No. 2 LSU Makes 2007 Debut On Thursday Night Against Mississippi State On ESPN

Second-ranked LSU opens the 2007 college football season on Thursday night when the Tigers travel to face Mississippi State in Starkville. Kickoff for what will be LSU's first non-Holiday Thursday night regular season game is set for 7 p.m. from Davis Wade Stadium. It's also the first time since 1991 that LSU will open a season against a Southeastern Conference opponent. That year, the Tigers fell to Georgia, 31-10, in Athens. The game will be televised to a national audience on ESPN with Chris Fowler, Doug Flutie, Craig James and Erin Andrews calling the action. The Tigers beat Mississippi State, 48-17, a year ago in Tiger Stadium. **Les Miles'** first SEC win as LSU's coach came against Mississippi State in Starkville by a 37-7 count on Oct. 1, 2005. LSU goes into this year's season-opener game ranked No. 2 in the nation in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and in the Associated Press Top 25. The No. 2 preseason ranking is the highest for the Tigers since being ranked No. 1 to start the 1959 season. The Tigers return 15 starters, including eight on defense, from last year's squad that posted an 11-2 overall mark and finished the season ranked No. 3 in the nation following a 41-14 win over Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl. The Mississippi State contest also marks the start of year No. 3 for the Tigers under Miles. In two years under Miles, the Tigers have won 22 of 26 games and finished ranked among the top five teams in the nation both times. LSU brings a seven-game overall winning streak into the Mississippi State contest as the Tigers last loss came on Oct. 7 of last year against Florida, 23-10, in Gainesville. The seven-game winning streak currently ranks as the nation's fifth-longest streak. LSU QB **Matt Flynn** will make his first regular-season start against the Bulldogs after serving as the Tiger backup for the past three years. Flynn, a fifth-year senior, is 1-0 as starting quarterback, guiding the Tigers to a 40-3 win over ninth-ranked Miami in the 2005 Peach Bowl in his only start at LSU. Other offensive standouts for the Tigers include WR **Early Doucet** (103 rec., 1,418 yards, 15 TDs for his career) and RB **Jacob Hester** (677 rushing yards, 14 overall TDs for his career). Defensively, DT **Glenn Dorsey** and DE **Tyson Jackson** headline a group that has given up just 13.4 points and 254.8 yards per game in two years (26 games) under defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini**. LSU's offensive will be directed by former BYU and Louisiana Tech head coach **Gary Crowton**.

Tigers Ride Russell's Arm and Stingy Defense To 11-2 Mark in 2006

Behind the arm of quarterback JaMarcus Russell and a defense that rated among the best in the nation, the Tigers roared to an 11-2 overall mark and a final national ranking of No. 3 in 2006. Coupled with its 11-2 record in 2005, LSU won at least 10 games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in school history. The Tigers capped the 2006 season with a 41-14 win over Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl. Other big wins for LSU in 2006 include a 28-24 road win over No. 8 Tennessee and a 31-26 win over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock. LSU's only two losses in 2006 came on the road, falling to then No. 3 Auburn, 7-3, and then dropping a 23-10 to eventual national champion Florida.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Les Miles' first two years with the Tigers have been unmatched in the history of the program. The results are impressive and staggering: 22 wins; 13 SEC victories; eight wins over top 25 teams; five wins over top 10 teams; back-to-back top five final rankings; two bowl victories, including one BCS bowl win; 12 NFL Draft picks and four first-team All-Americans.

After leading LSU to an 11-2 mark and a top five national ranking in his first year as LSU's head coach in 2005, many wondered just what Miles would do for an encore. His second year with the Tigers proved to be another year full of milestones and firsts as he guided the Tigers to another 11-2 overall record, culminating with a 41-14 dismantling of 11th-ranked Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

The Tigers finished their second year under the direction of Miles ranked No. 3 in the nation, marking the first time since the 1958-59 seasons that LSU was ranked in the top five in the country in back-to-back years.

LSU's at-large berth in a BCS bowl was a first in school history and it also represented the third time this decade that the Tigers ended their season in the Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, Miles became the first coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to back-to-back 10-wins seasons and with 22 victories in his first 26 games as the school's head coach, his win total matched Bernie Moore for the most in school history over that span. He also became the first LSU coach since Jerry Stovall in 1982 to beat two top 10-ranked teams on the road in the same season as the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee in Knoxville followed by a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock.

