LSU Goes After 15th Straight Home Win On Saturday Against Middle Tennessee

LSU will look to build on last week's 48-7 win over then-No. 9 ranked Virginia Tech on Saturday when the second-ranked Tigers host Middle Tennessee in a non-conference matchup in Tiger Stadium. Kickoff for the contest is set for 7 p.m. in a sold out Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on LSU's pay-per-view network, TigerVision. LSU brings a 2-0 mark into the game following last week's dismantling of Virginia Tech. Dating back to last season, LSU has won nine straight games, outscoring its opponents 331 to 111 over that span. LSU has outscored its first two opponents, 93-7, this year. Middle Tennessee is 0-2 overall despite possessing an offense that is averaging 28 points and nearly 400 yards per game. The Blue Raiders are coming off a 58-42 loss to No. 8 Louisville last Thursday. The Tigers bring one of the nation's stingiest defenses into the contest as LSU is allowing 3.5 points and 147.5 yards per contest, both of which rank No. 3 in the nation. In eight quarters of action in 2007, the Tigers have only allowed on TD, that coming in the third quarter last week against the Hokies. The Tigers rank first in the nation in pass efficiency defense (43.51 rating), No. 7 in pass defense (107.0 yards per game) and No. 11 in rushing defense (40.5 yards per game). Offensively, the Tigers have been efficient, scoring 46.5 points per game to go with 472.5 yards per game. LSU has yet to commit a turnover on offense, while racking up eight on the defensive end. LSU also brings a 14-game Tiger Stadium winning streak into the Middle Tennessee contest. The 14-game streak ranks as the third-longest streak in Tiger Stadium history and it's the longest since the Tigers won 15 consecutive games at home from 1971-73. The school record for consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium is 17, which was set from 1935-37. Individually, QB **Matt Flynn** has been nearly flawless; connecting on 29 of 46 passes for 345 yards and 2 TDs. Flynn has also rushed for 54 yards and a score. RB **Jacob Hester** leads the Tigers in rushing with 149 yards and 1 TD, while RB **Keiland Williams** has 144 yards and 4 scores for the Tigers. WR **Early Doucet** has caught 15 passes for 153 yards and 2 scores, while WR **Brandon LaFell** is LSU's other top target, hauling in eight balls for 140 yards and a score. Defensively, LB **Ali Highsmith** is tops on the team with 14 tackles, while DT **Glenn Dorsey** has 11 tackles, 2 TFL, and a sack. S **Craig Steltz** leads the nation in interceptions with four to his credit.

Tigers Click On All Cylinders In 48-7 Win Over No. 9 Virginia Tech

LSU scored on four of its first five possessions and the Tiger defense didn't allow Virginia Tech to cross midfield until the third quarter in a 48-7 victory over the ninth-ranked Hokies in Tiger Stadium. In a game that saw LSU dominate in all phases, the Tigers raced out to a 24-0 halftime lead and never looked back in a contest that was billed as a defensive battle. LSU set the tone early, taking the opening kickoff and going 87 yards on 10 plays, capped with a 3-yard run by **Jacob Hester** to take a 7-0 lead. After a three-and-out by the Hokies, LSU went 85 yards on eight plays on its next possession, capped with a 7-yard TD run by **Matt Flynn** to stretch the margin to 14-0. LSU blew the game open early in the third quarter when **Keiland Williams** used a spectacular 67-yard run to give the Tigers a 24-0 lead. The Hokies scored their only points in the contest late in the third quarter to cut the deficit to 27-7. However, it took the Tigers only three minutes to add another score, this time **Ryan Perrilloux** connected with **Early Doucet** on a 34-yard TD pass. LSU added a pair of fourth quarter TDs for the final margin. For the game, LSU racked up 598 yards of offense (297 rush, 301 pass), while limiting the Hokies to just 149 yards (71 rush, 78 pass). Williams led the Tigers with 126 yards and 2 TDs on 7 carries, while Hester added 81 yards and 1 score on 12 rushes. Flynn and Perrilloux combined to complete 22 of 32 passes for 301 yards and a pair of scores. **Brandon LaFell** led all receivers with 7 catches for 125 yards and a score.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Les Miles' first two years with the Tigers have been unmatched in the history of the program. The results are impressive and staggering: 22 wins; 13 SEC victories; eight wins over top 25 teams; five wins over top 10 teams; back-to-back top five final rankings; two bowl victories, including one BCS bowl win; 12 NFL Draft picks and four first-team All-Americans.

After leading LSU to an 11-2 mark and a top five national ranking in his first year as LSU's head coach in 2005, many wondered just what Miles would do for an encore. His second year with the Tigers proved to be another year full of milestones and firsts as he guided the Tigers to another 11-2 overall record, culminating with a 41-14 dismantling of 11th-ranked Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

The Tigers finished their second year under the direction of Miles ranked No. 3 in the nation, marking the first time since the 1958-59 seasons that LSU was ranked in the top five in the country in back-to-back years.

