Top-Ranked Tigers Set For Battle With Kentucky And One Of Nation's Top QBs

The road doesn't get any easier for LSU this week as the top-ranked Tigers travel to Lexington to face No. 17/18 Kentucky in a game that will pit one of the nation's best defenses against one of college football's top quarterbacks in Andre Woodson. Kickoff for the contest is slated for 2:34 p.m. CDT from Commonwealth Stadium. The game will be televised by CBS, the third appearance in four weeks for the Tigers on that network. The game in Lexington will mark LSU's first return to Kentucky since the Bluegrass Miracle in 2002 when Marcus Randall connected with Devery Henderson on a 75-yard TD pass as time expired in a 33-30 Tiger victory. This week's game with Kentucky will be the fourth time this year that the Tigers will face a top 20-ranked opponent. LSU brings a 6-0 overall mark into the contest following last week's thrilling 28-24 win over seventh-ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium. LSU is also 3-0 in conference play and the Tigers have now won eight straight Southeastern Conference games dating back to last season. Overall, LSU holds the nation's longest current winning streak with 13 consecutive victories to its credit. Kentucky brings a 5-1 overall mark into the contest as the Wildcats dropped their first game of the year last Thursday in falling to South Carolina by a 38-23 margin. LSU's 13 straight wins ranks as the third-longest streak in school history. It's the longest winning streak for LSU since the Tigers won a school-record 19 games in a row from 1957 to 1959. In addition, LSU's eight straight SEC victories are the most by the school since posting nine consecutive wins in league play from 1969 to 1971. The Tigers continue to rank among the best in the nation in defense as LSU is No. 1 in total defense (197.83 yards per game) and pass efficiency defense (58.50 rating), and No. 2 in scoring (9.33 points per game). Against Kentucky, the Tigers will face a Wildcat squad that is averaging 42.67 points per game, 474 yards of total offense per contest with 262 of those yards coming through the air. Individually, RB **Jacob Hester** is coming off the best game of his career, rushing for 106 yards and the game-winning TD in LSU's win over Florida. Hester leads the Tigers in rushing with 433 yards and TDs. QBs **Matt Flynn** and **Ryan Perrilloux** have combined to connect on 95 of 159 passes for 1,219 yards and 10 scores. Perrilloux has also added 166 yards and 2 rushing TDs for the Tigers. Defensively, S **Craig Steltz** leads the Tigers with 41 tackles and 4 interceptions, while DE **Kirston Pittman** is tops on the squad with 6.5 TFL and DT **Glenn Dorsey** has recorded 30 tackles and a team-best 4 sacks. As a group, LSU has 20 sacks and 11 interceptions to its credit.

Hester, Tigers Will Themselves To Win Over Florida, 28-24

In what is being called an epic battle of two college football heavyweights, LSU willed itself, behind the play of **Jacob Hester** and the gutsy play calling of **Les Miles**, to a 28-24 win over seventh-ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium. Trailing 24-14 entering fourth quarter, the Tiger offense dominated the final 15 minutes of the game, possessing the ball for 12 minutes and scoring 14 points during that final frame. LSU took its first and only lead of the contest on its last possession of the game, going 60 yards on 15 plays, capped with a 2-yard Hester TD run that put the Tigers up 28-24 with just over a minute left. LSU's defense turned away Florida on its final possession to seal the victory in front of a school-record 92,910 fans. Florida wasted little time in jumping on the Tigers, taking a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. The Tigers pulled to within 10-7 on a 1-yard run by **Ryan Perrilloux**, but the Gators answered right back to a take a 17-7 lead at halftime. The second half was all LSU as the Tigers held the powerful Gators to only seven points and just 142 yards of offense. LSU used a **Kirston Pittman** interception early in the fourth quarter to pull within 24-21 following a 4-yard pass from **Matt Flynn** to **Demetrius Byrd**. The Tigers held the Gators to a 3-and-out on their next possession setting up the game-winning drive. Hester led the Tigers with 106 yards rushing, while Flynn threw for 144 yards and a TD in the victory.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Les Miles' first two years with the Tigers have been unmatched in the history of the program. The results are impressive and staggering: 22 wins; 13 SEC victories; eight wins over top 25 teams; five wins over top 10 teams; back-to-back top five final rankings; two bowl victories, including one BCS bowl win; 12 NFL Draft picks and four first-team All-Americans.

After leading LSU to an 11-2 mark and a top five national ranking in his first year as LSU's head coach in 2005, many wondered just what Miles would do for an encore. His second year with the Tigers proved to be another year full of milestones and firsts as he guided the Tigers to another 11-2 overall record, culminating with a 41-14 dismantling of 11th-ranked Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

The Tigers finished their second year under the direction of Miles ranked No. 3 in the nation, marking the first time since the 1958-59 seasons that LSU was ranked in the top five in the country in back-to-back years.

LSU's at-large berth in a BCS bowl was a first in school history and it also represented the third time this decade that the Tigers ended their season in the Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, Miles became the first coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to back-to-back 10-wins seasons and with 22 victories in his first 26 games as the school's head coach, his win total matched Bernie Moore for the most in school history over that span. He also became the first LSU coach since Jerry Stovall in 1982 to beat two top 10-ranked teams on the road in the same season as the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee in Knoxville followed by a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock.

The Tigers were able to accomplish all of this during the 2006 season despite having to face four top eight opponents on the road, also a first in school history. LSU posted a 2-2 mark in those road games, which included November wins over Tennessee and Arkansas that propelled the Tigers to a berth in a BCS bowl.

LSU opened the 2006 season in grand style, posting identical 45-3 wins over Louisiana-Lafayette and Arizona. After a gut-wrenching 7-3 loss at No. 3 Auburn, the Tigers reeled off decisive wins over both Tulane (49-7) and Mississippi State (48-17). Following a 23-10 setback to eventual national champion Florida, the Tigers responded with seven-straight wins to end the season, starting with a 49-0 victory over a Kentucky team who went on to win eight games and beat Clemson in a bowl game.

The Tigers capped the 2006 season with its 41-14 win over an overmatched Notre Dame team in the Sugar Bowl, giving the Tigers their third win in a BCS game since the 2001 season. The three wins for the Tigers in BCS bowl games since the 2000 season is the most of any SEC team during that span.

With a 6-2 SEC mark in 2006, Miles ran his record in conference games to 13-3, which trails only Bernie Moore as the best start for an LSU head coach in league games in school history. Moore won 15 of his first 16 conference games from 1934-36.

With a makeshift offensive line that featured three first-time starters and a pair of true freshmen running backs having to plug holes in a depleted backfield, the Tigers still managed to lead the SEC in total offense (411 yards per game) and scoring offense (33.7 points per game), while ranking No. 2 in the league in rushing offense (165 yards per game). Defensively, (the Tigers, despite losing three defensive linemen to the NFL Draft from the year before), ranked among the top four in the nation in scoring defense, total defense and pass defense.

