### ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE (9-0) vs. LSU TIGERS (6-2) Saturday, Nov. 8, 2008 - 2:30 p.m. (CDT) - CBS Tiger Stadium (92,619) - Tuscaloosa, Ala.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The University of Alabama football team travels to Baton Rouge Saturday for a SEC West showdown with the LSU Tigers at Tiger Stadium. The game is slated to kickoff at 2:30 p.m. (CDT) and will be televised nationally by CBS with Verne Lundquist, Gary Danielson and Tracy Wolfson calling the action. The Tigers are 6-2 on the season and coming off of a 35-10 win over Tulane. The Tigers are 3-2 in SEC play, two games back of the Crimson Tide in the Western Division. A win will also clinch the SEC Western Division for Alabama for the first time since 1999.

**HEAD COACH NICK SABAN:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban (Kent State, 1973) is in his second season with the Crimson Tide. He was named the school's 27th head coach on Jan. 3, 2007. Saban has compiled a 107-48-1 (.689) record as a collegiate head coach, including an 16-6 (.727) mark at Alabama and a 9-0 record in 2008. He captured his 100th career victory in week two against Tulane and coached his 150th game as a collegiate head coach in week three vs. Western Kentucky. Saban led LSU to a 13-1 record and the BCS National Championship in 2003. Overall, Saban has coached three conference championship teams (1990 Mid-American, 2001 SEC and 2003 SEC) and nine of his 12 teams have played in post-season bowl games and his 2008 team is qualified for a bowl. Saban is the only current Football Bowl Subdivision coach to coach for at least 10 years and have never suffered a losing season. **RANKINGS:** Alabama assumed the No. 1 spot in this week's *Associated Press* poll after the Crimson Tide knocked off Arkansas State and Texas lost at Texas Tech. The Tide also moved up to No. 1 in the *USA Today* Coaches poll and garnered the top spot in the Bowl Championship Series standings. Alabama is ranked No. 1 in this week's *Associated Press* football poll for the first time since the final *AP* poll of the 1992 season after the Crimson Tide knocked off Miami 34-13 in the 1993 Sugar Bowl. The last time the Crimson Tide was ranked atop the *AP* poll during the regular season was the ninth week (Oct. 26-Nov. 1) of the 1980 regular season. UA has a 19-5 (.792) all-time record as the nation's top-ranked team.

**LSU SERIES:** Alabama leads the all-time series with LSU 43-23-5, but the Tigers have reeled off five straight wins in the series, including a come-from-behind 41-34 win last season in Tuscaloosa. The Crimson Tide's last win in the series was a 31-0 victory in Baton Rouge on Nov. 16, 2002. The series dates back to a 12-6 LSU win in 1895. The Crimson Tide own a 24-8-2 edge in games played in Baton Rouge.

**NEXT GAME:** Alabama returns home to began a two-game SEC Western Division home stand that will close out the 2008 regular season. The Crimson Tide will host Mississippi State on Nov. 15 before taking a week off and welcoming Auburn on Nov. 29.

**TOP 10 TERROR**: Alabama is one of just three teams in the country with two wins over top 10 teams during the 2008 season. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a 34-10 drubbing of No. 9 Clemson in the Georgia Dome before dismantling No. 3 Georgia 41-30 in Athens on Sept. 27. It marks the first time since 1999 that Alabama has beaten two top 10 teams in the same season. The Tide beat No. 3 Florida 40-39 in overtime in Gainesville on Oct. 2 before again beating the No. 5 Gators 34-7 in the SEC Championship Game in Atlanta on Dec. 4. Texas owns wins over then-No. 1 Oklahoma and then-No. 6 Oklahoma State and Florida owns wins over then-No 4 LSU and then-No. 8 Georgia.

**NEW BCS RANKINGS OUT:** Alabama garnered the No. 1 position in the Bowl Championship Series standings for the first time in school history on Sunday, Nov. 2, when the third BCS rankings of the season were released. The Crimson Tide have a BCS average of .9747 with Texas Tech (.9372) ranked second and Penn State (.9286) ranked third. The Tide is No. 1 in the Harris Interactive poll, the USA Today Coaches poll and tied for first in computer rankings.

**HARRIS INTERACTIVE POLL RANKING:** Alabama moved to the top of the sixth Harris Interactive College Football Poll that was released on Sunday, Nov. 2. The Harris Interactive rankings consist of a panel of former coaches, players and administrators along with current and former members of the media. Alabama garnered 2,798 points for the top spot with Penn State (2,689) in second, Texas Tech (2,644) third, Florida (2,391) fourth and Oklahoma (2,366) fifth. The Crimson Tide received 79 first-place votes followed Penn State with 17 and Texas Tech with 16. Florida and Texas both received one each.

**TIDE RANKED NO. 1:** Alabama is ranked No. 1 in this week's *Associated Press* football poll for the first time since the final *AP* poll of the 1992 season after the Crimson Tide knocked off Miami 34-13 in the 1993 Sugar Bowl. The last time the Crimson Tide was ranked atop the *AP* poll during the regular season was the ninth week (Oct. 26-Nov. 1) of the 1980 regular season. The Tide has a 19-5 (.792) all-time record as the nation's top-ranked team. Alabama was ranked No. 1 for eight straight weeks during the 1980 season, with its last No. 1 ranking coming prior to 6-3 loss to Mississippi State at Mississippi Memorial Stadium in Jackson on Nov. 1, 1980. The loss to MSU ended Alabama's school and SEC record 28-game winning streak.

HISTORY OF NO. 1 RANKINGS: The LSU game will mark Alabama's 25th all-time game when sitting atop the Associated Press college football poll. The Crimson Tide's first regular-season No. 1 ranking came during the 1961 season after a 10-0 win over Georgia Tech at Birmingham's Legion Field. The Tide then defeated Auburn 34-0 on Dec. 2, 1961, before a 10-3 win over Arkansas in the 1962 Sugar Bowl to win the national championship. UA was ranked No. 1 three times during the 1962 regular season, posting a 2-1 record. The Tide suffered a 7-6 loss to Georgia Tech on Nov. 17, 1962, at Grant Field in Atlanta and would not be ranked No. 1 again until after the 1964 regular season. The No. 1 ranked Crimson Tide fell 21-17 to Texas in the 1965 Orange Bowl. Alabama was ranked No. 1 two times in 1973, beating Auburn 35-0 at Legion Field on Dec. 1 and then losing to Notre Dame 24-23 in the Sugar Bowl. The 1978 season marked the only time Alabama was the No.1 team in the preseason poll. The Tide opened the year with wins over Nebraska and Missouri before losing to Southern California at Legion Field to end its run at No. 1. Alabama won its final nine games in 1978, including a 14-7 win over Penn State in the Jan. 1, 1979, Sugar Bowl. Alabama ascended back into the No.1 spot in the AP poll after winning its first five games of the 1979 season. The Tide played six games as the No. 1 ranked team in 1979 before slipping to No. 2 after a 25-18 win over arch-rival Auburn to end the season. Alabama beat Arkansas 24-9 in the 1980 Sugar Bowl for the national title. After opening the 1980 season as the No. 2 ranked team, Alabama's 26-3 win over Georgia Tech at Legion Field vaulted the Tide to No. 1 where they remained for seven weeks until a loss to Mississippi State. Alabama has been ranked atop the Associated Press poll at the end of the season six times, including the final AP poll in 1961, 1964, 1965, 1978, 1979 and 1992.

