- Seven SEC teams have at least one win this season thus far against a Top 25 team (rankings at time game was played).
- Vanderbilt junior wide receiver George Smith is this week's SEC Community Service Team Player of the Week [See page 6].
- The SEC continues to lead the nation in non-conference winning percentage. After five weeks, the SEC is 25-4 (86.2 percent) against non-conference foes [See page 8].
- The SEC leads the nation with five teams ranked in this week's AP, USA Today Coaches' and Harris Interactive polls. The Big 12 also has five teams ranked in the AP and the Pac-10 has five teams in the USA Today Coaches' polls [See page 10].
- After five weeks, SEC stadiums are averaging 97.84 percent capacity. The SEC has a total attendance of 2,886,545 in 38 home games, an average of 75,962 fans per game [See page 11].
- Five of the six longest offensive drives (by time of possession) occurred in Week 5 [See page 13].
- On Oct. 4, 1969 (38 years ago), Alabama defeated Ole Miss, 33-32, on ABC-TV, marking the first prime-time telecast of an SEC football game [See page 13].

SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

Each head coach is allowed one Instant Replay challenge per game, which is exercised by requesting a team timeout. A head coach may issue a challenge only if his team has one or more timeouts remaining in the half. If the challenged ruling is overturned, the timeout is not charged, but the coach has no more challenges during that game.

THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game (CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2, Lincoln Financial) or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference, following approval by the NCAA Football Rules Committee, will implement the use of video replay on an experimental basis beginning with the 2005 football season.

THE PLAYS

Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
 - a. Scoring Plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
 - b. Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line
 - c. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
 - d. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds
2. Passing Plays:
 - a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
 - b. Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver
 - c. Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player
 - d. Quarterback (Passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, play is finalized)
 - e. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
 - f. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
 - g. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
3. Other Detectable Infractions:
 - a. Runner ruled not down.
 - b. Forward progress with respect to first down
 - c. Touching of a kick
 - d. Number of players on field
 - e. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with overturned plays)
 - f. Fourth-down/try fumble plays

THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with a DVSPORT Digital Replay System. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official is selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live video feed is sent directly to the replay booth. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while capturing/digitizing it into the DVSPORT Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play as well as any replays as they occur in real time.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Communicator. As the Technician marks the incoming video, each view (by mark) will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Communicator can touch/click on a thumbnail and immediately send that play/replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a remote device controlled by the Replay Official. All replays/video are viewed on an output monitor. The touch screen is only used to select the replays.

While most plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the Digital Replay System developed by DVSPORT of Pittsburgh, Pa. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from DVSPORT.

2007 SEC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The SEC's Eastern and Western Division winners will meet in Atlanta's Georgia Dome to battle for the league championship and the right to represent the conference in the Bowl Championship Series. The 16th-annual title game is set for December 1 and will be nationally televised by CBS Sports at 4:00 p.m. ET.

The game is a result of conference expansion, which saw Arkansas and South Carolina become the first members added in SEC history. Under NCAA regulations, a conference with 12 members may play a 12th football game to determine its champion, provided the regular season is played in divisions.

The participants of the game are determined each year during the eight-game regular-season conference schedule as the teams with the best overall SEC winning percentage in each division.

The 1994 SEC Championship Game earned a 10.5 rating and a 26 share, the highest rated SEC Championship Game in history.

The SEC Championship Game has also drawn capacity crowds in its history. 1,120,836 fans have witnessed first-hand the pageantry of SEC Football at the 15 previous Championship Games.

Attendance at the 15 previous championship games has been 102.3 percent of stadium capacity, including 13 sellouts.

THIS WEEK IN SEC FOOTBALL HISTORY

As the Southeastern Conference celebrates its 75th anniversary, here is a look at some of the highlights during the upcoming game dates in its history:

**Oct. 4-6**

1951 - (Oct. 6) Unranked Mississippi State upsets #13 ranked Georgia, 6-0, in Starkville.

1969 - (Oct. 4) Alabama defeats Ole Miss 33-32 on ABC television in the first ever prime time telecast of an SEC football game. This season commemorated the 100th anniversary of the start of college football and both teams wore the 100 insignia on their helmets. In that contest, Ole Miss' Archie Manning collects an SEC record 540 total offensive yards. He would become the National Back of the Year as well as first-team All-America and All-SEC. Sons Peyton (Tennessee, 1997) and Eli (Ole Miss, 2003) would become All-Americans in their playing careers.

1997 - (Oct. 4) Kentucky defeats Alabama, 40-34 in overtime, at Lexington. It is the first time in 75 years that the Wildcats had defeated the Crimson Tide.

2001 - (Oct. 6) Unranked Georgia goes into Knoxville and upsets #6-ranked Tennessee, 26-24. The Vols would win seven straight before falling in the SEC Championship Game to LSU.

CBS SPORTS - The 2007 season marks the 11th year for CBS as the league's national network television partner. CBS will televise up to 15 games per year throughout the season. CBS will normally broadcast its SEC games in the late afternoon window beginning at 3:30 p.m. ET. CBS provides exclusive national network broadcasts of conference home games during the season. CBS will televise the SEC Football Championship Game, which will be on Dec. 1 at 4 p.m. ET.