In all, the Tigers fashioned its 11-2 record against seven teams who went on to play in bowl games as LSU's schedule was ranked as the 12th toughest in the nation according to the NCAA.

Even though the Tigers had to go on the road to face four top 10-ranked teams in 2006, year two under Miles seemed somewhat ordinary compared to what the Tigers had to endure during his first year in Baton Rouge.

In Miles' inaugural season at LSU he led the Tigers to only the third 11-win season in school history, to a top five national ranking and a berth in the SEC Championship Game despite numerous distractions that covered most of the months of September and October.

The Tigers, playing without starting quarterback and future No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick JaMarcus Russell, put an exclamation point on the year with a 40-3 win over No. 9 Miami in the Peach Bowl to finish with an 11-2 overall mark and a No. 5 national ranking.

To appreciate just how adverse the conditions that Miles and the Tigers had to overcome in 2005, you have to go back to late August and Hurricane Katrina, the first of two storms to devastate the state of Louisiana during the fall.

Days before LSU's originally scheduled season opener against North Texas in Tiger Stadium, Hurricane Katrina blew ashore, packing tremendous winds, and turned the state, in particular New Orleans and southeastern Louisiana, upside down.

Massive flooding followed in the wake of the storm as more than 30 LSU players had their families and their homes affected by the hurricane and Miles' first game in Tiger Stadium against North Texas was postponed. With the LSU campus serving as the recovery center for those sick, homeless and displaced due to Hurricane Katrina, football seemed to be the farthest thing from most people's minds. However, Miles was able to successfully manage a delicate situation, one that saw his team and coaching staff volunteer time to those in need, while still attempting to focus on football for at least two hours a day.

After a week of trying to minimize the distractions for a football team that had their apartments and dorm rooms filled with displaced family members and friends due to the storm, it appeared that the Tigers would finally get to play a home game, this time against 15th-ranked Arizona State.

Still, with many in Louisiana under the distress of Hurricane Katrina, the Tigers were going to have to take to the desert to face a powerful offense in their first game of the season.

These were certainly trying times for everyone in the state of Louisiana, but even more so for a football coach who now had his team carrying the banner for a state in need of a diversion. LSU football had become a release for those consumed with the hurricane. LSU even re-stated its team goals, putting playing for the state of Louisiana at the top of the list.

The Tigers didn't disappoint as Miles and his LSU team used a 28-point fourth quarter rally to come back to beat Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe. Now with the Arizona State game behind them, it looked as if things for the LSU football team would gradually get back to normal as the Tigers now had a week off before facing Tennessee in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 24.

Then, the unthinkable happened. Another storm, this one named Rita, hit southwest Louisiana, causing severe damage to more homes, leaving thousands without electricity and displacing even more Louisiana natives. The combination of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita forced LSU to again shuffle its schedule. Instead of playing Tennessee on a Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers would now be forced to face the Volunteers on a Monday night. An emotionally drained LSU team saw a 21-0 halftime lead evaporate into a 30-27 overtime loss against the Vols.

Miles became the only coach in his first year in the SEC to lead his squad to the league's title game. He also became the first coach in LSU history to beat Alabama, Auburn and Florida in the same season.

Following a loss to Georgia in the league's title game, Miles and the Tigers re-grouped, this time to beat No. 9 Miami, 40-3, in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win gave the Tigers 11 victories for the year, making Miles the winningest first-year coach in school history.

Miles, the 2002 Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year and former assistant with Michigan, Colorado and the Dallas Cowboys who built Oklahoma State into a force in the Big 12, became LSU's 32nd head football coach on Jan. 3, 2005.

During his two years with the Tigers, Miles has put together a 22-4 overall mark, while leading LSU to a 13-3 conference record. LSU has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft over the past two years, including a school-record four in the first round in 2007, which included the No. 1 overall pick in Russell. In addition, LSU has had four players earn first-team All-America status under Miles.

LSU Set For Bluegrass Battle Against Kentucky

LSU returns to Lexington for the first time since the Bluegrass Miracle in 2002 on Saturday when the top-ranked Tigers face No. 17/18 Kentucky at 2:34 p.m. CDT. The game will be carried to a national audience by CBS. LSU brings the nation's longest winning streak at 13 straight games as well as a 6-0 overall mark into the contest. LSU is 3-0 in league play with two of the wins coming against SEC Eastern Division foes - beat South Carolina, 28-16; beat Florida, 28-24. The last time LSU and Kentucky both came into the game ranked came in 1984 when the Tigers were No. 10 and the Wildcats were No. 16. LSU won that game, 36-10, in Lexington. This year's contest will mark only the third time that both teams go into the game ranked. The other time came in 1977 when No. 12 Kentucky posted a 33-13 win over No. 16 LSU in Tiger Stadium.

In the Polls - Tigers Now No. 1 In All Three

For the first time in school history, LSU is ranked as the nation's No.1 team in all three major polls this week. The Tigers, behind their 28-24 win over Florida, are the unanimous No. 1 pick in both the AP Poll and the Harris Interactive Poll. LSU recorded 58 of a possible 60 first place votes (Ohio State got the other 2) in the USA Today Coaches Poll. LSU has now been ranked 74 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll and for 73 straight weeks in AP poll. The last time LSU failed to make the top 25 in either poll came following the Tigers loss to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl to conclude the 2002 season.

LSU Now 13-1 In Games Played As No. 1 Ranked Team

With its win over Florida, LSU improved its record to 13-1 in games played as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. The Florida contest marked the first time since the 1959 season that LSU played a football game as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Prior to last week, the last time LSU was ranked No. 1 in the nation in any poll came at the conclusion of the 2003 season when the Tigers beat Oklahoma to claim the BCS national title. As a result, LSU was ranked No. 1 in the final USA Today Coaches Poll that year.

Who's In And Who's Out

LSU DT **Charles Alexander** will miss the rest of the season after suffering a knee injury in a non-contact drill in practice on Sept. 20 ... WR **Early Doucet** has missed LSU's last four games with an undisclosed injury ... LSU coach **Les Miles** said he is "cautiously optimistic" that Doucet would play this week against Kentucky ... LSU OG **Will Arnold** has missed LSU's last four games with an infection and will not play this week against Kentucky.