LSU's at-large berth in a BCS bowl was a first in school history and it also represented the third time this decade that the Tigers ended their season in the Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, Miles became the first coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to back-to-back 10-wins seasons and with 22 victories in his first 26 games as the school's head coach, his win total matched Bernie Moore for the most in school history over that span. He also became the first LSU coach since Jerry Stovall in 1982 to beat two top 10-ranked teams on the road in the same season as the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee in Knoxville followed by a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock.

The Tigers were able to accomplish all of this during the 2006 season despite having to face four top eight opponents on the road, also a first in school history. LSU posted a 2-2 mark in those road games, which included November wins over Tennessee and Arkansas that propelled the Tigers to a berth in a BCS bowl.

LSU opened the 2006 season in grand style, posting identical 45-3 wins over Louisiana-Lafayette and Arizona. After a gut-wrenching 7-3 loss at No. 3 Auburn, the Tigers reeled off decisive wins over both Tulane (49-7) and Mississippi State (48-17). Following a 23-10 setback to eventual national champion Florida, the Tigers responded with seven-straight wins to end the season, starting with a 49-0 victory over a Kentucky team who went on to win eight games and beat Clemson in a bowl game.

The Tigers capped the 2006 season with its 41-14 win over an overmatched Notre Dame team in the Sugar Bowl, giving the Tigers their third win in a BCS game since the 2001 season. The three wins for the Tigers in BCS bowl games since the 2000 season is the most of any SEC team during that span.

With a 6-2 SEC mark in 2006, Miles ran his record in conference games to 13-3, which trails only Bernie Moore as the best start for an LSU head coach in league games in school history. Moore won 15 of his first 16 conference games from 1934-36.

With a makeshift offensive line that featured three first-time starters and a pair of true freshmen running backs having to plug holes in a depleted backfield, the Tigers still managed to lead the SEC in total offense (411 yards per game) and scoring offense (33.7 points per game), while ranking No. 2 in the league in rushing offense (165 yards per game). Defensively, (the Tigers, despite losing three defensive linemen to the NFL Draft from the year before), ranked among the top four in the nation in scoring defense, total defense and pass defense.

In all, the Tigers fashioned its 11-2 record against seven teams who went on to play in bowl games as LSU's schedule was ranked as the 12th toughest in the nation according to the NCAA.

Even though the Tigers had to go on the road to face four top 10-ranked teams in 2006, year two under Miles seemed somewhat ordinary compared to what the Tigers had to endure during his first year in Baton Rouge.

In Miles' inaugural season at LSU he led the Tigers to only the third 11-win season in school history, to a top five national ranking and a berth in the SEC Championship Game despite numerous distractions that covered most of the months of September and October.

The Tigers, playing without starting quarterback and future No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick JaMarcus Russell, put an exclamation point on the year with a 40-3 win over No. 9 Miami in the Peach Bowl to finish with an 11-2 overall mark and a No. 5 national ranking.

To appreciate just how adverse the conditions that Miles and the Tigers had to overcome in 2005, you have to go back to late August and Hurricane Katrina, the first of two storms to devastate the state of Louisiana during the fall.

Days before LSU's originally scheduled season opener against North Texas in Tiger Stadium, Hurricane Katrina blew ashore, packing tremendous winds, and turned the state, in particular New Orleans and southeastern Louisiana, upside down.

Massive flooding followed in the wake of the storm as more than 30 LSU players had their families and their homes affected by the hurricane and Miles' first game in Tiger Stadium against North Texas was postponed. With the LSU campus serving as the recovery center for those sick, homeless and displaced due to Hurricane Katrina, football seemed to be the farthest thing from most people's minds. However, Miles was able to successfully manage a delicate situation, one that saw his team and coaching staff volunteer time to those in need, while still attempting to focus on football for at least two hours a day.

After a week of trying to minimize the distractions for a football team that had their apartments and dorm rooms filled with displaced family members and friends due to the storm, it appeared that the Tigers would finally get to play a home game, this time against 15th-ranked Arizona State.

Still, with many in Louisiana under the distress of Hurricane Katrina, the Tigers were going to have to take to the desert to face a powerful offense in their first game of the season.

These were certainly trying times for everyone in the state of Louisiana, but even more so for a football coach who now had his team carrying the banner for a state in need of a diversion. LSU football had become a release for those consumed with the hurricane. LSU even re-stated its team goals, putting playing for the state of Louisiana at the top of the list.

The Tigers didn't disappoint as Miles and his LSU team used a 28-point fourth quarter rally to come back to beat Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe. Now with the Arizona State game behind them, it looked as if things for the LSU football team would gradually get back to normal as the Tigers now had a week off before facing Tennessee in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 24.