ESPN/ESPN2, the SEC's national cable provider, may televise up to 18 regular season games each year, with a minimum of nine on ESPN through the season. ESPN GamePlan offers fans extra college football games and is available on television or online. Viewers can order ESPN GamePlan on ESPN.com (search "GamePlan"), or by contacting their cable or satellite Pay-Per-View provider.

LINCOLN FINANCIAL SPORTS (LFS) (Formerly **Jefferson-Pilot Sports**) will continue its highly successful SEC Football Game of the Week this season. The Charlotte, N.C. company, holds the rights to televise 13 games annually throughout the nine-state SEC region on a syndicated basis. The games will be broadcast in the early afternoon at 12:30 p.m. ET.

FOX Sports Net South (FSNS), FOX Sports Net Southwest (FSNSW) and SUN Sports (SUN) together form **SEC-TV**, the league's regional cable package. SEC-TV Weekly airs Thursday nights and Saturday mornings during the season, highlighting all of the SEC's athletic teams and events.

SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send eight of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2007 season. The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One (2nd), will then make its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The Outback, Chick-fil-A and AT&T Cotton Bowls will work with the conference office to determine picks 3-5. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference. The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the selection of preference following the Cotton and Outback Bowls.

In selections 6-7, the AutoZone Liberty and Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowls will make their selections, not in any specific order, but in consultation with the SEC Office. The Bowls will rank available qualified teams in order of preference. If there are no similarities in the order of selection, the bowls will be granted its selection. If the bowls rank the same teams in preference, the team involved in the process would get its preference of which bowl to participate.

The PetroSun Independence Bowl will receive the eighth selection of available SEC teams.

2008 BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCHEDULE

Following the 2007 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the FedEx Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose presented by Citi, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

FOX Sports will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games, with the exception of the Rose Bowl, which will be televised by ABC Sports.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

At the conclusion of the 2007 regular season, the Allstate BCS National Championship Game will be hosted in New Orleans on Jan. 7 at 8 p.m. EST. The Allstate BCS National Championship Game will have the top two teams ranked in the BCS final regular season standings.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

Other BCS games following the 2007 regular season include the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1 at 4:30 p.m. EST, Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. EST, Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. EST, and the Orange Bowl on Jan. 3 at 8 p.m. ET.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE TEAM NOTES



ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE

Despite a fourth quarter rally, Alabama fell short to Florida State 21-14 in the final minutes of the landmark game. In their first meeting since 1965, it was the Florida State Seminoles that had the lead when the clock expired in the River City Showdown in Jacksonville, Fla. Alabama was shutout for three quarters before two touchdown drives of 91 and 60 yards with just over five minutes to go in the fourth put the Tide on the board. John Parker Wilson connected on a 7-yard touchdown pass to DJ Hall at the 5:04 mark and hit senior Keith Brown with a 17-yard touchdown pass with 1:06 to go in the game. Wilson finished the night 28 of 53 for 240 with two touchdowns and set career highs in completions and attempts. Sophomore linebacker Prince Hall entered the game for the first time in the third quarter on FSU's second possession of the half and ended a Seminole scoring threat with an interception at Alabama's 7-yard line and returned it 10 yards. It marked the first of Hall's Alabama career. Sophomore punter P.J. Fitzgerald set a single-game personal high for punts with 10 for 369 yards, an average of 36.9 yards per attempt, including a career-high 58-yard punt at Vanderbilt on Sept. 8.

ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS

Arkansas scored on seven of its nine first half possessions as they cruised to a 66-7 victory over North Texas Saturday and snapped a two-game losing streak. The Razorbacks generated 713 yards of total offense, the second-highest, in school history. The 66 points scored is the sixth-highest in school history while the 446 rushing yards is the 10th highest. The 45 first-half points by the Hogs were the most first-half points in the 115-game tenure of the program. Darren McFadden moved up two positions on the SEC career rushing chart to No. 13 with 3,417 yards after he recorded his third-consecutive 100-yard rushing game with 138. He jumped past Kentucky's Moe Williams (3,333) and Auburn's Joe Cribbs (3,368) and is just three yards shy of 12th place. McFadden now has 657 yards rushing on the season and moved into second place in career rushing at Arkansas. Felix Jones rushed for 132 yards on seven carries and has now moved into sixth place at Arkansas with his 10th 100-yard rushing game of his career. He posted a 71-yard touchdown run in the second quarter, the fourth longest of his career. In addition, Jones had a career-high 48 receiving yards on three catches and two kickoff returns, which now makes him the SEC career leader in kickoff return average.



