2007 SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

● **TENNESSEE vs. LSU** ●
Saturday, Dec. 1 • 4 p.m. ET

THE TEAMS: Tennessee (9-3, 6-2 SEC) is the Eastern Division Champion and will be the visiting team. LSU (10-2, 6-2 SEC) is the Western Division Champion and will be the home team.

NATIONAL RANKINGS: Tennessee comes into the game ranked 14th in the Associated Press poll, 15th in the USA Today Coaches poll, 15th in the Harris Interactive poll and 14th in the BCS Standings. LSU comes into the game ranked 5th in the Associated Press poll, 7th in the USA Today Coaches poll, 5th in the Harris Interactive poll and 7th in the BCS Standings.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME: The game, which started in 1992, is in its 16th year. It was a result of conference expansion, which saw Arkansas and South Carolina become the first members added in SEC history. More than 1.2 million fans have witnessed the pageantry of the game first-hand, with 13 sellouts in its history. The first two games were played at Legion Field in Birmingham and the game has been played at the Georgia Dome ever since (1994).

SEC CHAMPIONS: Tennessee will be vying for its 14th SEC Championship and first since 1998. LSU will attempt to win its 10th SEC title and first since 2003. UT's Phillip Fulmer has won two SEC titles while LSU's Les Miles is going after his first conference crown.

TELEVISION: CBS Sports will televise the game nationally for the seventh straight year (VERNE LUNDQUIST, Play-by-Play; GARY DANIELSON, Analyst; TRACY WOLFSON, Sidelines).

RADIO: Managed by Host Communications, the SEC Radio Network will broadcast the game to the 9-state SEC region and around the nation on the Westwood One Radio Network (DAVE NEAL, Play-by-Play; DAVE ARCHER, Analyst; DAVE BAKER, Sidelines).

SERIES: Tennessee leads the series, 20-6-3. In games played in Knoxville, Tennessee leads, 11-2-1. In games played in Baton Rouge, Tennessee leads, 8-3-2. The two teams met in the 2001 SEC Championship Game with LSU winning, 31-20. The teams also met in the 1972 Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl with Tennessee winning, 24-17.

IN THE SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME: This marks Tennessee's fifth appearance in the contest while LSU is in the game for the fourth time. The Vols are 2-2 in its previous visits to Atlanta while LSU is 2-1. Tennessee defeated Auburn, 30-29, in 1997 and Mississippi State, 24-14, in 1998, while falling to LSU, 31-20, in 2001 and Auburn, 38-28, in 2004. LSU defeated the Vols in 2001 and Georgia, 34-13, in 2003 and fell to Georgia, 34-14, in 2005.

LAST MEETING: Nov. 4, 2006 in Knoxville, LSU defeats Tennessee, 28-24. The Tigers' JaMarcus Russell completed a four-yard touchdown pass to Early Doucet with just nine seconds left in the game to lift LSU to the win. Tennessee had taken a 24-21 lead midway through the final quarter on a 54-yard TD pass from Jonathan Crompton to Robert Meachem. Vol quarterback Erik Ainge started but could not play through an ankle injury and was relieved by Crompton in the second quarter. Crompton was 11-of-24 for 183 yards and two TD passes. Russell was 24-of-36 for 247 yards with three TDs and also ran for 71 yards on seven carries. Doucet caught eight passes for 73 yards and a score.

LAST TEN SEASONS: Since 1998, Tennessee and LSU have been two of the four winningest teams in the SEC. The Vols are 100-36 (.735) and have the third best mark in the league while the Tigers have the fourth best mark at 97-38 (.719).

LAST FIVE SEASONS: Since 2003, LSU has the SEC's best overall mark at 64-12 (.842) while Tennessee has the league's fifth best mark at 51-23 (.689).

