#### LSU To Host Louisiana Tech For Homecoming

LSU steps out of conference play for the final time during the regular season on Saturday when the eighth-ranked Tigers host Louisiana Tech at 6 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience on ESPNU. LSU goes into the game ranked No. 8 in the latest BCS standings, No. 9 in the AP Top 25 and No. 11 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and the Harris Interactive Rankings. LSU is 7-2 overall with its only losses coming at the hands of No. 1 Florida and No. 3 Alabama. Louisiana Tech is coming off a 45-35 loss to No. 5 Boise State last week and stands at 3-6 overall. This week's game against Louisiana Tech will serve as Homecoming for LSU. LSU is 56-25-3 all-time in Homecoming games, which includes an eight-game winning streak. LSU's hasn't dropped a Homecoming game since a 13-10 defeat to UAB in 2000. LSU brings the nation's longest non-conference winning streak into the Tech game as the Tigers have won 22 straight games against non-SEC opponents. LSU hasn't dropped a non-conference contest since falling to Iowa, 30-25, in the Capital One bowl during the 2004 season. In addition, LSU has won 27 consecutive non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, a stretch that goes back to the 2002 season when the Tigers lost to UAB by a 13-10 count. LSU has also won 24 consecutive games over teams from Louisiana. The last time LSU lost to a team from Louisiana came in 1982 when the Green Wave beat the Tigers, 31-28, in Tiger Stadium. LSU goes into the Tech game averaging 25.1 points and 317.1 total yards (136.3 rushing, 180.8 passing) per game. The Tigers are among the best in the SEC in defense, allowing only 13.4 points and 310.7 total yards (121.2 rushing, 189.4 passing) per game. The Tigers will be without their leading rusher in **Charles Scott** (clavicle) who will miss the remainder of the regular season. Scott, who ranks sixth all-time in school history with 2,317 rushing yards, was injured against Alabama. Defensively, a trio of linebackers - **Kelvin Sheppard** (78 tackles, 7.5 TFL), **Perry Riley** (63 tackles, 3.0 TFL) and **Harry Coleman** (55 tackles, 2 sacks) pace the Tigers.

#### Alabama Grinds Out 24-15 Win Over LSU

A rash of injuries, including a season-ending one to running back **Charles Scott**, along with the running of Alabama's **Mark Ingram** proved to be too much to overcome as the No. 3 Crimson Tide beat No. 9 LSU, 24-15. LSU led 15-10 going into the fourth quarter, however, Alabama scored 14 unanswered points during the final stanza to record the victory. After a scoreless first quarter, LSU got on the board first, taking a 7-0 lead when **Jordan Jefferson** connected with **Deangelo Peterson** for a 12-yard TD pass at the 9:12 mark. **Leigh Tiffin** kicked a 28-yard field goal for Alabama's only first half points as the Tigers led 7-3 at halftime. Alabama took its first lead of the game, 10-7, on its opening possession of the second half on a 21-yard TD pass from **Greg McElroy** to **Darius Hanks**. An LSU safety closed the gap to 10-9 at the 5:55 mark and then the Tigers regained the lead on an 8-yard run by **Stevan Ridley** two minutes later. Alabama pulled to within 15-13 on another Tiffin field goal early in the fourth quarter and the Crimson Tide took the lead for good, 21-15, when **Julio Jones** raced 73-yards for a TD at the 10:24 mark. LSU played the final quarter without Scott and Jefferson due to injuries. Scott finished with 83 rushing yards but was injured late in the third quarter after a 34-yard run. Jefferson finished 10-of-17 for 114 yards and 1 score, most of which came in the first half.

# Les Miles

HEAD COACH • FIFTH YEAR

It has been said that LSU is in the midst of the Golden Era of football at the school and head coach Les Miles has been the driving force behind the Tigers' continued dominance at the national level since his arrival in 2005.

In four years at LSU, Miles has led the charge in what has been the best run in the history of football at the school. Since taking over the program in January of 2005, Miles has led LSU to a national title, a Southeastern Conference championship, two appearances in the SEC Championship Game, three straight top five finishes, and four bowl victories, two of which were BCS contests.

Throw in 49 victories and three seasons of at least 11 victories and that makes for the best four-year stretch of football in school history.

Miles' record with the Tigers is an astonishing 49-13 with those victories representing the most by any LSU football coach over a four-year period. In addition to his 49 wins, some other notable accomplishments during his first four years with the Tigers include: only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice; only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game; nine wins over coaches who have won national titles; only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings; and a perfect 4-0 record in bowl games, which includes wins in the BCS Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 10 wins for the past four years, the Tigers have had 66 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 85 earning their college diploma.

Sixteen of the 18 seniors on the 2008 football team graduated, while 18 members of the 25-man senior class from the 2007 national championship team have earned their degree.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 25 NFL Draft picks over the past four years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards - the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies - as well as being named the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American. A year later, Tyson Jackson became the highest drafted defensive player in LSU history, going No. 3 overall to the Kansas City Chiefs.

Now, with the Tigers becoming the first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for the LSU football program continues to be solid. After 49 wins, including 18 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with four-straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 class in 2009, Miles and the Tigers have solidified their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

## LSU To Host Louisiana Tech For Homecoming

LSU will play its final non-conference game of the regular season on Saturday when the No. 8 Tigers host Louisiana Tech at 6 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on ESPNU. Both teams go into the game coming off losses to top-five ranked opponents - LSU falling to No. 3 Alabama last week, 24-15, while Tech dropped a 45-35 decision to No. 5 Boise State on Friday night. LSU brings a 7-2 overall mark into the game, while Tech is 3-6 overall.