Hester Named SEC Offensive Player of the Week and National POW By Sporting News

LSU RB **Jacob Hester** earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week and National Player of the Week honors from the Sporting News for his performance in the Tigers' 28-24 win over Florida. In the win over the Gators, Hester rushed for a career-high 106 yards and scored the game-winning TD with just over a minute left. The 106 yards came on a career-best 23 attempts and he averaged 4.6 yards per carry against a Florida defense that entered the game allowing just 63 yards per contest. Down 24-21 late in the fourth quarter, LSU was forced to go for it on fourth down twice and they put the ball in Hester's hands both times, converting both times. In all, Hester carried the ball eight times on LSU's final possession, a drive that consumed 60 yards on 15 plays and took just over eight minutes. In the fourth quarter alone, the Tigers held the ball for 12 minutes, outscored Florida 14-0 and outgained the Gators, 130-37. Of Hester's 106 rushing yards, 77 came in the second half with 39 of those yards coming in the fourth quarter. Hester also became the first LSU back to go over 100 yards in an SEC game since Joseph Addai had 105 yards against Auburn in 2005.

Another Fourth Quarter Comeback Under Les Miles

LSU's rally from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit against Florida marked the sixth time under **Les Miles** that the Tigers have come from behind in the final quarter to win a game. The following is a look at LSU's fourth quarter comebacks under Miles and how many points the Tigers had to overcome in the final frame to win the game:

Tigers Off To Best Start Since 1973

With its win over Florida, LSU ran its record to 6-0 overall, which is the best start for the Tigers since the 1973 squad won its first nine games. That team went on to post a 9-3 overall mark. In its history, LSU has started 6-0 only eight times, which includes this year.

LSU Off To Best SEC Start Since 2002

LSU moved to 3-0 in the SEC for the first time since 2002 with the win over Florida. LSU hasn't been 4-0 in conference place since 1987 when the Tigers beat Florida, Georgia, Kentucky and Ole Miss to open league play. In 2002, Auburn handed LSU its first loss after the Tigers started 3-0.

LSU Is 9-2 In Road Games Under Miles

LSU brings an overall road record of 9-2 under **Les Miles** into the Kentucky game. LSU was 2-2 on the road last year after going 5-0 away from Tiger Stadium in 2005. The Tigers are 2-0 away from Tiger Stadium this year, beating Mississippi State in the season-opener followed by a 34-9 win over Tulane in week 5. Of LSU's nine road wins under Miles, four have come against teams ranked in the top 15 with three of those coming against top 10 ranked teams. LSU's top 10 road wins under Miles include a 16-13 victory over No. 3 Alabama in 2005; a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee and a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in 2006.

LSU Also Among Nation's Best Away From Home Since 2003

In addition to being the best in the SEC in terms of wins since 2001, the Tigers have also earned the distinction of being among the best in the nation away from home since the 2003 season. Since 2003, the Tigers have posted a 21-6 (.778) overall mark, which includes away games and neutral site contests. The .760 winning percentage for the Tigers away from Tiger Stadium ranks behind only Southern Cal (26-4, .867) and Auburn (18-5, .783) as the best winning percentage during that span. It's Like Backyard Ball When It Comes To Fourth Downs For LSU - Go For It

It's been like backyard football when it comes to going for it on fourth down this year for the Tigers. LSU is a perfect 6-for-6 on fourth down opportunities this year, and dating back to last year, the Tigers have successfully converted eight straight fourth down attempts. LSU currently leads the nation in fourth down percentage at 100.0 success rate. Last week against Florida, the Tigers went for it on fourth down five times and were successful on each attempt. To put LSU's 5-5 fourth-down conversions against Florida in perspective, the Tigers only had a total of four fourth-down conversions during the entire 2004 season, three in 1998, four in 1997, three in 1996.

Tigers Stretch Overall Winning Streak To 13 Straight; Ranks As Nation's Longest Streak

LSU ran its overall winning streak to 13 straight games with its 28-24 win over Florida. The 13-game streak, which started a year ago with a 49-0 win over Kentucky in Tiger Stadium, now ranks as the nation's longest thanks to Wisconsin's loss on Saturday. LSU won its final seven games a year ago, which included victories over No. 5 Arkansas, No. 8 Tennessee and No. 11 Notre Dame. LSU hasn't lost a game since a 23-10 setback to Florida on Oct. 7 in Gainesville. The 13-game streak is also the longest for LSU since winning a school-record 19, straight games during the 1957-59 seasons. The following is a look at the longest winning streaks in school history:

LSU Stretches Tiger Stadium Winning Streak To 17

LSU ran its Tiger Stadium winning streak to 17 straight with its victory over Florida. The 17-game Tiger Stadium winning streak ranks as the nation's longest current streak since Southern Cal had its 35-game winning streak snapped by Stanford on Saturday. In addition to its 17-game winning streak at home, LSU has also won 27 of its last 28 games in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss at home came against Tennessee on Sept. 26, 2005, a Monday night. LSU hasn't lost a Saturday game in Tiger Stadium since a 19-7 setback to Florida on Oct. 11, 2003. To take it a step further, LSU hasn't dropped a Saturday night game at home since a 31-0 defeat to Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002, a streak that stretches 24 consecutive Saturday night games. The 17 straight wins in Tiger Stadium ranks as the second longest streak in school history and the longest since winning a school-record 17 straight in Tiger Stadium from 1935-37.

LSU To Go For Sweep vs. SEC Eastern Division

LSU will go for a sweep of its SEC Eastern Division foes for the first time since the 2002 season when the Tigers beat Florida, South Carolina and Kentucky. LSU has won this year against South Carolina and Florida. Since going to divisional format in 1992, LSU has posted a perfect mark against the SEC Eastern Division twice, in 1997 and 2002. LSU coach Les Miles has a 6-3 mark against SEC Eastern Division teams. LSU is 24-26-1 all-time against the SEC Eastern Division, which includes an 18-8 mark since 2000.

LSU To Face Another Ranked Opponent

LSU will face its four ranked opponent on Saturday against Kentucky. LSU, which has won six straight against ranked teams, is 3-0 against Top 25 opponents this year. This year, LSU has wins over then-No. 9 Virginia Tech, 48-7, in week 2; a 28-16 win over then-No. 12 South Carolina in week 4; and a 28-24 win over then-No. 7 Florida in week 6. Since taking over at LSU, Les Miles has a 10-4 mark in games against Top 25 teams.

LSU Defense Best In Nation Thru 6 Games - Tigers Lead Nation In 2 Categories, No.2 In Another

LSU ranked No. 1 in more than just the polls as the Tigers have arguably the No. 1 defense in the nation. The Tigers, for the fourth straight week, lead the nation in total defense (197.83 yards per game) and pass efficiency defense (58.5 rating). LSU is also No. 2 in the country in scoring defense, allowing just 9.33 points per game; No. 3 in pass defense (139.33 yards per game) and No. 4 in rushing defense (58.5 yards per game).