Then, the unthinkable happened. Another storm, this one named Rita, hit southwest Louisiana, causing severe damage to more homes, leaving thousands without electricity and displacing even more Louisiana natives. The combination of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita forced LSU to again shuffle its schedule. Instead of playing Tennessee on a Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers would now be forced to face the Volunteers on a Monday night. An emotionally drained LSU team saw a 21-0 halftime lead evaporate into a 30-27 overtime loss against the Vols.

Miles became the only coach in his first year in the SEC to lead his squad to the league's title game. He also became the first coach in LSU history to beat Alabama, Auburn and Florida in the same season.

Following a loss to Georgia in the league's title game, Miles and the Tigers re-grouped, this time to beat No. 9 Miami, 40-3, in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win gave the Tigers 11 victories for the year, making Miles the winningest first-year coach in school history.

Miles, the 2002 Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year and former assistant with Michigan, Colorado and the Dallas Cowboys who built Oklahoma State into a force in the Big 12, became LSU's 32nd head football coach on Jan. 3, 2005.

During his two years with the Tigers, Miles has put together a 22-4 overall mark, while leading LSU to a 13-3 conference record. LSU has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft over the past two years, including a school-record four in the first round in 2007, which included the No. 1 overall pick in Russell. In addition, LSU has had four players earn first-team All-America status under Miles.

Tigers Host Middle Tennessee In Non-Conference Contest

LSU plays its second straight home game this week when the second-ranked Tigers welcome Middle Tennessee of the Sun Belt Conference to Tiger Stadium. Kickoff for the Tigers and the Blue Raiders is set for 7 p.m. The game will be televised on LSU's pay-per-view network, TigerVision. LSU, winners of nine straight dating back to last season, is 2-0 following last week's 48-7 win over No. 9 Virginia Tech. Middle Tennessee is 0-2 overall after falling to No. 8 Louisville by a 58-42 margin last Thursday.

In The Polls

LSU remained No. 2 in both national polls this week following its 48-7 win over then-No. 9 Virginia Tech. LSU has now been ranked 70 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll and for 69 straight weeks in AP poll. The last time LSU failed to make the top 25 in either poll came following the Tigers loss to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl to conclude the 2002 season.

Looking Ahead To Next Week - It's Either CBS Or ESPN For South Carolina Game

LSU stays at home next week, hosting Southeastern Conference Eastern Division foe South Carolina. The game will be televised by either CBS or ESPN and will carry a 2:30 p.m. or 6:45 p.m. start time. The start time and network carrying the game will be announced by the SEC on Sunday afternoon.

Observations And Did You Knows About This Year's LSU Football Team

LSU has allowed only one trip into the redzone this year, which came last week by Virginia Tech ... The Tigers haven't turned the ball over this year, and dating back to last season, the LSU offense has gone 75 minutes and 41 seconds of possession time without a turnover ... LSU's last turnover was an interception against Notre Dame in the fourth quarter ... To take it a step further, LSU's gone 92 minutes and 45 seconds of possession timeout without losing a fumble ... LSU's last lost fumble came in the first quarter of the Notre Dame game in the Sugar Bowl ... LSU is 11-of-11 in redzone opportunities this year ... In 26 possessions by its opponents, LSU has held the opposition to less than 10 total yards in 17 of those 26 possessions ... LSU opponents have also gone 3-and-out in 11 of its 26 possessions ... The longest drive against LSU this year is 65 yards, which came last week in the third quarter by Virginia Tech ... The longest first half drive allowed by LSU this season was a 9-play, 34-yard possession by Mississippi State.

Middle Tennessee Contest Could Double As Homecoming For The Blue Raiders

LSU's homecoming game won't come until later in the year against Louisiana Tech, but this weekend's contest against Middle Tennessee will serve as a homecoming of sorts for several members of the MTSU athletic department. Four former members of the LSU athletic department are now playing major roles for the Blue Raiders. Former LSU assistant basketball coach **Termit Davis** is the head basketball coach for the Blue Raiders; former LSU basketball trainer **Drew Shea** holds the same title at Middle Tennessee; former LSU business manager **Michael Szul** is an associate AD for the Blue Raiders; and **Jim Rost**, who spent four years as an associate director in LSU academic center for student-athletes, serves as the director of Middle Tennessee's academic center.

How About LSU's Middle Tennessee Ties

LSU's special teams coordinator/linebackers coach **Bradley Dale Peveto** served on the Blue Raiders staff in 2003-04. Peveto served as MTSU's defensive coordinator in 2004 after coaching the secondary in 2003. In addition, LSU administrative interns **Glen Elarbee** and **Brendan Farrell** have served on Middle Tennessee's staff. Elarbee actually played for the Blue Raiders from 1999-02, and then later coached there. Farrell coached on the defensive side of the ball for the Blue Raiders in 2004-05.