AUBURN TIGERS

Freshman kicker Wes Byrum kicked a 43-yard field goal as time expired to push Auburn over Florida 20-17, snapping an 11-game win streak for the Gators. Auburn has now won nine of its last 10 games against top 10 opponents in the AP Poll and has now won seven straight SEC road games. The win marked the first for the Tigers in Gainesville since 1994 and Auburn is now 9-23 at the Swamp. The home loss was the first under coach Urban Meyer for the Gators. Auburn led 14-0 at the half and held Florida without a first down in the first quarter. It marked the first time in nine games that Florida had been shut out in the first quarter. The Tigers were the first team to shut out Florida in the first half since the Gators trailed South Carolina 3-0 in 1992. Auburn led 17-3 after three quarters and is now 2-2 when leading after three quarters this season. Sen'Derrick Marks blocked a 34-yard field goal by Joey Ijas, the second blocked kick of the season for Marks. It was the first blocked kick by Florida since 2004. Jerraud Powers led the Tigers with seven tackles and was part of the defense that held Florida to just 14 first downs.



FLORIDA GATORS

On the final play of the game, Auburn kicker Wes Byrum kicked a 43-yard field goal to hand a 20-17 loss to Florida at home Saturday. The loss snapped an 11-game win streak for the Gators, the third longest in the nation, and an 18-game winning streak in The Swamp. Shutout in the first half, the Gators were held to 14 first downs and had to rally to get back into the game. Down 17-3 going into the fourth quarter, the Gators answered back as QB Tim Tebow led a 38-yard scoring drive and connected with a six-yard pass to tight end Cornelius Ingram to cut the lead to 17-10. Tebow then scored with a two-yard run to tie the game with 7:36 to go. With the run, he tied his own school record for rushing scores by a quarterback in a season with eight. Tebow finished the game 20-for-27 for 201 yards and one touchdown, marking his fifth straight 200-yard passing game. He also led the Gators with 75 yards rushing on 19 carries, his fourth straight 60-yard rushing game. Percy Harvin led the receiving corps with 119 yards on seven catches. It marked his fourth consecutive 100-yard receiving effort this season.



GEORGIA BULLDOGS

Georgia tailback Thomas Brown rushed for a career-high three touchdowns as the Bulldogs defeated the Ole Miss Rebels 45-17 and improved to 2-1 in the league. Brown totaled 180 yards, also a career high, on 16 carries. It marked the most rushing yards by a Bulldog since 2001 and it was Brown's sixth career 100-plus yards game. His 50-yard TD run was the second-longest of his career. As a team, the Bulldogs rushed for 328 yards on 45 carries, the most since 1992. The Bulldogs recorded a 96-yard drive in the first quarter, marking its longest since the 2004 season when UGA went 97-yards against UK in 2004. Georgia's defense continued to play solid as it entered the game allowing just 17.3 points a game and held the Rebels to 17 points. Ole Miss was only 2-for-4 in the Red Zone. Junior Dannell Ellerbe led Georgia with eight tackles while CJ Byrd and Asher Allen each had seven. Kicker Brandon Coutu was 6-for-6 on extra points and had an 18-yard field goal. Georgia also took advantage of a couple of Ole Miss mistakes as they recorded 14 points off of a fumble recovery at the 1-yard line and an interception. The interception was by linebacker Brandon Miller, the first of his career.



KENTUCKY WILDCATS

Quarterback Andre Woodson continued to shine for Kentucky as he threw for a career-high five touchdowns in the Wildcats 45-17 victory over Florida Atlantic. Woodson completed 26 of 33 for 301 yards, a season high, but his NCAA-record streak of consecutive passes without an interception was snapped at 325. With the win, UK is 5-0, its best start since 1984. Including last season, Kentucky has won 10 of its last 11 games, the best 11-game stretch since the 1997 team went 10-1. With 55 career TD passes, Woodson is now third on UK's career TD pass list. This marked his fifth career 300-yard game, the first on the season and he has thrown for at least 200 yards in 11 straight games. RB Rafael Little rushed for 112 yards on 20 carries to record his 11th 100-yard rushing game of his career and fourth on the season. For the ninth-straight game, UK totaled more than 400 yards of offense with 514. This marks only the second time this season the Wildcats have gone over the 500-yard mark. The Wildcats are also 23-of-24 in the red zone this season.



SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE TEAM NOTES

LSU TIGERS



For the first time since the 1959 season, LSU is ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll as the Tigers moved past Southern Cal following their 34-9 win over Tulane on Saturday. It's the first time since Nov. 7, 1959 that LSU has held the top spot in the AP Poll. This week, LSU picked up 33 first place votes, one more than Southern Cal, who struggled in its 27-24 win over Washington on Saturday night. LSU last reached the No. 1 spot in any college football poll during the 2003 season when the Tigers beat Oklahoma in the Sugar Bowl to claim the BCS National Championship. LSU finished the 2003 season ranked No. 1 in the nation in the USA Today Coaches Poll. ESPN's College GameDay will be on campus this weekend for the matchup between top-ranked LSU and seventh-ranked Florida. Earlier this year, ESPN's College GameDay was on site when the Tigers posted a 48-7 win over ninth-ranked Virginia Tech in Tiger Stadium. LSU and Florida square off at 7:28 p.m. on Saturday in a nationally televised contest on CBS. It will be LSU's first prime time regular season game on one of the big three non-cable networks since 1981.

