- ▶ LSU steps out of SEC play to take on Baylor in a mid-week tilt Wednesday at the new Tiger Park.
- ▶ The Bears are led by former LSU head coach Glenn Moore (1999-2000) and he is assisted by former Tiger All-American hurler Britni Sneed (1999-2002).
- ▶ Sneed was the first softball player to be inducted into the LSU Hall of Fame on Tuesday and will be honored on the field during a pregame ceremony.
- ▶ Girouard enters tonight's game 20 wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 51 consecutive weeks in both the USA Today/ NFLCA and ESPN/USA Softball Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 20 and No. 22 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has won eight of its last nine games dating back to the final game of the Easton Tiger Classic on Feb. 15 and have out-scored its opponents, 59-16.
- The Tiger offense has posted a .339 team batting average headlined by Kirsten Shortridge from the leadoff spot. She is hitting .464 with nine RBIs.
- Shortridge has reeled off hits in nine of her last 10 games with four multi-hit efforts. She is 12-for-15 stealing bases.
- Rachel Mitchell has knocked a hit in 11 of her last 12 games and picked up an RBI in four of last five games.
- Mitchell also has drawn a walk in her last eight games and has an on-base percentage of .630 during that stretch.
- Ashley Applegate has reached base in 10 of her 12 nine games. She notched hits in all three games of the Kentucky series last weekend, including a career-best four hits in game two. The last time a Tiger reached that feat was Killian Roessner against Arkansas during the 2007 season.
- Applegate is two RBIs from matching her total from last season. Her seven RBIs are sixth on the team.
- Jazz Jackson recorded a season-best three hits in the series finale against Kentucky. She also produced RBIs in the last two games of the series.
- Juliana Santos has scored a run in her last six outings. She also has tallied a hit in six of her last nine games and belted a grand slam in the first inning en route to a career-best five RBIs. Tayl'r Hollis against St. John's in 2008 was the last Tiger to reach that feat.
- After starting the season 0-for-9, Jessica Mouse is hitting .308 (8-for-26) in her last 11 games.
- Eight of Anissa Young's 10 RBIs are on her three home runs. She is hitting .366 (11-for-30) when putting the ball in play.

- Courtney Hollier has drawn a walk in five of her last seven games.

CIRCLE NOTES

- Cody Trahan has won her last five starts and notched 31 strikeouts over her last 30.2 innings of work. She has allowed only five earned runs and recorded a 1.14 ERA during that stretch.
- Brittany Mack will look to bounce back after a rough outing in her SEC debut against Kentucky. She issued seven walks and allowed five earned runs.

OFF THE BENCH

- Casey Faile has not allowed an earned run in her last five appearances, a stretch of 10.1 innings. She recorded a two-inning save against Southern Miss (Feb. 25).
- Six of Ashley Langoni's last seven hits have produced RBIs, including a pair of home runs against Kentucky.
- Morgan Russell has powered home five RBIs in her last nine at-bats after starting the season 0-for-17.
- Lauren Capello has reached base in four of her six at-bats as a pinch hitter with two hits and two walks.
- Katie Guillory has scored three runs as a pinch runner. She also has gone 3-for-7 at the plate with an RBI.
- Katie Hamilton has reached base in all four games she has played in, including a three-game hitting streak. She returned to Georgia before LSU's home opener due for personal reasons.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU is 9-1 when hitting a home run against a 5-4 mark when not hitting a homer.
- The Tigers have won six of its eight games decided by one run.
- LSU is 10-1 when scoring first, including a 7-0 mark when scoring in the first inning.

- LSU has already played six extra inning games and had two additional games decided in the final two innings this season.
- The Tigers are 4-4 in those games, including a four-run come-from-behind victory in the seventh inning at Hawai'i (Feb. 7).
- The last time LSU accomplished that feat came at Georgia during the 2003 season.
- The Tigers also overcame two-run deficits on consecutive days against then-No. 5 Texas A&M (Feb. 14 & 15).

MITCHELL AND SHORTRIDGE ON USA SOFTBALL POY LIST

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was joined by junior pitcher/outfielder Kirsten Shortridge as two of 50 players named to the eighth annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year watch list as announced by the Amateur Softball Association.

The pair were two of 12 players from the SEC to be represented on the list. LSU has had at least two players on this list in four of the last five seasons.

The USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, considered the Heisman Trophy of women's collegiate softball, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

Former Tiger three-time All-American Britni Sneed was one of 10 finalists for the award in 2002 followed by two-time All-American Kristin Schmidt during the 2003 season. In 2006 and 2007, three-time All-American Leslie Klein was one of 25 finalists for the honor.

The 2009 Preseason Watch List is comprised of 50 players representing 32 schools and 13 different NCAA Division I Conferences. The ASA will announce the 25 finalists on April 1. A player does not have to appear on the initial watch list to be considered as a Top 25 finalist, but once the Top 25 is named, the remaining finalist must be selected from that list.

Just days before the start of postseason play, a list of 10 finalists will be named and released on May 6. The final three finalists will be announced May 20 with the winner of the 2009 USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award being announced prior to the start of the 2009 NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

MITCHELL NABS SPOT ON PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was one of 12 players to earn a spot on the second annual Preseason All-SEC Team as selected by the league's coaches.

Mitchell, a First-Team All-SEC and Second-Team NFCA All-South Region pick in 2008, finished the season by hitting safely in 13 of her last 16 games with a .438 batting clip to go along with six homers, 20 RBIs and a .958 slugging percentage.

TIGERS PICKED SECOND IN SEC WEST

LSU was picked to finish second in the Southeastern Conference Western Division as chosen by the conference's coaches in the league's annual preseason poll.

The Tigers totaled 21 points, 11 points behind division favorite Alabama. Mississippi State was selected third with 30 points, followed closely by Auburn with 35 points. Arkansas and Ole Miss finished out the Western Division with 49 and 50 points, respectively.

Florida led the Eastern Division with 10 points. The Gators also picked up 10 of the 11 votes for the overall conference championship. Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina and Kentucky complete the Eastern Division.
