SERIES HISTORY: Arkansas and LSU will meet for the 54th time on the gridiron on Friday when the two teams meet in Little Rock. LSU leads the series 33-18-2 including wins in five of the last seven meetings. The Tigers have won 10 of 16 meetings since the Razorbacks entered the SEC in 1992. Arkansas snapped a four-game LSU winning streak last year by upsetting the then-No. 1 Tigers 50-48 in triple overtime in Baton Rouge.

LSU leads the series 9-6 in games played in Arkansas. Arkansas won the only game (1993) played in Fayetteville, but LSU is 9-5 against the Razorbacks in Little Rock. The last Razorback win in Little Rock came in 2002 by a score of 21-20 at War Memorial Stadium. The Miracle on Markham sent Arkansas to the SEC Championship Game.

This week's game will mark the 13th time the two teams have met on the Friday following Thanksgiving. The post-holiday football tradition began in 1996.

BATTLE FOR THE BOOT: For the 13th-consecutive year since its inception, Arkansas and LSU will be playing for "The Golden Boot," a trophy shaped like the two states combined. The trophy was introduced into the series prior to the 1996 game. It is believed to be the heaviest trophy awarded in a college football rivalry. It weighs approximately 175 pounds.

From 1998-2002, the trophy changed hands after every game. The Tigers won the trophy in four-straight match ups (2003-06). Arkansas re-claimed the Boot in 2007 with a triple-overtime win over No. 1 LSU at Baton Rouge.

The Razorbacks have never held on to the Boot for more than four seasons in a row (1922-25). The last time UA has brought the trophy back to Fayetteville in consecutive seasons was 1992 and 1993. (see page 13 for more info on The Boot)

OTHER SERIES NOTES: LSU has outscored Arkansas 839-757 in the series ... the teams first met in 1907 in Baton Rouge ... between 1913 and 1936 the teams played 23 times with all of those games played in Shreveport ... there have been 17 shutouts in the series including a scoreless tie in 1947 ... the last true shutout came in 1995 when LSU posted a 28-0 victory in Baton Rouge ... there have been 19 games decided by a touchdown or less, with LSU holding a 15-4 advantage in those games ... the largest margin of victory in the series was 51 points by Arkansas in a 51-0 win in 1910.

LAST TIME AGAINST LSU (2007): Mattered Richardson's interception of a Matt Flynn pass in the third overtime capped the Razorbacks' 50-48 triple-overtime win over No. 1 LSU in front of 92,606 fans at Tiger Stadium in Baton Rouge, La. The senior cornerback's third interception of the year gave Arkansas its first win over a No. 1 ranked team since 1981.

The Hogs scored on a three-yard run by Peyton Hillis to start the third overtime and a two-point conversion on a rush by Felix Jones put Arkansas ahead, 50-42. The senior fullback rushed for two touchdowns and caught another two scores against LSU.

Flynn's nine-yard touchdown pass in the third overtime to Brandon LaFell closed the gap with the two-point attempt still to come, but Richardson stepped in front of an LSU receiver and picked off the intended pass to seal the victory for the Hogs.

Darren McFadden racked up 255 all-purpose yards, rushing for three touchdowns and throwing for another, a 24-yard pass to Hillis.

McFadden ran for 206 yards which pushed his season total to 1,725 rushing yards, also a school record, and boosted his career total to 4,485 yards on the ground.

The game did not begin well for the Razorbacks as McFadden fumbled the ball on the opening kickoff which LSU recovered on the Arkansas 25-yard line. The Hogs' defense held the LSU offense to a field goal on the drive and with another field goal on their second possession.

Arkansas responded with 14 unanswered points behind two McFadden rushing touchdowns, the second of which was a 73-yard run out of the WildHog formation in the third quarter. Following a 12-yard touchdown run by Jacob Hester, Flynn rushed for the two-point conversion to even the score at 14 apiece. The two teams traded scores—a career-long 65-yard run by Hillis and a touchdown reception by Demetrius Byrd—to end the quarter tied at 21 heading into the fourth.

Byrd's second touchdown catch of the day capped a 13-play drive that covered 79 yards and tied the score at 28 with 57 second left in the game.

Arkansas won the toss and elected to start on defense to begin the first overtime. The LSU offense took just three plays to score on a 12-yard run by Flynn to take the lead, 35-28. With the game on the line facing fourth and ten, Casey Dick dropped back to find a receiver. The Tigers' pass rush forced the junior quarterback out of the pocket to his right where he spotted an open Hillis for a 13-yard gain and a first down. Four plays later, the two Razorbacks connected again on a 10-yard touchdown to tie the score.

McFadden and Hester traded touchdown runs in the second overtime to take the game to its third extra period where teams have to attempt the two-point conversion after a touchdown. The two teams combined for 926 total yards of offense, but it was Richardson's defensive stop that gave the Razorbacks their first win in Baton Rouge since 1993.

LAST TIME AGAINST LSU IN LITTLE ROCK (2006): Arkansas tailback Darren McFadden tore through the highly touted defense of No. 9 LSU for 182 yards and two touchdowns but it wasn't enough as the Tigers held on to beat the No. 5 Razorbacks, 31-26, at War Memorial Stadium.

McFadden finished with 222 total yards, including 33 yards passing and seven receiving. Jones ran for 137 yards, and he and McFadden became the first players to rush for 100 yards against LSU on the season. He finished the day with 1,485 yards rushing on the season. He broke Madre Hill's single-season school record of 1,387 in 1995.

LSU was led by the right arm of quarterback JaMarcus Russell, who threw for 210 yards and two touchdowns. Keiland Williams led the Tigers' ground game with 68 yards rushing and a touchdown.

Arkansas pulled within five points at 31-26 on Felix Jones' 5-yard touchdown run with 4:53 remaining, and the Razorbacks (10-2, 7-1) got the ball back at their own 27 with 2:04 to play. But Casey Dick threw four straight incompletions, completing a 3-for-17 day in which he passed for only 29 yards.

McFadden's 80-yard burst up the middle with 10:59 remaining in the fourth quarter gave the Razorbacks hope as they pulled with five points at 24-19.

LSU's Trindon Holliday quickly silenced the raucous War Memorial crowd when he returned the ensuing kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown with 10:14 remaining. That completed a wild stretch of three touchdowns in 45 seconds — Russell had thrown a seven-yarder to Early Doucet immediately before McFadden's run.

Dick was 0-for-8 in the second half. He was intercepted early in the fourth quarter by LaRon Landry, who returned it 23 yards to the Arkansas 9, setting up Doucet's touchdown.

Arkansas had won 10 straight since a 50-14 loss to Southern California, and the Razorbacks appeared unstoppable early, driving 80 yards in 2:30 and taking a 6-0 lead on McFadden's 1-yard run. Arkansas was the first team this season to score on its first drive against LSU.

But Jeremy Davis missed the extra point, and the Tigers went ahead later in the quarter on Keiland Williams' 29-yard scoring run. LSU never relinquished its lead.

The Tigers made it 14-6 in the second when Russell threw a 47-yard touchdown pass to Craig Davis on third-and-13.

Arkansas answered with Dick's 21-yard scoring pass to Marcus Monk, but Dick's pass for a 2-point conversion was incomplete — and he didn't complete another.

LSU place-kicker Colt David provided the only scoring in the third quarter with a 27-yard field that extended the Tigers' lead to 17-12.

FAMILIAR FACE: LSU co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach Bradley Dale Peveto is a familiar face to the Razorback program. Peveto served as a graduate assistant working with the Razorback linebackers and special teams at Arkansas from 1994-95. He worked for former Arkansas head coach Danny Ford. During his tenure the Razorbacks made their first appearance in the SEC Championship Game in 1995.