BOWLING: Tennessee will be looking to get into a BCS bowl for the first time since the 2000 Fiesta Bowl (loss to Nebraska, 31-21). LSU will be looking for back-to-back BCS bowl trips for the first time (2007 Sugar Bowl, def. Notre Dame, 41-14). LSU has been to bowls during the last seven seasons while Tennessee has been to bowls in 16 of the last 17 seasons (2005).

2007 SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Tennessee vs. LSU

December 1, 2007 • 4:00 p.m. ET

Georgia Dome (71,500) • Atlanta, Ga. • CBS Sports

Tennessee (Eastern Division Champion) and LSU (Western Division Champion / designated home team) will meet in Atlanta's Georgia Dome to battle for the league championship and the right to represent the conference in the Bowl Championship Series. The 16th-annual title game is set for December 1 and will be nationally televised by CBS Sports at 4 p.m. ET.

The game is a result of conference expansion, which saw Arkansas and South Carolina become the first members added in SEC history. Under NCAA regulations, a conference with 12 members may play a 12th football game to determine its champion, provided the regular season is played in divisions.

The participants of the game are determined each year during the eight-game regular-season conference schedule as the teams with the best overall SEC winning percentage in each division.

The 1994 SEC Championship Game earned a 10.5 rating and a 26 share, the highest rated SEC Championship Game in history.

The SEC Championship Game has also drawn capacity crowds in its short history. 1,120,836 fans have witnessed first-hand the pageantry of SEC Football at the 15 previous Championship Games.

Attendance at the 15 previous championship games has been 102.3 percent of stadium capacity, including 13 sellouts.

SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

Each head coach is allowed one Instant Replay challenge per game, which is exercised by requesting a team timeout. A head coach may issue a challenge only if his team has one or more timeouts remaining in the half. If the challenged ruling is overturned, the timeout is not charged, but the coach has no more challenges during that game.

THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game (CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2, Lincoln Financial) or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference, following approval by the NCAA Football Rules Committee, will implement the use of video replay on an experimental basis beginning with the 2005 football season.

THE PLAYS

Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
 - a. Scoring Plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
 - b. Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line
 - c. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
 - d. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds
2. Passing Plays:
 - a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
 - b. Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver
 - c. Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player
 - d. Quarterback (Passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, play is finalized)
 - e. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
 - f. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
 - g. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
3. Other Detectable Infractions:
 - a. Runner ruled not down.
 - b. Forward progress with respect to first down
 - c. Touching of a kick
 - d. Number of players on field
 - e. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with overturned plays)
 - f. Fourth-down/try fumble plays

THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with a DVSPORT Digital Replay System. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official is selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live video feed is sent directly to the replay booth. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while capturing/digitizing it into the DVSPORT Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play as well as any replays as they occur in real time.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Communicator. As the Technician marks the incoming video, each view (by mark) will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Communicator can touch/click on a thumbnail and immediately send that play/replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a remote device controlled by the Replay Official. All replays/video are viewed on an output monitor. The touch screen is only used to select the replays.

While most plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the Digital Replay System developed by DVSPORT of Pittsburgh, Pa. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from DVSPORT.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE BOWLS

TEN SEC TEAMS ALREADY BOWL ELIGIBLE

Ten Southeastern Conference teams, the most the SEC has ever had, have already earned the six-win benchmark to be eligible for post-season play in 2007.

The most bowl-eligible teams for the SEC in its history in one season prior to 2007 was nine, which was during the 2000, 2001 and 2006 seasons. In eight other seasons, the SEC has had eight bowl-eligible teams, the latest coming in 2002.

While six wins is the basic eligibility to participate in post-season bowl games, NCAA rules state that a "deserving winning team" be eligible for bowl-season play.

The SEC has agreements to send eight of its teams to post-season bowls.

NCAA Rule 30.9.2 states, "A contest (bowl game) shall be licensed only if it serves the purpose of providing a national contest between deserving winning teams. A "deserving winning team" shall be defined as wone that has won a minimum of six games against football bowl subdivision opponents and that has more wins than losses."

