Top Five Tigers Host Mississippi State Under The Lights In Tiger Stadium

LSU, fresh off a 26-21 come-from-behind win over top 10 ranked Auburn last week returns to action on Saturday night when the No. 5/6 Tigers host Mississippi State at 6:30 in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience on ESPN2, the third time this year that the Tigers have appeared on one of the ESPN networks. LSU brings a 3-0 overall mark and a 1-0 record in league play into the Mississippi State contest. Mississippi State, 1-3 overall and 0-1 in conference action, is coming off a 38-7 setback to Georgia Tech last week. LSU goes into the State contest having won eight straight and 15 of the last 16 against the Bulldogs, including last year's 45-0 win in Starkville. Saturday's game will also mark the return of night SEC football to Tiger Stadium. LSU has won 27 straight Saturday night games in Tiger Stadium with 10 of those coming against SEC foes. LSU hasn't lost a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium since the 2002 season. Overall, LSU's won 29 consecutive Saturday games in Death Valley, a stretch that dates back to 2003. Thru three games, LSU is averaging 36 points and 427.3 yards (220 rush, 207.3 pass), both of which rank second in the SEC. Individually, RB **Charles Scott** continues to lead the SEC in rushing with 131.3 yards per game. Scott has rushed for 100 yards in each of LSU's three games, including 132 in the win over Auburn. LSU's dual QB system of **Jarrett Lee** and **Andrew Hatch** has combined to complete 46 of 87 passes for 600 yards and five touchdowns. Lee leads with 382 passing yards and four TDs. WR **Brandon LaFell** is tops on the squad and first in the SEC with 82.7 receiving yards per game. Defensively, LSU is allowing 12.3 points and 252.7 yards (55.3 rush, 197.3 pass) per game. Thru 12 quarters of football this year, LSU's defense has yielded just 3 TDs. S **Harry Coleman** leads the Tiger with 17 tackles, while CB **Chris Hawkins** has 2 interceptions.

Lee Comes Off Bench To Lead Tigers Past Auburn, 26-21

Jarrett Lee spelled an injured **Andrew Hatch** and rallied LSU from a 14-3 halftime deficit by throwing a pair of second half TDs in the Tigers 26-21 win over No. 9/10 Auburn. It was the first win by LSU at Auburn since 1998. LSU grabbed the early lead in the contest, taking a 3-0 advantage on a 46-yard field goal by **Colt David** late in the first quarter. That lead was short lived as Auburn responded with 14 unanswered points in the second quarter, which included a 24-yard interception return of a Lee pass for a TD by Gabe McKenzie, stretching the lead to 14-3 at halftime. Hatch went down midway through the third quarter with a head injury as was not able to return, setting up the dramatic turn over events engineered by Lee, a red-shirt freshman. Lee put his first half jitters behind him to light up the Auburn secondary over the final 22 minutes of the contest as he completed 11 of 17 passes during that span for 182 yards and 2 scores. Lee connected with **Chris Mitchell** on a 39-yard TD pass to pull the Tigers to within 14-10 at the 6:28 mark in the third quarter. LSU took a 17-14 lead on the final play of the third quarter when RB **Keiland Williams** threw a halfback pass for a TD to **Demetrius Byrd**. LSU extended the lead to 20-14 on a 32-yard field goal by David with 8:27 to go. Auburn regained the lead at 21-20 with 6:40 left setting up yet another fourth quarter comeback by LSU. After a stop by the LSU defense on Auburn's next possession, Lee and the LSU offense took over at the four minute mark. Lee guided LSU on a 7-play, 54-yard game-winning drive, capped when he connected with **Brandon LaFell** on an 18-yard TD pass. RB **Charles Scott** led the Tigers ground game with 132 yards rushing, while LaFell caught four passes for 92 yards and a score.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

It has been said that LSU is in the midst of the Golden Era of football at the school and head coach Les Miles has been the driving force behind the Tigers' dominance at the national level for the past three years.

Since taking over as head coach at LSU in January of 2005, Miles has guided the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Title and to three straight top five rankings, a first at the school. Miles' record with the Tigers is an astonishing 34-6, which marks the best three-year stretch in the history of the program.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 11 wins for the past three years, the Tigers have had 51 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 51 earning their college diploma. Of the 25 seniors on the 2007 national championship team, 15 have already earned their college degree with the remainder of the class on pace to graduate within the next year.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 19 NFL Draft picks over the past three years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history winning four national awards - the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies - as well as being the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American.