**JPW ON THE ROAD:** Alabama's John Parker Wilson has quarterbacked the Crimson Tide to a 9-0 record and a No. 1 national ranking as a senior. His play on the road in 2008 has been key to his team's performance. The Hoover, Ala. native has completed 69.0 percent of his passes away from Bryant-Denny Stadium for 647 yards, four touchdowns and no interceptions. Wilson boasts a passing efficiency rating of 149.46 in four games away from home this season. He led the Tide to wins over top 10 foes Clemson (at the Georgia Dome) and Georgia away from home, as well as a 49-14 win at Arkansas and a 29-9 triumph at Tennessee. Wilson threw for 180 yards against the Tigers in Atlanta with two touchdowns and then passed for 205 yards and a score against the Bulldogs in Athens. In Wilson's trip to Neyland Stadium, he completed 17-of-24 passes for 188 yards. In his last trip to LSU in 2006, Wilson completed 22-of-35 passes for 291 yards and two touchdowns against the Tigers.

**SECOND-HALF STANDOUT:** UA quarterback John Parker Wilson's 60.8 completion percentage is a career best and a big part of his outstanding game management in 2008. But that number is even better in the second half and nearly perfect in the fourth quarter. Wilson is completing 66.7 percent of his passes in the second half this year (50 of 75) for 479 yards and two touchdowns. In the fourth quarter he has completed 16-of-22 passes (.727) for 183 yards. Wilson is 13 for 18 (.722) for 144 yards in the fourth quarter in his last five games. He did not have a fourth quarter incompletion against Georgia (3 for 3, 66 yards), Kentucky (1 for 1, 14 yards) or Tennessee (2 for 2, 17 yards).

**STOPPING THE RUN:** Alabama is 11-2 under Coach Nick Saban when holding opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in a game, including an 8-0 mark in 2008. The Crimson Tide held Clemson (0), Tulane (86), Western Kentucky (42), Arkansas (92), Georgia (50), Kentucky (35), Tennessee (36) and Arkansas State (91) to less than 100 rushing yards in eight of the first nine games of the season. Going back to 2007, the Tide has held nine of their last 10 opponents below 100 yards rushing with Colorado amassing just 75 yards in the 2007 Independence Bowl. Alabama was 3-2 last year when opponents failed to reach 100 rushing yards in a game. In Coach Saban's 22-game tenure at Alabama, the Tide has held it's opponent under 100 yards rushing 13 times.

**TIDE 2ND NATIONALLY IN RUSHING DEFENSE:** The Crimson Tide ranks second nationally in rushing defense eight games into the 2008 season. Alabama opponents have 227 rushing attempts for 590 yards, an average of 65.6 yards per game and 2.60 yards per attempt this season. The top five teams in the nation in terms of rushing defense are No. 1 TCU (38.9), Alabama (65.6 ypg), No. 4 Nevada (69.5 ypg), No. 4 Texas (73.2) and No. 5 Southern California (84.1 ypg). The Crimson Tide defense opened the season in impressive fashion by holding Clemson to zero rushing yards. In the Crimson Tide's second game Alabama held Tulane to 86 rushing yards on 32 attempts, then allowed just 42 yards on 22 carries vs. Western Kentucky, 92 yards on 31 rushes at Arkansas, 50 yards on 16 carries at Georgia, 35 yards on 20 attempts to Kentucky, 36 yards on 21 carries at Tennessee and 91 yards on 37 attempts to Arkansas State.

**RUNNING ON THE TIDE IS TOUGH:** Running has been tough against the Crimson Tide defense this season, as evidenced by the fact that no running back has surpassed the 100-yard barrier and all nine opponents' leading rushers have fallen significantly short of their season run totals when playing Alabama. The Crimson Tide held Clemson's vaunted tandem of James Davis and C.J. Spiller to 20 rushing yards in the season-opening win in Atlanta. The Clemson duo averages 112.5 yards per game this season and was held to 93 yards below their season average by Alabama. Georgia running back Knowshon Moreno averages 110.0 yards per game this season, but managed only 34 yards (76 below season average) on nine carries in the loss to Alabama. Arkansas freshman Michael Smith averages 123.4 yards per game this season and managed 91 yards (32 yards below season average) on 19 rushing attempts against Alabama. Here is a look at the Tide's opposing running backs this season and how they have fared against Alabama, compared to their season totals.

**ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY:** The popular college football pregame show, "College Gameday" will be at the Alabama-LSU game this Saturday in Baton Rouge. It will mark Alabama's third appearance on the show this season. The Tide's 2008 season opener against Clemson also hosted GameDay on Aug. 30 from Centennial Park in downtown Atlanta and the showed up for the Tide's 41-30 win at Georgia. Chris Fowler, Kirk Herbstreit, Lee Corso and Desmond Howard will be in Baton Rouge to preview a showdown of perennial SEC powers. Alabama is making its 13th overall appearance on ESPN College Gameday and its fourth in the Nick Saban era. The Tide is 5-7 in games featured on Gameday. Alabama made its College Gameday debut with a 21-14 win over Auburn during the 1994 season at Legion Field. Alabama has been on ESPN College Gameday for eight home games, including five Tuscaloosa games and three Birmingham games. The Crimson Tide has also appeared on ESPN College Gameday three times on the road at Auburn in 1995, at LSU in 1996 and at Georgia in 2008.

**SABAN REACHES 9-0 FOR FIRST TIME:** Nick Saban moved to 9-0 for the first time in his head coaching career with last week's win over Arkansas State. Saban had fielded two teams that reached 6-0 and two teams that reached 5-0. His 1990 team at Toledo posted wins in the first six games before falling at Central Michigan 13-12 and then his 1999 team at Michigan State went 6-0 before a 19-17 loss at Northwestern. Saban's 1997 Michigan State and 2003 LSU squads started the year at 5-0.

**FAST-STARTING TIDE**: Alabama continued its penchant for jumping on top early against Arkansas State by taking its first offensive possession 89 yards in 16 plays, consuming 7:02 to a touchdown run of nine yards by Glen Coffee with 4:22 left in the first quarter. UA led 7-0 at the end of the first quarter and 14-0 at half-time. The Crimson Tide has outscored its opposition this season a combined 198-26 in the first half, including a 108-6 edge in the first quarter of its first nine games. Alabama has shutout Clemson (13-0), Tulane (13-0), Western Kentucky (17-0), Arkansas (21-0), Georgia (10-0), Kentucky (14-0) and Arkansas State (7-0) in the first period this year, and has a 90-20 edge in second-quarter scoring this season.

**ANOTHER FIRST-HALF EXPLOSION:** Alabama once again broke out to an early lead against Arkansas State with a 14-0 halftime lead. That continued a trend of quick starts by the Crimson Tide in 2008. The Tide has scored on its first possession of the game in six of nine games this season. The Crimson Tide had a 35-point first half at Arkansas and then a 31-point first half at Georgia. The 35 points at Arkansas was the most by an Alabama team since the Tide scored 42 points in the first half of a 56-7 win over UTEP on Oct. 6, 2001, at Legion Field, game UA lead 42-0 at halftime. **SMITH A SEMIFINALIST FOR THE LOMBARDI:** Alabama junior left tackle Andre Smith is one of 12 semi-finalists for the 2008 Rotary Lombardi Award. The Lombardi Award is presented to the nation's top offensive or defensive lineman. The Lombardi Award will be presented Dec. 10 at the Hilton Americas Hotel in Houston. Smith, a preseason Playboy All-American, was named the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week following the Tide's 49-14 win at Arkansas on Sept. 20 as UA rushed for 328 yards. Smith has helped the Crimson Tide rank 18th nationally in rushing at 205.3 yards per game. He won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy last year as the top offensive lineman in the conference. Former UA All-American Cornelius Bennett in 1986 is the only other Crimson Tide player to win the Lombardi Award.

**HELMET STICKER FOR JOHNSON:** Rashad Johnson made Homecoming 2008 one he will remember forever. The senior from Sulligent, Ala., matched his career high with 13 tackles and found the end zone for the first time in his career with a 32-yard interception return. He also registered a career-best 2.5 tackles for loss and broke up his team-high 10th pass of the season. ESPN.com's Chris Low gave Johnson a helmet sticker for his efforts. Below is what Low had to say about the Tide's free safety.