Exceptions to NCAA Rule 30.9.2 exist. Those are:

"An institution with a record of six wins and six losses may be selected for participation in a bowl game under the following circumstances:

(a) The institution or its conference has a primary contractual affiliation, which existed prior to the first contest of the applicable season, with the sponsoring bowl organization. In the case of a conference contractual affiliation, all conference teams with winning records must be placed in one of the contracted bowl games before any institution with a record of six wins and six losses may be placed in a contracted bowl game. There shall be no contingency agreements with other sponsoring bowl organizations intended to enable an institution with a record of six wins and six losses to become eligible for those contests; or

(b) All contractual affiliations per Bylaw 30.9.2.1-(a) have been fulfilled and all institutions with winning records

30.9.2.2 Exception—Football Bowl Subdivision Opponent. [FBS] Each year, a football bowl subdivision institution may count one victory against a football championship subdivision opponent toward the six-win minimum, provided the opponent has averaged 90 percent of the permissible maximum number of grants-inaid per year in football over a rolling two-year period.

30.9.2.2.1 Waiver. [FBS] The Football Issues Committee may approve a waiver of the 90 percent requirement to permit a football bowl subdivision institution to count a victory against a football championship subdivision opponent in football toward meeting the six-victory requirement when a unique or catastrophic situation affects the Division I-AA institution's ability to average 90 percent of the permissible maximum number of grants-in-aid per year in Division I-AA football over a rolling two-year period.

SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send eight of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2007 season. The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One (2nd), will then make its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The Outback, Chick-fil-A and AT&T Cotton Bowls will work with the conference office to determine picks 3-5. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference. The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the selection of preference following the Cotton and Outback Bowls.

In selections 6-7, the AutoZone Liberty and Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowls will make their selections, not in any specific order, but in consultation with the SEC Office. The Bowls will rank available qualified teams in order of preference. If there are no similarities in the order of selection, the bowls will be granted its selection. If the bowls rank the same teams in preference, the team involved in the process would get its preference of which bowl to participate.

The PetroSun Independence Bowl will receive the eighth selection of available SEC teams.

2008 BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCHEDULE

Following the 2007 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the FedEx Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose presented by Citi, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

FOX Sports will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games, with the exception of the Rose Bowl, which will be televised by ABC Sports.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

At the conclusion of the 2007 regular season, the Allstate BCS National Championship Game will be hosted in New Orleans on Jan. 7 at 8 p.m. EST. The Allstate BCS National Championship Game will have the top two teams ranked in the BCS final regular season standings.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

Other BCS games following the 2007 regular season include the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1 at 4:30 p.m. EST, Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. EST, Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. EST, and the Orange Bowl on Jan. 3 at 8 p.m. ET.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME RACE RECAPS

1992 - Both races decided before final weekend. Florida and Georgia (6-2 in the SEC) were co-champions in the Eastern Division. The Gators won the tie-breaker by virtue of a 26-24 win over the Bulldogs earlier in the season. Alabama (8-0) was the outright Western Division champion, even with a game against Auburn in the final weekend, which the Tide won, 17-0.

1993 - Both races decided before final weekend. Florida won the Eastern Division and Alabama won the Western Division. The Gators finished 1/2 game ahead of Tennessee (UT tied Alabama, 17-17). Alabama, at 5-2-1, finished two games ahead second-place Arkansas. Auburn was 8-0 in the SEC, but was ineligible for the conference title.

1994 - Both races decided before final weekend. Florida won the Eastern Division, finishing SEC play at 7-1, two games ahead of Tennessee. Alabama won the Western Division with an 8-0 SEC mark, three games ahead of Miss. State.

1995 - Both races decided before final weekend. Florida won the Eastern Division, finishing SEC play at 8-0, one game ahead of Tennessee. Arkansas won the Western Division with a 6-2 SEC mark, one game ahead of Auburn and Alabama.

