TULANE CLOSURES OUT NON-CONFERENCE PLAY AGAINST LONG-TIME RIVAL LSU

The Tulane football team (2-5, 1-3 C-USA) takes a break from Conference USA play this week when the Green Wave concludes its 2008 non-conference slate against the 15th-ranked LSU Tigers (5-2, 3-2 SEC) in the 97th edition of the storied rivalry. The contest will kickoff at 7 p.m. (CST) on Saturday night (Nov. 1) at Tiger Stadium in Baton Rouge, La.

The Wave is 0-2 on the road this season after falling at No. 13 Alabama (20-6) in the season opener and at UTEP (24-21) three weeks ago. Tulane will play four of its next five games on the road with its lone home game coming against UAB on Nov. 15. Among the four road contests are outings against nationally ranked LSU (#15) this week and Tulsa (#19) on Nov. 22.

TULANE-LSU GAME TO BE TELEVISED ON TIGERVISION

The Tulane-LSU game will be broadcast live on TigerVision, the LSU's in-house pay-per-view network. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. The TigerVision pregame show starts at 6:45 p.m.

Residents in Louisiana can purchase TigerVision through their local cable television system or through The Dish Network or DirecTV. Cable customers are reminded that they must have digital cable capabilities to order the games.

Residents outside Louisiana can purchase the TigerVision broadcast through ESPN's Game Plan package. The ESPN Game Plan package will be blacked out in Louisiana.

The cost to purchase the game will be \$34.50.

SEC TEAMS ARE COMMON OPPONENTS FOR TULANE

Tulane has a rich history against the SEC. From 1933 to 1965, the Green Wave was a member of the SEC and captured the conference crown three times (1934, 1939 and 1949). When the Wave meets LSU this Saturday, it will mark the 488th all-time meeting against an SEC opponent. TU has an overall record of 184-279-24 against SEC members. Tulane has regularly scheduled SEC teams throughout its existence, including two current SEC members during TU's inaugural season of college football in 1893. TU hosted both LSU and Ole Miss that season and finished 1-1 with a 34-0 win of the Tigers and a 12-4 loss to the Rebels. The Wave fell at Alabama in the 2008 season opener, 20-6.

ANDERSON NAMED A DOAK WALKER AWARD CANDIDATE; SUFFERS SEASON ENDING INJURY AGAINST RICE

Tulane junior running back **Andre Anderson** will miss the remainder of the 2008 season after he sustained a season-ending injury to his right shoulder last week during the second quarter of the Green Wave's game against the Rice Owls, head coach Bob Toledo announced Tuesday.

On Monday, Anderson was recognized as one of the nation's premier running backs with his selection to the 2008 Doak Walker Award Candidate List. Despite missing most of the Rice game due to an injury suffered in the first half, Anderson currently ranks eighth nationally and first among Conference USA players in rushing yards per game (123.43) and is 24th in the nation and fifth in C-USA for all-purpose yards per contest (152.29). He has rushed for 100 or more yards in four games and owns two of the nation's top 11 rushing performances this season with 255 yards at UTEP (6th) and 219 yards vs. SMU (11th).

Anderson became the third Tulane player to be named to the watch list in the last six years, joining 2007 candidate and current Chicago Bears rookie Matt Forte and 2003 honoree and current Pittsburgh Steelers running back Mewelde Moore.

NOTING THE GREEN WAVE

- **Andre Anderson's** 864 rushing yards (174 att.) this season placed him 11th place on Tulane's single-season rushing leaders. Anderson finished with 12 yards on the ground before suffering his season-ending injury against Rice but managed to pass Matt Forte (2006, 859) and Marvin Lewis (1981, 860).

- **Kevin Moore** has completed 59 percent of his pass attempts (128-217) this season for 1,476 yards and seven touchdowns. Moore has 17 pass plays of 20+ yards, including six strikes of 40 or more yards and three 50-yard efforts. His career long came on a 57-yard hook-up with senior **Brian King** vs. ULM.

- Redshirt freshman QB **Joe Kemp** took over the reins in the second half vs. Rice and completed 14-of-20, for 201 yards with two TDs, all career-highs. Kemp completed five of his passing attempts for 20+ yards, including a 42-yard strike to **Casey Robottom** for his first career touchdown.

- Although he sat out the last two games with an injury, junior **Jeremy Williams** leads Tulane is receiving with 27 receptions for 437 yards and five touchdowns, and he ranks second on the team in all-purpose yards with 135.2 yards per outing (437-rec./219-kickoff return/20-rushing).

- Senior **Michael Parenton** started his 21st consecutive game, dating back to a missed start in 2006 at UTEP due to food poisoning. Senior **Evan Lee** started his 22nd consecutive game, the longest active streak for the Green Wave, while **Andrew Nierman** and **Reggie Scott** each made their 19th-consecutive starts.

- First-year starter S **Corey Sonnnier** continues to lead the Green Wave is tackles with 50 (26 solo) on the year, while senior DE **Reggie Scott** is tops on the team for tackles for lost yardage with 4.5.

- Tulane has outgained its opponents in both passing (251.1 to 173.4) and rushing (153.1 to 135.9) yardage per game and holds a 2,830 to 2,165 edge (+665) in total yards this season.

ABOUT THE LSU TIGERS

No. 15 LSU, the defending national champions, is coming off a loss to Georgia (52-38) last week at home, and has lost two out of its last three outings after beginning the season with four straight wins. LSU is 3-1 overall and 2-0 vs. non-conference opponents at home this season. The last time the Tigers dropped back-to-back games on its home field was during the 2001 season (Florida, 44-15; Ole Miss, 35-24).