Tennessee Tigers

LSU has one player on its roster who calls Tennessee home and that's freshman kicker **Josh Jasper**. Jasper is a native of Memphis.

Tigers Stretch Overall Winning Streak To 9 Straight

LSU ran its overall winning streak to nine straight games with its 48-7 win over Virginia Tech on Saturday. LSU won its final seven games a year ago, which included victories over No. 5 Arkansas, No. 8 Tennessee and No. 11 Notre Dame. LSU hasn't lost a game since a 23-10 setback to Florida on Oct. 7 in Gainesville. The 9-game winning streak ties with Florida as the nation's second-longest current streak. Wisconsin has won 11 straight for the longest current streak. The 9-game streak is also the longest for LSU since winning 10 straight during the 2003 and 2004 seasons. LSU won its final 8 games in 2003 and its first 2 contests in 2004 before falling to Auburn, 10-9, on Sept. 18.

LSU's Been Dominating In First Quarters Under Miles In Tiger Stadium

LSU continued what has become a dominating first quarter trend last week as the Tigers held Virginia Tech scoreless during the first 15 minutes of action in the 48-7 victory. In the 15 home games the Tigers have played under Les Miles, only one team (Alabama in 2006) has scored points on LSU in the first quarter. In all, LSU has outscored its opposition 157-7 in the first quarter of its 15 home games under Miles since the start of the 2005 season.

Looking Back At Last Week: Tigers Win Rare Top 10 Non-Conference Matchup In Tiger Stadium

Last week's LSU-Virginia Tech contest marked only the third time in the history of Tiger Stadium that a pair of top 10 teams squared off in a non-conference contest. Prior to last Saturday, the last time it happened came in 1987 when No. 4 LSU and No. 7 Ohio State battled to a 13-13 tie.

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 202-59-3 (.771) at night under the lights compared to a 19-22-3 (.466) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 44-6 overall at home, which includes a 36-4 (.900) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 8-2 (.800) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 11 games at home during the day in 34 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted an 11-20-3 (.368) record at home during the day. LSU Brings 14-Game Home Winning Streak Into Middle Tennessee Contest

LSU brings a 14-game winning streak in contests played in Tiger Stadium into Saturday's game against Middle Tennessee. The 14-game home winning streak ranks as the nation's fourth-longest current streak, along with Ohio State. Southern Cal is riding a streak of 34 straight home victories to rank first. In addition to its 14-game winning streak at home, LSU has also won 24 of its last 25 games in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss at home came against Tennessee on Sept. 26, 2005, a Monday night. LSU hasn't lost a Saturday game in Tiger Stadium since a 19-7 setback to Florida on Oct. 11, 2003. To take it a step further, LSU hasn't dropped a Saturday night game at home since a 31-0 defeat to Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002, a streak that stretches 22 consecutive Saturday night games. The 14 straight wins in Tiger Stadium is the longest streak for LSU since winning 15 consecutive games at home from 1971-73. The school record for consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium is 17 from 1935-37.

Miles Now 24-4 At LSU; Best Start For A Coach In LSU History

With a 2-0 mark this year, LSU coach Les Miles ran his record with the Tigers to 24-4 overall. The 24 wins in his first 28 games is the most of any coach in school history during that span. Bernie Moore ranks second with 23 wins during his first 28 games. Charles McClendon ranks third with 21 wins during his first 28 games.

Miles Runs Record To 5-3 Against Top 10 Teams As LSU's Coach

With LSU's 48-7 win over Virginia Tech, Les Miles ran his record against teams ranked in the top 10 to 5-3 during his two-plus years with the Tigers. In his head coaching career, Miles has a 7-7 mark against Top 10 teams. At Oklahoma State, Miles beat Oklahoma twice when they were in the top 10. Miles' Top 10 wins at LSU have come against No. 3 Alabama and No. 9 Miami in 2005; No. 5 Arkansas and No. 8 Tennessee in 2006; and Virginia Tech this year.

Tigers Have Also Won 19 Straight At Home Against Non-SEC Teams

In addition to its 14-game overall home winning streak, LSU has also won 19 straight games in Tiger Stadium against non-SEC teams. The last time LSU dropped a non-conference home game came in a 13-10 setback to UAB on Sept. 23, 2000.

