**Reigning National Champion LSU Hosts FCS Power Appalachian State To Open 2008**

A pair of reigning national champions will square off on Saturday in Tiger Stadium when No. 6/7 LSU hosts Appalachian State at 10 a.m. The game was moved up six hours on Friday due to the threat of Hurricane Gustav on the state of Louisiana. The 10 a.m. start time is thought to be the earliest kickoff time from a game in Tiger Stadium in the modern era of LSU football. The game will be televised to a national audience by ESPN Classic. A year ago, LSU posted a 12-2 overall mark and claimed its second BCS National Championship in five years with a 38-24 win over Ohio State in the BCS title game. Appalachian State, who is ranked No. 1 in the preseason FCS polls, posted a 13-2 record a year ago on its way to claiming its third straight Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA) national title. It marks the first time in college football history that the reigning champion from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) will face the defending champion of the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in the season-opener the following year. LSU is 1-0 all-time against Appalachian State, having posted a 24-0 win over the Mountaineers in 2005. Les Miles begins his fourth season as head coach of the Tigers in 2008. Miles' 34-6 mark with the Tigers is the best three-year stretch in school history and his 34 wins since the start of the 2005 Pete Carroll (USC) for most in the nation during that span. The Tigers go into 2008 riding a string of three straight seasons with double-digit wins, also a first at the school. LSU returns 13 starters from last year's squad - 7 offense, 5 defense, 1 specialist. Among the returning starters for the Tigers include four offensive linemen in center **Brett Helms**, guards **Herman Johnson** and **Lyle Hitt** and left tackle **Ciron Black**. The Tigers also return three members of their defensive front, including preseason All-America Tyson Jackson and the defensive MVP of the BCS title game in **Ricky Jean-Francois**. **Colt David** returns as LSU's placekicker after setting an SEC record with 147 total points a year ago. RBs **Keiland Williams** (478 yards, 6 TDs) and **Trindon Holliday** (364 yards, 2 TDs) return as LSU's top two ground gainers from a year ago, while **Brandon LaFell** (50 rec., 656 yards, 4 TDs) and **Demetrius Byrd** (35 rec., 621 yards, 7 TDs) are the top two receivers back from 2008. **Andrew Hatch** is the only quarterback on the roster with any game experience as he played in one contest (Middle Tennessee) a year ago. Hatch, along with redshirt freshman **Jarrett Lee**, are both expected to play against Appalachian State.

**LSU Becomes First Two-Time BCS National Champion In 2007**

LSU became college football's first two-time BCS National Champion in 2007 as the Tigers capped a 12-2 season with a 38-24 win over Ohio State in the BCS title game. The win over the Buckeyes put an end to a season that saw the Tigers spend four weeks during the regular season as the nation's top-ranked team. LSU's only two losses in 2007 came in triple-overtime, falling to Kentucky, 43-37, and then to Arkansas, 50-48, in the regular-season finale. A week after its setback to Arkansas, LSU regrouped to post a 21-14 win over Tennessee in the SEC title game even though the Tigers' starting quarterback (Matt Flynn) missed the game with a shoulder injury. The win over Tennessee, coupled with losses by Missouri and West Virginia that night, sent the Tigers to No. 2 in the BCS standings and thus a spot in BCS title game opposite Ohio State. In 2007, LSU recorded a school-record seven wins over top 25 teams, including three victories over opponents ranked in the top 10.

# Les Miles

## HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

It has been said that LSU is in the midst of the Golden Era of football at the school and head coach Les Miles has been the driving force behind the Tigers' dominance at the national level for the past three years.

Since taking over as head coach at LSU in January of 2005, Miles has guided the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Title and to three straight top five rankings, a first at the school. Miles' record with the Tigers is an astonishing 34-6, which marks the best three-year stretch in the history of the program.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 11 wins for the past three years, the Tigers have had 51 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 51 earning their college diploma. Of the 25 seniors on the 2007 national championship team, 15 have already earned their college degree with the remainder of the class on pace to graduate within the next year.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 19 NFL Draft picks over the past three years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history winning four national awards - the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies - as well as being the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American.