All-Time Tiger Stadium Top 10 Matchups

The LSU-Florida contest marked the 12th time in the history of Tiger Stadium, and the second time this year, that a pair of top 10 teams squared off in Death Valley. LSU is 8-3-1 all-time in those top 10 clashes in Tiger Stadium, which includes a 2-1 mark under Les Miles. The following is a look at the Top 10 matchups in Tiger Stadium:

LSU Defense Stingy Against The Run

In addition to not allowing many points this year, the Tigers have also become stingy when it comes to rushing yards as the Tigers have allowed only 351 yards rushing on 183 attempts this year. That's an average of 1.9 yards per carry. For the first time this year, LSU allowed a team to reach the 100-yard mark in net rushing yards against Florida as the Gators accumulated 156 yards against the Tigers. Under defensive coordinator Bo Pelini, the Tigers have held 22 of their 32 opponents to less than 100 net rushing yards. LSU is 19-3 in those games with the losses coming to Tennessee in 2005 and Auburn and Florida in 2006.

Observations And Did You Knows About This Year's LSU Football Team

LSU has allowed only 8 trips into the redzone this year (1 by Va. Tech, 3 by South Carolina, 1 by Tulane, 3 by Florida) ... LSU is 30-of-32 in redzone opportunities this year, while the opposition is just 8-for-8 in those chances ... In 75 possessions by its opponents, LSU has held the opposition to less than 10 total yards in 41 of those 75 possessions ... LSU opponents have also gone 3-and-out in 32 of its 75 possessions.

First Quarter Dominance Continues Into 2007

One big reason for LSU's success last year was its ability to take control of the contest early. Last year, the Tigers outscored their opponents 136 to 27 in the first quarter and 240 to 87 in the first half. LSU didn't allow a single point in the first quarter of a game last year until the sixth contest of the year when Florida scored with 11 seconds remaining in the opening frame. In all, LSU held nine of its 12 opponents without a point in the first quarter a year ago. This year, LSU has outscored its opponents 41-10 in the first quarter and 102-33 in the first half.

The Bo Pelini "D"

Since taking over as defensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2005, defensive coordinator Bo Pelini has put a unit on the field that rarely allows opponents to reach the 20-point mark. In 32 games with Pelini as its defensive coordinator, LSU has held 26 opponents to fewer than 20 points. In addition, 17 of LSU's 31 opponents (55 percent) failed to score more than 10 points. Last year, LSU limited seven of its 13 opponents to 10 points or less, including holding Kentucky scoreless, Arizona to 3 points, Fresno State to 6 points, and Auburn to 7 points. Pelini's defenses have also recorded four shutouts over the past 2-plus seasons, including two this year.

LSU's Been Dominating In First Quarters Under Miles In Tiger Stadium

In the 18 home games the Tigers have played under Les Miles, only 3 teams (Alabama in 2006, South Carolina and Florida 2007) have scored points on LSU in the first quarter. In all, LSU has outscored its opposition 174 -17 in the first quarter of its 18 home games under Miles since the start of the 2005 season.

LSU "D" Has Held Opponents Scoreless In 19 Of Last 26 Quarters

Dating back to last year's Notre Dame contest, LSU has held its opponent scoreless in 19 of the last 26 quarters in which they have played. That streak included holding opponents scores in 17 of 24 quarters this year. The Tigers have allowed just 10 first quarter points this year and a total of 33 first half points. Only three teams - Florida (17 points), Tulane (9 points) and South Carolina (7 points) are the only teams to score on LSU in the first half this year. Florida's 17 first half points were the most scored on the Tigers since Georgia's 21 points in the SEC Championship game in 2005.

LSU's Defense Has Only Allowed 8 Redzone Opportunities This Year

In five games and 24 quarters of football this year, LSU's defense has allowed only three teams (Va. Tech, South Carolina, Tulane, Florida) to penetrate into the redzone. The Hokies were 1-of-1 in their redzone opportunities against the Tigers; South Carolina was 3-of-3 on its chances; Tulane was 1-of-1 and Florida was 3-of-3. A quick look at the SEC stats show that remarkably the Tigers rank last in the league in red zone defense (it's based on percentage). However, taking a further look to explore those numbers shows that the next closest team to LSU in terms of allowing redzone penetration is Vanderbilt with 15.

Miles Now 28-4 At LSU; Best Start For A Coach In LSU History

With a 6-0 mark this year, LSU coach Les Miles ran his record with the Tigers to 28-4 overall. The 28 wins in his first 32 games is the most of any coach in school history during that span. Bernie Moore ranks second with 27 wins during his first 32 games.

Miles Is 16-3 In SEC Games

LSU coach Les Miles ran his record in SEC games to 16-3 with the win over Florida. Miles was 7-1 in 2005 in conference games followed by a 6-2 record a year ago. Miles is 7-2 in SEC road games and 9-1 in league games played in Tiger Stadium.

Miles Is 6-3 Against Top 10 Teams As LSU's Coach; He's 11-4 In Top 25 Games

With LSU's 28-24 win over No. 7/9 Florida, Les Miles ran his record against teams ranked in the top 25 to 11-4 during his two-plus years with the Tigers. Miles is 6-3 against top 10 teams at LSU, which also includes a 48-7 win over then-No. 9 Virginia Tech this year. Dating back to last season, LSU has won six straight games against top 25 teams.

Hester Does It All For Tigers

LSU senior RB Jacob Hester does it all for the Tigers. In 6 games this year, Hester has played a variety of positions for the Tigers. He's started both games at tailback, but he's also seen action at fullback as well as on LSU's punt, punt return, and PAT/field goal teams. Through four weeks of action, Hester has seen action in a total of 217 plays from scrimmage. The following is a look at Hester's play breakdown for the Tigers through two games:

Hester Goes Over 1,000-Yard Mark

LSU RB Jacob Hester ran his career rushing total to 1,004 yards against Tulane in week 5. He followed with 106 yards and a TD against Florida to run his career total to 1,110 rushing yards to go along with 13 rushing touchdowns. For his career, Hester has accounted for 1,507 total yards (1,110 rushing, 397 passing) and a total of 17 TDs (13 rushing, 6 receiving).

Steltz Has Big Night Against Florida

LSU S Craig Steltz came up with a career-best 16 tackles in LSU's win over Florida last week. Of his 16 tackles, 13 were solo. The 16 tackles by Steltz were the most by an LSU player since the 2002 season when LB Bradie James had 18 against Arkansas that year. The 16 tackles also moved Steltz's season total to 41, which is tops on the squad.

Flynn Passes For Career-High 258 Yards In Win Over Tulane

LSU QB Matt Flynn threw for a career-best 258 yards on 16 of 29 passing against Tulane. Flynn, despite being sacked six times against the Green Wave, had his best passing game yardage wise of his career. Flynn's previous best was a 217-yard effort in week 2 against Virginia Tech. For the year, Flynn has connected on 53 of 94 passes for 673 yards, 3 TDs and only 2 interceptions.

