### Tigers Open 2007-08 Exhibition Season

In some respects, it is expected to be a new-look LSU team that steps on the floor of the Maravich Center for the first time in the opener of a two-game exhibition season Thursday night against Belhaven.

More team oriented than last year's team, look for a little different style of play and a more perimeter oriented offense than has been seen in the last few years that featured big body, pound it inside games.

Some notes to ponder:

\*This marks the third straight year the Tigers have played another college team as one of its exhibition contests, but the first time it has been scheduled as the exhibition opener.

\*This will be the earliest exhibition start ever to an LSU season. In John Brady's tenure, the earliest the Tigers opened was on Nov. 5 against EA Sports in 2001-02 ... The previous all-time earliest exhibition was 1978 when LSU played Australia on Nov. 3

\*LSU's other exhibition game will be Nov. 6 when LSU hosts the EA Sports/Global Sports touring team coached by Maury Hanks. This will mark the eighth straight year that LSU has played this team.

# John Brady

Head Coach • 11th Year

When John Brady first put a team on the floor of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, his Tiger squad was undermanned, undersized and underdogs.

Teams hated to play the Tigers then because John Brady coached his team hard and they responded with several strong performances against the leagues top teams, but not many wins. The strong performances continued as the years went on, but now LSU was winning.

In 11 years as head coach at LSU, John Brady has coached the LSU team as only he knows how -- with heart and passion, and knowledge of the game that makes him one of the best at in-game decisions.

The LSU Tigers, in 2006, won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record and won the Western Division for the second straight year. LSU has won 31 SEC games the last three years, one of the best totals in the league over the last three years, and during that time period, LSU had a streak of 19 straight conference home wins that spanned portions of four seasons from 2004-07.

The SEC Championship in 2006 was Brady's second and the school's first outright championship in 21 years.

LSU has had six consecutive winning seasons under John Brady and only three times in the program history have there been longer consecutive years of winning.

Three times, John Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year and he has coached the SEC Freshman of the Year four times.

Brady's 184 wins are the third most wins by an LSU basketball coach and only two LSU basketball coaches have served longer tenures.

Brady's knowledge of the game and his belief in discipline and respon-

sibility for actions on and off the floor have made the program strong again, one that LSU fans are proud of.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hardwood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that athletic and academic pursuits of the players should be challenged to the fullest.

That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well.

Brady came to LSU after six highly successful seasons at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala. In his six-year tenure (1992-97), he turned the team into a consistent winner, posting a record of 89-77. In Brady's six years at Samford, the team had three first-team and five second team all-league selections.

Now at LSU, the numbers are beginning to work for Brady both on and off the floor. He has had 33 players earn Academic Honor Roll status at LSU, plus 18 players who have received their degrees from LSU.

The 53-year-old Brady is the father of two daughters (Brittany-17, Brooke-13) and is married to the former Misty Champagne.

In his first 10 seasons, Brady has taken the Tigers a long way, including to college basketball's pinnacle, the NCAA Final Four. The results are a program that is solid both athletically and academically. The top athletes in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers in the league.

He has re-established LSU back as a national factor in college basketball and the work is being done to keep LSU there for years to come.

### Last Game

LSU's final game of the 2006-07 season was in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals, losing 80-60, to Ole Miss at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta, Ga ... LSU defeated Tennessee in overtime in the opening round of the tournament.

### About Belhaven

Belhaven will be the third team from the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference that LSU has played in an exhibition game after LSU played LSU-Shreveport in 2005 and Louisiana College in 2006 ... The Blazers, located in Jackson, Miss., are led by Dax Miller, a pre-season GCAC selection after leading the team in scoring last year at 18.5 points per game ... The Blazers open the season Tuesday night at home against Blue Mountain College before coming to LSU on Thursday.

Tom Kelsey is in his third season as the head coach at Belhaven, with a record of 31-29 ... From 1998-2001, Kelsey was an assistant coach under Mark Gottfried at Alabama.

Of course, there are a couple of side notes to the game in that Coach John Brady and Coach John Treloar are both alums of Belhaven, having played basketball at the school in the 1970s ... Coach Brady was inducted into the Belhaven Sports Hall of Fame in 1997.

### Trying To Get Another Winning Season

While this is an early start for the exhibition season, the LSU season got an even earlier start thanks to a three-game exhibition tour of Canada over the Labor Day weekend ... The Tigers played games and won at the University of Guelph (92-60), York University (101-67) and the University of Toronto (82-55) ... Marcus Thornton, the junior college transfer, led the Tigers on the trip averaging 26.0 points per game as the guard hit 32-of-55 field goal attempts and more importantly 11 three-pointers in 25 attempts (44 percent) ... Anthony Randolph averaged 13.3 points and a team best 6.7 rebounds, while veterans Terry Martin (13.0 points) and Mitchell (11.0 points) averaged in double figures.

LSU as a team shot 48 percent from the floor and 36.9 percent from the international three-point arc, some 30 percentage points higher than a season ago.
