**LSU Gets Final Test Against North Texas Before Starting League Play**

LSU will get its final test before opening Southeastern Conference play in two weeks when the seventh-ranked Tigers host North Texas tonight at 7 o'clock in Tiger Stadium. LSU was forced to take a bye week last Saturday when Hurricane Gustav devastated Baton Rouge and surrounding communities postponing the Tigers' game against Troy, which was scheduled for Sept. 6, until Nov. 15. As a result, LSU goes into tonight's game with the Mean Green with a 1-0 record and having not played a contest since the season-opener on Aug. 30. LSU opened its season with a 41-13 win over Appalachian State. North Texas is 0-2 following losses to Kansas State and Tulsa. LSU brings a 15-game winning streak against non-conference foes into the North Texas game. LSU hasn't lost a non-conference game since a 30-28 setback to Iowa in the 2005 Capital One Bowl. LSU coach Les Miles is 15-0 against non-conference teams during his four years with the Tigers. LSU is 3-0 all-time against North Texas with the most recent game between the teams coming in 2005 when the Tigers posted a 56-3 win over the Mean Green in Tiger Stadium. LSU goes into the North Texas game with an offense that is averaging 459 yards per game (266 rushing, 193 passing) and 41 points per contest. Defensively, LSU is allowing 239 yards (52 rushing, 187 passing) and 13 points per game. RB Charles Scott currently leads the SEC in both rushing yards per game (160.0) and total offense (174.0). Scott opened the season by rushing for 160 yards and a pair of TDs in the 41-13 win over Appalachian State. LSU QBs Andrew Hatch and Jarrett Lee combined to complete 13 of 24 passes for 193 yards and 3 scores in the season-opener with WR Brandon LaFell leading the team in receptions with 4 for 87 yards and a pair of scores. WR Demetrius Byrd caught the other TD pass for the Tigers. Defensively, S Danny McCray recorded a team-best 7 tackles in the opener, while DE Rahim Alem led the Tigers with a pair of tackles for losses and one sack.

**LSU Has Little Trouble In 41-13 Win Over Appalachian State To Open 2008**

Charles Scott rushed for 160 yards and a pair of TDs and LSU QBs Andrew Hatch and Jarrett Lee combined to complete 13 of 24 passes for 193 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 41-13 win over Appalachian State to open the 2008 season. The game, which was originally scheduled for a 4 p.m. start, was moved to a 10 a.m. kickoff due to Hurricane Gustav. The move had little effect on the Tigers as LSU's first play from scrimmage in 2008 had Scott rushing for a 56-yard gain. A play later, Scott scored from eight yards out giving the Tigers a 7-0 lead. The Tigers scored on their next two possessions, stretching the lead to 17-0 early in the second quarter. LSU extended the lead to 31-0 at halftime after scores by Brandon LaFell - a 31-yard pass from Lee - and Scott - a 29-yard run. Appalachian State scored its only TD on a 44-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter with the game's outcome already decided. For the game, the Tigers rolled up 459 yards of total offense, compared to just 239 yards for Appalachian State. The Tiger defense held Appalachian State QB Armani Edwards, a possible Heisman Trophy candidate, to just 23 rushing yards and only 13 of 31 on passing attempts. Danny McCray led the Tigers with 7 tackles, while DE Rahim Alem added two tackles for losses and a sack in the victory.

# Les Miles

## HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

It has been said that LSU is in the midst of the Golden Era of football at the school and head coach Les Miles has been the driving force behind the Tigers' dominance at the national level for the past three years.

Since taking over as head coach at LSU in January of 2005, Miles has guided the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Title and to three straight top five rankings, a first at the school. Miles' record with the Tigers is an astonishing 34-6, which marks the best three-year stretch in the history of the program.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 11 wins for the past three years, the Tigers have had 51 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 51 earning their college diploma. Of the 25 seniors on the 2007 national championship team, 15 have already earned their college degree with the remainder of the class on pace to graduate within the next year.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 19 NFL Draft picks over the past three years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history winning four national awards - the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies - as well as being the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American.

