ARKANSAS TRAVELS TO LSU TO CLOSE OUT REGULAR SEASON

▶ Arkansas travels to Baton Rouge, La., to end the regular season against LSU on Saturday, Nov. 28. The two will meet for the 55th time in the history of the series.

▶ For the 14th-consecutive year since its inception, Arkansas and LSU will be playing for "The Golden Boot," a trophy shaped like the two states combined. The trophy was introduced into the series prior to the 1996 game. It is believed to be the heaviest trophy awarded in a college football rivalry (approx. 175 pounds). For more information on The Boot see page eight.

▶ The Razorbacks have defeated LSU each of the last two seasons. The last time UA beat LSU three-straight years was 1927-29. Arkansas also won three-straight from 1909-11 and four-straight from 1922-25.

▶ On Nov. 28, 2008, Arkansas defeated LSU, 31-30, to finish Bobby Petrino's first season as the Razorback head coach. Francis Schmidt (1922-28) is the only head coach in Razorback history to lead Arkansas to a victory in each of his first two meetings with LSU.

▶ Arkansas enters today's game winners of four-straight and the Razorbacks have won each their three games in November. The last time UA went undefeated in November was 2002.

▶ Arkansas will play LSU on Saturday for the first time since 1995. Starting in 1996, the two played 13-straight years on the Friday following Thanksgiving.

LEADING THE SEC

▶ Currently, Arkansas leads the SEC in scoring offense (38.0), total offense (445.2), passing offense (310.3), touchdowns (51), passing touchdowns (30), opp. fourth down conv. (25.0) and red zone offense (98 pct.). The Razorbacks have never finished a season leading the SEC in scoring or passing offense.

TURNOVERS

▶ Arkansas is +12 in turnover margin this season after finishing the 2008 campaign -9, which ranked 102nd nationally. Arkansas is currently second in the SEC and seventh nationally in turnover margin. The turnaround is the second-largest nationally from last season in terms of rankings (Ohio currently T7 and was 110 in 2008). The Razorbacks have outscored opponents 111-17 following turnovers this season.

▶ This season, UA has forced 12 fumbles and recovered 15 (tied for fourth nationally) after forcing nine and recovering four in 2008. The Razorbacks have had 10 interceptions this season after making 11 last year. The Razorbacks have not turned the ball over in three games this season, while opponents have turned the ball over in 10 games.

ARKANSAS IN THE RED ZONE

▶ Arkansas is first nationally in red zone offense as the Razorbacks have converted on 41-of-42 (98 pct.) trips inside the red zone (32 touchdowns, nine field goals). Arkansas is also tied for 10th nationally and is second in the SEC in red zone defense as it has allowed opponents to convert on only 26-of-36 (72 pct.) trips.

THE TEAM

▶ This season, the Razorbacks' schedule has been one of the toughest in the nation. According to NCAA rankings, the 2009 slate is tied for the fourth-toughest nationally. LSU will be the sixth ranked opponent Arkansas has faced this season (AP or USA Today Coaches').

▶ Arkansas has thrown for 300-or-more yards in nine of 23 games under head coach Bobby Petrino. Prior to his arrival, Arkansas had thrown for 300-or-more yards 16 times in school history.

▶ The Razorbacks have scored 40-or-more points in seven games this season. The only other time UA scored 40-or-more points in seven games or more in a season was 2007 (seven times). Against Eastern Michigan, Arkansas scored 63 points which is tied for the highest total by any SEC team in a game this season.

▶ Arkansas has outscored opponents 97-47 in the first quarter this season. UA has scored 21 points in the first quarter three times (Missouri St., Georgia, Eastern Michigan). In 2008, Arkansas scored 55 points in the first quarter all season. The UA defense has not allowed seven of 11 opponents to score a first quarter touchdown this year, including four SEC teams (Missouri St., Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Eastern Michigan South Carolina and Troy).

▶ Arkansas has started seven true freshmen this season; the total ranks second nationally and leads the SEC.

▶ Earlier this year, Arkansas defeated No. 17 Auburn 44-23. Auburn was the highest ranked opponent the Razorbacks have defeated under Bobby Petrino (No. 19 Tulsa, 30-23; No. 20 Auburn, 25-22 in 2008).

▶ Already this season, Arkansas has scored more points against Texas A&M (47) than it has any game against the Aggies and more against Auburn (44) than the Razorbacks had in any game against the Tigers.