SOUTH CAROLINA GAMECOCKS



Freshman Chris Smelley threw for a career-best 279 yards and two touchdowns to lead No. 16 South Carolina to a 38-21 victory over Mississippi State on Saturday. Smelley, who replaced fifth-year senior Blake Mitchell, connected with receiver Kenny McKinley on touchdown passes of 20 and 27 yards, the latter which put South Carolina ahead for good, 24-21, with 3:43 left in the third quarter. The Gamecocks' defense also looked strong without its best player in injured middle linebacker Jasper Brinkley. Brinkley, who damaged a knee ligament in last week's LSU defeat, had season-ending surgery this past Wednesday. The Gamecocks gave up only 45 rushing by halftime in stopping Mississippi State (3-2, 1-2), which came to Williams-Brice Stadium with a three-game winning streak. Mike Davis added two of his three rushing touchdowns (3, 2 and 12 yards) for South Carolina in the final quarter. Eric Norwood blocked a Mississippi State punt in the third quarter, South Carolina's second punt block of the season. Norwood also recorded a sack for a 16-yard loss on the final play of the game, his third sack of the season and 10th of his career.

OLE MISS REBELS



Ole Miss struck early and came within an inch of a two-touchdown lead in the first quarter but could not hold off the Georgia rushing attack in a 45-17 defeat to the 15th-ranked Bulldogs Saturday at Sanford Stadium. Rebel running back BenJarvus Green-Ellis registered his second 100-yard rushing game and sixth of his career with 108 on 22 carries with a touchdown. Mike Wallace caught a TD pass for the fourth straight game with his 45-yard grab in the first quarter, and Seth Adams completed 24-of-35 passes for 228 yards with one TD and one interception. WR Dexter McCluster saw his first action of the season and hauled in two passes for three yards. Georgia's 45 points and 268 rushing yards are the most surrendered by the Rebel defense this season. Junior DL Peria Jerry established career highs in total tackles with eight, solos with six and TFLs with 2.5. Redshirt freshman Kentrell Lockett was credited with his first career tackles and finished with five stops, including four solos. Ole Miss had its first true punt return of the year with Marshay Green's first quarter return for -2 yards.

TENNESSEE VOLUNTEERS



The Tennessee football schedule has its ups and downs, its SEC showdowns and non-conference tune-ups. Much to the delight of players and coaches, the schedule also includes a bye week. The 13-day stint without a game allowed the players time to visit four different Knoxville-area hospitals, and it also allowed them to have a weekend off. The focus of the bye week is not only improving and correcting the mistakes from the first four games, but also preparing for the weeks ahead. After playing three non-conference opponents in the first month of the season, Tennessee will see nothing but SEC foes in October. Those opponents currently have a combined record of 12-4, and three of them are ranked in this week's AP Top 25. The Vols entertain No. 15 Georgia on Oct. 6, travel to play a 3-1 Mississippi State team on Oct. 13, visit No. 22 Alabama on Oct. 20 and host No. 16 South Carolina on Oct. 27. The Vols' has their first junior varsity game in 15 years last Thursday night as Tennessee hosted Hargrave Military Academy at Neyland Stadium. Tennessee's junior varsity defeated Hargrave 37-20.

MISSISSIPPI STATE BULLDOGS



Despite taking a lead early in the second half, Mississippi State's upset bid at 16th-ranked South Carolina fell short Saturday as the Gamecocks used a blocked punt to change momentum and pull away for a 38-21 victory. It marked the fifth win in a row for USC in the series with MSU and broke a three-game State win streak. The Bulldog offensive production was once again led by Dixon, who amassed 83 yards and two touchdowns on the day. Ducre added 68 rushing yards for the MSU cause. Josh Riddell, in his first career start at quarterback for State, went 9-for-21 for 101 yards, a touchdown and one interception. Riddell tore his ACL late in the game and is out for the rest of the season. Gabe O'Neal and Anthony Johnson led the way defensively for State with seven tackles apiece. Titus Brown adds two more sacks to his SEC-leading total. Derek Pegues tallied the lone Bulldog interception of the afternoon. MSU now returns home to host UAB for homecoming next Saturday.

VANDERBILT COMMODORES



The three wins in the month of September marks the quickest Vanderbilt has reached three home wins in school history. With the win over EMU, the Commodores earned their third win at home for the first time since 1993. The third win also marks the first time since 1984 that VU has won three of its first four home games. The three wins in September also mark the first time VU has had three home wins in the same month since winning all three home games in the month of November in 1982. The 'Dores won all four games played during that month. Junior wide receiver Earl Bennett collected nine catches for 93 yards and one touchdown against Eastern Michigan. He now needs just 11 catches and 603 yards to become the SEC's all-time leader in career receptions and receiving yardage. Saturday's attendance of 37,220 moved Vanderbilt's season average to 35,847 through four home games. This season's average currently ranks as Vanderbilt's second highest mark in the last seven seasons. Vanderbilt averaged 36,031 in 2005.

