## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ The No. 16 LSU softball team faces off against Houston, Jacksonville State and Southern as the Tigers head into the heart of their 18-game homestand this weekend at the Tiger Invitational.
- ▶ LSU has compiled a 9-1 combined record against this weekend's competition. The last time the Tigers met Houston and Southern came during the 2007 season.
- ▶ LSU won a 5-3 decision over the Cougars as former All-Americans Leslie Klein and Killian Roessner provided home runs in the fourth and sixth innings, respectively.
- ▶ Kyla Holas, a former three-time All-American pitcher for Yvette Girouard at Louisiana-Lafayette, is the head coach of Houston.
- ▶ The Tigers have yet to meet Jacksonville State, who made the NCAA Super Regionals last season.
- ▶ LSU has spent 64 consecutive weeks in both the *USA Today/NFCA* and *ESPN/USA Softball* Top 25 polls. The Tigers check in at No. 16 and No. 15 in this week's edition of the polls.

**STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS**

- After starting the season 2-3 at the Time Warner Texas Invitational that featured a quartet of 2009 NCAA Tournament teams, LSU has charged back to win six of its last seven games at home highlighted by the Wilson/DeMarini Tiger Classic title.
- Ashley Applegate, Rachele Fico, Courtney Hollier and Ashley Langoni garnered All-Tournament Team honors for their efforts.
- LSU notched a pair of victories over Virginia and Oklahoma State. The Tigers used two big fourth innings to dismiss the Cowgirls, who were receiving votes in the NFCA Top 25 poll.
- LSU was picked to finish second in the SEC Western Division by the league coaches behind division and conference favorite Alabama. For the overall title, Alabama tallied six votes followed by Florida's three votes. Georgia joined the Tigers with one vote apiece.
- Shortridge, a 2010 All-SEC Preseason Team selection, has slapped hits in 10 of 12 games. Her 14 hits are tied for second in the SEC. The Keller, Texas product is looking to break out of a 4-for-21 mini slump over her last six games.
- Shortridge also has racked up a league-best 10 stolen bases highlighted by a trio of steals against Virginia [Feb. 19]. She became the first player since Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson against Alcorn State during the 2007 season to steal three bases in the same game.
- Shortridge batted .426 on a team-high 80 hits last season. Her .426 average was second-highest, while the 80 hits were tied for eighth-most in program history over a single season en route to All-SEC First-Team, NFCA All-South Region First-Team and NFCA All-America Third-Team accolades.

- Rachel Mitchell has compiled hits in nine of 12 games, including her last four to check in with a .343 batting average. She also has drawn a walk in five of her last eight outings.
- Mitchell has drove home five RBIs highlighted by a two-run single against Louisiana-Monroe [Feb. 17].
- Mitchell collected 24 of her team-best 38 RBIs over her last 30 games in 2009 sparked by an eight-RBI weekend in the Mississippi State series [March 21-22] which allowed her to sweep SEC, LSWA and NFCA National Player of the Week honors [Week of March 23].
- Both Mitchell and Shortridge were selected to the USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List for the second straight season.
- Juliana Santos and Allison Falcon are looking to break out of a combined 2-for-40 slump during LSU's first 12 games.
- Santos notched a spot on the SEC All-Freshman squad and earned NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors in 2009.
- Santos tallied 20 of her 27 RBIs against SEC opponents in 2009. She finished with a .279 hitting clip to go along with four home runs and 27 RBIs as she started 52 of 53 games at shortstop.
- Anissa Young has cranked a pair of home runs en route to a career-best five RBIs against Southeastern Louisiana [Feb. 24]. She also has knocked RBI doubles in four of six games.
- During her two-year career, 25 of Young's 47 RBI's have come on her 11 home runs. The California native also has notched a .358 [43-for-120] hitting clip when putting the ball in play.
- Ashley Langoni has amassed a .375 batting average to go along with four home runs and 12 RBIs. She has knocked hits in five of her last seven games sparked by a trio of multi-hit performances.
- Langoni matched a career-best four RBIs against Virginia [Feb. 21] and picked up LSWA Hitter of the Week accolades.