The Tigers were able to accomplish all of this during the 2006 season despite having to face four top eight opponents on the road, also a first in school history. LSU posted a 2-2 mark in those road games, which included November wins over Tennessee and Arkansas that propelled the Tigers to a berth in a BCS bowl.

LSU opened the 2006 season in grand style, posting identical 45-3 wins over Louisiana-Lafayette and Arizona. After a gut-wrenching 7-3 loss at No. 3 Auburn, the Tigers reeled off decisive wins over both Tulane (49-7) and Mississippi State (48-17). Following a 23-10 setback to eventual national champion Florida, the Tigers responded with seven-straight wins to end the season, starting with a 49-0 victory over a Kentucky team who went on to win eight games and beat Clemson in a bowl game.

The Tigers capped the 2006 season with its 41-14 win over an overmatched Notre Dame team in the Sugar Bowl, giving the Tigers their third win in a BCS game since the 2001 season. The three wins for the Tigers in BCS bowl games since the 2000 season is the most of any SEC team during that span.

With a 6-2 SEC mark in 2006, Miles ran his record in conference games to 13-3, which trails only Bernie Moore as the best start for an LSU head coach in league games in school history. Moore won 15 of his first 16 conference games from 1934-36.

With a makeshift offensive line that featured three first-time starters and a pair of true freshmen running backs having to plug holes in a depleted backfield, the Tigers still managed to lead the SEC in total offense (411 yards per game) and scoring offense (33.7 points per game), while ranking No. 2 in the league in rushing offense (165 yards per game). Defensively, (the Tigers, despite losing three defensive linemen to the NFL Draft from the year before), ranked among the top four in the nation in scoring defense, total defense and pass defense.

In all, the Tigers fashioned its 11-2 record against seven teams who went on to play in bowl games as LSU's schedule was ranked as the 12th toughest in the nation according to the NCAA.

Even though the Tigers had to go on the road to face four top 10-ranked teams in 2006, year two under Miles seemed somewhat ordinary compared to what the Tigers had to endure during his first year in Baton Rouge.

In Miles' inaugural season at LSU he led the Tigers to only the third 11-win season in school history, to a top five national ranking and a berth in the SEC Championship Game despite numerous distractions that covered most of the months of September and October.

The Tigers, playing without starting quarterback and future No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick JaMarcus Russell, put an exclamation point on the year with a 40-3 win over No. 9 Miami in the Peach Bowl to finish with an 11-2 overall mark and a No. 5 national ranking.

To appreciate just how adverse the conditions that Miles and the Tigers had to overcome in 2005, you have to go back to late August and Hurricane Katrina, the first of two storms to devastate the state of Louisiana during the fall.

Days before LSU's originally scheduled season opener against North Texas in Tiger Stadium, Hurricane Katrina blew ashore, packing tremendous winds, and turned the state, in particular New Orleans and southeastern Louisiana, upside down.

Massive flooding followed in the wake of the storm as more than 30 LSU players had their families and their homes affected by the hurricane and Miles' first game in Tiger Stadium against North Texas was postponed. With the LSU campus serving as the recovery center for those sick, homeless and displaced due to Hurricane Katrina, football seemed to be the farthest thing from most people's minds. However, Miles was able to successfully manage a delicate situation, one that saw his team and coaching staff volunteer time to those in need, while still attempting to focus on football for at least two hours a day.

After a week of trying to minimize the distractions for a football team that had their apartments and dorm rooms filled with displaced family members and friends due to the storm, it appeared that the Tigers would finally get to play a home game, this time against 15th-ranked Arizona State.

Still, with many in Louisiana under the distress of Hurricane Katrina, the Tigers were going to have to take to the desert to face a powerful offense in their first game of the season.

These were certainly trying times for everyone in the state of Louisiana, but even more so for a football coach who now had his team carrying the banner for a state in need of a diversion. LSU football had become a release for those consumed with the hurricane. LSU even re-stated its team goals, putting playing for the state of Louisiana at the top of the list.