LSU's Overall Non-Conference Win Streak At 10

Overall, the Tigers have won 10 straight non-conference games, including five wins a year ago, which was capped with a 41-14 victory over Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl. Under Les Miles, the Tigers are 10-0 in non-SEC games. Of those 10 non-conference games under Miles, the Tigers have outscored their opponents, 421 to 77. Included in LSU's 10 non-SEC wins under Miles, four have come against ranked teams (def. No. 15 Arizona State, 35-31, def. #10 Miami, 40-3, def. #11 Notre Dame, 41-14, def. #9 Virginia Tech, 48-7). LSU's last non-conference loss came against then-No. 11 Iowa, 30-25, in the 2005 Capital One Bowl.

LSU Defense Ranked Among Nation's Elite

For the third straight season, LSU has put a defense on the field that ranks among the nation's best. Through two games, the Tigers have allowed just 3.5 points per game and only 147.5 yards of offense per contest. LSU is currently No. 3 in the nation in scoring defense and total defense. The Tigers lead the country in pass efficiency defense with a 43.51 rating and they are No. 11 nationally in rushing defense, yielding just 40.5 yards per game.

Tigers Are Second In Nation In Turnover Margin; Steltz Leads Nations In Interceptions

After going another contest without committing a turnover, LSU has increased its turnover margin to plus-8 (or 4.0 per game). LSU opened the season by forcing seven turnovers (6 interceptions, 1 fumble) against Mississippi State and then followed that by forcing another turnover in the win over Virginia Tech. Of LSU's eight turnovers, seven have been interceptions. Craig Steltz leads the Tigers and ranks first in the nation in interceptions with four this year.

LSU's Gone Without A Turnover In Two Straight Games

LSU again without a turnover against Virginia Tech marking the second straight game that the Tigers didn't commit a turnover. Dating back to last season, LSU has now gone nine straight quarters without a turnover. The last time LSU went back-to-back games without a turnover came a year ago in wins over Kentucky and Fresno State.

Double Trouble At Quarterback

Through two games, LSU QBs Matt Flynn and Ryan Perrilloux have both shown their ability to lead the Tigers. Flynn, who is now 3-0 as LSU's starting quarterback, has started both games this year and has been responsible for 3 TDs (2 passing, 1 rushing), while Perrilloux has accounted for 4 TDs (3 passing, 1 rushing) in a backup role. In two games, Flynn has connected on 29 of 46 passes for 345 yards, 2 TDs and no interceptions. Flynn has also rushed for 54 yards and a score for the Tigers. As a duo, Flynn and Perrilloux have combined to connect on 36 of 54 passes for 450 yards, 5 TDs and no interceptions. They have also combined for 77 rushing yards and 2 TDs.

Hester Does It All For Tigers

LSU senior RB Jacob Hester does it all for the Tigers. In two games this year, Hester has played a variety of positions for the Tigers. He's started both games at tailback, but he's also seen action at fullback as well as on LSU's punt, punt return, and PAT/field goal teams. Through two weeks of action, Hester has seen action in a total of 115 plays from scrimmage. The following is a look at Hester's play breakdown for the Tigers through two games:

LaFell Enjoys Breakout Game Against Virginia Tech

LSU sophomore WR Brandon LaFell had his coming out party against Virginia Tech, setting career highs for receptions (7) and yards (125). LaFell hauled in a 56 yard TD to help set up LSU's second touchdown of the game. For the year, LaFell ranks second on the team with 8 catches for 140 yards and a score.

Williams Makes SportsCenter Highlight Reel

LSU RB Keiland Williams made ESPN SportsCenter's highlight reel on Saturday with his 67-yard TD run against Virginia Tech. During the run, Williams leaped over fullback Shawn Jordan, who had fallen to ground, and then raced the remaining 50-plus yards to the endzone for the touchdown. The run was the highlight of Williams' career-night, one that saw him carry seven times for 126 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Williams has now scored at least 2 TDs in three straight games and he's scored at least one TD in the last six games in which he's played dating back to last season.

Tiger Offense Has Good Balance Under Flynn

In a word LSU's offense can be called balanced. Through two games, the Tigers are averaging 472.5 yards per game (247.5 rushing, 225 passing). The Tigers have scored seven rushing TDs and added another five scores through the air.

LSU Running Backs Take Care Of The Football

LSU's running back-by-committee approach has been good at more than just rushing yards and TDs. The group has also done a tremendous job of taking care of the football. Of LSU's four running backs - Jacob Hester, Keiland Williams, Charles Scott and Richard Murphy - only Hester has lost a fumble on a rushing attempt. Hester's lost fumble on a rush came against Georgia in what was the first game of his career in 2004. Since then, Hester has gone 152 carries from the running back position without a fumble. The following is a look at the number of carries LSU's running backs have toted the football without a fumble:

Tiger Defense Picks Off 6 Passes In Opener; Most By LSU Team Since 1975

LSU's six interceptions in the season-opener against Mississippi State was the most by an LSU team since having the same total against Tulane in 1975. Senior S **Craig Steltz** tied a school-record with 3 interceptions against the Bulldogs. Steltz became just the seventh player in school history, and the first since Corey Webster vs. Florida in 2002, to intercept 3 passes in a game. In all, the Tigers forced 7 turnovers in the 45-0 win over Mississippi State. The school record for interceptions in a game is 8, which was set against Villanova in 1951.

