That's the mantra Coach Brady has used to describe his Tigers in 2007-08 ... After years of pounding the ball down low with players like Jaime Lloreda, Brandon Bass, Tyrus Thomas and Glen Davis, this year's team is much taller but there is no one to pound the ball to the goal ... But Tigers players are among the leaders in blocked shots and LSU appears to be able to score from more options than in years past ... LSU is scoring more points, but many of LSU's young players are also learning how to play defense.

### Last Time Out

LSU had its chances for a statement win against Villanova in the Pizza Hut Big East/SEC Challenge (12/6) in Philadelphia, but was unable to sustain any of the success it had in the first 31 1/2 minutes over the last part of the game, falling 68-67 ... The final score negated a strong defensive effort that had LSU blocking 14 Villanova shots, second

# John Brady

Head Coach • 11th Year

When John Brady first put a team on the floor of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, his Tiger squad was undermanned, undersized and underdogs.

Teams hated to play the Tigers then because John Brady coached his team hard and they responded with several strong performances against the leagues top teams, but not many wins. The strong performances continued as the years went on, but now LSU was winning.

In 11 years as head coach at LSU, John Brady has coached the LSU team as only he knows how -- with heart and passion, and knowledge of the game that makes him one of the best at in-game decisions.

The LSU Tigers, in 2006, won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record and won the Western Division for the second straight year. LSU has won 31 SEC games the last three years, one of the best totals in the league over the last three years, and during that time period, LSU had a streak of 19 straight conference home wins that spanned portions of four seasons from 2004-07.

The SEC Championship in 2006 was Brady's second and the school's first outright championship in 21 years.

LSU has had six consecutive winning seasons under John Brady and only three times in the program history have there been longer consecutive years of winning.

Three times, John Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year and he has coached the SEC Freshman of the Year four times.

Brady's 184 wins are the third most wins by an LSU basketball coach and only two LSU basketball coaches have served longer tenures.

Brady's knowledge of the game and his belief in discipline and respon-

sibility for actions on and off the floor have made the program strong again, one that LSU fans are proud of.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hardwood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that athletic and academic pursuits of the players should be challenged to the fullest.

That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well.

Brady came to LSU after six highly successful seasons at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala. In his six-year tenure (1992-97), he turned the team into a consistent winner, posting a record of 89-77. In Brady's six years at Samford, the team had three first-team and five second team all-league selections.

Now at LSU, the numbers are beginning to work for Brady both on and off the floor. He has had 33 players earn Academic Honor Roll status at LSU, plus 18 players who have received their degrees from LSU.

The 53-year-old Brady is the father of two daughters (Brittany-17, Brooke-13) and is married to the former Misty Champagne.

In his first 10 seasons, Brady has taken the Tigers a long way, including to college basketball's pinnacle, the NCAA Final Four. The results are a program that is solid both athletically and academically. The top athletes in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers in the league.

He has re-established LSU back as a national factor in college basketball and the work is being done to keep LSU there for years to come.

Tasmin Mitchell was taken out of Oklahoma State game (11/19) after six minutes, did not play the remainder of the Maui tournament ... Has a stress reaction in the shin bone area of his left foot ... Surgery was Nov. 29 ... Eligible for medical redshirt if unable to return ... Dameon Mason broke his nose in practice prior to the Villanova game (12/6), has continued to play.

## Last Game -- Villanova 68, LSU 67 (12/6 - Philadelphia, Pa.)

LSU's appearance in the Pizza Hut Big East/SEC Invitational was one of such promise for nearly 32 minutes before Villanova made a tremendous rally in the final few minutes to win the game with a late bucket ... The Tigers had a 21-point lead with 8:50 to play but couldn't hold the lead as both teams free throw fortunes changed completely and a second chance rebound gave Villanova the winning shot ... LSU shot identical halves of 11-of-26 (42.3%) from the field and after going 12-of-14 from the foul line in the first 31 minutes, LSU (shooting almost 75 percent to that point in the season) was just 4-of-11 at the line while Villanova, which started 3-of-its-first-12, made 20-of-its-last 22 at the line ... Marcus Thornton had his second double double of the season with 15 points and 13 rebounds, while Anthony Randolph had 12 points before fouling out. Terry Martin added 14 and Chris Johnson had his sixth straight double figure scoring game with 11 ... Garrett Temple six assists and the Tigers blocked 14 shots, just two off the school record ... Randolph blocked four shots with Temple, Johnson and Dameon Mason each blocking three shots.

