#### LSU Opens Fifth Season Under Les Miles Against Washington

LSU will travel the farthest its ever been - 2,550 miles - for a football game on Saturday when the Tigers open the 2009 season against Washington in Seattle. Kickoff for Tigers and Huskies is set for 9:36 p.m. CT from Husky Stadium. The game will be televised nationally by ESPN. The contest will mark only the second meeting between the two schools, and the first since a 40-14 LSU win over the Huskies in Tiger Stadium in 1983. Its also the first time that the Tigers have played a game on the West Coast since a 1984 contest against Southern Cal (LSU won 23-3). It's also just the second time in school history the Tigers have played a game in the Pacific Time Zone. LSU goes into the Washington game ranked No. 9 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 11 in the AP Poll. LSU has been ranked in the preseason AP and Coaches Poll every year since 2001. The Washington contest also marks the first for the Tigers against a Pac-10 team since a 45-3 win over Arizona in Tiger Stadium in 2006. LSU last played at a Pac-10 opponent in 2005 when the Tigers were forced, due to Hurricane Katrina, to travel to Tempe, Ariz., to face Arizona State. LSU used a fourth quarter rally to beat the Sun Devils, 35-31 in what was Les Miles' first game as the Tiger head coach. The Washington game represents the start of Miles' fifth season as head coach at LSU. Miles' first four years at LSU was the best four-year stretch in school history with 42 wins (11 losses), four bowl victories, and a national title. The Tigers go into 2009 with an offense that will be led by sophomore QB Jordan Jefferson and a stable of running backs paced by senior Charles Scott, who rushed for 1,174 yards in 2008. As a group, LSU returns 92.7 percent (2,011 of 2,168 yards) of its rushing game from a year ago. The Tigers also return 88.4 percent (2,314 of 2,617 yards) of its passing game from 2008. Brandon LaFell (63 rec., 929 yards, 8 TDs) and TE Richard Dickson (31-324-5) return as the Tigers' top two receivers. Defensively, coordinator John Chavis will make his debut against Washington. Chavis has overhauled a Tiger defense that allowed 24.2 points and 325.5 yards per game in 2008. LSU returns its tackles leader (LB Harry Coleman - 71), sacks leader (DE Rahim Alem - 8) and interception leader (CBC Chris Hawkins - 3) from a year ago. LSU also has new starters at both kicker (Josh Jasper) and punter (Derek Helton).

#### Tigers Finish 2008 Season In Style With 38-3 Bowl Win Over Georgia Tech

LSU put a season worth of frustration behind it in the Chick-fil-A Bowl as the Tigers capped 2008 with a 38-3 thrashing of 14th-ranked Georgia Tech. The win ran LSU's record to 8-5 overall marking the ninth straight year in which the Tigers have won at least eight games - a school record. LSU also ended a season with a bowl victory for the fourth straight year. The Tigers opened 2008 with four straight wins and climbed to as high as No. 3 in the nation before a loss to Florida in early October. Of LSU's five losses in 2008, one came to eventual national champion Florida; one came to then-No. 1 ranked Alabama in overtime and another came at the hands of top 10-ranked Georgia. LSU had top 25 wins over Auburn and Georgia Tech. Last year also saw the Tigers overcome the largest deficit in school history to win a game as LSU came back from being down 31-3 in the third quarter against Troy, to win 40-31.

# Les Miles

HEAD COACH • FIFTH YEAR

It has been said that LSU is in the midst of the Golden Era of football at the school and head coach Les Miles has been the driving force behind the Tigers' continued dominance at the national level since his arrival in 2005.

In four years at LSU, Miles has led the charge in what has been the best run in the history of football at the school. Since taking over the program in January of 2005, Miles has led LSU to a national title, a Southeastern Conference championship, two appearances in the SEC Championship Game, three straight top five finishes, and four bowl victories, two of which were BCS contests.

Throw in 42 victories and three seasons of at least 11 victories and that makes for the best four-year stretch of football in school history.