Now, with the Tigers becoming first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for LSU football is more stable than ever. After 34 wins, including 14 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, Miles and the Tigers have solidified their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

The LSU Years

Les Miles' first three years with the Tigers have been unmatched in the history of the program. One would be hard pressed to find a better three-year stretch in major college football. The results are impressive and staggering: 34 wins, 20 SEC victories, 14 wins over top 25 teams, eight wins over top 10 teams, three bowl victories, including a win over Ohio State in last year's BCS National Championship Game, an SEC title and three straight top five final rankings.

Miles' 34 victories is the most of any coach during a three-year span in the history of the school and his 19 SEC regular season wins rank as the best among any Tiger coach in their first three seasons with the program. His 34 wins since taking over at LSU in 2005 also ties with Pete Carroll as the most by any head coach in college football during that three-year span.

After two of the most successful seasons in school history in 2005 and 2006, Miles again led the Tigers to a season of firsts in 2007. LSU became the first school in the Bowl Championship Series era to claim a second BCS National Title with its 38-24 win over Ohio State. LSU's first BCS title came in 2003 when the Tigers beat Oklahoma, 21-14.

With a 12-2 final record in 2007, the Tigers became the first team in school history to win at least 10 games in three straight years. The 2007 Tigers also set the school record for wins over Top 25 teams (7), won the SEC Championship with a backup quarterback and were ranked No. 1 in the BCS Standings during the regular season for the first time in school history. LSU finished the year ranked No. 1 in the nation in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the AP Poll.

After leading LSU to an 11-2 mark and a top five national ranking in his first year as LSU's head coach in 2005, many wondered just what Miles would do for an encore. His second year with the Tigers proved to be another year full of milestones and firsts as he guided the Tigers to another 11-2 overall record, culminating with a 41-14 dismantling of 11th-ranked Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

The Tigers finished their second year under the direction of Miles ranked No. 3 in the nation, marking the first time since the 1958-59 seasons that LSU was ranked in the top five in the country in back-to-back years.

LSU's at-large berth in a BCS bowl was a first in school history and it also represented the third time this decade that the Tigers ended their season in the Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, Miles became the first coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to back-to-back 10-wins seasons, something that he added to with another 10-plus win season in 2007.

He became the first LSU coach since Jerry Stovall in 1982 to beat two top 10-ranked teams on the road in the same season as the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee in Knoxville followed by a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock.

The Oklahoma State Years

As head coach at Oklahoma State, he built a consistent winner out of a program that had recorded only one winning season since 1988, and had posted a record of 13-20 in the three years prior to his arrival at OSU. After going 4-7 in his first year as head coach in 2001, he took the Cowboys to consecutive winning marks of 8-5 in 2002, 9-4 in 2003 and 7-5 in 2004.

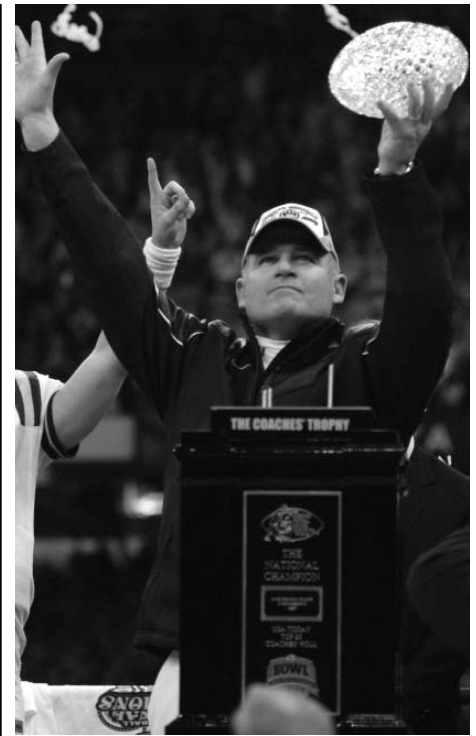
Miles led Oklahoma State to a four-year record of 28-21 for a winning percentage of 57.1, the best career winning percentage for an OSU coach since Jim Lookabaugh ended his career in Stillwater in 1949.

