## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ For the second time in the last three seasons, LSU welcomes the No. 1 team in the nation to Baton Rouge as Florida visits the new Tiger Park for a weekend series.
- ▶ The Tigers halted Tennessee's 25-game winning streak and took two of three games in front of the program's two largest crowds at the old Tiger Park during the 2007 season.
- ▶ LSU's offense is hitting .382 as a team over its last five games. Kirsten Shortridge, Rachel Mitchell, Ashley Applegate, Anissa Young and Jessica Mouse are each hitting over .450 and have combined for 69.2 percent (27-of-39) of the team's RBIs.
- ▶ Head coach Yvette Girouard enters the Florida series seven wins away from reaching 1,200 career victories.
- ▶ LSU has spent 56 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 18 and No. 19 in this week's edition of the polls.

**STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS**

- After starting the season 6-4, LSU has won 21 of its last 28 games (.750). The Tigers are batting .382 as a team and have belted double-digit hits in four of its last five games.
- LSU was 11-for-24 with runners in scoring position Wednesday against Southeastern Louisiana.
- Rachel Mitchell and Ashley Applegate combined for nine RBIs, while Casey Faile and Brittany Mack tossed a pair of complete games holding the Lady Lions to one run on six hits.
- Kirsten Shortridge ignites the offense racking up 60 hits on a .423 batting average. She has reached base in 35 of 38 games in addition to being 18-for-23 in the stolen base department.
- Shortridge is on an 11-game hitting streak and is batting at a .511 clip (23-for-45) posting nine of her team-best 20 multi-hit efforts during the streak.
- Jazz Jackson has strung together a season long 12-game hitting streak and tallied a hit in 15 of 17 SEC games.
- It's the fourth time in Jackson's career with a double-digit hit streak. She had an 11-game streak (Feb. 15-24) last season and a career-best 13-game streak (Feb. 18-March 2) in 2007.
- Juliana Santos has recorded a hit in 16 of her last 21 games and has picked up 14 of her 20 RBIs against SEC opponents. She also has scored a run in 21 of her last 26 games.
- Santos is the reigning SEC Freshman and LSWA Hitter of the Week after belting a pinch-hit triple to tie the score at 1-1 during the seventh inning at Nicholls (April 7) and broke open the rubber game of the Arkansas series (April 11) with a two-run single during the second inning.
- Rachel Mitchell has compiled hits in seven straight games and 12 of her last 16 games. She has collected 16 of her team-best 30 RBIs during that stretch.
- Earlier this season, Mitchell swept SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors (Week of March 23).

- The Tigers are 20-5-1 when Santos hits third followed by Mitchell in the cleanup spot.
- 11 of Ashley Langoni's last 16 hits have produced RBIs. Eight of those hits have gone for extra bases as Langoni has knocked in 18 of her 21 RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup.
- Ashley Applegate has slapped a hit in 12 of 17 SEC games, including six multi-hit efforts. She has already surpassed her RBI total from a season ago and is currently on a career-long five game hitting streak.
- 15 of Anissa Young's 24 RBI's are on her team-leading seven home runs. She has tallied a hit in 12 of her last 14 games with five of her seven multi-hit efforts during that stretch.
- Young also has seen her batting average climb from .190 to .272 over those 14 games. She is batting .400 (28-for-70) when putting the ball in play this season and has struck out only twice in her last eight games.
- Langoni, Santos and Young have accounted for 40.1 percent (65-of-162) of LSU's RBIs this season. The trio also has knocked 15 of the team's 21 home runs.
- Morgan Russell broke out of a nine-game, 0-for-21 slump with her second career multi-hit game during the Tennessee series finale (April 5). She added a single and scored a run in her only start at Arkansas (April 11).
- Jessica Mouse has reached base in 11-of-her last 18 plate appearances over the last five games. She has five hits to go along with five walks and was hit-by-a-pitch once.
- LSU is 21-6-1 when Mouse hits at the bottom of the lineup. She is batting .317 (20-of-63) and has picked up 13 of her 14 RBIs from the No. 9 hole.

**CIRCLE NOTES**

- After starting the season with six no-decisions, Cody Trahan has gone 7-3 with seven complete games. She is coming off a season-best 11 strikeouts during the Arkansas series finale.