"Most of the defensive pub this season has gone to nose tackle Terrence Cody and middle linebacker Rolando McClain, but Johnson has been Mr. Steady in the secondary and is also one of the strongest leaders on the team. His 32-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter highlighted another defensive gem by Alabama in its 35-0 win over Arkansas State. The Crimson Tide held the Red Wolves to 158 total yards and sacked quarterback Corey Leonard four times. In its last three games, the Alabama defense has allowed just three touchdowns."

**JOHN PARKER WILSON NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR DAVEY O'BRIEN:** Alabama quarterback John Parker Wilson is among 13 Football Bowl Subdivision quarterbacks selected as semifinalists for the 2008 Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award. The native of Hoover, Ala, has completed 60.8 percent of his passes for 1,412 yards and eight touchdowns. Wilson is UA's all-time leader in completions, yards and touchdowns. The Davey O'Brien Award focuses on accomplishments both on and off the field. Fans are able to vote for semifinalist candidates once daily at www.VoteOBrien.org. The voting will continue throughout the semifinalist and finalist rounds with five percent of the final tally coming directly from the fan vote.

**TIDE WINS 10TH STRAIGHT:** With the win over Arkansas State, Alabama has reeled off 10 consecutive wins dating back to last year's win over Colorado in the Independence Bowl. The Crimson Tide's winning streak ties Penn State and Texas Tech for the longest in the nation pending the outcome of Saturday night's game between Texas Tech and Texas. Penn State did not play Saturday. Texas and Utah also had nine straight wins entering Saturday's action, both teams play on Saturday night. The 10-game winning streak is the longest since a 12-game winning streak that began at the 1993 Gator Bowl and continued through a loss to Florida in the 1994 SEC Championship Game.

**WILSON TIES SCHOOL RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE COMPLETIONS:** Senior quarterback John Parker Wilson tied the Alabama record for consecutive passes completed with a 6-yard completion to Mike McCoy with 10:06 left in the first quarter on the Tide's second play from scrimmage. Parker's chance to break the record went awry when receiver Julio Jones failed to catch what would have been the 13th straight completion just a couple of plays later.

**WILSON SURPASSES 7,000 CAREER PASSING YARDS:** John Parker Wilson surpassed the 7,000-yard mark in career passing yardage on Saturday afternoon. Entering the game with 6,911 career passing yards, Wilson passed for 85 yards in the first half to move that total to 6,996 yards at halftime. Alabama's all-time career passing yards leader, Wilson surpassed the 7,000-yard barrier on a six-yard pass completion to tight end Travis McCall on the first play from scrimmage in the third quarter. Wilson finished the day with 152 passing yards for a career total of 7,063 yards.

**INGRAM TIES RECORD FOR RUSHING TDS BY A FRESHMAN:** Running back Mark Ingram rushed for 113 yards and two touchdowns against Arkansas State, scoring on runs of 5 and 17 yards to give him eight rushing touchdowns this season. That ties the Alabama record for touchdown runs by a freshman, matching Terry Grant's eight rushing touchdowns in 2007.

**SMITH, CODY ON** *SPORTING NEWS MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICAN TEAM*: Alabama was one of four schools nationally to place two players on *The Sporting News Midseason All-America* team with left tackle Andre Smith and nose guard Terrence Cody garnering first-team honors. Smith is the cornerstone of the Crimson Tide's offensive line while Cody has been a game-changer in the middle of UA's defensive front. "Andre Smith is the best pass protector in the game, and better than many current NFL starting left tackles," *Sporting News Today* college football writer Matt Hayes said.

**UA AMONG DEFENSIVE LEADERS:** Alabama is in the top 20 nationally in four defensive categories after nine games this season. The Crimson Tide ranks fourth nationally in total defense, allowing just 251.4 yards per game. The rushing defense is second in the country, giving up just 65.56 yards per contest, while the scoring defense ranks sixth nationally, allowing just 12.22 points per game, which is second in the SEC (Florida, 11.63). Finally, the pass efficiency defense comes in at No. 14 this week, allowing an efficiency rating of just 101.40 to opposing quarterbacks. The pass defense also moved up this week to No. 34, allowing 185.89 yards per game.

**TIDE TIED FOR NATIONAL LEAD IN NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** Alabama is tied for the nationally lead in the Football Bowl Subdivision with six non-offensive touchdowns in 2008. The Crimson Tide has three interceptions returns for touchdowns - a 74-yarder by Justin Woodall, a 63-yarder by Javier Arenas and a 32-yarder by Rashad Johnson - to go along with an 87-yard punt return from Arenas, a 17-yard return of a blocked punt by Chris Rogers and a four-yard fumble return by Rolando McClain. UA is joined by Oklahoma State (2 PR, 2 INT, 1 KOR and 1 FR), Kansas State (5 PR and 1 FR) and Florida (4 INT and 2 PR) with six non-offensive touchdowns. Missouri has five with four interception returns and one kickoff return.

**TOUGH TO FIND THE END ZONE:** Alabama has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the country. The Crimson Tide allowed their first and only rushing touchdown of the season at Georgia and have allowed just one rushing TD in the last 40 quarters of football. The UA defense is allowing just 65.6 yards rushing per game and 12.22 points. Ohio State, Northern Illinois, Vanderbilt, Auburn and Clemson are close behind, surrendering just four rushing touchdowns this season.

**TIME OF POSSESSION:** An Alabama trademark this season has been its ability to control the line of scrimmage offensively and, consequently, control the tempo of the game. This has been particularly evident in games with Clemson, Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky and Tennessee. Alabama (32:31) currently leads the SEC and ranks 10th nationally in time of possession. The Crimson Tide have won the time of possession battle in seven of nine games this season.

**POINTS OFF TURNOVERS:** The Alabama defense has forced 16 turnovers this season and 11 of those turnovers have resulted in points for the Crimson Tide. The offense has scored seven times, including three touchdowns and four field goals. The defense has four touchdowns as well, including interception returns by Javier Arenas and Justin Woodall at Arkansas (Sept. 20), Rashad Johnson vs. Arkansas State and a fumble return by Rolando McClain against Kentucky (Oct. 4). Alabama has forced at least one turnover in seven of nine games this season (no turnovers vs. Tulane and Tennessee). The Crimson Tide recorded a season-high four turnovers, all interceptions, in its 49-14 win at Arkansas (Sept. 20) and converted three of those turnovers into 21 points. Alabama also scored 10 points off three turnovers in the 24-20 win over Mississippi (Oct. 18) and scored six points off two turnovers in its 34-10 season-opening win over Clemson (Aug. 30). By comparison, Alabama has 11 turnovers this season, but only four have directly led to points. Western Kentucky, Arkansas and Mississippi all scored one touchdown following an Alabama turnover this season while Tennessee kicked a field goal.

**OUT IN FRONT:** Alabama has trailed for a total of 1:15 over the last 10 games dating back to a loss at Auburn in 2007. The Crimson Tide have been tied or led in just under 599 of the last 600 minutes of football. In nine of those 10 games (Mississippi), Alabama has scored in the first quarter to take an early lead and held that lead for 533:40 of those games. The Tide has spent 65:05 tied during those games.

**O-LINE EXPERIENCE:** Alabama's offensive line has been a dominant force early in the 2008 season. The Crimson Tide ranks 18th nationally in rushing - with the No. 30 Glen Coffee (99.33) and No. 91 Mark Ingram (59.22) individual rusher - and have physically dominated their opposition. A big reason for their success - beyond physical talent - is their ability to play as a cohesive unit. Coming into the LSU game, the five have combined to start 129 games over their careers – Antoine Caldwell (43 starts), Andre Smith (34 starts), Mike Johnson (22 starts), Marlon Davis (21 starts) & Drew Davis (9 starts).