- Langoni has produced 30 of her 41 career RBIs from the No. 5 spot in the lineup and 22 of her last 33 hits have produced RBIs with 18 of those hits going for extra bases.
- Langoni cranked three homers at the NCAA Tempe Regional to pick up All-Regional Team honors. She teamed with Santos and Young to account for 43.0 percent [92-of-214] of LSU's RBIs last season. The trio also cranked 21 of the team's 31 home runs.
- The sophomore trio currently has five of six of the Tigers home runs and 22-of-49 of the team's RBIs in 2010.
- Ashley Applegate has slapped hits in nine of 12 games and her six-game hitting streak from Feb. 13-19 matched a career-best. She ripped RBI-doubles against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19] and Virginia [Feb. 21]. She has split time between designated player and right field in 2010.
- Applegate recorded hits in 15 of 26 SEC games and spent most of last season with over a .300 batting average. She represented the Tigers on the SEC Community Service Team.
- Courtney Hollier has made the most of her nine starts and tallied a .360 hitting clip with a homer and four RBIs. She has recorded three straight multi-hit games and notched her first career multi-RBI game against Virginia [Feb. 21].
- Morgan Russell and Lauren Houston have combined for a 2-for-17 clip at the plate. Both catchers have thrown out runners attempting to steal and LSU's opponents have been limited to five stolen bases over 12 games.
- Jessica Mouse has garnered hits in seven of her last 10 games since spending a majority of her time at the No. 9 spot in the lineup. She powered home a two-run double in both games against Oklahoma State [Feb. 19 & 20].
- Mouse is third on the squad with nine RBIs after driving home 14 RBIs during the entire 2009 season.

CIRCLE NOTES

- LSU's pitching staff compiled a SEC-leading 1.05 staff ERA and have already faced six 2009 NCAA Tournament squads. Rachele Fico, Brittany Mack and Kirsten Shortridge represent the Tigers among the SEC's Top 11 in ERA.
- Mack is 2-2 with a staff low 0.95 ERA but has been dealt a pair of tough-luck losses to Texas [Feb. 13] and No. 4 Michigan [Feb. 20] where she has only received one run of support.
- Mack mowed down eight batters and allowed only one earned run in both of those starts. With two outs in the seventh inning, the Longhorns used a pair of two-out RBI-hits.
- Mack compiled an 11-4 mark with a 2.36 ERA and racked up 110 strikeouts in 103.2 innings of work. She held opponents to a staff low .197 hitting clip last season.
- Shortridge has gone 2-0 over her three starts and tossed her first seven-inning complete game during a 4-1 win over No. 21 DePaul [Feb. 13]. She compiled six strikeouts and surrendered only three hits against the Blue Demons.
- Shortridge totaled a 5-4 record with a 3.21 ERA over 15 appearances in the circle sparked by marquee victories over College World Series participants No. 2 Alabama [March 18] and No. 9 Arizona State [May 16] last season.
- Fico, a two-time NFCA High School All-American, fired five dominating innings in her Tiger Park debut against ULM [Feb. 17]. She followed that up with a win and pair of saves at the Wilson/DeMarini Tiger Classic [Feb. 19-21].
- Fico picked up her first collegiate win in relief over No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13] where she fired 2.2 frames of two-hit relief. She has rolled to 34 Ks in 30.2 innings of work.
- Cody Trahan made her season debut against Virginia [Feb. 19] and earned a no-decision in 3.2 innings of shutout ball. She followed that up with a complete game six-inning effort also against Virginia [Feb. 21] and allowed only two hits.
- Trahan went 12-7 and fired 11 complete games to earn NFCA All-South Region First-Team honors. She ranked in the SEC's Top 10 in ERA [2.46], strikeouts [141] and opponent average [.217].
- Eight of Trahan's 12 wins came versus SEC opponents highlighted by a complete game victory over No. 2 Alabama [March 18].

- LSU has recorded a 6-0 mark when hitting a home run, while going 2-4 when not hitting a long ball.

**GOING THE DISTANCE**

- In 13 of LSU's 34 wins during the 2009 season, LSU entered the fifth inning either trailing or tied.
- The Tigers picked up comeback wins over NCAA Tournament squads No. 5 Texas A&M [Feb. 14 & 15], Baylor [March 11], No. 2 Alabama [March 18], Mississippi State [March 21 & 22], Auburn [May 3] and Cal State Fullerton [May 15].
- LSU has continued that trend and already has picked up two comeback victories this season.
- Ashley Langoni laced a two-run home run coupled with a two-run Jessica Mouse double as LSU turned a 3-2 deficit into a 6-3 lead in the fifth inning against No. 19 North Carolina [Feb. 13].
- Behind 3-0 to Oklahoma State [Feb. 19], LSU exploded for six runs in the fourth inning. Once again, Langoni and Mouse fueled the frame with a two-run homer and double, respectively.