Now, with the Tigers becoming first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for LSU football is more stable than ever. After 34 wins, including 14 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, Miles and the Tigers have solidified their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

### The LSU Years

Les Miles' first three years with the Tigers have been unmatched in the history of the program. One would be hard pressed to find a better three-year stretch in major college football. The results are impressive and staggering: 34 wins, 20 SEC victories, 14 wins over top 25 teams, eight wins over top 10 teams, three bowl victories, including a win over Ohio State in last year's BCS National Championship Game, an SEC title and three straight top five final rankings.

Miles' 34 victories is the most of any coach during a three-year span in the history of the school and his 19 SEC regular season wins rank as the best among any Tiger coach in their first three seasons with the program. His 34 wins since taking over at LSU in 2005 also ties with Pete Carroll as the most by any head coach in college football during that three-year span.

After two of the most successful seasons in school history in 2005 and 2006, Miles again led the Tigers to a season of firsts in 2007. LSU became the first school in the Bowl Championship Series era to claim a second BCS National Title with its 38-24 win over Ohio State. LSU's first BCS title came in 2003 when the Tigers beat Oklahoma, 21-14.

With a 12-2 final record in 2007, the Tigers became the first team in school history to win at least 10 games in three straight years. The 2007 Tigers also set the school record for wins over Top 25 teams (7), won the SEC Championship with a backup quarterback and were ranked No. 1 in the BCS Standings during the regular season for the first time in school history. LSU finished the year ranked No. 1 in the nation in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the AP Poll.

After leading LSU to an 11-2 mark and a top five national ranking in his first year as LSU's head coach in 2005, many wondered just what Miles would do for an encore. His second year with the Tigers proved to be another year full of milestones and firsts as he guided the Tigers to another 11-2 overall record, culminating with a 41-14 dismantling of 11th-ranked Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

The Tigers finished their second year under the direction of Miles ranked No. 3 in the nation, marking the first time since the 1958-59 seasons that LSU was ranked in the top five in the country in back-to-back years.

LSU's at-large berth in a BCS bowl was a first in school history and it also represented the third time this decade that the Tigers ended their season in the Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, Miles became the first coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to back-to-back 10-wins seasons, something that he added to with another 10-plus win season in 2007.

He became the first LSU coach since Jerry Stovall in 1982 to beat two top 10-ranked teams on the road in the same season as the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee in Knoxville followed by a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock.

### The Oklahoma State Years

As head coach at Oklahoma State, he built a consistent winner out of a program that had recorded only one winning season since 1988, and had posted a record of 13-20 in the three years prior to his arrival at OSU. After going 4-7 in his first year as head coach in 2001, he took the Cowboys to consecutive winning marks of 8-5 in 2002, 9-4 in 2003 and 7-5 in 2004.

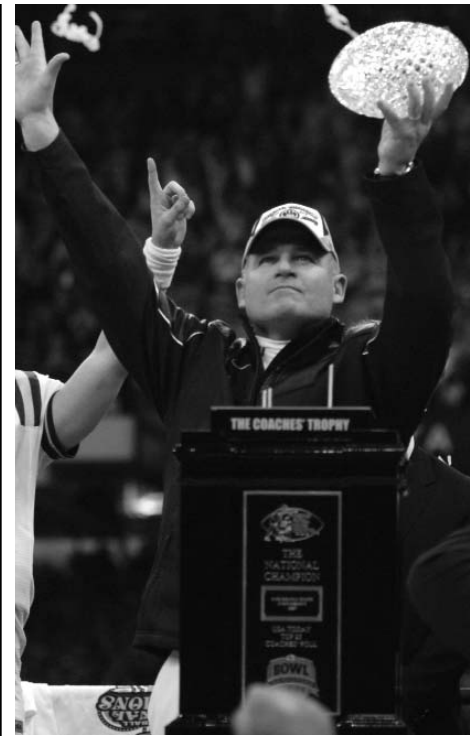
Miles led Oklahoma State to a four-year record of 28-21 for a winning percentage of 57.1, the best career winning percentage for an OSU coach since Jim Lookabaugh ended his career in Stillwater in 1949.