Quarterback **Jarrett Lee** has started four of seven games and has completed 58 percent (98-169) of his passing attempts for 1,328 yards and 11 touchdowns. Lee is coming off a 287-yard, three touchdown effort against Georgia.

Charles Scott has been the workhorse for the Tigers' rushing game this season, chalking up 775 yards and 10 scores on 120 carries. Scott totaled 144 yards on 21 totes vs. Georgia.

Brandon LaFell leads LSU in receptions (36), yards (524) and touchdowns (5) this season, while four total players have 10 or more catches.

Harry Coleman leads the Tigers' defense with 41 tackles (25 solo), while **Rahim Alem** has a team-high five quarterback sacks.

Green Wave Game Notes

SERIES & NOTES:

• Saturday's game marks 97th all-time meeting between Tulane and LSU, and the Tigers lead the series, 66-23-7. LSU has won the last 16 games with TU, including the last nine meetings at Tiger Stadium.

• This is the oldest rivalry for each team in their histories. The two teams first played in 1893, the first football season for each school. Tulane and LSU met in November of that year, with the Greenies winning that game 34-0.

• Tulane's last win in the series came in 1982 when the Green Wave capped a 4-7 season with a 31-28 upset of the Orange Bowl-bound Tigers. TU trailed 28-24 late in the fourth quarter, but quarterback Mike McKay found fullback Reggie Reginelli open in the flat on fourth down for a 31-yard game-winning touchdown.

• One of the biggest Tulane win in the series came in 1981 when the Wave downed LSU, 48-7. TU blocked a punt to set up a touchdown and recovered another block in the end zone for another score. Tulane Hall of Famer and longtime NFL tight end Rodney Holman capped his career with a touchdown reception in that ballgame.

• Tulane and LSU played every year from 1911-94 (with the exception of 1918 when LSU did not field a team due to World War I). The teams played single games in 1996 and 2001 and began a 10-year, home-and-home deal in 2006.

THE LAST TIME AGAINST LSU

A year ago at the Louisiana Superdome, the Green Wave defense posted a season-high six sacks - including two by senior defensive tackle Antonio Harris - and senior running back Matt Forté tallied 105 all-purpose yards, but it was not enough as the Tulane dropped a 34-9 decision to No. 2 LSU.

The Green Wave gave the Tigers all they could handle throughout the first 30 minutes of play, and took a 9-7 advantage when sophomore running back André Anderson scored from five yards out with 4:11 to go before halftime. From there, however, LSU closed out the half with a 36-yard field goal and scored 24 unanswered points in the second half to earn the victory.

TULANE DEFENSE REMAINS AMONG LEAGUE'S BEST

Tulane's defense remains first among Conference USA schools and 33rd nationally for total defense, giving up 309.29 yards per game, and also leads the league and ranks 21st in the country for pass defense (173.43). The Wave has not allowed a 300-yard passer in any game this season.

SHARING THE WEALTH

This season, 18 different players have caught pass for the Green Wave, while 11 players have more than one reception and five players have 10 or more catches. Junior **Jeremy Williams** is first on the team with 27 receptions, while classmate **Andre Anderson** is second with 25 grabs. Senior **Brian King** is third with 23, while sophomore **Cody Sparks** (14) and senior **Michael Batiste** (12) round out the top-five. The 18 players are second to Troy for the most players on one team with a reception in the nation this season.

THE COACHES:

Tulane: Bob Toledo (San Francisco State, 1968) is in his second season as the head coach of the Green Wave. Toledo has a 6-13 mark at Tulane and a career record of 84-81 in 15 years as a Division I head coach. He became the 37th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2006, and has coached in 13 bowl games, including seven traditional New Year's Day bowls.

Toledo led TU to a 4-8 record during his rookie season with the Wave. However, three of Tulane's losses were by a combined total of nine points. His previous head coaching stint was at UCLA (1996-2002), where he led the Bruins to two Pac-10 titles, a school-record 20-game win streak, two final top-10 national rankings and was twice named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

LSU: Les Miles (Michigan, 1976) is in his fourth year at LSU and has a record of 39-8 at the school, and has an overall mark of 67-29 and six bowl game appearances and one national title in eight seasons as a head football coach. Last season, Miles led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and an outright national championship. He has guided LSU to three bowl game appearance

Miles came to LSU from Oklahoma State, where he led the Cowboys to a record of 28-21 in four seasons with three bowl game appearances. He was a two-year letterman at Michigan (1974, 1975) and helped the Wolverines to consecutive Big 10 titles and to the 1976 Orange Bowl.

TO THE VICTORY GOES THE RAG

The winner of the Tulane-LSU game traditionally received a banner known as "The Rag". The Rag is decorated half Tulane and half LSU with each school's logo on the respective sides. The Rag exchanged hands with each team's victory from the first game of the series in 1893 until 1981. The original "Rag" was lost between LSU's victory in 1980 and Tulane's win in 1981. Some speculate that "The Rag" was delivered to Tulane following the Green Wave's 1981 victory, but was destroyed in a fire at the Tulane Student Center prior to the 1982 game. A replacement flag was created in 2001 and was present in 2006 at Tiger Stadium.

TULANE-LSU: A LOUISIANA TRADITION

The crowds at the Tulane-LSU games have been tops in both programs history as the 1973 (86,958 in Tulane Stadium) is the largest crowd ever to see a home Tulane athletic event. The 1979 attendance of 73,496 still stands as the largest college crowd in Tulane-LSU Superdome history. The announced crowd of 92,135 in Tiger Stadium during the 2006 contest is the second-largest largest crowd to ever watch a Tulane athletic event.