**COFFEE HAS SEC'S TWO LONGEST RUNS:** Glen Coffee has the two longest runs in the Southeastern Conference this season. He busted loose on an 87-yard touchdown run at Arkansas, which was the fourth-longest run in Crimson Tide history and a career long for him at Alabama. He then ripped off a 78-yard touchdown run against Kentucky. Coffee has three rushes of 50 yards or more, including a 51-yard touchdown run against Western Kentucky. Coffee ranks fourth in the SEC and 30th nationally in rushing at 99.33 yards per game and is second among the top 10 SEC rushers at 6.6 yards per carry.

**1,000-YARD RUSHERS:** Glen Coffee became the 48th Crimson Tide player to eclipse the 1,000-yard career rushing mark with his 10-carry, 162-yard effort at Arkansas on Sept. 20. In 30 games, Coffee has 313 rushing attempts for 1,618 yards and 11 touchdowns in his career. He averages 5.2 yards per carry in his career. Coffee is 20th on the school's all-time rushing list with 1,618 yards. In nine games this season, Coffee has 136 rushing attempts for 894 yards and seven touchdowns. Sophomore running back Terry Grant has 990 career rushing yards and with 10 more yards will become the school's 49th career 1,000-yard rusher.

**MR. COFFEE:** Alabama junior running back Glen Coffee set the Alabama single-game record with a 16.2-yard per carry average (minimum 10 attempts) at Arkansas on Sept. 20. Coffee ran 10 times for 162 yards and scored on runs of 87 and 31 yards in the Tide's 35-point first half. The previous record was 14.9-yards per carry average by Santonio Beard against Mississippi in 2002. Beard had 10 rushing attempts for 149 yards and a school-record tying five touchdowns against the Rebels.

**COFFEE HAS CAREER-BEST RUSHING DAY:** Junior running back Glen Coffee rushed for a career-high 218 yards and one touchdown on 25 carries against Kentucky. The performance, the sixth-best single-game rushing performance in Alabama history, outpaced his previous single-game high of 162 yards accomplished against Arkansas on September 20 in Fayetteville. This season, Coffee has rushed for 838 yards on 127 carries (6.6-yard per carry average) and has scored five touchdowns. The performance vs. Kentucky marked Alabama's first 200-yard rushing performance since Kenneth Darby rushed for 200 yards against Mississippi State on October 6, 2004, and the most since Shaun Alexander went for a school-record 291 yards against LSU on Nov. 9, 1996, in Baton Rouge.

**COFFEE/CODY ADDED TO WATCH LISTS:** Juniors Glen Coffee and Terrence Cody were added to the 2008 Maxwell Football Club Awards Watch list on Oct. 7. Coffee is on the watch list for the 2008 Maxwell Award, presented annually to the top offensive player in college football, joining Tide senior quarterback John Parker Wilson. Cody was named to the 2008 Chuck Bednarik Award watch list, presented annually to the best defensive player in college football.

JONES SETS FRESHMAN TO CATCHES AND YARDAGE RECORD: Freshman receiver Julio Jones hauled in a John Parker Wilson touchdown pass with 1:25 left in the second quarter at Georgia, his fourth touchdown catch of the season. That set an Alabama record for touchdown catches by a freshman. The previous mark of three was shared by David Palmer (1991) and A.C. Carter (1999). Jones the set the freshman yards receiving record at Tennessee with 103 yards on six catches. He now has 506 yards receiving on the season, passing Ozzie Newsome, who had 374 yards in 1974. Jones also set the season receptions record with 33, passing Carter who had 29 in 1999.

**TRUE FRESHMAN PARTICIPATION**: Alabama is tied for third nationally in true freshman participation. The Crimson Tide has played 16 true freshmen during the 2008 season. Alabama has had two true freshman starters while 15 others made contributions. Florida State leads the nation with 22 true freshmen seeing time in its opener while Miami has started 21 and Arkansas 16.

**NINE SCHOLARSHIP SENIORS FEWEST IN NATION:** Alabama boasts just nine scholarship seniors on the 2008 team and that mark is tied with Middle Tennessee for the fewest in the country. Antoine Caldwell, Marlon Davis, Bobby Greenwood, Rashad Johnson, Travis McCall, Will Oakley, Nikita Stover, Nick Walker and John Parker Wilson make up the Crimson Tide's nine scholarship seniors.

**FRESHMAN IMPACT:** Several members of the Crimson Tide's touted 2008 recruiting class have already made a significant impact on the field. Freshman running back Mark Ingram (Flint, Mich.) ranks second on the team in rushing and seventh in the SEC with 59.2 yards per game (533 yards on 94 carries) and a team-best eight touchdowns. Rookie wide receiver Julio Jones leads the team in receptions (33), receiving yards (506 and 56.2 per game) and touchdowns (4). He is tied for seventh in receptions per game in the SEC and sixth in yards per game. On the other side of the football, Dont'a Hightower is third on the team in tackles with 42 stops - 19 solo - in nine games (4.4 tackles per game). Hightower has also forced one fumble and recovered two more to rank tied for fifth in the SEC at .22 per game. Junior college transfer Terrence Cody has also cast a large shadow for the Tide defense, the 6-5, 365-pound nose guard has 15 tackles on the season with 3.5 tackles for loss (-8) while also causing and recovering a fumble.

**TIDE SCORES 2 DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** Alabama's defense scored two touchdowns against Arkansas, both on interception returns. That marked the first time in Alabama history that the Crimson Tide had scored two touchdowns on interceptions returns in the same game. Since 2001, Alabama has had four games in which the Tide scored two defensive touchdowns:

Sept. 20, 2008 - at Arkansas (Javier Arenas 63-yard interception return; Justin Woodall 74-yard interception return)

Nov. 5, 2005 - at Mississippi State (Matt Miller 15-yard fumble return; Rudy Griffin 17-yard interception return)

### JOHNSON'S INTERCEPTION RETURN TO IS TIDE'S 4TH DEFENSIVE TO THIS SEASON:

Safety Rashad Johnson returned his interception of an Arkansas State pass 32 yards for a touchdown with 8:54 remaining in the second quarter. With that touchdown, the Alabama defense has scored four touchdowns this season, including interception returns by Javier Arenas and Justin Woodall at Arkansas (Sept. 20) and a fumble return by Rolando McClain against Kentucky (Oct. 4).

**ARENAS BREAKS 61-YEAR OLD RECORD:** Javier Arenas gained 147 punt return yards on five punt returns (29.4-yard average), against Tulane on Sept. 6, setting an Alabama single-game record for punt return yards. The old mark of 122 yards was set by Harry Gilmer against Georgia on October 25, 1947, in a 17-7 Alabama victory in Athens. Arenas accomplished virtually that entire total in the first half before leaving the game with an injury suffered on his first punt return of the third quarter. Arenas ranks fourth in the SEC and 13th nationally with a 13.37 yards per return average.

**ARENAS GOES THE DISTANCE:** Javier Arenas returned a Tulane punt 87 yards for a touchdown with 10:45 left in the first quarter to put Alabama in front, 7-0. That return, the fifth-longest punt return in Alabama history, was Arenas' fourth punt return for a touchdown, tying David Palmer's (1991-93) school record. Palmer actually had a fifth punt return for a touchdown against Colorado in the 1991 Blockbuster Bowl that came prior to the NCAA recognizing bowl statistics. Arenas has had two punt returns of more than 80 yards in his career, including an 86-yarder vs. Oklahoma State in the 2006 Independence Bowl.

