## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU is looking to build on a weekend sweep of South Carolina where the Tigers outscored the Gamecocks, 20-0. Kirsten Shortridge and Cody Trahan swept the LSWA weekly awards.
- ▶ LSU won all four meetings with Auburn last season. Dani Hofer won all three regular season decisions, including a 15-strikeout performance in the series opener.
- ▶ LSU also defeated Auburn 4-0 in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals. Trahan tallied eight strikeouts in a complete game shutout, while Quinlan Duhon, Taylr Hollis and Shannon Stein added RBIs.
- ▶ Head coach Yvette Girouard enters the Auburn series four wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 58 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 20 and No. 22 in this week's edition of the polls.

**STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS**

- After starting the season 6-4, LSU has won 24 of its last 35 games (.686). The Tigers are coming off a three-game sweep over South Carolina and outscored the Gamecocks 20-0.
- Kirsten Shortridge and Cody Trahan were named LSWA Hitter and Pitcher of the Week for their efforts.
- LSU's offense hit .354 (23-for-65), while the Tiger pitching staff held the Gamecocks to a .111 mark.
- Shortridge ignites the offense racking up 67 hits on a .414 batting average. She has reached base in 39 of 45 games in addition to being 22-for-28 in the stolen base department.
- Shortridge has hit safely in 15 of her last 18 games posting 12 of her team-best 23 multi-hit efforts during the streak. Her 23 multi-hit games are second in the SEC (see page 5).
- Shortridge racked up a career-best five RBIs in game one against South Carolina aided by a second inning grand slam.
- Jazz Jackson has tallied a hit in 20 of 23 SEC games. She has recorded eight multi-hit games in league games, including a 3-for-3 performance during the South Carolina series finale.
- Juliana Santos has recorded a hit in eight of her last 13 games. She also picked up RBIs during all three games of the South Carolina and has tallied 19 of her 25 RBIs against SEC opponents. The California native earned SEC Freshman and LSWA Hitter of the Week (Week of April 13).
- Rachel Mitchell has compiled hits in 10 of her last 14 games. She also has collected 18 of her team-best 32 RBIs over her last 22 games. Earlier this season, Mitchell swept SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors (Week of March 23).
- The Tigers are 23-9-1 when Santos hits third followed by Mitchell at cleanup in the batting order.
- Ashley Applegate has slapped a hit in 15 of 23 SEC games, including six multi-hit efforts. Her batting average has dipped below .300 only once since Feb. 20.

- Applegate has already surpassed her RBI total from a season ago and recorded RBIs during the last two games of the South Carolina series.
- 15 of Anissa Young's 28 RBI's are on her team-leading seven home runs. She has tallied a hit in 14 of her last 21 games with five of her seven multi-hit efforts during that stretch.
- Young also has seen her batting average climb from .190 to .248 over those 21 games. She is hitting .366 (30-for-82) when putting the ball in play this season and has struck out only six times in her last 11 games after striking out 32 times in her first 34 games.
- 11 of Ashley Langoni's last 16 hits have produced RBIs. Eight of those hits have gone for extra bases as Langoni has knocked in 18 of her 21 RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup.
- Langoni is looking to break out of an 0-for-18 slump over her last nine games. She appeared as pinch-hitter against USC.
- Langoni, Santos and Young have accounted for 40.2 percent (74-of-184) of LSU's RBIs this season. The trio also has knocked 16 of the team's 24 home runs.
- Morgan Russell has reached base in six of her last nine starts at catcher where she registers an at-bat.
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 17 of her last 33 plate appearances over the last 12 games. She has eight hits to go along with seven walks in addition to being hit-by-a-pitch and reaching on an error once.
- LSU is 24-10-1 when Mouse hits at the bottom of the lineup. She is batting .303 (23-of-76) and has picked up 13 of her 14 RBIs from the No. 9 hole.

**CIRCLE NOTES**

- Cody Trahan bounced back from the shortest start of her career against No. 1 Florida (April 19) and responded with a two-hit and one-hit shutouts against South Carolina. She added 12 strikeouts and held the Gamecocks to an .081 average.

- Brittany Mack had her streak of eight consecutive wins snapped in game one of the Arkansas series (April 10). She limited No. 1 Florida (April 18) to one run on five hits over nine innings of work during the first two games of the series.
- Kirsten Shortridge fired a three-hit shutout during game two of the South Carolina series. She is 2-1 with a 2.39 ERA in SEC games and tossed four innings of three-hit relief to secure LSU's doubleheader sweep over No. 2 Alabama (March 18).
- After logging 24.0 innings over the first two months of the season, Casey Faile has racked up 24.1 innings of work in the month of April. She has gone 2-1 with a 1.44 ERA in seven appearances and mowed down a career-best eight batters in game one against Southeastern Louisiana (April 15).

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in seven of her 15 at-bats as a pinch hitter with three hits, three walks and was hit-by-pitch once.
- Casey Faile has recorded a hit in six of her last 10 games with five RBIs. She belted a three-run homer during the seventh inning at McNeese State (April 22).
- Katie Guillory has scored six times as a pinch runner, including the game-tying run in the series finale at Mississippi State. She also has gone 3-for-10 at the plate with an RBI.
- Courtney Hollier has appeared in 31 games being used primarily as a defensive replacement at second base.
- After missing LSU's first 26 games, Tiffany Shaw has scored nine times in 15 pinch running appearances representing the tying runs at Southern Miss (April 1) and Nicholls (April 7).
- Katie Hamilton has reached base in all four games she has played in, including a three-game hitting streak. She returned to Georgia before LSU's home opener due for personal reasons.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU is 15-4-1 when hitting a home run against a 15-10 mark when not hitting a homer.
- LSU has won 11 of its 19 games decided by one run. 10 of the Tigers 23 SEC games have been decided in this fashion.
- LSU is 22-2-1 when scoring first, including an unbeaten 14-0-1 mark when scoring in the first inning. In 10 of those 14 games, Kirsten Shortridge has scored the game's first run.
- The Tigers are 29-6-1 when scoring three or more runs.
- LSU has won 12 of its 14 games that have begun after 6 p.m.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 11 of LSU's 30 wins this season, LSU has entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- Behind 1-0 in the seventh inning, Juliana Santos scored pinch runner Tiffany Shaw with a triple into a right centerfield gap at Nicholls (April 7). On the next batter, a Colonel fielding error allowed Santos to score the game winning run.
- Jessica Mouse, Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson provided back-to-back-to-back RBI singles with two outs to turn a 2-1 deficit into a 4-2 advantage during the sixth inning at Southern Miss (April 1).
- Trailing 5-1 going into the fifth inning of the series finale at Mississippi State (March 22), the Tigers scored six runs in the last three innings highlighted by a Mouse RBI-triple and Shortridge RBI-single in the sixth inning to give LSU the lead.
- Mouse broke a 4-4 tie belting a home run during the seventh inning of the series opener at Mississippi State (March 21).
- LSU exploded for five runs in the fifth inning down 5-1 in game two against Alabama (March 18). With the bases loaded, Rachel Mitchell cleared the bases with a game-tying double and used alert base running to score the game-winning run on a Crimson Tide error.