Now, with the Tigers becoming first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for LSU football is more stable than ever. After 34 wins, including 14 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, Miles and the Tigers have solidified their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

### The LSU Years

Les Miles' first three years with the Tigers have been unmatched in the history of the program. One would be hard pressed to find a better three-year stretch in major college football. The results are impressive and staggering: 34 wins, 20 SEC victories, 14 wins over top 25 teams, eight wins over top 10 teams, three bowl victories, including a win over Ohio State in last year's BCS National Championship Game, an SEC title and three straight top five final rankings.

Miles' 34 victories is the most of any coach during a three-year span in the history of the school and his 19 SEC regular season wins rank as the best among any Tiger coach in their first three seasons with the program. His 34 wins since taking over at LSU in 2005 also ties with Pete Carroll as the most by any head coach in college football during that three-year span.

After two of the most successful seasons in school history in 2005 and 2006, Miles again led the Tigers to a season of firsts in 2007. LSU became the first school in the Bowl Championship Series era to claim a second BCS National Title with its 38-24 win over Ohio State. LSU's first BCS title came in 2003 when the Tigers beat Oklahoma, 21-14.

With a 12-2 final record in 2007, the Tigers became the first team in school history to win at least 10 games in three straight years. The 2007 Tigers also set the school record for wins over Top 25 teams (7), won the SEC Championship with a backup quarterback and were ranked No. 1 in the BCS Standings during the regular season for the first time in school history. LSU finished the year ranked No. 1 in the nation in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the AP Poll.

After leading LSU to an 11-2 mark and a top five national ranking in his first year as LSU's head coach in 2005, many wondered just what Miles would do for an encore. His second year with the Tigers proved to be another year full of milestones and firsts as he guided the Tigers to another 11-2 overall record, culminating with a 41-14 dismantling of 11th-ranked Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

The Tigers finished their second year under the direction of Miles ranked No. 3 in the nation, marking the first time since the 1958-59 seasons that LSU was ranked in the top five in the country in back-to-back years.

LSU's at-large berth in a BCS bowl was a first in school history and it also represented the third time this decade that the Tigers ended their season in the Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, Miles became the first coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to back-to-back 10-wins seasons, something that he added to with another 10-plus win season in 2007.

He became the first LSU coach since Jerry Stovall in 1982 to beat two top 10-ranked teams on the road in the same season as the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee in Knoxville followed by a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock.

### The Oklahoma State Years

As head coach at Oklahoma State, he built a consistent winner out of a program that had recorded only one winning season since 1988, and had posted a record of 13-20 in the three years prior to his arrival at OSU. After going 4-7 in his first year as head coach in 2001, he took the Cowboys to consecutive winning marks of 8-5 in 2002, 9-4 in 2003 and 7-5 in 2004.

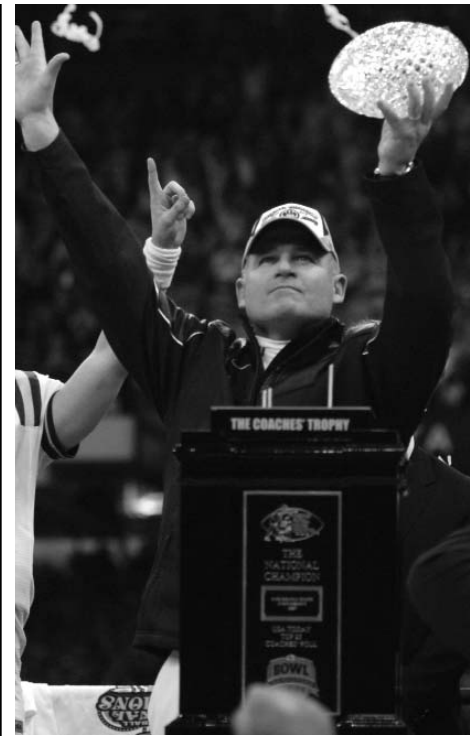
Miles led Oklahoma State to a four-year record of 28-21 for a winning percentage of 57.1, the best career winning percentage for an OSU coach since Jim Lookabaugh ended his career in Stillwater in 1949.