**FITZGERALD FLIPPING FIELD FOR TIDE:** Junior punter P.J. Fitzgerald's performance at Arkansas was one of his best punting games at Alabama. He averaged 45.2 yards on five punts, including a 56-yarder that was his longest kick of the season. Fitzgerald also pinned the Razorbacks inside their 20-yard line twice. He is averaging a career-best 41.76-yard per kick to rank fifth in the SEC with seven punts inside the 20. Fitzgerald has been outstanding in five SEC games, averaging 42.6 on 19 punts. He averaged 45.2 at Arkansas, 44.5 at Georgia and 43.2 against Kentucky.

**TIGHT END TANDEM:** Alabama's senior tight end duo of Nick Walker and Travis McCall have played an important role in the Crimson Tide's 9-0 start. Walker is the Tide's No. 2 receiver with 23 receptions for 232 yards and two touchdowns. McCall, has just three catches on the year, but has good hands and is an outstanding blocker whose contributions are many times overlooked. While McCall is helping the Crimson Tide roll up 205.3 yards per game on the ground, Walker is compiling impressive numbers through the air. Walker's 23 receptions are one shy of his career high set last season, which are the most receptions by an Alabama tight end since Lamonde Russell had 28 in 1990. Russell set the school record for tight ends in 1989 with 51 receptions.

ALABAMA-LSU SERIES: Alabama leads the all-time series with LSU 43-23-5 in a series that dates back to the 1895 season. The 2008 game will be the 72nd meeting between these two long-time Southern football rivals. The Tigers won the inaugural meeting in Baton Rouge, 12-6, on Nov. 18, 1895. The two teams did not meet again until the 1902 season, with LSU prevailing once again. Alabama's first series win came on Nov. 9, 1903, in Baton Rouge as the Crimson Tide scored a 10-0 victory. LSU won four of the first six meetings in the series, before Alabama began to take control at the conclusion of World War I. From 1919-45, Alabama posted a 12-game unbeaten streak (9-0-3) against LSU. The two schools did not meet from 1931-43. The series was resumed during the 1944 season with the Fighting Tigers gaining a slight advantage over the next nine meetings, posting a 5-3-1 record from 1946-58. Alabama went 16-2 (.889) against LSU from 1964-81, including a series-long 11-game winning streak from 1971-81. LSU also ended UA's school record 31-game (30-0-1) unbeaten streak with a 17-13 win at Bryant-Denny Stadium in 1993. The Tigers snapped a 15-game winless streak to the Crimson Tide in Tiger Stadium with a 30-28 win in Baton Rouge on Nov. 4, 2000. LSU has won eight of the last 12 meetings, dating back to 1997, seven of the last eight meetings, dating back to 2000 and five straight. The Tide's last win was a 31-0 trimuph in Baton Rouge in 2002. Alabama has not beaten LSU in Tuscaloosa since a 23-17 win in 1999.

**THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME:** There's no place like home, unless you play in the Alabama-LSU football series. A streaky series at best, this matchup between Alabama and LSU has produced some interesting results. The Crimson Tide holds a 43-23-5 series lead over the Tigers in a series that has been dominated by the road team. The home team has compiled an 11-26-1 record since the 1970 season. The road team won every game in the Alabama-LSU series from 1981-89, with the exception of a 14-14 tie in Baton Rouge in 1985. Alabama snapped the nine-game unbeaten streak by

the road team with a 24-3 win in Tuscaloosa during the 1990 season. Since 1991, the road team is 12-5 (.688) in the last 17 games, including LSU's win last year in Tuscaloosa (41-34). Since 1971, Alabama has posted a 15-2-1 (.861) record against LSU in Baton Rouge, including a 15-game unbeatean streak from 1971-98. Alabama posted a 14-0-1 record at Tiger Stadium during that stretch. LSU has won back-to-back home games with Alabama. The only other time in series history in which LSU won two straight home games against Alabama was a 31-21 win on Nov. 9, 1946 (31-21) and a 26-6 win on Nov. 20, 1948. Since 1982, LSU owns an 10-3 record over the Crimson Tide in the state of Alabama. The Tigers won four straight road games from 1982-88 and have won the last four at Bryant-Denny Stadium (2001, 2003, 2005 & 2007).

**BAMA-LSU SERIES AT VARIOUS SITES:** The Alabama-LSU series has been played at six different sites since the initial meeting in 1895. The city of Baton Rouge has hosted the most games in the series (34), with Alabama posting a 24-8-2 (.735) record on the LSU campus. Only one other Louisiana city has hosted this series, with Alabama and LSU playing to a 7-7 tie in New Orleans in 1921. Four Alabama cities have played host to this rivalry, including Tuscaloosa, Mobile, Montgomery and Birmingham. The Tide owns a 19-14-2 record in the state of Alabama.

**LSU SERIES IS A LONG ONE:** The LSU series is the fourth-longest series in school history. The two teams began playing in 1895, the 15th game in Crimson Tide history, and the 2008 game marks the 72nd meeting between the two teams. Only Mississippi State (92), Tennessee (91) and Vanderbilt (81) have played Alabama more than LSU.

SABAN VS. LSU: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 0-2 in his career against LSU, losing 46-25 to the Tigers while at Michigan State in the 1995 Independence Bowl in Shreveport and 41-34 last year in Tuscaloosa. Saban was the head coach at LSU from 2000-04 and compiled a 48-16 (.750) record, leading the Tigers to the 2003 BCS National Championship and two SEC Championships during his tenure. In 2003, Saban led the Tigers to a 13-1 record and a 21-14 win over Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship Game played at the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans, La. This will be Saban's first game against his former team in Tiger Stadium since he left Baton Rouge for the Miami Dolphins after the 2004 season. This will be Saban's third game in the state of Louisiana since his departure from LSU following the 2004 season. On Oct. 30, 2005, Saban led the Miami Dolphins to a 21-6 win over the New Orleans Saints in a game played at Tiger Stadium after Hurricane Katrina had damaged the Louisiana Superdome earlier that year and the Saints moved their home games to various sites, including Baton Rouge and San Antonio, Texas. Saban also led Alabama to 30-24 win over Colorado in the 2007 Independence Bowl in Shreveport.

**UA PLAYER NOTES VS. LSU:** Alabama junior Javier Arenas has averaged 152.5 all purpose yards per game in his career against LSU. Last year, Arenas had a career-high 305 all-purpose yards, including a 61-yard punt return that gave the Tide a 31-24 lead in the fourth quarter. He also had eight kickoff returns for 168 yards, all career-highs last season ... Arenas also had four tackles, one sack and pass break-up in last year's game against the Tigers, which was his first career start for the Tide at cornerback ... Senior defensive end Bobby Greenwood has seven career tackles, two tackles for loss (-17) and one sack (-10) in his career against LSU ... Sophomore cornerback Kareem Jackson had six tackles (5 solos), two pass break-ups, one interception (51 yards) and one blocked field goal in last year's game with LSU ... Senior safety Rashad Johnson had 11 career tackles and two pass break-ups in two games against the Tigers ... He missed the 2006 game with an injury ... Sophomore linebacker Rolando McClain had seven tackles (5 solos) in last year's game ... Senior receiver Nikita Stover's first career TD reception came at LSU during the 2006 season ... Senior quarterback John Parker Wilson has 525 passing yards (262.5) and five TDs in his career against the