In 2004, Miles took Oklahoma State as high as No. 15 in the country with five wins to open the season. The 2004 season included road wins at UCLA, Colorado and Missouri, and the Cowboys never lost to a team outside of the top 25. In addition, his 2004 Cowboys ranked 12th in the nation in rushing, averaging 237 yards per game, and Oklahoma State was among the national leaders in scoring offense with 32.3 points a contest.

## LSU Hosts FCS Power Appalachian State To Open 2008 Season

Reigning BCS national champion LSU hosts defending Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA) national champion Appalachian State on Saturday at 10 a.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience by ESPN Classic. LSU is coming off a 12-2 record a year ago, while Appalachian State posted a 13-2 mark, which included winning its last eight games. The contest will mark the second meeting between the teams with LSU winning the first meeting, 24-0, in 2005.

## LSU To Face A No. 1 Ranked Team For Second Straight Time

LSU will face a top-ranked team for the second straight time when No. 1-ranked Appalachian State rolls into town on Saturday. Last year, the Tigers closed their season with a 38-24 win over No. 1-ranked Ohio State in the BCS title game. Appalachian State is ranked No. 1 in the Football Championship Subdivision preseason polls. It's also the second time that the Tigers will play a team ranked No. 1 in the FCS (formerly I-AA) polls. The other time came in 2003 when the Tigers posted a 35-7 win over then-No. 1 ranked Western Illinois on Sept. 13 in Tiger Stadium.

## LSU vs. The Football Championship Subdivision (Formerly I-AA)

Saturday's game against Appalachian State marks the fifth time that LSU will face a team from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). LSU is 4-0 all-time against FCS teams, which includes a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season; a 35-10 win over The Citadel on Sept. 7, 2002; a 35-7 victory over Western Illinois, on Sept. 13, 2003; and a 24-0 win over Appalachian State on Nov. 5, 2005.

## LSU Ranked In Top 10 To Start Season For Fifth Straight Year

When LSU kicks off the 2008 season on Saturday against Appalachian State, they will do so ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation. LSU is ranked No. 6 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll and No. 7 in the Associated Press Top 25. It marks the fifth straight year that the Tigers enter week 1 of the regular season ranked in the top 10. LSU has been ranked in the preseason top 10 since the 2004 season.

## LSU In Season-Openers

LSU brings an 81-28-5 overall mark in season-openers into the Appalachian State game. The Tigers have won five straight and 11 of their last 12 season-openers. LSU's only season-opening loss over the past 12 years came at Virginia Tech by a 26-8 count in 2002. Last year, the Tigers rolled to a 45-0 win over Mississippi State in Starkville to open the season.

## Miles In Season Openers

LSU coach Les Miles is 4-3 in season openers in his seven previous years as a head coach. Miles is 3-0 in season openers at LSU, beating Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe in 2005 followed by a 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in 2006 and the 45-0 victory over Mississippi State last year.

## LSU On ESPN To Open Season For Fourth Time In Five Years

LSU's game against Appalachian State will mark the fourth time in five years that the Tigers will start their season on ESPN. The only time in the last five years that the Tigers weren't on national television came in 2006 when LSU beat UL-Lafayette, 45-3, to start the season. LSU beat Oregon State, 22-21, to open 2004; beat Arizona State in Tempe, 35-31 to start 2005; and beat Mississippi State, 45-0, in Starkville to start last year.

## LSU's Won 11 Straight Overall On ESPN Family Of Networks; Streak At 12 On ESPN

LSU brings an 11-game winning streak on the ESPN family of networks into the Appalachian State game. The 11-game streak goes back to the 2005 season when Tennessee rallied for a 30-27 overtime win over the Tigers on a Monday night in a game televised by ESPN2. Since then, the Tigers have reeled off 11 straight victories on the all sports network. Breaking down the 11-game streak has the Tigers winning six straight on ESPN and five in a row on ESPN2. In ESPN only games, the Tigers have won 12 straight, a streak that dates back to the 2002 season.