Miles' record with the Tigers is an astonishing 42-11 with those victories representing the most by any LSU football coach over a four-year period. In addition to his 42 wins, some other notable accomplishments during his first four years with the Tigers include: only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice; only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game; nine wins over coaches who have won national titles; only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings; and a perfect 4-0 record in bowl games, which includes wins in the BCS Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 10 wins for the past four years, the Tigers have had 66 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 85 earning their college diploma.

Sixteen of the 18 seniors on the 2008 football team graduated, while 18 members of the 25-man senior class from the 2007 national championship team have earned their degree.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 25 NFL Draft picks over the past four years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards - the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies - as well as being named the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American. A year later, Tyson Jackson became the highest drafted defensive player in LSU history, going No. 3 overall to the Kansas City Chiefs.

Now, with the Tigers becoming the first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for the LSU football program continues to be solid. After 42 wins, including 17 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with four-straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 class in 2009, Miles and the Tigers have solidified their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

## LSU Goes West To Face Washington

LSU will travel over 2,000 miles this week as the Tigers open the 2009 season against Washington in Seattle. The Washington game will mark the longest distance LSU has ever had to travel for a football game. LSU is 1-0 all time against Washington. The only time the teams met came in 1983 in Tiger Stadium when unranked LSU upset then-No. 9 Washington, 40-14, on Sept. 24. LSU brings of nation's best streak of 19 straight non-conference wins into the Washington game.

## LSU Travel Plans

Due to the long distance that LSU must travel for this week's season opener, the Tigers will change up their travel routine. LSU will depart Baton Rouge a day early, leaving on Thursday evening after practice instead of Friday afternoon. LSU will also spend the night in Seattle on Saturday night (the Tigers always return home immediately following all other road games) and return home on Sunday afternoon.

## Did You Know...

- \* The Washington contest is just the second time in school history that LSU will play a game in the Pacific Time Zone.
- \* Saturday's 9:36 p.m. CT kickoff will be the latest LSU has ever started a football game.
- \* LSU has the nation's longest non-conference winning streak at 19 in a row.
- \* LSU men's basketball coach **Trent Johnson** grew up and Seattle and lived just a few miles from Husky Stadium as a child. Johnson will be in the stands on Saturday night for the game.
- \* **Jordan Jefferson** will be the youngest LSU quarterback to start a season-opener since **Y.A. Tittle** in 1945. Jefferson will be 19 years, 11 days when the Tigers kickoff on Saturday vs. Washington. Tittle was 18 years, 11 months and 6 days when he took the opening snap vs. Rice in 1945.

## Just How Far Is Seattle

With 2,551 miles separating Baton Rouge and Seattle, this will be the farthest LSU has ever traveled for a football game. To put a little perspective on the distance between the two cities, consider that the combined distance that LSU will travel for its remaining four away games this year is 1,590 miles (300 to Starkville, 597 to Athens, 347 to Tuscaloosa and 346 to Oxford), nearly 1,000 miles short of the distance the Tigers will travel to for the season opener.

## LSU-Washington Ties

LSU wide receiver coach **D.J. McCarthy** played football at Washington for three seasons (1991-92-93) and he was a part of the Huskies national title team in 1991. McCarthy is a 1994 graduate of Washington. Washington AD Scott Woodward is an LSU graduate and spent several years serving as the athletic department liaison for the Chancellor's office earlier this decade. Current Washington chancellor Dr. Mark Emmert held the same post at LSU for several years ... LSU men's basketball coach **Trent Johnson** served as an assistant basketball coach at Washington from 1989-92.