1996 - Both races decided before final weekend. Florida won the Eastern Division, finishing SEC play at 8-0, one game ahead of Tennessee. Alabama won the Western Division with a 6-2 SEC mark, tying LSU. However, the Tide defeated the Tigers, 26-0, earlier in the year to win the tie-breaker.

1997 - Eastern Division race not finalized until after the final weekend. Tennessee defeated Vanderbilt, 17-10, to win the division on the final weekend. Tennessee, at 7-1 in the SEC, finished one game ahead of Georgia and Florida. Auburn had won the Western Division with a 6-2 SEC mark, tying LSU. However, Auburn defeated LSU, 31-28, earlier in the year to win the tie-breaker.

1998 - Western Division race not finalized until after the final weekend. Miss. State defeated Ole Miss, 28-6, on Thanksgiving night, to win the division on the final weekend. Arkansas and Miss. State finished in a tie for the division title. However, Miss. State defeated Arkansas, 22-21, earlier that season to win the tie-breaker. Arkansas defeated LSU 41-14 on the final weekend, but when State defeated Ole Miss, the chase for the Championship Game had been won. Tennessee had clinched the Eastern Division before the final weekend and defeated Vanderbilt, 41-0, to finished the SEC at 8-0.

1999 - Both races decided before final weekend. Florida won the Eastern Division, finishing SEC play at 7-1, one game ahead of Tennessee. Alabama won the Western Division with a 7-1 SEC mark, one game ahead of Miss. State.

2000 - Both races decided before final weekend. Florida won the Eastern Division, finishing SEC play at 7-1, two games ahead of South Carolina, Georgia and Tennessee. Auburn won the Western Division with a 6-2 SEC mark, one game ahead of LSU. LSU lost to Arkansas in the final weekend, 14-3. Even if the Tigers would have beaten the Razorbacks, Auburn would have won the tie-breaker over LSU due to a 34-17 win earlier in the season.

2001 - Both races go down to the final weekend. Due to game postponements on Sept. 15, games were reschedule for Dec. 1. On that weekend, Tennessee defeated Florida, 34-32, in Gainesville, and LSU defeated Auburn, 27-14, in Baton Rouge, to clinch berths in the SEC Championship Game. The Vols won the East with a 7-1 mark while LSU had a 5-3 mark and tied with Auburn for the West, but won the head-to-head tiebreaker.

2002 - Western division race not finalized until after the final weekend. Georgia clinched the Eastern Division championship on Nov. 16 after defeating Auburn, 24-21, in Auburn. The 7-1 Bulldogs finish one game ahead of Florida, which was 6-2. Arkansas wins the Western Division on the season's final weekend, defeating LSU, 21-20, in Little Rock on Nov. 29. The Razorbacks, LSU Tigers and Auburn Tigers are tied at 5-3 but Arkansas wins the head-to-head tiebreakers.

2003 - Both races decided on final weekend. Tennessee defeats Kentucky, 20-7, to force a three-way tie for the Eastern Division championship between the Vols, Georgia and Florida. Using a tie-breaker involving the BCS standings, Georgia has the highest BCS ranking and has defeated Tennessee (next highest ranking) during regular season to secure SEC

Championship Game berth. LSU defeats Arkansas, 55-24, and Ole Miss beats Mississippi State, 31-0, to force a tie for the Western Division championship. LSU's 17-14 win over Ole Miss the week before earns the Tigers the Western Division berth.

2004 - Auburn clinches berth in the SEC Championship Game on Oct. 30, tying the earliest since the game began in 1992 (Alabama, 1993). The Tigers (8-0) finish two games ahead in the standings of second-place LSU (6-2). Tennessee clinches berth as Eastern Division representative with 38-33 win against Vanderbilt on Nov. 20. The Vols (7-1) would win their next game on the following weekend against Kentucky to claim the division title outright. Georgia was second in the Western Division with a 6-2 mark.