NATIONALLY RANKED OPPOSITION: Arkansas has faced its share of nationally ranked opponents on its 2008 schedule. The Razorbacks have played five nationally ranked teams this season.

Arkansas recorded its second win over a ranked opponent this season when the Hogs topped No. 19 Tulsa 30-23 in Fayetteville. The Razorbacks also topped No. 20 Auburn earlier in the season.

The Hogs completed the toughest schedule stretch in school history earlier this season, taking on four consecutive nationally ranked opponents. Arkansas dropped decisions to No. 9 Alabama, No. 7 Texas and No. 12 Florida, before recording an upset of No. 20 Auburn.

Three of Arkansas' five losses this season have come to teams that are ranked No. 1 (Alabama), No. 4 (Florida) and No. 5 (Texas) in this week's Associated Press poll.

The stretch was the most difficult four-game streak in the 115-year history of Arkansas football. Arkansas had never before played four nationally-ranked opponents consecutively. In fact, the Razorbacks have only played three consecutive nationally ranked opponents six times previously. Three of those six occurrences have come in the last decade. Arkansas lost to No. 3 Baylor in 1960 before beating No. 11 Texas 24-23. The Hogs then fell to No. 2 Ole Miss 10-7. In 1961, Arkansas defeated No. 18 TCU and No. 9 Baylor before falling to No. 3 Texas.

In 1997, Arkansas lost to No. 5 Tennessee, won against No. 13 Mississippi State and lost to No. 17 LSU in the season finale. In 1999, Arkansas fell to No. 23 Ole Miss then rallied to defeat No. 3 Tennessee and No. 12 Mississippi State. In 2004, Arkansas lost all three consecutive games to No. 16 Florida, No. 4 Auburn and No. 6 Georgia. The final three games of the 2006 season were against nationally-ranked opponents. The Razorbacks lost to No. 9 LSU, No. 4 Florida and No. 6 Wisconsin.

Arkansas faced a school-record seven ranked teams in 2006 and six-ranked opponents in 1997.

BRUTAL SCHEDULE: Even before Arkansas embarked on its 2008 schedule, prognosticators noted the Hogs faced one of the toughest schedules in the nation. In fact, Phil Steele's pre-season college football publication ranked Arkansas' schedule as the No. 2 most difficult slate in the nation.

The NCAA releases a toughest schedule ranking each week based on the results of a team's opponents in their other games. This week, Arkansas is ranked No. 2 in the toughest schedule ranking with the Razorbacks' opponents combining for a 64-39 record (.621) thus far this season.

FRESH FACES: Arkansas has employed a new look on the football field, literally. The Razorbacks have played a total of 16 true freshmen in the 2008 season. Joe Adams, Lavunce Askew, Mitchell Bailey, Khiry Battle, Greg Childs, De'Anthony Curtis, Elton Ford, Chris Gragg, Dennis Johnson, Hunter Miller, Jerico Nelson, Jelani Smith, Zach Stadther, Tramain Thomas, Tyler Wilson and Jarius Wright have all played in their first year on campus. In fact, Adams, Ford, Gragg, Johnson, Nelson, Smith, Stadther, Thomas and Wright have all earned starts.

In addition, Arkansas has utilized nine redshirt freshmen in the mix.

An informal survey of FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) schools indicate that only Florida State and Miami have played more true freshmen than Arkansas so far this season.

PETRINO ERA DEBUTS IN 2008: Arkansas head coach Bobby Petrino is in his first season as the head coach at the University of Arkansas.

Petrino was named the 30th Arkansas head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2007, after spending one season as the head coach of the Atlanta Falcons. Prior to moving to the National Football League, Petrino distinguished himself as one of the best coaches in college football during his four-year tenure at the University of Louisville. Petrino posted a 41-9 (.820) record with the Cardinals.

In his 24th year as a coach, including his 20th on the collegiate level and four in the NFL, he was 3-10 with the Falcons after going 41-9 at Louisville. His teams at Louisville went 9-4 in 2003 and played in the GMAC Bowl, falling to No. 14 Miami (Ohio); 11-1 in 2004 with a Conference USA title, a win over No. 10 Boise State in the Liberty Bowl, 44-40, and a No. 7 final ranking; 9-3 in 2005 with a spot in the Gator Bowl, where the Cardinals fell to No. 12 Virginia Tech, and a No. 19 final ranking; and 12-1 in 2006 with a Big East Conference championship, a win over No. 12 Wake Forest in the Orange Bowl, 24-13, and a No. 6 final ranking.

The 2006 Cardinals ranked second in the nation in total yards (475.3 yards per game) and fourth in the nation in scoring offense (37.8 points per game). His 2004 squad led the nation in total offense (539.0) and scoring offense (49.8), and set an NCAA record by scoring 50 or more points in five-straight games.

In addition to Louisville, Petrino's college experience includes stops at Arizona State, Nevada, Utah State and Auburn. In addition to coaching the Falcons, his NFL experience includes two years working as the quarterbacks coach and one as the offensive coordinator with the Jacksonville Jaguars.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE: Arkansas has been impressive in non-conference regular-season games in the last decade. The Razorbacks are 34-4 (.895) in the last 11 years against non-SEC opponents during the regular season.

Arkansas head coach Bobby Petrino is 18-2 as a head coach in non-conference regular season games. Petrino is 3-1 in non-conference action at Arkansas with wins over Western Illinois, Louisiana-Monroe and No. 19 Tulsa and a loss at No. 7 Texas.

Petrino was 4-0 (2003), 2-1 (2004), 4-0 (2005) and 5-0 (2006) against non-conference competition at Louisville. The Cardinals played in Conference USA in 2003-04 and joined the Big East in time for the 2005 season. The only blemish on Petrino's non-conference record at Louisville came in a three-point loss at No. 3 Miami (38-41) in 2004. Petrino and the Cardinals returned the favor in 2006 when they topped the No. 7 Hurricanes 31-7 in Louisville.

CARDIAC HOGS: Arkansas certainly gave its fans plenty to stick around for this season. In five of eight games this season, the winning score or a decisive game-saving play has been made in the final three minutes of the game. Arkansas is 3-2 in game that have come down to the final 180 seconds with wins over Western Illinois, Louisiana-Monroe and No. 19 Tulsa and narrow losses to Kentucky and Ole Miss.

The Razorbacks had to overcome deficits in the fourth quarter to earn their first three victories of the season. In fact, Arkansas overcame double-digit deficits to post the decisive points with under two minutes to play in wins over Western Illinois and Louisiana-Monroe.

Arkansas trailed by three points heading into the fourth quarter against Western Illinois in the season opener. The Hogs then saw their deficit increase to 10 points with 10:34 left to play. Arkansas rallied for two fourth-quarter touchdowns, the final coming on a Casey Dick touchdown pass to true freshman Greg Childs with 1:49 to play, to capture a 28-24 victory.

In a similar script, Arkansas had to rally once again in its second game against Louisiana-Monroe at War Memorial Stadium in Little Rock. Arkansas trailed ULM 24-14 entering the fourth quarter before rallying for two touchdowns to hold on to a 28-27 victory. Dick found tight end D.J. Williams for eight yards and the game-winning touchdown with 1:22 remaining in the game. The Razorbacks then had to hold on as a 45-yard field goal attempt by ULM went wide right in the game's final minute.

Arkansas rallied for its third fourth-quarter comeback win of the season at No. 20 Auburn. The Razorbacks trailed the Tigers 20-16 heading into the final period before converting a 44-yard Shay Haddock field goal and then a 63-yard Michael Smith touchdown run to hold off Auburn 25-22.