THIS IS THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports - 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- The SEC's mission statement reflects the priorities of the league. "The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- During the last five years, the SEC has had more student-athletes honored as CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans than any other conference. The league has had 171 student-athletes named CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans, including 79 named to the first-team.
- During the last eleven years, the SEC has had 19 winners of the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which is given annually to eight outstanding senior student-athletes. Since 1997, no other conference has had as many student-athletes honored with this prestigious award. In 2006, Alabama track & field athlete Beth Mallory was named a recipient of this award.
- Florida's Chris Leak was named by the National Football Foundation as a National Scholar-Athlete. During the last five years, the SEC has had 11 student-athletes honored, the most of any conference. LSU's Rudy Niswanger won the Vincent dePaul Draddy Award given by the National Football Foundation in 2005 as the nation's top football scholar-athlete. Niswanger became the sixth SEC student-athlete to claim the "Academic Heisman" since the award was established in 1990.

FOR THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- The 12 member institutions of the SEC provide nearly \$65 million in scholarships for the more than 4,200 student-athletes each year.
- The SEC distributed nearly \$675,000 during the 2006-2007 academic year from the NCAA Special Assistance Fund for Student-Athletes. This program was implemented to provide financial aid to student-athletes with specific needs such as clothing and shoes, medical or vision care, academic course supplies and family emergencies.
- During the 2007-08 academic year, the SEC will distribute more than \$1 million to directly benefit student-athletes from the Student-Athlete Opportunity Fund.
- The SEC awards post-graduate scholarships totaling \$130,000 to 24 student-athletes each year. The top male and female nominee each receive the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award, named for the league's fourth commissioner, and a \$10,000 scholarship. Last year, 22 additional student-athletes (11 female and 11 male) received \$5,000 to continue their education. Alabama baseball player Emeel Salem and Vanderbilt track & field athlete Erika Schneble were named McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award winners in 2006-07.
- The SEC has established a Community Service Award to honor a male and female student-athlete with a \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding service in the community. Tennessee swimmer Brad Boswell and Florida softball player Stacey Stevens were named recipients of this award in 2006-07.

A LEADER IN WOMEN'S SPORTS

- The SEC has developed a "Principles for Gender Equity," which, calls for each league school to provide equitable funding for women's sports, promotions and marketing and other support services. The SEC currently conducts championships in 11 women's sports and nine men's sports.
- The SEC had four sport winners of the Collegiate Woman of the Year Award sponsored by Honda. Tennessee's Candace Parker won for women's basketball, Courtney Kupets of Georgia took top honors in gymnastics, Georgia's Kara Lynn Joyce won in Swimming & Diving and Tennessee's Monica Abbott was the top athlete in softball.
- Since 1987, SEC schools have won 66 NCAA women's national championships, an average of more than three per year in the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors. Nine of the 12 SEC institutions have won a national women's team championship since 1987.

COMPLIANCE AND EDUCATION

- The SEC Task Force Committee on Compliance and Enforcement has issued a report of recommendations that represents an important initial step in a formal process of establishing a new standard of compliance excellence within the Southeastern Conference. Among the recommendations included in this report was how institutions will handle reports of allegations, strengthening the relationship between the league's institutions and the conference office, developing new orientation programs and establishing an annual review of compliance issues.
- The SEC also conducts a New Coaches Orientation Program four times a year, which supplements institutional orientation programs and enhance the professional development of coaches. Topics of discussion range from the role of the SEC and NCAA to the role of athletics in higher education.

SPORTSMANSHIP

- The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states:
 "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

IN THE COMMUNITY

- The SEC launched its education initiative in 2002, utilizing the platform of intercollegiate athletics to provide elementary school teachers with relevant resources they can use to educate and prepare children for life. The SEC became the nation's first conference to develop customized educational software, providing a CD-ROM containing SEC-branded content correlating to national educational standards. Since the CD-ROM was produced, the SEC has initiated an online program for K-8 students on education content and character development.
- SECKids.com is a website uniquely designed for school-age students. Now fans of all ages can access exciting, interactive and educational information on the SEC and its universities. SECKids.com features exclusive behind-the-scenes access at championship events, profiles of student-athletes and coaches, along with games and video highlights. Teachers can also register online to utilize the SEC Kids's college software in their classroom. The SEC is the only conference in the country to develop a site of this kind.

OVERALL ATHLETICS SUCCESS

- Since 1990, the SEC has won 118 team and 805 individual national championships. Since that time, the SEC has had at least one team ranked in the top five nationally in 76.8 percent of the total sports win which the league has competed (268 of 349). Ten of the SEC's 12 schools have won at least one national championship since 1990.
- In the SEC's 20 sponsored sports since 2000, the SEC has won more team national championships than any other conference in the nation. The SEC won 50 team titles since 2000, while the Pac-10 won 45 and the Big 12 won 21. The SEC won team titles in 16 different sports since 2000, also the most of any conference.

THE COACHES

Rich Brooks is in his fifth season at Kentucky with a record of 21-30 (.412) and in his 23rd season overall with a record of 112-139-4 (.447). The Wildcats' offensive coordinator is Joker Phillips and the defensive coordinator is Steve Brown.