▶ Prior to 2009 August practices; the squad selected its captains for the 2009 season. They are Ryan Mallett (RSo., QB), Michael Smith (RSr., TB), DeMarcus Love. (Jr., OT), Malcolm Sheppard (Sr., DT), Adrian Davis (Sr., DE) and Wendel Davis (Sr., LB). It is believed Sheppard is the first two-time captain at Arkansas since Frank Broyles began coaching in 1958.

QUARTERBACKS (SEE PAGE 11 FOR RYAN MALLET RECORDS)

▶ Ryan Mallett leads the SEC and ranks third nationally in pass efficiency (165.18) and he also leads the league and is tied for third nationally in passing touchdowns (28). Mallett is first in the SEC and 13th in the nation in total offense (287.9) and he ranks first in the SEC in passing yards per game (290.5) Mallett is the only SEC quarterback to have thrown for 400-or-more yards in a game this season (twice) and he leads the league lead in 300-yard passing performances (five).

▶ In his last game against Mississippi State, Ryan Mallett broke or matched three different Arkansas records. He set the school record for passing touchdowns (28) and touchdown accountability in a season (30). He also matched his own school record for passing touchdowns in a game (5). Mallett has matched or broken 12 different school records in his 11 games as a Razorback.

▶ Ryan Mallett has thrown a passing touchdown in 10 of 11 games as a Razorback and in 12 of his 14 collegiate starts. He has thrown for multiple touchdowns in six of 11 starts as a Razorback and seven of 14 collegiate starts.

▶ In his 14 collegiate starts, Ryan Mallett has thrown for 200-or-more yards 11 times (10 as a Razorback), 300-or-more yards five times (all as a Razorback) and 400-or-more yards twice (vs. UGA and Troy, 2009).

▶ Ryan Mallett has thrown only six interceptions this season and has not thrown one in six of 11 games. He set a school record with 141 attempts without an interception before throwing one late in the first half against Troy.

▶ Arkansas has players on the watch lists for the following individual awards in 2009. This season is the first time in school history the UA offense has a player on the watch list for the O'Brien, Mackey and Walker Awards in the same year. Arkansas is also one of eight teams nationally to have a player on all three lists this year (Ohio State, Va. Tech, Oregon, LSU, Oklahoma, Florida, Notre Dame).

► Ryan Mallett owns a 10-4 collegiate record as a starting quarterback. During the 2007 season at Michigan, he was 3-0 with victories against Notre Dame, Penn State and Minnesota. He is 7-4 at Arkansas with victories over Missouri State, Texas A&M, Auburn, Eastern Michigan, South Carolina , Troy and Mississippi State.

► Ryan Mallett was 21-of-39 for 408 yards and five touchdowns against Georgia, which was his second start as a Razorback. His 408 yards were a UA single-game record as were his five passing touchdowns.

► Arkansas quarterback Ryan Mallett made his first appearance in 658 days in the Arkansas season opener. His last appearance prior to the Missouri State game came on Nov. 17, 2007, against Ohio State. In the fall of 2008, Mallett got a lot of work in on Sunday nights as he had 455 reps during those workouts.

► In the season opener, UA quarterbacks combined to go 30-of-41 for 447 yards with three touchdowns. The effort marked the highest single-game passing total in school history and the first game in which the Razorbacks have ever thrown for 400-or-more yards.

RUNNING BACKS

► Prior to kickoff of the Mississippi State game it was announced Michael Smith would miss the remainder of the season due to a hamstring injury. Smith played in 39 games (14 starts) and carried the ball 359 times for 2,018 yards and 16 touchdowns. He also had 53 career receptions for 529 yards and three touchdowns.

► Broderick Green is tied for third in the SEC with 11 touchdowns this season. Nine of Green's 10 rushing touchdowns have come in his last seven games and he has rushed for two touchdowns in three games this season, including two of the last four outings.

► Against Troy, Ronnie Wingo, Jr. took a reception 83 yards for a touchdown and also had a 16-yard rushing touchdown. The reception was the longest by a Razorback this season and the sixth-longest touchdown reception in school history. Earlier this season, Wingo, Jr. scored on a 62-yard carry against Texas A&M. He is averaging 54 yards per touchdown.