Entering the 2008 season, Arkansas was only 8-42 when entering the fourth quarter trailing its opponent since 1998.

Against No. 19 Tulsa, it was the Razorback defense that provided the last minute heroics. The Golden Hurricane drove to the Arkansas four-yard line before the Hogs' defense held to keep Tulsa from tying the game and forcing overtime. Tulsa's last chance was foiled when a fourth down pass from the seven-yard line fell incomplete securing the victory.

At Kentucky, the Wildcats completed a comeback and scored the decisive touchdown with 2:21 on the clock. Against Ole Miss, Arkansas scored and recovered an onside kick before a potential game-winning drive was stifled by a pass interference penalty in the game's final minute.

4th DOWN AND GAME: Two defining plays stand out in Arkansas' pair of comeback wins to start the 2008 season. The Razorbacks are two-for-three on the season in fourth-down conversions, including two conversions that meant the difference between a win and a loss.

Arkansas was in deep trouble in the season opener before pulling off a memorable drive late in the game. On the Razorbacks' eventual game-winning drive, the Hogs faced fourth down and 10 on the Western Illinois 33-yard line. Arkansas quarterback Casey Dick fired a bullet to a diving Carlton Salters for a tumbling gain of 11 yards and a game-saving first down. Four plays later, Dick rambled four yards for the go-ahead and deciding touchdown as Arkansas went on to win 28-24.

A week later, Arkansas once again faced a crucial fourth down situation with the game in the balance against Louisiana-Monroe. The Razorbacks were in a fourth down and one yard situation at the ULM 32-yard line with 2:03 left in the game and the Hogs trailing the Warhawks 27-21. After a timeout, Dick took the snap and lofted the ball on a play-action pass for freshman Chris Gragg. Gragg leaped above two defenders and pulled in a pass for 25 yards and a first down. It was Gragg's first collegiate reception and it couldn't have come at a better time. Two plays later, Dick completed an eight-yard touchdown pass to D.J. Williams to tie the game. Kicker Shay Haddock added the extra point to put the Razorbacks ahead for good 28-27.

CHANGING OFFENSIVE FORTUNES: A quick glance at the Southeastern Conference statistics might have some Razorback followers a little confused. Since entering the Southeastern Conference, Arkansas has been atop or near the top of rushing offense both in the league and in the nation. In fact, the Hogs have led the SEC in rushing in five of the last six years. While Arkansas has been effective rushing the ball, the Hogs have rarely ranked among the pass offense team leaders. Since 1992, the Razorbacks have ranked 10th or lower in the SEC in pass offense 11 times.

This year, things have taken a turn. Thus far in the 2008 season, Arkansas is second in the league and 22nd in the nation in pass offense with an average of 257.7 yards per game. Junior tailback Michael Smith ranks ninth in the nation in rushing, yet the Razorbacks still rank near the bottom of the national rushing team leaders. Arkansas ranks 11th in the SEC and 99th in the nation with an average of 113.1 rushing yards per game.

SMITH NEAR SEC LEAD AND RANKS AMONG NATION'S RUSHING LEADERS: Junior tailback Michael Smith is making the most of his opportunities as Arkansas' feature back. After toiling behind Darren McFadden and Felix Jones for most of his Razorback career, Smith is taking the lead for the Hogs in 2008. In the process, Smith has led the Southeastern Conference in rushing for much of the 2008 season. In fact, Smith topped the league rushing list for five weeks from Oct 13 until Nov. 10.

Georgia's Knowshon Moreno (113.1) has edged in front of Smith for the league lead. Smith ranks second in the SEC and 20th in the nation in rushing yards per game (107.2).

Smith has racked up 1,072 yards and eight touchdowns on 207 carries thus far this season. He has five 100-yard rushing games to his credit this season (ULM, Florida, Auburn, Kentucky and Ole Miss), including posting four consecutive 100-yard efforts against No. 12 Florida, No. 20 Auburn, Kentucky and Ole Miss.

Smith recorded a breakout performance in his first career start in the Razorback backfield against Louisiana-Monroe. Smith responded by rushing for a then career-high 157 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries. Smith almost eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark again against No. 9 Alabama. He rushed 19 times for 91 yards, including a 30-yard gain. He also set career highs with six receptions for 67 yards.

Smith racked up 133 rushing yards and one touchdown on 20 carries against No. 12 Florida. He tied a career high with six receptions for 43 yards. Smith became the first rusher to earn 100 yards against the Gators this season. Florida entered the game as the No. 7 total defense in the nation.

Against No. 20 Auburn, Smith responded with a career high 176 yards and one touchdown on 35 carries to lead Arkansas to a 25-22 upset win. He boasted 15 rushes of five yards or more against the Tigers including a 63-yard touchdown run to provide the winning margin midway through the fourth quarter. Smith also hauled in two catches for 46 yards, including a career long gain of 41 yards.

Smith dashed his career high rushing total for the second consecutive week with a 192 yard rushing performance at Kentucky. The tailback earned the yardage and a touchdown on 35 carries before leaving the game early in the fourth quarter. He averaged 5.5 yards per carry against

the Wildcats including runs of 10, 11, 13, 16 and 51 yards. He accounted for 13 of the Razorbacks' 21 first downs with 11 coming on rushes and two coming on receptions. He had three catches for 33 yards and a touchdown against Kentucky. His 253 all-purpose yards against the Wildcats was the sixth-best total in Razorback history for a single game.

Smith was questionable to play against Ole Miss early in the week, but by game day he was back to prime form. He recorded his fourth straight 100-yard rushing game with 129 yards and a touchdown on 19 carries against the Rebels. Smith scored his sixth touchdown of the season on a fourth down play when he scampered 13 yards for the score.

While Tulsa loaded up to stop Smith, the junior still managed to earn 67 yards and a touchdown against the No. 19 Golden Hurricane. He also caught three passes in the victory.

MICHAEL SMITH SERVING ALL PURPOSES: Junior Michael Smith leads the SEC and ranks 29th in the nation in all-purpose yardage with 141.4 yards per game. Smith has racked up 1,072 rushing yards, 298 receiving yards and 44 yards on punt returns for a total of 1,414 all-purpose yards in the 10 games he has played this season. In some of his most recent outings, Smith has recorded the sixth-best (253 vs. Kentucky) and the 12th-best (232 vs. Auburn) all-purpose yardage totals in school history.

Smith is attempting to make it three consecutive seasons for a Razorback to lead the league in all-purpose yardage. Darren McFadden led the SEC in all-purpose yardage in 2006 and 2007.

HEART AND SOUL OF THE RUNNING GAME: Tailback Michael Smith is literally and figuratively, the heart and soul of the Arkansas running game. Smith is second in the Southeastern Conference and ranks No. 20 in the nation with an average of 107.2 yards per game on the ground.

Smith's value to the Razorback rushing attack is even more impressive when you compare his contributions to other top running backs in the nation. Of the running backs that rank in the top 20 in rushing average nationally, Smith is second only to Michigan State's Javon Ringer in the percentage of the team's total rushing output. Smith has accounted for 1,072 yards of the Razorbacks' total of 1,244 rushing yards. Ten other ball carriers have combined for 172 yards. Smith has racked up 86.2 percent of Arkansas' rushing yards this season.

RUSHING FOR 1,000: Junior Michael Smith became the ninth Razorback in school history to post 1,000 yards in a season when he passed the milestone against South Carolina. It marked the 15th time the feat has been accomplished in a season by a Razorback. Of the 15 1,000-yard seasons, eight of those have come since 2000.