2005 - Georgia (6-2) clinched the Eastern Division Championship with a 45-13 win over Kentucky on Nov. 19. The Bulldogs finish one full game ahead of South Carolina and Florida in the standings. LSU clinched the Western Division title with a 19-17 win over Arkansas on Nov. 25. The Tigers finished tied for the Western Division title (7-1), but defeated Auburn, 20-17, on Oct. 22, to win the tie-breaker.

2006 - Florida (7-1) clinched Eastern Division Championship and berth in the SEC Championship Game on Nov. 4, by defeating Vanderbilt, 25-19. Arkansas clinched the Western Division title and SEC Championship Game berth with a 28-14 win over Mississippi State on Nov. 18.

2007 - LSU (6-2) clinches Western Division berth in the SEC Championship Game on Week 11 after Alabama and Auburn both lose. Tennessee (6-2) clinches Eastern Division berth with win over Kentucky, 52-50, in four overtimes, in Week 13. The Vols finished tied for the Eastern Division title, but defeated Georgia, 35-14, on Oct. 6

The earliest a berth has been clinched in the SEC Championship Game is Oct. 30 (Auburn, 2004, & Alabama, 1993).

In nine of the 32 divisional races (counting 2007), a championship game berth has not been decided until the weekend prior to the SEC Championship Game. That occurred in 1997 (Tennessee), 1998 (Mississippi State), 2001 (Tennessee and LSU), 2002 (Arkansas), 2003 (Georgia and LSU), 2005 (LSU) and 2007 (Tennessee).

THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports - 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- The SEC's mission statement reflects the priorities of the league. "The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- During the last five years, the SEC has had more student-athletes honored as CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans than any other conference. The league has had 171 student-athletes named CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans, including 79 named to the first-team.
- During the last eleven years, the SEC has had 19 winners of the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which is given annually to eight outstanding senior student-athletes. Since 1997, no other conference has had as many student-athletes honored with this prestigious award. In 2006, Alabama track & field athlete Beth Mallory was named a recipient of this award.
- Florida's Chris Leak was named by the National Football Foundation as a National Scholar-Athlete. During the last five years, the SEC has had 11 student-athletes honored, the most of any conference. LSU's Rudy Niswanger won the Vincent dePaul Draddy Award given by the National Football Foundation in 2005 as the nation's top football scholar-athlete. Niswanger became the sixth SEC student-athlete to claim the "Academic Heisman" since the award was established in 1990.

FOR THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- The 12 member institutions of the SEC provide nearly \$65 million in scholarships for the more than 4,200 student-athletes each year.
- The SEC distributed nearly \$675,000 during the 2006-2007 academic year from the NCAA Special Assistance Fund for Student-Athletes. This program was implemented to provide financial aid to student-athletes with specific needs such as clothing and shoes, medical or vision care, academic course supplies and family emergencies.
- During the 2007-08 academic year, the SEC will distribute more than \$1 million to directly benefit student-athletes from the Student-Athlete Opportunity Fund.
- The SEC awards post-graduate scholarships totaling \$130,000 to 24 student-athletes each year. The top male and female nominee each receive the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award, named for the league's fourth commissioner, and a \$10,000 scholarship. Last year, 22 additional student-athletes (11 female and 11 male) received \$5,000 to continue their education. Alabama baseball player Emeel Salem and Vanderbilt track & field athlete Erika Schneble were named McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award winners in 2006-07.
- The SEC has established a Community Service Award to honor a male and female student-athlete with a \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding service in the community. Tennessee swimmer Brad Boswell and Florida softball player Stacey Stevens were named recipients of this award in 2006-07.

