SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU and Nicholls meet for a mid-week game in Thibodaux with first pitch slated for 6 p.m.
- ▶ The Tigers have won 16-straight in the series and defeated the Colonels 8-0 earlier this season at home.
- ▶ Kirsten Shortridge went 3-for-3 with a pair of RBIs and stolen bases, while Juliana Santos, Rachel Mitchell and Ashley Langoni each tacked on RBIs of their own.
- ▶ Cody Trahan and Brittany Mack limited Nicholls to only two hits and combined for 11 strikeouts.
- ▶ The Tigers have tallied an impressive 70-4 (.946) mark against Louisiana schools under head coach Yvette Girouard.
- ▶ Girouard enters the Nicholls game 12 wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 55 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 18 and No. 19 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has won 16 of its last 22 games dating back to the final game of the Easton Tiger Classic on Feb. 15 and are looking to bounce back from a 0-2-1 weekend against No. 13 Tennessee.
- Kirsten Shortridge ignites the offense racking up 49 hits on a .415 batting average. She has reached base in 29 of 32 games in addition to being 16-for-21 in the stolen base department.
- Shortridge has currently strung together five consecutive multi-hit efforts, including back-to-back three-hit efforts against Tennessee.
- Jazz Jackson has tallied a hit in 12 of 14 SEC games and is currently on a season-long six-game hitting streak. She notched a pair multi-hit outings against Tennessee.
- Juliana Santos has scored a run in 15 of her last 19 games. She also has hit safely in 11 of her last 15 games and has picked up 11 of her 16 RBIs against SEC opponents.
- Rachel Mitchell has picked up 12 of her team-leading 24 RBIs over her last 10 games. She earned SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week (Week of March 23).
- The Tigers are 16-4-1 when Santos hits third followed by Mitchell in the cleanup spot.
- 10 of Ashley Langoni's last 16 hits have driven home RBIs. She has knocked in 14 of her 17 RBIs from the No. 5 spot.
- Ashley Applegate has slapped a hit in nine of 14 SEC games, including four multi-hit efforts. She surpassed her RBI total from a season ago driving home three runs during the Tennessee series.
- 10 of Anissa Young's 17 RBI's are on her five home runs. She is currently on a career-long five game hitting streak and is batting .368 (21-for-57) when putting the ball in play.
- Morgan Russell broke out of a 0-for-21 slump over her last nine games with her second multi-hit game of her career against Tennessee during the series finale.

- Jessica Mouse is hitting .317 (19-for-60) in her last 24 games and has hit safely in eight of last 14 games. She provided a pair of RBIs during LSU's last mid-week game at Southern Miss.
- LSU is 16-5-1 when Mouse hits at the bottom of the lineup.

CIRCLE NOTES

- After starting the season with six no-decisions, Cody Trahan has gone 6-3 with six complete games. She is coming off a no-decision over 5.2 innings during LSU's 3-3 tie with No. 13 Tennessee.
- Brittany Mack tossed 1.1 innings of scoreless relief during the series finale against Tennessee. She has won seven consecutive decisions over her last 15 outings.
- Kirsten Shortridge racked up a season-best five strikeouts but earned the loss in the middle game of the Tennessee series. She fired four innings of three-hit relief and secured LSU's doubleheader sweep over No. 2 Alabama.
- Casey Faile has not allowed an earned run in her last seven appearances, a stretch of 14.1 innings. She tossed three innings of one-hit relief en route to the win during the series finale at Mississippi State and is scheduled to start tonight's game against Nicholls.

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in six of her nine at-bats as a pinch hitter with three walks, two hits and a hit-by-pitch.
- Casey Faile has recorded a hit in four of her seven starts.
- Katie Guillory has scored five times as a pinch runner, including the game-tying run in the series finale at Mississippi State. She also has gone 3-for-7 at the plate with an RBI.
- Courtney Hollier has drawn a walk in three of her last six games that she has started.
- Tiffany Shaw scored the go-ahead run during the sixth inning as a pinch runner at Southern Miss.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU is 12-2-1 when hitting a home run against a 10-7 mark when not hitting a homer.
- LSU has won 10 of its 15 games decided by one run. Eight of the Tigers 14 SEC games have been decided in this fashion.
- LSU is 15-2-1 when scoring first, including an unbeaten 9-0-1 mark when scoring in the first inning.
- The Tigers are 22-4-1 when scoring three or more runs.
- LSU has won nine of its 10 games that have begun after 6 p.m.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 10 of LSU's 22 wins this season, LSU has entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- Jessica Mouse, Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson provided back-to-back-to-back RBI singles with two outs during the sixth inning at Southern Miss (April 1).
- Trailing 5-1 going into the fifth inning in the series finale at Mississippi State (March 22), the Tigers scored six runs in the last three innings highlighted by a Mouse RBI-triple and Shortridge RBI-single in the sixth inning to give LSU the lead.
- Mouse broke a 4-4 tie belting a home run during the seventh inning of the series opener at Mississippi State (March 21).
- LSU exploded for five runs in the fifth inning down 5-1 in game two against Alabama (March 18). With the bases loaded, Rachel Mitchell cleared the bases with a game-tying double and used alert base running to score the game-winning run on a Crimson Tide error.
- One week earlier, Morgan Russell scored on a wild pitch in the bottom of the seventh as the Tigers edged Baylor 4-3.
- The Tigers also overcame two-run deficits on consecutive days to win a pair of one-run games against then-No. 5 Texas A&M (Feb. 14 & 15).
- Shortridge and Mitchell provided the late-winning heroics with game-winning singles against the Aggies.
- LSU completed a four-run comeback victory at Hawai'i (Feb. 7). The Tigers scored four in the seventh before winning the game on an Ashley Applegate walk in the ninth.
- The last time LSU accomplished that feat came at Georgia during the 2003 season.

MITCHELL NABS SPOT ON PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was one of 12 players to earn a spot on the second annual Preseason All-SEC Team as selected by the league's coaches.

Mitchell, a First-Team All-SEC and Second-Team NFCA All-South Region pick in 2008, finished the season by hitting safely in 13 of her last 16 games with a .438 batting clip to go along with six homers, 20 RBIs and a .958 slugging percentage.

TIGERS PICKED SECOND IN SEC WEST

LSU was picked to finish second in the Southeastern Conference Western Division as chosen by the conference's coaches in the league's annual preseason poll.

The Tigers totaled 21 points, 11 points behind division favorite Alabama. Mississippi State was selected third with 30 points, followed closely by Auburn with 35 points.

Arkansas and Ole Miss finished out the Western Division with 49 and 50 points, respectively.

Florida led the Eastern Division with 10 points. The Gators also picked up 10 of the 11 votes for the overall conference championship.

Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina and Kentucky complete the Eastern Division.