When Smith attained the feat, it marked the first time in school history that Arkansas has boasted at least one 1,000-yard rusher in four consecutive seasons. McFadden rushed for more than 1,000 yards in 2005, 2006 and 2007 while Jones accomplished the feat in 2006 and 2007.

Smith's current total of 1,072 yards ranks 13th on the Razorback single season rushing list. Darren McFadden (2005) and Felix Jones (2007) rank tied for 11th on the list with 1,113 yards while former Razorback Fred Talley (2002) ranks 10th with 1,119 yards.

SMITH PICKS UP SEC HONOR: Junior tailback Michael Smith was honored by the Southeastern Conference for his play in Arkansas' 25-22 win over No. 20 Auburn. Smith was named the offensive player of the week after he rushed for a career-high 176 yards on 35 carries. His 63-yard touchdown run provided the winning margin in the victory. Smith also hauled in two catches for 46 yards, including a key 41-yard gain. He was also named a finalist for the AT&T All-America Player of the Week for his effort against the Tigers.

Smith became the second offensive player to be honored this season for the Razorbacks. Freshman Joe Adams was named SEC Freshman of the Week for his performance against Louisiana-Monroe. Fellow teammate Adrian Davis earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his role in the Hogs' win over Auburn.

MORE ON MICHAEL:

- Arkansas tailback Michael Smith is attempting to give the Razorbacks their third-consecutive Southeastern Conference rushing leader. Former Razorback and current Oakland Raider Darren McFadden led the SEC in rushing in 2006 and 2007. The last school to boast three consecutive SEC leading rushers was Georgia or more specifically Herschel Walker who led the league in rushing from 1980-82. The last school to lead the SEC in rushing for three consecutive seasons with multiple players was Auburn. The Tigers led the SEC in rushing with Joe Childress (1954), Fob James (1955) and Tommy Lorino (1956).
- Smith's five 100-yard rushing games this season ties him for ninth on the UA single season list in that category.
- Smith rushed for a touchdown in five consecutive outings (Florida, Kentucky, Auburn, Ole Miss and Tulsa) earlier this season. He is the first Razorback since Darren McFadden to accomplish the feat. McFadden earned a rushing score in the first five games of the 2007 season.
- Smith ranks second on the team with 32 receptions for 298 yards and two touchdowns. His two touchdowns are tied for the team lead among all Razorback pass catches. Smith has caught at least two passes in nine of his 10 games this season including three or more catches in six of those games. He has posted a career high six receptions twice (Alabama and Florida) this season.

D.J. TIME: Arkansas tight end D.J. Williams has already proven to be a primary target in the Razorbacks' passing game. Williams has caught at least four passes in nine of Arkansas' first 11 games and leads the Razorbacks in catches and receiving yards with 53 receptions for 672 yards. He also leads the Hogs with three touchdown receptions. He is averaging 12.7 yards per reception.

Williams ranks sixth in the nation in catches per game (4.82) among tight ends and sixth in receiving yards per game (61.1). He ranks tied for 65th and tied for 76th nationally among all receivers in those two categories, respectively.

Williams ranks second in the SEC with 4.82 catches per game among all pass receivers. He also ranks fifth in the SEC in receiving yards per game with an average of 61.1.

Williams set a then-career high in receiving yards, touchdowns and tied a career high in receptions in leading Arkansas to a 28-27 come-from-behind win over Louisiana-Monroe.

Williams hauled in five passes for 124 yards and two touchdowns in the victory including the game-winner on an eight-yard pass play with 1:22 left in the game. He also added a reception to successfully earn a two-point conversion in the third quarter after scoring on the previous play, an eight-yard touchdown pass from UA quarterback Casey Dick.

Williams tallied a career-long 76-yard reception in the fourth quarter to set up another Razorback touchdown. The play was the longest pass play for the Razorbacks since 2002 and is tied for 12th for the longest pass play in the nation this season.

Williams led the Hogs in receiving with four catches for 39 yards against No. 7 Texas. Against No. 12 Florida, Williams hauled in a career high six catches for 35 yards. In Arkansas' upset win over No. 20 Auburn, Williams snared three passes for 24 yards.

Williams has caught 25 passes for 357 yards in his last four games. He snared a record 10 receptions for 129 yards against Ole Miss. He then matched his yardage total with 129 yards on six catches in a win over No. 20 Tulsa. Williams had four catches for 40 yards against South Carolina. He came up big down the stretch against Mississippi State hauling in five catches for 59 yards and one touchdown.

MACKEY AWARD SEMIFINALIST: Sophomore D.J. Williams is one of eight semifinalists for the John Mackey Award, recognizing the best tight end in the nation. Williams is the only sophomore among the eight semifinalists. Other tight ends on the semifinalist list include junior Chase Coffman (Missouri), junior Jared Cook (South Carolina), junior Jermaine Gresham (Oklahoma), senior Mark Hafner (Houston), senior Branden Ledbetter (Western Michigan), senior Brandon Pettigrew (Oklahoma State) and junior Dennis Pitta (BYU). Three finalists for the Mackey Award will be named on Nov. 24. The 2008 Mackey Award winner will be announced on Dec. 11, 2008, at the Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards Show.

RECORD-SETTING NIGHT: Arkansas tight end D.J. Williams turned in a record-setting night against Ole Miss. Williams hauled in a career high 10 passes for 129 yards against the Rebels. He set a school record for receptions for a modern-day tight end in a single game and recorded the most catches by any Razorback player in the past 24 seasons.

Williams' 10 receptions were the most by a Southeastern Conference tight end since Georgia's Randy McMichael had 12 catches against Georgia Tech in 2000. It also marked the most by an SEC tight end in a conference game since Kentucky's James Whalen Jr. snagged 12 against Florida in 1999.

Williams' reception total tied for the fifth highest reception game in Razorback history and the most since wide receiver Bobby Joe Edmonds caught 10 passes against Auburn in the 1984 Liberty Bowl.

His 10 catches tied for seventh in the nation for a single game this season by a tight end and the most by a tight end in the SEC this year.

With his 10 catches against Ole Miss, D.J. Williams set a UA record for most catches by a tight end in a season topping the previous mark of 33 receptions by former Razorback tight end and current Arkansas assistant coach Kirk Botkin (1992).

NO ORDINARY JOE: Freshman wide receiver Joe Adams has become one of Arkansas' primary targets in the passing game in his rookie season. Adams is third on the squad with 30 receptions for 373 yards and one touchdown in the first 11 games of the season.

He has caught at least one pass in every game this season and multiple passes in seven of 11 outings. He made the most of his first start and his first game as a Razorback in front of a hometown crowd. The Little Rock, Ark., native tallied a team-high seven receptions for 89 yards in Arkansas' 28-27 win over Louisiana-Monroe at War Memorial Stadium. For his efforts, Adams was named the SEC Freshman of the Week, becoming the first Razorback to earn a conference weekly award in 2008.

Adams snagged catches of 4, 7, 8, 10, 10, 17 and 33 yards in his first career start. His seven catches were the most by a Razorback in a single game since Marcus Monk hauled in eight receptions against Tennessee in 2007.

Two of his catches came to help Arkansas' fourth-quarter comeback. He netted a pair of first downs on receptions. He also recorded one rush for nine yards against the Warhawks in his first collegiate game in his hometown.

Adams hauled in five catches for 68 yards against No. 12 Florida. Four of his five catches went for first down yardage. He also had one rushing attempt for 16 yards which also moved the chains.

He led the Razorbacks with four catches for 60 yards in Arkansas' 25-22 win over No. 20 Auburn. Adams recorded a key 31-yard gain in the victory. Against Kentucky, Adams hauled in two passes for 24 yards, including a 16-yard gain.