## Three Scoring 20

The Tigers had three players score 20 points in the last home game, the win over Southern (11/30) ... Anthony Randolph scored a career high 24, Marcus Thornton 22 and Chris Johnson a career high 20 points ... Randolph and Johnson played 26 minutes, while Thornton played 32 minutes for the Tigers in the win.

The last time three LSU players scored in 20 points was in the double overtime win over Ohio State on Jan. 15, 2005 when Darrel Mitchell had 32 points (the last LSU player to break 30 in a game), Brandon Bass (2005 SEC Player of the Year) had 29 and Antonio Hudson added 20. LSU won the game, 113-101.

The other time it happened for LSU in a regulation game was in the 1999-2000 season opener at the Maravich Center when LSU defeated Grambling State, 112-37. In the game Stromile Swift (2000 SEC co-Player of the Year) had 22 points, Ronald Dupree had 21 points and Lamont Roland had 20.

## Second Half Shooting And Scoring

In the midst of everything else that was seen in the Villanova game, it marked the first time this season that LSU did not shoot at least 50 percent in the second 20 minutes of the contest ... In fact, it turned out to be the lowest percentage of the sea-

son overall for any game - 42.6 percent ... In three games this season, LSU has shot over 50 percent from the field for the game and for the season is still shooting a nice percentage of 48.6 percent (221-455) while holding opponents to 38.6 percent (192-498) ... Through the first eight games, LSU is 126-of-230 in the second half or 54.8 percent.

LSU is averaging 43.4 points a game in the second half and has outscored opponents by 76 points in the final 20 minutes ... In the first halves of games so far this year, LSU is averaging 32.4 points and has a scoring differential of plus seven ... LSU scored 57 points against Southern in the second half (11/30), the fourth best single scoring half in the John Brady era:

### Johnson, Randolph On Jay Bilas' Maui Team

Junior Chris Johnson and freshman Anthony Randolph were both on Jay Bilas' final ESPN.com All-Maui team for their performances over the three games of the EA Sports Maui Invitational ... Earlier in one of his blogs from Maui, Bilas said about Johnson, "this kid oozes potential." Johnson averaged a team best 16.0 points a game, making 20-of-29 field goals, including four treys, with a 7.0 rebound average per game ... Randolph averaged 15.7 points a game and 7.0 rebounds.

### About Northwestern State University

The Demons and Tigers will meet for the 19th time with LSU holding a 12-6 lead in the series ... This will be the fifth meeting since 1989 with the Demons with LSU winning all four of those games ... The Demons come into the game 4-6 on the season, coming off a 79-73 loss in Natchitoches to LSU-Shreveport, the undefeated No. 5-ranked team in NAIA ... Trey Gilder had a huge game for the Demons with 31 points and 17 rebounds (nine offensive), while Gerrell Thomas had 14 points and 13 rebounds and Deividas Petravicius getting 13 points ... A third Demon, Colby Bargeman, was also in double figures on the boards with 10 ... Northwestern State shot 34.7 percent for the game, 26-of-75, but out rebounded LSU-Shreveport, 54-43.

One of the great family traditions of college basketball in North Louisiana continues on with Mike McConathy in his ninth season as the head coach of the Demons ... The superstar player at Louisiana Tech who coached 16 seasons at Bossier Parish Community College, has taken the Demons to the NCAA Tournament twice, most notably in 2006 when the Demons upset Iowa on a last-second shot in the first round of the tournament ... McConathy has won 134 games at Northwestern State and as a head coach has 486 wins and 282 losses in this his 25th year as a head coach ... The probable Northwestern State starters are:

LSU has won 14 games each of the last three years at home, but will only play 15 home games this season ... LSU is 46-7 (86.5 percent) over the last three-plus years overall and 80-6 (92.9 percent) over the ten-plus years of John Brady's tenure in non-conference games.