In 2004, Miles took Oklahoma State as high as No. 15 in the country with five wins to open the season. The 2004 season included road wins at UCLA, Colorado and Missouri, and the Cowboys never lost to a team outside of the top 25. In addition, his 2004 Cowboys ranked 12th in the nation in rushing, averaging 237 yards per game, and Oklahoma State was among the national leaders in scoring offense with 32.3 points a contest.

LSU Hosts Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium

LSU returns to Tiger Stadium on Saturday for its first conference home game of the year as the No. 5/6 Tigers host Mississippi State at 6:30 p.m. The game will be televised nationally by ESPN2. LSU brings a 3-0 overall mark and a 1-0 SEC record into the contest, while State is 1-3 overall and 0-1 in league play. Last year, LSU opened its national championship season with a 45-0 win over Mississippi State in Starkville.

Did You Know....

An LSU win on Saturday will give the Tigers back-to-back 4-0 starts for the first time since 1972-73 ... LSU won its first seven games in 1972 and followed that by winning nine in a row to open the 1973 season ... Last year, LSU won its first six games before falling to Kentucky in triple-overtime ... LSU hasn't allowed a point in the first quarter this year ... The last time LSU allowed any first quarter points in a regula season game came last year against Ole Miss ... The last time LSU was scored on in the first quarter of a home game came against Auburn on Oct. 20 of last year ... With 100 yards against Mississippi State, RB **Charles Scott** can join Charles Alexander as the only running backs in school history to rush for 100-plus yards in the first four games of a season ... Alexander did it in 1978.

LSU Does It Again...Records 10th Fourth-Quarter Comeback Under Miles

RB **Charles Scott** was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Monday after rushing for 132 yards in LSU's 26-21 win over Auburn. The 100-yard game was the third straight for Scott to open the season as he continues to lead the SEC with 131.3 yards per game. For the year, Scott has rushed for 394 yards and 4 TDs. Scott also became the first LSU player to have three straight 100-yard games to open a season since Charles Alexander did it in 1978. Scott also became the first LSU running back to break the 100-yard mark in a game at Auburn. He averaged 6.3 yards per carry against an Auburn defense that was allowing just 53 rushing yards per game going into the contest. Scott had eight carries of at least nine yards vs. Auburn, including a long run of 31 yards to setup an LSU field goal in the third quarter. He also caught 2 passes for 15 yards. The honor is the first of Scott's career.

LSU Ranked No. 5 In AP Poll This Week; Tigers Remain No. 6 In Coaches Poll

LSU moved up a spot to No. 5 in the nation in this week's AP Top 25 following its 26-21 win over Auburn. LSU remained No. 6 in the USA Today Coaches Poll for a second straight week. LSU has now been ranked in the top 10 in both the AP Top 25 and the USA Today Coaches Poll for a school-record 27 straight weeks. That streak dates back to Nov. 12, 2006.

LSU Ranked In Every Coaches And AP Poll Since Start of 2003 Season

With its No. 5/6 ranking this week in the AP Top 25 and the USA Today Coaches Poll, LSU extended its streak of consecutive weeks in the top 25. LSU has been ranked for 87 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll and for 86 straight weeks in the AP Poll. The last time LSU failed to make the top 25 in either poll came following the Tigers loss to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl to conclude the 2002 season. LSU's current streak of consecutive weeks in both polls is a school record.

Who's In and Who's Out For LSU

Senior LB **Darry Beckwith** (leg - unspecified injury) is expected to miss his second straight game this week against Mississippi State ... All other Tigers are expected to be ready for the Mississippi State game.

Miles Is 20-5 In SEC Regular Season Games

LSU coach **Les Miles** improved his record in SEC regular season games to 20-5 following the win over Auburn. Miles was 7-1 in 2005 in conference games followed by a 6-2 record in both 2006 and 2007. Miles is 9-3 in SEC road games and 11-2 in league games played in Tiger Stadium. Counting the SEC Championship Game, Miles has posted 21 wins over SEC foes during his three years with the Tigers.