## Another August 30 Start - Could It Be A Sign Of Things To Come?

For the third time in school history, LSU will open a football season on Aug. 30 when the Tigers face Appalachian State on Saturday. The other two years in which the Tigers opened a season on Aug. 30 came in 2003 and 2007, both years that LSU went on to win the BCS National Championship. LSU is 2-0 in games played on Aug. 30, beating Louisiana-Monroe, 49-7, in 2003 and then Mississippi State, 45-0, in 2007. The Appalachian State game is only the second time in program history LSU has opened the season on the same date in consecutive seasons. The Tigers opened on Sept. 1 in 2001 and the following year in 2002.

## LSU Ranked In Every Coaches And AP Poll Since Start of 2003 Season

With its preseason ranking of No. 6 in the coaches poll and No. 7 in the AP Poll, the Tigers extended their streak of consecutive weeks in the top 25. LSU has been ranked for 84 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll and for 83 straight weeks in the AP Poll. The last time LSU failed to make the top 25 in either poll came following the Tigers loss to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl to conclude the 2002 season. LSU's current streak of consecutive weeks in both polls is a school record.

## LSU's Won 27 Straight Saturday Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU's school-record streak of 19 consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium may have been snapped in the home-finale last year against Arkansas, but the Tigers have another home streak intact going into 2008. LSU has won 27 straight Saturday games played in Tiger Stadium, a streak that goes all the way back to 2003. The last time LSU lost a game played on a Saturday in Tiger Stadium came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU's only two home losses have come against Tennessee in 2005 and Arkansas in 2007. Tennessee beat LSU, 30-27, in overtime on a Monday night, while the Arkansas victory came in triple-overtime on a Friday afternoon.

## LSU's Won 29 Of Last 31 Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU goes into the Appalachian State game having won 29 of its last 31 games in Tiger Stadium. LSU stretched its home winning streak to a school-record 19 games last year before Arkansas, posted a 50-48 triple-overtime win over the Tigers in the home finale in 2007. LSU is 19-2 under Les Miles in Tiger Stadium.

## LSU's Won 14 Straight Non-Conference Games

Dating back to the end of the 2004 season, LSU has won 14 straight games against non-conference teams. All 14 wins have come under current head coach Les Miles, who has a 14-0 mark in non-conference games at LSU. LSU's last non-conference loss came to Iowa by a 30-25 count in the 2005 Capital One Bowl (which capped the 2004 season). The last time LSU lost to a non-SEC foe in Tiger Stadium came during the 2000 season when UAB upset the Tigers, 13-10.

## LSU Hasn't Been Kind To Non-SEC Foes; Tigers Have Outscored Them 499 to 113 Under Miles

LSU coach Les Miles is 14-0 in non-conference games with the Tigers and in those 14 contests, only four teams - Arizona State, Notre Dame, Louisiana Tech, and Ohio State - have reached double-figures in points against LSU. In five non-conference games in 2007, LSU outscored its opponents 222 to 50 in going 5-0 against Virginia Tech, Middle Tennessee, Tulane, Louisiana Tech and Ohio State.

## Home Sweet Home

LSU will open the season with three straight home games for the 12th time in modern college football history (since 1936) but only the first time this decade. The 11 other years the Tigers played three consecutive games in Tiger Stadium to open a season were: 1940-43-43-49-59-70-72-73-76-80-99.

## Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

Here are some notable trends for LSU in the 40 games its played under head coach Les Miles ... The Tigers are 31-2 when rushing for 100 yards or more ... The Tigers are 24-2 when leading after the first quarter with the only losses during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005 and Arkansas last week ... LSU is 31-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 27-3 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 23-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing.