Tigers Open Season In Style With Shutout Over Mississippi State

LSU opened the 2007 season with a convincing 45-0 win over Mississippi State in Starkville. The shutout was the first in a season-opener on the road for the Tigers since a 44-0 win at Colorado in 1977. It also marked the first time LSU posted a shutout to open SEC play since a 30-0 win over Kentucky in 1966. The 45 points was also the most by an LSU team in an SEC road game since the Tigers scored 63 points in a victory over Kentucky in 1997.

LSU Started 2007 Ranked No. 2 In The Nation

LSU opened the 2007 season ranked No. 2 in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the Associated Press Top 25. The No. 2 ranking is the highest preseason rating for the Tigers since 1959 when LSU was ranked No. 1 by the AP. The No. 2 ranking in the coaches poll is the highest preseason ranking for the Tigers since the inception of that poll in 1982. LSU finished the 2006 season ranked No. 3 in both polls following its 41-14 win over Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

Doucet Sets Personal Best With 9 Catches Against Mississippi State

LSU WR **Early Doucet** set a career-high with 9 receptions against Mississippi State. Doucet finished the contest by making all but five of LSU's receptions against the Bulldogs. For the game, Doucet tallied 78 yards and 1 score on his nine receptions. Doucet's nine receptions ran his career total to 112, which puts him just 10 catches shy of breaking into LSU's all-time top 10 list for that category. Doucet's third quarter TD moved his career total to 16, which ties with Tony Moss as the eighth-highest total in school history. Dwayne Bowe holds the school record with 26 TD receptions. A year ago Doucet, established himself as one of the best in the SEC, catching 59 balls for 772 yards and eight TDs.

Running Back Hester Adds To Receiving Total

When it comes to catching the ball out of the backfield, RB/FB **Jacob Hester** has become one of the best in school history at it. During his LSU career, Hester has 50 receptions from the running back position, a figure that ranks just outside of the top six in LSU history. A year ago, Hester caught 35 passes, which ranked as the third-highest single-season total in school history. Gary James (1982-85) holds both the LSU career mark (122) and single-season record (50 in 1985) for receptions by a running back. This year, Hester has two catches for 38 yards, including a 28-yarder against Virginia Tech that setup LSU's first touchdown.

Dorsey In Line For Special Season

Last spring DT **Glenn Dorsey** opted to return to LSU for his senior season, turning down what would have surely been a first round pick in the NFL Draft. As a result, Dorsey is now in line to get his college degree, while also being put in a position to contend for some of college football's most prestigious awards. ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit has already called Dorsey, "the best player in college football," heading into 2007. Dorsey has been listed on every preseason All-America team and has been rated as the best defensive tackle in the nation by several publications. Last year, Dorsey earned First-Team All-America honors after anchoring an LSU defense that ranked among the top five in the nation in yards allowed and scoring. Thru 2 games, Dorsey has 11 tackles, 2 TFL, and one sack. The following is a listing of awards that Dorsey has been listed as a preseason candidate for heading into the 2007 season:

First Quarter Dominance Continues Into 2007

One big reason for LSU's success last year was its ability to take control of the contest early. Last year, the Tigers outscored their opponents 136 to 27 in the first quarter and 240 to 87 in the first half. LSU didn't allow a single point in the first quarter of a game last year until the sixth contest of the year when Florida scored with 11 seconds remaining in the opening frame. In all, LSU held nine of its 12 opponents without a point in the first quarter a year ago. In two games this year, the Tigers have held both opponents without points in the first half.

The Bo Pelini "D"

Since taking over as defensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2005, defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini** has put a unit on the field that rarely allows opponents to reach the 20-point mark. In 28 games with Pelini as its defensive coordinator, LSU has held 23 opponents to fewer than 20 points. In addition, 15 of LSU's 28 opponents (54 percent) failed to score more than 10 points. Last year, LSU limited seven of its 13 opponents to 10 points or less, including holding Kentucky scoreless, Arizona to 3 points, Fresno State to 6 points, and Auburn to 7 points. The shutout of Mississippi State to open the 2007 season marks the third straight year in which the Tigers have recorded a shutout.

Double-Trouble At Corner

LSU cornerbacks **Chevis Jackson** and **Jonathan Zenon** are back as returning starters at cornerback for the Tigers in 2006. The duo has started opposite each other at the cornerback position for 15 straight games. Last year, Jackson and Zenon combined for 6 interceptions for an LSU defense that ranked No. 1 in the SEC and No. 3 in the nation in pass defense.