Adams ranks second among SEC freshmen with 2.7 catches per game and third among league rookies with 33.9 yards receiving per game.

CHASING A RECORD: Freshman Joe Adams are on track to eclipse a freshman receiving record in 2008. Adams is looking to break the freshman receiving mark set in 2004 by former Razorback Marcus Monk. Monk hauled in 37 catches for 569 yards as rookie breaking the previous freshman mark held by Richard Smith (33) set in 2000. Adams has 30 receptions for 373 yards so far this season.

RIMINGTON TROPHY WINNER BACK TO ANCHOR THE LINE: Senior Jonathan Luigs was recognized as the top center in the nation when he received the 2007 Rimington Trophy. A runner-up for the award as a sophomore in 2006, the 2007 winner was also named a first-team All-American by CBSsports.com, the Football Writers Association of America, Rivals, The Sporting News, Phil Steele College Football, CollegeFootballNews.com and Walter Camp. Luigs, a 6-4, 314-pounder from Little Rock, Ark., also earned the Jacobs Trophy, which goes to the top blocker in the Southeastern Conference.

He helped Arkansas lead the SEC and rank fourth in the nation in rushing (286.5), rank 17th in total offense (450.0) and 13th in scoring (37.3). The total offense and scoring averages, and 3,750 rushing yards set school records, along with a 5.96 yards per carry average. In addition to being a Rimington Trophy finalist as a sophomore in 2006, he was an AP third-team All-American and first-team All-SEC. He helped Arkansas lead the SEC and rank fourth in the nation in rushing (228.5), rank 29th in the nation in total offense (378.0) and 31st in scoring (28.9).

As you might expect, Luigs is one of 43 pre-season watch list candidates for the 2008 Rimington Trophy. In the history or the award, there has never been a two-time winner.

LUIGS LEADING THE WAY: Center Jonathan Luigs has picked up where he left off last season after winning the 2007 Rimington Trophy. Luigs has once again been the centerpiece of the Razorbacks' offensive line playing his best against some of the nation's top teams.

Luigs earned a 92 percent assignment grade against No. 7 Texas. He tallied four knockdown blocks against the Longhorns. Against No. 12 Florida, Luigs posted a 95 percent assignment grade and racked up three knockdowns in clearing the way for 100-yard rusher Michael Smith (133).

The Little Rock, Ark., native was superb up front in Arkansas' 25-22 win over No. 20 Auburn. Luigs graded out at 98 percent on assignments and earned five knockdowns against the Tigers. He helped pave the way for 416 yards of total offense including 176 yards rushing by Smith.

Luigs turned in another solid outing at Kentucky. He recorded a grade of 95 percent on his assignments against the Wildcats and didn't yield a sack. He racked up seven knockdowns and cleared the way for 236 rushing yards, including a career-high 192 rushing yards from Smith.

Luigs graded out at 91 percent on assignments against Ole Miss. He earned three knockdowns against the Rebels will paving the way for Smith's fourth-consecutive 100-yard rushing game (129 yards).

Arkansas' center turned in another solid effort in the Razorbacks' win over No. 19 Tulsa. Luigs graded out at 98 percent on assignments against the Golden Hurricane. He also racked up three knockdown blocks in the victory.

IMPRESSIVE DEBUT: Arkansas redshirt freshman quarterback Nathan Dick was impressive in his debut as the Razorbacks' starting quarterback. Dick completed 25-of-43 passes for 333 yards and three touchdowns against Mississippi State. Coming into the game, Nathan Dick had played in only one other collegiate game and had thrown only eight passes.

Dick's 333 yards marked only the 13th 300-yard passing game in Razorback history and ranked as the seventh-best passing game in school history. He became just the seventh Razorback quarterback to throw for 300 yards in a game and only the second freshman (Brad Taylor) to do so. His 333-yard total is the third-highest passing total in the SEC this season behind only his brother Casey Dick (385) and Georgia's Matthew Stafford (376).

Dick led Arkansas on four touchdown scoring drives, including scores on the first two offensive possessions of the game. Combined with his one offensive drive for a touchdown against South Carolina, Nathan Dick led the Razorbacks to touchdowns on his first three offensive drives as a collegiate quarterback.

CASEY AT THE PASS: Arkansas senior quarterback Casey Dick racked up passing yards and record performances in the 2008 season. The Razorback signal caller recorded back-to-back 300-yard passing games with 318 yards in the season opener against Western Illinois and 323 yards in a win over Louisiana-Monroe. He then followed it up with a near-record breaking game against Tulsa. Dick threw for a career-high 385 yards against the Golden Hurricane, falling only two yards short of the Razorback school record for passing yards in a game (387 – Clint Stoerner vs. LSU, 1997).

The 300-yard outings are the first of Dick's career and only the 10th, 11th and 12th 300-yard passing games in Razorback history.

In fact, Dick became the first UA quarterback to record back-to-back 300-yard passing games and the first to earn three 300-yard passing games in a season. Casey is the only SEC quarterback to have three 300-yard passing games this season.

The senior from Allen, Texas, is second in the SEC in passing yards per game (238.9 ypg.) trailing only Georgia's Matthew Stafford (254.7 ypg.) in that category.

Dick is second in the SEC and ranks 37th in the nation in total offense per game with an average of 236.3 yards per outing.

Dick has passed for 2,389 yards and 11 touchdowns on 328 attempts in 10 games this season.

CASEY DICK CLIMBING ARKANSAS' CAREER PASSING CHARTS: Senior quarterback Casey Dick has made steady progress throughout his career. He started all 13 games in 2007 and had made 28 consecutive starts before not playing last week at Mississippi State. As a junior, he was 150-of-262 (.573) for 1,695 yards with 18 touchdowns and 10 interceptions.

Here is where Dick ranks on the school's career charts and where last year's numbers place among Arkansas' all-time season bests. Dick broke the UA single season record for completions in a season against South Carolina and is on track to break the pass attempts record as well.

LOOK TO LUCAS: Junior Lucas Miller had a spectacular outing against Mississippi State hauling in 10 passes for 201 yards and a touchdown against the Bulldogs. Miller's 201 yards receiving ranks second only to Mike Reppond (204 vs. Rice, 1971) in school history. Miller and Reppond are the only two Razorbacks to earn more than 200 yards receiving in a single game.

Miller is the only SEC wide receiver to earn 200 yards receiving this season and his 201-yard effort ranks as the 18th-best effort in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision play.

His 10 catches tied for fifth on the Razorback single game reception chart tying him with teammate D.J. Williams, who snared 10 receptions earlier this year against Ole Miss.

Miller's touchdown catch came on an 87-yard scoring toss from redshirt freshman quarterback Nathan Dick. The play tied for the second longest passing touchdown in school history.

In his last three games, Miller has 19 receptions for 321 yards and a touchdown. In his previous 29 career games, Miller had combined for 21 catches for 298 yards and three touchdowns.

Entering the season, Miller's career high reception total was two catches. He eclipsed that mark in the opener with three catches for 67 yards against Western Illinois. He has re-set his career high in each of the last three games earning four catches for 63 yards against No. 20 Tulsa before earning five receptions for 57 yards against South Carolina. He then shattered his career high with 10 catches against Mississippi State.

Miller ranks fourth on the team with 27 receptions for 443 yards. He is averaging 16.4 yards per catch.

ALL WRIGHT: Freshman wide receiver Jarius Wright was key in Arkansas' offensive attack in the Razorbacks' 30-23 win over No. 19 Tulsa. Wright earned career highs in receptions and receiving yards by hauling in five catches for 112 yards against the Golden Hurricane.