## LSU's 56 Wins Since 2003 Ranks No. 2 Nationally

Since the start of the 2003 season, LSU has won 56 games, which ranks as the second-highest total nationally during that span. Southern Cal is first with 59 wins, followed by LSU and Boise State with 56 each. The following is a look at the schools with the most wins since the start of the 2003 season:

## LSU To Have A First-Time Starter In Season Opener For First Time Since 2002

LSU will have a first-time starter at quarterback for a season-opener for the first time since the 2002 season when the Tigers face Appalachian State. LSU's three quarterbacks - Andrew Hatch, Jarrett Lee, and Jordan Jefferson - have never started a collegiate game. The last time LSU had a first-time starter for a season-opener came in 2002 when Matt Mauck started for the first time in the loss to Virginia Tech. A year ago, Matt Flynn entered the 2007 season with no regular season starts, however he did have one start under his belt, that coming in a 40-3 win over Miami in the 2005 Peach Bowl. ## An Experienced Offensive Line

LSU boasts six players who have combined for 96 career starts on the offensive line. The Tigers lost only one starter from their offensive line of a year ago - **Carnell Stewart**. Senior **Brett Helms** leads the way with 28 career starts - 26 of those from under center. Junior **Ciron Black** has started at left tackle in all 27 career games he has played in. Senior **Ryan Miller** has two starts, senior **Herman Johnson** has 25 starts and junior **Lyle Hitt** owns 13 starts. **Andrew Whitworth** (2002-05) holds the LSU record for career starts with 52.

## LSU Athletics in the Aftermath of Katrina

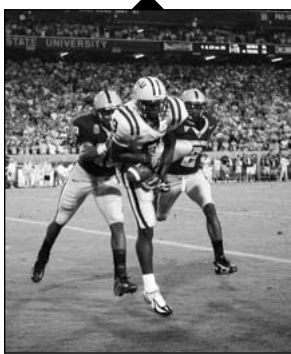

## LSU to the Rescue

**S**PORTS? No, sports had absolutely nothing to do with the Gulf Coast's trying to survive Hurricane Katrina.

Except that while the fifth-ranked LSU football team practiced in Baton Rouge, about 80 miles north-west of New Orleans, the coaches were huddling above the drone of helicopters, 20 in all, dropping off evacuees.

Except the infield of the outdoor track was being used as a helipad 24 hours a day.

Except that the basketball arena, Pete Maravich Assembly Center, had been turned into a two-hooped hospital. Triage was where the hand plays during games. Dialysis was where the scorekeepers sit. And pediatrics was where students usually wait. People still lined up outside to get in, though. It's just that they were all on stretchers.

No, sports weren't as all involved, except that the field house next door was a patient ward. And the baseball stadium was an emergency processing center.

Katrina chaos was everywhere. In the LSU sports information office, student assistant Bill Martin couldn't sleep after volunteering at the Maravich Center, so he decided to urge his friends to help out by e-mailing them about what he'd seen.

Blackhead helicopters were carrying in victims who'd been stranded on roofs. Buses rolled in from New Orleans. ... A lady fell out of a wheelchair and we scrambled to help her up. ... A man from New Orleans was badly injured on his head. Five minutes later he was dead. Mothers were giving birth in the locker rooms. ... A man was rolled in on a stretcher suffering from jaundice. A paramedic said a later medical bill would be for wouldn't give it to him. ... The auxiliary gym was being used as a morgue. I couldn't take myself down there to see it.

Martin's friends should have heard the story of his colleague Jason Freeman. He was stranded on I-10, near the police road block 20 minutes outside New Orleans, when a displaced and distraught woman snatched and walked straight into traffic. Freeman jumped out of his car, sprinted down the highway, grabbed the woman and dragged her to the shoulder.

It was a week agoes will forget, much as they would like to. The Tigers' starting quarterback, sophomore JaMarcus Russell, had

a kit on his mind too—the team's game kit Saturday night against Arizona State and the 22 displaced people in his three-bedroom apartment. The guy sleeping on his cousin's Fats Domino.

Domino, the 188 lbs who'd been listed in the papers as missing for two days, in the grounds of Russell's girlfriend's childhood home. After the house gave way in New Orleans, Domino was trapped on the second floor of his house. He was rescued by boat and taken to the makeshift hospital at the Maravich Center. Russell happened to be volunteering there that night—as so many LSU athletes were—hugged into Domino and took him home.