Holliday The Speedster Makes Most Of His Touches; He Averages 9.3 Yards Per Touch

LSU RB/RS Trindon Holliday doesn't get many touches during a game, but he sure makes them count when he does get his hands on the ball. In week 5 against South Carolina, Holliday rushed for 73 yards on six carries, including a 33-yard TD run in the first quarter. For the game, Holliday totaled 93 all-purpose yards on a total of seven touches for an average of 13.3 yards every time he touched the ball against the Gamecocks. Holliday followed that with 3 carries for 19 yards against Tulane. For the season, Holliday has a total of 352 all-purpose yards on 38 touches for an average of 9.3 yards every time he gets his hands on the ball. Holliday has rushed for 180 yards on 28 attempts; he's caught two passes for three yards; he's returned seven kickoffs for 169 yards and one punt for zero yards.

Big Al Woods Pounces On Fumbles

LSU DT Al Woods recovered his third fumble of the season against Tulane, which ranks first in the SEC. Woods' fumble recoveries have come against Mississippi State, South Carolina and Tulane. Woods, who made his first career start against Tulane, has 7 tackles, 2 sacks and 3 fumble recoveries to his credit this year.

Perrilloux Shines In First Start

LSU QB Ryan Perrilloux stepped in for an injured Matt Flynn and directed the Tigers to a 44-0 victory over Middle Tennessee. The start was the first of Perrilloux's career. For the game, he connected on 20-of-25 passes for 298 yards and 3 scores. Steltz Continues To Lead SEC In Interceptions

LSU senior safety Craig Steltz continues to rank among the top 10 in the nation in interceptions with four to his credit. This week, Steltz ranks No. 10 in the nation. He leads the SEC in that category. Steltz opened the year by tying an LSU record with three interceptions against Mississippi State. He followed that a week later with an interception against Virginia Tech. For his career, Steltz has nine interceptions, which he has returned for 244 yards (or an average of 27.1 yards per interception).

Double Trouble At Quarterback

Through 6 games, LSU QBs Matt Flynn and Ryan Perrilloux have both shown their ability to lead the Tigers. Flynn, who is 6-0 as LSU's starting quarterback, started the first two games before giving way to Perrilloux because of an injury in week 3. In 5 games, Flynn has been responsible for 5 TDs (4 passing, 1 rushing), while Perrilloux has accounted for 8 TDs (6 passing, 2 rushing). In four games, Flynn has connected on 67 of 121 passes for 817 yards, 4 TDs and just 3 interceptions. Flynn has also rushed for 51 yards and a score for the Tigers. Perrilloux has gone 28 of 38 for 402 yards, 6 TDs and 1 interception. He's also rushed for 166 yards and a pair of touchdowns. As a duo, Flynn and Perrilloux have combined to connect on 95 of 159 passes for 1,219 yards, 10TDs and 4 interceptions. They have also combined for 216 rushing yards and 3 TDs.

David Scores TD, Then Kicks PAT - A First For LSU Since 1965

The last time an LSU player scored a touchdown and then kicked the ensuing PAT came back on Nov. 20, 1965 when Doug Moreau (who now handles the color analyst duties for the Tiger broadcast team) did it against Tulane. In the 62-0 win over the Green Wave, Moreau scored on a 9-yard TD pass from Pat Screen with 30 seconds left in the first quarter and then followed with one of his six extra points that day. Now, 42 years later, LSU PK Colt David did it again for the Tigers, scoring on a 15-yard run on the Tigers' fake field goal just before halftime in the win over South Carolina. It was the first touchdown of David's career.

Dickson Is First TE To Lead Tigers In Receiving Since Robert Royal In 2000

With 4 catches for 39 yards and 1 TD against South Carolina in week 4, TE Richard Dickson became the first tight end to lead the Tigers in receiving since Robert Royal did it against Houston in 2000. Royal had 4 receptions for 44 yards and 1 TD against the Cougars. For the year, Dickson has caught 9 passes for 98 yards and 1 touchdown for the Tigers. His 9 receptions rank fifth on the squad and he's one of six players to have caught a TD pass for LSU.

Sharing The Wealth On Offense

LSU's offense has been sharing the wealth in the first six games of the season. Fourteen different offensive players have scored at least one touchdown and eight have crossed the goal line at least twice. In addition to the scoring balance, the Tigers have had a different receiver lead the team in each of four of the first six games. Sophomore Brandon LaFell is the only receiver to lead the Tigers in receiving more than once this year, doing it three times - 7 catches for 125 yards vs. Va. Tech, 4 for 76 yards vs. Tulane, 6 for 73 yards vs. Florida. Other players to lead the Tigers in receiving this season include: Early Doucet - 9 catches for 78 yards vs. Mississippi State; Jared Mitchell - 6 catches for 82 yards vs. Middle Tennessee; and Richard Dickson - 4 receptions for 39 yards vs. South Carolina.

LaFell Enjoys Breakout Game Against Virginia Tech

LSU sophomore WR Brandon LaFell had his coming out party against Virginia Tech, setting career highs for receptions (7) and yards (125). LaFell hauled in a 56 yard TD to help set up LSU's second touchdown of the game. For the year, LaFell leads the team with 23 catches for 352 yards and a score.

Williams Makes SportsCenter Highlight Reel

LSU RB Keiland Williams made ESPN SportsCenter's highlight reel with his 67-yard TD run against Virginia Tech. During the run, Williams leaped over fullback Shawn Jordan, who had fallen to ground, and then raced the remaining 50-plus yards to the end-zone for the touchdown. The run was the highlight of Williams' career-night, one that saw him carry seven times for 126 yards and a pair of touchdowns. In 6 games, Williams has rushed for 272 yards and a team-best 5 touchdowns for the Tigers.

LSU Running Backs Take Care Of The Football

LSU's running back-by-committee approach has been good at more than just rushing yards and TDs. The group has also done a tremendous job of taking care of the football. Of LSU's four running backs - Jacob Hester, Keiland Williams, Charles Scott and Richard Murphy - only Hester has lost a fumble on a rushing attempt. Hester's lost fumble on a rush came against Georgia in what was the first game of his career in 2004. Since then, Hester has gone 212 carries from the running back position without a fumble. The following is a look at the number of carries LSU's running backs have toted the football without a fumble:

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

Here are some notable trends for LSU in the 32 games its played under head coach Les Miles ... The Tigers are 26-0 when rushing for 100 yards or more ... The Tigers are 21-1 when leading after the first quarter with the only loss during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005 ... LSU is 25-1 when scoring 20 or more points and 22-1 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 19-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing.

