SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ For the fourth time in program history, LSU will face both Mississippi schools on the road during the same season. It marks the first time that the Tigers will play the two schools back-to-back.
- ▶ The Tigers have won 11 of its last 13 games and are coming off a doubleheader sweep of No. 2 Alabama.
- ▶ Both LSU and Mississippi State made trips to Hawai'i this season. The Tigers tallied a 3-2 mark at the Paradise Classic (Feb. 5-7), while the Bulldogs split its six games during the Malihini Tournament (March 5-8).
- ▶ Girouard enters the Mississippi State series 17 wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 52 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 21 and No. 20 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU has won 11 of its last 13 games dating back to the final game of the Easton Tiger Classic on Feb. 15 and have outscored its opponents, 77-32.
- Kirsten Shortridge ignites the offense racking up 31 hits on a .388 batting average. She has reached base in 21 of 23 games in addition to being 14-for-18 in the stolen base department.
- Jazz Jackson paces LSU with a .455 batting average and is the only Tiger to record a hit in all six conference games. She notched a pair of three-hit outings in the series finale against Kentucky and at No. 8 Georgia.
- Juliana Santos has scored a run in nine of her last 10 games. She also has hit safely in five of her last six games and has picked up seven of her 12 RBIs against SEC opponents.
- Rachel Mitchell has knocked a hit in 13 of her last 16 games, including a three-run double during a five-run fifth inning in game two against No. 2 Alabama.
- The pre-season All-SEC performer also has drawn a walk in 10 of her last 12 games where she has a .537 on-base percentage.
- The Tigers are 12-1 when Santos hits third followed by Mitchell in the cleanup spot.
- Nine of Ashley Langoni's last 10 hits have produced RBIs, including a fifth inning solo homer in game one and a RBI-single during the first inning of game two against No. 2 Alabama.
- Langoni is batting .324 (11-of-34) and has driven home 12 of her team-leading 15 RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup.
- Ashley Applegate has slapped a hit in five of six SEC games, including a career-best four hits in game two against Kentucky. The last time a Tiger reached that feat was Killian Roessner against Arkansas during the 2007 season.
- Applegate is one RBI away from matching her total from last season. Her eight RBIs are sixth on the team.
- Eight of Anissa Young's 10 RBIs are on her three home runs. She is hitting .333 (12-for-36) when putting the ball in play.

- Morgan Russell has registered a hit in four of her last six games when she starts at catcher, including her first career multi-hit effort at No. 8 Georgia.
- After starting the season 0-for-9, Jessica Mouse is hitting .361 (13-for-36) in her last 15 games. She is currently on a career-long five game hitting streak.
- LSU is 11-2 when Mouse hits at the bottom of the lineup.

CIRCLE NOTES

- Cody Trahan has won her last six of her last seven starts. She is coming off an eight-strikeout performance where she limited No. 2 Alabama to a pair of runs on six hits.
- Brittany Mack looks to respond from a rough outing against No. 2 Alabama. She was touched up for a two, two-run homers in three innings.
- Kirsten Shortridge returned to the circle for the first time since facing UAB (Feb. 21). She fired four innings of three-hit relief and secured LSU's doubleheader sweep over No. 2 Alabama by retiring eight of the last nine batters she faced.
- Casey Faile has not allowed an earned run in her last five appearances, a stretch of 10.1 innings. She recorded a two-inning save against Southern Miss (Feb. 25).

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in five of her seven at-bats as a pinch hitter with two hits, two walks and a hit-by-pitch.
- Casey Faile has a hit in four of her seven starts, including a seventh inning RBI-double at Hawai'i (Feb. 7).
- Katie Guillory has scored four times as a pinch runner, including the game-winning run in the first game against No. 2 Alabama. She also has gone 3-for-7 at the plate with an RBI.
- Courtney Hollier has drawn a walk in five of her last eight games she has registered an at-bat.
- Katie Hamilton has reached base in all four games she has played in, including a three-game hitting streak. She returned to Georgia before LSU's home opener due for personal reasons.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU is 10-1 when hitting a home run against a 7-5 mark when not hitting a homer.
- The Tigers have won nine of its 12 games decided by one run. Five of LSU's six SEC games have been decided in this fashion.
- LSU is 11-1 when scoring first, including an unbeaten 8-0 mark when scoring in the first inning.
- The Tigers are 17-3 when scoring three or more runs.
- LSU has picked up wins in six of its seven games that begin after 6 p.m.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- LSU has already played six extra inning games and had four additional games where the lead has changed hand in the final two innings.
- The Tigers are 6-4 in those games, including a 3-2 walkoff win in game one over No. 2 Alabama. LSU challenged a Crimson Tide substitution which turned into a leadoff walk that came around to score on an error.
- LSU also completed a four-run comeback victory at Hawai'i (Feb. 7). The Tigers scored four in the seventh before winning the game on an Ashley Applegate walk in the ninth.
- The last time LSU accomplished that feat came at Georgia during the 2003 season.
- The Tigers also overcame two-run deficits on consecutive days to win a pair of one-run games against then-No. 5 Texas A&M (Feb. 14 & 15).

MITCHELL AND SHORTRIDGE ON USA SOFTBALL POY LIST

Junior outfielder Rachel Mitchell was joined by junior pitcher/outfielder Kirsten Shortridge as two of 50 players named to the eighth annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year watch list as announced by the Amateur Softball Association.

The pair were two of 12 players from the SEC to be represented on the list. LSU has had at least two players on this list in four of the last five seasons.

The USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, considered the Heisman Trophy of women's collegiate softball, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

Former Tiger three-time All-American Britni Sneed was one of 10 finalists for the award in 2002 followed by two-time All-American Kristin Schmidt during the 2003 season. In 2006 and 2007, three-time All-American Leslie Klein was one of 25 finalists for the honor.

The 2009 Preseason Watch List is comprised of 50 players representing 32 schools and 13 different NCAA Division I Conferences. The ASA will announce the 25 finalists on April 1. A player does not have to appear on the initial watch list to be considered as a Top 25 finalist, but once the Top 25 is named, the remaining finalist must be selected from that list.

Just days before the start of postseason play, a list of 10 finalists will be named and released on May 6. The final three finalists will be announced May 20 with the winner of the 2009 USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award being announced prior to the start of the 2009 NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

TIGERS PICKED SECOND IN SEC WEST

LSU was picked to finish second in the Southeastern Conference Western Division as chosen by the conference's coaches in the league's annual preseason poll.

The Tigers totaled 21 points, 11 points behind division favorite Alabama. Mississippi State was selected third with 30 points, followed closely by Auburn with 35 points. Arkansas and Ole Miss finished out the Western Division with 49 and 50 points, respectively.

Florida led the Eastern Division with 10 points. The Gators also picked up 10 of the 11 votes for the overall conference championship. Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina and Kentucky complete the Eastern Division.