### The Pete Maravich Assembly Center - New Floor For 2007-08

This is the 37th season of play in the building and LSU is 418-139 in the building (75.0 percent) and 217-30 (87.8 percent) in non-conference games.

The Tigers are playing at home on a brand new wood floor that was installed earlier in the month. The floor was designed by Jason Feirman in the LSU Athletics Publications office and made by Connor Sports Flooring in Arlington, Illinois.

## Thornton and Randolph With Big Opening Night Games

Junior college transfer Marcus Thornton made his season debut a good one for LSU, hitting 8-of-14 field goals, including four treys, in a 27-point effort against Southeastern Louisiana ... He was just on the edge of becoming the first Tiger to score 30 points since Darrel Mitchell scored 32 in double overtime at home against Ohio State in January 2005 ... Also freshman Anthony Randolph came up big against the Lions with a double double of 19 points and 13 rebounds ... Here are how the numbers compare with other opening night first games for some other Tigers in the last 20 or so years:

Of course, one to add to that is Durand "Rudy" Macklin who in the 1976 season opener in his first game as a Tiger pulled down a school record 32 rebounds against Tulane.

### **A Nice Scoring Average**

Through the first eight games, junior college transfer Marcus Thornton is averaging 19.3 points a game ... Through play on Wednesday, that average ranks third in the conference ... While extremely early, Thornton finds himself in rare territory for an LSU player as no player has averaged more than 19 points to lead the LSU team in scoring since Ronnie Henderson averaged 21.8 points per game in 1996.

### **Randolph One Of The Top SEC Freshman**

Anthony Randolph of Dallas is making his name known as one of the top SEC freshman after seven games, averaging 15.0 points per game, 8.1 rebounds and 3.2 blocks per game ... His scoring average ranks fifth among league freshman, the rebound average is second among the freshman and his blocks per game average is first among league freshman.

### **Chris Johnson**

The point was made in post-game comments against Nicholls State last month about the success Chris Johnson has had since moving into the starting lineup and again it is a case of another LSU player working hard in practice and having the patience to wait their time ... This is Johnson's time and his last six games have certainly shown his patience has been rewarded and how big a help he has been to some of the success LSU has had:

**Oklahoma State - 19 pts, five rebounds (8-9 FG)**  
**Chaminade - 18 pts, 11 rebounds (first double-double, 3 blocks)**  
**Arizona State - 11 pts, 5 rebounds (3 blocks)**

**Villanova - 11 pts, 4 rebounds (3 blocks)**

For the season in eight games, Johnson has scored 101 points, 43 more than in 18 games last year and his 213 minutes is more than 100 minutes over his total of a year ago ... This season he is averaging 12.6 points per game and 2.5 blocks a game.

### **Johnson With A Nice Streak**

Johnson at the free throw line this season, has made 21-of-23 free throws or 91.3 percent at the charity stripe, far and away the best in the league for those qualifying (based on the league minimum of 2.5 made a game) and it is 21st in the nation in

the latest NCAA stats ... As part of that 21-of-23 was a consecutive streak of 18 that was finally stopped in the Villanova game ... Ironically, in Johnson's first two seasons, he was just a combined 8-of-13 at the charity stripe ... The 18 consecutive free throws made is believed to be the longest streak since Chris Jackson hit the school record 35-in-a-row in the 1989-90 season.

### Trying To Get Another Winning Season

LSU has had a winning record each of the last six seasons which is the third longest consecutive winning streak in school history ... LSU's consecutive season winning streaks:

- 11 - 1982-83 to 1992-93
- 9 - 1913-14 to 1921-22
- 6 - 2001-02 to present
- 5 - 1976-77 to 1980-81
- 4 - 1931-32 to 1934-35

### O Canada

The LSU season got off to an early start thanks to a three-game exhibition tour of Canada over the Labor Day weekend ... The Tigers played games and won at the University of Guelph (92-60), York University (101-67) and the University of Toronto (82-55) ... Marcus Thornton, the junior college transfer, led the Tigers on the trip averaging 26.0 points per game as the guard hit 32-of-55 field goal attempts and more importantly 11 three-pointers in 25 attempts (44 percent) ... Anthony Randolph averaged 13.3 points and a team best 6.7 rebounds, while veterans Terry Martin (13.0 points) and Mitchell (11.0 points) averaged in double figures.