TULANE AGAINST IN-STATE SCHOOLS

When Tulane takes the field against LSU this Saturday, it will mark the 153rd time in school history that the Green Wave has faced an in-state opponent. TU has a record of 74-71-7 against Louisiana schools with match-ups against the following teams:

- Three Green Wave players will be going home this Saturday when Tulane battles LSU in Baton Rouge, including defensive end **Adam Kwentua** (University HS), linebacker **Devin Holland** (Istrouma) and quarterback **D.J. Ponder** (Catholic).

- Tulane linebackers coach **Greg Jackson** was a four-year letterwinner for the Tigers from 1985-88 and helped LSU to a mark of 36-10-2. He capped his collegiate career by claiming first team All-Southeastern Conference and All-America honors in 1988.

- Tulane offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** and **Mack Butler**, LSU Assistant AD/Football Administration, each served on the same coaching staff at Tulsa in 2000.

THIS-N-THAT ABOUT TULANE AND LSU

A win against LSU would...

- Give TU's **Bob Toledo** his seventh victory at Tulane and his 85th overall.
- Give Tulane its first win against the Tigers since 1981 (48-7)
- Snap a 16-game skid dating back to the 1983 campaign
- Give Tulane its first win against a nationally-ranked team since defeating 12th-ranked LSU on Nov. 27, 1982, which ironically is the last time the Green Wave defeated the Tigers.
- Give Tulane a 13-3 record against Louisiana schools since 1998
- Hand LSU its first non-conference loss at home since a 13-10 loss to Conference USA's school UAB on Sept. 23, 2000.

A loss against LSU would...

- Extend the Tigers' win streak to 18 straight in the series.
- Drop the Green Wave's record in Baton Rouge to 10-31-1
- Give the Green Wave an 0-36 record vs. Top-25 teams since 1982.
- Give Tulane its fourth straight loss, its longest losing streak since dropping eight straight to end the 2005 season.

THE GREEN WAVE AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Tulane has an all-time record of 19-106-2 against nationally ranked opponents. TU's last triumph over a ranked team was in 1982 against the then 12th-ranked LSU Tigers, 31-28, in Baton Rouge. Since then, the Green Wave is 0-36 vs. the Top-25.

IN GOOD COMPANY

Andre Anderson's career-high 255 yards rushing at UTEP was the fourth most in a single game by a Tulane runner. It was the 13th 200-yard rushing game in Tulane history. Anderson becomes one of just four players to rush for over 200 yards twice in his Tulane career, joining **Matt Forte** (six times), **Mewelde Moore** (twice) and **Eddie Price** (twice), each of whom went on to play in the NFL.

RUNNING WITH TOLEDO

Since head coach **Bob Toledo** installed his West Coast offense at Tulane, a Wave running back has reached the 100-yard plateau 13 times in 19 total games, and has surpassed 200 or more yards seven times. Last season, **Matt Forte** rushed for 100 or more yards in nine games, including three 200+ yard contests and two 300+ yard performances. This season, **Andre Anderson** topped the century mark four times and had two games with 200+ yards.

ANDRE THE GIANT

Junior **Andre Anderson** rushed for 100 or more yards in four straight games before suffering a season-ending injury against Rice. Among the four games were two 200+ yard outbursts.

During his fourth straight century effort, Anderson carried the ball a combined 124 times for 738 yards (5.95 apc) and scored five touchdowns. He has also caught 16 passes for 147 yards and a score during the same four-game stretch for a combined 885 all-purpose yards, or 6.3 yards per touch.

Anderson's 72-yard touchdown run at UTEP was the longest play from scrimmage for the Green Wave this season, a career-long for Anderson and the longest Tulane run since Matt Forte's 77-yard scamper at SMU on Oct. 20, 2007.

TIME MANAGEMENT

Tulane has done a good job keeping the opponent's offense on the sidelines this season with consistent ball control. In fact, the Green Wave ranks second nationally in time of possession with a per game average of 33:57 minutes per game.

Tulane has dominated time of possession in five of seven games this season and holds better than a eight minute edge this season, 34:43 to 26:03.

UTEP and Rice are the only teams to hold the ball longer than the Wave in a single game this season.

TULANE DEFENSE

The Tulane defense remains ranked among the nation's top teams in total sacks at No. 28 with 16 for minus 106 yards. TU is averaging 2.43 sacks per game this season.

The Wave registered four sacks (-29 yds) in the season opener at #13 Alabama, produced five sacks (-26 yds) against #14 East Carolina, finished with four sacks (-28 yds) vs. ULM and notched a season-low two sacks (-15 yds) against SMU. TU did not register a sack against Army, who attempted just five passing attempt for the game, but did notch one sack at UTEP.

FIRST TIMERS

Twenty freshmen, including 12 true rookies, have seen action this season.

In the opener at #13 Alabama, the Wave had 16 freshmen make their first collegiate appearance. True freshmen **Chris Asumnu**, **Nathan Austin**, **Harris Howard**, **Eric Jones**, **Alex Lauricella**, **Sule Osagiede**, **Kristofar Rhymes**, **Kasey Stelly**, **Rafael Vazquez**, **Troy Wainwright** and **Albert Williams**, joined redshirt freshmen **Logan CoBell**, **Charles Gaspard**, **Josh Smith**, **Joey Ray** and **Taylor Echols** in making their Green Wave debuts.

Junior **Reece Thomas** and redshirt freshman **Cedric Wilson** saw their first action against #14 East Carolina, while redshirt freshman **Dominique Dade** took the field for the first time in his career against ULM.

Redshirt freshman **Chandler Davis** made his collegiate debut against Army, while true freshman **Emmanuel Aluko** played in his first college game at UTEP.

Of the 20 freshmen to play, three walk-ons- Reece, Gaspard and CoBell- have earned playing time for their practice performances.