## LSU In Homecoming Games

The Tigers bring a 56-25-3 mark in Homecoming games into the Louisiana Tech contest. LSU has won eight straight Homecoming games, including a 58-10 victory over Louisiana Tech in 2007. Last year, LSU rallied for a 40-31 win over Troy. LSU's last loss in a Homecoming contest came in 2000 when UAB stunned the Tigers, 13-10.

## Scott To Miss Remainder Of Regular Season With Injury

LSU running back **Charles Scott** will miss the remainder of the regular season after fracturing his clavicle in last week's game against Alabama. Scott, a senior from Saline, La., was injured on a 34-yard run late in the third quarter against the Crimson Tide. Scott finished the Alabama contest with 83 yards rushing on 13 attempts. Scott, who leads the Tigers with 542 rushing yards and four touchdowns this year, is the sixth leading rusher in LSU history with 2,317 yards. Scott is the second running back to go down with a season-ending injury for LSU this year as **Richard Murphy** (knee) was lost for the year during the Vanderbilt game. **Stevan Ridley**, **Keiland Williams** and **Trindon Holliday** will handle running back duties for the Tigers.

## LSU Moves Up A Spot To No. 8 In The BCS Standings

Despite the loss to Alabama, LSU still managed to move up one spot to No. 8 in this week's BCS Standings. LSU is one of three SEC teams in the top 10 - Florida is No. 1 and Alabama is No. 2. In the other polls, LSU is No. 9 in the AP Poll, and No. 11 in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the Harris Interactive Rankings. LSU has been ranked in the BCS top 10 all four weeks this year.

## Miles Moves Past Saban Into Third On LSU's Coaching Victory List

With the win over Tulane, LSU coach **Les Miles** moved past Nick Saban into sole possession of third place in school history with 49 victories. Miles is 49-13 overall as head coach of the Tigers. Miles goes into the Louisiana Tech game just one win shy of reaching the 50-victory milestone at LSU. Charles McClendon is the winningest coach in school history with 137 victories, followed by Bernie Moore with 83 and then Miles.

## Miles' List of Achievements

Now in his fifth season with the Tigers, LSU coach **Les Miles** has put together quite a list of achievements during his first 62 games. The following is a look at some of Miles' highlights during his five seasons with the Tigers:

- Third-winningest coach in LSU history with a 49-13 mark.
- Led LSU to 7-1 start for third time in five years (2005, 2007, and 2009)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice (2005 and 2007)
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 9 wins over coaches who have won national titles
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings

## LSU Storylines This Week ...

- LSU coach Les Miles will go after his 50th win as head coach of the Tigers on Saturday vs. Louisiana Tech.
- LSU holds the nation's longest non-conference winning streak at 22 straight games. LSU hasn't lost a non-conference game since a 30-25 defeat to Iowa in the Capital One Bowl to cap the 2004 season.
- LSU has also won 27 consecutive non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, a stretch that goes back to the 2002 season when the Tigers dropped a 13-10 decision to UAB.
- LSU has won 24 consecutive games over teams from Louisiana. The last time LSU lost to a team from Louisiana came in 1982 when the Green Wave beat the Tigers, 31-28, in Tiger Stadium.
- LSU has won 34 of its last 35 Saturday night games in Tiger Stadium.
- Since the 2002 season, LSU is 50-12 in games which they were ranked in the Top 10.
- LSU will have a different starter at running back for the first time since the start of the 2008 season due to the injury to **Charles Scott**. Scott had started 22 straight games at running back for the Tigers.

## Noting the LSU Defense

- LSU's defense is allowing just 7.0 points in its five home games this year.
- LSU is third in the SEC and 10th in the nation in scoring defense at 13.4 points per game
- LSU has intercepted at least one pass in 11 straight games, it's the longest streak for the Tigers since having an interception in 19 consecutive games from the Tulane game in 1983 to the Ole Miss game in 1985.
- LSU hasn't allowed a first quarter touchdown since the Mississippi State contest (5 games).
- LSU has only allowed 13 first half points in its last five games (Florida 10, Alabama 3).
- LSU has pitched first half shutouts against Georgia, Auburn and Tulane and allowed just a first half field goal to Alabama.
- LSU is tied with Arkansas atop the SEC in redzone defense, allowing opponents to score just 66.7 percent of the time (14 of 21). LSU has forced three redzone turnovers this year.
- LSU has forced 17 turnovers this year and the Tigers are tied with Arkansas for first in the SEC in turnover margin at +9 (1.0 per game)
- LSU is second in the SEC in redzone defense, allowing opponents to score just 69.6 percent of the time in that area (16 of 23).
- CB **Patrick Peterson** leads the SEC in passes defended with 11 (9 PBUs, 2 interceptions).
- LB **Kelvin Sheppard** ranks No. 3 in the SEC in tackles with 8.7 per game (78 total).

## Noting the LSU Offense

- LSU's **Brandon LaFell** and **Terrance Toliver** have combined for more receptions (83) than any other wide receiver tandem in the SEC. Toliver leads the Tigers with 42 catches for 527 yards and 3 TDs, while LaFell has 41 receptions for 506 yards and 8 scores.
- Six different LSU players have scored rushing TDs this year for the Tigers.
- LSU is No. 3 in the SEC in third-down conversions at 41.2 percent (47 of 114).