- Brittany Mack had her streak of eight consecutive wins snapped in the opening game of the Arkansas series (April 10). She reeled off her 11th win of the season in game two against Southeastern Louisiana (April 15).
- Kirsten Shortridge racked up a season-best five strikeouts but earned the loss in the middle game of the Tennessee series (April 4). She fired four innings of three-hit relief and secured LSU's doubleheader sweep over No. 2 Alabama (March 18).
- Casey Faile has surrendered only one earned run in her last 10 appearances, a stretch of 29.2 innings.
- Faile mowed down a career-best eight batters in game one against Southeastern Louisiana (April 15). She also tossed 4.1 innings off three-hit relief with seven strikeouts in game two at Arkansas (April 10).

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in six of her 12 at-bats as a pinch hitter with three walks, two hits and a hit-by-pitch.
- Casey Faile has recorded a hit in five of her eight starts at designated player and drove home an RBI in the first two games of the Arkansas series.
- Katie Guillory has scored five times as a pinch runner, including the game-tying run in the series finale at Mississippi State. She also has gone 3-for-8 at the plate with an RBI.
- Courtney Hollier has appeared in 29 games being used primarily as a defensive replacement at second base.
- After missing LSU's first 26 games, Tiffany Shaw has scored six times in 10 pinch running appearances, including the game-tying runs at Southern Miss (April 1) and Nicholls (April 7).
- Katie Hamilton has reached base in all four games she has played in, including a three-game hitting streak. She returned to Georgia before LSU's home opener due for personal reasons.

IT'S NOT SO BAD BEING TRENDY

- LSU is 14-3-1 when hitting a home run against a 13-7 mark when not hitting a homer.
- LSU has won 11 of its 17 games decided by one run. Nine of the Tigers 17 SEC games have been decided in this fashion.
- LSU is 19-2-1 when scoring first, including an unbeaten 12-0-1 mark when scoring in the first inning. In eight of those 12 games, Kirsten Shortridge has scored the game's first run.
- The Tigers are 26-5-1 when scoring three or more runs.
- LSU has won 12 of its 13 games that have begun after 6 p.m.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- In 11 of LSU's 23 wins this season, LSU has entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- Behind 1-0 in the seventh inning, Juliana Santos scored pinch runner Tiffany Shaw with a triple into a right centerfield gap at Nicholls (April 7). On the next batter, a Colonel fielding error allowed Santos to score the game winning run.
- Jessica Mouse, Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson provided back-to-back-to-back RBI singles with two outs to turn a 2-1 deficit into a 4-2 advantage during the sixth inning at Southern Miss (April 1).
- Trailing 5-1 going into the fifth inning of the series finale at Mississippi State (March 22), the Tigers scored six runs in the last three innings highlighted by a Mouse RBI-triple and Shortridge RBI-single in the sixth inning to give LSU the lead.
- Mouse broke a 4-4 tie belting a home run during the seventh inning of the series opener at Mississippi State (March 21).
- LSU exploded for five runs in the fifth inning down 5-1 in game two against Alabama (March 18). With the bases loaded, Rachel Mitchell cleared the bases with a game-tying double and used alert base running to score the game-winning run on a Crimson Tide error.
- One week earlier, Morgan Russell scored on a wild pitch in the bottom of the seventh as the Tigers edged Baylor 4-3.

**THE BEST YEAR(S) EVER**

- Kirsten Shortridge's .423 batting average is second highest in program history for a season only behind Ashlee Ducote's .431 mark during the 2000 season. Her .463 on-base percentage is third for a single season.
- Rachel Mitchell currently holds the program record with a .441 on-base percentage. Camille Harris (2003-06) and Ashlee Ducote (1997-2000) are second at .430.
- Mitchell's .596 career slugging percentage is second only behind Leslie Klein (2004-07) at .607.

**TIGERS PICKED SECOND IN SEC WEST**

LSU was picked to finish second in the Southeastern Conference Western Division as chosen by the conference's coaches in the league's annual preseason poll.

The Tigers totaled 21 points, 11 points behind division favorite Alabama. Mississippi State was selected third with 30 points, followed closely by Auburn with 35 points.

Arkansas and Ole Miss finished out the Western Division with 49 and 50 points, respectively.

Florida led the Eastern Division with 10 points. The Gators also picked up 10 of the 11 votes for the overall league championship.

Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina and Kentucky complete the Eastern Division.