Steve Spurrier is in his third season at South Carolina with a record of 19-11 (.633) and in his 18th season overall with a record of 161-51-2 (.757). Spurrier serves as the offensive coordinator and the defensive coordinator is Tyrone Nix.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN KENTUCKY HAS THE BALL

Kentucky's offense ranks fifth in the nation and leads the SEC in scoring offense, averaging 46.6 points per game. UK has scored 40 or more points in five consecutive games for the first time in school history. UK is the first SEC school to accomplish that feat since Florida did it in 2001. Quarterback André Woodson threw a career-high five touchdown passes, finding four different receivers for scores in the win vs. FAU.

Casper Brinkley, has been impressive this season, logging 23 tackles. He has 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack while playing outside linebacker and defensive end after logging 7.0 sacks a year ago. Eric Norwood has recorded a team-leading 30 tackles this season, including 6.5 tackles for loss, sixth in the SEC. He has 3.0 sacks this season.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN SOUTH CAROLINA HAS THE BALL

Linebacker Wesley Woodyard leads the SEC and currently ranks 11th nationally in tackles, averaging 11.6 per game. He has a streak of 29 consecutive games with at least four tackles and also has 313 tackles in his career, becoming the first Wildcat since Marty Moore (1990-93) to reach 300 stops.

Redshirt freshman Chris Smelley got the starting nod last week against Mississippi State, his second start of the season, but the first time he has gone the distance. He celebrated his 21st birthday by completing 19-of-37 passes for a career-high 279 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. His performance has earned him another start this week against Kentucky. Kenny McKinley has 27 catches for 314 receiving yards with five of the team's eight touchdown receptions.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Punter Tim Masthay significantly helped the Wildcats in the battle for field position in the last two games. Against Arkansas he tallied seven punts for 302 yards (43.1 avg.) and pinned one kick inside the 20-yard line. In the Florida Atlantic game he punted only twice but both punts landed inside the 20-yard line. Arkansas started five of its possessions inside their own 25-yard line, which included a drive starting on the eight-yard line.

Ryan Succup is 6-for-8 in field goal attempts this season. He has been successful on six of his last seven tries with his only miss in that stretch a 50-yarder, after missing his first attempt (a 47-yarder) of the season. He is 22-for-30 in field goal attempts in his career. He has converted 16 of his last 19 attempts from inside 47. He is averaging 41.0 yards per punt this season after averaging 43.7 yards per punt in 2006, and is averaging 66.1 yards on his kickoffs.

Bobby Johnson is in his sixth season at Vanderbilt with a record of 18-44 (.290) and in his 14th season overall with a record of 78-80 (.494). The Commodores' offensive coordinator is Ted Cain and the defensive coordinator is Bruce Fowler.

Tommy Tuberville is in his ninth season at Auburn with a record of 73-31 (.702) and in his 13th season overall with a record of 98-51 (.658). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Al Borges and the defensive coordinator is Will Muschamp.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN VANDERBILT HAS THE BALL

WR Earl Bennett has 198 career receptions and is just 11 receptions shy of becoming the SEC's all-time leader, and three catches away from setting the school record. Bennett ranks fifth in the NCAA in receptions (9.3) and seventh in receiving yards (117.0) Vandy's offensive line features five seniors who were all starters last season.

Sen'Derrick Marks played a key role in the victory over Florida last Saturday, blocking a field goal for the second time this season and collecting two tackles for losses. Marks, who has 22 tackles including 4.5 for losses this season, accomplished a rare double the previous Saturday against New Mexico State, collecting an interception and a fumble recovery. Quentin Groves is the NCAA's leader among active players in career sacks with 25, although that claim is in jeopardy following a foot injury suffered against Florida that could keep him out of the lineup for an undetermined amount of time.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN AUBURN HAS THE BALL

The Commodores are ranked 11th nationally in pass defense (157.5) and 17th in both scoring defense (16.3) and total defense (279.0). Senior LB Jonathan Goff ranks third among all active SEC players in career tackles with 228. Vanderbilt tied a school record with seven sacks during a victory over Ole Miss.

Junior WR Rodgeriquis Smith has set career highs in receiving yards in each of the past two weeks, including 102 yards on a career-best nine catches last Saturday at Florida. Brandon Cox leads all active SEC quarterbacks with 21 career victories as a starter. RB Brad Lester will make his 2007 debut this weekend versus Vanderbilt. Auburn started three true freshmen on the offensive line each of the past two games.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Bryant Hahnfeldt is 7-10 on field goals and 13-13 on extra points to lead Vanderbilt in scoring. Brett Upson is averaging 35.9 yards per punt with a long of 51 yards. D.J. Moore is a dangerous returner, averaging over 27 yards per kickoff return.

Auburn's freshmen kickers have excelled, as Wes Bryum made the game-winning field goal at Florida and Ryan Shoemaker would lead the SEC averaging 46.3 yards per punt, but is one punt shy of the minimum needed to qualify. Byrum has made eight field goals in 10 attempts.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LOUISIANA TECH HAS THE BALL

Second-year starting QB Zac Champion has completed 74-of-138 passes for 584 yards, four TDs and two interceptions in his senior season. Junior RB Patrick Jackson is the leading rusher with 361 yards on 80 carries with three TDs, while sophomore Daniel Porter has 171 yards on 26 rushes with a pair of scores. Wide receivers Philip Beck and Joe Anderson have each hauled in 16 passes with 132 and 109 yards.