## Noting the LSU Special Teams

- LSU leads the SEC in kickoff coverage with a net average of 45.5 yards. On 44 kickoff returns, LSU is allowing just 17.0 yards per return.
- LSU is first in the league in punt return average at 17.3 yards.
- LSU is No. 3 in the SEC in net punting at 38.2 yards per punt. LSU opponents have returned only nine punts for 41 yards against the Tigers this year.
- **Trindon Holliday** ranks No. 2 in the SEC in punt return average at 14.6 yards a return.
- Both LSU punt returners - **Chad Jones** and **Trindon Holliday** - have returned punts for touchdowns during their career.
- In 41 punts this year, LSU punters have had 10 downed inside the 20-yard line, including three against Alabama.

## LSU OC Crowton To Face His Former Team In Louisiana Tech

A week after LSU faced its former head coach in Nick Saban, the shoe will be on the other foot this week as Tiger offensive coordinator **Gary Crowton** will square off against a team he once served as the head coach for. Crowton served as head coach at Tech for three years, leading the Bulldogs to an overall mark of 21-13. His best year with the Bulldogs came in 1997 when he guided Tech to a 9-2 overall mark, which included a road win over Alabama as well as a victory against Cal. Crowton spent a total of four years in Ruston, serving as the offensive coordinator at the school in 1995 before being promoted the following year to head coach.

## More LSU-Louisiana Tech Ties

Current Louisiana Tech coach Derek Dooley spent five years as an assistant with the Tigers from 2000-04 ... During his five years with the Tigers, Dooley coached running backs, tight ends, and served as both the recruiting coordinator and special teams coordinator ... Current Tech DB coach Terry Joseph spent the 2006 season on the LSU staff working with the Tiger defense ... Tech DL coach Jimmy Brumbaugh was assistant strength coach at LSU in 2006 and 2007 .... Tech football intern Schirra Fields was a member of the LSU football team from 2002-05 ... Tech equipment manager Jeffrey Springer served on the LSU equipment staff and is a 2001 graduate of LSU ... LSU offensive guard **Lyle Hitt** will go up against his brother this weekend ... Hitt's brother, Mason, is a junior defensive tackle for Louisiana Tech.

## LSU Leads Nation With 21 Straight Non-Conference Wins

With its win over Tulane, LSU has now won 22 straight non-conference games, a streak that dates back to the start of the 2005 season. LSU coach **Les Miles** is a perfect 22-0 in non-conference games at LSU. The 22-game non-conference winnings streak ranks first nationally. LSU's last non-conference loss came during the 2004 season when Iowa scored on the final play of the game to beat LSU, 30-25, in the Capital One Bowl. LSU hasn't lost a regular season non-conference contest since dropping a 26-8 decision to Virginia Tech in the 2002 season opener. LSU hasn't lost a non-conference home game since 2000 when the Tigers dropped a 13-10 decision to UAB.

## LSU vs. Louisiana Schools

The Tigers bring a 129-25-8 mark all-time against teams from Louisiana into the Louisiana Tech contest. The Tigers have won 24 straight games against in-state opponents. LSU's last loss to an in-state foe came in 1982 when Tulane posted a 31-28 win over LSU in Tiger Stadium.

## LSU Hasn't Been Kind To Non-SEC Foes; Tigers Have Outscored Them 756-194 Under Miles

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 22-0 in non-conference games with the Tigers outscoring their opponents 798-194 in those games. LSU is 3-0 in non-conference games this year - beating Washington, 31-23, in the season-opener followed by a 31-3 victory over Louisiana-Lafayette and a 42-0 win over Tulane.

## LSU's 13-5 Under Miles In November Games

LSU coach **Les Miles** has guided the Tigers to a 13-5 mark in games played during the month of November. LSU won its first eight November games under Miles, going 4-0 in both 2005 and 2006. LSU was 3-1 in November in 2007 followed by a 2-3 record last year. Two of LSU's four November losses under Miles have come in overtime (2007 vs. Arkansas 3 OT; 2008 vs. Alabama). Since the start of the 2000 season, LSU is 27-8 in games played in November.

## Tigers Bowl Eligible For Record 10th Straight Year

The win over Auburn on Oct. 24 gave the Tigers their sixth win this year, thus making LSU bowl eligible for a school-record 10th straight season. Since the start of the 2000 season, LSU has played in the BCS National Championship twice (2003, 2007), played in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (2000, 2005, 2008), Sugar Bowl (2001, 2003, 2006), Cotton Bowl (2002) and Capital One Bowl (2004) in consecutive years.

## LSU's Streak of 32 Consecutive Saturday Night Wins In Tiger Stadium Snapped By Florida

With its 13-3 loss to Florida, LSU saw its 32-game winning streak in Saturday Night games in Tiger Stadium snapped. Prior to the Florida game, LSU hadn't lost a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium since a 31-0 defeat to Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002. Les Miles is now 23-1 in Saturday night games in Tiger Stadium. LSU goes into the Louisiana Tech game having won 34 of its last 35 Saturday night games in Tiger Stadium.

## This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 213-60-4 (.775) at night under the lights compared to a 21-25-3 (.459) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 58-11 overall at home, which includes a 47-5 (.902) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 11-6 (.647) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. LSU goes into the Louisiana Tech game with a 28-6 overall mark and a 13-6 SEC record under Les Miles in games played in Tiger Stadium. Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama last year.