**UA-LSU SERIES NOTEBOOK:** The LSU series is the fourth-oldest series in the UA record books. The series dates back to 1895 ... LSU and Southern Mississippi are the only two teams to play Alabama at all four modern era home sites -- Crampton Bowl, Ladd Stadium, Legion Field and Bryant-Denny Stadium ... Alabama has shut out LSU 15 times, including a 31-0 win in Baton Rouge in 2002. The Crimson Tide's largest shutout victory was a 42-0 decision in 1925 ... LSU has shut out Alabama three times and not since a 27-0 win in Tuscaloosa in 1997. The Tigers' largest shutout win came in 1957 (28-0) ... Alabama's longest series winning streak is 11 games from 1971-82 ... LSU's longest winning streak over Alabama is the Tigers' current five-game winning streak ... LSU has posted back-to-back wins over Alabama five times (1895 & 1902; 1948 & 1951; 1957-58; 1969-70 and 2000-01) before posting its third consecutive win last year in Tuscaloosa ... Alabama defeated LSU 6-4 in Mobile during the 1907 season on a 75-yard kickoff return by Thomas Ready with less than one minute to play ... The Crimson Tide's 21-0 win in Baton Rouge during the 1919 season was the first win of a then school record 12-game winning streak for Alabama ... This was also the first win in the first 10-game winning streak in school history ... Alabama and LSU played to 27-27 tie in Baton Rouge on Sept. 30, 1944, marking the first Alabama football game since the Jan. 1, 1943 Orange Bowl win over Boston College (37-21). The Crimson Tide did not field a football team in 1943 due to World War II ... Legendary Alabama coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's first game as head coach of the Crimson Tide was against LSU. The Tigers defeated the Crimson Tide 13-3 on Sept. 27, 1958 at Mobile's Ladd Stadium ... Alabama recorded its 500th all-time win with a 21-7 victory over LSU on Thanksgiving night (Nov. 22) in 1973 ... Alabama's 650th win (32-16) came against LSU on Nov. 11, 1989 in Baton Rouge as UA clinched a share of its first SEC Championship since 1981 ... Alabama's 700th win also came in Baton Rouge on Nov. 5, 1994 as the Tide claimed a 35-17 win.

LOUISIANA NATIVES: Alabama has two Louisiana natives on its football roster, including sophomore defensive lineman Luther Davis (Monroe, La.) and freshman special teams' player Robby Green (River Ridge, La.)

UA-LSU COACHING TIES: Alabama defensive line coach Bo Davis was an All-SEC defensive lineman at LSU and later worked on the Tigers' staff under both Nick Saban and Les Miles. Assistant head coach and secondary coach Kirby Smart spent the 2004 season at LSU under Nick Saban. Smart tutored two NFL first-round draft picks Corey Webster and Travis Daniels. LSU allowed 157.2 passing yards to rank second in the SEC and fifth nationally in 2004. Alabama outside linebackers coach Lance Thompson spent two years on Saban's staff at LSU in 2002 and 2003. In 2002, Thompson served as defensive line coach. In 2003, he served as the Tigers' recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach during their BCS National Championship season. LSU's Director of Athletic Training, Jack Marucci, served as a graduate assistant trainer for the Alabama football and baseball teams from 1986-88 and earned his master's degree from UA in 1988.

ALABAMA VS. LOUISIANA SCHOOLS: Alabama owns an 83-39-8 record against teams from the state of Louisiana ... The Crimson Tide has played 112 of those 129 games against LSU (71) and Tulane (41).

WILSON BREAKING RECORDS FOR TIDE: John Parker Wilson became Alabama's all-time leader in pass completions against Clemson on Aug. 30. Wilson found UA tight end Nick Walker for a five-yard completion in the second quarter to pass Brodie Croyle's record of 488 set from 2002-05. Wilson now has 602 career completions. Wilson also surpassed the Alabama career pass attempts mark vs. Clemson and now has 1,056, exceeding Croyle's 869. His eight touchdown passes this season have also moved him ahead of Croyle on that list with 45 career TD strikes to Croyle's 41. Wilson also captured the school record for career plays (now 1,259) and then surpassed the career total yards mark (now 7,241).

WILSON BREAKS ALABAMA CAREER PASSING YARDS MARK: Senior quarterback John Parker Wilson broke the Alabama record for career passing yards in the 41-30 win over Georgia on Sept. 27. With 205 passing yards, Wilson surpassed Brodie Croyle (2002-05) on the Alabama list. Wilson now has passed for 7,063 yards, after a win over Arkansas State. Wilson eclipsed Croyle's total of 6,382. The record fell on a 29-yard pass to Roy Upchurch against Georgia on Sept. 27 that carried to the Bulldogs' 13-yard line with just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

TIFFIN A SEMIFINALIST FOR LOU GROZA AWARD: Alabama place-kicker Leigh Tiffin was named a semifinalist for the 2008 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the FedEx Orange Bowl. Tiffin is one of 20 placekickers selected as semifinalists by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission. The Muscle Shoals, Ala., native has connected on 13 of 18 field goals this season and all 33 extra points. He is tied for second in the Southeastern Conference and tied for 24th nationally in field goals per game at 1.44. Tiffin also ranks tied for fourth in the league and tied for 38th nationally in scoring at 8.00 points per game. He is 9 for 11 this season from inside 40 yards with a long of 54 yards vs. Clemson. His 54-yarder against the Tigers ranks third in UA history, exceeded only by a 57-yarder by his father, Van Tiffin, against Texas A&M in 1985 and a 55-yarder by Ryan Pflugner against Arkansas in 1998. Tiffin is responsible for 67 points this season and 214 in his Crimson Tide career, which ranks seventh on the all-time list.

SEC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Alabama has had 10 SEC Players of the Week in 2008. The Crimson Tide got things started with two SEC Players of the Week after its 34-10 victory over then-No. 9 Clemson. Junior Mike Johnson was named the Offensive Lineman of the Week and nose guard Terrence Cody garnered Defensive Lineman of the Week honors. In week two, following a 20-6 win over Tulane, Javier Arenas was named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week. He had a school record 147 punt return yards, including an 87-yard return for a touchdown. Julio Jones then captured Freshman of the Week accolades against Western Kentucky. Andre Smith was named the Offensive Lineman of the Week after his performance against Arkansas and John Parker Wilson was tabbed as the Offensive Player of the Week following the win over No. 3 Georgia where he completed 13-of-16 passes for 205 yards. Bobby Greenwood then won UA's second Defensive Lineman of the Week honor after the Kentucky game. Johnson claimed his second SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week following his performance in the Tide's 24-20 win over Mississippi. Jones then garnered his second freshman of the week honor after catching six passes for 103 yards in a 29-9 win at Tennessee. Alabama garnered its second straight freshman of the week honor, this time for Mark Ingram, who rushed for a career-high 113 yards and two touchdowns against the Red Wolves.

WILSON NAMED AT&T NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Alabama senior quarterback John Parker Wilson was named the AT&T All-America Player of the Week following the Crimson Tide's 41-30 win over Georgia. The award is the only major college football honor chosen exclusively by fans. Wilson led the Tide to victory in Athens with 205 yards through the air on 13-of-16 passing and a touchdown. He received 40 percent of the votes to beat out Oregon State running back Jacquizz Rogers (23 percent), Oklahoma quarterback Sam Bradford (21 percent) and Texas quarterback Colt McCoy (16 percent).

**CALDWELL AND WILSON ON LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS LIST:** Alabama senior center Antoine Caldwell and senior quarterback John Parker Wilson are among 30 Division I players that make up the preliminary list for the 2008 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for NCAA football teams. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages those leaders to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact on their circle of influence. This prestigious awards program was launched during the 2001-02 basketball season, added six additional sports in 2007, and has now expanded this year to include NCAA football. Alabama, Georgia Tech and Ohio State are the only Division I programs will multiple candidates. These 30 student-athletes will be narrowed down to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will then be placed on the official ballot. The ballots will be distributed through a

nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select the candidate that best exemplifies excellence in the "Four C's" of Classroom, Character, Community and Competition.