Tiger Defense Picks Off 6 Passes In Opener; Most By LSU Team Since 1975

LSU's six interceptions in the season-opener against Mississippi State was the most by an LSU team since having the same total against Tulane in 1975. Senior S Craig Steltz tied a school-record with 3 interceptions against the Bulldogs. Steltz became just the seventh player in school history, and the first since Corey Webster vs. Florida in 2002, to intercept 3 passes in a game. In all, the Tigers forced 7 turnovers in the 45-0 win over Mississippi State. The school record for interceptions in a game is 8, which was set against Villanova in 1951.

What's New For LSU in 2007

The Tigers have three new assistant coaches on the staff, including offensive coordinator Gary Crowton, who is considered one of the most innovative minds in football. Other newcomers to the staff include offensive line coach Greg Studrawa and receivers coach D.J. McCarthy.

Running Back Hester Adds To Receiving Total

When it comes to catching the ball out of the backfield, RB/FB **Jacob Hester** has become one of the best in school history at it. During his LSU career, Hester has 51 receptions from the running back position, a figure that ranks just outside of the top six in LSU history. A year ago, Hester caught 35 passes, which ranked as the third-highest single-season total in school history. Gary James (1982-85) holds both the LSU career mark (122) and single-season record (50 in 1985) for receptions by a running back. This year, Hester has three catches for 44 yards, including a 28-yarder against Virginia Tech that setup LSU's first touchdown.

Double-Trouble At Corner

LSU cornerbacks **Chevis Jackson** and **Jonathan Zenon** are back as returning starters at cornerback for the Tigers in 2006. The duo has started opposite each other at the cornerback position for 19 straight games. Last year, Jackson and Zenon combined for 6 interceptions for an LSU defense that ranked No. 1 in the SEC and No. 3 in the nation in pass defense.

Dorsey In Line For Special Season

Last spring DT **Glenn Dorsey** opted to return to LSU for his senior season, turning down what would have surely been a first round pick in the NFL Draft. As a result, Dorsey is now in line to get his college degree, while also being put in a position to contend for some of college football's most prestigious awards. ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit has already called Dorsey, "the best player in college football," heading into 2007. Dorsey has been listed on every preseason All-America team and has been rated as the best defensive tackle in the nation by several publications. Last year, Dorsey earned First-Team All-America honors after anchoring an LSU defense that ranked among the top five in the nation in yards allowed and scoring. Thru 6 games, Dorsey has 30 tackles, 5.5 TFL, and 4 sacks. The following is a listing of awards that Dorsey has been listed as a preseason candidate for heading into 2007:

LSU is one of the few schools in the country that can lay claim to having three coaches on its staff who have picked up wins as a head coach at the Division I level. Head coach **Les Miles** has combined to win 56 games at LSU and Oklahoma State, offensive coordinator **Gary Crowton** has a combined 47 victories after stints at Louisiana Tech and BYU and defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini** won his only game as the interim head coach at Nebraska during the 2003 season.

Oh Brother

LSU has two sets of brothers on this year's team - defensive end **Rahim Alem** (formerly Al Jones) and defensive back **Chad Jones** are brothers as are center **Brett Helms** and offensive lineman **Trey Helms**. Alem is a backup defensive end for the Tigers, while Jones serve as either a nickel back or dime back in LSU's subpackages on defense. Brett Helms is LSU's starter at center, while Trey is a walkon true freshman.

Dorsey Named SEC Defensive Lineman Of The Week

LSU DT **Glenn Dorsey** picked up what is sure to be the first of many weekly awards last week as he was named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his efforts in the 28-16 victory over South Carolina. Dorsey was credited with 8 tackles, 7 of which were solo, to go with a sack for a 7-yard loss and a PBU. Dorsey led a Tiger defense that held South Carolina to 17 yards rushing in the contest.

Cap and Gown Tigers

Two members of the LSU football team - FB **Shawn Jordan** and DL **Anthony Zehyoue** - have already earned their bachelor's degree. Jordan graduated last spring with a degree in kinesiology, while Zehyoue earned his diploma last spring in history.

Double-Duty Tigers

Three members of the LSU football team also participate in other sports on campus. Wide receiver **Jared Mitchell** and defensive back **Chad Jones** are on the baseball team, while wide out/return specialist **Trindon Holliday** is on the track team. Here's a look at how these players fared while competing in their "other" sport:

Trindon Holliday - sprinter - track and field

Established himself as one of the nation's premier sprinters on the track with his outstanding performance in the spring. He earned a pair of All-America honors at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in June. He finished as the NCAA runner-up in the 100-meter dash after ripping up the track with a time of 10.06 seconds in the final while also anchoring the Tigers' fearsome 4x100-meter relay team to a second-place finish with a seasonal best time of 38.85. In addition, Holliday etched his name in the record books with his performance as he shattered the school record in the 100-meter dash with a seasonal best time of 10.02, eclipsing the mark of 10.09 set by LSU great and former two-sport standout Xavier Carter in 2006.

Jared Mitchell - centerfield - baseball

Last year as a true freshman, Mitchell started 55 games at centerfield for the Tiger baseball team, batting .258 (54-of-209) with eight doubles, a triple, three homers and 21 RBI. He also became the first freshman since 1998 to lead the team in steals with 18. The stolen bases put him fourth in the SEC in that department and represented the most by an LSU player since 2004. Mitchell, the 10th-round selection of the Minnesota Twins in the 2006 MLB Draft, was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 26.

Chad Jones - outfielder - baseball

Jones, a left-handed outfielder from Southern Lab High School, was picked in the 13th round by the Houston Astros in the 2007 Major League Draft. He will make his debut for the Tiger baseball team this spring.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 83rd year in the venerable stadium. LSU is also celebrating the 76th anniversary of playing under the light of Tiger Stadium. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.

• LSU has won 24 OF ITS LAST 25 games at home.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 51 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 41 times, including a school-record 92,910 for the Oct. 6, 2007 game that pitted No. 1 LSU against No. 9 Florida. LSU won the game 28-24.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 47 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 45 of the 47 years and in the top 10 on 39 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. 15 times, LSU has ranked in the TOP SIX IN THE NATION, including the last six.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 205-59-3 (.777) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 20-22-3 (.478) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

Offense and Defense Shine in 49-0 Win Over Kentucky

A balanced offense and a stingy defense proved just too much for Kentucky as the Tigers rolled to a 49-0 win over Kentucky in Tiger Stadium. Offensively, the Tigers scored touchdowns on their first four possessions in building a 28-0 halftime lead. JaMarcus Russell connected on first half TD passes of 7 and 48 yards to Dwayne Bowe and Jacob Hester added scoring runs of 7 and 4 yards as the Tigers led 28-0 at halftime. In the second half, the Tigers tacked on 14 points third quarter points, one coming on a 12-yard run by Early Doucet and the other coming on an 8-yard TD pass from Matt Flynn to Bowe. Flynn finished off the scoring for the Tigers early in the fourth quarter with a 2-yard TD pass to Shawn Jordan. For the game, LSU racked up a season-best 546 yards (268 rushing, 278 passing), while holding the Wildcats to season lows in points (0), passing yards (166) and total yards (227). For the game, Russell connected on his first 11 passing attempts on his way to completed 15 of 18 for 226 yards and 2 scores. Bowe led all receivers with 6 catches for 111 yards and a career-best 3 TDs, while Hester added 44 rushing yards and 2 TDs on the ground for the Tigers. DE Tyson Jackson led a Tiger defense that pitched their first shutout of the season with 3 tackles, 1 sack and his first career interception.