## Miles 8-7 Against Top 10 Teams; 17-10 vs. Top 25 Opponents

LSU coach Les Miles has eight wins over top 10 teams and 17 victories over top 25 teams during his career with the Tigers. LSU is 1-2 vs. Top 25 teams this year. Miles and the Tigers won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. ## LSU Leads SEC, Ranked No. 7 Nationally In Turnover Margin

LSU goes into the Louisiana Tech game leading the SEC and ranked No. 7 in the nation in turnover margin at +9 (or +1.0 per game). In nine games, the Tigers have gained 17 turnovers - 12 interceptions and 5 fumbles, while losing just eight turnovers - 5 interceptions, 3 fumbles. LSU has scored 41 points off of opponents' turnovers. On the other hand, LSU has turned the ball over eight times this year and the opponents have yet to capitalize on the Tiger miscues this season.

## Shepard Has Third Straight Double-Digit Tackle Game

LSU junior LB Kelvin Sheppard had his third straight double-digit tackle game with 13 stops against Tulane. Sheppard has recorded 13 tackles in consecutive games against Florida, Auburn, and Tulane. He's the first Tiger since Bradie James in 2002 to have double-figure tackles in three straight games (11 vs. Florida, 11 vs. South Carolina, 14 vs. Auburn). For the year, Sheppard leads the Tigers and ranks fourth in the SEC in tackles with 8.8 per game. Sheppard has 70 tackles, 7.5 tackles for losses and one sack to his credit this year.

## LaFell Moving Up The LSU Career Record Books - 2nd In Career TDs and 6th In Yards

Senior WR Brandon LaFell continues to make an impact in the LSU career record books. LaFell, who opted to return for his senior season, is now second in LSU history with 22 receiving touchdowns. LaFell trails LSU record holder Dwayne Bowe by just four touchdowns going into the Alabama game. In addition, LaFell ranks fifth in LSU history in receptions with 157 and he's sixth in LSU history in receiving yards with 2,231. Wendell Davis holds the school record for career receptions with 183, while Josh Reed is the record holder in receiving yards with 3,001.

## Despite Injury, "Chuck The Truck" Moves Up To No. 6 In LSU Career Rushing

Senior RB Charles Scott moved into sixth place on LSU's all-time rushing list with 83 yards against Alabama. Scott ran his career total to 2,317 yards. Scott ranks fourth in LSU history in rushing TDs with 32 and he's fourth in school history in 100-yard games with eight. Scott will miss the remainder of the regular season with an injury (collar bone).

## Trio of Linebackers Leading Tigers On Defense

LSU's trio of linebackers - Kelvin Sheppard, Harry Coleman and Perry Riley - have emerged as the leaders of an LSU defense that has become one of the best in the SEC. Sheppard, who has recorded double-figure tackles in three straight games against Florida, Auburn, and Tulane, leads LSU and ranks third in the SEC with 78 tackles, followed by Riley with 63 and Coleman with 55. The trio of linebackers has combined for 15.5 tackles for losses, three sacks, eight pass breakups and four forced fumbles. LSU's fourth linebacker - Jacob Cutrera - has 45 tackles, 3.0 tackles for losses and an interception to his credit.

## Coleman Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week For Performance vs. Auburn

Harry Coleman had perhaps his best game in an LSU uniform against Auburn with nine tackles, two sacks, and two forced fumbles. Coleman finished with a total of 2.5 tackles totaling 18-yards in losses. He also added a pass breakup. Both of Coleman's forced fumbles led to first half points for the Tigers as LSU built a 17-0 lead at halftime. He's added 4.5 tackles for losses, two sacks, three forced fumbles and three pass breakups. Coleman was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week for his effort in the Tigers' win over Auburn on Oct. 24.

## Jefferson Has Best Game Career Against Auburn - Resets Three Career Bests In Win

LSU sophomore QB Jordan Jefferson has performed well in the first nine games of the season as he's connected on 133-of-210 passes for 1,535 yards, 12 TDs and just five interceptions. Jefferson has also added 159 rushing yards. Jefferson is 8-3 as LSU's starting quarterback. The following is a look at some of Jefferson's accomplishments during his young career:

- Opened 2009 by completing 31 passes in his first two games, which were the most by an LSU quarterback since Rohan Davey completed 32 passes in the first two games of the 2002 season.
- Opened 2009 by throwing 3 TD passes in the win over Washington and by doing so, he joined JaMarcus Russell (2006 vs. UL-Lafayette), Matt Mauck (2003 vs. UL-Monroe) and Davey (2000 vs. Western Carolina) as the only quarterbacks who have tossed 3 TDs in a season opener for the Tigers in the modern (SEC) era.
- Ran his streak of passes without an interception to 100 before throwing a pick against UL-Lafayette.
- Had his best game as a Tiger against Auburn as he set career-highs for completions (21), attempts (31) and passing yards (242) in the 31-10 LSU win.

## LSU Does It Again...Records 12th Fourth-Quarter Comeback Under Miles

For the 12th time under Les Miles, LSU won a football game despite trailing in the fourth quarter as the Tigers rallied from a 13-12 deficit with just over a minute to play to beat Georgia, 20-13, in Athens. The following is a look at LSU's fourth quarter comebacks under Miles, how many points the Tigers had to overcome in the final frame to win and the quarterback who engineered the comeback:

## LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 50 of the 62 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis earlier this decade, LSU has recorded a 50-12 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU is 5-2 this year as an AP Top 10 with wins over UL-Lafayette, Mississippi State, Georgia, Auburn, and Tulane. The losses have come to top-ranked Florida and No. 3 Alabama.

