SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU starts the season on the road for fourth time since the Tigers reinstated softball in 1997. The only other times that LSU has opened the season away from Tiger Park came at Arizona State's Fiesta Bowl Classic [2001], UNLV's Desert Classic [2005] and Hawai'i's Paradise Classic [2009].
- ▶ LSU is 12-1 in season openers highlighted by four consecutive wins by an impressive 38-6 margin, including a pair of shutouts over Stephen F. Austin [2006] and St. John's [2008].
- ▶ LSU has outscored its opponents by a 129-14 margin in openers and posted nine shutouts. The Tigers lone setback came in a 5-3 decision to Illinois during the 2005 season.
- ▶ LSU is 36-9 (.800) on opening weekend under Yvette Girouard. The Tigers have notched wins in 20 of their last 22 games since 2005.
- ▶ LSU has spent 62 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 18 and No. 13 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 6-4, LSU finished the 2009 campaign by winning 28 of its last 43 games (.651). The Tigers bring back 15 letterwinners from a squad that went 34-18-1.
- LSU started as many as seven freshmen during the season and finished one win away from the NCAA Super Regionals.
- LSU has five Texans on the roster returning to the Lone Star for 2010 opening weekend. They are seniors Rachel Mitchell, Kirsten Shortridge and Cody Trahan along with sophomore Brittany Mack and freshman Lindsay Price.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches. The Tigers garnered 17 points, five points behind division and conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. Georgia joined the Tigers with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge sparked the offense from the top of the batting order and racked up a .426 batting average on a team-high 80 hits last season. Her .426 average was second-highest, while the 80 hits were tied for eighth-most in program history over a single season.
- Shortridge reached base in 47 of 53 games in addition to being 26-for-32 in the stolen base department. She also hit safely in 11 of her last 12 games where she compiled a sparkling .526 hitting clip (20-for-38) en route to All-SEC First-Team, NFCA All-South Region First-Team and NFCA All-America Third-Team accolades.
- Shortridge was one of 12 players to earn a spot on the 2010 All-SEC Preseason squad.
- Rachel Mitchell collected 24 of her team-best 38 RBIs over her last 30 games that opened with a three-run double in LSU's 6-5 comeback win over then-No. 2 Alabama (March 18).

- Mitchell followed that up with an eight-RBI weekend in the series at Mississippi State which allowed her to sweep SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors (Week of March 23).
- Mitchell finished the season with a .306 batting average and drew a team-high 32 walks.
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were chosen to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second consecutive season.
- Juliana Santos notched a spot on the SEC All-Freshman squad and became the sixth LSU infielder to earn NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs against SEC opponents and five of her seven multi-RBI efforts highlighted by a five-RBI performance in the series finale against Kentucky (March 8).
- Santos batted .279 with four home runs and 27 RBIs as she started 52 of 53 games at shortstop.
- The Tigers were 25-10-1 (.708) when Santos hit third followed by Mitchell at cleanup in the batting order.
- 19 of Anissa Young's 36 RBIs came on her eight home runs last season. She tallied a hit in 17 of her last 29 games with six of her eight multi-hit efforts coming during that stretch.
- Young also saw her batting average climb from .190 to .243 over those final 29 games. She batted .351 (34-for-97) when putting the ball in play last season.
- 14 of Ashley Langoni's last 21 have produced RBIs with 12 of those hits going for extra bases. She knocked in 18 of her 29 RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup during her freshman season.
- Langoni belted three homers at the NCAA Tempe Regional to pick up All-Regional Team honors. She teamed with Young as LSU hit the two grand slams for the first time in program history during the same game to spark a 10-2 win over No. 9 Arizona State.

- Langoni, Santos and Young accounted for 43.0 percent (92-of-214) of LSU's RBIs last season. The trio also cranked 21 of the team's 31 home runs.
- Ashley Applegate slapped a hit in 15 of 27 SEC games, including six multi-hit efforts. Her batting average stayed above .300 for most of the 2009 season.
- Applegate surpassed her RBI total from the 2008 season and re-recorded six RBIs over her last nine games despite going 3-for-26 (.115) at the plate.
- Morgan Russell reached base in nine of her last 15 starts at catcher where she registers an at-bat.
- Jessica Mouse reached base in 21 of her last 53 plate appearances (.415) over the last 20 games during the 2009 season. She has 11 hits to go along with seven walks in addition to being hit-by-a-pitch three times and reaching on an error once.
- LSU is 28-13-1 (.679) when Mouse hit at the bottom of the lineup. She also picked up 13 of her 14 RBIs from the No. 9 hole.

- Cody Trahan went 12-7 and fired 11 complete games en route to NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors. She ranked in the SEC's Top 10 in ERA (2.46), strikeouts (141) and opponent batting average (.217)
- Eight of Trahan's 12 wins came versus SEC opponents highlighted by a complete game victory over No. 2 Alabama (March 18). She also notched a pair of wins over South Carolina (April 25-26) and Auburn (May 2-3) to conclude the regular season.
- Kirsten Shortridge totaled a 5-4 record with a 3.21 ERA over 15 appearances in the circle sparked by marquee victories over College World Series participants No. 2 Alabama (March 18) and No. 9 Arizona State (May 16).

- Mack also limited No. 1 Florida (April 18) to one run on five hits over nine innings during the first two games of the series.

- Casey Faile drove home pinch runner Courtney Hollier in the sixth inning to provide the game-winning run in a 3-2 triumph over Cal State Fullerton (May 15) to open the NCAA Tempe Regional.
- With LSU down 1-0 in the fifth inning, Ashley Langoni cranked a two-run home run in the regular season finale at Auburn (May 3). Casey Faile tacked on a two-run dinger in the seventh inning for the 4-1 victory.
- Behind 1-0 in the seventh inning, Juliana Santos scored pinch runner Tiffany Shaw with a triple into a right centerfield gap at Nicholls (April 7). On the next batter, a Colonel fielding error allowed Santos to score the game winning run.
- Jessica Mouse, Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson provided back-to-back-to-back RBI singles with two outs to turn a 2-1 deficit into a 4-2 advantage during the sixth inning at Southern Miss (April 1).
- Trailing 5-1 going into the fifth inning of the series finale at Mississippi State (March 22), the Tigers scored six runs in the last three innings highlighted by a Mouse RBI-triple and Shortridge RBI-single in the sixth inning to give LSU the lead.
- Mouse broke a 4-4 tie belting a home run during the seventh inning of the series opener at Mississippi State (March 21).
- LSU exploded for five runs in the fifth inning down 5-1 in game two against Alabama (March 18). With the bases loaded, Rachel Mitchell cleared the bases with a game-tying double and used alert base running to score the game-winning run on a Crimson Tide error.
- One week earlier, Morgan Russell scored on a wild pitch in the bottom of the seventh as the Tigers edged Baylor 4-3.
- The Tigers also overcame two-run deficits on consecutive days to win a pair of one-run games against then-No. 5 Texas A&M (Feb. 14 & 15).
- Shortridge and Mitchell provided the late-winning heroics with game-winning singles against the Aggies.
- LSU completed a four-run comeback victory at Hawai'i (Feb. 7). The Tigers scored four in the seventh before winning the game on an Ashley Applegate walk in the ninth.
- The last time LSU accomplished that feat came at Georgia during the 2003 season.