- DT **Cedric Wilson** made his first career start for Tulane, while Alex Wach made his first start of the year.
- Freshman FB **Kasey Stelly** picked up three yards on his first career tote.
- After holding opponents to just 12 first downs on their first 52 attempts on third down, the Green Wave have allowed their opponents to convert 12 of their last 24 third-down attempts.
- Tulane was shut out in the first half for the first time all season. The Green Wave had scored 86 first-half points in six games.

SATURDAY HEROES

- Sophomore LB **Devin Holland** recorded his first career interception in the first quarter, picking off a pass and returning it 10 yards to the Rice 43-yard line.
- Freshman RB **Nathan Austin's** 49-yard screen pass from **Kevin Moore** was his longest reception of his career. He finished with 73 yards receiving on five catches and 25 yards rushing on 13 carries.
- Freshman RB **Albert Williams** caught his first career touchdown on just the second reception of his career, taking an 18-yard screen pass in for six in the fourth quarter.

ANDERSON, THEVENOT NAMED LOUISIANA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- A pair of Tulane football players were named Player of the Week by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association after the Green Wave's 34-27 win over SMU. Junior running back **Andre Anderson** was named Offensive Player of the Week, with junior kicker/punter **Ross Thevenot** taking home Special Teams honors.
- Anderson racked up a career-high 219 yards on 36 attempts with a touchdown. It was the fourth straight game that Anderson has finished with a career-high in rushing yardage.
- Thevenot averaged 56 yards per punt on three attempts for 168 yards, placing one inside the 20. He also connected on field goals of 32 and 43 yards while converting all four PATs. His 43-yard field goal with 4:01 to play was a season-long and his 71-yard punt was the longest by a Green Wave player since 2003.

LEADERS OF THE PACK

- Seniors **Michael Parenton** and **Reggie Scott** were voted by their teammates as the permanent team captains for the Green Wave this season. Tulane will have two additional captains on a per game basis.
- This season the duo is keeping a weekly diary called "Down & Dirty: In the Trenches of Tulane Football" which has already received national notoriety from *USA Today*. In their chronicle of the football team's evacuation, *USA Today* featured it in the Sept. 2 edition, titled "Writing out the Storm."

GELHARDT NAMED TO 2008 AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Senior deep snapper **Craig Gelhardt** became the Green Wave student-athlete to receive individual honors this year as he was named to the 17th Annual Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.
- A three-year letterman on the gridiron, where he has handled snapping duties on nearly every punt, field goal and point-after-touchdown play, Gelhardt earned the honor after serving as an active member of SAFER (Student Advocacy For Equitable Recovery), Habitat For Humanities and Tulane's Student-Athlete Advisory Council.

As a member of SAFER, Gelhardt has assisted in the continued recovery effort in the New Orleans area following Hurricane Katrina in 2005. Among the activities carried out by SAFER, Gelhardt has helped gut houses, hang drywall and other maintenance to help bring families back to the city and help them return to the life they knew before the storm. He served as the community service representative on TU's Student-Athlete Advisory Council in 2007-08.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Sophomore offensive guard **Andrew Nierman** prepped at John Curtis High School and blocked for highly-touted USC freshman running back Joe McKnight. Together the two offensive players led JCHS to a combined record of 50-3 with three state championships during his final three seasons. During his senior season, he helped lead the way for one of the nation's top prep offenses as the Patriots amassed 4,310 yards and 58 touchdowns.
- Freshman **Rich Bell's** father, Richard, was an All-America football player at Rhode Island and had NFL stints in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and San Diego Chargers.
- Freshman **Alex Lauricella's** uncle, Hank, was an All-America football player at Tennessee.
- Freshmen **Chris Asumnu** and **Emmanuel Aluko** are not only classmates at Tulane, but were also prep teammates at Houston's (Texas) Alief Elsik High School.
- **Chris Asumnu** brings a talented athletic lineage to Tulane. His sister, Gloria, was a multi All-America track athlete for the Green Wave, while his brother, Richard, played both football and basketball at Tennessee and is a member of the Rio Grande Valley Vipers of the NBA Developmental League.
- Tulane assistant coach **Greg Jackson** was a four-year letterwinner at LSU from 1985-88, and garnered first-team All-SEC and All-America honors in 1988. He helped lead the Tigers to two conference titles and four straight bowl appearances. Jackson was drafted by the NFL's New York Giants in 1989 and helped that team to a Super Bowl title in 1991. He spent 12 years in the NFL and played with the Giants, Philadelphia Eagles, New Orleans Saints and San Diego Chargers.
- Tulane offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** has spent 16 years in collegiate coaching. However, he is most noted for scoring a touchdown on a Fumblerooski in the 1988 Orange Bowl against Miami (Fla.). As an All-America guard at Oklahoma against Miami in the fourth quarter of the 1988 Orange Bowl, Hutson picked up the ball after Sooners quarterback Charles Thompson had taken the snap and laid it on the ground and rambled 29 yards for a touchdown. However, OU lost the game for the national championship 20-14.
- Tulane wide receivers coach **Thomas "TD" Woods** completed his collegiate career at Tennessee as the Volunteers' single-season and career receiving leader. Woods was a two-time All-Southeastern Conference selection.

TULANE UNIVERSITY

- Tulane is the only American university that has been converted from a public institution to a private institution (founded in 1834 as Medical College of Louisiana).

• Named the 37th head coach in the 112-year history of the Tulane football program on Dec. 11, 2006.

• Has a 6-13 record at Tulane.

• Sports an overall record of 84-81 in 15 seasons as a collegiate head coach.

• Coached in his 150th game on Sept. 29, 2007, against No. 2 LSU.

• Since Toledo took over at Tulane, the Green Wave has averaged 183 rushing yards per game with 2,412 in 2007 and 1,072 yards this season.

