SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU opens SEC action with a weekend series against Kentucky at the new Tiger Park.
- ▶ The series also serves as the program's first annual alumni weekend. All-Americans Stephanie Hastings, Leslie Klein and Emily Turner are among the group of players scheduled to be honored in between games of Saturday's doubleheader.
- ▶ LSU is 29-7 (.806) on SEC opening weekend in program history and has won 15 of 18 games (.833) in Baton Rouge.
- ▶ Girouard enters this weekend 22 wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 50 consecutive weeks in both the USA Today/ NFA and ESPN/USA Softball Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 19 and No. 22 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU is on a six-game winning streak dating back to the final game of the Easton Tiger Classic on Feb. 15 and have outscored its opponents, 41-6.
- The Tiger offense has posted a .352 team batting average headlined by Kirsten Shortridge from the leadoff spot. She is hitting .524 with nine RBIs during her six-game hitting streak.
- Shortridge has reeled off four consecutive multi-hit efforts and is 11-for-13 in the stolen base department this season.
- Rachel Mitchell has knocked a hit in eight of her last nine games and drove home a RBI in three of her last games.
- Ashley Applegate has reached base in seven of her last nine games and is three RBIs away from matching her total from last season. Her six RBIs are fifth on the team.
- After starting the season 0-for-9, Jessica Mouse is hitting .350 (7-for-20) in her last eight games.
- Four of Ashley Langoni's last five hits have produced RBIs, including an RBI-double against Nicholls in the third inning.
- Seven of Anissa Young's eight RBI's have come via her two home runs. She is hitting .346 (9-for-26) when she puts the ball in play.
- Juliana Santos has scored a run in five of her last six outings, including three-straight games.
- Morgan Russell has powered home five RBIs on a pair of hits in her last four at-bats after starting the season 0-for-17.
- Courtney Hollier has drawn a walk in her last four games.

CIRCLE NOTES

- Cody Trahan has been touched up for only a trio of hits in her last three starts, all wins. She also has notched 21 strikeouts.
- Brittany Mack has allowed only one earned run in her last 20.1 innings of work. She was named LSWA Pitcher of the Week for her efforts after taking home Tournament MVP honors at the Easton Purple & Gold Challenge.

OFF THE BENCH

- Casey Faile has not allowed an earned run in her last four appearances, a stretch of 8.2 innings. She recorded a two-inning save against Southern Miss (Feb. 25) last time out.
- Lauren Capello has reached base in three of her four at-bats as a pinch hitter.
- Katie Guillory has scored three runs as a pinch runner. She also has gone 3-for-5 at the plate with an RBI.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU is 7-0 when hitting a home run against a 5-4 mark when not hitting a homer.
- The Tigers have won five of its six decisions decided by one run in addition to six of its seven games decided by five or more runs.
- LSU is 9-0 when scoring first, including a 6-0 mark when scoring in the first inning.
- The Tigers are 12-1 when scoring three or more runs.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- LSU has already played five extra inning games and had two additional games decided in the final two innings this season.
- The Tigers are 4-3 in those games, including a four-run come-from-behind victory at Hawai'i (Feb. 7). LSU evened the score at 5-5 and won on an Ashley Applegate walkoff walk in the ninth inning.
- The last time LSU accomplished that feat came at Georgia (March 22) during the 2003 season.
- The Tigers also overcame two-run deficits on consecutive days against then-No. 5 Texas A&M (Feb. 14 & 15).

circle, the No. 19 LSU softball team dismantled Nicholls 8-0 in five innings Wednesday at the new Tiger Park.

LSU (12-4) pushed its winning streak to six games and won its 16th consecutive game in the series against the Colonels.

"The offense did a lot of great things tonight," head coach Yvette Girouard said. "We were swinging at good pitches and extending innings which was one of the adjustments that we've been talking about. Kirsten is constantly money for us at the top of the lineup, and the freshman came through in primetime situations with runners on-base."

Shortridge opened the first inning with an infield single and moved to second base on her 10th stolen base of the season.

A single from Juliana Santos and a double from Rachel Mitchell gave the Tigers a 2-0 edge. LSU added a run in the second inning to make it 3-0 on a Shortridge RBI-single to score Courtney Hollier, who reached on a four-pitch walk.

Trahan set the tone in the circle mowing down seven of the first nine batters she faced en route to her third consecutive win. The Texas native has only been touched up for a trio of hits to go along with 21 strikeouts in 14 innings of work over her last three starts.

"Every time we play an in-state school we have a target on our backs," Trahan said. "We wanted to go out, focus on our game and make things happen."

The Tigers used a two-out rally in the third inning aided by a Mitchell walk followed by an Ashley Langoni RBI-double off the left centerfield wall. Langoni came around to score on a wild pitch to push the advantage to 5-0.

LSU tacked on a pair of unearned runs in the fourth inning as Hollier and Shortridge teamed up on a double steal and came around to score on a throwing error by Nicholls catcher Haley Burkett to give the Tigers a commanding 7-0 lead.

Walks drawn by Ashley Langoni and Morgan Russell along with a Katie Guillory infield single loaded the bases in the fifth. Shortridge worked a two-out walk to cap the 8-0 victory.

"I think we did an excellent job of passing the bat," Shortridge said. "There has been a lot of frustration on offense. Making adjustments quick is what really matters and I think everyone saw that tonight."

MITCHELL AND SHORTRIDGE ON USA SOFTBALL POY LIST

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was joined by junior pitcher/outfielder Kirsten Shortridge as two of 50 players named to the eighth annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year watch list as announced by the Amateur Softball Association.

The pair were two of 12 players from the SEC to be represented on the list. LSU has had at least two players on this list in four of the last five seasons.

The USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, considered the Heisman Trophy of women's collegiate softball, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

Former Tiger three-time All-American Britni Sneed was one of 10 finalists for the award in 2002 followed by two-time All-American Kristin Schmidt during the 2003 season. In 2006 and 2007, three-time All-American Leslie Klein was one of 25 finalists for the honor.

The 2009 Preseason Watch List is comprised of 50 players representing 32 schools and 13 different NCAA Division I Conferences. The ASA will announce the 25 finalists on April 1. A player does not have to appear on the initial watch list to be considered as a Top 25 finalist, but once the Top 25 is named, the remaining finalist must be selected from that list.

Just days before the start of postseason play, a list of 10 finalists will be named and released on May 6. The final three finalists will be announced May 20 with the winner of the 2009 USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award being announced prior to the start of the 2009 NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.
