SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU looks to snap out of a four-game skid as the Tigers wrap up the inaugural season at the new Tiger Park with a weekend series against South Carolina.
- ▶ The Tigers will honor senior pitcher Dani Hofer prior to Sunday's game. Hofer will start the game making her first appearance of 2009. She ranks in the Top 5 of nine pitching categories, including wins (59), strikeouts (623), complete games (54), shutouts (20) and opponent batting average (.179).
- ▶ LSU has won eight of the last 10 meetings against USC, including two of three last season in Columbia.
- ▶ Head coach Yvette Girouard enters the South Carolina series seven wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 57 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 19 and No. 21 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 6-4, LSU has won 21 of its last 32 games (.672). However, the Tigers are looking to end a four-game losing streak.
- LSU is batting .178 (16-for-90) as a team with its lone runs coming on a Casey Faile three-run homer in the seventh inning at McNeese State (April 22).
- Kirsten Shortridge ignites the offense racking up 61 hits on a .396 batting average. She has reached base in 36 of 42 games in addition to being 20-for-25 in the stolen base department.
- Shortridge has hit safely in 12 of her last 15 games posting nine of her team-best 20 multi-hit efforts during the streak. Her 20 multi-hit games are second in the SEC (see page 5).
- Jazz Jackson has tallied a hit in 17 of 20 SEC games. She matched a career-best 13-game hitting streak Saturday after a two-hit performance against UF ace Stacey Nelson.
- Juliana Santos has recorded a hit and scored a run in six of her last 10 games. She has picked up 14 of her 20 RBIs against SEC opponents.
- Santos earned SEC Freshman and LSWA Hitter of the Week (Week of April 13).
- Rachel Mitchell has compiled hits in nine of her last 11 games. She also has collected 16 of her team-best 30 RBIs over her last 20 games.
- Earlier this season, Mitchell swept SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors (Week of March 23).
- The Tigers are 20-9-1 when Santos hits third followed by Mitchell in the cleanup spot.
- Ashley Applegate has slapped a hit in 14 of 20 SEC games, including six multi-hit efforts.
- Applegate's batting average has dipped below .300 only once since Feb. 20. The California product has already surpassed her RBI total from a season ago.

- 15 of Anissa Young's 24 RBIs are on her team-leading seven home runs. She has tallied a hit in 12 of her last 18 games with five of her seven multi-hit efforts during that stretch.
- Young also has seen her batting average climb from .190 to .248 over those 18 games. She is hitting .368 (28-for-76) when putting the ball in play this season and has struck out only six times in her last 12 games after striking out 30 times in her first 30 games.
- 11 of Ashley Langoni's last 16 hits have produced RBIs. Eight of those hits have gone for extra bases as Langoni has knocked in 18 of her 21 RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup.
- Langoni is looking to break out of an 0-for-17 slump over her last eight games.
- Langoni, Santos and Young have accounted for 39.4 percent (65-of-165) of LSU's RBIs this season. The trio also has knocked 15 of the team's 22 home runs.
- Morgan Russell broke out of a nine-game, 0-for-21 slump with her second career multi-hit game during the Tennessee series finale (April 5). She has added hits in three of her last six starts at catcher where she registers an at-bat.
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 14 of her last 26 plate appearances over the last nine games. She has seven hits to go along with six walks in addition to being hit-by-a-pitch once.
- LSU is 21-10-1 when Mouse hits at the bottom of the lineup. She is batting .314 (22-of-70) and has picked up 13 of her 14 RBIs from the No. 9 hole.

CIRCLE NOTES

- After starting the season with six no-decisions, Cody Trahan has gone 7-5 with seven complete games. She will look to bounce back from the shortest start of her career, 1.2 innings, last time out against No. 1 Florida.
- Brittany Mack had her streak of eight consecutive wins snapped in game one of the Arkansas series (April 10). She

limited No. 1 Florida (April 18) to one run on five hits over nine innings of work during the first two games of the series.

- Kirsten Shortridge racked up a season-best five strikeouts but earned the loss in the middle game of the Tennessee series (April 4). She fired four innings of three-hit relief and secured LSU's doubleheader sweep over No. 2 Alabama (March 18).
- After logging 24.0 innings over the first two months of the season, Casey Faile has racked up 24.1 innings of work in the month of April. She has gone 2-1 with a 1.44 ERA in seven appearances and mowed down a career-best eight batters in game one against Southeastern Louisiana (April 15).
- Faile recorded seven strikeouts and a save over her two appearances last season against South Carolina.

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in six of her 13 at-bats as a pinch hitter with three walks, two hits and a hit-by-pitch.
- Casey Faile has recorded a hit in five of her seven starts and drove home RBIs in three of those game, including a three-run homer against McNeese State. She also turned in a 2-for-3 performance at the plate during the Florida series.
- Katie Guillory has scored five times as a pinch runner, including the game-tying run in the series finale at Mississippi State. She also has gone 3-for-9 at the plate with an RBI.
- Courtney Hollier has appeared in 29 games being used primarily as a defensive replacement at second base.
- After missing LSU's first 26 games, Tiffany Shaw has scored seven times in 13 pinch running appearances representing the tying runs at Southern Miss (April 1) and Nicholls (April 7).
- Katie Hamilton has reached base in all four games she has played in, including a three-game hitting streak. She returned to Georgia before LSU's home opener due for personal reasons.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU is 14-4-1 when hitting a home run against a 13-10 mark when not hitting a homer.
- LSU has won 11 of its 19 games decided by one run. 10 of the Tigers 20 SEC games have been decided in this fashion.
- LSU is 19-2-1 when scoring first, including an unbeaten 12-0-1 mark when scoring in the first inning. In eight of those 12 games, Kirsten Shortridge has scored the game's first run.
- The Tigers are 26-6-1 when scoring three or more runs.
- LSU has won 12 of its 14 games that have begun after 6 p.m.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 11 of LSU's 27 wins this season, LSU has entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- Behind 1-0 in the seventh inning, Juliana Santos scored pinch runner Tiffany Shaw with a triple into a right centerfield gap at Nicholls (April 7). On the next batter, a Colonel fielding error allowed Santos to score the game winning run.
- Jessica Mouse, Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson provided back-to-back-to-back RBI singles with two outs to turn a 2-1 deficit into a 4-2 advantage during the sixth inning at Southern Miss (April 1).
- Trailing 5-1 going into the fifth inning of the series finale at Mississippi State (March 22), the Tigers scored six runs in the last three innings highlighted by a Mouse RBI-triple and Shortridge RBI-single in the sixth inning to give LSU the lead.
- Mouse broke a 4-4 tie belting a home run during the seventh inning of the series opener at Mississippi State (March 21).
- LSU exploded for five runs in the fifth inning down 5-1 in game two against Alabama (March 18). With the bases loaded, Rachel Mitchell cleared the bases with a game-tying double and used alert base running to score the game-winning run on a Crimson Tide error.