### Dickson Breaks LSU Career Record For Receiving Yards by a Tight End

With his 31 receiving yards at Georgia, **Richard Dickson** shattered the school record for career receiving yards by a tight end. Dickson, who now has 903 receiving yards, eclipsed David LaFleur's old mark of 881 yards set from 1993-96. Dickson broke the mark on his 10-yard catch late in the fourth quarter that set up a **Charles Scott** touchdown. Dickson stands in second place in career receptions by a tight end with 82. He passed Malcolm Scott (77 from 1979-82) and now needs just six catches to become the school record holder. Mitch Andrews (1982-85) is the current school record holder with 87 receptions. Dickson shares the LSU career record for touchdown receptions by a tight end with Brad Boyd (1972-74). Both own 10 career touchdown catches. ### With Win Over Georgia, Miles Has Victories Over Every SEC Team

With the win over Georgia, LSU coach **Les Miles** has recorded at least one victory over every team in the SEC. Miles is 26-11 in SEC regular season games and 27-12 in all league games (including SEC Championship Game). In addition, Miles has faced 46 different teams during his head coaching career and he's beaten all but one of them. The only team that Miles has played as a head coach and yet to beat is Texas.

### LSU Defense Turned In Fine Outing In Win Over Georgia

LSU turned in an inspiring defensive effort "Between the Hedges". Sparked by Georgia natives **Perry Riley** and **Kelvin Sheppard**, the Tigers shutout one of the league's top offenses in their own stadium for three quarters. It represented the first time LSU blanked a ranked opponent on the road for the first three quarters since Nov. 6, 1993. That day Curley Hallman's Tigers stunned No. 5 Alabama in Bryant-Denny Stadium, 17-13. Alabama trailed 14-0 heading into the fourth quarter of that contest. Here are a few more notables on the Tiger defense from the win over Georgia:

- LSU held Georgia to just one first down and 49 total yards in the first half
- Georgia's 13 points were the fewest by a ranked opponent on the road since Auburn had 7 on Sept. 16, 2006.
- Georgia's 45 net rushing yards were the fewest by an SEC opponent since South Carolina had 39 last season. They were also the fewest rushing yards by a ranked opponent since Ole Miss has 27 on Nov. 22, 2003.

### Chad Jones 93-yard Punt Return Ranks Second In School History

**Chad Jones'** 93-yard punt return for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter against Mississippi State ranks as the second-longest punt return in school history. Eddie Kennison holds the school record with a 100-yard return against Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium in 1994. By returning a punt for a TD, LSU now has two punt returners on its roster - Jones and Trindon Holliday - who have returned at least one punt for a touchdown during their career.

### LSU Returns Another Interception For a Touchdown

LSU CB **Patrick Peterson** became the second Tiger to return an interception for a touchdown this year when he picked off a pass and returned it 37 yards for a first quarter score against Mississippi State. Peterson's interception came on Mississippi State's first offensive play from scrimmage. Linebacker **Jacob Cutrera** returned the other interception for a TD, taking a Jake Locker pass back 29-yards for a score in the first quarter against Washington in the season-opener.

### LSU's Best After Dark

Night games in Tiger Stadium seem to bring out the best in LSU. However, lately LSU has been at its best no matter the location just as long as it dark outside. After the Tulane game, LSU has won 28 of its last 30 night games (no matter the location). Note: NCAA determines that a kickoff at 5 p.m. or later is a night game. Last year, on Oct. 11 in Gainesville, Florida snapped LSU's streak of consecutive night wins at 19. Prior to the Florida game on Oct. 11, 2008, LSU hadn't lost a night game since a 34-14 loss to Georgia in the SEC Championship Game in 2005. Overall, LSU coach **Les Miles** has guided the Tigers to a 34-4 mark in night games.

### Jefferson Youngest Starting QB In SEC; Youngest LSU QB To Start Season-Opener Since 1945

LSU's **Jordan Jefferson** is the youngest starting quarterback in the SEC. Jefferson, who has five career starts to his credit, was 19 years and 11 days old when he took the first snap against Washington. Jefferson was the youngest quarterback to start a season-opener for the Tigers since Y.A. Tittle in 1945. That year, Tittle was 18 years, 11 months and 6 days when LSU opened the season against Rice. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 30-0. ## A Unique Situation At Left Tackle - 2 Players Have Accounted For Last 98 Starts

Starting left tackle Ciron Black goes into the Louisiana Tech game having started 49 straight games, all coming at left tackle. Since the start of the 2002 season, a stretch that spans 101 games, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Black and Andrew Whitworth. Whitworth, now a starting tackle for the Cincinnati Bengals, set an LSU record by starting 52 straight games for the Tigers from 2002-05. Black then picked up where Whitworth left off, starting the next 48 games at that position for the Tigers. Black's 49 straight starts ranks as the second-longest active streak in college football.

The 48 offensive plays were the fewest by an LSU team since the 1965 season when the Tigers mustered just 45 snaps in a 23-0 loss to Ole Miss on Oct. 30. LSU, 5-1 and ranked No. 5 in the nation at the time, managed just 52 yards of offense that day against the Rebels.

- LSU LB **Jacob Cutrera** intercepted a pass on his first play (Washington's first play of second drive) and returned it 29 yards for a TD. Cutrera became the first LSU player to return an interception for a TD since CB Jonathan Zenon did it against Tennessee in the 2007 SEC Championship Game. He's the first linebacker to do it since Kenny Hollis scored on a 3-yard interception return against Tennessee in 2005.

- LSU senior **Rahim Alem** was named defensive player of the week in the SEC for his play in the Tigers' 23-9 win over Vanderbilt. Alem recorded a career-best seven tackles, a sack and a pass breakup in the victory.