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 206-59-4 (.773) at night under the lights compared to a 21-23-3 (.479) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 51-7 overall at home, which includes a 40-4 (.909) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 11-3 (.786) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted an 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Miles' 37 Wins In First 43 Games Ranks Second In SEC History

Les Miles' list of achievements at LSU is both lengthy and impressive. However, perhaps the most impressive item on his list of accomplishments is the fact that he ranks second in SEC history for wins after 43 games with 37. Miles' 37 wins in 43 games trails only that of Robert Neyland of Tennessee, who won 38 of his first 43 games. Miles' 37 wins puts him ahead of such names as Mark Richt (35), Steve Spurrier (34) and Bernie Moore (33). The following is a quick look at some of Miles' highlights during his four years with the Tigers:

- * Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice
- * Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game
- * Has 6 wins over coaches who have won national titles
- * Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school
- * Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings

Finally, A Normal Routine

It's been like déjà vu for LSU this year as the Tigers have had flashbacks to the 2005 season when the first month of football season was disrupted by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. In 2005, LSU didn't finally settle into a normal week of practice followed by a regularly-scheduled Saturday contest until the week the Tigers played at Vanderbilt on Oct. 8. This year, it's been very similar as LSU's first two games were altered. In week one, the Appalachian State game was moved up six hours to 10 a.m. because of Hurricane Gustav and the following week the Troy contest was postponed until Nov. 15 because of that storm. The North Texas game appeared to be in jeopardy for most of the week before Hurricane Ike took a path away from Baton Rouge. The following is a look at the schedule disruptions for LSU caused by Hurricanes since the start of the 2005 season:

LSU's Won 29 Straight Saturday Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU's school-record streak of 19 consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium may have been snapped in the home-finale last year against Arkansas, but the Tigers have another home streak intact. LSU has won 29 straight Saturday games played in Tiger Stadium, a streak that goes all the way back to 2003. The last time LSU lost a game played on a Saturday in Tiger Stadium came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU's only two home losses have come against Tennessee in 2005 and Arkansas in 2007. Tennessee beat LSU, 30-27, in overtime on a Monday night, while the Arkansas victory came in triple-overtime on a Friday afternoon.

LSU's Won 27 Consecutive Saturday Night Games In Tiger Stadium

In addition to its streak of having won 29 straight Saturday games in Tiger Stadium, LSU has also won 27 consecutive Saturday night games in Death Valley. LSU's streak of consecutive Saturday night wins in Tiger Stadium goes back to the 2002 season when the Tigers beat Ole Miss, 14-13, to get the run started. The last time LSU lost a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium came against Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002 by a 31-0 count.

LSU's Won 31 Of Last 33 Games In Tiger Stadium

With its win over North Texas, LSU has now won 31 of its last 33 games in Tiger Stadium. LSU stretched its home winning streak to a school-record 19 games last year before Arkansas, posted a 50-48 triple-overtime win over the Tigers in the home finale in 2007. LSU is 21-2 under Les Miles in Tiger Stadium.

LSU's Won 35 Of Last 36 Against Unranked Opponents

LSU goes into the Mississippi State game having won 35 of its last 36 games against unranked opponents. LSU won 33 straight against unranked teams until Arkansas posted a 50-48 triple-overtime win over the Tigers in last year's regular-season finale. Prior to the Arkansas game, the last time LSU lost a game to an unranked team came in 2003 when the Tigers dropped a 19-7 decision to Tiger Stadium.

Another Top 10 Road Win For Miles and LSU

LSU ran its record in road games against top 10 teams to 4-2 under Les Miles with the win over Auburn on Sept. 20. LSU's top 10 road wins since the start of the 2005 season have come against Alabama (2005), Tennessee (2006), Arkansas (2006) and Auburn (2007).

LSU brings a 13-game winning streak on the ESPN family of networks into the Mississippi State game. The 13-game streak goes back to the 2005 season when Tennessee rallied for a 30-27 overtime win over the Tigers on a Monday night in a game televised by ESPN2. Since then, the Tigers have reeled off 13 straight victories on the all sports network. Breaking down the 13-game streak has the Tigers winning seven straight on ESPN, five in a row on ESPN2, and one time on ESPN Classic. In ESPN only games, the Tigers have won 13 straight, a streak that dates back to the 2002 season.