Ole Miss boasts two of the SEC's top four tacklers in junior DB Jamarca Sanford (third at 9.0 tpg) and junior LB Ashlee Palmer (fourth at 8.8 tpg). In addition, the duo share the team lead in pass breakups with four apiece. With a team-best 25 solos, Sanford also ranks second in the conference at 6.3 per game. Palmer has also posted 4.5 TFLs and an interception. He finished with 12 tackles in each of the first two games.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN OLE MISS HAS THE BALL

Defensively, Louisiana Tech is allowing 422.0 yards per game, including 286.5 through the air. The Bulldog defense returns 10 starters from last year, and the lone non-starter from 2006 is sophomore FS Antonio Baker, who tops the WAC in tackles with 51 total stops. Junior LB Quin Harris has 32 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 2.5 sacks and a team-high six pass break-ups. On the defensive line, D'Anthony Smith tops the club in TFLs with 4.5, and Chris Pugh has 3.5 sacks.

QB Seth Adams ranks fourth in the SEC in total offense (237.6 ypg), passing average (238.0 ypg) and passing efficiency (137.9). He has four 200-yard outings and the Rebels' first two 300-yard outings since 2004. WR Mike Wallace has hauled in a touchdown pass in four straight games and has five scores over that span. RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis registered his second 100-yard rushing game of the year and sixth of his career, finishing with 108 yards on 22 carries with a TD at Georgia.

Senior kicker Danny Horwedel is back to close his career as a four-year starter for the Bulldogs. Horwedel has connected on 3-of-5 FGs and 9-of-10 PATs. Punter Chris Keagle had another strong performance against Hawaii. He followed his WAC Player of the Week award by placing four of six punts inside the 20 and averaged 44.8 yards a kick. He had two punts over 50 yards at 52 and 54.

Sophomore K Joshua Shene tied his career high for field goals in a game against Florida, connecting on 3-of-4 from 40, 32 and 22 yards. Ole Miss had its first true punt return of the year at Georgia with Marshay Green's first quarter return for -2 yards. His two receiving touchdowns marked the first time a UAB receiver has caught multiple TD passes since 2005. QB/WR Webb presently has 16 receptions for 270 yards and two touchdowns to lead UAB. He is averaging 16.9 yards per reception. He also had a TD catch in the first two games of the season.

Senior defensive end Titus Brown, who has recorded 143 career tackles, including 31.5 for loss (minus 142 yards), 16.5 of which were sacks (minus 97 yards), had two quarterback sacks at South Carolina this past weekend to raise his season average to 1.2 per game, best in the SEC. Derek Pegues recorded his seventh career interception at South Carolina this past weekend. He has returned three of those for touchdowns, the most in school history.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN MISSISSIPPI STATE HAS THE BALL

Safety Will Dunbar is leading the country in tackles per game. Dunbar's average of 13.67 tackles per contest is tops nationally. He has recorded tackle totals of 17, 11 and 13 in three games of action. After two picks Saturday, Kevin Sanders has registered seven career interceptions and tied for team high last year in that category with three.

Anthony Dixon scored his fifth and sixth touchdown of the season, and now has 15 in his career. Christian Ducre set career bests with 15 attempts for 68 yards. His previous highs were 10 carries (twice) and 63 yards (at Auburn). Senior wide receiver Tony Burks' first-quarter 30-yard reception at USC was his third catch of 30 or more yards this season. Junior wideout Aubrey Bell's first-quarter 28-yard touchdown reception was the first score of his career.

SPECIAL TEAMS

PK Swayze Waters is the nation's leader in field goals made per game for the third week in a row as he was a perfect 3-for-3 in Saturday's game at Tulsa. Waters, who now has been successful on 12-of-13 field goals this season, also kicked his third field goal this season of 50 yards or more when he booted a 52-yarder.

Pegues has also been a threat in the return game, ranking third on the school's all-time kick return (67) and yardage (1,456) lists, and eighth all-time at the school in punt return yards (409). Junior punter Blake McAdams hit six punts for 274 yards, an average of 45.7 yards per kick. It was McAdams' highest single game average since he boomed six punts for 290 yards (48.3) against Alabama on November 5, 2005.

In 42 career games, Wallace Gilberry has 134 tackles, 33 tackles for loss and 11.5 sacks. He has also added four forced fumbles, three fumbles recovered and three pass breakups. In five games this season, Gilberry has 26 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one PBU. In five games this season, Simeon Castille leads UA with four pass breakups. He also fifth on the team with 25 tackles. In his four-year career, Castille leads all UA defenders with 138 tackles and 31 PBUs.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ALABAMA HAS THE BALL

Last week, Rocky Schwartz and Phillip Hunt led the defense with nine and eight tackles, respectively. Schwartz also forced a fumble. Brendan Pahulu finished the night with one-and-a-half sacks, two tackles for loss and an interception. Linebackers Trent Allen and Cody Lubojasky form one of the best LB duos in Conference USA.