## LSU vs. the Pac-10

LSU goes into the Washington game sporting a 12-3 all-time mark against teams from the Pac-10. LSU has faced Oregon State more than any other Pac-10 team and the Tigers are 4-0 against the Beavers. LSU is 3-0 vs. Arizona, 1-0 vs. Arizona State, 1-0 vs. Washington, 2-1 vs. Oregon, 1-1 vs. Southern Cal, and 0-1 vs. Stanford. LSU has never faced UCLA, California or Washington State. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 3-1 vs. the Pac-10, which includes a 2-0 mark at LSU. Miles has wins over Arizona and Arizona State while at LSU and he was 1-1 vs. UCLA while the head coach at Oklahoma State.

## Miles vs. Washington

Saturday's game will be the first time that **Les Miles** has faced Washington as a head coach, however, he has been involved in four games against the Huskies as an assistant coach. ## LSU Ranked In USA Today Coaches Poll Top 10 To Start Season For Sixth Straight Year

When LSU kicks off the 2009 season on Saturday against Washington, they will do so ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation. LSU is ranked No. 9 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll. It marks the sixth straight year that the Tigers enter week 1 of the regular season ranked in the top 10. LSU has been ranked in the preseason top 10 every year since the 2004 season. LSU is ranked No. 11 in the AP preseason poll.

## LSU In Season-Openers

LSU brings an 82-28-5 overall mark in season-openers into the Washington game. The Tigers have won six straight and 12 of their last 13 season-openers. LSU's only season-opening loss over the past 13 years came at Virginia Tech by a 26-8 count in 2002. Last year, the Tigers rolled to a 41-13 win over Appalachian State in Tiger Stadium to open the season.

## Miles In Season Openers

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 5-3 in season openers in his eight previous years as a head coach. Miles is 4-0 in season openers at LSU, beating Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe in 2005 followed by a 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in 2006, a 45-0 victory over Mississippi State in 2007 and the 41-13 victory over Appalachian State last year.

## LSU Won No. 700 In 2008 Finale

LSU won the programs 700th game last year against Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-a Bowl. Currently, LSU is one of only 12 schools in college football's highest division that have won 700 games during their history.

## LSU Leads Nation With 19 Straight Non-Conference Wins

LSU goes into its game with Washington having won 19 straight non-conference games, a streak that dates back to the start of the 2005 season. LSU coach Les Miles is a perfect 19-0 in non-conference games at LSU. The 19-game non-conference winning streak ranks first nationally. LSU's last non-conference loss came during the 2004 season when Iowa scored on the final play of the game to beat LSU, 30-25, in the Capital One Bowl. LSU hasn't lost a regular season non-conference contest since dropping a 26-8 decision to Virginia Tech in the 2002 season opener.

## LSU Hasn't Been Kind To Non-SEC Foes; Tigers Have Outscored Them 694 to 170 Under Miles

LSU coach Les Miles is 19-0 in non-conference games with the Tigers and in those 19 contests, only six teams - Arizona State, Notre Dame, Louisiana Tech, Ohio State, Appalachian State, Tulane and Troy - have reached double-figures in points against LSU. A year ago, LSU went 5-0 in five non-conference games, outscoring opponents 195-60. In the 19 non-conference games the Tigers have played under Miles, LSU has outscored its opponents 694 to 170 or by an average of 36.5 to 8.9.

## LSU's Won 16 Straight Overall On ESPN Family Of Networks; Streak At 15 On ESPN

LSU brings a 16-game winning streak on the ESPN family of networks into the Washington game. The 16-game streak goes back to the 2005 season when Tennessee rallied for a 30-27 overtime win over the Tigers on a Monday night in a game televised by ESPN2. Since then, the Tigers have reeled off 16 straight victories on the all sports network. Breaking down the 16-game streak has the Tigers winning nine straight on ESPN, six in a row on ESPN2, and one on ESPN Classic. In ESPN only games, the Tigers have won 15 straight, a streak that dates back to the 2002 season.

## LSU's Won 9 Straight And 11 of Last 12 In September

In addition to its 19 game non-conference winning streak, LSU brings a 9-game winning streak in games played in September into the Washington contest. LSU hasn't lost a game in September since a 7-3 setback to Auburn on Sept. 16, 2006. Overall, LSU coach Les Miles is 12-2 in September games with the Tigers.

