is 11-1 when scoring three or more runs.

TRAHAN AND MOUSE SELECTED AS 2009 CAPTAINS

Junior pitcher Cody Trahan and sophomore third baseman Jessica Mouse will serve as team captains for the 2009 season.

Trahan (Little Cypress, Texas) earned All-SEC Second-Team honors after going 18-6 with a 2.24 ERA in the circle last season. She ranked inside the SEC's Top 10 in wins, earned run average, opposing batting average and strikeouts during conference play. She fired six complete-game shutouts in 2008, including a one-hitter with eight strikeouts against No. 16 Georgia.

Mouse (Tampa, Fla.) stepped into the role of starting third baseman as a freshman and was solid defensively with a .963

fielding percentage in 54 starts. In her first collegiate at-bat, on her first career pitch, she hit a home run against St. John's. She finished the season with four multi-hit games and 11 RBI hitting primarily out of the No. 8 hole.

MITCHELL AND SHORTRIDGE ON USA SOFTBALL POY LIST

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was joined by junior pitcher/outfielder Kirsten Shortridge as two of 50 players named to the eighth annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year watch list as announced by the Amateur Softball Association.

The pair were two of 12 players from the SEC to be represented on the list. LSU has had at least two players on this list in four of the last five seasons.

A First-Team SEC pick and Second-Team NFCA All-South Region selection in 2008, Mitchell paced LSU's offense by ranking inside the SEC's Top 10 in seven offensive categories, including batting average (.374), home runs (11), RBIs (51) and slugging percentage (.665).

Shortridge was a dual threat on Baylor's 2007 Women's College World Series team and looks to return to the form that won her the Big 12 Freshman of the Year award. She hit .340 and posted 16 multi-hit efforts for the Bears.

In the circle, Shortridge compiled a 17-6 mark in the circle and secured three wins over nationally ranked foes.

The USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, considered the Heisman Trophy of women's collegiate softball, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

Former Tiger three-time All-American Britni Sneed was one of 10 finalists for the award in 2002 followed by two-time All-American Kristin Schmidt during the 2003 season. In 2006 and 2007, three-time All-American Leslie Klein was one of 25 finalists for the honor.

The 2009 Preseason Watch List is comprised of 50 players representing 32 schools and 13 different NCAA Division I Conferences. The ASA will announce the 25 finalists on April 1. A player does not have to appear on the initial watch list to be considered as a Top 25 finalist, but once the Top 25 is named, the remaining finalist must be selected from that list.

Just days before the start of postseason play, a list of 10 finalists will be named and released on May 6. The final three finalists will be announced May 20 with the winner of the 2009 USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award being announced prior to the start of the 2009 NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

MITCHELL NABS SPOT ON PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was one of 12 players to earn a spot on the second annual Preseason All-SEC Team as selected by the league's coaches.

Mitchell, a First-Team All-SEC and Second-Team NFCA All-South Region pick in 2008, finished the season by hitting safely in 13 of her last 16 games with a .438 batting clip to go along with six homers, 20 RBIs and a .958 slugging percentage.

TIGERS PICKED SECOND IN SEC WEST

LSU was picked to finish second in the Southeastern Conference Western Division as chosen by the conference's coaches in the league's annual preseason poll.

The Tigers totaled 21 points, 11 points behind division favorite Alabama. Mississippi State was selected third with 30 points, followed closely by Auburn with 35 points. Arkansas and Ole Miss finished out the Western Division with 49 and 50 points, respectively.

Florida led the Eastern Division with 10 points. The Gators also picked up 10 of the 11 votes for the overall conference championship. Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina and Kentucky complete the Eastern Division.