His 112-yard effort mark the first 100-yard receiving game of his career and ranks as the third-most compiled by a freshman in the Southeastern Conference this season. Wright made catches of 8, 18, 18, 34 and 34 yards against Tulsa earning three first downs on his five catches.

Along with tight end D.J. Williams, Wright was part of the first Razorback duo to earn more than 100 yards receiving in the same game since Anthony Lucas and Anthony Eubanks each earned more than 100 yards against LSU in 1997.

GOOD SHEPPARD: Junior defensive tackle Malcolm Sheppard has been a steady force for the Razorbacks this season on the defensive front. Sheppard leads the team in tackles for loss (11.0 – 35) and sacks (4.5 – 22) and ranks third in tackles (60). He also leads the team with 12 quarterback hurries. Sheppard ranks tied for third in the SEC with 1.14 tackles for loss per game and fifth in the league in sacks with an average of 0.50 sacks per outing.

Against Kentucky, Sheppard responded with a team high eight tackles, including two tackles for loss (-5) and one sack (-4). He also forced a fumble, broke up a pass and recorded one quarterback hurry against the Wildcats.

Sheppard was back at it again against Ole Miss recording nine tackles, including two tackles for loss (-5). He also registered a quarterback hurry against the Rebels.

Against No. 19 Tulsa, Sheppard recorded five tackles including a half tackle for loss (-1). He also tallied two quarterback hurries against the Golden Hurricane and helped the Razorbacks' hold the nation's top scoring offense to only 23 points. Tulsa entered the game with an average of 55.6 points per game.

Sheppard tied a season high with nine tackles, including two sacks (-9) against South Carolina. He recorded eight solo tackles and one quarterback hurry against the Gamecocks.

FRANKLIN LEADING THE WAY: Redshirt freshman linebacker Jerry Franklin is leading the way on the Razorbacks' defense. Franklin leads the Hogs with 82 tackles in the first 11 games. He has garnered 52 solo tackles and 30 assisted stops. He has 3.5 tackles for loss (-17), 1.5 sack (-14), two interceptions, two quarterback hurries, four pass break ups, one forced fumble and two recovered fumbles. He tallied a career-high 12 tackles in Arkansas' 28-27 win over Louisiana-Monroe.

He earned his first career interception after picking off a pass from Florida quarterback Tim Tebow. The interception snapped a string of 204 consecutive passes without an interception by Tebow, the third longest streak in SEC history. He picked off another pass in Arkansas' win over No. 19 Tulsa. Franklin also recovered a fumble against the Golden Hurricane.

Franklin has earned at least six tackles in 10 of 11 games this season, tallying double-digit tackles in three contests. Franklin ranks 15th in the SEC (based on press box totals) with an average of 6.8 tackles per game.

ZACH ATTACK: Freshman Zach Stadther has been active in his first year on the Razorbacks' defensive line. Stadther has played in all 11 of Arkansas' games this season, including earning a starting nod in the last seven contests. He has 52 tackles, including four tackles for loss (-9).

Stadther tallied a career high 10 tackles against Ole Miss earning five solo and five assisted stops. He also added a quarterback hurry against the Rebels. Earlier in Arkansas' upset of No. 20 Auburn, Stadther racked up nine tackles, including eight solo stops, against the Tigers. Two of his nine tackles were for lost yardage (-4).

He continued his solid play with seven tackles against No. 19 Tulsa. Stadther earned a half sack (-3) and a tackle for loss (-4) against the Golden Hurricane. Stadther tallied five tackles, including four solo stops, and two quarterback hurries at South Carolina.

DAVIS PUTTING HIS BEST FOOT FORWARD: Senior punter Jeremy Davis is on pace for his best season as a Razorback in 2008. Davis is averaging 42.6 yards per punt in his first 11 games including a career long punt of 58 yards earlier this year against Auburn. So far this season, Davis has punted 52 times for 2,215 yards and has landed 15 kicks inside the opponents' 20-yard line. He has recorded 11 punts of 50 yards or more this season. Davis ranks third in the SEC and 20th in the nation with his 42.6 yards per punt average.

Some of his best games have come against nationally ranked opponents Alabama, Texas, Florida, Auburn and Tulsa. Davis is averaging 45.5 yards per punt in games against nationally ranked opponents including eight punts inside the 20 and seven punts of 50 yards or more.

Against the No. 9 Crimson Tide, he averaged 43.4 yards per punt (7 punts) and landed three inside Alabama's 20-yard line. Against No. 7 Texas, he averaged 45.2 yards per punt (5 punts) including a 54-yard effort. Davis punted four times against No. 12 Florida averaging 43.8 yards per punt. He landed three of his four punts inside the Gators' 20-yard line. Against No. 20 Auburn, Davis averaged 52.0 yards per punt on four kicks, including a career-long 58 yard effort. In a win over No. 19 Tulsa, Davis averaged 45.0 yards per punt recorded two punts of more than 50 yards and landing one inside the Golden Hurricane 20-yard line.

Against Ole Miss, Davis averaged 45.3 yards per kick on six punts. He landed two inside the Rebels' 20-yard line and recorded three punts of 50+ yards (50, 53, 54).

Davis averaged 39.2 yards per punt as a freshman in 2004. He redshirted the 2005 season and served as the Hogs' placekicker in 2006. Last season as a junior, Davis posted an average of 40.0 yards per punt.

His current 40.9 career punt average ranks seventh on the Arkansas career record chart.

TEJADA RETURN: Arkansas placekicker Alex Tejada made a successful return to the placekicking duties for the Razorbacks in the win over No. 19 Tulsa. Tejada had lost the kicking job earlier in the season after missing on his first three field goal attempts.

Against Tulsa, Tejada nailed three field goals in as many attempts hitting from 22, 22 and 30 yards. He also connected on three extra points in the win over the Golden Hurricane.

VALDEZ NAMED TO SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM: Senior offensive tackle Jose Valdez has been selected to the Southeastern Conference's Community Service Team. Valdez was recognized during Raycom Sports telecast of the Arkansas-Alabama game on Sept. 20.

The senior from St. Francis, Wisc., has been a standout for the Razorbacks in the community. His community efforts include visits to The Sunshine School for disabled children, reading to students at Holcomb Elementary School as part of the Read Across America program, participating in Arkansas' Book Hogs reading program, a visit to the Homestyle Assisted Living Center for Thanksgiving dinner and a visit to Oakdale Junior High School where he spoke to students about decision making and overcoming racial issues.

Valdez is also one of five SEC players to be nominated for The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. The team honors football student-athletes who exemplify community service. A committee will select an 11-member team that will be announced later this season.

SCORING STREAK: Arkansas has scored in a school-record 159 consecutive games. The Razorbacks have not been shut out since a 28-0 loss to LSU in Baton Rouge, La., on Nov. 18, 1995. Arkansas' scoring streak ranks fourth in the SEC behind Florida, Tennessee and Georgia.

Over the last 11 years, Arkansas has scored 20 or more points in 100 of 134 games (.746). The Razorbacks are 48-17 (.738) when scoring 20 or more points over the last eight seasons.

RAZORBACK CAPTAINS: Arkansas coaches and players elected five team captains for the 2008 season. Senior center Jonathan Luigs and senior quarterback Casey Dick were selected as captains from the offensive unit. The Razorbacks' have three team captains from the defensive side of the ball; cornerback Jamar Love, linebacker Elston Forte and defensive tackle Malcolm Sheppard.