- LSU blocked a punt in a game for the first time since the 2006 contest against Florida.

- LSU held its fifth straight opponent without a first quarter touchdown.
- LSU intercepted a pass in its 11 straight game
- TE Deangelo Peterson caught the first TD of his career with a second quarter score.
- LSU held Alabama to just 55 yards rushing in the first half.

### An Offseason of National Championships for Chad Jones and Trindon Holliday

Free safety Chad Jones and running back/return specialist Trindon Holliday became national champions during the football off-season. Jones was an outfielder and key relief pitcher for LSU's 2009 College World Series champion baseball team. Jones maintained a 2.70 ERA in 6.2 innings pitched while walking three and striking out seven. He tossed three innings and did not allow a run or a hit in three appearances at the College World Series, which earned him the nickname "Dreadlocks of Doom". Jones came on in relief of starter Anthony Ranaudo in the deciding Game 3 of the CWS Championship Series against Texas and was brilliant. He did not allow a run in 1.2 innings of work while walking none and striking out two. Prior to spring football practice, Jones played in the outfield and batted .343 (12-for-35) with a homer, six RBI and eight runs scored. Along with former WR Jared Mitchell, Jones and he became just the second and third athletes in school history to win national titles in multiple team sports. Both were members of the 2007 BCS national championship team. Holliday, meanwhile, became the 100-meter dash national champion at the 2009 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. Holliday clocked 10.00 in the national final of the 100-meter to claim the title. The time was the fastest of any player in the history of college football.

## Tigers Ride Flynn, Hester To Win

Matt Flynn threw for 237 yards and three scores and Jacob Hester rushed for a career-best 115 yards, including an 87-yard TD run, as LSU rolled to a 58-10 win over Louisiana Tech. The Tigers racked up 595 yards, including 343 on the ground, extending their school-record Tiger Stadium winning streak to 19 games. The Tigers limited the Bulldogs to 256 total yards, including just 67 rushing yards. LSU also forced five Tech turnovers which resulted in 20 LSU points. LSU never trailed, taking a 10-0 lead in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Flynn followed by a 31-yard Colt David field goal. Tech pulled to within 10-7 early in the second quarter before the Tigers responded with 17 unanswered points, which had Flynn throwing TD passes of 71 yards to Terrance Toliver and 37 yards to Brandon LaFell, extending the margin to 27-7 at halftime. LSU stretched its lead to 37-7 on Hester's 87-yard TD run early in the third quarter. Richard Dickson added a 14-yard TD reception in the third quarter followed by a 15-yard TD run by Trindon Holliday and a 2-yard TD reception by Mit Cole in the fourth quarter to close out the scoring for the Tigers.

**Tigers Open Season With 31-23 Win Over Washington**

Jordan Jefferson threw for 172 yards and 3 touchdowns as he helped lead the No. 9/11 Tigers to a hard-fought 31-23 non-conference win over Washington in Seattle to open the 2009 campaign. LSU spotted the Huskies an early first quarter TD when UW went 85 yards on 10 plays to take a 7-0 advantage over the Tigers. LSU responded with a 24-yard field goal at the 6:03 mark. The Tigers took their first lead 14 seconds later when **Jacob Cutrera** returned an interception 29 yards for a score giving LSU a 10-7 advantage. The Huskies tied the game at 10-10 early in the second quarter before the Tigers took the lead for good on a 45-yard pass from Jefferson to **Terrance Toliver** at the 1:15 mark. UW added a field goal as time expired in the first half. Jefferson and Toliver hooked up for another score in the third quarter, this time a 39-yarder, as LSU stretched the lead to 24-13. The Tigers increased their margin to 31-16 on a 6-yard TD pass from Jefferson to **Brandon LaFell**. The Huskies added a touchdown as time expired for the final margin. Washington out-gained LSU on offense, 478-321, as the Huskies ran 83 plays compared to just 48 for the Tigers. LSU rushed for 149 yards and added 172 through the air. Toliver had his best game in an LSU uniform with four receptions for 117 yards and two scores. **Charles Scott** rushed for 51 yards, while **Keiland Williams** added 51 and Jefferson 42 to pace the Tigers offense.

**Strong Defensive Effort and Efficient Offense Leads LSU Past Vanderbilt, 23-9**

Keiland Williams rushed for 71 yards and a pair of TDs and the LSU defense limited Vanderbilt to just 210 total yards as the Tigers opened conference play with a 23-9 win over the Commodores on a rainy night in Tiger Stadium. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead on a 6-yard TD run by Williams late in the first quarter. LSU stretched the lead to 10-0 on a 32-yard field goal by **Josh Jasper** at the 10:22 mark in the second quarter. Vanderbilt responded with a 12-play, 80-yard drive to pull to within 10-7 on a 6-yard run by Larry Smith at the 7:20 mark in the second quarter. LSU need just over a minute to go 64 yards just before halftime as another Jasper field goal extended the lead to 13-7 at intermission. A third Jasper field goal stretched the margin to 16-7 midway through the third quarter. With the Tiger defense holding Vanderbilt in check, the LSU offense couldn't put the Commodores away though. An errant snap on a punt deep in LSU territory resulted in a safety for Vanderbilt, pulling the Commodores to within 16-9 with 1:35 to go in the third quarter. LSU's defense stepped up again the fourth quarter, halting a Vanderbilt drive at the LSU 23-yard line on an interception by **Brandon Taylor**. LSU put the game away with a 7-play, 46-yard drive capped on a 14-yard TD run by Williams with 6:05 to play. **Jordan Jefferson** completed 20-of-29 passes for 138 yards, while **Charles Scott** added 49 yards on the ground for LSU. LaFell led all LSU receivers with 7 catches for 38 yards. **Harry Coleman** paced the defense with 10 tackles, while **Rahim Alem** added 7 tackles and a sack.