## Jefferson Youngest Starting QB In SEC; Youngest LSU QB To Start Season-Opener Since 1945

LSU's Jordan Jefferson goes into the 2009 season as the youngest starting quarterback in the SEC. Jefferson, who has two career starts to his credit, will be 19 years and 11 days when he takes the first snap against Washington. Jefferson will be the youngest quarterback to start a season-opener for the Tigers since Y.A. Tittle in 1945. That year, Tittle was 18 years, 11 months, and 6 days when the Tigers opened the season against Rice. Here's a look at some of the younger quarterbacks who started season-openers at LSU:

## LSU To Start A New Quarterback In Season Opener For Third Straight Year

LSU will start a new quarterback in a season opener for the third straight year against Washington as sophomore Jordan Jefferson will take the first snap for the Tigers. Jefferson, who was offensive MVP of last year's Chick-fil-A Bowl, will be making his third career start for the Tigers, all of which have come away from Tiger Stadium. Jefferson is 1-1 as LSU's starting quarterback - beating Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl and losing to Arkansas in Little Rock in last year's regular season finale. LSU started the 2007 season with a new quarterback when Matt Flynn took the opening snap, while last year, Jarrett Lee made his first career start in the opener against Appalachian State. JaMarcus Russell was the last LSU quarterback to serve as starter for more than one year (2005-06).

## Two Brothers To Start For Tigers On Defense

LSU will have two brothers starting on defense against Washington on Saturday as DE Rahim Alem (formerly Al Jones) and FS Chad Jones will both be in the starting lineup. It's the first time brothers will start in the same game for the Tigers since 2005 when FB Kevin Steltz and S Craig Steltz both started in a win over Appalachian State.

## Charles Scott Goes Over 1,000-yard Mark

LSU's Charles Scott topped the 1,000-yard rushing mark in 2008, going for 1,174 yards and 18 touchdowns in what was one of the most productive seasons in school history for a running back. Scott's 1,174 rushing yards is the fifth-highest total in school history, while is 18 rushing TDs ranks No. 2 all-time. Scott goes into 2009 looking to become the first LSU running back since Kevin Faulk to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons. Faulk did it three straight years from 1996 to 1998. Only three players in LSU history have had back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons - Charles Alexander (1977-78), Dalton Hilliard (1984-85) and Faulk (1996-97-98).

## LSU Returns Top Rusher, Receiver And Passer For First Time Since 1997

For the first time since the 1997 season, LSU returns its top three hands on offense in terms of rushing, passing and receiving. This year, Charles Scott returns as the Tigers leading rusher from a year ago, while Brandon LaFell returns as the top receiver from 2008 and quarterback Jarrett Lee comes back after leading the Tigers in passing yards. In 1997, running back Kevin Faulk, quarterback Herb Tyler and wide receiver Larry Foster all returned on offense after leading the Tigers in rushing, receiving and passing from the year before.

His 10 TD receptions tie with Brad Boyd for the school's career mark for a tight end, while his 69 catches are No. 4 in school history and his 795 yards are No. 5 in school history. ## He Must Be A Former Lineman

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach Les Miles is a former offensive lineman. In 53 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 39-5 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 29-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 28-0. ## A Unique Situation At Left Tackle - 2 Players Have Accounted For Last 92 Starts

Starting left tackle Ciron Black goes into the 2009 season having started 40 straight games, all coming at left tackle. Since the start of the 2002 season, a stretch that spans 92 games, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Black and Andrew Whitworth. Whitworth, now a starting guard for the Cincinnati Bengals, set an LSU record by starting 52 straight games for the Tigers from 2002-05. Black then picked up where Whitworth left off, starting the next 40 games at that position for the Tigers.

## Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

Here are some notable trends for LSU in the 53 games its played under head coach Les Miles ... LSU is 28-0 under Les Miles when rushing for 100 or more yards and holding the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards. The Tigers are 39-5 when rushing for 100 yards or more ... On the contrary, the Tigers are just 3-6 under Les Miles when failing to reach the 100-yard mark in net rushing yards ... The Tigers are 30-3 when leading after the first quarter with the only losses during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005, Arkansas in 2007, and Alabama in 2008 - all three of which were overtime losses ... LSU is 40-7 when scoring 20 or more points and 34-5 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 29-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing, while the record goes to 13-8 under Miles when allowing opponents to go over the 100-yard mark.

## LSU's Best After Dark; Tigers Have Won 23 Of Last 24 Night Games

Night games in Tiger Stadium seem to bring out the best in LSU. However, lately LSU has been at its best no matter the location just as long as it dark outside. After the win over Georgia Tech to cap the 2008 season, LSU ran its record to 23-1 over its last 24 night games. (Note: NCAA determines that a kickoff at 5 p.m. or later is a night game). Florida snapped LSU's streak of consecutive night wins at 19 on Oct. 11, 2008. LSU's streak of 23 wins in its last 24 night games includes seven games in 2008 and 2007, eight in 2006 and the win over Miami in the Chick-fil-A Bowl to cap the 2005 season. Prior to the Florida game on Oct. 11, 2008, LSU hadn't lost a night game since a 34-14 loss to Georgia in the SEC Championship Game in 2005. Overall, LSU coach Les Miles has guided the Tigers to a 29-3 mark in night games.

## Weekly Honors

### An Offseason Of National Championships For Chad Jones And Trindon Holliday

Free safety **Chad Jones** and running back/return specialist **Trindon Holliday** became national champions during the football off-season. Jones was an outfielder and key relief pitcher for LSU's 2009 College World Series champion baseball team. Jones maintained a 2.70 ERA in 6.2 innings pitched while walking three and striking out seven. He tossed three innings and did not allow a run or a hit in three appearances at the College World Series, which earned him the nickname "Dreadlocks of Doom". Jones came on in relief of starter Anthony Ranaudo in the deciding Game 3 of the CWS Championship Series against Texas and was brilliant. He did not allow a run in 1.2 innings of work while walking none and striking out two. Prior to spring football practice, Jones played in the outfield and batted .343 (12-for-35) with a homer, six RBI and eight runs scored. Along with former WR Jared Mitchell, Jones and he became just the second and third athletes in school history to win national titles in multiple team sports. Both were members of the 2007 BCS national championship team. Holliday, meanwhile, became the 100-meter dash national champion at the 2009 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. Holliday clocked 10.00 in the national final of the 100-meter to claim the title. The time was the fastest of any player in the history of college football.

## Wickersham Passes Tigers Past No. 7 Washington, 40-14

Accounting for four touchdowns in his third collegiate start -- a 40-14 devastation of seventh-ranked Washington -- sophomore quarterback Jeff Wickersham proved there's no substitute for experience. Running for three of those scores and passing for another, Wickersham led the Tiger offense in piling up 477 yards. Wickersham completed 16 of 27 passes for 259 yards before the stadium-record crowd of 82,390. (The previous best had been 79,665 at the season opener with Florida State). But Wickersham wasn't the only Tiger hero. Sophomore tailbacks Dalton Hilliard and Garry James combined for 121 and 88 yards, respectively. LSU, on its first three possessions, amassed 17 quick points in piling up a 20-7 lead by halftime. After adding another score midway through the third quarter and two more in the fourth, the Tigers demonstrated total domination over Coach Don James' Huskies. Washington, which had upset Michigan the week before behind the arm of quarterback Steve Pelluer, finished with 312 passing yards against LSU, but proved ineffective inside the 20. Defensively, LSU showed an inspired aggressiveness and held the Huskies to 28 yards rushing and two touchdowns. Junior inside linebacker Ricky Chatman led the charge with 10 stops, while safeties Jeffery Dale and Liffort Hogley each hauled in interceptions.