The Tigers didn't disappoint as Miles and his LSU team used a 28-point fourth quarter rally to come back to beat Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe. Now with the Arizona State game behind them, it looked as if things for the LSU football team would gradually get back to normal as the Tigers now had a week off before facing Tennessee in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 24.

Then, the unthinkable happened. Another storm, this one named Rita, hit southwest Louisiana, causing severe damage to more homes, leaving thousands without electricity and displacing even more Louisiana natives. The combination of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita forced LSU to again shuffle its schedule. Instead of playing Tennessee on a Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers would now be forced to face the Volunteers on a Monday night. An emotionally drained LSU team saw a 21-0 halftime lead evaporate into a 30-27 overtime loss against the Vols.

Miles became the only coach in his first year in the SEC to lead his squad to the league's title game. He also became the first coach in LSU history to beat Alabama, Auburn and Florida in the same season.

Following a loss to Georgia in the league's title game, Miles and the Tigers re-grouped, this time to beat No. 9 Miami, 40-3, in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win gave the Tigers 11 victories for the year, making Miles the winningest first-year coach in school history.

Miles, the 2002 Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year and former assistant with Michigan, Colorado and the Dallas Cowboys who built Oklahoma State into a force in the Big 12, became LSU's 32nd head football coach on Jan. 3, 2005.

During his two years with the Tigers, Miles has put together a 22-4 overall mark, while leading LSU to a 13-3 conference record. LSU has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft over the past two years, including a school-record four in the first round in 2007, which included the No. 1 overall pick in Russell. In addition, LSU has had four players earn first-team All-America status under Miles.

Tigers Open 2007 Season On Thursday Night Against Mississippi State

LSU will get its 2007 season off to a fast start as the second-ranked Tigers travel to face Southeastern Conference opponent Mississippi State on ESPN's nationally televised Thursday night contest. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. in Starkville. The game will mark the first time the Tigers will play a regular-season, non-Holiday Thursday night game.

Tigers Making Debut On ESPN's Thursday Night Telecast

LSU will be making its 50th appearance on ESPN when the Tigers face Mississippi State on Thursday night. However, it will mark LSU's debut on ESPN's Thursday night telecast. LSU is 29-20 all-time on ESPN (does not include a 13-4 mark on ESPN2). ESPN has been kind to the Tigers as LSU's won nine straight games on the network, a streak that dates back to the 2002 season. LSU's last loss on ESPN came on Nov. 16, 2002 when the Tigers dropped a 31-0 decision to Alabama in Tiger Stadium. LSU hasn't lost an ESPN-televvised road game since a 26-18 setback to Tennessee on Sept. 29, 2001.

LSU Starts 114th Season Of Football On Thursday

LSU opens its 114th season of football on Thursday against Mississippi State. In its 113 years of football, the Tigers have posted a 680-376-47 overall mark. They've won two national titles, nine SEC titles and appeared in 37 bowl games. LSU is currently riding the most successful stretch of football in school history. Since the 2000 season, LSU has won 70 games, claimed a pair of SEC titles (2001, 2003) and won the 2003 BCS National title. The 70 wins over the past seven seasons is the most by LSU during any 7-year stretch in school history.

LSU Starts 2007 Ranked No. 2 In The Nation

LSU opens the 2007 season ranked No. 2 in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the Associated Press Top 25. The No. 2 ranking is the highest preseason rating for the Tigers since 1959 when LSU was ranked No. 1 by the AP. The No. 2 ranking in the coaches poll is the highest preseason ranking for the Tigers since the inception of that poll in 1982. LSU finished the 2006 season ranked No. 3 in both polls following its 41-14 win over Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

LSU To Open Season Against Conference Foe For First Time Since 1991

LSU's season-opener against Mississippi State will mark the first time since 1991 that the Tigers will face a league opponent in their first game of the year. In 1991, LSU dropped a 31-10 decision to Georgia in Athens in what was the first game of the Curley Hallman era for the Tigers. In all, the Tigers have opened a season against a conference opponent 12 times in the modern era (SEC era) and LSU is 4-6-2 in those games. LSU In Season-Openers

LSU brings an 80-28-5 overall mark in season-openers into the Mississippi State game. The Tigers have won four straight and 10 of their last 11 season-openers. LSU's only season-opening loss over the past 11 years came at Virginia Tech by a 26-8 count in 2002. Last year, the Tigers rolled to a 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette to open the season.