• Despite a 4-8 record during his first season at Tulane, Toledo still managed to lead the Wave into the national spotlight. Under his offensive philosophy, senior tailback Matt Forté rushed for a school record 2,127 yards, the seventh-best single season total in NCAA history, and he became the 12th player to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing plateau in a single year. Forté earned numerous All-America honors, including second team All-America honors, and was among the contenders for the Heisman Trophy, the Doak Walker and Maxwell Awards, and was named the national player of the week twice in his lone season under Toledo.

• Brings more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Green Wave football team, including head coaching stints at Cal Riverside (15-6 with two championships from 1974-75), University of the Pacific (14-30 from 1979-82) and UCLA (1996-2002). He has coached in 13 bowl games during his career, including seven of the traditional New Year's Day bowls.

• Spent seven years (1996-2002) as the head coach at UCLA where he compiled a 49-32 record overall. The Bruins produced a school-record 20-game winning streak, plus two Pac-10 titles, one Rose Bowl appearance and non-conference victories over Texas (twice), Alabama (twice), Michigan, Ohio State and Texas A&M.

• Under Toledo, UCLA went 10-2 in 1998, climbing to No. 2 in the national polls. The Bruins finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (40.5) and eighth in total offense (482.6). They set school records for total offense (5,487 yards), passing yards (3,658) and passing touchdowns (29) and Toledo was a finalist for three Coach of the Year awards.

• The 1997 UCLA team finished 10-2 and ranked No. 5 in the nation after rallying to defeat Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl. The Bruins trailed the Aggies 16-0 before making a dramatic second-half comeback to win 29-23. UCLA averaged 40.7 points and more than 430 yards during the regular season.

• Prior to becoming UCLA head coach in January of 1996, Toledo was the Bruins' offensive coordinator for two seasons (1994-95) under Terry Donahue. Offensive tackle Jonathon Ogden won the Outland Trophy and tailback Karim Abdul-Jabbar was first team All-America in 1995.

• Served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for R.C. Slocum at Texas A&M for five years (1989-93). During that span, the Aggies posted a gaudy 49-12-1 record with three Southwest Conference titles and five straight bowl games, including three consecutive Cotton Bowl appearances. His 1990 Aggie offense still holds the school record for total yards in a single game (774 yards on 76 plays against Louisiana-Lafayette) and season game average with 471.1 yards per game that year.

• Toledo served as the offensive coordinator at Oregon for six seasons (1983-88), and helped tutor two of the Pac-10's most productive quarterbacks - Chris Miller and Bill Musgrave.

• Before his head coaching stint at Pacific, Toledo guided the secondary under John Robinson at Southern Cal from 1976-78. The Trojans went 31-6 in three seasons and were co-national champs after the 1978 campaign. Toledo's most heralded pupils included Dennis Thurman, Ronnie Lott and Dennis Smith.

• Toledo's first collegiate head coaching position was at Cal Riverside from 1974-75. The Highlanders were 15-6 and captured a pair of California Collegiate Athletic Association championships.

Tuscaloosa, Ala. - What could have been a special night for the upset-minded Tulane Green Wave became a missed opportunity thanks to the Alabama special teams units. The No. 13 (AP/No. 17 USA Today) Crimson Tide used a pair of returns from their punt team to hold off Tulane, 20-6, Saturday at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa.

The Green Wave (0-1) held the Alabama offense to just one touchdown, but two mistakes on the first quarter -an 87-yard punt return for touchdown by Javier Arenas and a 17-yard punt block return for touchdown by Chris Rogers- were the difference making plays for the Crimson Tide (2-0).

Tulane held a 318-172 advantage in total yardage over an Alabama team which racked up 419 yards against No. 9 Clemson last weekend. The Green Wave defense turned in four sacks and a forced fumble while holding the Crimson Tide to under 100 yards rushing.

"First, my hat's off to Alabama," Toledo said. "They are a great football program. Nick's (Saban) is doing a nice job and he has a lot of good young football players. I'm proud of our team's effort. Our kicking game really let us down tonight. They returned a punt for a touchdown. They blocked a punt and returned for a touchdown, and we missed two field goals. Our red zone offense wasn't very good either and that's a credit to them. They did a good job of keeping us out of the end zone."

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore completed 28-of-49 passing attempts in his first career start for 225 yards without an interception. Eleven different players caught passes for the Green Wave, which was led by senior wide out Brian King's six receptions for 51 yards. Junior wide receiver Jeremy Williams and junior tailback Andre Anderson each caught four passes. Anderson led the Green Wave on the ground, with 32 yards, while freshman running back Nathan Austin chipped in 24 yards on five carries.

In the first half, Tulane owned a 166-38 advantage in total offense, and held an 8-5 edge in first downs. Tulane also led in time of possession, but it was the special teams' play that put the Wave behind the Tide. Arenas broke Alabama's single-game return yardage mark in the first half.

"All in all, I think we did pretty well but we have some work to do," Burks said. "We know the car is running and now we just need to tune it up. We made some mistakes that people in the stands probably wouldn't have noticed, but for us it was a big blow. We need to do better. I think Alabama held some things back that we prepared for during the week. I think we had a pretty good game plan against them and we came out and executed, but we didn't come out on top."

Alabama rolled up 262 return yards, 171 off of seven punt returns, and the 'Bama defense kept the Green Wave out of the end zone in three red-zone attempts.