OTHER RAZORBACK NOTABLES:

- Nathan Dick's start at quarterback at Mississippi State broke a string of 28-consecutive starts by his brother Casey Dick.
- Freshman Joe Adams returned the first kickoff of his Razorback career against Mississippi State. Adams returned the opening kickoff of the game for 20 yards.
- Arkansas recovered its second onside kick of the season against Mississippi State. The Hogs also recovered their only other onside kick attempt this season against Ole Miss.

OTHER FACTS ABOUT THE BATTLE FOR THE BOOT

- Bobby Petrino is coaching in his first Battle for the Boot. Les Miles is 2-1 in the Battle for the Boot.
- Five of the last seven BOOT games have decided who represents the Western Division in the SEC championship Game.
- Since the first BOOT game in 1996, the winner has won or shared the SEC western division title 54% of the time (7 of 13 years).
- Four times, the visiting team has won the BOOT. LSU won the inaugural trophy in 1996 (17-7) at Little Rock, then again in 2004 (43-14) in Little Rock and 2006 in Little Rock (31-26). Arkansas won the BOOT last year with a 50-48 win in three overtimes in Baton Rouge.
- On Nov 27, 1996 at the initial press conference at the Arkansas State Capital announcing the Battle for the Boot, Governor Mike Huckabee represented Arkansas and since Louisiana Governor Mike Foster (R) could not attend, Lt Gov Kathleen Blanco (D) represented LSU. Blanco went on to serve as the Governor of Louisiana (D).
- The two most popular youth video football games in the country are produced by EAS. They are the Madden NFL game and the NCAA Football game. The Battle of the Golden Boot has been a featured game on NCAA Football for the past four years allowing for young video players to have an actual Arkansas vs. LSU matchup with the winner receiving a digital version of the big trophy. There were only 23 trophy games featured in 2003, now there are more than 36.

*1) Why the "Battle of the Boot"?*

LSU and Arkansas don't have the longtime rivalry or trophy game that other SEC teams have, i.e. Alabama-Auburn, Miss-Miss State, Fla-FSU/Tenn, Tenn-Fla/Ala/Kentucky, South Carolina-Clemson, Georgia-Georgia Tech/Fla. The lack of an annual rival or trophy game for Ark/LSU, the fact they play each other at the end of the season on national television, their location geographically, the intensity of each team's zealous fans and the expectation that both will hopefully be challenging for the SEC West annually, make this game a good spot for a trophy matchup regardless of records or standing.

2) Was the Boot designed to create a true rivalry game?

Not necessarily. You can't create a rivalry that isn't really there. The "Battle for the Boot" simply creates a Trophy Game. If a rivalry develops from it that would be great. If not, at least it gives Arkansas and LSU players a little added motivation to win the game. Most competitive players like to play to win anything. A true competitor would lay it on the line for an empty coke can. There are currently several Trophy games per year around the country that are played between teams that have not been equally competitive for decades. Some teams actually have two "Trophy" games per year. These games are not considered rivalry games because they haven't been competitive, but the two teams can still have something to play for.

3) Why Arkansas and LSU?

Beside the fact mentioned above, LSU and Arkansas do you have some similar football background. Both the Tigers and Razorbacks have had a rich and storied football history over the past 100 years. From National Championships for the Tigers in 1958 and the Razorbacks in 1964, to "The Great Run" of Billy Cannon against Ole Miss and Ken Hatfield vs. Texas, both schools have great gridiron legacies. Since their first matchup in 1901, some of those legacies were created when the two teams played each other. The 1946 Cotton Bowl that ended in a 0-0 tie and is remembered by many as the "Ice Bowl", featured such great players as Y.A. Tittle for LSU and Clyde "Smackover" Scott for Arkansas. The 1966 Cotton Bowl was the scene of a stunning upset as the 7-3 Tigers defeated the second ranked and 10-0 Hogs 14-7. Besides the great game history between LSU and Arkansas, both states even have a football connection off the field as LSU's first Bengal Tiger mascot, Mike 1, was purchased by the student body from the Little Rock Zoo in 1937.

4) What's behind the heavy and expensive trophy?

Some trophy games have been around for many decades and their trophy value is founded in a long history and sometimes the oddness of the trophy itself. Since the Arkansas/LSU trophy game was going to be a new one, the best way to create value and significance is to make it more unique than any other trophy. The "Boot" is the most expensive trophy in all of college football and is one of the heaviest (weighs between 150-200 pounds). It requires teamwork to carry it off the field.

Head Coach Bobby Petrino



Long before his first game as head football coach at the University of Arkansas, Bobby Petrino's positive impact on a tradition-rich Arkansas program and a passionate Razorback fan base was abundantly evident. From the boisterous welcome offered from assembled fans at a late-night nationally-televised press conference announcing his hiring to the record attendance numbers at Razorback Clubs in all corners of the state last spring, there is no question that Petrino's arrival in Fayetteville has energized and unified the state behind their beloved Razorback football program.

It is easy to see why Razorback fans are so excited. Petrino is one of the most successful college football coaches in the nation. In his four previous years as a collegiate head coach at the University of Louisville, he won 41 games, led the Cardinals to four-consecutive bowl games, including a victory in the Bowl Championship Series' 2006 FedEx Orange Bowl. His .820 winning percentage ranks second only to USC's Pete Carroll among active NCAA Bowl Subdivision coaches with at least four years experience. His 41 wins rank tied for seventh in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision history for most victories by a coach in his first four seasons.

Entering his fifth season as a collegiate head coach and his first at Arkansas, Petrino blends 21 years of collegiate coaching experience with stints in the National Football League as both a head coach and assistant coach to total 25 years of coaching experience.

In addition to Louisville, Petrino's college experience includes stops at Arizona State University, the University of Nevada, Utah State University and Auburn University. His NFL coaching tenures have come with the Jacksonville Jaguars and the Atlanta Falcons.

His reputation for engineering high-octane and quick-strike offenses is well deserved. His teams have consistently ranked among the nation's best in total offense and scoring. Although sometimes perceived as a coach that focuses primarily on the passing game, in reality Petrino adheres to the philosophy of balance between offensive production on the ground and through the air. Consider that in the last 10 years of his college coaching career spent as a head coach, an offensive coordinator or both, Petrino's offenses have boasted 70 100-yard rushers and 41 300-yard passers. That equates to 111 defining offensive individual performances in 120 total games.

In his coaching career, Petrino has worked with countless players who went on to play professionally, including an impressive list of NFL quarterbacks. As a head coach, he helped develop quarterbacks Stefan LeFors (2003-04) and Brian Brohm (2004-06) at Louisville. As a coordinator or assistant, he tutored Jason Campbell at Auburn (2002), Chris Redman at Louisville (1998), Jake Plummer at Arizona State (1993), and Doug Nussmeier (1990-91) and John Friesz (1989) at Idaho.

On Dec. 11, 2007, Petrino was named the 30th head coach in Razorback football history. The announcement marked Petrino's return to college football, the very landscape that put him on the coaching map.

Prior to his most recent tenure as the head coach of the Falcons during the 2007 season, Petrino enjoyed four ultra-successful seasons (2003-06) at Louisville. His teams posted a combined record of 41-9 in his tenure for a winning percentage of .820.

In 2006, Petrino guided the Cardinals to a 12-1 record, including a 24-13 win over nationally-ranked Wake Forest in the BCS FedEx Orange Bowl. Louisville vaulted to as high as No. 3 in the polls during the season and finished with a final No. 6 national ranking in the Associated Press poll, the highest ranking in school history. Louisville had three victories over top-15 ranked teams, including wins over No. 15 Miami (31-7), No. 3 West Virginia (44-34) and No. 12 Wake Forest (24-13). The 12 victories also set a new school mark, breaking a record Petrino had held in part previously with 11 wins in 2004. The Cardinals won their first Big East Conference title, ranked second in the nation in total yards (475.3 yards per game) and fourth in the nation in scoring offense (37.8 points per game). Louisville also led the Big East in pass offense average (290.0) and first downs (296). Seven Louisville players earned first-team All-Big East honors, the most of any league school.