Charles Scott Continues To Lead SEC In Rushing Yards

RB Charles Scott continues to lead the SEC in rushing as he is averaging 131.3 yards per game thru three games this year. For the year, Scott has rushed for 394 yards and four TDs on 44 carries. He's averaging 9.0 yards per carry.

Lee Comes Up Big In Second Half At Auburn

LSU QB Jarrett Lee looked anything but a redshirt freshman in the second half vs. Auburn as he completed 11 of 17 passes during the final two quarters for 182 yards and a pair of TDs. Not bad after he started the game by going 0-for-5 in the first half with one of his passes being returned for a TD that gave Auburn a 14-3 lead at intermission.

PK Colt David Puts Name Atop LSU Kicking Records

With eight points (2 FGs, 2 PATs) against Auburn, LSU PK Colt David became the school's all-time leader in scoring by a kicker with 297 points to his credit. In four years with the Tigers, David has kicked 42 field goals and been successful on 165 extra-point attempts. The 165 PATs is also a school record. David currently ranks third in LSU history in field goals (42), field goal attempts (56), and scoring (297).

Another August 30 Start - Could It Be A Sign Of Things To Come?

For the third time in school history, LSU opened a football season on Aug. 30 when the Tigers beat Appalachian State, 41-13. The other two years in which the Tigers opened a season on Aug. 30 came in 2003 and 2007, both years that LSU went on to win the BCS National Championship. LSU is 3-0 in games played on Aug. 30, beating Louisiana-Monroe, 49-7, in 2003 and then Mississippi State, 45-0, in 2007.

Dalfrey Has Breakout Game As LSU's Punter

Senior P Brady Dalfrey had what could be considered his breakout game against Auburn as he punted 6 times for 290 yards and a 48.3 average. Four of Dalfrey's punts were downed inside the 20-yard line. Dalfrey had a long punt of 59 yards and added another 52-yarder. Of his 6 punts, four came to rest at the 1, 11, 13, and 14-yard line during the contest. His punts also had tremendous hangtime which kept Auburn from returning any of the punts. For the season, Dalfrey is averaging 37.9 yards punts. However, of his 13 punts, 7 have been downed inside the 20-yard line.

Hatch Got First SEC Start At Auburn; Lee Could Be Next This Week

Sophomore Andrew Hatch made his first career start vs. Auburn before being knocked out of the game with an injury midway through the third quarter. LSU is now 3-0 in games that Hatch has started. LSU, which has won eight straight games played in the month of September, was 4-0 during September a year ago. LSU's last September loss came at Auburn by a 7-3 count on Sept. 16, 2006. LSU's last September home loss came at the hands of Tennessee on Sept. 26 by a 30-27 margin in overtime.

Regulation Success

LSU brings a streak of having played 22 games without losing in regulation into the Mississippi State contest. The last time LSU lost a football game in regulation came on Oct. 7, 2006 when Florida posted a 23-10 win over LSU in Gainesville. Since that time, the Tigers have reeled off a 19-2 record with the only two losses coming in triple-overtime. LSU lost in triple-over-time to both Kentucky and Arkansas last year.

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

A Unique Situation At Left Tackle

Starting left tackle **Ciron Black** made his 30th career start against Auburn, continuing a unique trend at that position for the Tigers. Since the start of the 2002 season, a stretch that spans 82 games, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Black and Andrew Whitworth. Whitworth, now a starting guard for the Cincinnati Bengals, set an LSU record by starting 52 straight games for the Tigers from 2002-05. Black then picked up where Whitworth left off, starting the next 30 games at that position for the Tigers.

An Experienced Offensive Line

LSU boasts six players who have combined for 112 career starts on the offensive line. The Tigers lost only one starter from their offensive line of a year ago - Carnell Stewart. Senior **Brett Helms** leads the way with 31 career starts - 29 of those from under center. Junior **Ciron Black** has started at left tackle in all 30 career games he has played in. Senior **Ryan Miller** has two starts, senior **Herman Johnson** has 28 starts and junior **Lyle Hitt** owns 16 starts. Andrew Whitworth (2002-05) holds the LSU record for career starts with 52.