Miles In Season Openers

LSU coach Les Miles is 3-3 in season openers in his six previous years as a head coach. Miles is 2-0 in season openers at LSU, beating Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe in 2005 followed by a 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette last year.

Early Start

The August 30 season opener for the Tigers equals the earlier LSU has ever played a football game. The other time LSU opened a season this early came in 2003 when the Tigers beat Louisiana-Monroe, 49-7, in Tiger Stadium. LSU went on to claim the BCS National Championship that year, posting a 13-1 record, which included a 21-14 win over Oklahoma in the national title game.

Miles And LSU To Open Season On Road For Second Time In Three Years

It wasn't supposed to be this way, but LSU coach Les Miles will lead the Tigers into a season-opener on the road for the second time in three years. Hurricane Katrina postponed LSU's 2005 season opener against North Texas, which was scheduled to be played in Tiger Stadium. Instead, LSU was forced to open the Miles era on the road against Arizona State. LSU used a fourth-quarter rally to beat the Sun Devils, 35-31. LSU was originally scheduled to open this season at home against Middle Tennessee State, however, the opportunity to play the season-opener on Thursday night on national television was too much for the Tigers to pass up. As a result, a shift in the schedule was made and the Tigers and Bulldogs will square off on ESPN's Thursday Night Football in the season opener, while the game against Middle Tennessee will come on Sept. 15 in Tiger Stadium.

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

Here are some notable trends for LSU in the 26 games its played under head coach Les Miles ... The Tigers are 20-0 when rushing for 100 yards or more ... LSU is 3-0 on the road during night games ... The Tigers are 17-1 when leading after the first quarter with the only loss during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005 ... LSU is 19-1 when scoring 20 or more points and 16-1 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 13-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing.

Tigers Bring 7-Game Winning Streak Into State Contest

LSU brings a 7-game overall winning streak into the Mississippi State contest. LSU won its final seven games a year ago, which includes victories over No. 5 Arkansas, No. 8 Tennessee and No.11 Notre Dame. LSU hasn't lost a game since a 23-10 setback to Florida on Oct. 7 in Gainesville. The 7-game winning streak ties with Florida as the nation's fifth-longest current streak. Boise State's 13-game winning streak ranks first, followed by BYU (10), Wisconsin (9) and TCU (8).

In The Polls

LSU goes into the 2007 season riding a streak of being ranked among the top 25 teams in the nation for 68 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll and for 67 straight weeks in AP poll. The last time LSU failed to make the top 25 in either poll came following the Tigers loss to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl to conclude the 2002 season.

Miles Is 13-3 In SEC Games

LSU coach Les Miles goes into the Mississippi State game with a 13-3 mark in SEC games. Miles was 7-1 in 2005 in conference games followed by a 6-2 record a year ago. Miles is 6-2 in SEC road games and 7-1 in league games played in Tiger Stadium.

Flynn To Make First Regular Season Start And SEC Debut Against Mississippi State

Fifth-year senior QB Matt Flynn will make his first regular season and thus his first SEC start against Mississippi State. Flynn has started one game during his career, LSU's 40-3 win over Miami in the 2005 Peach Bowl. However, the Mississippi State contest will mark the first time he's started a game during the regular season. For his career, Flynn has taken snaps at quarterback in 17 games, including six appearances at the position in 2006. Dorsey In Line For Special Season

Last spring DT Glenn Dorsey opted to return to LSU for his senior season, turning down what would have surely been a first round pick in the NFL Draft. As a result, Dorsey is now in line to get his college degree, while also being put in a position to contend for some of college football's most prestigious awards. ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit has already called Dorsey, "the best player in college football," heading into 2007. Dorsey has been listed on every preseason All-America team and has been rated as the best defensive tackle in the nation by several publications. Last year, Dorsey earned First-Team All-America honors after anchoring an LSU defense that ranked among the top five in the nation in yards allowed and scoring. LSU Is 7-2 In Road Games Under Miles

LSU brings an overall record of 7-2 in road contests under Les Miles into the Mississippi State game. LSU was 2-2 on the road last year after going 5-0 away from Tiger Stadium in 2005. Of LSU's seven road wins under Miles, four have come against teams ranked in the top 15 with three of those coming against top 10 ranked teams. LSU's top 10 road wins under Miles include a 16-13 victory over No. 3 Alabama in 2005; a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee and a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in 2006.