Junior safety Corey Sonnier, senior linebacker Evan Lee, and sophomore linebacker Devin Holland led Tulane with seven tackles each, while Burks, junior end Logan Kelley, sopho-

more tackle Justin Adams and senior corner Josh Lumar each put Alabama quarterback John Parker Wilson on his back for a sack. Lumar also added a pair of pass breakups. NEW ORLEANS - For the second-straight week, the Tulane football team went toe-to-toe with a top 15 team, but once again Tulane failed to deliver the knock-out blow. The Green Wave led 24-21 in the fourth quarter against No. 14 East Carolina, but a 24-yard touchdown pass with 1:41 remaining in the game helped the Pirates escape the Superdome with a 28-24 victory.

Tulane junior running back Andre Anderson ran for two touchdowns, and gained 82 yards on the ground while red-shirt sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore threw for a career-best 236 yards, including a touchdown.

Three times, Tulane answered Pirates touchdowns with touchdowns of their own before finally taking the lead in the fourth quarter on a field goal by junior kicker Ross Thevenot. But the Pirates responded in the waning minutes with their late score to drop the Green Wave to 0-2 overall and 0-1 in Conference USA. East Carolina improves to 3-0 on the season, 1-0 in C-USA. The Pirates were led by Patrick Pinkney's 260-yard passing effort, which included two touchdowns on 22-of-32 attempts.

The Tulane defense pounded Pinkney for five sacks by five different players, and the Wave forced four fumbles, recovering three. Senior defensive end Reggie Scott led the Green Wave defense, turning in a sack and his first career interception. Senior linebacker Evan Lee recorded a sack and a fumble recovery, while sophomore linebacker Logan Kelley forced two fumbles.

But once again, an early special teams' play bit Tulane. After a scoreless first, the Pirates' C.J. Wilson blocked a field goal attempt from Thevenot, and Quentin Cotton scooped it up and returned the ball 44 yards for a touchdown for a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter.

Kelley forced the ball free from ECU running back Jon Williams and Lee recovered the fumble for the Wave at the 10 yard line. On third and one, Anderson took the ball up the middle untouched for his third career rushing score, to tie the game at 7-7. For the second-straight week, Tulane kept a top 15 team's offense out of the end zone in the first half. The Wave held East Carolina to just 76 yards in the first half, and owned a 21:46 to 8:14 edge in time of possession.

East Carolina opened the second half with a 10-play, 49-yard drive capped by a three-yard touchdown run by Brandon Simmons. But the Wave struck back, as Williams got behind the ECU safety for a 47-yard touchdown reception from Moore. Williams hauled in the second-and-10 pass at the five and trotted in to tie the game at 14-14 with 8:04 left in the third quarter.

Four plays later, the Pirates' Norman Whitley took a screen pass from Pinkney, and with a caravan traveled 51-yards to the house for a 21-7 lead, on what capped a string of 11 consecutive completions from Pinkney. Moore found Williams again for a 50-yard gain to the ECU 19, splitting double coverage with a catch in traffic. Anderson took in his second touchdown of the day, also from one yard out, to knot the game once again, at 21-21 with 2:51 left in the third.

On a swing pass to the outside, senior corner Josh Lumar forced an ECU fumble, and senior safety David Skehan recovered the ball at the ECU 31. After Anderson's 13-yard rush, Moore found sophomore fullback Jordan Stephany on an 11-yard gain down to the six, setting up first and goal as the third quarter came to a close. The East Carolina defense held their ground, holding the Wave to a field goal. Thevenot's 28-yarder gave Tulane its first lead of the game, 24-21 with 13:40 left.

After a 27-yard Pinkney pass to Darryl Freeney, Pinkney ran a keeper down to the Tulane 34-yard line. The Pirates converted on third down for just the third time in the game, keeping the

NEW ORLEANS - Junior running back André Anderson ran for a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown and junior safety Corey Sonnier posted a career-high 10 tackles as the Tulane University football team used a complete-team effort to defeat Louisiana-Monroe, 24-10, Saturday afternoon in the Louisiana Superdome.

Anderson posted his first career 100-yard game, while sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore threw for a career-best 272 yards on 19-of-32 passing. Sonnier, meanwhile, paced a Green Wave (1-2) defense that posted four sacks on the day while limiting the Warhawks (1-3) to 182 yards of total offense. In addition, the Green Wave defense held ULM to a 1-for-10 performance in third-down conversions.

The Green Wave got off to a fast start as junior Jeremy Williams brought the opening kickoff back 44 yards, Moore connected with sophomore tight end Cody Sparks for a 37-yard gain on the first play from scrimmage, and Anderson scored from nine yards out three plays later to put Tulane on top 7-0 just 1:50 into the ballgame.

Two drives later, Tulane doubled its advantage when freshman running back Albert Williams took an end-around handoff from Moore, darted up the right sideline and broke a couple of tackles along the way for a 37-yard score. A 24-yard field goal by junior kicker Ross Thevenot put the Wave on top, 17-0, with seven seconds left in the first half to give the home team the lead at the break.

Junior cornerback Charles Harris thwarted UL-Monroe's first drive of the second half with an interception, but the Warhawks were able to put together a seven-play, 50-yard drive during their second possession to give kicker Radi Jabour the opportunity to split the uprights from 47-yards out to make it a 14-point ballgame.

The Tulane offense, however, all but sealed the win in the opening drive of the fourth quarter when Moore connected with Williams from 19 yards out to give the Green Wave a commanding 24-3 advantage. ULM cut the lead back to 14 with a 10-play, 74-yard drive on the ensuing possession, which culminated with a direct snap to Darrell McNeal for a four-yard touchdown, but that was the last time the Warhawks touched the football.

Tulane took over at its own 13 yard line following a Green Wave penalty with 5:36 left to play, and Anderson put the game away almost single-handedly. Anderson ran the ball on nine of the next 10 plays to account for 40 yards before Moore took a knee twice to spark the home team's celebration.