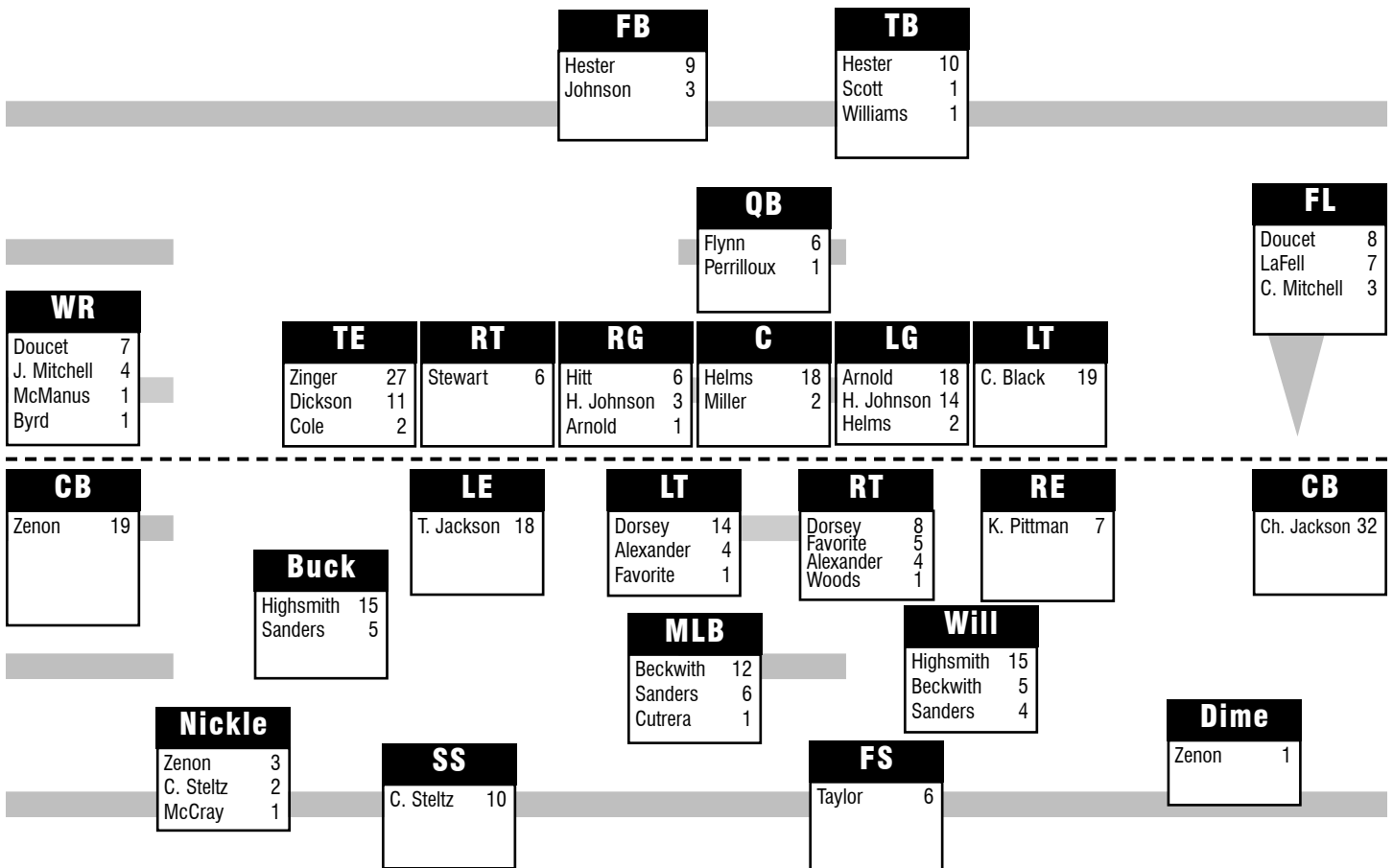

LSU's Defense Overwhelms Miss. State In 45-0 Win Over Bulldogs

LSU forced seven turnovers, including six interceptions, as the second-ranked Tigers overwhelmed Mississippi State, 45-0, in the season-opener for both teams last week. Matt Flynn, making his first regular season start at quarterback, directed a Tiger offense that didn't commit a turnover and racked up 45 points, the most by an LSU team in an SEC road game since scoring 63 points against Kentucky in Lexington in 1997. LSU took an early 3-0 lead on a 27-yard field goal by Colt David. The Tigers stretched the lead to 10-0 late in the second quarter on a 1-yard run by Keiland Williams. LSU increased the lead to 17-0 when Williams scored on a 1-yard run as time expired in the first half. LSU took the opening kickoff to start the second half and put together its best drive of the game, going 73-yards on six plays, capped with a Flynn-to-Early Doucet 11-yard TD pass to run the score to 24-0. Backup QB Ryan Perrilloux engineered a pair of fourth quarter TD drives for the final margin of 45-0. For the game, the Tiger defense limited Mississippi State to just 10 yards rushing and 136 yards passing. The Bulldogs managed just nine first downs, four of which came in the first half. Thirty-eight of LSU's 45 points came following an MSU turnover, including all 17 first half points.

Tigers Click On All Cylinders In 48-7 Win Over No. 9 Virginia Tech

LSU scored on four of its first five possessions and the Tiger defense didn't allow Virginia Tech to cross midfield until the third quarter in a 48-7 victory over the ninth-ranked Hokies in Tiger Stadium. In a game that saw LSU dominate in all phases, the Tigers raced out to a 24-0 halftime lead and never looked back in a contest that was billed as a defensive battle. LSU set the tone early, taking the opening kickoff and going 87 yards on 10 plays, capped with a 3-yard run by **Jacob Hester** to take a 7-0 lead. After a three-and-out by the Hokies, LSU went 85 yards on eight plays on its next possession, capped with a 7-yard TD run by **Matt Flynn** to stretch the margin to 14-0. LSU blew the game open early in the third quarter when **Keiland Williams** used a spectacular 67-yard run to give the Tigers a 24-0 lead. The Hokies scored their only points in the contest late in the third quarter to cut the deficit to 27-7. However, it took the Tigers only three minutes to add another score, this time **Ryan Perrilloux** connected with **Early Doucet** on a 34-yard TD pass. LSU added a pair of fourth quarter TDs for the final margin. For the game, LSU racked up 598 yards of offense (297 rush, 301 pass), while limiting the Hokies to just 149 yards (71 rush, 78 pass). Williams led the Tigers with 126 yards and 2 TDs on 7 carries, while Hester added 81 yards and 1 score on 12 rushes. Flynn and Perrilloux combined to complete 22 of 32 passes for 301 yards and a pair of scores. **Brandon LaFell** led all receivers with 7 catches for 125 yards and a score.