LSU Is Now 12-3 In Road Games Under Miles

LSU is now 12-3 in road games under **Les Miles** following the win over Auburn on Sept. 20. The Tigers were 3-1 on the road in 2007 after going 2-2 on the road in 2006. Miles guided LSU to a 5-0 mark on the road in his first season with the Tigers. All four of LSU's road opponents in 2006 were ranked in the top 10 at the time of the LSU game, including Auburn. Of LSU's 12 road wins under Miles, five have come against teams ranked in the top 15 with four of those coming against top 10 ranked teams. LSU's top 10 road wins under Miles include a 16-13 victory over No. 3 Alabama in 2005; a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee and a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in 2006; and a 26-21 win over No. 9/10 Auburn in 2008.

LSU's 16 Straight Non-Conference Wins Ranks Second Nationally

LSU ran its streak of consecutive non-conference wins to 16 straight with its win over North Texas. The 16 straight non-conference wins ranks as the second-longest streak in college football. LSU's streak of consecutive non-conference wins dates back to the end of the 2004 season when the Tigers dropped a last-second 30-25 decision to Iowa in the Capital One Bowl. All 16 wins in LSU's current non-conference streak have come under current head coach **Les Miles**, who has a 16-0 mark in non-conference games at LSU. The last time LSU lost to a non-SEC foe in Tiger Stadium came during the 2000 season when UAB upset the Tigers, 13-10. The last time LSU lost a regular-season non-conference game came on Sept. 1, 2002 when the Tigers dropped a 26-8 decision to Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Va.

Hatch Successful In First Start At Quarterback For LSU; Could Lee Be Next

QB **Andrew Hatch** made his first career start at LSU a successful one as the sophomore helped lead the Tigers to a 41-13 win over Appalachian State. Hatch became the first LSU quarterback to win his first career start that came in a season-opener since Sol Graves beat Georgia, 18-13, to open the 1990 season. When Hatch started against Appalachian State on Aug. 30, he became the first LSU quarterback to get his first career start in a season-opener since Matt Mauck did it against Virginia Tech in 2002. If **Jarrett Lee** starts against Mississippi State he will become the first freshman at LSU to have his first career start come in an SEC game since JaMarcus Russell started against Florida in 2004. The last time an LSU freshman (redshirt of true) had his first career start come against an SEC opponent in Tiger Stadium came in 2002 when Rick Clausen opened against Ole Miss. Notables

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 84th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 77th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 21 of its last 22 games at home. Only one time since 2000 have the Tigers lost more than one home game, that coming in 2001 when LSU dropped a pair of contests in Tiger Stadium.
- More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 56 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 46 times, including a school-record 92,910 for the Oct. 6, 2007 game that pitted No. 1 LSU against No. 9 Florida. LSU won the game, 28-24.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 44 of the past 51 seasons. The Tigers have drawn 24,134,535 fans since 1957.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 206-59-4 (.776) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 21-22-3 (.479) at home during the day in that span.
- Death Valley is the sixth largest on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

LSU's Defense Overwhelms Miss. State In 45-0 Win Over Bulldogs

LSU forced seven turnovers, including six interceptions, as the second-ranked Tigers overwhelmed Mississippi State, 45-0, in the season-opener for both teams last week. Matt Flynn, making his first regular season start at quarterback, directed a Tiger offense that didn't commit a turnover and racked up 45 points, the most by an LSU team in an SEC road game since scoring 63 points against Kentucky in Lexington in 1997. LSU took an early 3-0 lead on a 27-yard field goal by **Colt David**. The Tigers stretched the lead to 10-0 late in the second quarter on a 1-yard run by **Keiland Williams**. LSU increased the lead to 17-0 when Williams scored on a 1-yard run as time expired in the first half. LSU took the opening kickoff to start the second half and put together its best drive of the game, going 73-yards on six plays, capped with a Flynn-to-Early Doucet 11-yard TD pass to run the score to 24-0. Backup QB Ryan Perrilloux engineered a pair of fourth quarter TD drives for the final margin of 45-0. For the game, the Tiger defense limited Mississippi State to just 10 yards rushing and 136 yards passing. The Bulldogs managed just nine first downs, four of which came in the first half. Thirty-eight of LSU's 45 points came following an MSU turnover, including all 17 first half points.