A LEADER IN WOMEN'S SPORTS

- The SEC has developed a "Principles for Gender Equity," which, calls for each league school to provide equitable funding for women's sports, promotions and marketing and other support services. The SEC currently conducts championships in 11 women's sports and nine men's sports.
- The SEC had four sport winners of the Collegiate Woman of the Year Award sponsored by Honda. Tennessee's Candace Parker won for women's basketball, Courtney Kupets of Georgia took top honors in gymnastics, Georgia's Kara Lynn Joyce won in Swimming & Diving and Tennessee's Monica Abbott was the top athlete in softball.
- Since 1987, SEC schools have won 66 NCAA women's national championships, an average of more than three per year in the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors. Nine of the 12 SEC institutions have won a national women's team championship since 1987.

COMPLIANCE AND EDUCATION

- The SEC Task Force Committee on Compliance and Enforcement has issued a report of recommendations that represents an important initial step in a formal process of establishing a new standard of compliance excellence within the Southeastern Conference. Among the recommendations included in this report was how institutions will handle reports of allegations, strengthening the relationship between the league's institutions and the conference office, developing new orientation programs and establishing an annual review of compliance issues.
- The SEC also conducts a New Coaches Orientation Program four times a year, which supplements institutional orientation programs and enhance the professional development of coaches. Topics of discussion range from the role of the SEC and NCAA to the role of athletics in higher education.

SPORTSMANSHIP

- The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states:
 "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

IN THE COMMUNITY

- The SEC launched its education initiative in 2002, utilizing the platform of intercollegiate athletics to provide elementary school teachers with relevant resources they can use to educate and prepare children for life. The SEC became the nation's first conference to develop customized educational software, providing a CD-ROM containing SEC-branded content correlating to national educational standards. Since the CD-ROM was produced, the SEC has initiated an online program for K-8 students on education content and character development.
- SECKids.com is a website uniquely designed for school-age students. Now fans of all ages can access exciting, interactive and educational information on the SEC and its universities. SECKids.com features exclusive behind-the-scenes access at championship events, profiles of student-athletes and coaches, along with games and video highlights. Teachers can also register online to utilize the SEC Kids's college software in their classroom. The SEC is the only conference in the country to develop a site of this kind.

OVERALL ATHLETICS SUCCESS

- Since 1990, the SEC has won 118 team and 805 individual national championships. Since that time, the SEC has had at least one team ranked in the top five nationally in 76.8 percent of the total sports win which the league has competed (268 of 349). Ten of the SEC's 12 schools have won at least one national championship since 1990.
- In the SEC's 20 sponsored sports since 2000, the SEC has won more team national championships than any other conference in the nation. The SEC won 50 team titles since 2000, while the Pac-10 won 45 and the Big 12 won 21. The SEC won team titles in 16 different sports since 2000, also the most of any conference.

THE COACHES

Phillip Fulmer is in his 16th season at Tennessee and overall with a record of 146-44 (.768). The Volunteers' offensive coordinator is David Cutcliffe and the defensive coordinator is John Chavis.

Les Miles is in his third season at LSU with a record of 32-6 (.842) and in his 7th season overall with a record of 60-27 (.690). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gary Crowton and the defensive coordinator is Bo Pelini.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL

Erik Ainge set new career-highs last weekend for passing yards (397) and passing touchdowns (7) during UT's thrilling four-overtime triumph at Kentucky. Ainge needs just eight more completions to break Peyton Manning's single-season school record of 287 set in 1997. Arian Foster has 810 yards rushing, 245 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns in his last eight games after rushing for 118 yards and catching nine passes for 98 yards and a score at Kentucky. Lucas Taylor leads the team with 71 catches for 975 yards.