LSU as a team shot 48 percent from the floor and 36.9 percent from the international three-point arc, some 30 percentage points higher than a season ago.

LSU's decision to wait until the Labor Day Weekend to go on a trip outside the United States allowed the newcomers to join the veterans on the trip and allowed for a week of practice prior to leaving for Canada.

### The Season Started Earlier

The first exhibition game on Nov. 1 marked by two days the earliest exhibition game in LSU history ... The start of the season on Nov. 12 against Southeastern Louisiana was the earliest an LSU men's basketball team has ever started the season in program history.

Last season and in the 2001-02 season, the previous earliest game was played on Nov. 17 ... In the 2005-06 season, the season started on Nov. 18.

### Hopefully Villanova Game Not A Sign The Trend Will Continue

After winning almost all of the close games in 2006, the streak turned against LSU in 2007, going 1-6 in 2007 in games decided by four points or less last season:

### Garrett Temple Cracks Top 10 In Assists

The junior, who has spent much of his career dishing out assists at the point, is not listed as the starting point guard this season, but he handles the ball enough to get plenty of chances to dish the ball and he is off to another good start through the first eight games with 30 assists, to just 19 turnovers ... Temple has now 267 career assists,

### **Scoring Not An Issue**

Despite only scoring 67 points against Villanova, there is no doubt that through the first eight games, scoring is not an issue for the LSU team as they are averaging 76.5 points per game ... The Tigers are giving up 66.5 points (an average that was up over 75 prior to the Nicholls State and Southern games at the end of November) ... Sometimes while LSU has been scoring, opponents have also been scoring almost as much and that is certainly against the tradition of the John Brady-coached teams at LSU ... In the Arizona State game, it marked only the third time in the 11-years of the Brady era that LSU has scored 80 or more points and not won the game ... The other two times came in December 2004 at Biloxi against Southern Miss when LSU lost 88-84 in overtime and in November 2005 when LSU lost at home to Houston, 84-83.

LSU is 68-3 when scoring 80 or more points in the Brady era and also a good 129-28 (82.0%) when scoring 70 or more ... The Tigers have only allowed 80 points 40 times in the Brady era and LSU is 5-35 when allowed 80 or more points.

LSU's defense did make a stand against Nicholls as they held an LSU opponent to the lowest point total since playing Nicholls in the 2002-03 opener and holding them to 24.

### **Louisiana Win Streak**

So far in the first four games against Louisiana schools, LSU has been able to extend its home winning streak against state schools to 66 straight games ... LSU last lost to a Louisiana school in the PMAC on Dec. 6, 1988 when Louisiana Tech beat LSU in overtime, 111-109 ... The present streak started two nights later on Dec. 8, 1988 when the Tigers defeated McNeese State ... A total of 41 of those wins have come in the John Brady era ... LSU still has to get through the Northwestern State game to get the win streak through another season.



## Learning To Play Without Tasmin Mitchell

The Tigers have had to learn to play without a staple of the last two years in the LSU lineup, junior forward Tasmin Mitchell ... Mitchell, who started every game in his freshman and sophomore seasons is probably out for the remainder of the year after undergoing surgery on his left ankle for a stress fracture of his shin bone ... Mitchell averaged 11.4 points a game during LSU's Final Four season in 2006 and then averaged 14.5 points last season ... Mitchell was a pre-season coaches All-SEC selection for the 2007-08 season ... Mitchell started the first three games of the season, to run his consecutive game starting streak to 71, but had to go to the bench in pain after just six minutes of the LSU-Oklahoma State game in Maui (11/21) ... He underwent surgery on Nov. 29 and while the recovery and rehab process is six-to-eight weeks, it is expected that he will use a medical redshirt and be available for two more seasons for LSU.

## John Brady in Elite Company

Brady's two SEC titles (2000, 2006) make him one of just 15 coaches in SEC history to have won at least two SEC regular season titles joining Adolph Rupp (27), Joe Hall (8), Tubby Smith (5), Dale Brown and Babe McCarthy (4), Ray Mears, C. M. Newton, Billy Donovan and Harry Rabenhorst (3) and Brady, Eddie Fogler, Rick Pitino, Nolan Richardson, Ray Skinner and John Mayer (2).