► Against Eastern Michigan, Broderick Green had a 99-yard touchdown run in the second quarter on a one-play drive. The run was the longest by a Razorback from scrimmage in school history and just the second scoring run of 90-or-more yards. It was the longest since Billy Moore ran for 90 yards and a touchdown against Tulsa in 1962. It was also the longest for any player coached by Bobby Petrino.

► Arkansas running backs have combined for 35 receptions for 411 yards this season (11.7 yards per reception) after averaging 8.7 yards per reception in 2008 (46 receptions for 402 yards).

► In July of 2009, the NCAA granted Broderick Green a waiver to compete immediately for the Razorbacks. Green transferred to Arkansas in the spring of 2009 after spending two seasons at Southern California. He was a redshirt freshman in 2007 and carried the ball 32 times for 168 yards and three touchdowns in 2008.

OFFENSIVE LINE

► Arkansas opened the Mississippi State game with the following players on offensive line: OT Ray Dominguez, OG Wade Grayson, C Seth Oxner, OG Mitch Petrus, OT DeMarcus Love. UA has used four different lineups to start a game this season.

► Through 11 games, UA has allowed 21 sacks. After 11 games in 2008, the Razorbacks had allowed 40. Arkansas has not allowed a sack in two games this season (vs. Missouri State and Eastern Michigan).

► Anthony Oden made his first start as a Razorback at Alabama. He is the first true freshman to start on the offensive line since Shawn Andrews started in 2001. Both Oden and Andrews made their first starts at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

► Seth Oxner started the season opener for the Razorbacks at center marking the first time a player other than Jonathan Luigs had done so in 41 games. The last time Luigs did not start a game at center was against Ole Miss on Nov. 12, 2005.

RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

▶ This season, Arkansas has had five different players (Joe Adams, Jarius Wright, Greg Childs, Cobi Hamilton and D.J. Williams) combine for eight different 100-yard receiving games. Arkansas is the only team in the league with five different players to have a 100-yard receiving game this year. The Razorbacks are also the only team in the SEC with three players that have had two 100-yard receiving games in 2009 (Childs, Wright, Adams).

▶ Greg Childs has had a touchdown reception in six of the last 10 games. He leads the team with seven touchdown receptions this season, which is tied for third in the SEC and is tied for the fifth-highest single-season total in Arkansas history. Last season, D.J. Williams and Andrew Davie led the Razorbacks with three touchdown receptions on the year.

▶ Due to medical reasons, Joe Adams missed three games this season. In the last four games since his return, Adams has had 10 catches for 224 yards and five touchdowns. He has also ran the ball three times for 13 yards and a touchdown.

▶ Joe Adams has made at least one catch in each of his 20 career games. Adams and London Crawford were the only two receivers to have one catch in each of the Razorbacks' 12 games in 2008.

▶ London Crawford returned to action against Auburn after suffering a broken right collarbone in the season opener against Missouri State. He made starts in four of UA's last six games (at Florida and Ole Miss, South Carolina and Troy).

▶ Against Georgia, Greg Childs had five catches for 140 yards and two touchdowns, which was the first 100-yard receiving game of his career. Jarius Wright finished with four catches for 108 yards and a touchdown. The Georgia game marked the first time UA had two 100-yard receivers in the same game since the Tulsa contest in 2008 (D.J. Williams and Wright).

▶ Lucas Miller returned to action and started the game at Alabama after suffering a broken collarbone during practice on August 20. Miller had a career game late last season against Mississippi State as he finished with 10 catches for 201 yards and a career-long 87-yard touchdown reception. His 201 yards rank as the second-highest single-game total in school history and his reception was the longest by any receiver on a Coach Petrino team.

▶ Tight end Chris Gragg will miss the season after suffering a dislocated left ankle during practice on August 12. Following Gragg's injury UA coaches moved Colton Nash from defense to tight end.

DEFENSIVE LINE

▶ UA opened the Troy game with the following on defensive line (Damario Ambrose, DeQuinta Jones, Malcolm Sheppard, Adrian Davis). Jones was making the second start of his career and UA has used six different linueps to start a game this season.

▶ Defensive tackle Malcolm Sheppard is tied for fourth in the SEC with 11 tackles for loss this season. His career total (37) are tied for third in school history. Sheppard has led the Razorbacks in tackles for loss each of the last two seasons.