Defensively, S Craig Steltz leads LSU in tackles with 89, five of which have gone for losses. Steltz also leads the SEC in interceptions with 6 to go with 7 pass breakups. He's also recorded one sack, forced two fumbles and recovered a fumble. He's fifth in the league in passes defended with a total of 13. Steltz has been named one of three finalists for the Thorpe Award. Glenn Dorsey has recorded 61 tackles this year despite being constantly double and sometimes triple-teamed on just about every snap. He's also managed to recorded 11.5 tackles for losses, six sacks. He's also batted down four passes and posted four quarterback hurries.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LSU HAS THE BALL

Jerod Mayo led the team with a career-high 19 stops at Kentucky, including a sack and a TFL. He has 34 stops in the last two games. Ryan Karl posted 10 stops and Rico McCoy posted nine at Kentucky. Mayo leads the team with 112 tackles, followed by McCoy with 98 and Karl with 80. Eric Berry has 25 tackles and two interceptions in the last three games. He posted 14 stops at Kentucky. Berry has four interceptions and 207 INT return yards this season, which is a single-season school record. Jonathan Hefney is fourth on the team with 78 tackles.

Offensively, the Tigers have scored a school-record 482 points this year, which includes going over the 40-point mark a school-record seven times. LSU is averaging

40.2 points per game. RB Jacob Hester leads the squad with 897 yards rushing and 11 TDs, while QB Matt Flynn has thrown for 2,233 yards and 17 scores. With 7 receptions against Arkansas, LSU WR Early Doucet moved past Dwayne Bowe into fourth place in school history with 158 catches for his career. Despite missing four games this year with an injury, Doucet has still managed to catch 45 passes for 445 yards and four scores.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Daniel Lincoln is second in the SEC in field-goal percentage (21-of-26, .808) and 49-of-50 on PATs through 12 games. Lincoln kicked his career-long 48-yard field goal vs. South Carolina. Dennis Rogan replaced Hefney as the punt returner before the LA-Lafayette game. Rogan averages 11.6 yards per punt return and 30.3 yards per kick return.

LSU junior PK Colt David has kicked his way into the LSU record books as he now holds the school's single-season record for field goals (23) and points (132). With a pair of field goals against Ole Miss, David moved past David Brownkyke (19 field goals in 1988) for first place in LSU history for field goals in a season. In addition, David's 11 points against the Rebels allowed him to surpass RB LaBrandon Toefield for points in a season. Toefield held the school mark with 114 points scored during the 2001 season. David's 132 points this year ranks as the second-highest total in SEC history, while his 23 field goals ranks seventh in SEC history.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME NOTES AND FIGURES

- Here are some notes and figures on the SEC Championship Game:
- In 15 games, the average winning margin has been 15.20 points.
 - Three of the 15 games have been decided by a touchdown or less (1992, 1994 and 1997).
 - In 15 games, the two participating teams average 48.73 points per game, while the winning team scores 32.0 points per contest.
 - Five national champions have come from the SEC Championship Game. Alabama won the national title in 1992, Florida won the crown in 1996, Tennessee claimed the honor in 1998, LSU in 2003 and Florida in 2006.
 - There have been no shutouts in the history of the game. In 2003, Arkansas was the first team in SEC Championship Game history to be shutout in the first half.
 - The winning team has led at halftime in 12 of the 15 previous games. In 1997, Tennessee came back to win (30-29) after trailing Auburn at halftime (10-20) and in 2002, LSU trailed 17-10 at halftime before defeating Tennessee, 31-20.
 - The team that has scored first in the SEC Championship Game is 8-7, having won the last seven games. The team that scored first lost the first five games.
 - The 74,913 attendance at the 2003 Georgia-LSU SEC Championship Game is the largest in the 12 games at the Georgia Dome.

LSU has faced an SEC-high six teams against Top 25 foes at the time the game was played and won five of them. Tennessee has faced four Top 25 foes and split the games at two each. Both teams played one non-SEC Top 25 team - LSU defeated #9 Virginia Tech, 48-7, in Baton Rouge on Sept. 8 while Tennessee fell at #12 California, 45-31, in the season opener on Sept. 1.

In pre-season voting, LSU was predicted to win the SEC with Florida finishing as the Eastern Division Champion.