A New Starter At Free Safety For The Tigers

With LaRon Landry taking his game to the NFL, LSU had new starter at the free safety position for the first time since the 2003 season against Mississippi State. **Curtis Taylor**, a junior, started at free safety against the Bulldogs, snapping a streak of 48 games in which the same player (LaRon Landry) started at that position for the Tigers.

First Time Starters

LSU have had five players make their first career start this season. First time starters for the Tigers in the season-opener at Mississippi State included RG **Lyle Hitt**, RT **Carnell Stewart**, FB **Quinn Johnson** and FS **Curtis Taylor**. WR **Chris Mitchell** made his first start in the home opener against Virginia Tech. Hitt and Stewart are both converted defensive linemen who were playing on the offensive side of the football for the first time in their career. Johnson is also a converted linebacker who is in his second season on the offensive side of the ball.

Six True Freshmen See Action In Opener

LSU put six true freshmen on the field in the season opener against Mississippi State. True freshmen who saw action in the win over the Bulldogs were: PK **Josh Jasper**, PK **Andrew Crutchfield**, LT **Jarvis Jones**, RT **Joseph Barksdale**, WR **Terrance Toliver** and DB **Chad Jones**.

What's New For LSU in 2007

The Tigers have three new assistant coaches on the staff, including offensive coordinator **Gary Crowton**, who is considered one of the most innovative minds in football. Other newcomers to the staff include offensive line coach **Greg Studrawa** and receivers coach **D.J. McCarthy**.

Three Members of LSU Coaching Staff Have Wins As Division I Head Coaches

LSU is one of the few schools in the country that can lay claim to having three coaches on its staff who have picked up wins as a head coach at the Division I level. Head coach **Les Miles** has combined to win 52 games at LSU and Oklahoma State, offensive coordinator **Gary Crowton** has a combined 47 victories after stints at Louisiana Tech and BYU and defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini** won his only game as the interim head coach at Nebraska during the 2003 season.

Oh Brother

LSU has two sets of brothers on this year's team - defensive end **Rahim Alem** (formerly Al Jones) and defensive back **Chad Jones** are brothers as are center **Brett Helms** and offensive lineman **Trey Helms**. Alem is a backup defensive end for the Tigers, while Jones serve as either a nickel back or dime back in LSU's subpackages on defense. Brett Helms is LSU's starter at center, while Trey is a walk-on true freshman.

Double-Duty Tigers

Three members of the LSU football team also participate in other sports on campus. Wide receiver **Jared Mitchell** and defensive back **Chad Jones** are on the baseball team, while wide out/return specialist **Trindon Holliday** is on the track team. Here's a look at how these players fared while competing in their "other" sport:

Trindon Holliday - sprinter - track and field

Established himself as one of the nation's premier sprinters on the track with his outstanding performance in the spring. He earned a pair of All-America honors at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in June. He finished as the NCAA runner-up in the 100-meter dash after ripping up the track with a time of 10.06 seconds in the final while also anchoring the Tigers' fearsome 4x100-meter relay team to a second-place finish with a seasonal best time of 38.85. In addition, Holliday etched his name in the record books with his performance as he shattered the school record in the 100-meter dash with a seasonal best time of 10.02, eclipsing the mark of 10.09 set by LSU great and former two-sport stand-out Xavier Carter in 2006.

Jared Mitchell - centerfield - baseball

Last year as a true freshman, Mitchell started 55 games at centerfield for the Tiger baseball team, batting .258 (54-of-209) with eight doubles, a triple, three homers and 21 RBI. He also became the first freshman since 1998 to lead the team in steals with 18. The stolen bases put him fourth in the SEC in that department and represented the most by an LSU player since 2004. Mitchell, the 10th-round selection of the Minnesota Twins in the 2006 Major League Draft, was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 26.

Chad Jones - outfielder - baseball

Jones, a left-handed outfielder from Southern Lab High School, was picked in the 13th round by the Houston Astros in the 2007 Major League Draft. He will make his debut for the Tiger baseball team this spring.

LSU Streaks To Make Note Of

LSU's won 9 straight games dating back to last year ... It's the longest streak for an LSU team since winning 10 straight during the 2003-04 seasons ... CB **Chevis Jackson** has the longest streak of consecutive starts with 28 straight to his credit ... WR **Early Doucet** has caught at least one pass in 24 straight games ... RB **Keiland Williams** has scored at least 1 TD in the last 6 games in which he has played (he didn't score vs. Ole Miss last year because he sat out game) ... Williams has also scored at least 2 TDs in LSU's last three games dating back to last year.

LSU Sack Streak At 21 Straight

LSU ran its streak of games with a sack to 21 straight against Virginia Tech with three sacks against the Hokies. The last time LSU failed to record a sack came during the 2005 season against North Texas.