Anderson's rushing total came on a career-best 38 carries, which ranks tied for fifth in Tulane single-game history. He also hauled in a pair of passes for 20 yards to give him 177 yards of total offense for the day.

Williams led the Green Wave aerial attack with six receptions for 49 yards and a score,

NEW ORLEANS - Junior RB André Anderson ran for a career-best 219 yards and sophomore QB Kevin Moore posted the first three-touchdown performance of his career as Tulane defeated Conference USA foe SMU, 34-27, at the Louisiana Superdome. The Green Wave scored 31 points in the first half courtesy of Moore's three scoring strikes, an Anderson touchdown jaunt and a 32-yard field goal by junior Ross Thevenot to take a 24-point lead into the locker room at the break. In the second half, the Mustangs rallied for a pair of touchdown passes by Bo Levi Mitchell and two field goals by Thomas Morestead. The first-half advantage, however, proved to be the difference in the ballgame.

For the third consecutive week, Anderson was the Green Wave's workhorse as he carried the ball 36 times and finished the day with 257 all-purpose yards - the seventh-most in Tulane single-game history - after hauling in four passes for another 38 yards through the air.

Ninety-three of his rushing yards came in the first half on 17 carries, while Anderson galloped for another 126 yards after halftime. With Tulane clinging to a seven-point lead late in the ballgame, Anderson put the game away with a 40-yard run to give the Green Wave a first down, which allowed the team to run out the clock.

Moore's favorite target on the evening was junior WR Jeremy Williams, who hauled in six passes for 124 yards and two touchdowns. Williams' 51-yard touchdown reception two and a half minutes into the second quarter put Tulane on top 17-0, but SMU got on the board just over two minutes later when Mustang QB Bo Levi Mitchell found Aldrick Robinson streaking down the left sideline for a 45-yard scoring strike.

The Green Wave responded with a six-play, 71-yard drive on the ensuing possession with culminated on a one-yard touchdown plunge by Anderson, and Moore found Williams again - this time from 21 yards out - with 2:15 remaining in the first half to give Tulane a commanding 31-7 lead.

The second half, however, was a much different ballgame as SMU capitalized on a pair of Tulane turnovers to claw their way back into the ballgame. NEW ORLEANS - In the Green Wave's first game at Tad Gormley Stadium in four years, the Tulane football team was out-rushed 291-156 as the Army Black Knights rolled to a 44-13 win Saturday in front of a crowd of 23,749 outdoors in City Park. Junior running back Andre Anderson was over 100 yards for the third straight game, finishing with 107 yards on 21 carries with a touchdown, but the Wave couldn't overcome four turnovers and a pair of blocked kicks.

The Green Wave (2-3) gave up a season-high 291 yards rushing against the option offense of the Black Knights (1-4). Army attempted just five passes on the afternoon. Senior fullback Collin Mooney led the Black Knights with 187 yards on 19 carries and four touchdowns.

Army intercepted three Tulane passes, as the Green Wave could only find the end zone twice. Quarterback Kevin Moore was 22-of-35 on the day for 273 yards and a touchdown, but threw a pair of picks as Tulane fell to an unranked opponent for the first time this season.

Running the option, Army quarterback Chip Bowden attempted just five passes, completing four for 39 yards, and ran for another 51 yards.

Army got on the board in the first quarter after blocking a Tulane punt to take over deep in Green Wave territory. Collin Mooney accounted for all 22 yards on the drive, capping it with a four-yard touchdown for a 7-0 lead.

The Black Knights then forced a fumble by Moore, and Stephen Anderson scooped it up and returned it 81 yards for a touchdown with 5:24 to go in the first.

Mooney added a two-yard run to end a 42-yard drive, but Tulane corner Chinonso Echebelum blocked the PAT. Army added a 22-yard field goal with 5:38 to go in the first half for a 23-0 lead.

The Green Wave answered with a 73-yard drive, consuming 3:19 and punctuated by Andre Anderson's 1-yard touchdown plunge.

In the second half, the Wave opened with an onside kick attempt, but the Black Knights came away with good field position. The Tulane defense was able to force a three-and-out. On the ensuing Green Wave drive, Tulane threw an interception at midfield, but was bailed out by the defense again, which held Army on fourth-down at the 39 yard line.

Tulane then drove 61-yards to pay dirt, as Moore found Jeremy Williams for a 49-yard touchdown reception. The two-point conversion failed, as Army led 23-13 with 7:30 to go in the third quarter.

After holding the Black Knights, Dominique Dade set up the Wave at midfield with a 23-yard punt return to the Tulane 41. But the Tulane field goal attempt was blocked, and on the ensuing drive, Mooney scored on a 35-yard scamper

El Paso, Texas - Andre Anderson rushed for a career-high 255 yards and two touchdowns, the fourth most yards in a game in Tulane's history, but the UTEP Miners had the last word with a 24-21 win Saturday night at the Sun Bowl. The Miners' Trevor Vittatoe found Jeff Moturi for a 68-yard touchdown late in the fourth quarter to give the Miners a 24-21 victory.

Anderson racked up 255 yards on 29 carries, the second 200-yard rushing game of his career. Only Matt Forte has ever rushed for more yards in a single game. He also added a 28-yard touchdown reception, with four catches.

The Miners converted on seven of 14 third down tries, the most the Green Wave have given up all season. Vittatoe completed 21 of 32 attempts for 296 yards and three touchdowns for the Miners.

UTEP opened the game with an 80-yard touchdown drive, highlighted by a 53-yard pass from Trevor Vittatoe to Donavon Kemp down to the two yard line. On fourth and goal, Vittatoe found Landon Goodwell for his first career catch and a one-yard touchdown for a 7-0 Miners lead.