First Quarter Dominance.... Will It Continue In 2007

One big reason for LSU's success last year was its ability to take control of the contest early. Last year, the Tigers outscored their opponents 136 to 27 in the first quarter and 240 to 87 in the first half. LSU didn't allow a single point in the first quarter of a game last year until the sixth contest of the year when Florida scored with 11 seconds remaining in the opening frame. In all, LSU held nine of its 12 opponents without a point in the first quarter a year ago.

The Bo Pelini "D"

Since taking over as defensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2005, defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini** has put a unit on the field that rarely allows opponents to reach the 20-point mark. In 26 games with Pelini as its defensive coordinator, LSU has held 21 opponents to fewer than 20 points. In addition, 13 of LSU's 26 opponents (50 percent) failed to score more than 10 points. Last year, LSU limited seven of its 13 opponents to 10 points or less, including holding Kentucky scoreless, Arizona to 3 points, Fresno State to 6 points, and Auburn to 7 points.

Double-Trouble At Corner

LSU cornerbacks **Chevis Jackson** and **Jonathan Zenon** are back as returning starters at cornerback for the Tigers in 2006. The duo has started opposite each other at the cornerback position for 13 straight games. Last year, Jackson and Zenon combined for 6 interceptions for an LSU defense that ranked No. 1 in the SEC and No. 3 in the nation in pass defense.

A New Starter At Free Safety For The Tigers

With **LaRon Landry** taking his game to the NFL, LSU will have a new starter at the free safety position for the first time since the 2003 season when the Tigers face Mississippi State. **Curtis Taylor**, a junior, will start at free safety against the Bulldogs, snapping a streak of 48 games in which the same player (**LaRon Landry**) started at that position for the Tigers.

Running Back By Committee Approach

The Tigers will once again take the running back-by-committee approach into the season opener as LSU has four players at the position who could see action against Mississippi State. Senior **Jacob Hester** is expected to start at running back, but sophomores **Keiland Williams** and **Charles Scott** along with redshirt freshman **Richard Murphy** will action see action in the backfield.

Double-Duty Tigers

Three members of the LSU football team also participate in other sports on campus. Wide receiver **Jared Mitchell** and defensive back **Chad Jones** are on the baseball team, while wide out/return specialist **Trindon Holliday** is on the track team. Here's a look at how these players fared while competing in their "other" sport:

Trindon Holliday - sprinter - track and field

Established himself as one of the nation's premier sprinters on the track with his outstanding performance in the spring. He earned a pair of All-America honors at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in June. He finished as the NCAA runner-up in the 100-meter dash after ripping up the track with a time of 10.06 seconds in the final while also anchoring the Tigers' fearsome 4x100-meter relay team to a second-place finish with a seasonal best time of 38.85. In addition, Holliday etched his name in the record books with his performance as he shattered the school record in the 100-meter dash with a seasonal best time of 10.02, eclipsing the mark of 10.09 set by LSU great and former two-sport standout **Xavier Carter** in 2006.

Jared Mitchell - centerfield - baseball

Last year as a true freshman, Mitchell started 55 games at centerfield for the Tiger baseball team, batting .258 (54-of-209) with eight doubles, a triple, three homers and 21 RBI. He also became the first freshman since 1998 to lead the team in steals with 18. The stolen bases put him fourth in the SEC in that department and represented the most by an LSU player since 2004. Mitchell, the 10th-round selection of the Minnesota Twins in the 2006 Major League Draft, was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 26.

Chad Jones - outfielder - baseball

Jones, a left-handed outfielder from Southern Lab High School, was picked in the 13th round by the Houston Astros in the 2007 Major League Draft. He will make his debut for the Tiger baseball team this spring.

D-Line U.

You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Drafts from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had five defensive linemen earn First-Team All-America status and seven members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. Senior defensive tackle **Glenn Dorsey** earned First-Team All-America recognition in 2006 and then opted to return to LSU for his senior season despite being projected as a first round pick in last spring's ND L Draft.