Defense Dominates, Perrilloux Steps In To Lead Tigers Past MTSU, 44-0

LSU's defense put together another dominating performance and backup **Ryan Perrilloux** stepped in for an injured **Matt Flynn** at quarterback to lead the Tigers to a 44-0 win over Middle Tennessee. In his first collegiate start, Perrilloux connected on 20-of-25 passes for 298 yards and 3 TDs to pace an LSU offense that accounted for 505 yards against the Blue Raiders. The Tiger defense did its apart as well, limiting Middle Tennessee to only 9 first downs, 9 rushing yards and just 90 yards of offense in pitching its second shutout this year. The game was never in doubt as the Tigers opened with 10 first quarter points and then stretched the lead to 17-0 early in the second quarter when Perrilloux connected with **Demetrius Byrd** on a 67-yard TD. The Tigers led 24-0 at halftime following a pair of **Colt David** field goals during the final three minutes of the first half. LSU scored three times in the third quarter - the first on an 18-yard TD pass from Perrilloux to **Brandon LaFell**. Perrilloux hit **Terrance Toliver** with a 15-yard TD pass less than two minutes later and then **Richard Murphy** capped the scoring for Tigers with an 8-yard run with 1:28 to play. **Jacob Hester** led the Tigers in rushing with 57 yards on 10 carries, while Perrilloux added 37 yards on eight attempts. **Jared Mitchell**, in his first collegiate start, led the Tigers in receiving with six catches for 82 yards. Defensively, LB **Ali Highsmith** had 7 tackles, while DB **Danny McCray** had 4 tackles, 2 sacks and a fumble recovery in the win.

Defense, Special Teams Trickery Leads Tigers Past Gamecocks, 28-16

Another stout defensive performance to go along with some first half special teams trickery was too much for 12th-ranked South Carolina to overcome as No. 2 LSU posted a 28-16 win over the Gamecocks. South Carolina actually led early in this contest, scoring the first first half points against LSU this year with a 1-yard TD run by Mike Davis at the 2:46 mark in the first quarter. The Tigers, who hadn't trailed this year until falling behind the Gamecocks in this contest, responded on their next possession, using the speed of **Trindon Holliday** to go 69 yards on four plays, capped with a 33-yard TD run by Holliday, to tie the score at 7-7. LSU took the lead for good early in the second quarter when **Matt Flynn** hit **Richard Dickson** on a 1-yard TD pass to cap a 9-play, 69-yard drive. Following an interception by **Danny McCray**, LSU drove to the South Carolina 15-yard line where the drive stalled and forced what appeared to be a field goal attempt by the Tigers with just over a minute left in the first half. However, with South Carolina bringing a heavy rush, holder Flynn flipped the ball over his shoulder on the fake field goal attempt, right into the hands of placekicker **Colt David**, who raced 15 yards for his first career TD and a 21-7 LSU lead at halftime. The Tigers stretched the margin to 28-7 midway through the third quarter on a 9-yard run by **Jacob Hester**. The Gamecocks added a field goal and a late touchdown to make the margin appear much closer than it actually was. Hester led the Tigers with 88 yards rushing and 1 TD, while Holliday rushed for a career-best 73 yards and a score. Flynn connected on 8 of 19 passes for 70 yards and 1 TD. Defensively, the Tigers limited the Gamecocks to only 17 yards rushing and only 269 yards of total offense. LSU, on the other hand, racked up 290 yards rushing and three scores and added another 70 yards through the air.

Tigers Overcome Slow Start To Beat Tulane, 34-9

LSU erupted for 24 second half points as the second-ranked Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 34-9 non-conference win over Tulane in the Louisiana Superdome. **Matt Flynn** threw for a career-best 258 yards in the win, while **Charles Scott** added 53 yards and a pair of second half scores to aid the Tiger victory. LSU didn't show any signs of being sluggish early in the game as it took only two plays on their second possession to take a 7-0 lead on a **Jacob Hester** 3-yard run. However, a series of penalties and poor offensive execution plagued the Tigers for the rest of the first half. LSU finished the game with 15 penalties that accounted for 91 yards. Tulane actually took a lead, albeit brief, on a 5-yard run by Andre Anderson at the 1:40 mark in the second quarter. It marked the only time all year that LSU has trailed in the second quarter of a game. The Tigers responded, however, going 37 yards on nine plays, capped with a 37-yard field goal by **Colt David** just before halftime. LSU led 10-9 at the break. In the second half, it was all LSU as the Tigers limited the Green Wave to only 101 total yards over the final two quarters. LSU's offense finally got untracked in the second half, scoring 24 unanswered points, including runs of 35 and 3 yards by Scott. After managing just 127 yards in the first half, the Tigers doubled that output in the second half with 264 yards. Defensively, **Craig Steltz** and **Kirston Pittman** both had 7 tackles to lead the Tigers. Pittman added 2 TFLs, while Steltz had a fumble recovery in the win.

Hester, Tigers Will Themselves To Win Over Florida, 28-24

In what is being called an epic battle of two college football heavyweights, LSU willed itself, behind the play of **Jacob Hester** and the gutsy play calling of **Les Miles**, to a 28-24 win over seventh-ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium. Trailing 24-14 entering fourth quarter, the Tiger offense dominated the final 15 minutes of the game, possessing the ball for 12 minutes and scoring 14 points during that final frame. LSU took its first and only lead of the contest on its last possession of the game, going 60 yards on 15 plays, capped with a 2-yard Hester TD run that put the Tigers up 28-24 with just over a minute left. LSU's defense turned away Florida on its final possession to seal the victory in front of a school-record 92,910 fans. Florida wasted little time in jumping on the Tigers, taking a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. The Tigers pulled to within 10-7 on a 1-yard run by **Ryan Perrilloux**, but the Gators answered right back to a take a 17-7 lead at half-time. The second half was all LSU as the Tigers held the powerful Gators to only seven points and just 142 yards of offense. LSU used a **Kirston Pittman** interception early in the fourth quarter to pull within 24-21 following a 4-yard pass from **Matt Flynn** to **Demetrius Byrd**. The Tigers held the Gators to a 3-and-out on their next possession setting up the game-winning drive. Hester led the Tigers with 106 yards rushing, while Flynn threw for 144 yards and a TD in the victory.