FIRST-TIME PLAYERS: Alabama has played 16 true freshmen and seen 26 different newcomers contributing early in the 2008 campaign, including seven redshirt freshmen and one junior college transfer. The Crimson Tide had 12 players make their Alabama debuts against Clemson: true freshman Julio Jones (WR), true freshman Mark Ingram (RB), true freshman B.J. Scott (WR), redshirt freshman Marquis Maze (WR), true freshman Chris Jackson (WR), true freshman Dont'a Hightower (LB), true freshman Chris Jordan (LB), junior transfer Terrence Cody (DT), true freshman Mark Barron (DB), redshirt freshman Chris Underwood (TE), true freshman Marcel Dareus (DL) and true freshman Robby Green (DB). Three more true freshmen made their debut in the home opener against Tulane with linebackers Jerrell Harris and Courtney Upshaw along with place-kicker Corey Smith. The Tide then played three more true freshmen against Western Kentucky as offensive tackles, John Michael Boswell, Barrett Jones and Tyler Love got playing time. Redshirt freshmen Robert Ezell, Brandon Gibson, Demetrius Goode, and Sam Snider have also seen action. True Freshman Brad Smelley made his first appearance against Mississippi with a catch for 16

**WILSON NAMED JOHNNY UNITAS GOLDEN ARM FINALIST:** Alabama senior quarterback John Parker Wilson was selected as one of 10 finalists for the 2008 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award. The prestigious Golden Arm Award is presented annually to the nation's top senior quarterback by the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Educational Foundation, Inc. Six games into his senior season, Wilson has guided the Crimson Tide to a 6-0 record and a No. 2 national ranking. The Hoover, Ala., native has passed for 853 yards while completing 59.8 percent of his passes with six touchdowns

**ESPN.COM RECOGNIZES CRIMSON TIDE:** ESPN.com's Chris Low praised the Crimson Tide in his midseason report on the Southeastern Conference. Low named junior nose guard Terrence Cody the SEC's Newcomer of the Year while tagging linebacker Rolando McClain as the conference's Defensive Player of the Year. Low also named left tackle Andre Smith as Alabama's offensive player of the year. Low called Smith "perhaps the best left offensive tackle in college football, but he's been the cornerstone of an offensive line that has punished people this season. He's been as dominant as an offensive lineman can be."

### JONES & HIGHTOWER RIVALS.COM MIDSEASON FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICANS:

Alabama is not only among the leaders in true freshmen played nationally, but a couple of those freshmen are proving to be among the best in the country. Rivals.com selected Crimson Tide wide receiver Julio Jones and linebacker Dont'a Hightower as Midseason Freshman All-Americans. Jones has 28 catches for 444 yards and four touchdowns while Hightower has registered 37 tackles with two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble. It is the second straight year that Alabama has had two Midseason Freshman All-Americans after Rolando McClain and Kareem Jackson were honored last season.

PHIL STEELE'S MIDSEASON ALL-SEC: Alabama had nine players on Phil Steele's 2008 Midseason All-SEC Football Team. The Crimson Tide had five offensive selections, four defensive selections and one special teams' honoree with junior Javier Arenas being named as both a cornerback and kick returner. Junior left tackle Andre Smith was the Tide's lone first-team All-SEC representative on offense while junior running back Glen Coffee, freshman receiver Julio Jones and senior center Antoine Caldwell were second-team honorees. Left guard Mike Johnson was named to the third team. Junior nose tackle Terrence Cody and sophomore linebacker Rolando McClain were named first-team All-SEC defensive players with Rashad Johnson selected to the second-team.

**300 IN TUSCALOOSA:** Alabama captured its 300th win in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 18 vs. Mississippi in just the 362nd game played in the city. The Crimson Tide boasts a 300-59-3 (.833) record in Tuscaloosa and a 215-46-3 (.820) at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama's first game on campus was a 4-0 loss to the Birmingham Athletic Club on Oct. 14, 1893. The Tide's first game at what was then known as Denny Stadium was a 55-0 win over Mississippi College on Sept. 28, 1929.

**TOSTITOS FIESTA BOWL TEAM OF THE WEEK:** The Crimson Tide was selected as the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl Team of the Week after a dominating 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic in the Georgia Dome. The Alabama defense held Clemson to just 188 total yards and zero rushing yards while the offense controlled the clock with 41:13 of possession time and 419 total yards. It was the Crimson Tide's first win over a top 10 team since beating No. 5 Florida 31-3 in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 1, 2005.

**GLEN COFFEE IS SI COVER BOY:** Alabama running back Glen Coffee adorned the Sept. 8 cover of Sports Illustrated after he and his Crimson Tide teammates hammered then-No. 9 Clemson on Aug. 30 in the Chick-fil-A Kick-off Classic. Coffee rushed for 90 yards on 17 carries to help UA rack up 419 yards of total offense and 41:13 of possession time. John Parker Wilson threw for 180 yards on 22-of-30 passing with two touchdowns. The Tide defense allowed just 188 yards of total offense, including zero on the ground.

**ALABAMA DEGREES:** Alabama enters the 2008 season with six graduates on its football roster, including five of the nine scholarship seniors. Senior All-SEC safety Rashad Johnson, senior quarterback John Parker Wilson and junior offensive lineman Drew Davis all graduated this August from the Capstone, Johnson received his degree in Criminal Justice. Wilson and Davis earned their degrees in Marketing. The trio joins senior All-SEC center Antoine Caldwell and senior wide receivers Will Oakley and Nikita Stover, who graduated last May. In addition, five other former Crimson Tide players earned their undergraduate degrees from UA this August, including Charles Hoke (Finance), Zeke Knight (Human Environmental Studies), Terrence Jones (Human Environmental Studies), Tyrone Prothro (Human Environmental Studies) and B.J. Stabler (General Business).

**FRESHMAN ACADEMICS:** Alabama placed five freshmen on the 2007 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll, the fifth-highest total in the SEC. The Tide's freshman academic honorees were Josh Chapman, Rolando McClain, Jennings Hester, Nick Fanuzzi and Alfred McCullough.

**FORBES RECOGNIZES UNIVERSITY:** The University of Alabama was rated No. 7 by *Forbes* magazine on the Top 100 National Public Universities list. "The University of Alabama, which got great reviews from its students, came in No. 7 on our national public university ranking," the magazine wrote

**NICK'S KIDS:** At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Saban's continue in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise more than \$650,000 - including over \$350,000 this year - for "Nick's Kids" and made a total of more than 140 donations to children's charities throughout the state of Alabama.

**COVERING EVERYTHING:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban's success has spread beyond just football and into the business world. He was on the cover of *Sports Illustrated* prior to the 2007 season, and prior to the start of the 2008 season he was featured on the cover of the Sept. 1 issue of *Forbes* magazine. The article inside the magazine, written by Monte Burke, examines Saban and his guidance of Crimson Tide program. The cover features Saban with Bryant-Denny Stadium in the background. Saban is the first college football coach to be featured on the cover of *Forbes* since the publication began in 1917.

**MILLION DOLLAR PLEDGE:** Coach Saban and his wife, Terry, pledged \$1 million to The University for scholarships in June of 2008. The Saban scholarships are designed specifically for first-generation college students. Six first-generation college students have already benefitted from the \$100,000 gift the Saban's made upon their arrival at the Capstone in January 2007.

**COACHING CLINIC SUCCESS:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 2008 coaching clinic featured some of the top minds in football across all levels and over 1,000 high school coaches were on hand for the event in early April. The featured speakers included Bill Belichick, Al Groh, Dean Pees, Fernando Bryant, several Alabama assistant coaches and keynote speaker Vince Dooley.