In 2004, Miles took Oklahoma State as high as No. 15 in the country with five wins to open the season. The 2004 season included road wins at UCLA, Colorado and Missouri, and the Cowboys never lost to a team outside of the top 25. In addition, his 2004 Cowboys ranked 12th in the nation in rushing, averaging 237 yards per game, and Oklahoma State was among the national leaders in scoring offense with 32.3 points a contest.

## LSU Looks To Get Back Into Routine Against North Texas

After an unexpected open date last Saturday, LSU will look to get back into a routine this week as the seventh-ranked Tigers host North Texas tonight at 7 in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on TigerVision, LSU's in-house pay-per-view network. LSU brings a 1-0 mark into the North Texas contest after opening the season on Aug. 30 with a 41-13 win over Appalachian State. North Texas, under second-year coach Todd Dodge, is 0-2 following its 56-26 loss to Tulsa last week.

## LSU Schedule Disrupted Again By A Hurricane

LSU's game against Troy last week was postponed due to Hurricane Gustav, marking the fifth contest for the Tigers in the last four years that was disrupted due to a hurricane. Instead of playing Troy last Saturday, the Tigers were forced to have an open date and will play the Trojans on Nov. 15 in Tiger Stadium. It's was no secret that LSU was in talks with the Louisiana Superdome, Texas Stadium, Independence Stadium and the Georgia Dome as a backup plan in the event that current Hurricane Ike became a severe threat to Louisiana. In the event that Hurricane Ike threatened the coast of Louisiana and puts playing the LSU-North Texas game in Tiger Stadium in jeopardy, the Tigers would have opted to move the contest to another location.

## LSU's North Texas Ties

Four members of the North Texas athletic department, including two members of the football staff have ties with LSU. UNT cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels was a four-year letterwinner for LSU from 1989-92 and later served as a graduate assistant with the Tigers under both Gerry DiNardo and Nick Saban. UNT strength coach Chris Seroka served on the LSU staff under Curley Hallman during the early 1990s. North Texas AD Rick Villareal was a member of the LSU coaching staff under Curley Hallman, coaching the tight ends. Also, UNT Assoc. AD/SWA Cinnamon Sheffield was a 10-time All-American and a member of four outdoor national championship teams at LSU.

## LSU Ranked No. 7 In This Week's Polls

LSU remained among the top 10 teams in the nation this week despite not playing last Saturday. LSU did fall one spot from No. 6 to No. 7 in the USA Today Coaches poll, while holding steady at No. 7 in the Associated Press Top 25.

## LSU Ranked In Every Coaches And AP Poll Since Start of 2003 Season

With its No. 7 ranking this week in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the AP Top 25, LSU extended its streak of consecutive weeks in the top 25. LSU has been ranked for 85 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll and for 84 straight weeks in the AP Poll. The last time LSU failed to make the top 25 in either poll came following the Tigers loss to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl to conclude the 2002 season. LSU's current streak of consecutive weeks in both polls is a school record.

## LSU's Won 28 Straight Saturday Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU's school-record streak of 19 consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium may have been snapped in the home-finale last year against Arkansas, but the Tigers have another home streak intact. LSU has won 28 straight Saturday games played in Tiger Stadium, a streak that goes all the way back to 2003. The last time LSU lost a game played on a Saturday in Tiger Stadium came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU's only two home losses have come against Tennessee in 2005 and Arkansas in 2007. Tennessee beat LSU, 30-27, in overtime on a Monday night, while the Arkansas victory came in triple-overtime on a Friday afternoon.

## LSU's Won 26 Consecutive Saturday Night Games In Tiger Stadium

In addition to its streak of having won 28 straight Saturday games in Tiger Stadium, LSU has also won 26 consecutive Saturday night games in Death Valley. LSU's streak of consecutive Saturday night wins in Tiger Stadium goes back to the 2002 season when the Tigers beat Ole Miss, 14-13, to get the run started. The last time LSU lost a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium came against Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002 by a 31-0 count. SU's last night game

## LSU's Won 30 Of Last 32 Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU goes into the North Texas game having won 30 of its last 32 games in Tiger Stadium. LSU stretched its home winning streak to a school-record 19 games last year before Arkansas, posted a 50-48 triple-overtime win over the Tigers in the home finale in 2007. LSU is 20-2 under Les Miles in Tiger Stadium.