### Defense Leads Tigers Past UL-Lafayette, 31-3

Another solid defensive effort combined with a pair of touchdown receptions by **Brandon LaFell** helped lead LSU to a 31-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in Tiger Stadium. The win was the 21st straight non-conference win by the Tigers. LSU got on the board first, going 62 yards on six plays capped with a 16-yard TD pass from **Jordan Jefferson** to LaFell to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead at the 3:09 mark in the first quarter. After a **Chad Jones** interception gave the Tigers the ball deep in UL-Lafayette territory, the Tigers needed just one play - an 11-yard run by **Trindon Holliday** - to stretch the lead to 14-0 at the 14:52 mark of the second quarter. LSU led 17-3 at halftime after **Josh Jasper** connected on a 52-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter. LSU took the opening kickoff of the second half and drove 58 yards on seven plays capped with 20-yard TD pass from Jordan to LaFell to give the Tigers a 21-3 lead. A goal line stand highlighted the defensive effort by LSU in the third quarter as the Tigers turned back the Cajuns on three straight rushing attempts from the 1-yard line. LSU added its final points late in the fourth quarter when **Jarrett Lee** hit **Charles Scott** for a 1-yard TD pass. Jefferson finished 16-of-25 for 165 yards and a pair of TDs. Scott led the Tigers rushing attack with 63 yards and LaFell was tops in receiving with six catches for 68 yards and a pair of scores.

**Jones Punt Return and Last-Minute Goalline Stand Helps Tigers Past Mississippi State, 30-26**

Chad Jones returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown to start the fourth quarter and a last-minute goalline stand by the LSU defense helped the Tigers hold off Mississippi State, 30-26, in Starkville. Patrick Peterson opened the scoring for the Tigers, returning an interception 37 yards on State's first offensive play to give LSU a 6-0 lead. Mississippi State responded on its next possession to take a 7-6 lead. The Tigers struck back, going 66-yards on seven plays, capped with a Brandon LaFell 4-yard TD reception from Jordan Jefferson, putting LSU up 13-6. After an errant snap on a punt gave Mississippi State the ball at the LSU 1-yard line, the Bulldogs needed just one play to regain the lead at 14-13 on a 1-yard run by Anthony Dixon. The Tigers took a 16-14 lead at halftime courtesy of a Josh Jasper 22-yard field goal midway through the second quarter. LSU extended its lead on the first play of the third quarter when Jefferson connected with LaFell on a 58-yard TD pass to extend the lead to 23-14. The Bulldogs responded, going 73 yards on six plays to pull to within 23-21 on a 50-yard TD pass at the 6:33 mark. Jones' 93-yard punt return to open the fourth quarter gave the Tigers a 30-21 cushion. After a State field goal at the 10:13 mark pulled the Bulldogs to within 30-24, LSU's offense couldn't sustain drives on its next two possessions, opening the door for a Bulldogs possession that had State driving all the way to the Tiger 2-yard line with just over a minute left in the game. LSU's defense turned back State on four straight downs, including three from the 1-yard line, preserving the victory.

**Tigers Rally for Last-Minute Win Over Georgia, 20-13**

Charles Scott ran for a 33-yard TD with just over a minute left to lift LSU to a 20-13 comeback win over 18th-ranked Georgia. It was LSU's first win in Athens since the 1987 season. LSU's defense dominated the first three quarters of the contest as the Tigers took a 6-0 lead into the fourth quarter. Georgia took its first lead of the game at 7-6 less than a minute into the final quarter when Joe Cox hit Shaun Chapas with a 1-yard TD pass to cap an 18-play, 60-yard drive. The teams went back-and-forth for the next 11 minutes before Tigers cashed in on a 13-play, 88-yard drive capped on a 2-yard plunge by Scott at the 2:53 mark to regain the lead at 12-7. Georgia needed just a minute and 38 seconds to take back the lead, 13-12, this time on a 16-yard pass from Joe Cox to A.J. Green with 1:09 to play. An excessive celebration penalty combined with a 40-yard kickoff return by Trindon Holliday setup the game-winning score for the Tigers. Holliday's return gave the Tigers the ball at the UGA 38-yard line with just over a minute left. LSU needed just two plays - both rushes by Scott - to take the lead for good. Scott's 33-yard run proved to be the game-winner, giving the Tigers a 20-13 advantage with 46 seconds left. LSU linebacker Perry Riley clinched the win with an interception on Georgia's last possession. The fourth quarter scoring barrage came after both teams entered into a defensive battle - the Tigers winning the first half and Georgia the third quarter. LSU led 6-0 at halftime after holding the Bulldogs to just one first down and 49 total yards in the first half. Scott led the Tigers with 95 rushing yards and a pair of TDs, while QB Jordan Jefferson connected on 18-of-27 passes for 212 yards.