**NEW HIRES:** The Alabama football staff features three new faces in 2008, including offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Jim McElwain, tight ends and special teams coordinator Bobby Williams and Associate Athletics Director for Football Mike Vollmar. McElwain joins the Tide staff after spending last season at Fresno State where the Bulldogs averaged 419.5 yards of total offense per game that ranked 38th nationally and was a 24 percent increase over the previous year. He spent the 2007 season as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders. Williams rejoins Saban's staff after spending the 2005 and 2006 seasons as the Miami Dolphins running backs coach. Prior to that Williams was Saban's associate head coach and wide receivers coach at LSU in 2004. He was the head coach at Michigan State from 2000-04, taking over for Saban when he left for LSU. Vollmar comes to the Capstone after 12 years as an Assistant Athletics Director for Football at Michigan State.

**TOP AIDES:** Alabama's coaching staff has a wealth of knowledge across all levels of football. The nine-man Crimson Tide staff features two former head coaches at the Bowl Subdivision level in Kevin Steele (Baylor) and Bobby Williams (Michigan State). The staff also has six coaches that have spent time as assistant coaches in the NFL in Bo Davis (Dolphins), Jim McElwain (Raiders), Joe Pendry (19 years with multiple teams), Kirby Smart (Dolphins), Kevin Steele (Panthers) and Bobby Williams (Lions and Dolphins).

**PLAYBOY ALL-AMERICAN:** Alabama junior left tackle Andre Smith was named to the 2008 Preseason *Playboy* All-American team this summer. He was the winner of the 2007 Jacobs Trophy, presented to the SEC's most outstanding blocker. Smith was named to the 2008 Outland Trophy watch list. He was also named preseason All-American by *ESPN.com*, *Blue Ribbon College Football Yearbook*, *Phil Steele*, *Athlon's Sports* and *Lindy's*. He is rated as the No. 2 offensive tackle in the nation by *Lindy's*. Smith has started all 27 games in his UA career. He earned the Paul Crane Offensive Lineman Award following spring practice.

**ALABAMA'S TV RECORD:** Alabama has compiled a 174-113-5 (.604) all-time record in 292 televised games. This does not include pay-per-view, tapedelayed or closed circuit telecasts. The Crimson Tide owns a 149-95-3 (.609) record in 247 regular-season televised games.

### ALABAMA HEAD FOOTBALL COACH NICK SABAN

\*Saban brings a 107-48-1 (.689) record as a college head coach to Tuscaloosa. He has three conference championships and nine teams have played in post-season bowl games.

\*His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

\*Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

\*In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

\*Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

\*A native of Monongah, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen.

\*Saban also is a published author. He co-authored "Tiger Turnaround" in 2001, a book documenting his first two years as head coach at LSU, and co-authored "How Good Do You Want to Be" in 2005, a book that offers real-life principles for success at work and at home.

\*At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since thier arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise more than \$650,000 - including more than \$350,000 this year - for "Nick's Kids" and made a total of more than 140 donations to children's charities throughout the state of Alabama.

\*Saban and his wife, Terry, supported several charitable and civic projects in Louisiana. The largest of those efforts was with the Children's Miracle Network, for which Terry and Nick raised more than \$100,000 a year for children.

\*Saban was on the cover of the Sept. 1 issue of Forbes magazine. The article, written by Monte Burke, examines Saban and his guidance of Crimson Tide program. The cover features Saban with Bryant-Denny Stadium in the background. Saban is the first college football coach to be featured on the cover of Forbes since the publication began in 1917.

\*The Saban's pledged \$1 million to the University for scholarships in June of 2008. The Saban scholarships are designed specifically for first-generation college students. Six first-generation college students have already benefitted from the \$100,000 gift the Saban's made upon their arrival at the Capstone in January 2007.

\*Saban was inducted into the 2008 Independence Bowl Hall of Honor last spring at a ceremony at the East Ridge Country Club in Shreveport, La. The honor came six months after Saban's Crimson Tide defeated the Colorado Buffaloes 30-24 in the 2007 PetroSun Independence Bowl. Saban has made two appearances as a head coach in the Independence Bowl and has a 1-1 all-time mark. He coached Michigan State in 1995 when the Spartans fell to LSU by a final score of 45-26. The Independence Bowl Hall of Honor is comprised of players and coaches who have exemplified positive achievements both on and off the field, and who participated in the Independence Bowl at some point in the game's history.

### HISTORY OF ALABAMA FOOTBALL

\*The University of Alabama is in its 114th football season and has compiled a 796-314-43 (.709) all-time record in 1,153 games.

\*The Crimson Tide played its first football game on Nov. 11, 1892 with a 56-0 win over Birmingham High School in Birmingham.

\*Alabama is sixth among Division I schools in terms of all-time wins.

\*The Crimson Tide football legacy includes 12 national championships, 21 SEC championships and 92 All-Americans.

\*UA also ranks among the best in post-season play, holding the NCAA record for most bowl games (55) and most bowl wins (31).

\*Alabama ranks second all-time in NCAA history with 28 10-win seasons. Alabama's enduring success on the gridiron is further reflected in the fact that the Crimson Tide has recorded seasons with 10 or more wins in nine different decades since the first double-digit win season in 1920 (10-1).

\*Alabama has compiled a 346-159-20 (.678) record in 525 SEC games since 1933.

\*Alabama has played in more games (524), has more wins (345) and has won more league titles (21) than any team in SEC history. The Tide also has more SEC wins than Kentucky, Vanderbilt, Arkansas and South Carolina combined.

\*Alabama is the only SEC school to win a championship in every decade since the 1930s. The Crimson Tide's last SEC Championship came in 1999.

\*Alabama became the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in a decade in the 1970s. The Crimson Tide posted a 103-16-1 (.863) record from 1970-79, which included eight SEC Championships and three national titles.

- \*Alabama's on-campus home since 1929, Bryant-Denny Stadium is one of college football's most scenic venues.
- \*The Crimson Tide has compiled an all-time record of 216-46-3 (.821) in 265 games at Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- \*The stadium was originally named for former University of Alabama Presiden Dr. George H. Denny. Dr. Denny was named UA President on Jan. 1, 1912 and amassed an extraordinary career that spanned almost a quarter of a century.
- \*Bryant-Denny Stadium and Denny Chimes (located on the UA quadrangle) stand as reminders of Denny's legacy to the Capstone.
- \*In 1976, the State of Alabama Legislature and the UA Board of Trustees added coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's name to the stadium, thus calling Alabama's football home Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- \*Alabama's Sept. 2, 2006 season opener against Hawai'i drew a state-record 92,138 fans. The previous Bryant-Denny Stadium record was 86,869 on October 23, 1999 against Tennessee.

### ALL-TIME TUSCALOOSA RECORD

- \*In addition to its impressive record at Bryant-Denny Stadium (1929-present), Alabama has made Tuscaloosa a very difficult place to play for opposing football teams.
- \*Alabama has compiled a 301-59-3 (.833) record in 363 games in Tuscaloosa. The Crimson Tide captured their 300th win in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 18, 2008 vs. Ole Miss.
- \*Alabama's first game on campus was a 4-0 loss to Birmingham Athletic Club on Oct. 14, 1893.
- \*From 1911-28, Alabama posted a 55-2 (.965) record in Tuscaloosa. The 1929 season marked the opening of what is now known as Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- \*Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant posted a remarkable 72-2 (.973) record in Tuscaloosa, losing only to Florida (1963) and Southern Miss (1982). The USM game was the last game Bryant coached at Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- \*From 1963-82, Alabama posted an NCAA record 57-game home winning streak.
- \*Miami has since broken that record with a 58-game home winning streak, but the Hurricanes' record also includes three wins in the post-season Orange Bowl game. All of UA's 57 wins were in the regular season.
- \*The 57-game winning streak is one of seven winning streaks longer than 15 games for the Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa.
- \*Alabama posted a 19-game unbeaten streak in Tuscaloosa from 1928-35.