D-Line U

You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Drafts from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had five defensive linemen earn First-Team All-America status and seven members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. Senior defensive tackle **Glenn Dorsey** earned First-Team All-America recognition in 2006 and then opted to return to LSU for his senior season despite being projected as a first round pick in last spring's NFL Draft.

TIGER STADIUM



- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 83rd year in the venerable stadium. LSU is also celebrating the 76th anniversary of playing under the light of Tiger Stadium. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.

- LSU has won 32 OF ITS LAST 35 games at home.

- More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 48 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 38 times, including a school-record 92,739 for the Sept. 8, 2007 game that pitted No. 2 LSU against No. 9 Virginia Tech. LSU won the game 48-7.

- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 47 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 45 of the 47 years and in the top 10 on 39 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. 15 times, LSU has ranked in the TOP SIX IN THE NATION, including the last six.

- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 203-59-3 (.772) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 19-22-3 (.466) at home during the day in that span.

- Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

Davey-Reed Duo Set Records As MTSU Falls

Rohan Davey became LSU's single-season passing record holder while Josh Reed did the same in receiving yardage as the Tigers posted a 30-14 win over Middle Tennessee on Homecoming. Dave completed 26-of-37 passes for 318 yards and a touchdown strike to surpass Tommy Hodson as LSU's single-season passing yardage record holder. Davey broke the mark of 2,655 set by Hodson in 1989. Reed caught nine passes for 120 yards to break the record of 1,244 set by Wendall Davis in 1986. Davey finished the contest with 2,659 yards passing while Reed moved his season total to 1,311 yards receiving. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers scored touchdowns the first four times they touched the ball. LaBrandon Toefield scored three touchdowns, all in the first half, as the Tigers built a 27-7 halftime lead. John Corbello added a 42-yard field goal in the second half to complete the scoring for the Tigers.

LSU's Defense Overwhelms Miss. State In 45-0 Win Over Bulldogs

LSU forced seven turnovers, including six interceptions, as the second-ranked Tigers overwhelmed Mississippi State, 45-0, in the season-opener for both teams last week. Matt Flynn, making his first regular season start at quarterback, directed a Tiger offense that didn't commit a turnover and racked up 45 points, the most by an LSU team in an SEC road game since scoring 63 points against Kentucky in Lexington in 1997. LSU took an early 3-0 lead on a 27-yard field goal by Colt David. The Tigers stretched the lead to 10-0 late in the second quarter on a 1-yard run by Keiland Williams. LSU increased the lead to 17-0 when Williams scored on a 1-yard run as time expired in the first half. LSU took the opening kickoff to start the second half and put together its best drive of the game, going 73-yards on six plays, capped with a Flynn-to-Early Doucet 11-yard TD pass to run the score to 24-0. Backup QB Ryan Perrilloux engineered a pair of fourth quarter TD drives for the final margin of 45-0. For the game, the Tiger defense limited Mississippi State to just 10 yards rushing and 136 yards passing. The Bulldogs managed just nine first downs, four of which came in the first half. Thirty-eight of LSU's 45 points came following an MSU turnover, including all 17 first half points.

Tigers Click On All Cylinders In 48-7 Win Over No. 9 Virginia Tech

LSU scored on four of its first five possessions and the Tiger defense didn't allow Virginia Tech to cross midfield until the third quarter in a 48-7 victory over the ninth-ranked Hokies in Tiger Stadium. In a game that saw LSU dominate in all phases, the Tigers raced out to a 24-0 halftime lead and never looked back in a contest that was billed as a defensive battle. LSU set the tone early, taking the opening kickoff and going 87 yards on 10 plays, capped with a 3-yard run by **Jacob Hester** to take a 7-0 lead. After a three-and-out by the Hokies, LSU went 85 yards on eight plays on its next possession, capped with a 7-yard TD run by **Matt Flynn** to stretch the margin to 14-0. LSU blew the game open early in the third quarter when **Keiland Williams** used a spectacular 67-yard run to give the Tigers a 24-0 lead. The Hokies scored their only points in the contest late in the third quarter to cut the deficit to 27-7. However, it took the Tigers only three minutes to add another score, this time **Ryan Perrilloux** connected with **Early Doucet** on a 34-yard TD pass. LSU added a pair of fourth quarter TDs for the final margin. For the game, LSU racked up 598 yards of offense (297 rush, 301 pass), while limiting the Hokies to just 149 yards (71 rush, 78 pass). Williams led the Tigers with 126 yards and 2 TDs on 7 carries, while Hester added 81 yards and 1 score on 12 rushes. Flynn and Perrilloux combined to complete 22 of 32 passes for 301 yards and a pair of scores. **Brandon LaFell** led all receivers with 7 catches for 125 yards and a score.