Junior quarterback John Parker Wilson directs the Tide offense for the second straight year. He is 9-9 (.500) as the starting quarterback. In 23 career games, Wilson has completed 323 of 576 (.561) passes for 3,896 yards, with 25 touchdowns and 13 interceptions. DJ Hall is the school's all-time leader with 2,338 receiving yards. He leads the Bulldogs with 755 all-purpose yards (393 Rushing, 84 Receiving and 278 Kickoff Returns).

Senior free safety Jonathan Hefney has a chance to stand atop Tennessee's all-time list for starts by a position player, as he currently owns a streak of 40 consecutive starts. The school record is 49. Should the Vols play in the SEC Championship Game prior to a bowl appearance, Hefney would have a shot at 50 straight starts. Hefney has played in 41 career games.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL

Darius Dewberry has been the leading tackler for the Bulldogs in three games this season and he matched his career high with eight in the win over Ole Miss. Jeff Owens earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance in the win over WCU. He had a career-high five stops, two tackles for a loss and forced a fumble.

Senior quarterback Erik Ainge is on track to hold a prominent place on the SEC's all-time chart for career touchdown passes. Ainge needs just one passing touchdown to tie former LSU signal caller JaMarcus Russell for 20th place in SEC history with 52. Lucas Taylor has 24 catches for 382 yards and two touchdowns this season. He is ranked second in the SEC with 95.5 receiving yards per game and tied for second with six receptions per game.

Georgia's special teams features one of the nation's top place kickers in senior Brandon Coutu. For his career, Coutu is 43-for-54 in FGs including 5-for-10 from 50+ yards. Safety Chris Camacho led all defenders last week versus The Citadel, tying his career high with 13 tackles. Safety Jeff Phillips notched 12 tackles and 11 solos. Junior cornerback Brandon Golder recorded his first career interception, picking off a Duran Lawson pass in the second quarter, and recovered a fumble.

For the fourth time this season, and seventh time in their careers, Felix Jones and Darren McFadden both rushed for over 100 yards in a game last weekend. On seven carries, Jones ran for 132 yards on the ground while McFadden gained 138 yards on 19 carries. Each also picked up two touchdowns. McFadden now has 657 yards rushing this season to go along with six touchdowns. He now has 3,417 yards rushing for his 29-game career.

Urban Meyer is in his third season at Florida with a record of 26-5 (.839) and in his seventh season overall with a record of 65-13 (.833). The Gators' offensive coordinator is Dan Mullen and the defensive co-coordinators are Greg Mattison and Charlie Strong.

Les Miles is in his third season at LSU with a record of 26-4 (.867) and in his 7th season overall with a record of 54-25 (.684). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gary Crowton and the defensive coordinator is Bo Pelini.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN FLORIDA HAS THE BALL

Tim Tebow's passer rating of 185.4 is the third-highest in the nation. Tebow has completed 69.7 percent of his passes, which is the eighth-highest mark in the country and is the best in the SEC. Tebow has thrown eight passes for 40-or-more yards this season, which is already three higher than UF did all of last season. This season, Percy Harvin is first on the team with 629 all-purpose yards and is averaging 125.8 yards per game.

Defensively, LB Ali Highsmith leads the team with 33 tackles, including 3.5 for losses. DE Kirston Pittman has 26 tackles and a team-best 5.5 tackles for losses. LSU All-America DT Glenn Dorsey has 25 tackles, 4.5 TFLs and 3 sacks to his credit this year. As a unit, LSU's defense has recorded an SEC best 18 sacks to go with a league-high 10 interceptions.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LSU HAS THE BALL

This season, Brandon Spikes and Dustin Doe rank as Florida's leading tacklers with 46 and 32, respectively. Defensive end Derrick Harvey recorded a pair of sacks in Florida's last game against Auburn to bring his career total to 17. Over the last six games, Harvey has totaled eight sacks.

QB Matt Flynn, who is 4-0 as a starter, has thrown for 673 yards and 3 TDs with just 2 interceptions. LSU's running back-by-committee approach is averaging 223.4 yards per game, which ranks third in the SEC, is led by RB Jacob Hester, who has rushed for 327 yards and 4 scores. RB Keiland Williams is second on the team with 226 yards and 4 TDs, while RB Trindon Holliday has 147 yards and 1 TD. Five different running backs have scored TDs for the Tigers this year.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Throughout the first five games, Chas Henry has punted 17 times for an average of 36.9 yards. His long was 50 against Ole Miss and he has placed six inside the 20 this year. Joey Ijas is 28-of-28 on extra points through the first five outings and is four-of-six on field goals.

Patrick Fisher is the Tigers' starting punter, averaging 44.1 yards on 21 punts this season. His average ranks second in the SEC and 17th in the NCAA this year. He has pinned four of his punts inside the 20-yard line. PK Colt David ranks second in the SEC and is tied for seventh in the NCAA in scoring, averaging 11.0 points per game. He leads all Tiger scorers with 55 points this season, and for the year, he is a perfect 25-of-25 on extra points and is eight-of-10 on field goal attempts.