▶ Malcolm Sheppard has had at least half of a tackle for a loss in 17 of his last 19 games. During the span, Sheppard has had 23 tackles behind the line for a combined loss of 85 yards. In 2008, he had a tackle for a loss in nine of 12 games.

▶ Adrian Davis leads all Razorbacks in career sacks with 12.5. Davis needs two more to enter the school's career chart (Randy Garner is ninth in school history, 14.5, 1997-2000).

LINEBACKERS

▶ UA's starting linebackers for the Troy game were Jerico Nelson, Wendel Davis and Jerry Franklin. Franklin and Davis led the team with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.

▶ Arkansas plays one of the most demanding schedules in the country. Five Razorback opponents were listed in the Associated Press Top 25 (all in the top 13). This week, Arkansas travels to play preseason No. 11 LSU. The Razorbacks were also on the road for games at preseason No. 1 Florida, No. 5 Alabama and No. 8 Ole Miss. In September, Arkansas hosted preseason No. 13 Georgia.

▶ The slate includes matchups with seven teams that reached bowl games in the 2008 season. Two of the seven appeared in BCS bowl games and four won their bowl matchups.

▶ Arkansas' schedule includes games against teams that have won each of the last three national championships (Florida 2006, '08; LSU 2007).

▶ Against Eastern Michigan, Freddy Burton had the first interception of his career and returned it 50 yards for a touchdown. It was the first interception return for a touchdown since Antwain Robinson took one 30 yards against Mississippi State in 2007.

▶ Jerry Franklin returned a fumble 85 yards in the second quarter of the Texas A&M game. It was his first fumble recovery of the season and third of his career and the first touchdown of his career. It was the first fumble recovery for a touchdown by a Razorback since Antwain Robinson returned one 80 yards against Texas last season.

SECONDARY

▶ Against Mississippi State, Ramon Broadway, Elton Ford, Matt Harris and Rudell Crim started in the secondary. Ford led the group with nine tackles, including one for a loss and he also recovered a fumble.

▶ Elton Ford returned to action at Alabama and has started each of the last seven games. Ford missed the final four games of the 2008 season and dressed but did not play the first two games this year. As a true freshman last season, Ford earned the starting position at free safety for the first eight games before breaking three vertebrae in his neck during the Ole Miss game. Ford spent the next 3 1/2 months wearing a neck brace to restrict his movement. He was cleared for non-contact drills in the spring of 2009. After nearly 10 months, the first day of full contact drills for the Razorbacks was August 10, 2009.

▶ Cornerback Isaac Madison suffered a knee injury during August drills. During a scrimmage on August 15, Madison tore the ACL in his left knee that will cause him to miss the 2009 season.

▶ After receiving a medical redshirt in 2008 due to a hernia and a hamstring injury, Jerell Norton returned to action against Missouri State. Norton was the only returning member of the secondary who had started a game prior to 2008 as he had seven starts during the 2007 season.

SPECIAL TEAMS

▶ Against Mississippi State, Dennis Johnson returned two kickoffs for 46 yards to bring his season total to 940, which broke the single-season school record he set last year (905 yards on 41 returns). Johnson's effort also added to his career total (1,845), which is also an Arkansas record.

▶ Dennis Johnson ranks fifth in the SEC and ranks 23rd nationally with an average of 26.9 yards per kickoff return this season. Johnson has had four kickoff returns of 50-or-more yards this season.

▶ Dennis Johnson returned the season opening kickoff 91-yards for a touchdown to join Clemson's C.J. Spiller as the only two players in the nation to return a kick for a touchdown to start the year for their team. Johnson's return for a touchdown was the second in his career (Tulsa, 2008, 96 yards). It was the first game-opening kickoff return for a touchdown by a Razorback since Felix Jones went 100 yards against Ole Miss in 2006.

FACTS ABOUT THE BATTLE FOR THE BOOT

- ▶ Bobby Petrino is coaching in his second Battle for the Boot (1-0). Les Miles is 2-2 in the Battle for the Boot.
- ▶ Five of the last eight BOOT games have decided who represents the Western Division in the SEC Championship Game.
- ▶ Since the first BOOT game in 1996, the winner has won or shared the SEC western division title 50 percent of the time (7 of 14 years).
- ▶ Four times, the visiting team has won the BOOT. LSU won the inaugural trophy in 1996 (17-7) at Little Rock, then again in 2004 (43-14) in Little Rock and 2006 in Little Rock (31-26). In 2007, Arkansas won the BOOT with a 50-48 win in three overtimes in Baton Rouge.
- ▶ On Nov 27, 1996 at the initial press conference at the Arkansas State Capital announcing the Battle for the Boot, Governor Mike Huckabee represented Arkansas and since Louisiana Governor Mike Foster (R) could not attend, Lt. Gov. Kathleen Blanco (D) represented LSU. Blanco went on to serve as the Governor of Louisiana (D).

