SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 19 LSU softball team plays host to the first of three straight tournaments as No. 4 Michigan, Oklahoma State and Virginia visit Tiger Park for the Wilson/DeMarini Tiger Classic.
- ▶ LSU has put together a combined 5-3 record against its three opponents this weekend. The last time the Tigers met Michigan was an epic battle to open the 2004 Women's College World Series.
- ▶ In the bottom of the 13th, Sara Fitzgerald singled through the left side with two outs. On an infield single by Camille Harris, U-M shortstop Jessica Merchant threw the ball away at first, allowing Harris to move to second and Fitzgerald to go to third. An errant throw by right fielder Courtney Betley to the plate sent Fitzgerald home for the 3-2 win.
- ▶ Kristin Schmidt tossed a career-best 13 innings and tallied 13 strikeouts to outduel Jennie Ritter in a 3:27 marathon.
- ▶ LSU has spent 63 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 19 and No. 17 in this week's edition of the polls.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- After starting the season 6-4, LSU finished the 2009 campaign by winning 28 of its last 43 games (.651). The Tigers bring back 15 letterwinners from a squad that went 34-18-1.
- LSU started as many as seven freshmen last season and finished one win away from the NCAA Super Regionals.
- LSU picked up a 6-1 victory over Louisiana-Monroe Wednesday to open year two at Tiger Park after turning in a 2-3 mark on opening weekend.
- LSU scored a pair of runs in the second, third and fourth innings highlighted by an Ashley Langoni two-run homer. Kirsten Shortridge, Ashley Applegate and Rachel Mitchell, the top three hitters in the LSU batting order, also provided RBIs.
- Rachele Fico tossed five frames of two-hit ball and was touched up for an unearned run in her home debut, while Brittany Mack retired all six batters she faced in relief.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches. The Tigers garnered 17 points, five points behind division and conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. Georgia joined the Tigers with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in all six games and rides an eight-game hitting streak into the weekend dating back to the 2009 season.
- Shortridge headlines the team with a .435 batting average and four stolen bases. She has racked up a trio of multi-hit efforts and her 10 hits pace the SEC.
- Shortridge batted .426 on a team-high 80 hits last season. Her .426 average was second-highest, while the 80 hits were tied for

- eighth-most in program history over a single season en route to All-SEC First-Team, NFCA All-South Region First-Team and NFCA All-America Third-Team accolades.
- Rachel Mitchell has compiled hits in four of her last five games and provided RBIs in three of her last four outings. The LaPorte, Texas product knocked a two-run single against ULM [Feb. 17].
- Mitchell collected 24 of her team-best 38 RBIs over her last 30 games in 2009 sparked by an eight-RBI weekend in the Mississippi State series [March 21-22] which allowed her to sweep SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors [Week of March 23].
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second straight season.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 0-for-25 slump during LSU's first six games.
- Santos notched a spot on the SEC All-Freshman squad and earned NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs against SEC opponents in 2009. She finished with a .279 hitting clip to go along with four home runs and 27 RBIs as she started 52 of 53 games at shortstop.
- Anissa Young went 2-for-2 with three RBIs, including a two-run homer against No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 12]. She is 0-for-10 over the last four games since moving to the No. 4 hole in the lineup.
- During her two-year career, 21 of Young's 39 RBIs have come on her nine home runs. The California native also has notched a .336 [37-for-110] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has belted two home runs and five RBIs. She also has drawn four walks en route to a .500 on-base percentage.
- Langoni has produced 23 of her 34 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 17 of her last 26 hits have produced RBIs with 15 of those hits going for extra bases.

- Langoni belted three homers at the NCAA Tempe Regional to pick up All-Regional Team honors. She teamed with Young as LSU hit the two grand slams for the first time in program history during the same game to spark a 10-2 win over No. 9 Arizona State.
- Langoni, Santos and Young accounted for 43.0 percent [92-of-214] of LSU's RBIs last season. The trio also cranked 21 of the team's 31 home runs.
- The sophomore trio currently has all three of LSU's home runs and 8-of-18 of the team's RBIs in 2010.
- Ashley Applegate has slapped hits in five of six games and added a RBI-double against ULM [Feb. 17]. She has split time between designated player and right field in 2010.
- Applegate recorded hits in 15 of 26 SEC games and spent most of last season with over a .300 batting average. She represented the Tigers on the SEC Community Service Team.
- Courtney Hollier has made the most of her four starts and tallied a .300 average with a pair of doubles. She compiled her first career multi-hit game in a 6-3 win over No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Morgan Russell and Lauren Houston have combined for a 0-for-10 clip at the plate. Russell threw out a pair of runners attempting to steal against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 12] in the season opener.
- Jessica Mouse has garnered hits in her last four games since returning to the No. 9 spot in the lineup. She belted a two-run double down the left field line to cap a four-run fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- LSU was 28-13-1 [.679] when Mouse batted at the bottom of the lineup last season. She also picked up 13 of her 14 RBIs from the No. 9 hole.