Doucet Ready To Emerge As LSU's "Go-To" Guy

LSU senior WR **Early Doucet** takes over as LSU's "go to" guy at wide receiver due to the departure of **Dwayne Bowe** and **Craig Davis**. A year ago, Doucet established himself as one of the best in the SEC, catching 59 balls for 772 yards and eight TDs. Doucet capped his junior campaign by leading the Tigers with eight catches for a career-best 115 yards in the Sugar Bowl win over Notre Dame. For his career, Doucet ranks just outside of LSU's top 10 in receptions (103), receiving yards (1,521) and TDs (15).

LSU's Been The Best In SEC Since Winning League Title In 2001

Since capturing the SEC title in 2001, the Tigers have won more games than any school in the conference over the past six seasons. Since 2001, the Tigers have recorded 62 wins, one more than Georgia. The .760 winning percentage for the Tigers away from Tiger Stadium ranks behind only Southern Cal (24-4, .857) and Boise State (21-5, .808) as the best winning percentage during that span. The Tigers have three new assistant coaches on the staff, including offensive coordinator **Gary Crowton**, who is considered one of the most innovative minds in football. Other newcomers to the staff include offensive line coach **Greg Studrawa** and receivers coach **D.J. McCarthy**.

Three Members of LSU Coaching Staff Have Wins As Division I Head Coaches

LSU is one of the few schools in the country that can lay claim to having three coaches on its staff who have picked up wins as a head coach at the Division I level. Head coach **Les Miles** has combined to win 50 games at LSU and Oklahoma State, offensive coordinator **Gary Crowton** has a combined 47 victories after stints at Louisiana Tech and BYU and defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini** won his only game as the interim head coach at Nebraska during the 2003 season.

Hester Ranks Among Best In School History At Catching Ball Out Of Backfield

When it comes to catching the ball out of the backfield, RB/FB Jacob Hester has become one of the best in school history at it. In three years with the Tigers, Hester has 48 receptions from the running back position, a figure that ranks just outside of the top six in LSU history. A year ago, Hester caught 35 passes, which ranked as the third-highest single-season total in school history. Gary James (1982-85) holds both the LSU career mark (122) and single-season record (50 in 1985) for receptions by a running back.

LSU Streaks To Make Note Of

LSU's won 7 straight games dating back to last year ... It's the longest active streak going into a season for the Tigers since 2004 when LSU brought an 8-game winning streak into the year ... CB Chevis Jackson has the longest streak of consecutive starts going into 2007 as he's started 26 straight games ... WR Early Doucet has caught at least one pass in 22 straight games.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 82nd year in the venerable stadium. LSU is also celebrating the 75th anniversary of playing under the light of Tiger Stadium. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.

• LSU has won 31 OF ITS LAST 34 games at home.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 47 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 37 times, including a school-record 92,664 for the Oct. 22, 2005 game that pitted No. 7 LSU against No. 15 Auburn. LSU won the game 20-17.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 46 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 44 of the 46 years and in the top 10 on 38 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP SIX IN THE NATION, including the last five.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 202-59-3 (.771) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 19-22-3 (.466) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

Russell Passes LSU Past Mississippi State, 48-17

LSU scored touchdowns on its first five possessions, building a 35-0 lead just 20 minutes into the contest as the ninth-ranked Tigers rolled to a 48-17 win over Mississippi State. The game was delayed 52 minutes just after halftime due to lightning. LSU led 35-3 when the game was halted with just over 10 minutes left in the third quarter. **JaMarcus Russell** completed 15 of his first 16 passes on his way to the best passing day of his career. Russell finished 18 of 20 for a career-best 330 yards and 3 TDs. Russell threw first half TD passes of 9, 37, and 6 yards. For the game, the Tigers piled up 446 yards of total offense, including 338 passing and 108 rushing. **Charles Scott**, making his first career start, rushed for 27 yards and 2 TDs for the Tigers. **Jacob Hester** led the Tigers in rushing with 49 yards and 1 TD. **Craig Davis** led LSU in receiving with 6 receptions for 101 yards and a TD, while **Dwayne Bowe** added 5 catches for 95 yards and a score. Defensively, LSU limited State to just 14 yards rushing and 226 yards of offense. LSU sacked MSU quarterbacks five times as the Tigers held the Bulldogs to 3-and-out on five of their seven first half possessions.