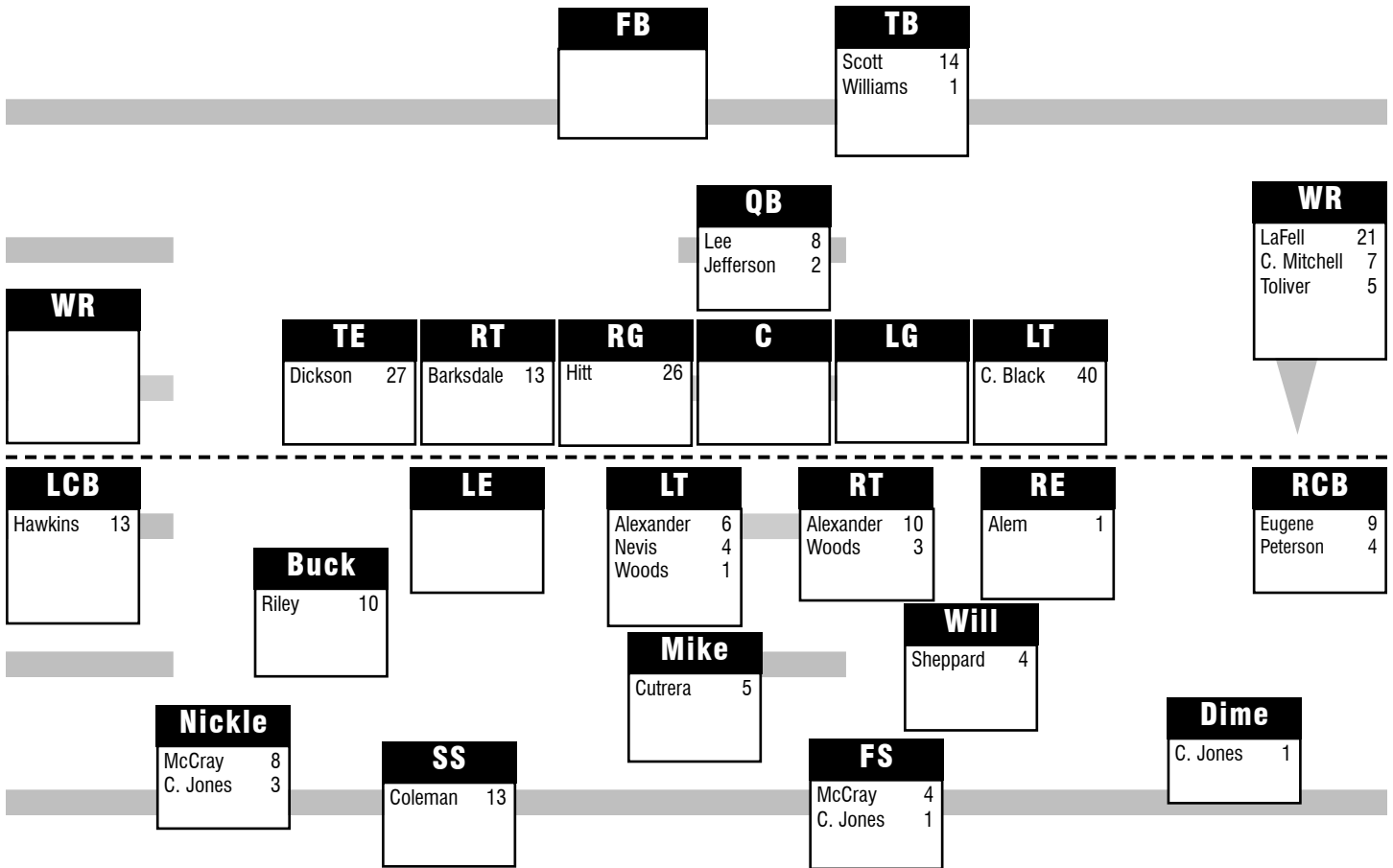