## LSU's Won 15 Straight Non-Conference Games

Dating back to the end of the 2004 season, LSU has won 15 straight games against non-conference teams. All 15 wins have come under current head coach Les Miles, who has a 15-0 mark in non-conference games at LSU. LSU's last non-conference loss came to Iowa by a 30-25 count in the 2005 Capital One Bowl (which capped the 2004 season). The last time LSU lost to a non-SEC foe in Tiger Stadium came during the 2000 season when UAB upset the Tigers, 13-10. The last time LSU lost a regular-season non-conference game came on Sept. 1, 2002 when the Tigers dropped a 26-8 decision to Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Va.

## Miles Is 9-2 In September Games At LSU

LSU coach Les Miles brings a 9-2 mark in games played in September as head coach of the Tigers into the North Texas contest on Saturday. LSU, which has won six straight games played in the month of September, was 4-0 during September a year ago. LSU's last September loss came at Auburn by a 7-3 count on Sept. 16, 2006. LSU's last September home loss came at the hands of Tennessee on Sept. 26 by a 30-27 margin in overtime.

## Charles Scott Has Big Game On Ground To Open 2008 Season

RB Charles Scott rushed for 160 yards and a pair of touchdowns in LSU's win over Appalachian State on Aug. 30. The 160 yards were the most by an LSU running back in a season-opener since 1998 when Kevin Faulk rushed for 180 yards against Arkansas State on Sept. 16. The 160 yards were also the most by a Tiger since Alley Broussard set the school record with 250 yards rushing against Ole Miss on Nov. 20, 2004. The 160 yards were a career-best for Scott, who has set a career-best with a 56-yard run on LSU's first play from scrimmage.

## Hatch Shines In First Start; Lee Has Successful Debut As Well

LSU QBs Andrew Hatch and Jarrett Lee combined to complete 13 of 24 passes for 193 yards and 3 TDs in the win over Appalachian State. Hatch, who was making his first career start, connected on 7 of 14 passes for 77 yards and 1 score and added 43 yards rushing for the Tigers. Lee, who was seeing his first collegiate action, connected on 6 of 10 passes for 116 yards and 2 TDs. Hatch became the first LSU QB to win his first start in a season-opener since Sol Graves beat Georgia, 18-13, to open the 1990 season.

## LSU Hasn't Been Kind To Non-SEC Foes; Tigers Have Outscored Them 540 to 126 Under Miles

LSU coach Les Miles is 15-0 in non-conference games with the Tigers and in those 15 contests, only five teams - Arizona State, Notre Dame, Louisiana Tech, Ohio State, and Appalachian State - have reached double-figures in points against LSU. In five non-conference games in 2007, LSU outscored its opponents 222 to 50 in going 5-0 against Virginia Tech, Middle Tennessee, Tulane, Louisiana Tech and Ohio State. In the 15 non-conference games the Tigers have played under Miles, LSU has outscored its opponents 540 to 126 or by an average of 36 to 8.4.

## Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

Here are some notable trends for LSU in the 41 games its played under head coach Les Miles ... The Tigers are 32-2 when rushing for 100 yards or more ... The Tigers are 25-2 when leading after the first quarter with the only losses during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005 and Arkansas in 2007 ... LSU is 32-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 28-3 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 24-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing.

## LSU's 57 Wins Since 2003 Ranks No. 2 Nationally

Since the start of the 2003 season, LSU has won 57 games, which ranks as the second-highest total nationally during that span. Southern Cal is first with 60 wins, followed by LSU with 57 and Boise State, Oklahoma and Texas with 56 each. ## A Unique Situation At Left Tackle

Starting left tackle Ciron Black made his 28th career start in LSU's season-opener against Appalachian State continuing a unique trend at that position for the Tigers. Since the start of the 2002 season, a stretch that spans 80 games, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Black and Andrew Whitworth. Whitworth, now a starting guard for the Cincinnati Bengals, set an LSU record by starting 52 straight games for the Tigers from 2002-05. Black then picked up where Whitworth left off, starting the next 28 games at that position for the Tigers.