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff compiled a 1.02 staff ERA and have already faced a trio of 2009 NCAA Tournament squads.
- Kirsten Shortridge tossed her first seven-inning complete game during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge totaled a 5-4 record with a 3.21 ERA over 15 appearances in the circle sparked by marquee victories over College World Series participants No. 2 Alabama [March 18] and No. 9 Arizona State [May 16] last season.
- Rachele Fico and Brittany Mack bounced back against ULM [Feb. 17] after receiving tough-luck losses in a pair of 2-1 setbacks against Texas [Feb. 13 & 14].
- Fico, a two-time NFCA High School All-American, fired five dominating innings in her Tiger Park debut. She was touched up for two hits, an unearned run and registered a career-best seven strikeouts.
- Fico picked up her first collegiate win in relief over No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13] where she fired 2.2 frames of two-hit relief. She has rolled to 21 Ks in 19.2 innings of work.
- Mack sat down all six Warhawk batters she faced in relief. In her lone start, the Round Rock native racked up five strikeouts her first time through the Texas lineup. With two outs in the seventh inning, the Longhorns used a pair of two-out RBI-hits.
- Mack compiled an 11-4 mark with a 2.36 ERA and added nine complete games. She racked up 110 strikeouts in 103.2 innings and held opponents to a staff low .197 batting average.
- Mack notched victories against NCAA Regional foes Texas State [Feb. 21], Baylor [March 11] and Mississippi State [March 21].
- Cody Trahan went 12-7 and fired 11 complete games to earn NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors. She ranked in the SEC's Top 10 in ERA [2.46], strikeouts [141] and opponent average [.217].
- Eight of Trahan's 12 wins came versus SEC opponents highlighted by a complete game victory over No. 2 Alabama [March 18]. She missed opening weekend due to injury and scheduled to make her season debut at the Wilson/DeMarini Tiger Classic this weekend.
- After logging 24.0 innings over the first two months of the 2009 season, Casey Faile recorded 27.0 innings of work during eight appearances in April and May. She reeled off a stretch of surrendering only one earned run in 29.2 innings [Feb. 11-April 15].

OFF THE BENCH

- Lauren Capello has reached base in eight of her 21 career at-bats as a pinch hitter with four hits, three walks and was hit-by-pitch.
- Casey Faile recorded a hit in eight of her last 18 games with eight RBIs, including the game-winning single in a 3-2 triumph over Cal State Fullerton [May 15]. She is 0-for-2 as a pinch hitter in 2010.

- Casey Faile drove home pinch runner Courtney Hollier in the sixth inning to provide the game-winning run in a 3-2 triumph over Cal State Fullerton [May 15] to open the NCAA Tempe Regional.
- With LSU down 1-0 in the fifth inning, Ashley Langoni cranked a two-run home run at Auburn [May 3]. Casey Faile tacked on a two-run dinger in the seventh inning for the 4-1 victory.
- Behind 1-0 in the seventh inning, Juliana Santos scored pinch runner Tiffany Shaw with a triple into a right centerfield gap at Nicholls [April 7]. On the next batter, a Colonel fielding error allowed Santos to score the game winning run.
- Jessica Mouse, Kirsten Shortridge and Jazz Jackson provided back-to-back-to-back RBI singles with two outs to turn a 2-1 deficit into a 4-2 advantage during the sixth inning at Southern Miss [April 1].
- Trailing 5-1 going into the fifth inning of the series finale at Mississippi State [March 22], the Tigers scored six runs in the last three innings highlighted by a Mouse RBI-triple and Shortridge RBI-single in the sixth inning to give LSU the lead.
- Mouse broke a 4-4 tie belting a home run during the seventh inning of the series opener at Mississippi State [March 21].
- LSU exploded for five runs in the fifth inning down 5-1 in game two against Alabama [March 18]. With the bases loaded, Rachel Mitchell cleared the bases with a game-tying double and used alert base running to score the game-winning run on a Crimson Tide error.
- One week earlier, Morgan Russell scored on a wild pitch in the bottom of the seventh as the Tigers edged Baylor 4-3.
- The Tigers also overcame two-run deficits on consecutive days to win a pair of one-run games against then-No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15].
- Shortridge and Mitchell provided the late-winning heroics with game-winning singles against the Aggies.
- LSU completed a four-run comeback victory at Hawai'i [Feb. 7]. The Tigers scored four in the seventh before winning the game on an Ashley Applegate walk in the ninth.
- The last time LSU accomplished that feat came at Georgia during the 2003 season.