Since then the quarterback has been attending to the people in his apartment. "I've been staying up real late getting medicine and stuff," a bleary-eyed Russell said. "Plus, I couldn't eat after what I saw [at the Maravich Center]."

The LSU equipment manager, Greg Strimling, was up to his clipboard in everything but football. "The Mississippi Vikings just called," he said, starting at his blackberry during Saturday's practice. "They're sending two semi full of supplies." A Detroit Lions fan named Vince Sunday was sending 25. Out in the parking lot LSU athletes had already filled up one tractor-trailer with stuff they had donated or collected on their own.

Everybody in the athletic department was in chis-deep. Driving to campus, the football team's trainer, Jack Marocco heard a plea from the house-hungry over the radio. "You know, game and 2000 extra were desperately needed. Hey, Marocco said to himself, I have all that. Fifteen minutes later, he delivered them.

No, no, sports had nothing to do with the Gulf Coast's surviving Katrina, except everything. And that's because you always forget what sports can provide—can do stuff, fit and focused athletes, and huge, versatile arenas—in times of trouble.

Inside the field house—hospital, half the patients were LSU purple and gold because so many students had donated clothing. As I gazed out at that sea of beds, I thought it looked as if the springs booster club was fresh from a train pillop.

"I never used to root for LSU's match," said one purple-shaded diabetic, who'd been rescued by boat from the flooded charity hospital in New Orleans. "But after this, I guess we're all fans."

It is determined that the game will be moved to Monday, September 26

Prior to the traditional pregame performance of the Tiger Marching Band, public address announcer Dan Borne reads the following:

*"For more than a hundred years, LSU Football has brought together people from every walk of life, from every corner of Louisiana and from many areas of our great Gulf Coast. Tonight – here in Tiger Stadium – is one of the most significant gatherings of Louisianians in the history of our great state. This evening, we reflect on the loss of life and the devastation we have suffered. But we also look with pride to our future, for it is through our prayerful determination and our perseverance that we will rebuild and we will prosper again. Tonight, this historic stadium is lit in Gold and stands as a beacon of promise for our state and for its people. Because on this evening we vow to move forward under a common flag – because this is LSU Football... and this is Tiger Stadium... and THIS IS LOUISIANA!"*

### Notables

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 84th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 77th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 19 of its last 20 games at home. Only one time since 2000 have the Tigers lost more than one home game, that coming in 2001 when LSU dropped a pair of contests in Tiger Stadium.
- More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 54 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 44 times, including a school-record 92,910 for the Oct. 6, 2007 game that pitted No. 1 LSU against No. 9 Florida. LSU won the game, 28-24.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 44 of the past 51 seasons. The Tigers have drawn 24,134,535 fans since 1957.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 207-59-3 (.779) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 20-23-3 (.467) at home during the day in that span.
- Death Valley is the sixth largest on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

## Tigers Methodical in 24-0 Win Over Appalachian State

It wasn't flashy, but it was effective as LSU used a balance offense combined with a stingy defense to shutout I-AA Appalachian State, 24-0, in the annual Homecoming contest. LSU never trailed in the game as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and drove 72 yards on nine plays, capped on a 9-yard pass from **JaMarcus Russell** to **Dwayne Bowe**. LSU extended the lead to 14-0 with a 1-yard TD run by **Justin Vincent** early in the second quarter. The score remained that way until early in the fourth quarter when Russell hit tight end **Keith Zinger** for a 9-yard TD. **Chris Jackson** completed the scoring for the Tigers with a 34-yard field goal midway through the fourth quarter. In all, LSU accounted for 371 yards of offense, 163 on the ground and 208 through the air. Vincent led the Tigers with a season-high 89 yards rushing and 1 TD, while Russell connected on 16 of 22 passes for 208 yards and 2 TDs. Bowe led all receivers with 5 catches for 76 yards and score. Defensively, LSU held ASU to 256 yards of offense and only 14 first downs. The Mountaineers crossed midfield only twice during the game as seven of their 10 possessions ended with a punt. **Melvin Oliver** led the Tigers with 8 tackles and 1 sack.