As far as Division championships, only four coaches -- Tubby Smith (7), Rick Pitino, Nolan Richardson and Billy Donovan (4) have won more division titles than John Brady.

## Brady 23rd On SEC All-Time Coaching List

Brady's 189 career wins at LSU has him listed as the 23rd winningest coach all-time in the Southeastern Conference after play on Sunday ... Mississippi State coach Rick Stansbury is at 190 wins while Alabama's Mark Gottfried is 24th at 186 career wins ... Brady needs eight wins to move into the top 20 of the year and it is conceivable that all three coaches could crack the top 20 before the end of the season.

## Three-Point Shooting

LSU hit 38 percent of its three-point attempts in Maui, 30-of-79, but gave up about the same, allowing opponents to make 37.8 percent (28-of-74) ... In the Arizona State game, LSU's 33 attempts was just seven shy of the school record for attempts ... In fact, Marcus Thornton's 12 attempts in that game was the first time anyone had attempted more than 10 three-pointers in a game since Torris Bright in 2002.

For the season, LSU is averaging 7.5 treys a game and 34.3 percent (60-of-175) ... For the season, opponents are making 6.9 a game and 32.7 percent (55-of-168) ... LSU's three-point percentage is the eighth best in the Southeastern Conference.

Individually, Marcus Thornton's percentage of 36.2 percent (21-of-58) is the 11th best in the league (min. 2.0 made per game).

LSU averaged 5.4 makes a game last season ... LSU has made more than 200 three-pointers three times - 215 in 2003, 205 in 2005 and 204 in 2002 ... LSU shot 33.7 percent from the three-point arc in 2007 ... The Tigers best percentage came in 1987, the first year of the three point field goal percentage, when LSU hit 40.1 percent.

## Rebounding

Rebounding and winning has always been a strong part of the LSU team with the Tigers going 21-5 when outrebounding the opponents in 2006 and 16-6 last year when the Tigers had more rebounds ... The Tigers have won 156 of 186 games (83.9 percent) in the Brady era when out rebounding the opponent ... LSU has averaged more rebounds than the opponents in each of the first 10 seasons of the Brady era.

The Tigers rebounding problems showed in the Southeastern game (11/12) as

the Lions out rebounded LSU, 38-29 ... It marked just the 30th time in 121 games in the John Brady era that LSU was able to win a game when out rebounded by the opposition

Of course, that rebounding was helped in the McNeese State game, as Coach Brady elected to go with a bigger lineup starting both Anthony Randolph and Chris Johnson around the goal ... The two combined for 16 points, 10 rebounds, four assists and seven blocks.

Through the first eight games, LSU is averaging 38.1 boards a game, sixth in the league, while giving up 35.1 rebounds a game, ninth in the league ... LSU had been 12th in the league in rebounding until grabbing 52 boards against Southern (11/30).

LSU is -19 to the opponents in offensive rebounds with opponents having kept possessions alive 115 times, compared to 87 for the Tigers

### **Free Throw Percentage**

Which way will the percentage go, now that LSU has found its first major problem making free throws in the clutch at the Villanova game ... LSU's percentage fell nearly two points after the Villanova game, down now to a still very respectable 72.4 percent (110-of-152) ... LSU is getting to the line plenty, having gotten to the line 152 times ... LSU is now third in the league in free throw percentage, one of just four players over 70 percent in the league at this time.

Last season, the Tigers hit 70 percent at the free throw line, making 403-of-572 free throws during the 32 game season ... It was just the second time in the Brady era that an LSU team made 70 percent of their field goals and just missed the top 10 for school all-time free throw percentage marks.

The other time the Tigers were over 70 percent was in Coach Brady's eighth year (2004-05) when LSU was 500-of-685 from the line or 73.0 percent ... Last year was the fewest free throw attempts of any team in the Brady era.

### **Tall and Lean Tigers Blocking Shots**

Blocks are coming easily at times for this LSU team which is billed as "Tall and Lean" but that also can be a double-edge sword as sometimes the blocks are coming from behind shooters driving to the goal after beating defenders to the goal ... But none-the-less, it is a good category number for the Tigers.