On fourth and seven, UTEP lined up for a 40-yard field goal and holder Kyle Wright rushed to the marker, but not over it as Tulane took over on downs.

Anderson broke a 72-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7. The Green Wave used four plays to go 83 yards, and give Anderson his fourth straight game with a rushing TD.

The Green Wave's David Kirksey forced a fumble, which Dominique Dade recovered for Tulane in UTEP territory. Anderson then ran in a one-yard touchdown, capping a four-play, 24-yard drive, highlighted by Kevin Moore 14-yard catch, his first career reception. Brian King's found Moore for his first career completion on his first career passing attempt. On the ensuing drive, the Miners travelled 80 yards on 11 plays, scoring on an eight-yard pass from Vittatoe to Daniel Palmer to tie the game at 14-14 with 9:00 to go in the first half.

Anderson took the first play from scrimmage on the next drive and hustled 53 yards to the UTEP 27. On third and 11, Anderson took a screen pass 28 yards to the house, accounting for 81 yards on the 80-yard drive, giving the Green Wave a 21-14 lead. Tulane took that lead into the half. After a Tulane punt, UTEP converted another third-down to keep a drive alive, and then Jose Martinez hit a 28-yard field goal to cut the margin to 21-17.

Freshman fullback Kasey Stelly caught a pair of passes on the next drive, giving him a career-high in reception yards, but the Green Wave 45-yard field goal attempt was blown away in the rainy conditions. The Green Wave defense forced a UTEP punt, taking over at the Tulane 40, but the drive stalled with 5:13 to go at the UTEP 43 yard line. The Miners took over at their own 20, and drove 80 yards in just two plays and 44 seconds.

Vittatoe found Jeff Moturi for a 68-yard touchdown deep down the middle to give the Miners a 24-21 lead with 4:22 remaining.

NEW ORLEANS - Despite a strong second half, Tulane couldn't overcome a poor start in a 42-17 loss to Rice. Redshirt freshman QB Joe Kemp completed 14 of 20 attempts for 201 yards and two touchdowns, all career highs and all in the second half, but the Green Wave couldn't overcome a 35-0 halftime deficit.

Rice quarterback Chase Clement racked up 168 yards through the air, on 20-of-25 with two touchdowns, and added 57 yards rushing and two scores on eight carries. Rice's C.J. Ugokwe carried the ball 18 times for 118 yards, his first career 100-yard rushing game, with one touchdown. Rice improves to 5-3 overall, and 4-1 in Conference USA, while Tulane falls to 2-5, 1-3 in C-USA.

The Owls jumped all over Tulane early, scoring on four of their first five possessions, while its defense held Tulane to just three yards in the first quarter, and 161 in the first half.

Kemp guided the Green Wave to a 17-7 advantage in the second half. Wide receiver Brian King grabbed seven balls for a career-high 103 yards. Casey Robottom added three catches for 66 yards, including a 42-yard touchdown. Nathan Austin added five grabs for 73 yards and led Tulane on the ground with 25 yards on 13 carries. Junior Andre Anderson had four first quarter carries for 12 yards but did not return to play the second half.

On the opening drive, Tulane's Devin Holland intercepted Clement, returning it 10 yards to the Rice 43-yard line. But the Owls forced a Green Wave punt. Rice then drove 95 yards on 16 plays, taking 8:48 off the clock before Clement found James Casey for a seven-yard TD strike. After the Wave went three-and-out, Rice quickly moved the ball down the field for a four-play, 60-yard drive in 1:26. Clement ran a quarterback keeper for a nine-yard touchdown run and a 14-0 lead. Tulane fumbled the kickoff, and Rice's Brandon Tolbert recovered to give the Owls a first and 10 from the 17. It took one play for Clement to find Casey on a slant pattern and his second touchdown grab of the day. Tulane picked up a first down on an 11-yard completion from Moore to Alan Mitchell. But then Moore threw an interception on the next play as Tulane attempted a flea-flicker pass. The Wave had an apparent sack on Clement, but Tulane was called for a facemask penalty when Clement's helmet popped off on the tackle. The seven-yard loss turned into a 15-yard gain for the Owls, and after a 21-yard run by C.J. Ugokwe, Clement ran the ball in from six yards out to cap the drive. The Green Wave moved the ball 26 yards on eight plays before punting, and the Owls punted the ball back from midfield. On fourth and one from their own 11-yard line, Tulane's Logan Kelley took a direct snap in punt formation, and surged ahead three yards on the fake punt for a Tulane first down on his first career rush. Nathan Austin took a screen pass 49 yards down to the Rice 20. But on the very next play, Robert Calhoun intercepted Moore at the 17-yard line.

After a Rice punt, Tulane moved the ball to the 23-yard line with two seconds left in the half, but Scott Solomon blocked the field goal attempt and Rice's Chris Jones scooped it up and took it 55 yards to the house for a 35-0 halftime lead.

In the second half, Kemp took over for Tulane and completed two of his first three attempts, moving the Green Wave down into Rice territory, setting up a 42-yard field goal by Ross Thevenot.

Kemp moved Tulane downfield after a Rice punt, hooking up with Robottom for a 42-yard touchdown. It was the longest completion and first touchdown of Kemp's career, and tied Robottom's career-long reception.

Tulane drove 53 yards, highlighted by Kemp's 24-yard pass to Brian King down to the Rice six-yard line. But the Owls stopped Tulane at the one, taking over on downs with 11:11 to go in the game. After forcing Rice to go three-and-out, Kemp hit Albert Williams for an 18-yard touchdown pass off a screen. Williams' first career TD made it 42-17 with 6:45 to go. The Green Wave defense held Rice again, and the Green Wave played its second-team in their remaining possession, a four-play, six-yard drive. Tulane's defensive backups then played the final 3:18.