1) Why the "Battle of the Boot"?

Arkansas and LSU don't have the longtime rivalry or trophy game that other SEC teams have, i.e. Alabama-Auburn, Miss-Miss State, Fla-FSU/Tenn, Tenn-Fla/Ala/Kentucky, South Carolina-Clemson, Georgia-Georgia Tech/Fla. The lack of an annual rival or trophy game for Ark/LSU, the fact they play each other at the end of the season on national television, their location geographically, the intensity of each team's zealous fans and the expectation that both will hopefully be challenging for the SEC West annually, make this game a good spot for a trophy matchup regardless of records or standing.

2) Why Arkansas and LSU?

Arkansas and LSU do you have some similar football background. Both the Tigers and Razorbacks have had a rich and storied football history over the past 100 years. From National Championships for the Tigers in 1958 and the Razorbacks in 1964, to "The Great Runs" of Billy Cannon against Ole Miss and Ken Hatfield vs. Texas, both schools have great gridiron legacies. Since their first matchup in 1901, some of those legacies were created when the two teams played each other. The 1946 Cotton Bowl that ended in a 0-0 tie and is remembered by many as the "Ice Bowl", featured such great players as Y.A. Tittle for LSU and Clyde "Smackover" Scott for Arkansas. The 1966 Cotton Bowl was the scene of a stunning upset as the 7-3 Tigers defeated the second ranked and 10-0 Hogs 14-7. Besides the great game history between LSU and Arkansas, both states even have a football connection off the field as LSU's first Bengal Tiger mascot, Mike 1, was purchased by the student body from the Little Rock Zoo in 1937.

3) What's behind the heavy and expensive trophy?

Some trophy games have been around for many decades and their trophy value is founded in a long history and sometimes the oddness of the trophy itself. Since the Arkansas/LSU trophy game was going to be a new one, the best way to create value and significance is to make it more unique than any other trophy. The "Boot" is the most expensive trophy in all of college football and is one of the heaviest (weighs between 150-200 pounds). It requires teamwork to carry it off the field.

EMBRACING ARKANSAS

In his time at Arkansas, Coach Petrino has reached out to the community, faculty and former players through numerous initiatives including the following:

Made a personal \$100,000 commitment to the Razorback Foundation. Petrino's gift is believed to be the largest donation to the Razorback Foundation Annual Fund by a sitting Razorback head coach in school history.

Initiated a kickoff luncheon on August 14, 2009, that was attended by more than 950 fans. Coach Petrino was the featured speaker and coaches, football personnel and all 105 players attended. Two players sat at each table with fans. The plan is for the luncheon to continue in future seasons.

Asked to establish a weekly radio show, which is held Wednesday evenings throughout the fall. It will be held at a local restaurant where fans can attend.

Studied and asked for consideration for a synthetic field surface to be installed at Razorback Stadium. The installation began immediately following our spring game and was completed prior to the 2009 season.

After reading an article discussing city budget issues, Coach Petrino utilized time that was allocated for team meetings during 2009 spring football to send the entire squad to the city library. The group spent part of an afternoon cleaning, stacking books and visiting with children.

Organized a ceremony at halftime of the 2009 Red-White game honoring the senior class from the past season and naming team award winners. He invited former players back to be a part of it and the following were on hand: Darren McFadden, Felix Jones, Shawn Andrews, Ken Hamlin, Quinn Grovey and Cedric Cobbs among others.

More than 500 faculty members were in attendance at the 2009 Arkansas spring game to participate in Faculty Appreciation Day. This was the second year the event was held and the attendance was nearly double that of last year.

Spoke to the "A" Club at a breakfast the morning of the 2009 spring game. More than 200 former Razorbacks from Seattle to Atlanta traveled to attend.

Made appearances at several other Razorback sporting events including men's and women's basketball games and baseball, including the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.