LSU Has Little Trouble In 41-13 Win Over Appalachian State To Open 2008

Charles Scott rushed for 160 yards and a pair of TDs and LSU QBs Andrew Hatch and Jarrett Lee combined to complete 13 of 24 passes for 193 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 41-13 win over Appalachian State to open the 2008 season. The game, which was originally scheduled for a 4 p.m. start, was moved to a 10 a.m. kickoff due to Hurricane Gustav. The move had little effect on the Tigers as LSU's first play from scrimmage in 2008 had Scott rushing for a 56-yard gain. A play later, Scott scored from eight yards out giving the Tigers a 7-0 lead. The Tigers scored on their next two possessions, stretching the lead to 17-0 early in the second quarter. LSU extended the lead to 31-0 at halftime after scores by Brandon LaFell - a 31-yard pass from Lee - and Scott - a 29-yard run. Appalachian State scored its only TD on a 44-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter with the game's outcome already decided. For the game, the Tigers rolled up 459 yards of total offense, compared to just 239 yards for Appalachian State. The Tiger defense held Appalachian State QB Armani Edwards, a possible Heisman Trophy candidate, to just 23 rushing yards and only 13 of 31 on passing attempts. Danny McCray led the Tigers with 7 tackles, while DE Rahim Alem added two tackles for losses and a sack in the victory.

Scott, Holliday Lead LSU Past North Texas, 41-3

Charles Scott rushed for 102 yards and a pair of TDs and Trindon Holliday returned a punt 92 yards for another score as LSU had little trouble with North Texas, winning 41-3 in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers showed no signs of having not played a game in two weeks as LSU scored on four of its first five possessions in the first half in building a 27-3 lead at half-time. Scott opened the scoring with a 39-yard run minutes into the contest. Colt David followed with a 41-yard field goal four minutes later to give the Tigers a 10-0 lead. The Mean Green pulled to within 10-3 early in the second quarter, before Scott busted loose on a 43-yard TD run to stretch the margin to 17-3. Another stop by the LSU defense setup the Tigers next score as Holliday fielded a punt on his own 8-yard line and raced 92 yards, untouched, for the score and a 24-3 advantage. Andrew Hatch and Quinn Johnson each added rushing TDs for the Tigers in the third quarter as Les Miles substituted freely in the fourth quarter. For the game, the Tigers racked up 425 yards of offense (216 rushing, 209 passing), while holding the Mean Green to only 199 yards (44 rushing, 155 passing). Hatch connected on 10 of 17 passes for 125 yards, while Lee hit on 10 of 18 attempts for 84 yards. Brandon LaFell led all receivers with seven catches for 69 yards.

Lee Comes Off Bench To Lead Tigers Past Auburn, 26-21

Jarrett Lee spelled an injured Andrew Hatch and rallied LSU from a 14-3 halftime deficit by throwing a pair of second half TDs in the Tigers 26-21 win over No. 9/10 Auburn. It was the first win by LSU at Auburn since 1998. LSU grabbed the early lead in the contest, taking a 3-0 advantage on a 46-yard field goal by Colt David late in the first quarter. That lead was short lived as Auburn responded with 14 unanswered points in the second quarter, which included a 24-yard interception return of a Lee pass for a TD by Gabe McKenzie, stretching the margin to 14-3 at halftime. LSU starting QB Hatch went down midway through the third quarter with a head injury as was not able to return, setting up the dramatic turn over events engineered by Lee, a redshirt freshman. Lee put his first half jitters behind him to light up the Auburn secondary over the final 22 minutes of the contest as he completed 11 of 17 attempts in during that span for 182 yards and two scores. Lee connected with Chris Mitchell on a 39-yard TD pass to pull the Tigers to with 14-10 at the 6:28 mark in the third quarter. LSU took a 17-14 lead on the final play of the third quarter when RB Keiland Williams threw a halfback pass for a TD to Demetrius Byrd. LSU extended the lead to 20-14 on a 32-yard field goal by David with 8:27 to go. Auburn regained the lead at 21-20 with 6:40 left setting up yet another fourth quarter comeback by LSU. After a stop by the LSU defense on Auburn's next possession, Lee and the LSU offense took over at the four minute mark. Lee guided LSU on a 7-play, 54-yard game-winning drive, capped when he connected with Brandon LaFell on an 18-yard TD pass. RB Charles Scott led the Tigers ground game with 132 yards rushing, while LaFell caught four passes for 92 yards and a score.