In 2005, Petrino led Louisville into the Big East Conference and guided the Cardinals to a 9-3 record and their first New Year's Day Bowl game since 1991. Louisville ranked ninth in the nation in total offense (482.1) and third in the nation in scoring offense (43.4). The Cardinals scored at least 30 points in 11 of 12 games, including eight games of more than 40 points, four games of 50 or more points and three 60-point outings. Seven Cardinals earned All-Big East honors in the school's first year in the league, including Bronko Nagurski and Ted Hendricks Award winner Elvis Dumervil. Dumervil led the nation in sacks (20) and forced fumbles (10) on his way to consensus All-America honors. Running back Michael Bush led the nation in scoring (14.4), scored 24 touchdowns and became the school's first 1,000-yard rusher since 1999.

Petrino's 2004 Louisville team went 11-1, won the Conference USA championship and beat No. 10 Boise State in the Liberty Bowl, 44-40, to end the season ranked No. 7. The Cardinals led the nation in total offense (539.0) and scoring offense (49.8), surpassed 40 points nine times, scored 50 points seven times and set an NCAA record by scoring 55 or more points in five-straight games. Petrino tied a then-school record for most wins in a season and had a perfect 8-0 record in league play. The Cardinals outscored their conference opponents 453-156 on their way to the school's third Conference USA crown. In the process, school records fell in points scored (597), points per game (49.8), total offense (6,448), touchdowns (80), rushing yardage (3,005), rushing touchdowns (47) and completion percentage (71.3). Under Petrino's tutelage, quarterback Stefan LeFors led the nation in completion percentage (73.5) and passing efficiency (181.74), narrowly missing NCAA records in both categories. The gaudy offensive production also allowed place-kicker Arthur Carmody to set an NCAA single-season record with 77-consecutive extra points. Defensively, Louisville led the league and ranked No. 15 in the nation in total defense. The Cardinals were one of only three teams to rank in the top 15 nationally in both total offense and total defense. Louisville had the best combined ranking of any team when taking into account both sides of the ball. For his efforts, Petrino was named the 2004 Conference USA Coach of the Year.

The groundwork for the record-setting success to come was laid in Petrino's first season as a head coach at Louisville in 2003. Taking over a team that had finished 7-6 the season before, Petrino guided the Cardinals to a 9-4 record and a GMAC Bowl berth. The nine wins were the most by a first-year Louisville coach. It didn't take long for Petrino to set the tone in his first collegiate coaching stint. In his first career game as a head coach, Petrino led Louisville to a 40-24 win over arch rival Kentucky. Louisville led the league and ranked among the nation's best in total offense, rushing and scoring. The Cardinals ranked fifth in the nation in total offense (488.9), 10th



in rushing (228.2) and 15th in scoring offense (34.6) in Petrino's inaugural season. Louisville set six Conference USA records including the mark for total yards after the Cardinals raked up 779 yards, including 445 rushing yards, in a 66-45 win over Houston.

Prior to Louisville hiring him as its head coach, Petrino served one season as the offensive coordinator at Auburn in 2002. In his one season with the Tigers, Auburn went 9-4, including three wins over top-10 ranked opponents, and won a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers led the Southeastern Conference in pass efficiency and third down conversions, and were third in scoring, rushing and total offense. Petrino's influence on Auburn's offensive fortunes resulted in significant improvement as the Tigers improved to No. 31 nationally in scoring offense (31.3) and No. 38 in total offense (358.8) after finishing No. 86 and No. 73 in the same two categories, respectively, in 2001. Auburn completed its season with a victory over No. 10 Penn State on New Year's Day in the Capital One Bowl.

Before going to Auburn, he spent three seasons in the NFL with the Jacksonville Jaguars. He was the quarterbacks coach in 1999 and 2000, and the offensive coordinator in 2001.

While with the Jaguars, he worked with quarterback Mark Brunell, who threw for 3,640 yards in 2000, which was the second-highest total in team history, and 3,309 yards in his 2001 season as offensive coordinator. In 1999, Jacksonville advanced to the AFC Championship Game.

In his first stint at Louisville, he was the offensive coordinator for the Cardinals in 1998. In that one season, Louisville was the top-ranked NCAA Division I-A team in scoring and total offense while recording the biggest turnaround in the nation. The Cardinals improved from 1-10 in 1997 to 7-5 in '98.

Petrino and quarterback Chris Redman helped the Cardinals set school records for points scored (444), scoring average (40.4), touchdowns (62), passing yards (4,498), passing touchdowns (33) and total yards (6,156). Redmen passed for 300 yards or more eight times on the season while reserve quarterback Mike Watkins also topped the 300-yard passing mark once. Louisville scored 60 or more points three times that season (wins over Cincinnati, 62-19; Western Kentucky, 63-44; and East Carolina, 63-45).

The Helena, Mont., native was the offensive coordinator at Utah State for three years (1995-97) before going to Louisville. While in Logan, Utah, he helped Utah State set school records by averaging 468.5 yards of total offense and 317.5 yards passing during the 1996 season. Prior to his arrival, USU averaged just more than 300 yards per game in total offense. In 1996, the Aggies also racked up a school-record 273 first downs, an average of nearly 25 first downs a game.

In 1994, he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at the University of Nevada. The Wolfpack ranked second in the nation in passing (330) and total offense (500) per game, and was third in the nation with 37.6 points a game. During his one-year stint at Nevada, the Wolfpack boasted 10 100-yard rushing performances and six 300-yard passing efforts. Nevada posted a 9-2 record and won a share of the Big West Conference title.

In 1992 and '93, he was the quarterbacks coach at Arizona State where he assisted in the development of future All-American and NFL star Jake Plummer. While with the Sun Devils, Petrino also worked with then-ASU quarterback and current UA quarterbacks coach Garrick McGee.

Prior to his two years at Arizona State he was the quarterbacks coach (1989) and offensive coordinator (1990 & 1991) for three seasons at the University of Idaho. He was the wide receivers coach at Weber State in 1987 and '88.

Petrino literally grew up in the coaching profession. His father, Bob Petrino Sr., coached at Carroll College in Helena, Mont., for 26 seasons, earning 163 victories and 15 conference titles. As a child, Petrino Jr. would race after school to the practice field to observe his father during his legendary career.

Bobby Petrino officially started his coaching career as a graduate assistant for his father at Carroll College in 1983. After a graduate assistant stint as quarterbacks coach at Weber State in 1984, Petrino returned to be the offensive coordinator for his father in 1985-86. Carroll had the top-ranked offense in the NAIA ranks in both of his seasons, thanks in large part to the play of Bobby Petrino's younger brother Paul, who was a four-year starter at quarterback at Carroll College. Paul Petrino now serves as Arkansas' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Before Bobby Petrino coached for his father, he played football for him at Carroll College. Petrino played quarterback and twice earned NAIA All-America honors. He led the Fighting Saints to three straight Frontier Conference championships and was named the league's most valuable



player in 1981 and 1982. He also played four years of basketball at Carroll. Petrino earned a bachelor's degree in physical education with a minor in mathematics from Carroll College in 1983.

Born March 10, 1961, Petrino and his wife, the former Becky Schaff, have four children: Kelsey, Nick, Bobby and Katie.