## An Experienced Offensive Line

LSU boasts six players who have combined for 101 career starts on the offensive line. The Tigers lost only one starter from their offensive line of a year ago - Carnell Stewart. Senior Brett Helms leads the way with 29 career starts - 27 of those from under center. Junior Ciron Black has started at left tackle in all 28 career games he has played in. Senior Ryan Miller has two starts, senior Herman Johnson has 26 starts and junior Lyle Hitt owns 14 starts. Andrew Whitworth (2002-05) holds the LSU record for career starts with 52.

### Notables

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 84th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 77th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 20 of its last 21 games at home. Only one time since 2000 have the Tigers lost more than one home game, that coming in 2001 when LSU dropped a pair of contests in Tiger Stadium.
- More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 55 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 45 times, including a school-record 92,910 for the Oct. 6, 2007 game that pitted No. 1 LSU against No. 9 Florida. LSU won the game, 28-24.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 44 of the past 51 seasons. The Tigers have drawn 24,134,535 fans since 1957.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 207-59-3 (.779) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 21-23-3 (.479) at home during the day in that span.
- Death Valley is the sixth largest on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

## Tigers Dominate North Texas in 56-3 Victory

LSU dominated in all phases of the game in its 56-3 non-conference win over North Texas as the Tigers racked up a season-best 566 yards (383 passing, 183 rushing), while limiting the Mean Green to 206 yards. The Tigers scored on their first possession of the contest and never looked back in building a 28-3 halftime lead. In all, the Tigers scored on four of their six possessions in both the first half and the second half. QB **JaMarcus Russell** paced the Tigers by completing 17 of 21 passes for 244 yards and 1 TD, while backup QB **Matt Flynn** was a perfect 7 of 7 for 139 yards and 3 TDs, all coming in the fourth quarter. **Justin Vincent** rushed for a team-best 70 yards and 1 score, while **Shyrone Carey** added 44 yards and 2 TDs on 8 carries. Carey scored on runs of 23 yards and 1 yard in the first half, while Vincent added a 1-yard run in the second half. Already leading 35-3, Flynn connected with **Xavier Carter** on a 49-yard TD pass early in the fourth quarter and then followed that with scoring passes of 40 and 6 yards to **Early Doucet** to cap the scoring for the Tigers. Defensively, **Craig Steltz** led LSU with 7 tackles and 1 interception.

**LSU Has Little Trouble In 41-13 Win Over Appalachian State To Open 2008**

Charles Scott rushed for 160 yards and a pair of TDs and LSU QBs Andrew Hatch and Jarrett Lee combined to complete 13 of 24 passes for 193 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 41-13 win over Appalachian State to open the 2008 season. The game, which was originally scheduled for a 4 p.m. start, was moved to a 10 a.m. kickoff due to Hurricane Gustav. The move had little effect on the Tigers as LSU's first play from scrimmage in 2008 had Scott rushing for a 56-yard gain. A play later, Scott scored from eight yards out giving the Tigers a 7-0 lead. The Tigers scored on their next two possessions, stretching the lead to 17-0 early in the second quarter. LSU extended the lead to 31-0 at halftime after scores by Brandon LaFell - a 31-yard pass from Lee - and Scott - a 29-yard run. Appalachian State scored its only TD on a 44-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter with the game's outcome already decided. For the game, the Tigers rolled up 459 yards of total offense, compared to just 239 yards for Appalachian State. The Tiger defense held Appalachian State QB Armani Edwards, a possible Heisman Trophy candidate, to just 23 rushing yards and only 13 of 31 on passing attempts. Danny McCray led the Tigers with 7 tackles, while DE Rahim Alem added two tackles for losses and a sack in the victory.
