## WEEKLY NEWS AND NOTES

### MISSISSIPPI STATE RETURNS HOME, LOOKS FOR BIG WINS

After a pair of Southeastern Conference road games, Mississippi State will return to Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field for three consecutive home games. The Bulldogs will face LSU (ranked 7th in both polls), Georgia Tech (receiving votes in both) and Houston (17th in AP, 23rd in USA Today).

### BULLDOGS HAVE BEEN GOOD AGAINST TOP-TIER RECENTLY

After winning just one game against a ranked opponent from 2001 to the middle of 2007 (1-22 record) State has won three of its last six games against ranked foes. The Bulldogs defeated No. 14 Kentucky and No. 21 Alabama in 2007, and defeated No. 13 Vanderbilt last season.

### STATE SEEKS 3-1 RECORD FOR SECOND TIME IN THREE YEARS; 2-1 SEC MARK FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2000

Mississippi State has started a season with a 3-1 mark through four games only once in the past eight seasons, as the 2007 team rattled of three-straight wins to move to 3-1 en route to a Liberty Bowl berth. Since 2000, no Bulldog squad has started a conference season with a 2-1 mark through three games.

### DIXON RETURNS TO FORM IN FIRST TWO GAMES

Senior running back Anthony Dixon has played in only two of MSU's first three games, meaning he hasn't reached the NCAA threshold of 75 percent of team games played to be ranked among national leaders. Dixon's 107.5 rushing yards per game would rank third in the SEC and 16th nationally. His 123 yards rushing at Vanderbilt moved him into third place on the school's all-time rushing yardage list with 2,818, and he needs only three yards to pass Walter Packer (2,280; 1973-76) for second.

### DOG DEFENSE DOMINATED 'DORES

The Bulldogs returned to their Week 1 defensive form and held Vanderbilt to 157 yards on 61 plays (2.6 yards per play). State held Vandy to only one first down in the first half, and the only Commodore points came on a drive that began on the Bulldog six yardline. In MSU's wins this season, the defense has allowed an average of 175.5 yards and 5.0 points.

### RUSHING ATTACK AMONG NATION'S BEST

The Mississippi State offense has relied heavily on its running game in the first three weeks of the season. MSU has gained 665 yards (221.7 ypg) on the ground and ranks 20th nationally and fourth in the Southeastern Conference in rushing yardage.

### SPECIAL TEAMS MAKING SPECIAL PLAYS

Head coach Dan Mullen has put an emphasis on special teams and serves as the special teams coach. His unit has been impressive in the first three games, as the Bulldogs rank 16th nationally in net punting, 23rd in punt return average and 36th in kickoff returns. Against Auburn, MSU blocked a punt and returned it for a touchdown, a first for State since 2001.

### HUTCHINS AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS, BRAUCHLE STREAKING

First-year punter Heath Hutchins and kicker Sean Brauchle have each made strong impressions early in their careers. Hutchins ranks second in the SEC with a 43.12 yard-per-punt average, and in 16 punts has allowed only six punt return yards. Brauchle missed his first two attempts as a Bulldog, but since then has made five consecutive tries, including a 49-yarder at Vandy last weekend.

### WRIGHT, MCPHEE PUTTING UP STRONG DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

Junior linebacker K.J. Wright and junior defensive lineman Pernell McPhee both had strong games against Vanderbilt as they work their way to the top of the SEC leaders in a pair of categories. After an 11-stop game in Nashville, Wright now has 21 total tackles, 10th most in the SEC. McPhee recorded 1.5 sacks, moving him into the conference leaders as well.

### BIG PLAY BERRY HAS ONE CALLED BACK, STILL SOLID IN RETURN GAME

Junior wide receiver Leon Berry totalled 246 all-purpose yards in State's loss at Auburn, and looked to be on a record-setting pace at Vanderbilt as he took the opening kickoff 89 yards for a score. And even though the score was called back due to an MSU penalty, Berry still complied 102 all-purpose yards on the evening.

BATON ROUGE, La. - Mississippi State trailed by just seven at halftime, but fifth-ranked LSU scored the first 10 points of the second half and never looked back as the Tigers posted a 34-24 win over the visiting Bulldogs Saturday night at Tiger Stadium.

With the setback State fell to 1-4, 0-2 in the Southeastern Conference. LSU remained undefeated at 4-0, 2-0 in the league.

State got on the board first after Derek Pegues returned the opening kickoff 59 yards to the LSU 32. That set up a 42-yard Adam Carlson field goal. The Tigers matched that score with a field goal of their own on the ensuing drive. After stopping MSU on the next drive, LSU took the lead on its next possession, marching 88 yards for the score. Charles Scott's 1-yard plunge capped the Tiger drive.

The Tigers extended their lead to 17-3 on their next drive with a 61-yard drive. Once again, Scott provided a 1-yard touchdown, this one coming on a fourth down attempt with 10:10 to go before halftime. Scott led LSU's offensive charge on the night with 27 carries for 141 yards and two touchdowns.

An LSU fumble aided the Bulldogs in getting back into the contest with 2:20 remaining before the intermission. Taking the ball at its own 47, Anthony Dixon ripped off a 23-yard run for State to the LSU 30. Then, after starting quarterback Tyson Lee scrambled for 16 yards to the LSU 10, two Christian Ducre' 5-yard runs later had the Bulldogs in the end zone. LSU led 17-10 at halftime.

LSU scored the first 10 points of the second half on its first two possessions to take control of the contest at 27-10. On its opening drive of the half, the Tigers went 58 yards on six plays. The scoring play came when quarterback Jarrett Lee hit Brandon LaFell on a pass play, but LaFell fumbled into the end zone and teammate Richard Dickson recovered. On their second march, the Tigers went 45 yards before stalling at the State 22. David then punched through a 39-yard field goal and the Tigers led 27-10 with 4:42 to go in the third period.

The Bulldogs finally broke through for their first points of the second half with an impressive 18-play, 74-yard march that ended the third and began the final period. Christian Ducre' saw much of the work on the drive for State, both on the ground and also hauling in a couple of receptions. With LSU trying to mount a goalline stand, Dixon, who finished with 50 yards on the ground, finally punched in a 1-yard touchdown with 10:25 left in the contest. LSU led 27-17.

State did mount an impressive drive to close out scoring on the evening, marching 68 yards to paydirt. Ducre hauled in a Tyson Lee pass and took it 11 yards for the score. On the drive, Lee completed 4-of-5 passes for 63 yards and the touchdown, the big play coming on a 41-yard connection with Jamayel Smith.

MSU's Lee finished his first career start solidly by completing 17-of-26 passes for 175 yards and one touchdown. He did not throw an interception.