**Florida Defense Too Much For LSU As Tigers Fall To Top-Ranked Gators, 13-3**

LSU's defense limited the SEC's top offense to only 13 points and just 327 total yards, but it wasn't enough as top-ranked Florida stymied the Tiger offense in a 13-3 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU managed just a second quarter field goal - an 18-yarder by **Josh Jasper** - as the Tigers suffered their first loss in a Saturday night game in Tiger Stadium since 2002. Florida never trailed in the contest, taking a 3-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 28-yard field goal by **Caleb Sturgis** at the 3:50 mark. The Tigers responded two drives later, going all the way to the Florida 2-yard line before settling for the Jasper field goal to tie the game at 3-3 with 5:16 to play in the first half. The Gators extended their lead to 10-3 just before halftime when **Tim Tebow** hit **Riley Cooper** on a 24-yard TD pass. After both teams went scoreless in the third quarter, Florida stretched the lead to 13-3 on a 32-yard field goal by **Sturgis** at the 7:27 mark. A **Jai Eugene** interception of a Tebow pass at the LSU 5-yard line with 4:55 left in the game, kept the Tigers' chances alive. However, LSU turned the ball over on downs on the ensuing possession and Florida was able to run out the clock for the victory. **Charles Scott** led the Tigers with 53 yards rushing, while **Jordan Jefferson** connected on 11 of 17 passes for 96 yards and one interception. LSU managed just 162 total yards, including 44 in the second half, in the loss. Defensively, **Kelvin Sheppard** led the Tigers with 13 tackles, while **Perry Riley** and **Chad Jones** added 12 each.

**LSU Puts It All Together In 31-10 Win Over Auburn**

The offense clicked and the defense shut down one of the most potent attacks in the SEC as LSU rolled to a 31-10 win over Auburn. LSU had its most productive offensive outing of the season with 376 total yards (122 rushing, 254 passing). Defensively, the Tigers limited Auburn to just 193 total yards (112 rushing, 81 passing), which included only 42 total yards in the first half as LSU built a 17-0 lead at halftime. **Jordan Jefferson** had perhaps his best outing, connecting on 21 of 31 passes for 242 yards and a pair of TDs (he also rushed for a score). LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead on its first possession when Jefferson hit **Terrance Toliver** with a 14-yard TD pass. Jefferson added a 15-yard run later in the first quarter for a 14-0 LSU advantage. LSU extended its lead to 24-0 on its first possession of the second half when Jefferson connected with **Brandon LaFell** on a 17-yard TD pass. **Russell Shepard** scored his first TD as a Tiger with a 69-yard TD run late in the third quarter to extend the lead to 31-3. Shepard led the Tigers in rushing with 71 yards on six carries, while Toliver caught nine passes for 86 yards and a score. **Kelvin Sheppard** (13 tackles) and **Harry Coleman** (9 tackles, 2 sacks, 2 FF) paced the LSU defense.

**LSU Cruises Past Tulane, 42-0**

Charles Scott rushed for 112 yards and a pair of scores as LSU had its best offensive outing of the season in its 42-0 win over Tulane on Halloween Night in Tiger Stadium. LSU produced season highs in total offense (455 yards), rushing yards (267) and points (42) as the Tigers had little trouble with their in-state rival. Defensively, LSU limited Tulane to just 216 total yards and only 26 rushing yards. It was LSU's first shutout of the season and the first by a Tiger team since the 2007 season. LSU wasted little time in taking control of the game as the Tigers capitalized following a blocked punt when Russell Shepard scored on a 19-yard run at the 8:05 mark in the first quarter. LSU made it 14-0 when Jordan Jefferson found Brandon LaFell all alone in the endzone for a 39-yard TD at the 2:32 mark. Scott's 4-yard TD run made it 21-0 at halftime. LSU stretched the margin to 35-0 when Jefferson connected with LaFell on a 13-yard TD pass early in the fourth quarter. Stevan Ridley added the final score for the Tigers, a 10-yard run late in the fourth quarter. Ridley finished with 73 rushing yards, while Shepard added 48 yards. Jefferson completed 11 of 17 passes for 163 yards and a pair of TDs. LaFell led the Tiger receivers with four catches for 85 yards and two TDs, while Terrance Toliver added four catches for 59 yards. Defensively, Kelvin Sheppard paced the Tigers with 13 tackles, three tackles for losses and one sack.

**Alabama Grinds Out 24-15 Win Over LSU**

A rash of injuries, including a season-ending one to running back **Charles Scott**, along with a the running of Alabama's Mark Ingram proved to be too much to overcome as the No. 3 Crimson Tide beat No. 9 LSU, 24-15. LSU led 15-10 going into the fourth quarter, however, Alabama scored 14 unanswered points during the final stanza to record the victory. After a scoreless first quarter, LSU got on the board first, taking a 7-0 lead when **Jordan Jefferson** connected with **Deangelo Peterson** for a 12-yard TD pass at the 9:12 mark. Leigh Tiffin kicked a 28-yard field goal for Alabama's only first half points as the Tigers led 7-3 at halftime. Alabama took its first lead of the game, 10-7, on its opening possession of the second half on a 21-yard TD pass from Greg McElroy to Darius Hanks. An LSU safety closed the gap to 10-9 at the 5:55 mark and then the Tigers regained the lead on an 8-yard run by **Stevan Ridley** two minutes later. Alabama pulled to within 15-13 on another Tiffin field goal early in the fourth quarter and the Crimson Tide took the lead for good, 21-15, when Julio Jones raced 73-yards for a TD at the 10:24 mark. LSU played the final quarter without Scott and Jefferson due to injuries. Scott finished with 83 rushing yards but was injured late in the third quarter after a 34-yard run. Jefferson finished 10-of-17 for 114 yards and 1 score, most of which came in the first half. **Jacob Cutrera** tied a career-best with 11 tackles to lead the Tiger defense. Ingram led Alabama with 144 yards, 106 of which came after halftime.
