### Tigers Play Final Exhibition Game

The LSU Tigers get their final tuneup for the 2007-08 season Tuesday night as LSU is now less than a week from opening the season on Nov. 12 against Southeastern Louisiana ... Tickets are available for \$5 at the LSU Athletic Ticket Office and online at www.LSU.sports.net ... The PMAC upper ticket office opens game night at 5:30 p.m.

\*In the first exhibition game (Nov. 1), LSU downed NAIA Belhaven (the alma mater of Coaches John Brady and John Treloar), 108-57 ... Tigers played a solid second half, outscoring the Blazers, 61-29, shooting 69.2 percent (27-of-39) in the final 20 minutes.

\*Tigers three-point shooting, expected to be an asset this year, didn't show in the first half as LSU was 0-of-9, but LSU was 3-of-9 in the second half, all from long-range shooter Marcus Thornton ... Freshman Anthony Randolph had 20 points and 15 rebounds, while one of the most impressive performances was from freshman backup point guard Bo Spencer with eight assists and no turnovers in 20 minutes.

\*LSU opens the season with two home games against Southeastern Louisiana (Nov. 12) and McNeese State (Nov. 14) before leaving on Nov. 15 for the EA Sports Maui Invitational Nov. 19-21 ... LSU takes on Oklahoma State in the first round in Maui ... The first two LSU games will be on CST; the Maui event on the ESPN networks.

# John Brady

Head Coach • 11th Year

When John Brady first put a team on the floor of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, his Tiger squad was undermanned, undersized and underdogs.

Teams hated to play the Tigers then because John Brady coached his team hard and they responded with several strong performances against the leagues top teams, but not many wins. The strong performances continued as the years went on, but now LSU was winning.

In 11 years as head coach at LSU, John Brady has coached the LSU team as only he knows how -- with heart and passion, and knowledge of the game that makes him one of the best at in-game decisions.

The LSU Tigers, in 2006, won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record and won the Western Division for the second straight year. LSU has won 31 SEC games the last three years, one of the best totals in the league over the last three years, and during that time period, LSU had a streak of 19 straight conference home wins that spanned portions of four seasons from 2004-07.

The SEC Championship in 2006 was Brady's second and the school's first outright championship in 21 years.

LSU has had six consecutive winning seasons under John Brady and only three times in the program history have there been longer consecutive years of winning.

Three times, John Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year and he has coached the SEC Freshman of the Year four times.

Brady's 184 wins are the third most wins by an LSU basketball coach and only two LSU basketball coaches have served longer tenures.

Brady's knowledge of the game and his belief in discipline and respon-

sibility for actions on and off the floor have made the program strong again, one that LSU fans are proud of.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hardwood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that athletic and academic pursuits of the players should be challenged to the fullest.

That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well.

Brady came to LSU after six highly successful seasons at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala. In his six-year tenure (1992-97), he turned the team into a consistent winner, posting a record of 89-77. In Brady's six years at Samford, the team had three first-team and five second team all-league selections.

Now at LSU, the numbers are beginning to work for Brady both on and off the floor. He has had 33 players earn Academic Honor Roll status at LSU, plus 18 players who have received their degrees from LSU.

The 53-year-old Brady is the father of two daughters (Brittany-17, Brooke-13) and is married to the former Misty Champagne.

In his first 10 seasons, Brady has taken the Tigers a long way, including to college basketball's pinnacle, the NCAA Final Four. The results are a program that is solid both athletically and academically. The top athletes in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers in the league.

He has re-established LSU back as a national factor in college basketball and the work is being done to keep LSU there for years to come.

Tasmin Mitchell had 18 points and Terry Martin 10 ... LSU had 28 assists and 15 turnovers with Bo Spencer coming off the bench to play 20 minutes with eight assists and no turnovers.

### About EA Sports

This will mark the eighth straight year the team of former college players have been one of the two exhibition contests at LSU, but this will be the first time it will be the second game of LSU's exhibition schedule.

LSU is 8-2 against the Maury Hanks team with the EA Sports All-Stars defeating LSU in 2002 (78-69) and 2003 (68-64) ... Last year, LSU was a 70-65 winner.

Center Dalron Johnson was a star at UNLV from 2000-02...Johnson averaged 17.4 points and 7.0 rebounds as a senior for the Rebels in 2001-02.

LSU's offense in the exhibition game used the passing assist to its advantage in the win over NAIA fore Belhaven ... The Tigers had 28 assists and nine of the 11 Tigers recorded at least one assist ... Bo Spencer led LSU with eight assists, Terry Martin had five and Marcus Thornton four ... The school record is 38 set against George Mason in a rapid-fire game back in 1994.