The Tigers blocked 14 shots at Villanova (12/6), just two shots off the school record of 16 set by the Shaquille O'Neal-Stanley Roberts team of 1990.

The Tigers cumulative total of blocks last year, 155, ranked sixth all-time at LSU as the Tigers averaged 4.8 blocks per game ... Through the first eight games, LSU already has 72 blocks or 9.0 a game ... LSU is tops in the league ahead of Mississippi State at 7.20 ... LSU is third in the nation in the latest NCAA stats just one-tenth behind tied leaders UConn and UNC-Asheville ... Nine players have blocked shots this year, led by the 26 of Anthony Randolph and the 20 of Chris Johnson ... Randolph's 3.3 average is second in the league, Johnson's 2.5 average is third ... Randolph is 11th in the country in block average, Johnson is 28th.

LSU is on a pace right now to block almost 248 shots this season, well above the present school record mark.

Morgan is rated No. 23 in the country by Rivalshoops.com and 29th by Scoutshoops.com after averaging 13 points, nine rebounds and five blocks per game last season. He was the District 14-4A defensive MVP and was named first-team Class 4A All-State by the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches ... Warren, ranked the 31st best power forward in the country by Scoutshoops.com, averaged 22.3 points, 18.1 rebounds and nine blocks a contest last year for Richwood as the Rams advanced to the Class 3A state semifinals. He was a first team All-State selection by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association ... Delwan Graham, ranked 68th in the country by Scoutshoops.com, averaged 18.6 points per game and 11 rebounds in earning first

team Class 3A All-State honors by the Georgia Coaches Association. Dunwoody was 27-4 last season after winning the state crown in Graham's sophomore season ... Harris' Mundy Mills team is 60-24 the last three seasons, with three consecutive playoff appearances, including a regional championship and a trip to the Class 5A state tournament in 2007. The 3-star Rivalshoops.com and Scoutshoops.com player averaged 19 points and 11 rebounds in earning an honorable mention All-Metro by the Atlanta Journal Constitution. He scored a 1300 on the SAT and carries a 3.7 GPA.

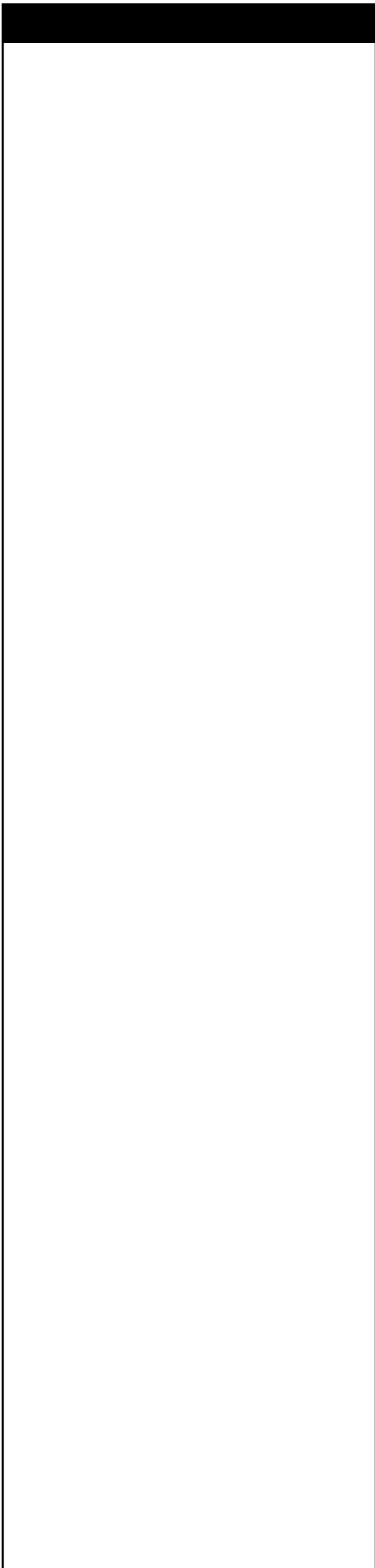
